THE GAME . . . The *Northeastern State RiverHawks* (0-1, 0-1 MIAA) will host the *Fort Hays State Tigers* (0-1, 0-1 MIAA) in the MIAA TV Game of the Week . . . the contest will also be Family Weekend at NSU . . . kickoff is set for 2:07 p.m. (CT) Sept. 13 at Doc Wadley Stadium (8,300) in Tahlequah, Oklahoma . . . the game can be heard live on KEOK 102.1 FM in Tahlequah with Bill Huddleston and Sean Rowley providing commentary . . . a free audio broadcast can be found at goriverhawksgo.com . . . the game will also be streamed live on Stretch Internet (<http://portal.stretchinternet.com/nsu/>, subscription based) . . . the MIAA TV Network can be viewed in Oklahoma on Cox Communications, which serves the Tulsa and Oklahoma City markets . . . a football-only season pass is available for \$69.95, and a day pass can be purchased for \$9.95.

THE MATCHUP . . . Saturday's contest will be just the third meeting all-time between Northeastern State and Fort Hays State . . . the RiverHawks hold a 2-0 advantage in the series . . . the two teams locked up for the first time in their respective histories in 1989, with NSU securing a narrow 16-14 victory . . . Northeastern State won the return contest a year later by a 37-7 score . . . this will be the first meeting between the two programs as members of the same conference.

THE HEAD COACHES . . . NSU's **ROB ROBINSON** (William Jewell, '00) is in his first season as the RiverHawks head coach . . . he was named the 19th head football coach in school history on Dec. 19, 2013 . . . he owns a 0-1 all-time record . . . Robinson spent the previous 12 years under Craig Schurig as a member of the Washburn Ichabod coaching staff, serving as the offensive coordinator for the last four seasons . . . he also directed the running backs from 2007-13 and coached the wide receivers from 2002-06 . . . he served as the recruiting coordinator from 2002-10 and was the academic coordinator from 2010-13 . . . Robinson was an integral member of a Washburn staff that completely turned around the Ichabod program . . . Washburn averaged 3.3 wins from 1989-03 and had just one winning season, but the Ichabods averaged 7.9 wins from 2004-13 and posted 10 straight winning campaigns . . . Robinson is the second former coordinator under Schurig's tutelage to become the head coach of another program, joining Fort Hays State's Chris Brown . . . Robinson spent the 2001 season at Pittsburg State as a graduate assistant, coaching the defensive backs with Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig . . . the Gorillas won the MIAA Championship that year.

FHSU's **CHRIS BROWN** (Pittsburg State, '96) is in his fourth season as head coach of the Tigers . . . he owns a 15-19 overall record . . . Brown came to Fort Hays State from Washburn University, where he served as the defensive coordinator and defensive secondary coach from 2002-10 and assistant head coach in 2010 . . . the Tigers posted a 6-5

overall mark in 2013 for the school's first winning season since 2009 . . . FHSU went 4-7 in Brown's first year and followed that with a 5-6 mark in 2012 before the most recent record of 6-5, showing a one-win improvement in each year at the helm . . . FHSU enjoyed its most All-MIAA selections under Brown in 2013 with 12 (5 defense, 5 offense, and 2 special teams) . . . he has coached 28 All-MIAA selections at Fort Hays State, including two first-team selections in 2011 . . . before coming to Hays, Brown helped Washburn compile a 62-41 record in his nine-year span with the program, which included two NCAA playoff appearances and two bowl wins . . . in his time at Washburn, Brown coached the 2009 and 2006 MIAA Most Valuable Defensive Players and guided two players selected in the NFL Draft (defensive tackle Trey Lewis-6th round 2007, and cornerback Cary Williams-7th round 2008).

THE SEASON OPENER . . . Northeastern State opened the 2014 season against No. 9 Pittsburg State University for the third year in a row . . . the Rob Robinson debut was seen by the fourth-largest crowd in Carnie Smith Stadium history (10,814) . . . Steffon Herd made his first start on the defensive side of the ball and finished the game with a team-high eight tackles . . . six different RiverHawks made their first start in the green and white, and those were Romon Beard, Garrett Powell, Dakota Ritchie, Tyler Easter, Kevin Pantastico and Michael Davis . . . the contest also marked the first time NSU was shutout since Sept. 5, 2009 . . . the NSU defense held Jeff Seybold to a career-low 14 yards rushing . . . Seybold was an All-MIAA First Team member a year ago . . . the RiverHawks also had more fourth-down conversions (3-for-5) than third-down conversions (2-for-16).

