**THE GAME . . .** The *Northeastern State RiverHawks* (0-2, 0-2 MIAA) are set to host the *Missouri Western State University Griffons* (1-1, 1-1 MIAA) in the MIAA TV Game of the Week . . . the contest will also be part of Family Weekend at NSU . . . kickoff is set for 2:37 p.m. Sept. 19 at Doc Wadley Stadium (8,300) in Tahlequah, Oklahoma . . . Neil Harwell (play-by-play) and Marc Boerigter (color) will provide commentary on the TV broadcast . . . the MIAA TV Game of the Week can be viewed in Oklahoma on Cox Communications, which serves the Tulsa and Oklahoma City markets . . . the game can also be heard live on KEOK 102.1 FM in Tahlequah with Bill Huddleston (play-by-play) and Sean Rowley (color) providing commentary . . . a free audio broadcast can be found at [goriverhawksgo.com](http://goriverhawksgo.com) . . . the game will be streamed live on Stretch Internet (<http://portal.stretchinternet.com/nsu/>, subscription based) . . . a football-only season pass is available for \$69.95, and a day pass can be purchased for \$9.95.

**THE MATCHUP . . .** The RiverHawks and Griffons have met five times since the first meeting in 1994, and Missouri Western State owns an unblemished 5-0 mark in the series . . . Saturday's matchup will be the fourth meeting between the two programs as members of the same conference . . . NSU traveled to St. Joseph each of the past two seasons and suffered big losses in both (54-10 in 2013 and 30-0 in 2014) . . . the last time MWSU traveled to Tahlequah was in 2012, when the visitors picked up a 45-31 triumph . . . the Griffons won the first meeting between the two programs 33-13 in 1994 . . . that was the season-opening contest the year NSU won the national championship . . . Missouri Western State also won 44-7 in 1995.

**THE HEAD COACHES . . .** NSU's **ROB ROBINSON** (William Jewell, '00) is in his second season as the RiverHawks head coach . . . he was named the 19th head football coach in school history on Dec. 19, 2013 . . . he owns a 0-13 all-time record . . . Robinson spent the previous 12 years under Craig Schurig as a member of the Washburn Ichabod coaching staff, serving as the offensive coordinator for the last four seasons . . . he also directed the running backs from 2007-13 and coached the wide receivers from 2002-06 . . . he served as the recruiting coordinator from 2002-10 and was the academic coordinator from 2010-13 . . . Robinson was an integral member of a Washburn staff that completely turned around the Ichabod program . . . Washburn averaged 3.3 wins from 1989-03 and had just one winning season, but the Ichabods averaged 7.9 wins from 2004-13 and posted 10 straight winning campaigns . . . Robinson is the second former coordinator under Schurig's tutelage to become the head coach of another program, joining Fort Hays State's Chris Brown . . . Robinson spent the 2001 season at Pittsburg State as a graduate assistant, coaching the defensive backs with Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig . . . the Gorillas won the MIAA Championship that year.

MWSU's **JERRY PARTRIDGE** (Missouri Western State, '85) is in his 19th season as head coach of the Griffons . . . he owns a 140-72 overall record,

and he became Missouri Western's all-time wins leader on September 30, 2006 . . . his current total of 140 career victories ranks third on the MIAA all-time list . . . he was honored as the 2000 and 2012 MIAA Coach of the Year . . . Partridge has coached more than 235 players named All-MIAA and 30 All-Americans . . . he owns the single season school record for wins with 12 and has won nine games or more in seven out of the last 12 years . . . he has also led the team to its first four NCAA Playoff appearances (2006, 2010, 2011, and 2012), which included hosting the first ever playoff game on November 20, 2011 against rival Northwest Missouri State . . . he also led the Griffons to their first NCAA Playoff victory against Minnesota-Duluth at home in 2012 by a score of 57-55 in triple overtime . . . he guided the Griffons into the NCAA quarterfinals with a victory over Henderson State the following week by a score of 45-21 in Arkadelphia, Arkansas . . . under Partridge, the Griffons were the MIAA Champions in 2012 and were co-champions of the MIAA in 2003 . . . Partridge served as a graduate assistant coach at both the University of Notre Dame and the University of Missouri . . . he was a member of the Notre Dame coaching staff when the Fighting Irish won the 1988 national title by winning the Fiesta Bowl under Head Coach Lou Holtz.

