Series History: 1st meeting

1ST AND 10

- ◆ This will be the first meeting between Norfolk State and Richmond in football.
- ◆ This is the first of two straight games NSU will play against nationally-ranked CAA football teams. The Spartans, who are 0-9 all-time against teams currently in the CAA, also visit No. 13 William & Mary next week.
- ◆ Saturday marks the return of NSU head coach Latrell Scott to Richmond. Scott has had two prior stints at UR, first as an assistant coach from 2005-07 and then as head coach in 2010. Scott, a Richmond native and graduate of Lee-Davis High School, helped UR reach the FCS national semifinals in 2007. As head coach, he compiled a 6-5 record leading the Spiders in 2010.
- ◆ This week's game also holds added meaning for three other Spartan assistant coaches. Cornerbacks coach Christian Parker (CB/WR, 2009-12) and quarterbacks coach Aaron Corp (QB, 2010-11) both played at UR. Parker, who also ran track at UR, played on the CAA title team in 2012, while Corp started 16 games behind center at UR after transferring in from Southern Cal.
- ◆ NSU tight ends coach Mike Faragalli was offensive coordinator and QB coach at Richmond in 2008-09. He helped the Spiders win the FCS national championship in 2008 and the CAA title in 2009.
- ◆ NSU has 19 players on its roster from the 804 area code, including six who started last week's opener against Elizabeth City State: C Louis Humphrey (Chester/Thomas Dale), RB Quintreil Chung (Midlothian/James River), WR Marcus Taylor (Highland Springs), DE Jay Anderson (Richmond/L.C. Bird), DB Brandon Walker (Chester/L.C. Bird) and LB Nigel Chavis (Richmond/Armstrong).
- ◆ NSU is 3-25 all-time against teams ranked in the Stats FCS (formerly Sports Network Poll), including losses in its last two games against ranked foes, vs. No. 25 Maine (Aug. 30) and No. 16 William & Mary (Sept. 30) in 2014. At No. 2 nationally, Richmond is the highest-ranked team NSU has ever faced.
- ◆ The Spartans' last win over a ranked team was at No. 12 Bethune-Cookman (27-24) on Nov. 9, 2013.
- ◆ NSU has one additional connection with the Richmond football program. Senior NSU wide receiver James Church Jr.'s father was a star wideout at UR in the mid-1980s. James Church Sr. was an All-Yankee Conference selection in 1986.
- ◆ Last week marked the Spartans' first season-opening victory since 2012, when NSU defeated Virginia State. The Spartans lost to Maine in both 2013 and '14 before falling at Rutgers to open the 2015 campaign.

All non-gameday interviews with NSU staff and athletes must also be scheduled through the Sports Information Office. Please allow 24 hours notice ahead of the preferred interview time for players.

Practices are generally open to the media, and interviews may be scheduled prior to or following practice. Once practice begins, players and coaches are unavailable until afterward.

QUICK HITS FROM ECSU

Some news and notes from the win over Elizabeth City State last Sunday:

- The Spartans won a season-opener for the first time since 2012.
- Receivers **James Church Jr.** and **George Wahee** caught their first collegiate touchdown passes.
- Making his second career start, **RB Quintreil Chung** led the Spartans in rushing for the first time in his career, with a career-high 81 yards on 18 carries.
- **QB Greg Hankerson** (205 total yards) topped the 200-yard mark in total offense for the fifth time in his last six games dating to last season, and third in a row overall.
- NSU had nine players start for the first time at NSU, eight of whom were starting for the first time in college: **WR George Wahee**, **OL Kenneth Kirby** and **Jake Mazgajewski**, **TE Torian Henderson**, **DL Deshaywn Middleton**, **LB Nigel Chavis** and **T.C. Livingston**, and **DB Hakiem Swann** and **Bobby Price**. Swann started as a true freshman at N.C. Central in 2013, but was playing his first game as a Spartan.
- The following true freshmen played in a college game for the first time: **OL Kenneth Kirby**, **DB Bobby Price**, **DB J.T. Wahee**, **OL/LS Dominic Jordan**, **DL Josh Bryant**.
- The following redshirt freshmen played for the first time: **WR George Wahee**, **WR Chuma Awanna**, **LB James Chapman**, **LB Cephas Harden**.

