THE HEADLINE

Northeastern State will have an opportunity to finish the final month of the season with a bang with their opponents having a combined 8-20 record. The last time NSU and the Lopers met last season was on the road with a 31-14 NSU win and the RiverHawks defense holding UNK to 199 yards of total offense. Through six games the series with the Lopers is tied at three wins apiece, in MIAA play both teams have taken games on their opposition's turf. The highlight of the series so far was in the 1980 NAIA Championship Semifinals with Northeastern State working a 14-point shutout.

QUICK HITS

LAST TIME OUT: Dimonic McKinzy aired out four touchdown passes with 263 yards against top-ranked Northwest Missouri in a 74-29 loss. The RiverHawks' Gary McKnight caught three touchdown passes with 136 yards and was the first receiver since 2011 that had three TD's against the Bearcats. NSU's passing game out-matched NWMSU by 27 with 318 yards in the air. Additionally, the RiverHawks held onto the ball with no-fumbles with the top-ranked Bearcats coughing up a pair. Inside the red zone, NSU remained effective and was perfect in both drives; the RiverHawks have scored in their last six drives into the red zone.

THE OPPONENT: The Lopers snapped a 17-game losing streak after holding off Central Oklahoma 47-32 in Kearney last weekend. Redshirt freshman Steve Worthing threw three touchdown passes and senior linebacker Tyke Kozeal returned an interception for a score with 1:44 left to seal the game for UNK. Central Oklahoma had well over 100 yards of total offense over UNK in the loss but it was four interceptions and two "pick-six" run-backs that helped tipped the scales. In the air this season, UNK is eleventh in the MIAA in passing offense with 225.3 yards, and its defense is seventh by allowing 268.4 yards in the air. UNK's O-line has allowed 17 sacks this year which is tenth most in the league. Worthing has 11 touchdown passes and eight interceptions in seven games this year; Kozeal leads the nation with 61 solo tackles and averages nearly 16 tackles per game this season.

IN THE AIR: Dimonic McKinzy is having a historic first season with the RiverHawks and through just seven games he is already eighth in NSU career NCAA Division II record book*. The sophomore

from Kansas City, Mo. has a pair of 300 passing yard games and three above 200, against Lindenwood on Sept. 8, he tossed five TD passes with no interceptions. With 16 touchdown passes, McKinzy is sixth in the NSU NCAA Division II record book as well.

L-TOWN: Gary McKnight, junior from Lawton, Okla. is second in the MIAA with 85.6 yards per game and second with seven touchdown passes this season. In one season, he is tied for seventh since 1996 when Northeastern State moved to NCAA Division II status in career TDs. McKnight has 599 receiving yards on 27 catches with a pair of three touchdown games.

THE HERD: Senior Steffon Herd is second in the MIAA with 49 solo tackles which is fourth most in NCAA Division II football this season. The four-year letter winner is averaging just over nine tackles a game and in fifth in NSU's NCAA Division II record book with 217 tackles in the backfield. Two weeks ago at home against #18 Emporia State he had 11 solo tackles.

THE HEAD COACHES: NSU's Rob Robinson (William Jewell, '00) is in his third season as the RiverHawks head coach...he was named the 19th head football coach in school history on Dec. 19, 2013...he owns a 4-25 all-time record...Robinson spent the previous 12 years under Craig Schurig as a member of the Washburn Ichabod coaching staff, serving as the offensive coordinator for the last four seasons...he also directed the running backs from 2007-13 and coached wide receivers from 2002-06...he served as the recruiting coordinator from 2002-10 and was the academic coordinator from 2010-13...Robinson was an integral member of the Washburn staff that completely turned around the Ichabod program... Washburn averaged 3.3 wins from 1989-03 and had just one winning season, but the Ichabods averaged 7.9 wins from 2004-13 and posted 10 straight winning campaigns...Robinson is the second former coordinator under Schruig's tutelage to become the head coach of another

program, joining Fort Hays State's Chris Brown...Robinson spent the 2001 season at Pittsburg State as a graduate assistant, coaching the defensive backs with Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig...the Gorillas won the MIAA Championship that year.

UNK's Josh Lamberson (Northwest '05) is in his second season with UNK and won his first game last week over Central Oklahoma and holds a career record of 1-17...came from Central Missouri where he was the offensive/ recruiting coordinator for five seasons and went 39-19 with back-to-back playoff appearances in 2010 and 2011...the Mules in 2014 led the MIAA with 35.7 points per game...spent two seasons with Southeastern Oklahoma as quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator (2008-10)...was a graduate assistant during the 2006-07 seasons with Northwest Missouri State where they played in two national championship games.

