OPENING KICKOFF

- The Spartans will attempt to break a four-game losing streak when they open a two-game homestand this Saturday against Howard University.
- NSU dropped to 3-5 overall, 1-4 in the MEAC after a 37-20 loss to No. 17 North Carolina A&T last week.
- Howard has won three out of its last four games and handed Florida A&M its first MEAC loss of the year last week, 31-23, in Washington, D.C.

LAST MEETING

- The host Bison scored 14 unanswered points in the final 8:06 of the game to rally for a 28-24 win over Norfolk State in the teams' last meeting on Nov. 11, 2017 at Greene Stadium.
- **Dezmond Wortham** scored on a 3-yard run with 8:06 remaining to cut NSU's lead to 24-21. After forcing the Spartans to punt, **Caylin Newton** led Howard on a 12-play, 89-yard drive which he capped with a 2-yard game-winning TD run with five seconds left in the game.
- NSU led 24-14 on the strength of a strong offensive showing. **Juwan Carter** threw a 19-yard TD pass to **Demetreus Ferebee** and also ran for a 2-yard TD in the first half. **Aaron Savage** scored on a 5-yard TD run and **Josh Nardone** kicked a 37-yard field goal late in the second quarter to give the Spartans a 10-point lead at halftime. But Howard held NSU scoreless in the second half.
- Carter passed for 257 yards and Savage rushed for a career-high 112 for the Spartans.

SERIES HISTORY

- Howard leads the all-time series with NSU 18-6 following the Bison's win last season.
- Howard has won three of the last four meetings between the two teams.

A WIN OVER HOWARD WOULD...

- A win this week over Howard would...
- Break a two-game losing streak to the Bison.
- Be NSU's first win in Norfolk over Howard since 2009 (victory was since vacated).
- Keep alive the Spartans' hopes of a winning season. NSU needs to win its three remaining games to accomplish that feat for the first time since 2011.

SCOUTING THE BISON

Howard (4-4, 4-2 MEAC) has won three of its last four games following a 31-23 home victory over Florida A&M last Saturday in Washington, D.C. The Bison scored 21 points in the first quarter while handing FAMU its first MEAC loss of the season.

The Bison rushed for 247 yards in the win over the Rattlers, led by 149 from running back **Dedrick Parson**, who ran for one touchdown. Quarterback **Caylin Newton** also rushed for 50 yards and a TD and threw two touchdown passes.

Howard boasts the most potent offense in the MEAC. The Bison lead the conference with averages of 33 points and 472.5 yards per game. Parson ranks fourth in the MEAC with 556 yards and six touchdowns on the ground this season.

Newton paces the MEAC in passing yards (2,127), total yards (2,539) and passing touchdowns (18). Receiver **Jequez Ezzard** has a MEAC-high 814 receiving yards and nine touchdown catches.

All non-gameday interviews with NSU staff and athletes must also be scheduled through the Sports Information Office. Please allow 24 hours notice ahead of the preferred interview time for players.

Practices are generally open to the media, and interviews may be scheduled prior to or following practice. Once practice begins, players and coaches are unavailable until afterward.

NORTH CAROLINA A&T QUICK HITS

News and notes from NSU's loss to N.C. A&T:

- North Carolina A&T ran for 310 yards against the Spartans, most by an NSU opponent since Howard's 317 last November.
- **Marcus Taylor's** 69-yard punt return touchdown in the first quarter was the first punt return score by NSU since **Darius Wilson's** 80-yarder against Delaware State in 2014.
- **Malik Wilson** of N.C. A&T posted the third kickoff return touchdown of the year against NSU with his 99-yarder late in the third quarter.
- NSU was intercepted three times, running the team's total to 11 in the current four-game losing streak.
- **DL Deshaywn Middleton** posted his first sack of the season in the first quarter.