SPARTANS PICKED TO FINISH 6TH IN MEAC

The Spartans were picked to finish sixth in the MEAC this season in the preseason poll of coaches and sports information directors, the same position NSU finished at the end of last season. Seven Spartans were named to the preseason All-MEAC teams: **QB Greg Hankerson**, **DL Chris Lee**, **CB Sandy Chapman** and **K Cameron Marouf** were second-team selections. **RB Gerard Johnson**, **DL Walter Brantley** and **KR Marcus Taylor** were third-team picks. ANOTHER PRESEASON HONOR

QB Greg Hankerson Jr. was named to the watch list for the inaugural Deacon Jones Trophy. The award will be given by the Black College Football Hall of Fame to the black college player of the year in February in Atlanta. Hankerson is one of 52 HBCU players from the Division I and Division II ranks on the initial list.

HANKERSON BACK AT THE CONTROLS

The 2015 season was an impressive one for quarterback **Greg Hankerson**:

- Hankerson tallied 2,475 yards of total offense, fourth-most in school history for a single season. His 2,052 passing yards were the sixth-most ever by a Spartan quarterback. He also led the team in rushing, with 423 yards, and accounted for 16 touchdowns (13 passing, three rushing). All that came in his first season after transferring from Florida Atlantic, where he played in 2013 and '14.
- A preseason All-MEAC second-team selection, Hankerson will now give the Spartans a returning starter under center for the first time since **Chris Walley** in 2010 and 2011. NSU had seven different starting quarterbacks in the three years between Walley and Hankerson.
- Hankerson (423) came close last season to breaking NSU's Division I-era rushing record for a quarterback. **Dennis Brown** (466 yards) set the record in 2008.
- Hankerson accounted for more than 300 yards of total offense twice last year, with 363 at Bethune-Cookman and 319 at N.C. Central. The 363 yards of total offense and four TD throws at BCU were the most by an NSU quarterback since **Nico Flores** amassed 423 total yards and four passing TDs against Howard in 2012.
- Hankerson had four 200+ yard passing games, all after the month of September. He had a career-high 294 at Howard on Oct. 3.
- Hankerson was fourth in the MEAC in passing yards per game (186.5) and third in total offense (225.0 ypg).
- In MEAC-only games, Hankerson was second among league players in total offense (242.6).
- Hankerson had his first two rushing TDs of the season at NCCU, including a 77-yarder. The 77-yarder is the longest by any Spartan quarterback since at least 1982. He also had a 57-yarder at Morgan State.

TRANSFERS LOOKING TO MAKE AN IMPACT

NSU welcomes three Division I FBS transfers to its roster this season, and all three are expected to contribute immediately.

- **DL Deshaywn Middleton, R-So., N.C. State transfer:** Middleton spent two seasons (2014-15), including a redshirt year, at N.C. State. The Winston-Salem native was a three-star recruit coming out of Parkland High and was ranked the No. 39 high school defensive tackle nationally by Rivals.com. He had a sack and two tackles in his NSU debut against ECSU.
- **DL Terrell Reid, R-Sr., Old Dominion:** The Washington, D.C. native earned his bachelor's degree over the summer from ODU, where he spent four seasons (2012-15), including a redshirt year. He amassed 52 tackles, 11 for loss, with five sacks in 32 games played for ODU. He started eight times as a freshman in 2013. He is enrolled in graduate school at NSU.
- **WR Joel Caleb, R-Sr., Virginia Tech:** The Richmond, Va.-area native will add depth, size and experience to the Spartans' receiving corps. Caleb was a four-star athlete and ranked the 83rd-best player in ESPN's Top 150 out of Clover Hill High. He played in 36 games the last three years at Tech, playing receiver, defensive back and special teams. He recorded 199 all-purpose yards and one rushing TD in his VT career. He is also enrolled in graduate school.