**RIVERHAWKS DEBUT NEW TURF UPGRADE . . .** Northeastern State Director of Athletics Tony Duckworth selected Hellas Construction to provide and install new Matrix® Turf at Doc Wadley Stadium for the 2015 season . . . the new playing surface replaced the first iteration of field turf that was installed at Gable Field in 2005 . . . the newest edition to the stadium features top-of-the-line turf which is currently utilized most notably by the Dallas Cowboys, Baylor University and the University of California . . . the design features the same NSU logo that currently dons center court inside the NSU Event Center, and the end zones have a black background with "NORTHEASTERN STATE" and "RIVERHAWKS" in large, white lettering outlined in NSU green . . . Hellas defines Matrix® Turf as the finest synthetic turf system available . . . from the advanced fibers, down through the patented REALFILL™ and reinforced backing – each component is part of an authentic, artificial turf system . . . Matrix® Turf has undergone decades of in-depth research and intense testing, resulting in countless innovations that make each Matrix synthetic turf field stronger and more reliable than ever before . . . Matrix® Turf is also held to a higher standard when it comes to testing for strength, safety and overall performance . . . each Matrix® Turf field is designed to provide a superior athletic experience at all levels of competition.

**THE QB/WR DUO RETURNS . . .** NSU is in Year 2 of the Kevin Pantastico era . . . the junior quarterback returned after an inaugural campaign that saw him finish fourth in the MIAA in passing yards per game (196.9) and sixth in total offense (193.4) . . . he finished 193-for-375 for 2,166 yards . . . he also had eight touchdowns to go with 14 interceptions, while starting all 11 games . . . Pantastico has the luxury of throwing to one of the top receivers in the league in Garrett Powell . . . the senior wideout ranked second in the MIAA last season in receptions per game (5.7) and fourth in receiving yards per game (72.8) . . . he appeared in 10 games and finished

the campaign with 57 receptions for 728 yards and five touchdowns.

**RECONSTRUCTING THE O-LINE . . .** Northeastern State struggled up front in 2014 with an offensive line that started seven different combinations in the first seven games of the season . . . NSU entered 2015 with a projected starting offensive line that featured three players who were not on the roster last season . . . the RiverHawks have beefed up the interior with the addition of Jordan Baldwin (LT), Brian Hobbs (C) and Lance Cox (RG) . . . Tyler Easter returns to start at right tackle and Brian West returns to start at left guard . . . the new-look offensive line features five juniors that average 302 pounds and are an average height of 6-foot-2 . . . redshirt freshman Dakota Ritchie (6-4, 275) was the team's starting left tackle last season before suffering a season-ending injury in the first game.

**MISSED OPPORTUNITIES . . .** NSU has struggled in the kicking game since joining the MIAA, and more specifically over the past two seasons . . . the RiverHawks have converted just 19 of 38 (50 percent) field goals since the beginning of the 2012 season, and they are just 1-for-10 (10 percent) since 2014 . . . additionally, Northeastern State has converted 60 of 69 (87 percent) extra-point attempts over the last four years.

**SOLVING THE KICKING WOES . . .** Northeastern State was one of just two teams in the entire country (Malone University) to not attempt a field goal in the first five games of the 2014 season . . . the RiverHawks were also one of five teams across the nation (Lincoln, Clarion, Southern Nazarene, Cheyney) to not make a field goal through the first eight weeks of the season . . . the RiverHawks were 1-for-7 on field-goal attempts last year, with the lone conversion coming in Week 9 against Central Oklahoma . . . both players who attempted field goals in 2014 are no longer with the program, and Eddie Garcia has been added to the mix to help the special teams . . . Garcia is a junior college transfer from El Camino College who earned All-National Central Conference Second Team honors a season ago . . . he went 13-for-15 on field-goal attempts with a long of 45 last season, and he also was 24 of 26 on point-after attempts.