CAREER DAY FOR AWANNA

One highlight from the loss at North Carolina A&T last Saturday was the play of NSU junior receiver **Chuma Awanna**. Awanna had a career-high 95 yards receiving and matched his personal-best with five receptions. He also caught a 20-yard TD pass, hauling in a strike from Juwan Carter with one hand. That was Awanna's second touchdown catch of the season, tied for the most on the team.

CHAVIS BRINGS THE PRESSURE

No Spartan defensive player has made a bigger impact in recent games than junior linebacker **Nigel Chavis**. Chavis has 6.5 tackles for loss and three sacks in the last two contests. He notched two sacks and a career-high 3.5 tackles for loss at Savannah State, then followed that up with three more tackles behind the line, including one sack, at North Carolina A&T. A preseason All-MEAC selection, Chavis ranks sixth in the MEAC in both tackles for loss (10.0) and sacks (4.0) this season.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

Marcus Taylor's 69-yard punt return at N.C. A&T was his second return touchdown of his career, following the 100-yard kickoff return score at JMU last season. Despite some teams kicking away from him, Taylor leads the MEAC with a 22.9-yard kickoff return average. Following his punt return TD, he now averages 25.7 yards per punt return, which would lead the nation if he had enough returns to qualify.

CARTER BREAKS 3,000

Sophomore quarterback **Juwan Carter** (3,209) surpassed the 3,000-yard career passing milestone with his 60 yards at Savannah State. He is now ninth in NSU history, just 161 shy of passing **Dontrell Leonard** (2001-04) for eighth place.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP

So far, so good for NSU's two sophomore kickers, placekicker **Josh Nardone** and punter **Taylor Goettie**. Both started as freshmen in 2017 and have built on their rookie performances with strong starts to the 2018 season.

- Goettie is currently third in the MEAC, averaging 42.2 yards per punt. That is on pace to break NSU's single-season record of 41.3 set by **Dylan Shaddix** in 2014. Goettie averaged 38.8 as a freshman.
- Nardone is 6-for-7 on field goals and 14-of-15 on extra points, with one PAT blocked.

LET ME SPELL IT OUT FOR YOU

The NSU defense has gotten a lift this year from the return of **Kyron Speller**. The junior missed all of

last season with multiple torn ligaments in his knee, which ended up requiring two surgeries to fix. After getting off the year on a slow start, Speller has 13 tackles, 4.0 TFL and a forced fumble in his last five games, including career highs of five tackles and 1.5 TFL vs. N.C. Central. He tied his career high with 1.5 TFL at Savannah State.

TAYLOR MOVES UP THE CHARTS

Senior receiver **Marcus Taylor** continues to put his name in the NSU football record books. More notes on the dynamic speedster:

- Taylor has moved up from sixth to third on NSU's all-time receptions list this season. He moved past **Howard Gilmore** for third during the NCCU game. With 153, Taylor is 10 away from passing **Darius Blount** (162) for second place.
- Taylor has 1,640 career receiving yards, 22 from passing **Marty Conner** (1,661) for fifth all-time at NSU.

Last year, Taylor:

- Set the school record with a 100-yard kickoff return TD at James Madison last season.
- His 60 receptions and 1,392 all-purpose yards last season both rank fourth in school single-season history. He led the MEAC in both categories.
- Tallied 714 kickoff return yards, second-most in school history.
- Averaged 23.8 yards per kick return, No. 6 in school history, and tops among MEAC players in 2017.

GOOD HANDS MEN

NSU boasts one of the top receiving corps in the MEAC, with several players distinguishing themselves this season.

- All-MEAC WR **Marcus Taylor** is the best-known of the group. He posted his first 100-yard game of the year and third in his career with eight catches for 120 yards and a TD vs. DSU. He ranks third in the MEAC with 4.4 catches per outing and eighth with 42.8 yards per game.
- Sophomore **Isaiah Winstead** ranks sixth in catches (3.9/game) and 10th in yards (40.1 ypg) among MEAC wideouts.
- Redshirt junior **Chuma Awanna** has 24 catches for 313 yards and two scores in seven games played this year. He did not play vs. DSU due to injury.
- Redshirt sophomore **Justin Smith** has emerged as a big-play threat this season. Smith has eight catches for 192 yards and averages a team-best 24.0 yards per catch. He caught his first career TD in the DSU game.

