



# Northeastern State University 2016 RiverHawks Football

**NSU vs. FORT HAYS STATE • Saturday • Sept. 24, 2016  
1 p.m. (CT) • Doc Wadley Stadium (8,300) • Tahlequah, Okla.**

**THE GAME . . .** The *Northeastern State RiverHawks* (1-2, 1-2 MIAA) return home for the second time this season on Saturday when they host the *Fort Hays State Tigers* (2-1, 2-1 MIAA) . . . kickoff is set for 1:00 p.m. Sept. 24 at Doc Wadley Stadium/Gable Field (8,300) in Tahlequah, Okla. for NSU's annual Homecoming Game . . . the game can be heard live locally on KEOK 102.1 FM with Bill Huddleston (play-by-play) and Sean Rowley (color) providing commentary . . . a free audio broadcast can be found at [goriverhawksgo.com](http://goriverhawksgo.com) . . . the game will be streamed live on Stretch Internet (<http://portal.stretchinternet.com/nsu>, subscription based) . . . a football-only season pass is available for \$69.95, and a day pass can be purchased for \$9.95.

**THE MATCHUP . . .** NSU and FHSU have met only four previous times, with the series even at 2-2-0. Northeastern State won the first two meetings, 16-14 (1989) and 37-7 (1990). The Tigers have won both contests in MIAA action, securing a 48-13 triumph in 2014 and edging the RiverHawks, 27-13, in Hays a year ago.

**THE HEAD COACHES . . .** NSU's Rob Robinson (William Jewell, '00) is in his third season as the RiverHawks head coach . . . he was named the 19th head football coach in school history on Dec. 19, 2013 . . . he owns a 4-21 all-time record . . . Robinson spent the previous 12 years under Craig Schurig as a member of the Washburn Ichabod coaching staff, serving as the offensive coordinator for the last four seasons . . . he also directed the running backs from 2007-13 and coached wide receivers from 2002-06 . . . he served as the recruiting coordinator from 2002-10 and was the academic coordinator from 2010-13 . . . Robinson was an integral member of the Washburn staff that completely turned around the Ichabod program . . . Washburn averaged 3.3 wins from 1989-03 and had just one winning season, but the Ichabods averaged 7.9 wins from 2004-13 and posted 10 straight winning campaigns . . . Robinson is the second former coordinator under Schurig's tutelage to become the head coach of another program, joining Fort Hays State's Chris Brown . . . Robinson spent the 2001 season at Pittsburg State as a graduate assistant, coaching the defensive backs with Ichabod head coach Craig Schurig . . . the Gorillas won the MIAA Championship that year.

FHSU's Chris Brown (Pittsburg State, 1996) is in his sixth season as head coach for the Tigers . . . he owns a 32-27 career record at FHSU, including last season's 8-3 mark where the Tigers finished third in the MIAA . . . he was the defensive coordinator at Washburn from 2002-10 where he also coached defensive backs . . . he was named assistant head coach at Washburn in 2010 . . . prior to entering the collegiate ranks, Brown coached three seasons at Liberal High School as a secondary coach.

**McKINZY EARNS WEEKLY TOP HONOR . . .** Dimonic McKinzy was selected as the MIAA Football Offensive Athlete of the Week on Sept. 12 . . . he became the only quarterback in the MIAA through two weeks with more than three touchdown passes in a game when his five TD throws led NSU to a thrilling 35-31 come-from-behind victory over Lindenwood on Sept. 8 . . . the sophomore was 23-of-47 passing for 300 yards, five touchdowns and zero interceptions . . . he also led the RiverHawks in rushing with 38 yards on 10 carries . . . Northeastern State trailed 31-21 with 5:30 left in the game, but McKinzy led the RiverHawks on two late TD drives that amassed 181 yards in just 3:09 . . . the final game-winning drive went 98 yards in just 1:38 and was capped by a 17-yard TD pass to junior Gary McKnight with just 33 seconds remaining on the clock . . . McKinzy's five touchdown passes were the second-most in school history and the most by an NSU quarterback since the 2011 season . . . the laurel is the first offensive athlete of the week accolade for a Northeastern State football player since the RiverHawks joined the MIAA in 2012. This also marked the third conference weekly honor overall for NSU since joining the league. Langston Jones was tabbed the league's defensive athlete of the week on Sept. 16, 2013, and Garrett Powell was named the special teams athlete of the week on Oct. 19, 2015.

