TURN BACK THE CLOCK

Northeastern State will be honoring the 1958 NAIA National Championship team during Saturday's contest. The Redmen during that year went 11-0 and won the Holiday Bowl, 19-13, over Northern Arizona in St. Petersburg, Fla. NSU would have two All-Americans from that squad in Claude Billingsly and Dan Smith.

HOMECOMING

Saturday's contest is NSU's 91st homecoming football game that dates back to the 1924 season with Northeastern State beating Kansas City University, 10-0. The RiverHawks are looking to snap a six game skid on homecoming with their last win coming in 2011 against Harding (49-41). Between 1924 and 1992, NSU was 39-23-3 on homecoming.

ON THIS DATE

Northeastern State has played on Sept. 29 11 previous times with its last coming in 2012 at Northwest Missouri. At home, NSU is 6-1-1 when playing on this date. The tie came in the 1950 season against Southeastern Oklahoma; neither team scored in the contest. This will be the first time NSU has hosted as school from Nebraska on this date. The last time Northeastern State has hosted an out-of-state program on this date was in 1978 against Central Missouri.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

Northeastern State opened the season with three straight contests with teams featured on the AFCA National Poll. On MasseyRatings.com, the RiverHawks have played the third toughest schedule in the nation.

QUARTERBACK NOTEBOOK

► **Cade Yeager** threw his 20th career touchdown pass for the RiverHawks in week-three. The sophomore is tied for fifth in NSU's NCAA Division II record book.
► NSU junior quarterback **Jake Pruitt** had the most snaps last week at Missouri Western and went 9-for-20 with 134 passing yards.
► **Jay Baker** and **Brice Waggle** both played a series in the fourth quarter at Missouri Western.

RECEIVER NOTEBOOK

► **Isaiah Upshaw** had a career high 104 receiving yards at Missouri Western on four catches. The NSU sophomore had a team game high 52-yard catch in the third quarter.
► **Ryheem Brummitt** leads NSU with two touchdown catches and needs one yard to pass 200 for the season.

RUNNING BACK NOTEBOOK

► **Boo McKnight** had his first start as the leading back for the RiverHawks in week-four. The NSU junior had nine carries and his first touchdown of the season in the third quarter.
► **Craig Davis** scored his second touchdown of the season at Missouri Western.
► Northeastern State has ran the ball more

than passed for three consecutive games.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTEBOOK

► Junior **Jason Staggs** has started in 20 games and has played eight straight.
► Freshman **Jason Bell** started has the last two games.
► **Chase Vance** started at center for NSU for the first time this season in week-four.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

► Freshman **Brady Ellsworth** has seven punts that have landed inside of the 20-yard line, which is tied for third best in the MIAA. In 33 punts this season, he is averaging 36.1 yards per kick.
► **Craig Davis** is ninth in the MIAA in All-Purpose yards with 108.5 and leads the conference in kick return yards with 343.
► The RiverHawks have blocked three extra-points this season and had two last week at Missouri Western. **Ja'len Evans** ran back a PAT for a safety in the second quarter at Missouri Western.
► **Upshaw's** 34-yard punt return in the third quarter at Missouri Western was the longest since the 2016 season.

DEFENSIVE BACK NOTEBOOK

► **Jean Bazlie** and **Jordan Prince** both made their first starts for NSU in the secondary in week-three.
► **Courtland Clark** was third in tackles for the RiverHawks at Missouri Western with eight and is third this season with 24.

LINEBACKER NOTEBOOK

► **Lane Yoder** picked-off a pass and had six tackles for the RiverHawks in week-three vs. Pitt State; he is fourth on the defensive side with 22 tackles.
► **J'Quille Washington** led NSU with ten tackles and he had two take-downs for a loss at Missouri Western. **Washington** has six tackles for loss this season which is tied for second in the MIAA.

INTERIOR DECOR

Much of the interior of Doc Wadley Stadium got a makeover during the summer off-season thanks to a \$300,000 renovation. The NSU football locker room and sports medicine center increased to approximately 2,000 feet with the upgrades. Within the locker room, 110 new custom lockers and flooring were placed in, and 500 square feet were added.

NEW-D

Over the off-season, the RiverHawks bought in a **Eric Gibson** as its new defensive coordinator. Gibson comes to Northeastern State from Southwestern Oklahoma where he held the same position in the last four seasons. The Gibson led defense in Weatherford, was in the top-5 in the Great American Conference each year. While at Southwestern Oklahoma, Gibson has coached two All-Americans, five All-Region players, and two Cliff Harris Award finalists.

Head Coach Rob Robinson is 2-2 when facing the Lopers and picked up his first coaching win in 2015 in Kearney. The series is even at 4-4 and the RiverHawks have won two of the last three meetings with the Lopers. In 1980, both teams met in Tahlequah in the NAIA postseason where Northeastern State would shutout the Lopers 14-0 at Doc Wadley Stadium. Saturday's meeting will be the fourth year in a row that both teams have met.

COACHING MATCHUP

Rob Robinson (6-42) is in his fifth season as head coach at Northeastern State. In three seasons at NSU, Robinson has 33 student-athletes who have been named All-MIAA, and 61 who where named to the MIAA Academic Honor Roll. Robinson was named the 19th head football coach in school history on Dec. 19, 2013 and spending previous 12 years under Craig Schurig as a member of the Washburn Ihabod coaching staff, serving as the offensive coordinator for his last four seasons at WU.

