WELCOME TO NSU





DIRECTIONS TO NOVA SOUTHEASTERN UNIVERSITY (DAVIE, FLA.)





3301 College Avenue, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33314-7796

From I-95, north or south, or Florida's Turnpike, north or south, take I-595 exit, westbound; proceed on I-595 to Davie Road exit; go south to Nova Drive, then turn right, heading west to College Avenue (traffic light). Turn left, heading south on College Avenue to just south of Abe Fischler Boulevard (east main entrance to campus at 3301 College Avenue).

From I-95 or Florida's Turnpike:

Exit at I-595, proceed west to University Drive exit. Turn left (south) onto University Drive. Proceed approximately 1 ½ miles to SW 30 Street (Abe Fischler Blvd.), turn left (east). NSU's main campus will be on the right side.

From University Drive:

From North of I-595. Take University Drive south 1 ½ miles past I-595 to SW 30 Street (Abe Fischler Blvd). Turn left (east). NSU's main campus will be on the right side.

From south of Griffin Road:

Take University Drive north approximately two miles past Griffin Road to SW 30 Street (Abe Fischler Blvd.). Turn right (east). NSU's main campus will be on the right side.

From I-75:

From Miami heading north or west coast/Naples heading east Merge onto I-595 eastbound (towards Fort Lauderdale). Exit at University Drive exit, turn right (south). Proceed approximately 1 ½ miles on University Drive to SW 30 Street (Abe Fischler Blvd.), turn left (east). NSU's main campus will be on the right side.

STRENGTH & CONDITIONING COMPLEX

Specific to NSU's student-athletes, the strength & conditioning facility is a state-of-the-art 5,500 square foot training area designed to provide student-athletes with everything they need to succeed, including Infinity Max impact flooring, 16 Hammer Strength Racks, six sets of UCS Plyo-Safe Boxes, 10 TRX Suspension trainers, Iron Grip Customized Urethane dumbbells ranging from 2.5lbs – 125lbs, 10 plus Hammer Strength Iso pieces, four sets of UCS Olympic Hurdles, two-10ft Customized Slide boards, four Keiser Trainers, Endless Perform Better Accessories, eight sets of customized Werksan Olympic Bumpers and Bars, two Star Trac Treadmills with 15" HD TV's embedded in the touch panel. Over 15 tons of free weight equipment is offered in the facility. The NSU Strength and Conditioning facility is located on the first floor of the Athletics Services Building.

PARKING: Located on the south side of the Athletics Services Building.

NSU TENNIS CENTER AT ROLLING HILLS


Located in Grande Oaks, the NSU Tennis Center measures out to 38,160 square feet inside the fence area. Each of the six courts are 36-feet-by-78-feet and consists of six inch lyme rock and one inch of asphalt. The blue and green surfaces for each court was done with a four-coat all acrylic system by Nova Sports, Inc.

PARKING: Located on the north side of the tennis center.



NSU AQUATIC CENTER

The Nova Southeastern Aquatics Center is an outdoor facility that boasts an Olympic-size pool and diving well. Opened in the summer of 2008, it is comprised of two moveable bulkheads to cread eight 50-meter lanes, 16 25-meter lanes, and 28 25-meter lanes. There is a separate diving well which includes 2 one-meter boards and one three-meter board with an infrastructure to build a diving tower. The pool was

NSU SOCCER COMPLEX

The NSU Soccer Complex consists of one practice field and one game field. The game field is home for both the men's and women's soccer teams. Both fields come equipped with lights that allow for night practices and games. The game field features state-of-the-art grandstand seating with capacity for 900 spectators. The stadium-style seating is the newest addition to the complex, which was built prior to the 2000 season. The U.S. Women's National Soccer Team and several MLS teams, including the Miami Fusion, have all used the NSU soccer complex as their training site. The Orange Bowl Committee has entered into an agreement to use the NSU Soccer Complex as the official training site for one of its participants. The 2004 National Champion University of Southern California used NSU's Soccer Compex to prepare for the BCS National Championship game.

PARKING: Visiting team vans/buses are asked to park parellel to the Fire Lane on the west side of the NSU Soccer Complex. Public parking is on the north side of the field, in the commuter lot.

LOCKER ROOMS: Locker room and shower facilities are available upon request for visiting



NSU BASEBALL COMPLEX

The NSU Baseball Complex is considered by many to be one of the finest baseball facilities in South Florida. This fully-lit complex features an immaculate playing field with two outdoor batting cages. Prior to the 2001 season, NSU added a fully functional press box and grandstand seating that accommodates 500 people. The NSU Baseball Complex is the site of the Frontier Independent Baseball League's annual player combine and Major League Baseball pre-draft tryouts. Last summer, the under 16 USA Baseball Team held their National Team trials.