**ON THE UPTICK . . .** The RiverHawks football program is enjoying Year 3 of the Rob Robinson . . . the program continues to move in the right direction and the 2016 season is sure to show further progress toward bringing Northeastern State back to prominence . . . Robinson's first year saw the team go 0-11, but it took him just one year to rebound as the 2015 team posted a 3-8 record . . . the coaching staff has added plenty of play-makers that will help generate more wins this year.

**SACK PARTY . . .** Northeastern State recorded 26 quarterback sacks last season, which was the most in a single season since the 2005 squad finished with 28 . . . the RiverHawks had four sacks each against Pittsburg State, Missouri Western State and Nebraska-Kearney, while registering three against Central Missouri and Washburn . . . NSU had two sacks each against Fort Hays State, Northwest Missouri State and Missouri Southern State. . . the last time NSU posted multiple four-sack games in a single season was in 2010 . . . Steffon Herd led the team with 5.0 sacks, which was the most in a single campaign since Travis Boswell finished with 7.0 in 2011 . . . Irving Steele and T'Nheous Smith finished in a tie for second on the team with 4.0 sacks each . . . Quincy Dotson has posted 3.5 sacks this year.

**DON'T THROW ON US . . .** Northeastern State defensive coordinator Josh Lattimer has injected an exciting new brand of defense to the RiverHawks program . . . in his two years leading his side of the football, NSU has been one of the MIAA's most dominant team's in terms of shutting down the opponent's pass game . . . in 2014, the RiverHawks finished fourth in the league in pass defense, allowing just 187.1 yards per game through the air . . . the 2015 squad allowed four additional yards per game (191.1) but fared better in the league, finishing second in the conference only to the team that went on to claim the national championship (Northwest Missouri State).

**COMPETING AGAINST THE BEST . . .** NSU has boasted one of the strongest strengths of schedule since joining the MIAA in 2012 . . . the league always features a plethora of teams that earn national rankings, and this season is no different . . . of the 11 conference opponents on NSU's schedule for 2016, six earned preseason national rankings or were receiving votes from the American Football Coaches Association . . . the three ranked teams were No. 1 Northwest Missouri, No. 20 Central Missouri and No. 24 Emporia State . . . the three RV teams were Pittsburg State, Fort Hays State and Central Oklahoma.

**BRING 'EM BACK . . .** Last season, Northeastern State returned just 23 players from the 2014 team, while adding 64 newcomers to the roster . . . there were also just nine seniors on the team . . . the 2016 squad has much more stability, with 58 returning players and a whopping 23 seniors . . . the RiverHawks also began the 2016 season with 48 newcomers . . . in total, there are 23 seniors, 13 juniors, 15 sophomores and 55 freshmen.

**STAFF STABILITY . . .** For the first time since joining the MIAA, the RiverHawks had no changes in their full-time staff from the previous year . . . those entering their third year with the program are head coach Rob Robinson, defensive coordinator Josh Lattimer, special teams coordinator Rob Messinger, offensive coordinator Dane Simoneau and wide receivers coach Marvin Bohannon . . . Will Skeans is entering his second year as

Northeastern State has won two national championships in its storied history, both coming at the NAIA level. The RiverHawks (then the Redmen) claimed national titles in both 1958 and 1994. The team has also recorded two undefeated campaigns.

the strength and conditioning coach, and he is in his second stint with the program . . . he was a graduate assistant at NSU in 2012-13 . . . offensive line coach Julian Mendez is also in his second year . . . those serving as graduate assistants with Northeastern State this season are Ryan Dvorak (second year) and newcomers Mitch Buhler, Chris Girdner and Jacques Washington.

**NSU SELECTED 9TH/10TH IN PRESEASON POLLS . . .** The Northeastern State football team was picked to finish ninth in the 2016 MIAA Coaches Poll . . . the RiverHawks were also selected by the league media to finish 10th this season . . . this tied the highest NSU has been picked in its four previous years as league members, as the green and white was also picked ninth (coaches) and 10th (media) in a then-15 team league in 2012 . . . Northeastern State was chosen 11th (coaches) and 10th (media) in 2013, and the RiverHawks were selected to finish last (12th) in the two preseason polls in both 2014 and 2015 . . . Northeastern State collected 31 points in the coaches' poll and 117 points in the media poll . . . the team was selected to finish 12th last season . . . NSU finished 3-8 overall a year ago and finished in a tie for ninth in the conference.

