-Coach Clint Killough has the opportunity to tie the record for most wins as a UIW head coach (24) against Northwestern State.

-UIW has the second best rushing defense in the Southland, allowing less than 1,000 yards on the ground this season.

-Keeping the chains moving is the name of the game and the Cardinals have made 200 this season, the most in the SLC.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

-EJ Colson continues to be one of the most efficient quarterbacks not only in the Southland but in all of FCS football. After completing 75 percent of his passes against Lamar his average for the season is back over 70 percent.

-Declan Williams continues to be a problem for opposing offenses, making 13 total tackles, with two sacks, and forcing a fumble last week.

-Jalen Walthall has cemented himself as a top receiver in the conference once again moving into the top-5 of the Southland for receptions and receiving yards per game.

-Josh Lorick had a career game against Lamar making eight catches for 90 yards and a touchdown.

CARDINALS VS DEMONS

-This weeks match up will be the first time these two conference foes will face off since the 2022 season when UIW defeated Northwestern State 66-7 in Natchitoches.

NATCHITOCHES, La. – For the second season in a row, the University of the Incarnate Word football team was crowned Southland Conference Champions. The Cardinals defeated the Demons of Northwestern State University, 66-7, on Saturday afternoon to clinch a share of the Southland Conference title. UIW now awaits its draw during the NCAA FCS Playoff Selection Show on Sunday, Nov. 20, at 11:30 a.m. on ESPNU.

Multiple team and individual records were broken in the final regular season game. Lindsey Scott Jr. finished with six touchdowns, five in the air and one on the ground. Marcus Cooper rushed for two touchdowns and 267 yards to surpass 1,000 yards on the season. Darion Chafin finished with three touchdowns off 143 yards.

The Demons wrapped up a five-minute starting drive with a touchdown to start the game, 7-0. UIW responded, scoring 66 unanswered points.

Cooper rushed 19 yards before Chafin bullied his way into the endzone to tie the game. With that touchdown, the 2022 Cardinals became the team with the most touchdowns responsible for in program history with 120.

Scott then found Taylor Grimes deep left for a touchdown to end the first quarter up, 14-7, and surpass the team season record for most touchdowns in a season with 49.

In the second, Scott took it himself 18 yards to the house (21-7) before scooping the ball to Jaelin Campbell for another Cardinal touchdown. This marked three passing touchdowns for Scott on the game, crowning him the new season passing touchdowns record holder with 48. UIW held the Demons scoreless in the second quarter and Carson Mohr nailed a 31-yard field goal to end the

half, 31-7.

Chafin leaked out for a touchdown off a 51-yard pass from Scott, then Cooper rushed down the middle for a 67-yard TD. Chafin scored once more and Elliott Davison intercepted the Demons to end the third, 52-7.

Cooper opened up the fourth quarter with a 78-yard touchdown to put him over 1,000 rushing yards this season. Jarrell Wiley came in to score another Cardinal touchdown as UIW took the game 66-7 to become Southland Conference Champions.