SACK PARTY: Northeastern State recorded 26 quarterback sacks last season, which was the most in a single season since the 2005 squad finished with 28...the RiverHawks had four sacks each against Pittsburg State, Missouri Western State and Nebraska-Kearney, while registering three against Central Missouri and Washburn...NSU had two sacks each against Fort Hays State, Northwest Missouri State and Missouri Southern State...the last time NSU posted multiple four-sack games in a single season was in 2010...Steffon Herd led the team with 5.0 sacks, which was the most in a single campaign since Travis Boswell finished with 7.0 in 2011...Irving Steele and T'Nheous Smith finished in a tie for second on the team with 4.0 sacks each...Quincy Dotson has

posted 3.5 sacks this year.

COMPETING AGAINST THE BEST: NSU has boasted one of the strongest strengths of schedule since joining the MIAA in 2012...the league always features a plethora of teams that earn national rankings, and this season is no different...of the 11 conference opponents on NSU's schedule for 2016, six earned preseason national rankings or were receiving votes from the American Football Coaches Association...the three ranked teams were No. 1 Northwest Missouri, No. 20 Central Missouri and No. 24 Emporia State...the three RV teams were Pittsburg State, Fort Hays State and Central Oklahoma.

BRING 'EM BACK: Last season, Northeastern State returned just 23 players from the 2014 team, while adding 64 newcomers to the roster...there were also just nine seniors on the team...the 2016 squad has much more stability, with 58 returning players and a whopping 23 seniors...the RiverHawks also began the 2016 season with 48 newcomers...in total, there are 23 seniors, 13 juniors, 15 sophomores and 55 freshmen.

STAFF STABILITY: For the first time since joining the MIAA, the RiverHawks had no changes in their full-time staff from the previous year...those entering their third year with the program are head coach Rob Robinson, defensive coordinator Josh Lattimer, special teams coordinator Rob Messinger, offensive coordinator Dane Simoneau and wide receivers coach Marvin Bohannon...Will Skeans is entering his second year as the strength and conditioning coach, and he is in his second stint with the program...he was a

coach Julian Mendez is also in his second year...those serving as graduate assistants with Northeastern State this season are Ryan Dvorak (second year) and newcomers Mitch Buhler, Chris Girdner and Jacques Washington.

NSU SELECTED 9TH/10TH IN PRESEASON POLLS:

The Northeastern State football team was picked to finish ninth in the 2016 MIAA Coaches Poll...the RiverHawks were also selected by the league media to finish 10th this season...this tied the highest NSU has been picked in its four previous years as league members, as the green and white was also picked ninth (coaches) and 10th (media) in a then-15 team league in 2012...Northeastern State was chosen 11th (coaches) and 10th (media) in 2013, and the RiverHawks were selected to finish last (12th) in the two preseason polls in both 2014 and 2015...Northeastern State collected 31 points in the coaches' poll and 117 points in the media poll...the team was selected to finish 12th last season...NSU finished 3-8 overall a year ago and finished in a tie for ninth in the conference.

MIAA, NSU PARTNER WITH STRETCH INTERNET

FOR 2016: The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association is set to continue its partnership with Stretch Internet to provide streaming of conference events...Stretch partners with the league and members institutions to broadcast all conference football and men's and women's basketball games, as well as selected other conference events...fans can view all conference football and basketball games live through almost any Internet connected device, including Smart TV's, Apple TV and Google Chromecast...the GameCentral 2.0 platform will also allow fans to access live stats in the video stream...the new platform also features archived games and other video content.

STRETCH INTERNET TO CONTINUE BROADCASTING

NSU THIS SEASON: The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association announced distribution partners and price points for the MIAA Television Network...fans can access the web streams through either from the league portal or from goriverhawksgo.com...beginning Sept. 3, fans will be able to purchase a day pass for \$9.95, and they also have the option of purchasing a football season pass for \$69.95...fans may purchase a season pass for volleyball for \$44.95 with men's and women's basketball season passes being available for \$89.95 each...fans wishing to have access to all MIAA web streaming content can



purchase an All-Access pass for \$149.95.