**HOW THEY'VE FARED IN THE NEW LEAGUE . . .** The RiverHawks are in their fifth year as members of the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association . . . since joining the NCAA in 1996, NSU has been a member of the Lone Star Conference (1996-2011), an independent (2011-12), and now the MIAA (2012-P) . . . the MIAA is one of the strongest football conferences in the country, as it boasts multiple national champions and squads that routinely make deep runs in the NCAA Championship playoffs . . . the MIAA is home to three of the last five national champions, including Northwest Missouri State (2013, 2015) and Pittsburg State (2011) . . . since joining the MIAA, the RiverHawks are 10-35 overall with a 10-34 record against league opposition.

**NSU ATHLETICS PUBLICATIONS RECEIVE NATIONAL RECOGNITION . . .** The Northeastern State Athletics Media Relations Department earned national recognition for its publications designs during the 2015-16 academic year, as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) . . . headlining the accolades was the 2015 women's and men's soccer schedule poster, which won the award for Nation's Best Poster in the College Division . . . the College Division consists of every non-NCAA Division I school, including NCAA Division II, NCAA Division III, and all NAIA and NJCAA institutions . . . the NSU Athletics schedule posters dominated the entire poster category, winning five of the top six positions . . . the 2015-16 women's and men's basketball schedule poster earned runner-up honors, while the 2016 softball/baseball poster was selected third in the nation . . . the 2016 women's tennis poster received fourth place in the division, while the 2015 football poster was honored as sixth-best in the country . . . the NSU Athletics schedule posters are a collaboration between the NSU Athletics Media Relations Department and the NSU Communications and Marketing Department . . . CoSIDA sponsors a variety of media guide/publication and digital design contests and an annual writing contest for its members, with every CoSIDA member at every level having the opportunity to receive recognition for his/her work . . . the judging is done by news media/communications professionals who utilize those publications in their work.

**MIAA, NSU PARTNER WITH STRETCH INTERNET FOR 2016 . . .** The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association is set to continue its partnership with Stretch Internet® to provide streaming of conference events . . . Stretch partners with the league and members institutions to broadcast all conference football and men's and women's basketball games, as well as selected other conference events . . . fans can view all conference football and basketball games live through almost any internet connected device, including Smart TV's, Apple TV and Google Chromecast . . . the GameCentral 2.0 platform will also allow fans to access live stats in the video stream . . . the new platform also features archived games and other video content.

**STRETCH INTERNET TO CONTINUE BROADCASTING NSU THIS SEASON . . .** The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association announced distribution partners and price points for the MIAA Television Network . . . fans can access the web streams through either from the league portal or from goriverhawksgo.com . . . beginning Sept. 3, fans will be able to purchase a day pass for \$9.95, and they also have the option of purchasing a football season pass for \$69.95 . . . fans may purchase a season pass for volleyball for \$44.95 with men's and women's basketball season passes being available for \$89.95 each . . . fans wishing to have access to all MIAA web streaming content can purchase an All-Access pass for \$149.95.

**2016 NSU TAILGATING GUIDELINES . . .** Entrance will open three hours prior to kickoff and will close to incoming vehicles two hours prior kickoff . . . extreme caution must be taken when driving through the area . . . tailgating assignments consist of the equivalent of three parking spots . . . each group will get one assigned area . . . each assigned tailgate area will be allowed a maximum of one vehicle . . . areas will be assigned in sequence based on order of arrival . . . it is important to fill the tailgate areas in sequence in order to maximize space in an orderly, safe fashion . . . all participants are expected to respect fellow tailgaters . . . all participants are expected to follow local, state, and federal laws . . . participants who are currently enrolled NSU students are expected to abide by NSU Student Rules and Regulations . . . no tent stakes may be used on parking lot asphalt . . . vehicles will not be allowed to leave the tailgate area until kickoff.