RANKING THE ROOKIES

The HBCU web site From the Press Box to Press Row (www.boxtorow.com) ranked the Norfolk State football recruiting class as the best in the MEAC and third among all HBCUs in its February release. The article cited NSU's heavy dose of Hampton Roads recruits and also noted the presence of a strong offensive line class – the Spartans have a total of eight true freshmen linemen, three of whom were rated as two or three stars by Rivals or ESPN.

BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER

NSU gets back the services of five starters who missed the end of last season due to injuries:

- **RB Gerard Johnson** (missed two games; torn ACL)
- **OL Daniel Oladimeji** (missed two games; torn ACL, MCL, meniscus)
- **WR James Church** (missed seven games; torn ACL)
- **C Louis Humphrey** (missed four games; ankle surgery)
- **DB Brandon Walker** (missed three games; knee sprain)

ALL IN THE FAMILY

NSU has been known to have successful brother tandems on the gridiron and this year the Spartans have another set of siblings in brothers **George** and **J.T. Wahee**. George is a redshirt freshman receiver who is slated to start. He redshirted last season after signing with NSU out of private school Bishop Sullivan Catholic High in 2015, where he was an all-state receiver and returner.

- J.T. is a true freshman member of this year's team and plays defensive back. He was an all-state defensive back at public-school powerhouse Lake Taylor in Norfolk.
- The Wahees come from an athletic family. Their older brother, Wil, is a senior defensive back at Virginia.

GREAT LINEAGE

Three Spartan defenders have familial ties to NSU:

- Junior **LB Kyle Archie's** grandfather, Bill, was head football coach (1961-66) and former NSU athletics director (1970-84) during his storied career at NSU. Kyle's father, Larry, was an assistant coach at NSU from 2003-04.
- Senior **DB Donte' Haynesworth's** dad, Leroy, was a Division II All-America defensive back who starred for NSU from 1988-91.
- Senior **LB Raynard Revels'** father of the same name led NSU in passing from 1980-82. His best year was his junior year of 1981, when he passed for 1,092 yards and 11 TDs.

WHAT'S MISSING

The Spartans didn't lose many key players from last year's squad. But the losses were key ones:

- **LB Deon King** was the Buck Buchanan Award winner at the top defensive player in the FCS. The Spartans' first-ever consensus FCS first-team All-American led the nation with 163 total tackles last season.
- **DB D'Metrius Williams**, like King, was a first-team All-MEAC performer. He tied for the MEAC lead with 14 passes defended (12 breakups, 2 interceptions).
- **WR Isaac White, Deandre Sangster** and **Quinta Funderburk** were NSU's top three receivers from last year's team. The trio combined for exactly 1,500 receiving yards, 108 catches and nine touchdown grabs. White was a third-team All-MEAC pick.

BIG THINGS COME IN SMALL PACKAGES

Sophomore **WR Marcus Taylor**, the fastest player on NSU's team, was fourth on the team with 21 catches last season and is the team's leading returning receiver. He played especially well over the last month of the year, as he has 15 of his 21 catches in the last five games. Taylor (5-8, 160) recorded career highs of five catches for 76 yards and his first career touchdown against South Carolina State.

LIMITING THE MISTAKES

NSU was a very disciplined team last year. In addition to committing just 14 turnovers in 2015, the Spartans were also the least-penalized team in the MEAC. The Spartans had both the fewest penalties (67, 6.1 per game) and fewest penalty yards in the MEAC (55.4 ypg). Both figured ranked among the top 60 in the nation. NSU committed just six penalties in the opener against Elizabeth City State.