THE RETURN OF THE ROCK . . . Joel Rockmore returned for his junior campaign after missing most of last year . . . the shifty running back was injured in the second game in 2013 and was awarded a medical redshirt . . . he made the start in the season opener and finished with 13 yards rushing before leaving with a minor injury . . . he currently has 1,760 career rushing yards, 15 career rushing touchdowns and 2,601 career all-purpose yards . . . he finished the 2012 campaign as the nation's 23rd-ranked rusher (113.8 ypg), and he was also 22nd in all-purpose yards (151.4 ypg) . . . he only rushed for 13 yards in the first two games of the season and averaged 126.4 yards rushing over the final eight games . . . he rushed for at least 100 yards in six of his last eight games, including a career-high 198 yards on 33 carries Nov. 10 against Central Oklahoma . . . he had a stretch of four-straight contests where he eclipsed his career high for carries in a game, with his newest mark of 38 coming against the Bearcats . . . Rockmore also recorded 200 all-purpose yards three times, against Washburn (211), Missouri Western (203) and UCO (223) . . . he was named to the All-MIAA Second Team and the Don Hansen All-Super Region Three Third Team for his efforts in 2012 . . . he was also named a 2013 USA College Football Divi-

sion II Preseason All-American prior to last year.

THE TWO-HEADED MONSTER . . . The return of Rockmore gives Northeastern State arguably the best backfield in the entire MIAA . . . Rockmore earned All-MIAA Second Team accolades in 2012, but played in only two games last season due to an injury . . . Terrance Dixon stepped into the starting role and landed on the All-MIAA Honorable Mention squad . . . he led NSU in rushing yards (720), rushing touchdowns (10) and receptions (24), while finishing second on the team in receiving yards (228) . . . Dixon, a senior, and Rockmore have combined for 3,331 rushing yards, 34 total touchdowns and 4,616 all-purpose yards.

ROBINSON ON THE RADIO . . . Northeastern State football coach Rob Robinson, in conjunction with Lakes Country 102.1 FM, has announced the debut of the new Rob Robinson Coaches Show . . . the weekly show will be held at Mazzio's Pizza in Tahlequah on Thursday nights at 6 p.m., beginning Sept. 4 and running through the end of the football season . . . the host of the coaches show will be Matt Reynolds . . . Robinson will be live each week highlighting last week's contest and previewing NSU's upcoming MIAA matchup . . . various assistant coaches and players will join the show throughout the season . . . NSU encourages students, faculty and fans to come out and support the RiverHawks football program every Thursday night at Mazzio's . . . Mazzio's is located at 1712 S. Muskogee Avenue . . . all 11 Northeastern State football games will also be broadcast live on 102.1 FM this season.

MIAA, NSU PARTNER WITH STRETCH INTERNET FOR 2014 . . . The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association has announced a partnership with Stretch Internet® to provide streaming of conference events, beginning in 2014 . . . Stretch partners with the league and members institutions to broadcast all conference football and men's and women's basketball games, as well as selected other conference events . . . fans will be able to view all conference football and basketball games live through almost any internet connected device, including Smart TV's, Apple TV and Google Chromecast . . . the new GameCentral 2.0 platform will also allow fans to access live stats in the video stream . . . the new platform also features archived games and other video content.

STRETCH INTERNET TO BROADCAST NSU THIS SEASON . . . The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association announced distribution partners and price points for the MIAA Television Network . . . fans can access the web streams through either from the league portal or from goriverhawksgo.com . . . beginning Sept. 4, fans will be able to purchase a day pass for \$9.95, and they also have the option of purchasing a football season pass for \$69.95 . . . fans may purchase a season pass for volleyball for \$44.95 with men's and women's basketball season passes being available for \$89.95 each . . . fans wishing to have access to all MIAA web streaming content can purchase an All-Access pass for \$149.95 . . . the MIAA also announced several returning distribution partners as well as two new distribution partners who have joined the network for the 2014 season.