BALL HAWKS

NSU junior safeties **Nhyre' Quinerly** and **Bobby Price** have made a habit of being around the ball this season.

• Price is fourth in the MEAC in passes defensed, with eight. That consists of one interception in addition to seven pass breakups, already the most he's had in any year of his NSU career. Price also ranks tied for first in the MEAC with two fumble recoveries in six games.

• Quinerly is tied for the MEAC lead with three forced fumbles and is tied for second with three interceptions. He ranks in the top 25 nationally in both stats.

OFFENSE LOOKING TO PICK UP THE PACE

NSU will look to get out of an offensive rut this week. The Spartans scored just nine points in the first three games in the current losing streak, the lowest three-game total since a six-point stretch in 2000 (6 vs. Bethune-Cookman, 0 vs. both Villanova and N.C. A&T). The Spartans are averaging just 261.5 yards per game in their last four outings.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION VS. DSU

The Spartans enjoyed one of their best offensive days in recent memory in the 54-28 win over Delaware State on Sept. 29. More notes from that win:

• **Juwan Carter** passed for a career-high 318 yards, the most by a Spartan QB since **Greg Hankerson's** 366 against Howard on Oct. 1, 2016.

• The 54 points NSU scored were the most since a 58-29 win over Savannah State on Oct. 1, 2005.

• NSU posted over 400 yards of offense (430) for the second straight week, marking the first time Oct. 8 and 15 in 2011 that NSU has accomplished that feat.

• For the second week in a row, **WR Isaiah Winstead** notched career highs in receptions (eight) and receiving yards (89).

• NSU's 26-point margin of victory was its largest against a MEAC opponent since a 30-0 win over Morgan State on Nov. 10, 2012.

• NSU brothers **Aaron** (6-yard run) and **Brandon Savage** (80-yard INT return) both scored TDs.

• **LB Nigel Chavis** scored his second career TD when he returned a fumble 23 yards for a score. He also had a fumble recovery TD last year vs. Virginia State.

CARTER TAKES COMMAND

After splitting time at quarterback with fellow freshman **Tripp Harrington** in the first three games of 2017, rookie **QB Juwan Carter** has taken the reigns of the offense. He started the final nine games of the season. More on the now sophomore signal-caller:

• Averaging 197.4 ypg this year, third in the MEAC.

• Accounted for a career-high 355 yards of total offense vs. DSU, earning his first-ever MEAC Offensive Player of the Week honor.

• Has two of the three-highest passing yardage totals in his back-to-back games, with 281 at SCSU (third-most) and the career-high 318 vs. DSU.

• Had a rushing TD against both SCSU and DSU.

• Last year, in MEAC-only games, he trailed only N.C. A&T's **Lamar Raynard** (17) and FAMU's **Ryan Stanley** (14) in TD passes, with 13, and was fourth in passing yards (1,589 in eight games, 198.6 ypg).

• Carter was named MEAC Rookie of the Week twice in 2017, following the wins over N.C. Central and Florida A&M, and was also the VaSID University Division state Rookie of the Year.

CHANGE SUITS THEM WELL

The Spartan defense has been stingy this year, and two of the team's standouts are converted offensive players in linebackers **Quintrell Chung** and **Tyre Givers-Wilson**. Chung played running back his first two seasons and Givers-Wilson played quarterback

until last season, when both made the transition to defense. The transition has been a smooth one. Chung leads NSU with 52 tackles. Givers-Wilson has made 28 stops, with 6.5 tackles for loss (second on the team) so far.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

Turnovers are always a key stat for NSU under head coach **Latrell Scott**. In the last four seasons under Scott, NSU has forced more turnovers than it has committed in 27 of 40 games. But NSU has been on the losing side of that equation the last four games, all losses, with a total of 14 turnovers and just five takeaways. On the season, NSU is seventh in the MEAC with a minus-3 turnover ratio.