2016 NSU TAILGATING GUIDELINES: Entrance will open three hours prior to kickoff and will close to incoming vehicles two hours prior to kickoff...extreme caution must be taken when driving through the area...tailgating assignments consist of the equivalent of three parking spots...each group will get one assigned area...each assigned tailgate area will be allowed a maximum of one vehicle...areas will be assigned in sequence based on order of arrival...it is important to fill the tailgate areas in sequence in order to maximize space in an orderly, safe fashion...all participants are expected to respect fellow tailgaters...all participants are expected to follow local, state, and federal laws...participants who are currently enrolled NSU students are expected to abide by NSU Student Rules and Regulations...no tent stakes may be used on parking lot asphalt...vehicles will not be allowed to leave the tailgate area until kickoff.

TICKETS REQUIRED FOR ENTRY IN 2016-17: All fans wishing to attend an NSU home football or basketball contest this season will be required to show a ticket prior to entering the facilities...this is the third straight year ID's have been required at those events...NSU students and faculty/staff are allowed free admittance, but NSU ID's are not accepted as a form of entry...tickets can be purchased at NSU's ticketing website, goriverhawkstickets.com...NSU students and faculty/staff can access goriverhawkstickets.com and secure their free tickets (either printable or downloaded to your smart phone) through their goNSU accounts...for questions regarding ticket options, please contact Brynn Hamner at 918.444.3901.

VIDEOBOARD UPGRADE UNVEILED LAST SEASON: The 2016 campaign is the first full season that the RiverHawks will be utilizing the new videoboard that was debuted on October 3 of last year at Doc Wadley Stadium...funded completely through private dollars, the new project is estimated to cost \$100,000...the 16' x 9' videoboard with 32' branded top banner and 8' x 9' backlit advertising panels debuted at NSU's Oct. 3 home football game against Northwest Missouri State...Duckworth said the project cost was greatly reduced because there is already a current structure in place...one of the major difference fans will notice right away will be a larger videoboard that goes from standard definition to high definition...with the recent turf installation project completed this past summer, NSU has now invested approximately \$500,000 in upgrades to Doc Wadley Stadium last year.

RIVERHAWKS CONTINUE TO ENJOY NEW TURF UPGRADE: Northeastern State Director of Athletics Tony Duckworth selected Hellas Construction to provide and install new Matrix® Turf at Doc Wadley Stadium for the 2015 season...the new playing surface replaced the first iteration of field turf that was installed at Gable Field in 2005...the newest edition to the stadium features top-of-the-line turf which is currently utilized most notably by the Dallas Cowboys, Baylor University and the University of California...the design features the same NSU logo that currently dons center court inside the NSU Event Center, and the end zones have a black background with "NORTHEASTERN STATE" and "RIVERHAWKS" in large, white lettering outlined in NSU green...Hellas defines Matrix® Turf as the finest synthetic turf system available... from the advanced fibers, down through the patented REALFILL™ and reinforced backing – each component is part of an authentic, artificial turf system...Matrix® Turf has undergone decades of in-depth research and intense testing, resulting in countless innovations that make each Matrix synthetic turf field stronger and more reliable than ever before...Matrix® Turf is also held to a higher standard when it comes to testing for strength, safety and overall performance... each Matrix® Turf field is designed to provide a superior athletic experience at all levels of competition.

THE END OF AN ERA: The 2015 season marked the final year of competition for running back Joel Rockmore...the dynamic player joined the program in 2010 and stayed as a member of the RiverHawks for six seasons before saying goodbye to Tahlequah...he redshirted in both 2010 and 2013 and competed in 2011, '12, '14 and '15...during his time with NSU he was selected to two All-MIAA teams, one All-Region team and was also honored as a 2013 preseason All-American...he played in 42 games and made 35 starts, and he ended his time at Northeastern State with school records for career all-purpose yards (4,423) and kickoff return yards (1,100)...Rockmore finished his career with 2,843 rushing yards, 439 receiving yards, 1,100 kickoff

return yards and 11 punt return yards...he also scored 22 touchdowns (20 rushing, 1 receiving, 1 kick return)...his banner year came in 2012 when he rushed for 1,024 yards, making him the first member of the team since 2005 to eclipse the 1,000-yard plateau.

FORMER RIVERHAWK WINS SUPER BOWL: Former Northeastern State offensive lineman Michael Bowie became the 15th player in school history and the first in 21 years to be selected in the NFL draft when he was chosen by the Seattle Seahawks with the 36th pick in the seventh round in the 2013 draft...he was the 242nd overall pick and is attempting to become the first NSU football player since 1992 to play for an NFL team...he started nine games along the offensive line during the season and helped lead Seattle to a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII...Bowie was a member of the Cleveland Browns for two seasons but was forced to retire this past offseason due to nagging injuries.