**QUITE THE TURNOVER . . .** The RiverHawks completely overhauled their roster for the 2015 campaign and feature only 23 players who have ever played in a game for NSU prior to this season . . . there are 64 newcomers to the roster and just 32 players who were on the team a year ago . . . the roster breakdown includes nine seniors, 28 juniors, seven sophomores and 52 freshmen . . . of the 64 newcomers, 24 are transfers.

**MIAA RANKS FROM 2014 . . .** The RiverHawks will be looking to improve on a team that ranked in the bottom two in the MIAA in 17 statistical categories a season ago . . . NSU was also last in the league in 11 categories, including scoring offense (10.5), total offense (274.6), rushing offense (69.8), pass efficiency (96.2), third-down conversions (27.8), scoring defense (39.5), rushing defense (224.6), pass defense efficiency (136.0), interceptions (5), field goal conversion percentage (.143), first downs per game (15.4) and penalty yards per game (79.6).

**7 RIVERHAWKS EARN POSTSEASON ACCOLADES IN 2014 . . .** Northeastern State had seven players named all-conference last year . . . headlining

the list of RiverHawks was defensive back Chandler Barr, who was named to the All-MIAA Third Team . . . those named All-MIAA Honorable Mention were defensive tackle Kenley Choute, offensive lineman Jonathan Brown, wide receiver Garrett Powell, tight end Kyle Matheson, linebacker Kenneth Davis, and defensive back Steffon Herd . . . the postseason honors were the first for all seven RiverHawks . . . Barr finished the season with 36 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss . . . he also broke up eight passes and returned five kickoffs for 90 yards . . . Choute finished with 27 tackles and 6.5 TFL's . . . Davis and Herd both registered 77 tackles, and Herd was second in the MIAA with 56 solo stops . . . Davis finished with 10.5 TFL's and 1.5 sacks . . . Herd had 1.5 TFL's and one interception . . . Powell finished second in the MIAA with 5.7 receptions per game . . . he led NSU with 57 catches for 728 yards and five touchdowns . . . Matheson tallied three receptions for 23 yards.

**2014 MIAA ACADEMIC AWARD WINNERS** . . . Northeastern State placed 16 members of the squad on the MIAA Academic Honor Roll . . . those included eight offensive players, six defensive players and two specialists . . . sophomore tight end Kyle Matheson was named an MIAA Scholar-Athlete . . . overall, there were 271 MIAA Students-Athletes in football named to the MIAA Academic Honor Roll . . . to achieve honor roll status, a student-athlete must have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.00 and have at least two terms of attendance at the certifying member institution, excluding summer terms . . . of those 271 student-athletes, 24 earned the MIAA Scholar Athlete Award, which is given to those who have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.50, have at least two terms of attendance at the certifying member institution, excluding summer terms, and, if competing in a championship sport of the MIAA, earn All-MIAA honors.

**DVORAK COLLECTS ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN NOD** . . . Ross Dvorak was named to the 2014 Capital One Academic All-America® NCAA Division II Football Second Team, which was the second-straight year he earned academic All-American status . . . the former RiverHawk carried a 3.97 grade-point average in business administration, while serving as one of the starting offensive linemen . . . in 2013, Dvorak became the second NSU student-athlete in school history to be named an Academic All-America . . . he joined former RiverHawk women's golfer Whitney McAteer, who was named to the 2013 Capital One Academic All-America® Women's At-Large First Team.

**ON THE WRONG SIDE OF HISTORY** . . . The RiverHawks posted a 0-11 record in 2014, marking the first time in school history the team lost 11 games in a single campaign . . . only two other teams in school history have finished with double-digit losses (2004, 2008) . . . only one NSU team in school history (2004) has ever finished an entire season without a win or a tie (minimum four games played) . . . Northeastern State is now in its 102nd year of

**MIAA, NSU PARTNER WITH STRETCH INTERNET FOR 2015 . . .** The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association is set to continue its partnership with Stretch Internet® to provide streaming of conference events . . . Stretch partners with the league and members institutions to broadcast all conference football and men's and women's basketball games, as well as selected other conference events . . . fans can view all conference football and basketball games live through almost any internet connected device, including Smart TV's, Apple TV and Google Chromecast . . . the GameCentral 2.0 platform will also allow fans to access live stats in the video stream . . . the new platform also features archived games and other video content.

