NSU vs. EMPORIA STATE • Saturday • Sept. 27, 2014
6 p.m. (CT) • Doc Wadley Stadium (8,300) • Tahlequah, Okla.

THE GAME . . . The *Northeastern State RiverHawks* (0-3, 0-3 MIAA) will look to pick up their first win of the season when the *Emporia State Hornets* (1-2, 1-2 MIAA) come to town . . . kickoff is set for 6 p.m. (CT) Sept. 27 at Doc Wadley Stadium (8,300) in Tahlequah, Oklahoma . . . the game can be heard live on KEOK 102.1 FM in Tahlequah with Bill Huddleston and Sean Rowley providing commentary . . . a free audio broadcast can be found at goriverhawksgo.com . . . the game will also be streamed live on Stretch Internet (<http://portal.stretchinternet.com/nsu/>, subscription based) . . . a football-only season pass is available for \$69.95, and a day pass can be purchased for \$9.95.

THE MATCHUP . . . Northeastern State and Emporia State have met 11 times in the history of the two programs . . . the RiverHawks own a 7-3-1 all-time record against the Hornets . . . the two programs tied 0-0 in the first meeting in 1938, but the Redmen picked up a 25-0 win in 1939 and would go on to own ESU until the Hornets would finally clip NSU 15-6 in 1989 . . . Northeastern State exacted revenge in 1990 with a 34-22 victory . . . ESU has taken the first pair of meetings since the two became members of the same conference in 2012.

THE HEAD COACHES . . . NSU's **ROB ROBINSON** (William Jewell, '00) is in his first season as the RiverHawks head coach . . . he was named the 19th head football coach in school history on Dec. 19, 2013 . . . he owns a 0-3 all-time record . . . Robinson spent the previous 12 years under Craig Schurig as a member of the Washburn Ichabod coaching staff, serving as the offensive coordinator for the last four seasons . . . he also directed the running backs from 2007-13 and coached the wide receivers from 2002-06 . . . he served as the recruiting coordinator from 2002-10 and was the academic coordinator from 2010-13 . . . Robinson was an integral member of a Washburn staff that completely turned around the Ichabod program . . . Washburn averaged 3.3 wins from 1989-03 and had just one winning season, but the Ichabods averaged 7.9 wins from 2004-13 and posted 10 straight winning campaigns . . . Robinson is the second former coordinator under Schurig's tutelage to become the head coach of another program, joining Fort Hays State's Chris Brown . . . Robinson spent the 2001 season at Pittsburg State as a graduate assistant, coaching the defensive backs with Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig . . . the Gorillas won the MIAA Championship that year.

ESU's **GARIN HIGGINS** (Emporia State, '92) is in his eighth season with the Hornets . . . he has compiled a 39-42 record during his tenure . . . he led ESU to a 9-2 record and the school's first NCAA playoff appearance since 2003 a year ago . . . he was named the 21st head football coach at Emporia State on December 15, 2006 . . . he has orchestrated one of the great turnarounds in Emporia State history as he has led the Hornets to a 20-6 record over the last two+ seasons after going 19-36 in his first five years . . . the 19 wins from 2012-13 were the most since 1988-89, while Higgins was a quarterback for Emporia State . . . Higgins compiled a 51-9 record (.857) as the head coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State University before becoming the co-offensive coordinator at NCAA Division II member Minnesota State in 2005 . . . prior to returning to ESU he was

the offensive coordinator at Northeastern State.

THE EMERGENCE OF DERRICK MOORE . . . Due to an injury to Joel Rockmore, an opportunity arose for redshirt freshman Derrick Moore to make his presence felt . . . he played just the fourth quarter against Fort Hays State and led NSU in rushing . . . he was then awarded his first-career start against Missouri Western State and went on to post a career-best 50 yards on the ground . . . he is currently listed at No. 1 on the depth chart and will look to earn more carries as the season progresses.

FROM RECEIVER TO LEADING THE D . . . Sophomore Steffon Herd came to NSU as a wide receiver . . . he played in 10 games and made four starts as a redshirt freshman in 2013, and he finished the campaign with 14 receptions for 217 yards . . . due to a depth issue in the secondary, new coach Rob Robinson made the decision to convert Herd to safety . . . that decision is paying off in spades, as Herd leads the RiverHawks in both total tackles (21) and solo tackles (17) through three weeks this season . . . his solo tackle total ranks 51st in the country this season.