**SEASON TICKETS ON SALE . . .** Season ticket packages are on sale for the five-game home portion of the upcoming 2016 football schedule . . . prices begin as low as \$45 per person for an adult general admission ticket . . . season chair back seats begin at \$75 each . . . season ticket holders receive the benefit of sitting in comfortable chair back seats for NSU's five home MIAA contests where they can watch future NFL players competing in the finest NCAA Division II conference in the nation . . . they also receive excellent view of the halftime show featuring the NSU Band . . . the 2016 campaign will mark the fourth year of the \$25 single-game Family 4-Pack, which includes two general admission adult tickets and two general admission student tickets (ages 4 through high school) . . . the Family 4-Pack may be purchased at any time and used at any regular season home game . . . all Northeastern State home football games are played at Doc Wadley Stadium . . . also for convenience, the Athletics Department will continue utilizing online ticketing for football and basketball. Online ticketing will allow for advanced ticket sales . . . all fans are required to show a ticket prior to entering an NSU football or basketball contest . . . NSU students and faculty/staff are allowed free admittance, but NSU ID's are not accepted as a form of entry . . . NSU faculty/staff can purchase an upgraded reserved chair back season ticket for just \$25 . . . Northeastern State is entering its fifth season as members of the MIAA and will play against teams from one of the premier conferences in the country . . . fans are encouraged to wear their NSU Green to all games . . . all RiverHawks gear can be purchased by visiting [goriverhawksgear.com](http://goriverhawksgear.com), the official online store of RiverHawks Athletics . . . for questions regarding ticket options, please contact Brynn Hamner at 918.444.3901.

**TICKETS REQUIRED FOR ENTRY IN 2016-17 . . .** All fans wishing to attend an NSU home football or basketball contest this season will be required to show a ticket prior to entering the facilities . . . this is the third-straight year ID's have been required at those events . . . NSU students and faculty/staff are allowed free admittance, but NSU ID's are not accepted as a form of entry . . . tickets can be purchased at NSU's ticketing website, [goriverhawkstickets.com](http://goriverhawkstickets.com) . . . NSU students and faculty/staff can access [goriverhawkstickets.com](http://goriverhawkstickets.com) and secure their free tickets (either printable or downloaded to your smart phone) through their goNSU accounts . . . for questions regarding ticket options, please contact Brynn Hamner at 918.444.3901.

**VIDEOBOARD UPGRADE UNVEILED LAST SEASON . . .** The 2016 campaign is the first full season that the RiverHawks will be utilizing the new videoboard that was debuted on October 3 of last year at Doc Wadley Stadium . . . funded completely through private dollars, the new project is estimated to cost \$100,000 . . . the 16' x 9' videoboard with 32' branded top banner and 8' x 9' backlit advertising panels debuted at NSU's Oct. 3 home football game against Northwest Missouri State . . . Duckworth said the project cost was greatly reduced because there is already a current structure in place . . . one of the major difference fans will notice right away will be a larger videoboard that goes from standard definition to high definition . . . with the recent turf installation project completed this past summer, NSU has now invested approximately \$500,000 in upgrades to Doc Wadley Stadium last year.

**RIVERHAWKS CONTINUE TO ENJOY NEW TURF UPGRADE . . .** Northeastern State Director of Athletics Tony Duckworth selected Hellas Construction to provide and install new Matrix® Turf at Doc Wadley Stadium for the 2015 season . . . the new playing surface replaced the first iteration of field turf that was installed at Gable Field in 2005 . . . the newest edition to the stadium features top-of-the-line turf which is currently utilized most notably by the Dallas Cowboys, Baylor University and the University of California . . . the design features the same NSU logo that currently dons center court inside the NSU Event Center, and the end zones have a black background with "NORTHEASTERN STATE" and "RIVERHAWKS" in large, white lettering outlined in

**THE END OF AN ERA . . .** The 2015 season marked the final year of competition for running back Joel Rockmore . . . the dynamic player joined the program in 2010 and stayed as a member of the RiverHawks for six seasons before saying goodbye to Tahlequah . . . he redshirted in both 2010 and 2013 and competed in 2011, '12, '14 and '15 . . . during his time with NSU he was selected to two All-MIAA teams, one All-Region team and was also honored as a 2013 preseason All-American . . . he played in 42 games and made 35 starts, and he ended his time at Northeastern State with school records for career all-purpose yards (4,423) and kickoff return yards (1,100) . . . Rockmore finished his career with 2,843 rushing yards, 439 receiving yards, 1,100 kickoff return yards and 11 punt return yards . . . he also scored 22 touchdowns (20 rushing, 1 receiving, 1 kick return) . . . his banner year came in 2012 when he rushed for 1,024 yards, making him the first member of the team since 2005 to eclipse the 1,000-yard plateau.