LATTIMER, MESSINGER, SIMONEAU JOIN STAFF . . . NSU coach Rob Robinson added three full-time assistants to his staff this season, defensive coordinator Josh Lattimer, special teams coordinator Rob Messinger and quarterbacks coach Dane Simoneau . . . Lattimer is responsible for the linebackers . . . he spent the 2013 season as the head football coach at Ellsworth Community College in Iowa Falls, Iowa . . . he served as defensive coordinator in 2012, and he was promoted to head coach in January 2013 . . . he coached 11 all-conference players as head coach at ECC and also guided two players to All-American status . . . he had 16 sophomores move on to four-year institutions and two sign with NCAA FBS programs . . . in his time at the junior college level, Lattimer helped 61 players move on to the four-year level . . . he began his coaching career at Pittsburg State as a student assistant from 2005-07 . . . he helped coach the linebackers, and the 2006 squad finished the season with a Mineral Water Bowl victory over Bemidji State . . . Lattimer was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American linebacker at Pitt State . . . he was also a two-time All-Southwest Region defensive player and landed on the All-MIAA team three times . . . he is currently third in school history with 394 tackles and helped lead the Gorillas to two MIAA Championships (2003-04) . . . Pittsburg State made three appearances in the NCAA Championship tournament during Lattimer's career, and the 2004 squad finished 14-1 and advanced to the national title game . . . Messinger serves as the recruiting coordinator and also is in charge of the secondary . . . he comes to Tahlequah after having spent the past season as the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ottawa University in Ottawa, Kansas . . . he helped lead the 2013 squad to an 8-4 record and an appearance in the NAIA Football Championship Series . . . he also coached at Ottawa from 2006-

08, serving as the junior varsity head coach and offensive coordinator . . . Messinger worked from 2010-12 at the University of Miami in Miami, Florida . . . he was the coordinator of football operations from 2011-12 and was a volunteer assistant in 2010 . . . prior to moving to Miami, he served as the defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Washburn University from 2008-11 . . . Simoneau spent the past two years playing quarterback and serving as the offensive coordinator for the Salina Bombers of the Champions Professional Indoor Football League . . . he led the 2013 squad to a 9-3 record and an appearance in the Champions Bowl . . . he was also named the 2013 CPIFL Offensive MVP . . . Simoneau served as a graduate assistant coach at Washburn from 2012-13, coaching both the quarterbacks and tight ends . . . he played for the Ichabods from 2007-11, where he started 42 of 43 games and recorded the most proficient passing career in Washburn history . . . the five-time consensus All-American finished his senior season second in Harlon Hill voting with school records of 4,089 yards and 38 touchdowns . . . he also earned the MIAA's Offensive Player of the Year as well as regional player of the year honors . . . Simoneau finished his collegiate career 12th in NCAA Division II history with 11,291 yards passing and 15th on the all-time charts with 102 passing touchdowns . . . he left school with 35 Ichabod career, season and single-game records, including the top three passing seasons in school history.

WELCOME TO THE SQUAD . . . The Northeastern State football team not only welcomed a new head coach, but the team also added 34 newcomers to the roster . . . 25 of those are freshmen, while the other nine are transfers . . . those expected to contribute right away are wide receiver transfers Anthony Williams, Antonio King and Ricki Herod . . . offensive lineman Chance Douthit found his way onto the two-man depth chart prior to the start of the season, and Tony Newman will be called upon to provide depth in the secondary . . . Ivan Thomas could battle for playing time on the defensive line . . . the most notable addition is sophomore transfer Kevin Pantastico, who is slated to be NSU's starting quarterback at the beginning of the year.

LAST YEAR'S TWO 5-INT PERFORMANCES . . . Northeastern State registered five interceptions against Washburn on Sept. 21, 2013 . . . the five picks were two shy of the school record set in 1980, and it was also the most by any NSU team in the modern era and the most by any NCAA team in a single game last season . . . the feat was so rare, there have been two NSU teams in the modern era (2004, '05) that recorded five interceptions all season . . . those that picked off Ichabod QB's were Kyler Harris (2), Chandler Barr, Carson Smallwood, and Darrain Winston . . . not to be outdone, the RiverHawks matched that effort against Central Oklahoma in a 45-38 victory in the regular-season finale, making them the only team in the MIAA with two 5-INT efforts last year . . . Langston Jones (2), Harris, Winston, and Barr all posted picks against the Bronchos.