Josh Lynn (42-37) was named the 18th head football coach in Nebraska-Kearney history on Jan. 4th, 2017. He is a native of Eunice, N.M., and an Eastern New Mexico graduate. Over the past five seasons, Lynn helped turn his alma mater around with two C.H.A.M.P.S. Heart of Texas Bowl appearances, and a share of the 2013 Lone Star Conference (LSC) title. In 2016, ENMU went 7-5 and battled MIAA-member Fort Hays State in the Heart of Texas Bowl. Tying for third place in the LSC, the 'Hounds led the league in total offense (473.4 yards per game) and rushing offense (344.6 ypg) while

NEW BACKFIELD

The RiverHawks do not have a returning running back heading into the 2018 season. Averaging 59.4-yards per game on the ground last season, Northeastern State is projected to turn the ball over to **Tre'von Overstreet** in the opening week of the season. Overstreet saw limited action as a true-freshman at NSU and was a Tulsa World All-State selection Drumright HS.

LOCAL TALENT

The RiverHawks have a total of 46 student-athletes at the start of the season from Oklahoma. Inola High School has the largest contingent on the roster with four, Broken Arrow High School is second with three on the NSU roster.

FAB 4

Senior day this season will be short with only four players listed on their final year of eligibility. **Jacob Drysdale** is the lone player from the group to start off his career at Northeastern State.

THE SHERIFF

Cade Yeager will start his first full season as the starting quarterback for the RiverHawks. The sophomore from Broken Arrow started the final seven games in 2017 after getting his redshirt removed. Yeager threw for 1,716 yard in the air and had 18 touchdown passes. With 245.1 passing yards per game, Yeager landed at second in the RiverHawks' NCAA record book.

MIAMI, FLORIDA

The RiverHawks made a preseason camp 3-star prospect addition with **Lamar Parker** transferring into the program. The Miami, Fla. native was a sought over inside receiver out of high school with 17 NCAA Division I offers before signing with West Virginia. Parker red-shirted his true freshman season before leaving the Mountaineers' program.

LAST CHANCE U

Junior Running Back **Boo McKnight** played for Independence Community College in 2017 which was featured in the third season of Netflix's "Last Chance U." McKnight and the Pirates won the KJCCC Regular Season Title and the Midwest Classic Bowl (Miami, Okla.). As a redshirt sophomore, McKnight caught six passes and had a season high 74 yard touchdown reception against Ellsworth CC. McKnight played his freshman season at Southern Arkansas where he rushed for 313 yards on 58 carries. In 2016, he transferred to Division I UTSA but he did not play.

HOLD THE LINE

The RiverHawks' offensive line returns four of its five letter winners from last season. Various injuries hammered the NSU line in 2017 with **Caleb Hash** as the lone player to see action in all 11 contests. Redshirt Freshman **Madison Wrather** is the lone new face to the starting group.

I'M BACK

Ashton Antwine returns to the NSU secondary as a red-shirt senior after missing the 2017 season due to injury. The Edmond native was the one of seven players to start in all 11 contests two seasons ago. In 2016, Antwine was eighth in tackles with ten deflected passes and two interceptions.

GAME RECAP

KEARNEY, Neb. – Gary McKnight Jr. caught three touchdown receptions but Northeastern State couldn't recover from a slow first half and fell on Saturday afternoon 42-27 to Nebraska-Kearney.

The NSU senior matched a career mark and it was the most since his three touchdown afternoon last season at Northwest Missouri. McKnight would catch seven passes from Cade Yeager for 154 yards, with his longest at 65-yards coming in the fourth quarter.

La'More Wise had a monster afternoon on the defensive side of the ball with 19 tackles and a forced fumble. His 19 take downs matched a season high this season in the MIAA and Wise entered the contest with a nation matching high four forced fumbles.

Northeastern State's defense was on the field for over 42-minutes against the Lopers with the RiverHawks' offense unable to convert a first down until the final two-minutes in the first half. In their first seven drives, NSU was forced to punt six times, and their other drive resulted in an interception. Nebraska-Kearney in the first half had 21 first downs and 328 yards of total offense with three touchdowns; the RiverHawks had 36 yards of offense on the other side of the ball.

The Lopers would go up 28-0 with a touchdown midway through the third-quarter before Yeager connected with McKnight on a short five-yard pass with 4:50 left.

Yeager in the fourth quarter had 209 of his 275 passing yards with the RiverHawks getting caught up in a scoring shootout where they had a 21-14 edge. Zac King had Northeastern State's other touchdown reception on a 22-yard pass on fourth down with 3:13 left in regulation. Wise would force a fumble in the ensuing UNK drive to allow the RiverHawks go down the field for quick-six on a 43-yard pass to McKnight to get to the final 42-27 score.

UNK (3-5, 3-5 MIAA) would run the ball 69 times on the RiverHawks and picked up 299 of their 531 total offensive yards on the ground. Northeastern State had 293 total yards and made 14 rushing attempts against the Lopers.

Yeager went 25-for-42 in the air and his four touchdown passes were tied for third-most by a quarterback this season in the MIAA.

With a strong wind in the first half, Blake Pearce kicked a MIAA high 73-yard punt, and besting the previous league mark by two yards.