PARKING: Parking for baseball is in the parking lot on the east side of the NSU Baseball Complex. Additional parking is in the HPD Parking Garage.

LOCKER ROOMS: Locker room and shower facilities are available upon request for visiting



A.D. GRIFFIN SPORTS COMPLEX

The A.D.Griffin Sports Complex is home to the NSU softball team. This complex features one game field, with parking lots located on both sides. The field is equipped with lights that allow for night practice and games. The game field overlooks NSU's Health Professions Building while the Miami Dolphins Training Facility is located behind the complex. Located behind the field is the press box area. The centralized press box also houses the Sharks' locker room and official's locker room.

PARKING: Parking is available in the lot located directly behind centerfield of the main field and in the lot located to the left of the field. Visitors can also park at the HPD Parking Garage, located behind right field.

LOCKER ROOMS: Locker room and shower facilities are available upon request for visiting teams.



RICK CASE ARENA AT THE DON TAFT UNIVERSITY CENTER

The revolutionary 300,000 square-foot, multi-use facility serves as a central hub for the NSU student community. The main arena, which seats 4,500, is the home for NSU's intercollegiate athletic program, and will host all of NSU's volleyball and men's and women's basketball home games. With one main game court, the Rick Case Arena also has two practice/game -ready courts on the upper level. The Rick Case Arena also has the state-of-the-art capabilities to host concerts, lectures, special events and more for NSU and the surrounding community. The main court provides for over 1,000 permanent chair-back seats, while the upper level houses the world's largest automated telescopic seating system, which adds over 2,000 chair-back seats on either side when extended.

PUBLIC PARKING: Parking is in the commuter parking lot located on the east side of the Don Taft University Center or in the Library Parking Garage off SW 30th Street.

TEAM BUS/VAN PARKING: Visiting team vans/buses are asked to park in the loading dock at the Arena at the Don Taft University Center.

LOCKER ROOMS: Locker room and shower facilities are available upon request for visiting teams.

ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS

OVERVIEW

The Athletics Communication Department provides a variety of services to the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics and the news media. Athletics communication duties include keeping accurate statistical data of each athletic event and providing publications for each team such as media guides, game programs, schedule posters, schedule cards and press releases. The Athletics Communication Department has won numerous awards for excellence in media guide design and content.

A member of the NSU Athletics Communication staff will be present at home games and may travel with NSU teams for selected road contests.

The Athletics Communication Office is located on the second floor of the Athletics Services Building (ASB Building) on NSU's main campus in Davie, Florida.

CREDENTIALS

Complete statistical information will be available to the media at the conclusion of all NSU home athletic events. Telephones and a fax machine are available for use in the athletics offices. Please contact a member of the athletic communications staff to request use of this service.

INTERVIEWS

All one-on-one interviews with Nova Southeastern University players and coaches should be scheduled through the athletics communication department. Please provide at least 24 hours advance notice to allow interview arrangements to be made. Interviews at the conclusion of all home games will be held after a brief cooling-off period. Any requests for visiting team interviews should be made through the visiting team's sports information representative. If one is not present, the athletics communications staff will assist with visiting team interview needs.

RADIO/VIDEO BROADCASTS

Phone access will be provided for visiting teams' radio broadcasts upon request. If a visiting team's radio is traveling, please contact the sports information staff 24 hours in advance to secure a phone line.

TICKET PRICES



Nova Southeastern University's Athletic Training Staff is dedicated to high quality medical care of its athletes, and those of visiting teams. To ensure quality coverage, a Certified Athletic Trainer (AT) and athletic training students (ATS) will be in attendance at all athletic events.

The NSU Athletic Training Room is located in the new University Center facility. This building is located just west of College Avenue at the end of Mary R. McCahill Drive (East Main Entrance). The Athletic Training Suite is located in the southwest corner of the building. The Sports Medicine Clinic is located on the ground floor of the University Center, adjacent to the Athletic Training Suite. Please see enclosed NSU campus map for further information.

Please notify one of the NSU AT if your team will be traveling without an AT. If your team will be traveling without an AT, a letter from the AT must accompany the athlete, plus all necessary supplies so that the NSU athletic training staff may assist your team properly. Please fill out the attached questionnaire and return to the athletic training department at NSU.

The NSU Athletic Training Staff provides the following services for visiting teams:

- 1. Access to the Athletic Training Suite two hours prior to the start of the contest.
- 2. Ice, water, ice bags, and cups are provided at the bench and in the dugouts.
- 3. A biohazard kit and AED.
- 4. Air splints and crutches will be available if needed.
- 5. A physician will be present at all basketball events. The certified athletic trainer will notify the athletic trainer what physician is in attendance. A physician is on-call for all other events.