NSU HELPS WELCOME UTSA TO COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL: Northeastern State traveled to San Antonio, Texas, on Sept. 3, 2011, for a meeting with the UTSA Roadrunners...the special occasion marked the first football contest in UTSA history, which was won by the Roadrunners, 31-3...the game attracted 56,743 fans, which was the largest crowd to ever watch an NSU football game and the largest crowd in NCAA to ever watch a program's first collegiate football game.

MARYVILLE, Mo. - Gary McKnight caught three touchdown passes for Northeastern State but they would fall 74-29 in a high scoring battle on Saturday at top-ranked Northwest Missouri State.

McKnight's effort against the Bearcats tied his NSU career best that was last set earlier this season against Lindenwood. Additionally, he was first receiver to catch three TDs against the Bearcats since the 2011 season; the Lawton, Okla. native had 136 yards.

Dimonic McKinzy threw for 263 yards in the air and had four touchdown passes; his effort was the best by an opposing quarterback since Central Missouri did the same on Sept. 19, 2015

Additionally, the 29 points by the RiverHawks was the most allowed this year by the Bearcats and in the last 18 games. The points scored by NSU is also the most in the seven meetings of the series between the two programs. Prior to Saturday's contest, the Bearcats were only allowing under 14 points per game this season.

"I thought our kids played hard for four quarters," said head coach Rob Robinson. "Our offensive line did really well today, Dimonic (McKinzy) only took one shot all day...we made some big plays and made them (Northwest Missouri State) play all four quarters."

"We just need to build on what we are doing, we have gotten better each week. We took a step forward this week in showing we can move the ball against a really good defense and got some more confidence on the offensive side of the ball."

Northeastern State had 318 passing yards which surpassed the Bearcats by 27 yards. On the defensive side of the ball, Devon Siers had a team game high 11 tackles with Tim Howard only one behind.

Northwest Missouri's Kyle Zimmerman had five touchdowns and 270 yards.

The loss will send NSU to 1-6 overall and in the MIAA; Northwest Missouri picked up their 22nd win in a row to move to 7-0 this year.

First Quarter

Northeastern State struck first on the opening drive with Ra'Keim Abdul catching a pass from Dimonic McKinzy for 75 yards for six points, the extra point would miss. On the next drive, the Bearcats drove down the field for 61 yards to score seven. NWMSU drove down the field twice before the quarter ended scoring on a 42-yard drive and a 49-yard drive to put the RiverHawks behind 21-6.

Second Quarter

The RiverHawks scored on the opening play of the quarter with Gary McKnight picking up a TD on a 15-yard pass from McKinzy. On the NSU extra point, the Bearcats blocked the kick and ran the ball back for a safety to make it a 23-12 game. Northwest after the RiverHawks kick on the following drive quickly went down the field in under two minutes to score on a four-yard rush from in the red-zone to go up 30-12. The scoring continued in the drive with the RiverHawks picking up a field goal from 39-yards out to cut the NWMSU lead to 15 points. The Bearcats scored on the fourth consecutive drive by both teams after connecting a 76-yard pass to go up 36-15 at the 8:17 mark.

Northwest Missouri picked up their third TD of the quarter on a 63-yard drive and move the score to 44-15 on NSU. In the next drive, the RiverHawks fumbled the ball into their own end zone for a safety to bring the score to 46-15 at the half.

Third Quarter

It only took 39 seconds NWMSU to score on two plays to increase their lead to 53-15. Northeastern State followed up on the next drive to put up a TD pass on two plays for 72-yards to push pass 20 points. At the 10:45 mark, the Bearcats took six plays for 63 yards to make the score 60-22 on the RiverHawks. McKinzy continued to air out the ball for this fourth touchdown pass of the game for 25 yards to McKnight to margin to 31 on the Bearcats. Northwest Missouri scored their third TD of the quarter at the 5:14 mark on a one-yard rush to put the score at 67-29.

Fourth Quarter

The Bearcats scored the final points of the contest at the 6:23 mark on a one-yard rush by the QB to get to Saturday's final score, 74-29.

HEAD COACH ROB ROBINSON

The 2016 campaign is the third at NSU for Rob Robinson. He was named the 19th head football coach in school history on Dec. 19, 2013, and he is currently 4-25 at the helm of the program.

Robinson's inaugural season with the program in 2014 saw the team post a 0-11 overall record and a 0-11 mark in the MIAA. The team featured one All-MIAA Third Team member and six All-MIAA Honorable Mention performers. NSU had one player named MIAA Scholar-Athlete and 14 that landed on the MIAA Academic Honor Roll. Ross Dvorak was also named to the 2014 Capital One Academic All-America® NCAA Division II Second Team.