POWER OUTAGE . . . Northeastern State has struggled on the offensive side of the ball through the first three games this season, specifically in the running game . . . NSU has failed to reach 100 yards rushing in each of the first three games, posting totals of 48, 48, and 67 to start the season . . . of 167 NCAA Division II teams, the RiverHawks rank in the bottom 15 in eight categories . . . NSU ranks low in total offense (153), rushing offense (163), scoring offense (166), turnover margin (164), turnovers lost (159), passes had intercepted (162), third-down conversion percentage (152), and red-zone offense (165) . . . Northeastern State has been shutout in two of its first three games this season . . . the last time NSU was shutout twice in one season was 1986 . . . the last time NSU began the season with two shutouts in the first three games of the year was 1938.

RECONSTRUCTING THE O-LINE . . . From left to right, Northeastern State entered the 2014 season with a projected starting offensive line of Ethan James (LT), Jonathan Brown (LG), Ross Dvorak (C), Trevon Lawson (RG), and Tyler Easter (RT) . . . due to a plethora of injuries, the front five looks much different heading into Week 4 of the season . . . the projected starting lineup this week is Brown (LT), Devin Crisp (LG), Anthony Frazier (C), Chance Douthit (RG), and Easter (RT) . . . James was hurt in the preseason and will miss the entire year . . . redshirt freshman Dakota Ritchie started the first game of the year at the left tackle position, but he suffered a season-ending injury in that contest . . . Dvorak and Lawson both missed the Missouri Western State game due to injuries and likely will not play this week . . . against the Griffons, Northeastern State started an offensive line with five linemen playing positions for the first times in their careers . . . outside of Brown, who was starting in his 16th-career game, the other four linemen entered the game with three starts combined.

ROBINSON ON THE RADIO . . . Northeastern State football coach Rob Robinson, in conjunction with Lakes Country 102.1 FM, has announced the debut of the new Rob Robinson Coaches Show . . . the weekly show is held at Mazzio's Pizza in Tahlequah on Thursday nights

at 6 p.m. . . . it began Sept. 4 and will run through the end of the football season . . . the host of the coaches show is Matt Reynolds . . . Robinson will be live each week highlighting last week's contest and previewing NSU's upcoming MIAA matchup . . . various assistant coaches and players will join the show throughout the season . . . NSU encourages students, faculty and fans to come out and support the RiverHawks football program every Thursday night at Mazzio's . . . Mazzio's is located at 1712 S. Muskogee Avenue . . . all 11 Northeastern State football games will also be broadcast live on 102.1 FM this season.

THE SEASON OPENER . . . Northeastern State opened the 2014 season against No. 9 Pittsburg State University for the third year in a row . . . the Rob Robinson debut was seen by the fourth-largest crowd in Carnie Smith Stadium history (10,814) . . . Steffon Herd made his first start on the defensive side of the ball and finished the game with a team-high eight tackles . . . six different RiverHawks made their first start in the green and white, and those were Romon Beard, Garrett Powell, Dakota Ritchie, Tyler Easter, Kevin Pantastico and Michael Davis . . . the contest also marked the first time NSU was shutout since Sept. 5, 2009 . . . the NSU defense held Jeff Seybold to a career-low 14 yards rushing . . . Seybold was an All-MIAA First Team member a year ago . . . the RiverHawks also had more fourth-down conversions (3-for-5) than third-down conversions (2-for-16).

THE RETURN OF THE ROCK . . . Joel Rockmore returned for his junior campaign after missing most of last year . . . the shifty running back was injured in the second game in 2013 and was awarded a medical redshirt . . . he made the start in the season opener and finished with 13 yards rushing before leaving with a minor injury . . . he missed the Missouri Western State game this past week due to that same injury . . . he currently has 1,767 career rushing yards, 15 career rushing touchdowns and 2,608 career all-purpose yards . . . he finished the 2012 campaign as the nation's 23rd-ranked rusher (113.8 ypg), and he was also 22nd in all-purpose yards (151.4 ypg) . . . he only rushed for 13 yards in the first two games of the season and averaged 126.4 yards rushing over the final eight games . . . he rushed for at least 100 yards in six of his last eight games, including a career-high 198 yards on 33 carries Nov. 10 against Central Oklahoma . . . he had a stretch of four-straight contests where he eclipsed his career high for carries in a game, with his newest mark of 38 coming against the Bearcats . . . Rockmore also recorded 200 all-purpose yards three times, against Washburn (211), Missouri Western (203) and UCO (223) . . . he was named to the All-MIAA Second Team and the Don Hansen All-Super Region Three Third Team for his efforts in 2012 . . . he was also named a 2013 USA College Football Division II Preseason All-American prior to last year.