RB BY COMMITTEE

Due to injuries last year, NSU often had to use a running back by committee approach. **Larry Bishop**, who played a hybrid fullback/H-back position for NSU, became the fifth different Spartan and fourth running back to lead the Spartans in rushing in a game last year when he ran nine times for 35 yards against South Carolina State in the season's next-to-last game. NSU played five different players at tailback due in part to injuries. Others to lead NSU in rushing last year included **Greg Hankerson** and running backs **Gerard Johnson, Quintreil Chung** and **Shakeem Copeland**.

VERSATILE SPARTANS

NSU has several players on its roster who were multi-sport standouts in high school. Among them:

- **DE Chris Lee** is already well on his way to a successful two-sport career at NSU. Lee was a third-team All-MEAC defensive lineman last year, when he led NSU's line in tackles (53), tackles for loss (13.5) and sacks (6.0). Lee then turned his attention to track, where he won the MEAC indoor championship in the shot put with a school-record throw of 55 feet, 3 inches. He was MEAC outdoor runner-up in the event.
- **DB Bobby Price** was a private schools all-state performer in both football and track and field at Bishop Sullivan Catholic. Price was a first-team all-state defensive back and second-team all-state performer as an offensive athlete as a senior. In track, he was indoor and outdoor state champion in the high jump and also placed seventh at the New Balance Nationals in that event, earning All-America honors. He has career-bests of 6-8 in the high jump and 23-6 in the long jump.
- **WR/KR Marcus Taylor** is NSU's leading returning receiver after making 21 catches last season as a true freshman. Taylor was also one of the state's top high school sprinters as a junior in 2014. He won four state track championships as a junior, in the 55, 200 and 300 meters and with the Highland Springs High 4x200 meter relay team. He was also state outdoor runner-up in the 100m as a junior in 2014, but did not run outdoors as a senior. He has personal-best times of 6.31 seconds (55m) and 10.76 (100m).

HOME SWEET HOME

NSU's roster is again loaded with in-state talent. Sixty-seven (67) of NSU's 87-man opening day roster hails from the Commonwealth of Virginia. As usual, the Spartans are faring well close to home in their recruiting endeavors. Thirty-eight of the 67 Virginia natives are from the Hampton Roads area. Nineteen are from the Richmond and surrounding areas, while another 10 come from points north or west. That fits in with NSU's recruiting approach, to focus on the southeastern and central parts of the state before fanning out and recruiting on a regional and national basis.

SPARTANS IN THE NFL

NSU will have three former players under contract with NFL teams as the season begins this week. Here's a look at the former Spartans in the NFL:

- Detroit **DB Don Carey** (2005-08) is in his eighth season in the NFL and sixth with Detroit. He was drafted by Cleveland in the sixth round of the 2009 draft, but was cut by the Browns. He quickly joined on with Jacksonville and played in 15 games, starting 10 times in 2010. He has played in 57 career games with Detroit, starting 12 times. His career totals include 168 tackles, three interceptions and eight pass breakups. Carey also made the 2016 Pro Bowl ballot as a special teamer. He is on the opening-day 53-man roster for the Lions.
- **LB Deon King** (2012-15) signed this spring as a free agent with the Dallas Cowboys. He was released as the team cut its roster to 53 players, but was signed to the practice squad last week. He led the Cowboys with 19 tackles in four preseason games. The 2015 Buck Buchanan Award winner and first-team FCS All-American had a Division I-leading 163 tackles as a senior in 2015.
- **OLB Lynden Trail** had two stints on the practice squad with the Washington Redskins during the 2015 NFL season and, after being released on cut-down day, was again signed to Washington's practice squad last week. Trail had nine tackles this preseason with the Redskins. Trail (2012-14) was a three-time FCS All-American at NSU.