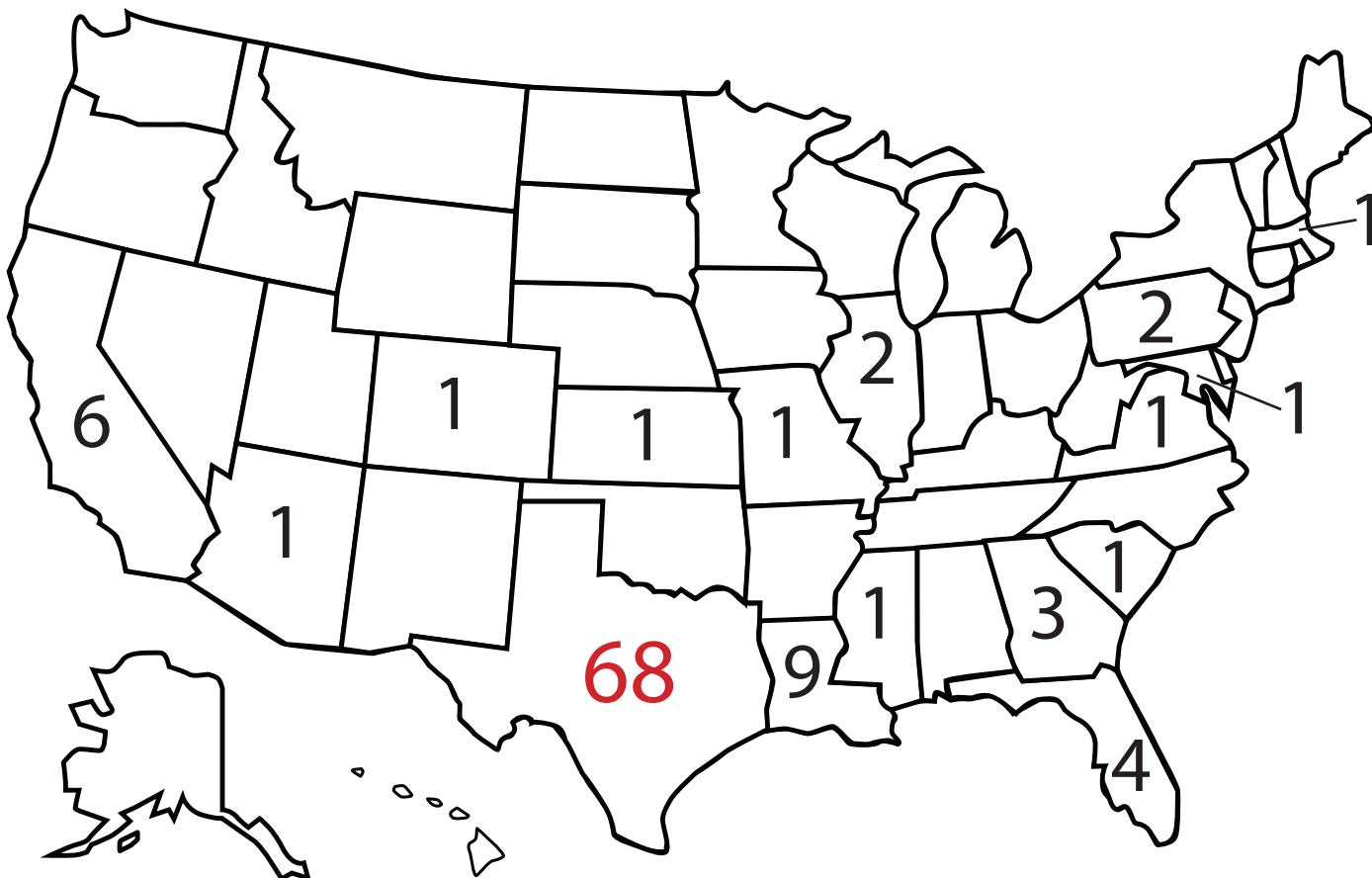

CARDINALS IN THE PLAYOFFS

- The Cardinals have appeared in the FCS playoffs four times, with the deepest run coming in 2022 when UIW made it to the semi-final
- Since 2018 the Cardinals have raked up four wins and suffered four losses in the postseason.
- UIW holds the record for most points scored in an FCS playoff game with 66 in the highest scoring game in FCS playoff history (66-63 vs Sacramento State)
- Wins haven't come easy in the playoff as the Cardinals have an average margin of victory of 4.5 points with one of those wins coming in over time.
- The Cardinals have adopted the slogan #NORTH this season, acknowledging the path to the National Championship running through the area. UIW has played five of its eight playoff games on the road all #NORTH of campus down in San Antonio.

EJ COLSON (QB1)

A transfer from the University of Central Florida (UCF) EJ appeared in three games and made one start for the Golden Knights. He joined the Cardinals in fall camp and was placed at No. 2 on the depth chart. After a rough start for the Cardinals against UTSA Colson made an appearance in the second half. He instantly gave UIW a spark throwing for 213 yards and three touchdowns while completing 71 percent of his throws. His performance earned him the starting job against Northern Arizona.



CAM WARD (The No. 1 Pick)

Cam racked up numerous awards in his time at UIW including being named to FCS All-American Second Team, Southland Conference Offensive Player of the Year and All-Conference first team, was a Walter Payton Award Finalist, given to the most outstanding offensive player in FCS Football, won the Jerry Rice Award, led UIW to a Southland Conference Championship, and into the second round of the FCS playoffs. Ward also set numerous game, season, and career records, 13 of which still stand as of the start of the 2025 season. On top of this he was the only passer in UIW history to throw for 600+ yards in a game and has five 400+ yard games. After leaving UIW he would go on to play for Washington State, Miami, and now the Titans.



LINDSEY SCOTT JR.

Scott joined the Cardinals in 2022 and picked up right where Cam Ward left off. He led the Cardinals to their deepest playoff run in school history and was four points away from taking UIW to it's first National Championship. All the while Scott was etching his name in the history books. Years after Scott left the Word for the USFL and the CFB coaching ranks four game records, eight season records, five career records still stand in the UIW football record book. He is currently an assistant QB coach at Texas Tech.



ZACH CALZADA

Another FBS Transfer, Calzada, played two seasons for the Cardinals was named SLC Newcomer of the Year in 2023, Player of the year in 2024, and named to the All-Conference Team twice. He was named AP and Stats Perform All-American. Calzada threw for more than 6,00 yards and scored more than 60 touchdowns. In his final season as a Cardinal he led UIW to the FCS Playoffs Quarterfinal. He now plays for the University of Kentucky.



Clint Killough - Head Football Coach

Clint Killough, a former UIW student-athlete and associate head coach, was promoted to the position of UIW head football coach in December of 2022. Killough was named head coach in the midst of the best season in program history, heading to the FCS Semifinals for the deepest playoff run in the UIW football era.

His second season was one for the books. The Cardinals rolled through the regular season never leaving the FCS Top-25 and went 7-0 in conference play, 11-3 overall. UIW claimed its third Southland title in four years and earned a first round bye in the FCS Playoffs. The Cards took down Villanova 13-6 in round two and eventually fell to South Dakota State in the quarterfinal.

Under the lead of coach Killough five Cardinals were named FCS All-Americans and five were named to the Dave Campbell's All-Texas Team. Zach Calzada reigned as the SLC Player of the Year and 15 players found a spot on the Southland All-Conference team.

Killough's Cardinals got it done on and off the field as five student-athletes earned Southland All-Academic Team honors including Student-Athlete of the Year, Roy Alexander.

