Northwest University Women's Soccer Notebook

READY TO ROLL: The Eagles are coming off their first win of the season and ready to start a winning streak. NU had win streaks of two, three, and five games last season.

RASSIER SCORES: Rylee Rassier got the game -winner on a penalty kick last week in NU's win at Northwest Nazarene and now has two of the three Northwest goals this season. Rassier's game-winning goal ranks her 18th nationally. She is tied for fourth in the Cascade Collegiate Conference with 0.67 goals per game.

HELP WANTED: Through three games and three goals, Northwest has yet to produce an assist.

DEFENSE IMPROVES: The Northwest defense held Northwest Nazarene to 11 shots and four shots on goal last weekend--both lows for the season. NU is fourth in the Cascade Collegiate Conference at 1.33 goals allowed per game.

SAVES: After collecting eight saves in each of the first two games, Kat Sanchez was tested only four times last week at Northwest Nazarene. Sanchez has 11 saves on the season. Sanchez is 35th in the NAIA in total saves (19) and 48th in saves per game (6.33).

WRIGHT ON: Northwest averages 9.3 shots per game, led by Callie Wright with nine. Wright, who also leads the team with six shots on goal, got her first collegiate goal last week at Northwest Nazarene.

LAST TIME: Northwest last met Puget Sound in 2014, predating any of the current Eagles and Coach Bryan Chud. The Loggers won that game, 2-1, in Tacoma.

CLOSING IN ON MORE GLORY: NU Head Coach Bryan Chud already holds a place in the NU Hall of Fame after his strong playing career on the men's team. He owns four single-season records for the NU men. Now he lacks just six wins to catch Erin Redwine for the school record for coaching wins in women's soccer. Redwine finished with 46 wins over seven seasons. Chud got his 40th career win in the victory at Northwest Nazarene.

COMING UP: The Eagles wrap up their threegame road swing at Lewis and Clark College in Portland on Wednesday before a home game with Linfield on Sept. 14. After that brief respite from the road, the Eagles head east to start the Cascade Conference schedule in Montana Sept. 20 (at Providence) and 22 (at Carroll).

scouting puget sound: Puget Sound enters the game at 1-1 on the season after a breakeven trip to Illinois. The Loggers bounced back from a 3-0 loss at Wheaton to collect a 3-0 win against Hanover. Kylee Roath scored two goals in that second game, with Gabbie Berg getting the third. Rahdi Webster Schutz and Ceann Romanaggi had assists. UPS has delivered six shots per game. In goal, Chaylea Tome has 11 saves and a 1.50 goals-against average. Puget Sound is the preseason No. 3 pick in the NCAA Division III Northwest Conference after being the automatic postseason qualifier from the conference last season.

NUMBER 20: The Eagles opened the season at No. 20 in the NAIA Coaches' Preseason Top 25 Rankings after its NAIA Quarterfinals appearance in 2018. Northwest was ranked 15th in the post-season poll for last season. The initial regular-season poll comes out Sept. 11.

Head Coach Bryan Chud



Coach Bryan Chud took the helm of the women's soccer program in 2016 and Northwest University hasn't missed the national postseason since.

His first team in 2016 reached the NAIA National Semifinals. He followed that up with an Opening Round appearance and in 2018 guided the Eagles back to the final site and a successful season that culminated in the NAIA National Quarterfinals.

On the conference level, Chud's teams have peaked at the right time. His 2018 squad won the Cascade Collegiate Conference Tournament, 1-0, over Eastern Oregon, after reaching the finals in 2016 and 2017.

Chud, who also is the assistant athletics director at NU, returned to his alma mater as assistant men's soccer coach in 2015 and stayed at that position until 2017.

Northwest finished fifth in the NAIA final poll in 2016, received votes in the last poll in 2017 and ranked 15th in the 2018 postseason poll.

Coach Chud is a 2002 graduate of Northwest University earning a degree in history and was a three-time team captain of the Eagle men's soccer team from 1999 to 2002, earning both regional and national recognition. He owns the school record in career goals scored and was inducted into the NU Eagle Hall of Fame in March, 2015. He earned NAIA All-America honorable mention and was his team's 2002 Champions of Character Award winner.

Chud was born and raised in Alaska, but his career in soccer has taken him all over the world. After graduating from high school, he moved to Europe playing at a high level in Germany and England for three years. He then returned to the U.S. and enrolled at Northwest U.

Following his graduation from Northwest U, Bryan and his wife Breanna moved to Dungannon, North Ireland, where he played for the Irish Premier League for 10 years with Ambassadors FC. While with AFC, he was the all-time leading goal-scorer while garnering four Promotions, three Player' Player of the Year awards and helping the squad to the Mid-Ulster Cup Championship in 2012.

While in Northern Ireland, he served six years as a youth pastor and was also instrumental in establishing the charity, Ambassadors in Sport and his involvement with the Ambassadors allowed him to travel to Africa—Sudan, Senegal, Mozambique and South Africa as a player and coach.

Coach Chud has earned his Level 1 and Level 2 coaching licenses from the Irish Football Association and recently received his UEFA B Part 1 license.

After 12 years in Northern Ireland, Bryan and his wife Breanna, along with their twin sons, Kidran and Cohen, moved back to the Pacific Northwest. The family attends Bellevue Presbyterian Church.

Chud enjoys skiing, music (guitar/drums), family time, hiking, cliff diving, adrenaline adventure and traveling.

Scott Lane came to Northwest as an assistant men's soccer coach in 2014 and joined the women's staff a year later.

In addition to his duties at NU, Lane is head soccer coach at The Overlake School and an assistant with Seattle Stars FC. He had previously served as the JV Head Coach at Overlake from 2014-17.

He guided The Overlake School to championships in 2017 and 2018, earning WSSCA Coach of the Year honors in 2018. He also has a pair of ECL Boys' Soccer Coach of the Year honor to his credit.

Lane was a member of the Eagle soccer team as a goalkeeper after a year at Edmonds Community College. He earned All-Region Status at ECC.

Lane, who hails from Snohomish, earned his bachelor's degree in biology from NU in 2014 and a CMA for Lake Washington Institute of Technology in 2017.

He attends Pathways Church and enjoys golf, paddle-boarding, skiing, hiking and puns.

Brendon Wheeler returned to his alma mater and joined Bryan Chud's women's soccer staff at Northwest in 2016.

Wheeler coached two seasons as an assistant at Snohomish High School, helping his hometown team to a pair of 4A State Titles.

He capped a stellar playing career with the Eagle Men's Soccer program with a degree in business administration in 2016. Wheeler was an All-Cascade Conference player and scholar-athlete. He played in 67 games during his NU career.