MIAA, NSU PARTNER WITH STRETCH INTERNET FOR 2014 . . . The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association has announced a partnership with Stretch Internet® to provide streaming of conference events, beginning in 2014 . . . Stretch partners with the league and members institutions to broadcast all conference football and men's and women's basketball games, as well as selected other conference events . . . fans will be able to view all conference football and basketball games live through almost any internet connected device, including Smart TV's, Apple TV and Google Chromecast . . . the new GameCentral 2.0 platform will also allow fans to access live stats in the video stream . . . the new platform also features archived games and other video content.

STRETCH INTERNET TO BROADCAST NSU THIS SEASON . . . The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association announced distribution partners and price points for the MIAA Television Network . . . fans can access the web streams through either from the league portal or from goriverhawksgo.com . . . beginning

Sept. 4, fans will be able to purchase a day pass for \$9.95, and they also have the option of purchasing a football season pass for \$69.95 . . . fans may purchase a season pass for volleyball for \$44.95 with men's and women's basketball season passes being available for \$89.95 each . . . fans wishing to have access to all MIAA web streaming content can purchase an All-Access pass for \$149.95 . . . the MIAA also announced several returning distribution partners as well as two new distribution partners who have joined the network for the 2014 season.

- KSMO-TV which serves 100 percent of the Kansas City market and is available over-the-air on through a cable or satellite provider.
- Cox Communications KS serving communities across the state of Kansas including Topeka, Pittsburg, and Wichita.
- Cox Communications Oklahoma serving communities across the state of Oklahoma including the Tulsa and Oklahoma City markets.
- Eagle Communications which serves western Kansas and parts of central Kansas
- The News-Press NOW channel in St. Joseph, Missouri. Serving northwest Missouri including the St. Joseph and Maryville markets. In addition, four of the broadcasts (Sept. 4, Oct. 25, Nov. 8, and Nov. 15) will be simulcast on their Fox 26 KNPN channel.

2014 NSU TAILGATING GUIDELINES . . . Entrance will open three hours prior to kickoff and will close to incoming vehicles two hours prior to kickoff . . . extreme caution must be taken when driving through the area . . . tailgating assignments consist of the equivalent of three parking spots . . . each group will get one assigned area . . . each assigned tailgate area will be allowed a maximum of one vehicle . . . areas will be assigned in sequence based on order of arrival . . . it is important to fill the tailgate areas in sequence in order to maximize space in an orderly, safe fashion . . . all participants are expected to respect fellow tailgaters . . . all participants are expected to follow local, state, and federal laws . . . participants who are currently enrolled NSU students are expected to abide by NSU Student Rules and Regulations . . . no tent stakes may be used on parking lot asphalt . . . vehicles will not be allowed to leave the tailgate area until kickoff.

COACH TO CURE MD SET FOR SEPT. 25-27 . . . For the sixth year in a row, college football coaches nationwide will join together in support of the Coach To Cure MD program, which will be held during games of Saturday, September 27, 2014 . . . the rapidly growing annual effort has raised more than a million dollars to battle Duchenne muscular dystrophy . . . on Sept. 27, American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) members will wear a Coach To Cure MD logo patch on the sidelines and college football fans will be asked to donate to research projects supported by Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy (PPMD), the largest nonprofit organization in the U.S. focused entirely on Duchenne muscular dystrophy . . . more than 60 of those games will recognize a local Duchenne family on the field before or during the game . . . football fans can donate to Duchenne muscular dystrophy

research by either going online to www.CoachtoCureMD.org or by texting the word CURE to 90999 (a \$5 donation will automatically be added to your next phone bill) . . . last year, more than 10,000 college coaches at more than 600 different institutions participated in Coach To Cure MD events . . . both those figures are higher than in any of the program's first six years (2008-13) . . . the five-year fundraising total is just over \$1 million . . . Duchenne muscular dystrophy is the most common fatal genetic disorder diagnosed during childhood and primarily affects boys across all races and cultures . . . boys and young men with Duchenne muscular dystrophy develop progressive muscle weakness that eventually causes loss of mobility, wheelchair dependency and a decline in respiratory and cardiac function . . . currently, there is no cure for Duchenne muscular dystrophy and limited therapeutic options exist.