Alexander was one half of the best receiving duo in the country. Him and Jalen Walthall accounted for 185 catches, 27 touchdowns and nearly 3,000 yards through the air.

He went on to be named Southland Conference Coach of the Year and was an Eddie Robinson Award Finalist.

In his inaugural season, the 2023 UIW football team finished with a 9-2 (6-1 SLC) overall record, marking the third-most wins in program

history behind 2022 and 2021. Killough took over a program that saw 66 total departures from the 2022 roster and rebuilt the Cardinals into a conference championship-contending team with only one returning defensive starter and three returning offensive starters. Killough, along with his new coaching staff, united the 2023 Cardinals to become the top statistical offense (total offense and scoring offense) and statistical defense (total defense and scoring defense) in the Southland Conference. Nationally, the Cardinals reached rankings in five different defensive categories and four offensive categories. Defensively, UIW finished first for team passing efficiency defense, tied for fourth for defensive touchdowns, fifth in third down conversion percentage, eighth for first downs defense, and tenth for total defense. Offensively, UIW ended the season ranked second in the nation for passing offense, second in total offense, eleventh for team passing efficiency, and twelfth for scoring offense.

The Cardinals appeared in the Coaches Poll Top 25 and FCS Stats Perform Top 25 Rankings every week during the 2023 season, coming in as high as No. 4 in weeks six and seven. UIW had been active in the rankings for 37 straight weeks, the fifth-longest streak in the nation behind North Dakota State, South Dakota State, Montana, and Montana State.

The 2022 Cardinals, with Killough as associate head coach and wide receivers coach, rewrote the record book. The team had two wide receivers sitting in the top five in FCS for receiving touchdowns and receiving yards after winning back-to-back Southland Conference Championships.

Killough, a UIW alum, played for the Cardinals for three seasons (2013-2015) before returning to UIW in 2018 as the quality control coach for the inside receivers. He quickly climbed the coaching ranks as he was elevated to associate head coach/wide receivers coach/recruiting coordinator in January of 2022. Killough has been with the program through all three Southland Conference Championships ('18, '21, '22) and all three FCS Playoff runs.

Upon winning the 2021 Southland Conference Championship, the Cardinals defeated Stephen F. Austin to advance to the second round of the FCS Playoffs. Killough mentored a wide receiver core in an offense that threw for 4,680 yards and 48 touchdowns. Robert Ferrel nabbed a first team All-Southland Conference honor, while Trevor Begue, currently playing with the Edmonton Elks (CFL), produced 474 receiving yards and six touchdowns.

Even through the shortened 2021 spring season, the Cardinals achieved their highest ranking in school history (No. 13) while Killough guided the top two wide receivers in Tre Wolf and Ferrel. Ferrel produced 474 receiving yards and six TDs, while Wolf added 467 yards and two touch-

downs. Ferrel finished the season with second team all-conference honors.

In 2019, Killough coached Kam Williams to become the program's first student-athlete to average 100 receiving yards per game through five games while also adding four touchdowns and 35 receptions.

During his first coaching season at UIW, Killough mentored Kody Edwards and Phillip Baptiste to first team All-SLC selections. Baptiste broke the single-season program record for receptions (59), total points (357), and receptions per game (5.36). Edwards set program bests with five 100-yard receiving outings and 1,389 all-purpose yards while breaking the program record for career receiving yards (2,353) and receptions (140). As a program, the 2018 team set multiple records to include total offense (5,315), total points (357) and touchdowns (48) as it finished the season with the first Southland Conference Championship and berth to the FCS Playoffs.

Killough began his career in 2017 at Bowling Green State University under Head Coach Mike Jinks. He worked directly under Defensive Coordinator Perry Eliano as the defensive backs/ special teams graduate assistant while also serving as the WRs graduate assistant under coach Seth Doege.

Graduating from UIW in 2015, Killough obtained a Bachelor of Business Administration in Finance.

Football Falls to Colonels in Week 0

THIBODAUX, La. - The University of the Incarnate Word football team fell to the Nicholls Colonels, 20-6, in the opening game of the 2025 season on Saturday afternoon.

AJ Tisdell led the team in tackles, racking up eight solo on the day. Kendrick Stone wasn't far behind with seven total tackles with one tackle for loss. As a team the Cardinals only allowed 89 yards on the ground and forced one fumble.

The Cardinals had a strong first drive, moving the ball on the ground and through the air. However, things stalled in the red zone and the UIW 10 play 58 yard drive finished with a field goal, putting the Cards up 3-0.

The UIW defense stood strong only allowing two field goals through the first 30 minutes, but the Colonels took advantage of a turnover, turning it into a score. The Cardinals trailed 13-3 at the break.

In the second half the Cardinals had an opportunity to punch it in after a muffed punt gave UIW the ball on the 11 yard line. Once again the Cards couldn't find the endzone and instead cut the lead to a single score with another Will Farris field goal.

In the fourth quarter the defense gave up it's first touchdown of the game and the Cardinals fell by a final score of 20-6.

UIW will be back in action next Saturday when the Cardinals host Eastern Washington at Benson Stadium.



Cardinals Bounce Back With Win Over Eastern Washington

SAN ANTONIO – The University of the Incarnate Word football extended its home win streak with a 31-21 win over Eastern Washington on Saturday afternoon.