**STRETCH INTERNET TO CONTINUE BROADCASTING NSU THIS SEASON . . .** The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association announced distribution partners and price points for the MIAA Television Network . . . fans can access the web streams through either from the league portal or from [goriverhawksgo.com](http://goriverhawksgo.com) . . . beginning Sept. 3, fans will be able to purchase a day pass for \$9.95, and they also have the option of purchasing a football season pass for \$69.95 . . . fans may purchase a season pass for volleyball for \$44.95 with men's and women's basketball season passes being available for \$89.95 each . . . fans wishing to have access to all MIAA web streaming content can purchase an All-Access pass for \$149.95 . . . the MIAA also announced several returning distribution partners as well as two new distribution partners who have joined the network for the 2014 season.

- KSMO-TV which serves 100 percent of the Kansas City market and is available over-the-air on through a cable or satellite provider.
- Cox Communications KS serving communities across the state of Kansas including Topeka, Pittsburg, and Wichita.
- Cox Communications Oklahoma serving communities across the state of Oklahoma including the Tulsa and Oklahoma City markets.
- Eagle Communications which serves western Kansas and parts of central Kansas
- The News-Press NOW channel in St. Joseph, Missouri. Serving northwest Missouri including the St. Joseph and Maryville markets. In addition, four of the broadcasts (Sept. 4, Oct. 25, Nov. 8, and Nov. 15) will be simulcast on their Fox 26 KNPN channel.
- KGCS-TV in Joplin, Missouri. KGCS-TV is a broadcast station licensed to Missouri Southern State University that serves more than 167,000 households across a region including southwest Missouri, as well as parts of southeast Kansas and northeast Oklahoma.

**SIMONEAU, BOHANNON PROMOTED, SKEANS RETURNS, MENDEZ JOINS STAFF** . . . NSU football coach Rob Robinson announced changes to his coaching staff over the summer . . . quarterbacks coach Dane Simoneau was promoted to offensive coordinator following the resignation of Paul Lane . . . Simoneau is set to enter his second year with the RiverHawks football program . . . prior to his arrival at Northeastern State, he spent two years playing quarterback and serving as the offensive coordinator for the Salina Bombers of the Champions Professional Football League . . . Simoneau also served as a graduate assistant coach at Washburn from 2012-13 . . . he played for the Ihabods from 2007-11 and finished his collegiate career as the most prolific passer in WU history . . . Robinson also announced the hiring of Julian Mendez as the new offensive line coach, which was under the guidance of Lane . . . Mendez joined the NSU staff after a two-year stint at Ellsworth Community College where he also served as O-line coach . . . prior to his time at ECC, he spent three years in various roles at Ottawa University . . . he was a volunteer in 2010, an assistant in 2011 and a graduate assistant in 2012 . . . Marvin Bohannon served as a graduate assistant in 2014 but was promoted to assistant coach following the departure of Bradley Thomas, who is now the offensive coordinator at Oklahoma Baptist University . . . Bohannon coaches the wide receivers . . . Will Skeans has returned to NSU and serves as the strength and conditioning coordinator/linebackers coach . . . he was a graduate assistant with the program from 2012-13.

**NSU SELECTED LAST IN PRESEASON POLLS** . . . Northeastern State was picked to finish 12th in both the 2015 MIAA Preseason Coaches' and Media Polls, the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association announced at the MIAA Football Media Day on August 3. The RiverHawks collected 16 points in the coaches' poll and 47 points in the media poll. They were also selected to finish 12th in both polls last season. Northwest Missouri State and Pittsburg State locked down the top two spots in both rankings. The Bearcats brought in eight of 12 first-place votes (118 total) in the coaches' poll and raked in 28 of 41 first-place votes (478 total) in the media poll. Pittsburg State earned four first-place votes in the coaches' poll and 13 in the media poll to earn 114 and 455 points, respectively. NSU finished 0-11 overall a year ago and finished 12th in the conference.