JONES EARNS ALL-AMERICAN ACCOLADE . . . Langston Jones was named to the 2013 Don Hansen NCAA Division II All-America Honorable Mention Team, giving NSU its second All-American in as many years (Michael Bowie in 2012) . . . the linebacker was the leading tackler from Super Region 3 (for the second-straight year) by a 21-tackle margin . . . he finished

fourth in the NCAA in both total tackles (141) and tackles per game (12.8) . . . the versatile player also ranked 12th in the MIAA in tackles for loss (9.0) and 15th in pass breakups (8), while finishing with a pair of interceptions. He is fourth in career tackles (387) amongst all active Division II players . . . Jones was also honored as the 2013 Oklahoma State College All-Star Defensive Player of the Year, and he was named to the 2013 Daktronics All-Super Region 3 Second Team and the All-MIAA Second Team . . . he was also named to the 2013 Don Hansen All-Super Region 3 Second Team . . . a total of 168 players earned some form of Don Hansen All-America honors. Players from 78 of the 166 football-playing schools in Division II earned Don Hansen All-America accolades.

FORMER RIVERHAWK WINS SUPER BOWL . . . Former Northeastern State offensive lineman Michael Bowie became the 15th player in school history and the first in 21 years to be selected in the NFL draft when he was chosen by the Seattle Seahawks with the 36th pick in the seventh round in the 2013 draft . . . he was the 242nd overall pick and is attempting to become the first NSU football player since 1992 to play for an NFL team . . . he started nine games along the offensive line during the season and helped lead Seattle to a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII . . . Bowie has since been claimed off waivers by the Cleveland Browns and expects to battle for playing time at the left tackle position.

burg State earned one first-place vote in both polls and was slotted second with 106 and 422 total votes, respectively . . . Central Missouri was picked third in the coaches' poll with 94 points and sixth in the media poll with 285 points. Emporia State (88) and Missouri Western State (82) rounded out the top 5 in the coaches' poll, while the Hornets (353), Griffons (348) and Washburn (306) comprised the rest of the top 5 in the media poll . . . NSU finished 2-9 overall a year ago and tied for 11th in the conference with a 2-8 league mark.

SEASON TICKETS ON SALE . . . ANOTHER TREACHEROUS SLATE . . . Northeastern State faced the most difficult schedule in the nation in both 2012 and 2013 . . . over the past two seasons, the RiverHawks have faced off with a whopping 14 opponents (of 21 games) that were either ranked or receiving votes sometime during the year . . . NSU faced off with the defending national champs to kickoff the 2012 campaign (Pittsburg State) and faced a Northwest Missouri State squad that went on to capture the 2013 national championship . . . other difficult matchups over the last two years included tilts with Missouri Southern State, Missouri Western State, Central Missouri, Washburn, and Emporia State . . . Northeastern State is scheduled to face five teams in 2014 that were either ranked or received votes in the preseason AFCA national rankings.

NO LONGER NEWBIES . . . The RiverHawks are in their third year as members of the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association . . . since joining the NCAA in 1996, NSU has been a member of the Lone Star Conference (1996-2011), an independent (2011-12), and now the MIAA (2012-P) . . . the MIAA is one of the strongest football conferences in the country, as it boasts multiple national champions and squads that routinely make deep runs in the NCAA Championship playoffs . . . the MIAA is home to two of the last three national champions, including the defending champs (Northwest Missouri State) and the 2011 champs (Pittsburg State).

THE WRONG RECORD FALLS . . . Northeastern State allowed 2,843 yards rushing last season (258.5 ypg) to break the all-time school record for rushing yards allowed in a single season . . . the previous mark was set in 2011 when the team conceded 2,289 yards . . . Northeastern State's defense allowed three teams to post at least 350 yards rushing in a game this season (Pittsburg State-354, Eastern New Mexico-368, Central Missouri-374) . . . in comparison, the rest of the teams in the MIAA combined for just four such occurrences (Pittsburg State had 361 against Central Oklahoma, Nebraska-Kearney had 365 against Lindenwood, Missouri Southern had 427 against Central Missouri, Missouri Southern had 607 against Lincoln).

GOING BOWLING IN 2011 . . . Northeastern State made its first appearance in a bowl game since making the transition to Division II last season . . . the RiverHawks posted a 7-4 mark in the regular season and was awarded a bid to the Mineral Water Bowl, one

NSU HELPS WELCOME UTSA TO COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL . . . Northeastern State traveled to San Antonio, Texas, on Sept. 3, 2011, for a meeting with the UTSA Roadrunners . . . the special occasion marked the first football contest in UTSA history, which was won by the Roadrunners, 31-3 . . . the game attracted 56,743 fans, which was the largest crowd to ever watch an NSU football game and the largest crowd in NCAA to ever watch a program's first collegiate football game.