Jameson Garcia ended the game with six catches, 146 yards, and one touchdown. Richard Torres ended the game with 332 yards on 27 completions, including a touchdown and 153.1 QBR. Harlan Dixon led the team on the ground with 75 yards on 14 carries and two touchdowns.

To start the game the Eagles drove the ball to the Cardinals 22 yard line, following a pass interference call on UIW. Eagles quarterback Nate Bell drops back and passes into the UIW endzone to be picked off by cornerback Barry Dillion for a touchback.

After the EWU turnover, UIW quarterback Torres leads an 80-yard drive to set up a rushing touchdown from Dixon to put the Cards up 7-0.

The Cards kick off the second quarter with back-to-back impact plays, starting with a 29 yard punt return from Josh Lorick and a pass from Torres to Player of the Game, Garcia for 19 yards, prompting the Cardinals on the Eagles 30 yard line.

At the one yard line, running back Timothy Carter stretches over the crowd of linemen for a Cardinal touchdown to increase the lead, 14-0.

The Eagles responded with a 71 yard drive to the endzone with a rushing touchdown from Marceese Yetts to narrow the lead 14-7.

Following the EWU touchdown, Torres responds on the very next play by heaving a 75-yard touchdown to Garcia adding seven points to their lead, 21-7.

EWU once again had life after recovering a muffed punt inside the 10 yard line. The Eagles scored on the ensuing drive and once again on the following dive to knot things up at 21.

With 30 seconds left in the half with no timeouts, Torres slings it to Lorick on the sideline to stop the clock seven seconds. UIW kicker Will Farris attempts a field goal to close the half and the Cardinals successfully take back their lead 24-21 going into halftime.

Both the Cardinals and Eagles were at a stalemate starting the second half, with neither team scoring through the 15 minute quarter.

Harlan Dixon added another touchdown to the scoreboard putting the finishing touches on the 31-21 win for the Cardinals.



Football Falls in Hometown Showdown

SAN ANTONIO – The University of the Incarnate Word fell to the UTSA Roadrunners 48-20 in the Alamodome on Saturday, moving the team's record to 1-2 on the season.

EJ Colson came in the second half and racked up 213 passing yards and three touchdowns while completing 71 percent of his throws. Chedon James led all receivers with 134 yards and three touchdowns. Declan Williams was just one tackle shy of entering the top-five for most tackles in a single game at UIW with 14 total on the day.

Things did not go the Cardinals way in the first quarter with two turnovers and a punt in the opening drives. On the other side UTSA was able to put together two scoring drives. In the final play of the first, down 10-0, the Cardinals looked to be given life when Declan Williams forced a fumble in Roadrunner territory.

However, after review, it was determined that the ball was not snapped before the clock hit all zeroes and the turnover was taken off the board. The Cardinals gave up two more touchdowns in the half and went into the break down 24-0.

In the second half the Cardinals made a change at QB. EJ Colson led UIW on a three-play 50-yard drive that was capped off with a Chedon James touchdown catch, the first touchdown of the season for each of them. The next time out the Cardinals went

on a more methodical 11 play drive, moving the ball through the air and on the ground. Once again UIW put points on the board when Colson found James in the end zone, making the score 14-38. The duo of Colson and James would connect one more time, in the fourth quarter, for the third Cardinals touchdown of the day.

While the offense picked up the pace in the second half, it wasn't enough to cut into the Roadrunner lead, and the Cardinals fell by a final score of 48-20.



Cardinals Lose in Top-20 Showdown

FLAGSTAFF, AZ – The University of the Incarnate Word football team fell in a top-20 matchup against the Northern Arizona Lumberjacks on Saturday afternoon.

EJ Colson had another outstanding game throwing for 292 yards and two touchdowns. His number one target was Jameson Garcia who went for 162 yards and two touchdowns.

The Cardinals started behind the eight-ball once again as Northern Arizona found success on the ground and through the air, and striking first holding a 7-0 lead through the first quarter. On it's third drive of the game UIW started deep in enemy territory on the 13-yard line. The Cardinals marched down the field and into the red zone. The drive stalled there, but UIW was able to walk away with it's first points of the game thanks a Will Faris field goal.

The Faris field goal gave the Cardinals life as the defense forced a three-and-out on the ensuing drive and putting the ball back in the hands of the UIW offense. On this drive EJ Colson was able to get the ball to his biggest playmakers. He found Chedon James for a 28-yard completion and later hooked up with Jameson Garcia for what turned into a 47-yard touchdown, giving UIW it's first lead of the game.

The Lumberjacks quickly took the lead after scoring another touchdown, 14-10. The two teams would battle back and forth through the final minutes of the half. After muffed punt nearly gave UIW the ball in plus territory, NAU was set up on the 40

yard line. UIW gave up one first down but held strong not allowing the Lumberjacks into field goal range. With two seconds left on the clock the Cardinals looked head into the locker room just down four. However, the Lumberjacks took a shot to the end zone and converted, pushing the lead to 11, 21-10.

The score remained the same until late in the third quarter when the Cardinals once again found themselves in the red zone. UIW lined up in a heavy package to help with the run, Lontrell Turner was able to find the edge and score his first touchdown of the year in his first game of the year. The Cardinals missed the extra point and the score was now 21-16.