**9 RIVERHAWKS EARN POSTSEASON ACCOLADES IN 2015 . . .** Northeastern State had nine players named all-conference last year . . . highlighting the group were punter Garrett Powell (All-MIAA Second Team), running back Joel Rockmore (All-MIAA Third Team) and offensive tackle Jordan Baldwin (All-MIAA Third Team) . . . NSU also had six individuals named All-MIAA Honorable Mention . . . those were: linebacker Irving Steele, defensive backs Steffon Herd and Darian Morris, fullback Michael Davis, defensive lineman Quincy Dotson and defensive back Devon Siers . . . Powell punted the ball 69 times for 2,800 yards . . . he was second in the MIAA and 27th in the nation with a 40.6 yard-per-punt average . . . he also had the longest punt of the season by any MIAA punter (71 yards), while leading the MIAA in most punts fair caught (27) and most of 50 yards or more (9) . . . he also did not have a punt blocked all season . . . Rockmore rushed the ball 171 times for 854 yards . . . he was seventh in the MIAA in rushing yards per game (77.6) . . . he finished the season with 1,363 all-purpose yards, and his 123.9 per-game average ranked sixth in the conference . . . he also led NSU with five total touchdowns this year . . . Steele finished fifth in the MIAA and 13th in the nation with 128 total tackles (11.6 per game) . . . he was also fifth in the league and 17th in the country with 65 solo stops . . . he added 10.0 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks, two QB hurries, one fumble recovery and one pass breakup . . . Herd finished sixth in the conference and 26th in the NCAA with 111 total tackles (10.1 per game) . . . he was also fourth in the league and 15th in the country with 66 solo stop . . . he added 8.0 TFL's, 5.0 sacks and three pass breakups . . . Morris finished the season with 93 tackles (49 solo, 44 assist), 5.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks . . . he was 89th in the NCAA and 10th in the conference in total tackles . . . he finished fifth in the MIAA in interceptions (4) and ninth in the league in pass breakups (12) . . . he was also second in the country and first in the league with four fumble recoveries . . . one of those fumbles he returned 97 yards for a touchdown against Missouri Southern State . . . Davis ran the ball seven times for 25 yards and had one reception for eight yards, serving primarily as a lead blocker . . . Dotson finished the year with 43 tackles, 9.5 TFL's and 3.5 sacks. He also had two forced fumbles and one pass breakup . . . Siers totaled 81 tackles, 2.0 TFL's, seven pass breakups, one interception, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble.

**2015 MIAA ACADEMIC AWARD WINNERS . . .** Northeastern State placed 16 members of the squad on the MIAA Academic Honor Roll for a second-straight year . . . those included four offensive players, 10 defensive players and two kickers . . . to achieve honor roll status, a student-athlete must have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.00 and have at least two terms of attendance at the certifying member institution, excluding summer terms . . . of those 271 student-athletes, 24 earned the MIAA Scholar Athlete Award, which is given to those who have a cumulative grade-point average of 3.50, have at least two terms of attendance at the certifying member institution, excluding summer terms, and, if competing in a championship sport of the MIAA, earn All-MIAA honors.

**FORMER RIVERHAWK WINS SUPER BOWL . . .** Former Northeastern State offensive lineman Michael Bowie became the 15th player in school history and the first in 21 years to be selected in the NFL draft when he was chosen by the Seattle Seahawks with the 36th pick in the seventh round in the 2013 draft . . . he was the 242nd overall pick and is attempting to become the first NSU football player since 1992 to play for an NFL team . . . he started nine games along the offensive line during the season and helped lead Seattle to a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII . . . Bowie was a member of the Cleveland Browns for two seasons but was forced to retire this past offseason due to nagging injuries.

**GOING BOWLING IN 2011 . . .** Northeastern State made its first appearance in a bowl game since making the transition to Division II last season . . . the RiverHawks posted a 7-4 mark in the regular season and was awarded a bid to the Mineral Water Bowl, one of only two Division II bowl games . . . Northeastern State fell 28-14 to Minnesota State University in Excelsior Springs, Mo.

**NSU HELPS WELCOME UTSA TO COLLEGIATE FOOTBALL . . .** Northeastern State traveled to San Antonio, Texas, on Sept. 3, 2011, for a meeting with the UTSA Roadrunners . . . the special occasion marked the first football contest in UTSA history, which was won by the Roadrunners, 31-3 . . . the game attracted 56,743 fans, which was the largest crowd to ever watch an NSU football game and the largest crowd in NCAA to ever watch a program's first collegiate football game.