LATTIMER, MESSINGER, SIMONEAU JOIN STAFF . . . NSU coach Rob Robinson added three full-time assistants to his staff this season, defensive coordinator Josh Lattimer, special teams coordinator Rob Messinger and quarterbacks coach Dane Simoneau . . . Lattimer is responsible for the linebackers . . . he spent the 2013 season as the head football coach at Ellsworth Community College in Iowa Falls, Iowa . . . he served as defensive coordinator in 2012, and he was promoted to head coach in January 2013 . . . he coached 11 all-conference players as head coach at ECC and also guided two players to All-American status . . . he had 16 sophomores move on to four-year institutions and two sign with NCAA FBS programs . . . in his time at the junior college level, Lattimer helped 61 players move on to the four-year level . . . he began his coaching career at Pittsburg State as a student assistant from 2005-07 . . . he helped coach the linebackers, and the 2006 squad finished the season with a Mineral Water Bowl victory over Bemidji State . . . Lattimer was a two-time NCAA Division II All-American linebacker at Pitt State . . . he was also a two-time All-Southwest Region defensive player and landed on the All-MIAA team three times . . . he is currently third in school history with 394 tackles and helped lead the Gorillas to two MIAA Championships (2003-04) . . . Pittsburg State made three appearances in the NCAA Championship tournament during Lattimer's career, and the 2004 squad finished 14-1 and advanced to the national title game . . . Messinger serves as the recruiting coordinator and also is in charge of the secondary . . . he comes to Tahlequah after having spent the past season as the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Ottawa University in Ottawa, Kansas . . . he helped lead the 2013 squad to an 8-4 record and an appearance in the NAIA Football Championship Series . . . he also coached at Ottawa from 2006-08, serving as the junior varsity head coach and offensive coordinator . . . Messinger worked from 2010-12 at the University of Miami in Miami, Florida . . . he was the coordinator of football operations from 2011-12 and was a volunteer assistant in 2010 . . . prior to moving to Miami, he served as the defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Washburn University from 2008-11 . . . Simoneau spent the past two years playing quarterback and serving as the offensive coordinator for the Salina Bombers of the Champions Professional Indoor Football League . . . he led the 2013 squad to a 9-3 record and an appearance in the Champions Bowl . . . he was also named the 2013 CPIFL Offensive MVP . . . Simoneau served as a graduate assistant coach at Washburn from 2012-13, coaching both the quarterbacks and tight ends . . . he played for the IChabods from 2007-11, where he started 42 of 43 games and recorded the most proficient passing career in Washburn history . . . the five-time consensus All-American finished his senior season second in Harlon Hill voting with school records of 4,089 yards and 38 touchdowns . . . he also earned the MIAA's Offensive Player of the Year as well as regional player of the year honors . . . Simoneau finished his collegiate career 12th in NCAA Division II history with 11,291 yards passing and 15th on the all-time charts with 102 passing touchdowns . . . he left school with 35 IChabod ca-

reer, season and single-game records, including the top three passing seasons in school history.

WELCOME TO THE SQUAD . . . The Northeastern State football team not only welcomed a new head coach, but the team also added 34 newcomers to the roster . . . 25 of those are freshmen, while the other nine are transfers . . . those expected to contribute are wide receiver transfers Anthony Williams, Antonio King and Ricki Herod . . . offensive lineman Chance Douthit is now serving as one of NSU's starters, and Tony Newman will be called upon to provide depth in the secondary and on special teams . . . the most notable addition is sophomore transfer Kevin Pantastico, who is NSU's starting quarterback.

LAST YEAR'S TWO 5-INT PERFORMANCES . . . Northeastern State registered five interceptions against Washburn on Sept. 21, 2013 . . . the five picks were two shy of the school record set in 1980, and it was also the most by any NSU team in the modern era and the most by any NCAA team in a single game last season . . . the feat was so rare, there have been two NSU teams in the modern era (2004, '05) that recorded five interceptions all season . . . those that picked off Ichabod QB's were Kyler Harris (2), Chandler Barr, Carson Smallwood, and Darrain Winston . . . not to be outdone, the RiverHawks matched that effort against Central Oklahoma in a 45-38 victory in the regular-season finale, making them the only team in the MIAA with two 5-INT efforts last year . . . Langston Jones (2), Harris, Winston, and Barr all posted picks against the Bronchos.

JONES EARNS ALL-AMERICAN ACCOLADE . . . Langston Jones was named to the 2013 Don Hansen NCAA Division II All-America Honorable Mention Team, giving NSU its second All-American in as many years (Michael Bowie in 2012) . . . the linebacker was the leading tackler from Super Region 3 (for the second-straight year) by a 21-tackle margin . . . he finished fourth in the NCAA in both total tackles (141) and tackles per game (12.8) . . . the versatile player also ranked 12th in the MIAA in tackles for loss (9.0) and 15th in pass breakups (8), while finishing with a pair of interceptions. He is fourth in career tackles (387) amongst all active Division II players . . . Jones was also honored as the 2013 Oklahoma State College All-Star Defensive Player of the Year, and he was named to the 2013 Daktronics All-Super Region 3 Second Team and the All-MIAA Second Team . . . he was also named to the 2013 Don Hansen All-Super Region 3 Second Team . . . a total of 168 players earned some form of Don Hansen All-America honors. Players from 78 of the 166 football-playing schools in Division II earned Don Hansen All-America accolades.