It was the Lumberjacks matched the Cardinal third quarter touchdown extending their lead to 12, 28-16, but EJ wasn't done. To start the fourth Colson led a 10-play, 75-yard scoring drive to keep the Cardinals in striking distance, 23-28.

Northern Arizona tacked on another three points with a 50-yard field goal. Down by eight the Cardinals were still alive in the final minutes, but, were unable to find the end zone and fell by a final score of 31-23.



SAN ANTONIO - The University of Incarnate Word football team dominated the Abilene Christian University Wildcats, 38-7, on Saturday Sept. 27 at Benson Field. This pushes the Cardinal home win streak to nine straight, 25-1 since the 2021 season.

The Cardinals rushed for 301 yards, averaging more than five yards per carry. Lontrell Turner led the team 118 yards on the ground. Quarterback EJ Colson wasn't far behind with 103 and had 122 through the air, scoring three touchdowns. Linebacker Declan Williams exploded for one interception, one sack, two tackles for loss.

The Cardinals looked to be in trouble after a 66 yard rush from Wildcat running back which set up what would be the only score of the game for ACU.

Following that drive, Colson helped spark the Cardinals with a four-yard pass over Wildcat defensive back to wideout Jalen Walthall. This marks Walt's first trip to the endzone this season.

On the ensuing drive UIW put more points on the board with a field goal from Will Faris. In the second quarter Colson scrambled for his second touchdown of the game, extending the

Cardinal lead to 17-7 in the second quarter.

With 30 seconds left in the second quarter, the Wildcats approached the Cardinals two yard line to score before the end of half. Their quarterback Stone Earle throws a pass and is deflected by defensive back Matt Kordas and ricochets into the hands of defensive lineman Michael Pleas Jr., his first collegiate interception.

A critical fourth down on the Wildcat 34 yard line, Colson completed a pass to Turner to continue the opening drive of the second half. He would later end up scoring his second rushing touchdown to increase the score 24-7 in the third quarter.

On the Wildcats' first drive following a UIW touchdown, linebacker Williams leaped for an interception at the 28 yard line and returned it for a pick six.

The Cardinals recorded back to back sacks from linebackers Williams and Dune Smith to shut the Wildcat drive down early in the fourth quarter.

Turner exploded for a 55 yard rush into the redzone approaching the final two minutes in the game. Running back Jaylon Spears would rush for a 11 yard touchdown with one minute left on the clock, ending the final score with UIW victorious 38-7.



SAN ANTONIO- The University of the Incarnate Word football team fell short at home against Stephen F. Austin on Oct. 4, 31-17.

The Cardinals fell behind 14-0 early after turning the ball over twice in the first 15 minutes. Despite the slow start, UIW still found a way to move the ball down the field and put points on the board before the quarter's end. This is the third time that Will Faris has scored the first points of the game for the Cardinals, as UIW went into the second trailing 14-3.

The Lumberjacks' touchdown plays continued to get longer, after scoring on a 20 and 37-yard passes in the first, took it in from 47 yards out to push the SFA lead to 24-3. In the second quarter, the Cardinals' only points once again came from Will Faris, who this time converted on a 34-yard field goal, making the score 24-6. On the final drive of the half, Joe Cadette sacked the SFA quarterback, giving the Cardinals two on the night. Coming into the game, UIW had successfully taken down the QB twice this season.

The third quarter of Cardinal football was quiet, tallying zero points. The defensive line held the Lumberjacks to 79 yards on 29 carries (2.2 YPC) and six tackles for loss. The Cardinals ended the game doubling their sack total on the year with two.

Edge rusher Talib Salahuddin was a menace in the trenches, posting one sack, one tackle for loss, and two QB hurries.

The Cardinals turned it on in the fourth quarter, scoring 11 of the 17 points in 15 minutes, starting with a 37-yard field goal from Will Farris, tying his longest this season. Wide receiver Josh Lorrick brought home the lone Cardinal touchdown from 16 yards out with 1:18 left in the fourth quarter. Following the touchdown, running back Jaylon Spears punches in a 2-point conversion, which would be the final point scored in the game, ending 31-17



SAN ANTONIO – The University of the Incarnate Word football team narrowly fell to the East Texas A&M Lions, 52-45, on Saturday night.

Jaylon Spears led the way on the ground with 92 yards and three touchdowns. John Mathis had three total tackles and two sacks to go along with two forced fumbles. Will Farris set a new UIW record with a 57-yard field goal to tie the game at 45 late in the fourth.

The Cardinals started strong with an opening drive that went for nine plays and 67 yards and ended with a Jaylon Spears touchdown. Just four plays later East Texas knotted things up at seven a piece.

On the second UIW offensive drive of the day Spears carried the load. The first four snaps went to number one, and he finished off the drive breaking tackles and rumbling down for a 10-yard touchdown.

The Cardinal defense made a key fourth-down stand to give UIW the ball on the 33. EJ Colson found Jalen Walthall twice, the second time wide open in the endzone putting the Cardinals up 21-7. UIW had scored a total of 21 through each of their first six first quarters and tied that total today.

With 33 seconds remaining in the first, John Mathis forced a fumble that was recovered by Declan Williams giving the Cardinal offense great field position once again. This time Austin Samaha punched it in from the 1-yard line for his first score of the season. UIW led 28-7 early in the second quarter.