by an NSU QB since 2011 - and a pair of touchdowns . . . he had 26 yards rushing and a TD run in overtime . . . he led NSU on three TD drives of 52, 75 and 79 yards in the fourth quarter to send the game to OT . . . NSU trailed by 14 points twice in the final quarter before scoring the third TD with less than a minute to play in regulation . . . Terrance Dixon's first rushing touchdown early in the fourth quarter was the first TD on the ground for NSU this year . . . the RiverHawks were also penalized 201 yards, which broke both the school's all-time record and the MIAA's all-time record for penalty yards in a single game . . . NSU was flagged for 19 penalties, which broke the school's all-time record for most penalties called against a team in a single game . . . the mark also tied the MIAA's all-time record, which was matched most recently by Central Missouri in 1999 . . . NSU ran a school-record 90 plays, which broke a mark that hasn't been equaled since Sept. 27, 1980 . . . Garrett Powell had a career-high 14 receptions for 179 yards . . . the 21 points NSU scored in the fourth quarter was the most points in a quarter since the RiverHawks had 24 in the second frame against Lincoln on Nov. 3, 2012 . . . the last time NSU scored 21 points in a fourth quarter was against East Central on Sept. 27, 2008.

**THE 2014 SEASON OPENER** . . . Northeastern State opened the 2014 season against Pittsburg State University for the third year in a row . . . the Rob Robinson debut was seen by the fourth-largest crowd in Carnie Smith Stadium history (10,814) . . . Steffon Herd made his first start on the defensive side of the ball and finished the game with a team-high eight tackles . . . the contest also marked the first time NSU was shutout since Sept. 5, 2009 . . . the NSU defense held Jeff Seybold to a career-low 14 yards rushing . . . Seybold was an All-MIAA First Team member the year ago . . . the RiverHawks also had more fourth-down conversions (3-for-5) than third-down conversions (2-for-16).

**HOW THEY'VE FARED IN THE NEW LEAGUE** . . . The RiverHawks are in their fourth year as members of the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association . . . since joining the NCAA in 1996, NSU has been a member of the Lone Star Conference (1996-2011), an independent (2011-12), and now the MIAA (2012-P) . . . the MIAA is one of the strongest football conferences in the country, as it boasts multiple national champions and squads that routinely make deep runs in the NCAA Championship playoffs . . . the MIAA is home to two of the last four national champions, including Northwest Missouri State (2013) and Pittsburg State (2011) . . . since joining the MIAA, the RiverHawks are 6-27 overall with a 6-26 record against league opponents.

**FORMER RIVERHAWK WINS SUPER BOWL** . . . Former Northeastern State offensive lineman Michael Bowie became the 15th player in school history and the first in 21 years to be selected in the NFL draft when he was chosen by the Seattle Seahawks with the 36th pick in the seventh round in the 2013 draft . . . he was the 242nd

overall pick and is attempting to become the first NSU football player since 1992 to play for an NFL team . . . he started nine games along the offensive line during the season and helped lead Seattle to a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII . . . Bowie has since been claimed off waivers by the Cleveland Browns and is expected to miss his second-straight season due to injury.

**GOING BOWLING IN 2011** . . . Northeastern State made its first appearance in a bowl game since making the transition to Division II last season . . . the RiverHawks posted a 7-4 mark in the regular season and was awarded a bid to the Mineral Water Bowl, one of only two Division II bowl games . . . Northeastern State fell 28-14 to Minnesota State University in Excelsior Springs, Mo.

### NSU HELPS WELCOME UTSA TO COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL

. . . Northeastern State traveled to San Antonio, Texas, on Sept. 3, 2011, for a meeting with the UTSA Roadrunners . . . the special occasion marked the first football contest in UTSA history, which was won by the Roadrunners, 31-3 . . . the game attracted 56,743 fans, which was the largest crowd to ever watch an NSU football game and the largest crowd in NCAA to ever watch a program's first collegiate football game.