NSU SELECTED LAST IN PRESEASON POLLS . . . The Northeastern State football team was picked to finish 12th in both the 2014 MIAA Preseason Coaches' and Media Polls . . . the RiverHawks collected 17 points in the coaches' poll and 66 points in the media poll . . . they were selected to finish 10th in the media poll and 11th in the coaches' poll last season . . . Northwest Missouri State and Pittsburg State locked down the top two spots in both rankings . . . the Bearcats brought in 11 of 12 first-place votes (121 total) in the coaches' poll and raked in 37 of 39 first-place votes (466 total) in the media poll . .

. Pittsburg State earned one first-place vote in both polls and was slotted second with 106 and 422 total votes, respectively . . . Central Missouri was picked third in the coaches' poll with 94 points and sixth in the media poll with 285 points. Emporia State (88) and Missouri Western State (82) rounded out the top 5 in the coaches' poll, while the Hornets (353), Griffons (348) and Washburn (306) comprised the rest of the top 5 in the media poll . . . NSU finished 2-9 overall a year ago and tied for 11th in the conference with a 2-8 league mark.

SEASON TICKETS ON SALE . . . the most difficult schedule in the nation in both 2012 and 2013 . . . over the past two+ seasons, the RiverHawks have faced off with a whopping 16 opponents (of 24 games) that were either ranked or receiving votes sometime during the year . . . NSU faced off with the defending national champs to kickoff the 2012 campaign (Pittsburg State) and faced a Northwest Missouri State squad that went on to capture the 2013 national championship . . . other difficult matchups over the last two+ years included tilts with Missouri Southern State, Missouri Western State, Central Missouri, Washburn, and Emporia State . . . Northeastern State is scheduled to face five teams in 2014 that were either ranked or received votes in the preseason AFCA national rankings.

NO LONGER NEWBIES . . . The RiverHawks are in their third year as members of the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association . . . since joining the NCAA in 1996, NSU has been a member of the Lone Star Conference (1996-2011), an independent (2011-12), and now the MIAA (2012-P) . . . the MIAA is one of the strongest football conferences in the country, as it boasts multiple national champions and squads that routinely make deep runs in the NCAA Championship playoffs . . . the MIAA is home to two of the last three national champions, including the defending champs (Northwest Missouri State) and the 2011 champs (Pittsburg State).

FORMER RIVERHAWK WINS SUPER BOWL . . . Former Northeastern State offensive lineman Michael Bowie became the 15th player in school history and the first in 21 years to be selected in the NFL draft when he was chosen by the Seattle Seahawks with the 36th pick in the seventh round in the 2013 draft . . . he was the 242nd overall pick and is attempting to become the first NSU football player since 1992 to play for an NFL team . . . he started nine games along the offensive line during the season and helped lead Seattle to a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII . . . Bowie has since been claimed off waivers by the Cleveland Browns and expects to battle for playing time at the left tackle position when he returns from injury.

for rushing yards allowed in a single season . . . the previous mark was set in 2011 when the team conceded 2,289 yards . . . Northeastern State's defense allowed three teams to post at least 350 yards rushing in a game this season (Pittsburg State-354, Eastern New Mexico-368, Central Missouri-374) . . . in comparison, the rest of the teams in the MIAA combined for just four such occurrences (Pittsburg State had 361 against Central Oklahoma, Nebraska-Kearney had 365 against Lindenwood, Missouri Southern had 427 against Central Missouri, Missouri Southern had 607 against Lincoln).

GOING BOWLING IN 2011 . . . Northeastern State made its first appearance in a bowl game since making the transition to Division II last season . . . the RiverHawks posted a 7-4 mark in the regular season and was awarded a bid to the Mineral Water Bowl, one of only two Division II bowl games . . . Northeastern State fell 28-14 to Minnesota State University in Excelsior Springs, Mo.

NSU HELPS WELCOME UTSA TO COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL . . . Northeastern State traveled to San Antonio, Texas, on Sept. 3, 2011, for a meeting with the UTSA Roadrunners . . . the special occasion marked the first football contest in UTSA history, which was won by the Roadrunners, 31-3 . . . the game attracted 56,743 fans, which was the largest crowd to ever watch an NSU football game and the largest crowd in NCAA to ever watch a program's first collegiate football game.