Momentum was flipped in the second as East Texas was able to score two unanswered touchdowns and had the ball with 2:06 to go in the half. Once again, the UIW defense stood tough and forced a three and out giving the UIW offense time to work. Colson connected with Walt more than 30 yards down field. This set up an easy third touchdown for Spears, sending UIW into the locker room with a 35-21 lead.

The Lions would not go quietly and scored the opening touchdown of the second half to bring the deficit to one score. UIW responded when Colson found Josh Lorick in the back of the endzone for an amazing catch to keep the Cardinals in charge of the game in the third quarter.

East Texas went on to score 17 straight points, taking their first lead of the game 45-42. With two minutes remaining Will Farris stepped up to a 57-yard field goal and knocked it down to tie the game.

The Lions marched down the field and scored, leaving UIW with 27 seconds to respond. The Cardinals were unable to find the endzone and fell by a final score of 45-52.



EDINBURG, Texas – The University of the Incarnate Word football team lost to the UTRGV Vaqueros 28-56 on Saturday night.

Jalen Walthall had 220 yards on 10 catches and two touchdowns. EJ Colson threw for 339 yards and added 61 more on the ground along with one rushing touchdown.

The Cardinals could not get anything going in the first half. With only a total of 88 yards and five first downs in two quarters UIW trailed 35-0 going into the break.

UIW came out of the locker room on fire, on just the second play of the third EJ Colson found Jalen Walthall on the right side of the field, Walt broke a few tackles and was off to the endzone for the first Cardinal score of the game.

The next time the ball was in his hands Colson was responsible for 54 of the 79 yards which was capped off with a 22-yard scramble for another TD. UIW's defense continued to stand strong, forcing a three-and-out, giving Colson and the Cardinal the ball once again. Walthall and EJ couldn't be stopped in the opening minutes of the third as the two linked up once again on a 54-yard pass and catch, setting UIW up in great field position. The drive was ended when Harlan Dixon found his way into the endzone cutting the deficit to just two scores, 21-35.

UTRGV wouldn't be held to zero in the quarter and put seven on the board. The Cardinals went into the fourth with new life despite trailing 42-21.

Walthall picked up right where he left off in the fourth. After making a catch that moved the chains on 4th & 10 Walt made a falling down catch while covered by two Vaqueros, keeping UIW in striking distance down 28-35.

The scoring would end there for the Cardinals and the Vaqueros added and few more as UIW ended the night with a 28-56 loss.

The Cardinals start the new month with a win against the number 14-ranked FCS football team, Lamar University Cardinals, increasing UIW's record to 3-6. This marks Lamar's first defeat since week one against the University of North Texas.

The Cards dominated Lamar on homecoming night, only allowing nine first downs to UIW's 17. The UIW defensive line harassed Lamar with four sacks, six tackles for loss and four QB hurries. Freshman quarterback for UIW, EJ Colson, started the game on fire, throwing three passes for touchdowns in the first half. One of the touchdowns was caught by wide receiver Josh Lorick, who had 90 yards on the day.

The first quarter saw the UIW Cardinals hold Lamar to 4 yards passing and -7 yards rushing. The Cards tallied two sacks in the first 15 minutes with help from defensive linemen Talib Shalahuddin and half sacks from Jeremiah Young and John Mathis.

Colson led a 14-play drive to Lamar territory for a one-yard shuttle pass to Jalen Walthall, his fifth of the season, to go up 7-0.

In the second quarter, Colson continues to spread the ball through the air with an eight-yard touchdown pass (14-0) to tight end Jackson Lowe. He has played in all eight games this 2025 campaign and recorded his first touchdown

Following the UIW Cardinal touchdown, Lamar drove down the field for a 41-yard field goal to crawl back into this game, 14-3.

Cardinal momentum continues at home following Lamar's field goal. Colson airs the ball to receiver Lorick for a 45-yard touch-

down reception (21-3), his longest catch as a Cardinal.

The UIW Cardinals had more than double Lamar's total yards at half (183) and held onto an 18 point lead in the first 30 minutes of play.

The third quarter found both Cardinal teams punting three times and a Lamar turnover on downs.

On the third UIW drive of the third quarter, the Cardinals need two yards to convert on fourth down for a chance at increasing the three score lead. Colson sprints towards the right sideline and spins around a Lamar defender to cross the line for a first down, leading to a Will Faris field goal from 39 yards out (24-3).

75 yards Lamar drove to close the third quarter and bled three minutes into the fourth quarter. They would punch in their first touchdown in the game (24-10) with a one yard rush attempt in the redzone.

Lamar would score again late in the fourth quarter on an eight-yard reception to make it a one score game – 24-17. They would attempt at an onside kick, but would draw a flag instead and give the ball back to the UIW Cardinals to close out the game.