The RiverHawks earned their first win under Robinson in 2015 and ended the campaign with a 3-8 record. The team featured nine All-MIAA performers and 16 MIAA Academic Honor Roll honorees.

Prior to his arrival in Tahlequah, Robinson spent 12 years under Craig Schurig as a member of the Washburn Ichabod coaching staff. He was the offensive coordinator for the last four seasons. He also directed the running backs from 2007-13 and coached the wide receivers from 2002-06. He served as the recruiting coordinator from 2002-10 and was the academic coordinator from 2010-13.

Robinson was an integral member of a Washburn staff that completely turned around the Ichabod program. Washburn averaged 3.3 wins from 1989-03 and had just one winning season, but the Ichabods averaged 7.9 wins from 2004-13 and posted 10 straight winning campaigns.

Washburn competed in the NCAA Division II Football Playoffs three times in a nine-year span (2005, '07, '11) and captured the first MIAA Championship in school history in 2005. The Ichabods also won the 2004 Mineral Water Bowl and the 2010 Kanza Bowl.

In Robinson's first season as offensive coordinator, he led Washburn to 10th in the nation in scoring offense (37.2 ppg) and 10th nationally in total offense (460.3 ypg). Washburn ranked fifth in the nation in total offense (481.5 ypg) and 11th in scoring offense (38.6 ppg) in 2011, and the Ichabods were once again 11th in the country in scoring offense (40.9 ppg) in 2013.

The 2011 campaign was arguably the best in school history, as WU won a school-record 10 games and lost just three. One of those victories included a 52-49 triumph over Abilene Christian in the first round of the NCAA Division II Football Championship, marking the first playoff win in school history.

Robinson is the second former coordinator under Schurig's tutelage to become the head coach of another program, joining Fort Hays State's Chris Brown.

At Washburn, Robinson coached two players who earned All-American distinction. He also had six players receive various all-region awards and 18 players who landed All-MIAA accolades at either wide receiver, running back, fullback, or kick returner. He guided the top two offenses and the top two passing seasons in school history. In 2011, he directed quarterback Dane Simoneau to a second-place finish for the NCAA Division II College Football Player of the Year Award (Harlon Hill Trophy). Simoneau tossed 38 touchdowns and became the first Ichabod signal caller to throw for more than 4,000 yards.

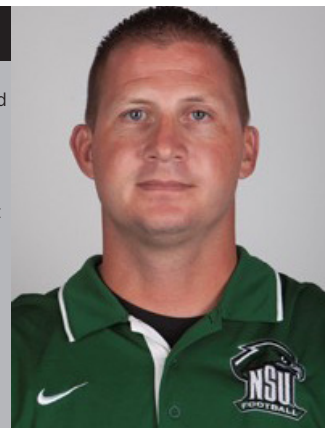
In 2007, Robinson's first as running backs coach, he guided Ra'Shawn Mosley to the school's all-time rushing crown as he finished with 1,199 yards, four shy of the Ichabod single-season record. Washburn notched the third-highest single-season rushing total in school history with 2,351 yards on 495 carries with 29 touchdowns. Ichabod Brandon Walker earned All-MIAA Second Team honors and Mosley finished as an honorable mention all-conference pick. In the kickoff return game, Cary Williams averaged 28.6 yards per return to finish 10th in the nation. He was named to the All-MIAA First Team.

While coaching the Ichabod wide receivers, Robinson guided four of the top seven receivers in school history. Those included two All-MIAA selections, an all-region receiver and Sam Sissom, the No. 4 receiver all-time in the MIAA and Washburn's career leader in receiving yards and receptions. In 2004, Sissom became only the third Washburn receiver to go over the 1,000-yard mark as the Ichabods broke the school record for most passing yards in a season.

Robinson spent the 2001 season at Pittsburg State as a graduate assistant, coaching the defensive backs with Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig. The Gorillas won the MIAA Championship that year.

Robinson received a bachelor of art degree in history from William Jewell College in 2000. He was a four-year letterman and three-year starter for the Cardinals at fullback. He was named the 1997 and '98 Special Teams Player of the Year and was an all-conference selection his junior season. He was named to the Player's Leadership Committee and to the All-Heart of American Conference Third Team as a senior.

Robinson and his wife Jes have two sons, Tabor and Beckett, and one daughter, Grier.