OPPORTUNISTIC SPARTANS

The Spartans were third in the MEAC in turnover margin last year, at +2. The South Carolina State game marked the only game last year where NSU had more turnovers than its opponent (minus-3). The Spartans forced four turnovers against Hampton alone on Sept. 26, the most by an NSU opponent since South Carolina State also committed four on Nov. 23, 2013. Offensively, NSU committed just 14 turnovers last season, second-fewest in the MEAC.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD

The Oct. 24, 2015 game at Bethune-Cookman was an offensive coordinator's dream, as both NSU and B-CU scored early and often. A few notes on the fireworks in Daytona Beach:

- The 49 points scored by NSU were its most since a 51-28 win over Virginia State in 2010, and most against an FCS opponent since a 49-12 win over Howard in 2009.
- The 483 total offensive yards by NSU are its most since a 559-yard day at Savannah State in 2011.
- The 108 combined points are tied for the third-most for any game in school history, and tied for second-most in a regulation game.

NSU GAMES ON STAR 1310 AGAIN THIS YEAR

Star 1310 WGH-AM will broadcast all NSU football games for the third year in a row. Games will also be simulcast on 91.1 FM. Links to live audio are available on the multimedia page and the football schedule at nsuspartans.com.

SPARTANS ON TV 3 TIMES IN 2016

Three NSU games will be televised this season:

- Sept. 10 at Richmond - Will air on either Comcast Mid-Atlantic.
- Oct. 6 at N.C. A&T - Live broadcast on both ESPNU and ESPN3/Watch ESPN app.
- Oct. 22 vs. Bethune-Cookman - Live on ESPN3/Watch ESPN, tape-delayed (TBA) on ESPNU.

SCHEDULE TRAVEL FRIENDLY FOR NSU

After playing its first three games of the year on the road last season - all against Division I FBS teams - the Spartans have a much more fan-friendly schedule this year. This week's game marks the first time since 2013 that the Spartans have opened the season at home, after playing road games at Rutgers last year and at Maine in 2014.

Although the Spartans' next two games are on the road, they are a short bus ride away at in-state FCS foes Richmond (Sept. 10) and William & Mary (Sept. 17). NSU then plays back-to-back home games against

2016 GAME BY GAME RECAPS

GAME 1: NSU 20, ELIZABETH CITY STATE 12

Sept. 4, 2016

Dick Price Stadium • Norfolk, Va.

Greg Hankerson threw two touchdown passes and Quintreil Chung tallied 81 yards and a TD on the ground to lift Norfolk State over Elizabeth City State in the ABNB Labor Day Classic at Dick Price Stadium.

Seniors James Church and redshirt freshman George Wahee both caught their first career scoring passes for the Spartans (1-0), who won their season-opener for the first time since defeating Virginia State in 2012. The game – the first meeting between the schools since 1996 – was delayed to Sunday due to the effects of Hurricane Hermine.

NSU scored first when Chung capped an eight-play, 48-yard drive with a 3-yard TD run with 7:14 left in the first quarter. But the Vikings (0-1) responded late in the period with quarterback Daquan Neal's 3-yard TD run with 24 seconds left in the stanza. The PAT was blocked, however, keeping the Spartans in the lead at 7-6.

Hankerson hit Church on a 7-yard TD pass at the 11:06 mark of the second quarter to culminate a 12-play, 64-yard drive. But Neal hit Victor Tabbs on a 29-yard pass play on the final play of the second quarter. The Vikings went for a two-point conversion to attempt to tie the score, but Neal's pass fell incomplete.

The Spartans capped the scoring with 2:50 left in the third quarter as Hankerson hit Wahee on a 12-yard TD pass, extending the lead to 20-12.

The NSU defense made the lead stand up, forcing a turnover on downs, a fumble and a punt by ECSU in the final quarter. The Vikings' first drive of the quarter reached the NSU 32-yard line. But NSU linebacker Kyle Archie sacked Neal for an 8-yard loss on fourth down.

On ECSU's next drive, backup quarterback Jamond Oatman was sacked and stripped of the ball by defensive linemen Walter Brantley and Terrell Reid. Brantley fell on the fumble to give NSU possession.

The Vikings' had one more chance, taking over at their 30-yard line with 5:53 left. But ECSU lost two yards over the course of its next three plays and opted to punt. The Spartans ran out the clock, with Hankerson threading a needle to Taylor for a 37-yard gain on 3rd-and-17 to seal it.