Previous Notes

VS Lamar

- UIW averages the second most yards of offense per game (395) in the Southland Conference (SLC) heading into week nine.
- The Cardinal defense ranks third-fewest in rushing yards per game (115.4) in the SLC this campaign.
- The electric Jalen "Walt" Walthall had a career night against the Vaqueros last Saturday, catching 10 passes for a career high 220 yards. Walt's longest reception went for 69 yards and a touchdown immediately after the second half began. His 220-yard performance is the first of its kind since 2022.
- The last person to achieve this feat was a UIW alumnus receiver, Darion Chafin, with 262 yards on seven receptions.
- Despite becoming the starter two weeks into the season, freshman quarterback EJ Colson is third in passing yards (1,560) with the highest completion percentage in the conference (69.9). He also has the second-most yards on the ground for quarterbacks (251) in the SLC.
- Declan Williams is a force that opposing offenses have to reckon with as he's in the top-5 in the SLC for total tackles for loss (8). UIW has two top-10 linebackers with the most tackles in Williams (65) and fellow linebacker Dune Smith (62).
- Red bird versus red bird is a yearly battle they've competed in since 2011. The UIW Cardinals have won the last five matchups and lead the all-time series against Lamar 7-4.

@ UTRGV

- The Cardinals have the third best rush defense in the SLC only giving up 815 yards on the ground this season.
- UIW offense is averaging the second most yards through the air this season with 267.2 yards.
- The Cardinal's offensive play calling continues to be efficient in the redzone, as they are tied for first in redzone offense by scoring on 24 of their 28 attempts in the oppo-

ment's scoring territory.

- Jalen Walthall's nine catches for 96 yards put him over 2,000 career yards.
- Jaylon Spears has the fifth most rush yards in the Southland with 316.
- EJ Colson has completed 122 passes this season which is more than any other quarterback in the Southland this year.
- John Mathis only had three tackles against East Texas but still managed to force two fumbles.
- While this will be the first match up between the two schools in football, the Cardinals and Vaqueros have played against one another in almost every other team sport including volleyball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's soccer, along with baseball.

VS East Texas

- The Cardinals begin drives more efficiently than any other team in the Southland. They lead the conference in total first downs (136) and have the most yards averaged on first down (22.7). This dominance continues in their fourth-down playbook, as they are tied for second in total fourth-down conversions (10).
- The Cardinal's offensive play calling continues to be efficient in the redzone, as they are tied for second in scoring on 19 of their 23 attempts in the opponent's scoring territory.
- Freshman quarterback EJ Colson has been explosive through the air and on the ground. He is second behind running back Jaylon Spears with 160 rushing yards and is within the top 5 total passing yards in the SLC, along with being one of the most efficient passers in the FCS, completing 71% of his attempts.
- The UIW receiving core continues to dominate the SLC despite last week's bye. Jameson Garcia and Chedon James are top-5 in receiving yards and combined for six touchdowns in six games.
- Kicker Will Faris ties the most field goals made this season in the Southland with eight (88.9% FG)
- The Cardinals will look to get back on track after their first loss at home since the 2023 season.
- UIW has never lost to East Texas A&M, through six games going back to when neither school was Division I in 2010.

VS SFA

- Despite rushing for more than 300 yards against ACU, the Cardinals still have two of the top-5 receivers in the league. Jameson Garcia has 354 yards and Chedon James is right behind at 330. Both have caught three TDs.
- UIW has kept the chains moving all season with 115 first downs and eight fourth down conversions, second most in the SLC. The Cardinals also have found a way to keep drives alive with the most third-down conversions in the league with 31.
- The UIW streak of being ranked inside a national top-25 poll moves to 59 weeks after making the jump to No. 20 in the AFCA Coaches Poll.
- Linebacker Declan Williams earned Southland Conference Player of the Week honors after racking up eight tackles, two tackles for loss, one sack and an interception that he took back for a touchdown.
- Freshman EJ Colson third quarterback in UIW history to pass and rush for over 100 yards in a single game. He is second best completion percentage (69.2%) and has the second-best passing efficiency (150.1). His 177 yards on the ground is top-10 in the SLC.
- Bary Dillion has four pass breakups and an interception in five games, which is tied for second in the SLC.
- The Cardinals defeated the Lumberjacks 27-20 clinching the 2024 Southland Conference title last season.
- UIW is 3-5 all time against SFA but have a 2-1 record against the 'Jacks in Benson Stadium.
- UIW has won the last two matchups, both by seven points, and three of the last four

against SFA.

VS ACU

- The Cardinals have a top-15 passing offence in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), while having two different starting quarterbacks this season.
- The UIW backfield has rushed for over 470 yards in four games this season.
- Last week, the Cardinals lost against Northern Arizona University in a top-20 showdown, 23-31. They finished the game with more yards on the ground and through the air while staying efficient in the red zone, going three for three in scoring position.
- In his first game as the starter, quarterback EJ Colson aired it out with 292 passing yards, two touchdowns and 59 yards rushing. Colson currently ranks within the top-10 in passing efficiency (173.79).
- Jameson Garcia is having a breakout season with over 340 yards on 23 catches. Garcia has two games with receiving yards over the century mark, while pairing them with three touchdowns.
- Talib Salahuddin had a great game against NAU last Saturday, recording four quarterback hits in a competitive matchup.
- The lone UIW win this season came at home vs Eastern Washington.
- Cardinals have won eight straight home games.
- UIW has a 24-1 record at Benson Stadium going back to the 2021 fall season when Cam Ward was at the helm.

@ Nicholls

- The Cardinals finished 7-0 in conference play last season claiming their fourth Southland title ever and the third in the last four seasons. The last SLC championship that wasn't claimed by UIW went to Nicholls in 2023.
- After earning a bye through the first round of the FCS Playoffs UIW took down Villanova in round two. The Cardinal's season would come to an end in the quarterfinal after falling to South Dakota State in the second match up of the 2024 season.
- There are high expectations for the Cardinals coming into the year. UIW was picked first in the SLC Preseason Poll for the first time in school history. Along with this the Cardinals were ranked No. 4 by the AFCA Coach's and No. 5 in the Stats Perform Preseason Polls.
- Jalen Walthall: One of the nation's best receivers, Walt finished last season with the third most receiving yards (1290) and touchdowns (14). He has six games with 100+ receiving yards and four games with at least two touchdowns.
- Richard Torres: In his third season at UIW Torres was named QB1. Despite not being the starter he has made his mark at the Quarterback position stepping up in key moments. Most notably when he earned FCS National Freshman of the Week after leading a second half comeback on the road against McNeese that saw 28 unanswered from the Cardinals.
- Declan Williams: After a stellar first year on the d-Line where Declan played all 14 games for the Cardinals and was named First Team All-Conference, he is poised for another great season, this time at linebacker. He was named a Preseason All-American by Stats Perform, Phil Steele, and FCS Football Nation.
- Dune Smith: Another guy who has made the switch to linebacker "The Gravedigger" was the second leading tackler for the Cardinals in 2024 and is now in a position to beat his 80 total tackles from just a year ago.
- Jaylon Spears and Tyler Morton: The Cardinals have amassed talent from near and far, however, they were able to make two key additions to the squad from their SLC week 0 opponent in Nicholls. Each played in 11 games for the Colonels in 2024 and bring a wealth college football experience to the team.

VS Eastern Washington

- The Cardinals look to bounce back after starting their season off 0-1 against Nicholls State University (NSU) last week. Over the past 10 years, UIW has battled competitively against the Colonels, with an all time record of 6-7.

Previous Notes

On defense, the Cardinals halted running back Miequle Brock Jr. to 22 yards on 10 carries. Brock was awarded Southland Conference Freshman of the Year in 2024. The Colonels

UIW's undefeated home record is on the line this weekend. Stretching back to last season, the Cardinals earned their 7-0 record at Benson Stadium with the help of their defense, which held opposing teams to 16.5 points per game. Since 2024, the Cardinals' explosive offense has scored over 40 points per game at home.

-UIW's elite secondary consists of A.J. Tisdell and Kendrick Stone, who ended last week's game with 14 of the 39 tackles. Tisdell added one pass breakup, and Stone recorded one tackle for loss against Nicholls.

-The Cardinals have some new faces to look out for on offense in Chedon James and Jaylon Spears. Hailing from Fresno State University, James ended his first game in the black and red uniform with 5 catches for 59 yards against Nicholls State University.

-For Spears, this was a homecoming game as he spent the past four years at NSU. He ended with 15 attempts for 49 yards in his first game as a Cardinal.

@UTSA

-The Cardinals' secondary currently has nine total pass breakups, led by A.J. Tisdell and Barry Dillon, who are second and third in the Southland Conference rankings.

-The defensive line held opposing teams to three yards per rush attempt with 12 tackles for loss and 10 quarterback hits.

-The Cardinals have found themselves in the redzone 11 times this season and came away with points on 10 of those drives.

-UTSA is the lone FBS opponent on the UIW schedule this season. The Cardinals have two wins over FBS teams in the last four seasons.

-Richard Torres has 507 yards in his first two games of the 2025 season. He's averaging over 10 yards a completion with his longest being 75 yards for a touchdown to Jameson Garcia.

-Garcia currently leads the Cards in receiving yards with 146 on six catches and has the lone receiving touchdown on the team.

-Harlan Dixon leads the team in rushing touchdowns, with both coming from their win against Eastern Washington University.

@Northern Arizona

-Currently, the Cardinals are the only team in the Southland Conference with two receivers who have over 200 receiving yards this season.

-Led by both Cardinal quarterbacks, UIW tallied 23 first downs last week and 324 yards through the air. UIW is second in the Southland for total passing yards so far this season with 844.

-Last week, two of the three leading receivers wore black and red as Chedon James and Jameson Garcia found the ball in their hands eight times each.

-Keeping the ball in the hot hand, freshman quarterback EJ Colson completed 71 percent of his passes for 213 yards and three touchdowns in two quarters. He will start his first game for the Cardinals this Saturday against the Lumberjacks.

-Junior wide receiver Chedon James exploded for 134 yards against UTSA last Saturday. He currently ranks in the top 10 nationally for two categories, receptions per game (7) and receiving touchdowns (2).

-On defense, AJ Tisdell shares the number one ranking for solo tackles in the SLC (17) and is also third in pass breakups (3).

-Declan Williams made his mark on last week's game for the Cardinals with 14 tackles against UTSA last week. He was one tackle shy of entering the top five for most tackles in a single game at UIW.

-After missing some time due to injury Jalen Walthall, one of the best receiver's in the nation will make his return against Northern Arizona.

-Other Cardinal receivers have stepped up in the absence of Walt. Both Jameson Garcia and Chedon James put up 100+ yard games. Who will be the next Cardinal to have a breakout game? Or will Jalen prove he is just as strong post injury.