NSU ended the 2017 season with a +15 turnover margin, which ranked fifth in the nation.

TURNING DEFENSE INTO OFFENSE

Norfolk State was adept last season at turning turnovers into points and is picking up right where it left off.

• NSU scored two defensive touchdowns vs. Delaware State, an 80-yard interception return by **Brandon Savage** and a 23-yard fumble return by **Nigel Chavis**.

• The DSU win marked the fourth time in the last two seasons that the Spartans have scored two non-offensive touchdowns in the same game.

• Last year, the Spartans tied for first in the nation among Division I FCS schools in defensive touchdowns, with six.

DEFENSE IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

NSU has gotten off to a strong start defensively this season.

• Though NSU's per-game statistics are helped out somewhat by the one-quarter James Madison result and stats counting as a full game, the Spartans still rank 19th nationally in total defense, averaging 318.3 yards allowed per game.

• NSU is fifth nationally in passing defense (148.0 ypg).

• **DB Nyhyre' Quinerly** is tied for ninth in the FCS in forced fumbles per game and 25th in interceptions per game (three in eight games, in both cases).

• **LB Nigel Chavis** and **DB Bobby Price** are tied for 11th nationally with two fumble recoveries.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

NSU has been known to have successful brother tandems on the gridiron in the past, and now the Spartans have another set of siblings in brothers **Aaron** and **Brandon Savage** from Baltimore, Md.

• Against DSU, the Savages became the second Spartan brother duo in as many years to score touchdowns in the same game in the last two years.

• Aaron, a redshirt junior running back and former walk-on, scored on a 6-yard run in the first quarter and Brandon, a true freshman defensive back, scored on an 80-yard INT return in the second quarter.

• Last season, **J.T. Wahee** returned a fumble 96 yards for a TD and his brother, George, caught a 24-yard TD pass in the win over FAMU.

NSU IN THE WEEKLY MEAC HONORS

The Spartans have won four MEAC weekly awards this season:

• **Juwan Carter** (Offense) and **Brandon Savage** (Rookie) won awards following the Delaware State win. Carter accounted for a career-high 355 yards of total offense and four touchdowns (three passing).

Savage had three tackles and returned his first career interception 80 yards for a score.

• **DB Nhyre' Quinerly** was chosen Co-Defensive Player of the Week for Sept. 24. He recorded seven tackles (six solo) with one pass breakup, one interception and one forced fumble at S.C. State.

• **OL Craig Rodwell** was selected the Co-Offensive Lineman of the Week for Sept. 3 following the Virginia State game. He helped pave the way for NSU to finish with 368 total yards against VSU.

SO POSSESSIVE

NSU held the ball for 36 minutes and 44 seconds of the opener against Virginia State. The Spartans' last time holding the ball that long was on Nov. 9, 2013, against Bethune-Cookman (37:48). In the Spartans' three wins, NSU is averaging 34 minutes, 7 seconds of possession.

OVER IN A FLASH

After two lengthy weather delays, the Spartans' home game against James Madison on Sept. 8 was halted and declared a JMU win with the No. 2 Dukes leading 17-0 after one quarter. The game's 6 p.m. start was delayed 90 minutes by storms. The teams then played one quarter, which took 45 minutes to complete. Then lightning again entered the vicinity of the stadium, and the game was delayed another 50 minutes before officials from both schools decided to call the game.

It was an omen for NSU - the team's next game, scheduled for Sept. 15 at Liberty, was postponed due to Hurricane Florence and will be made up on Dec. 1.

YOUTH STILL ON DISPLAY

Even with 17 starters returning from last year's team, the Spartans still have a relatively young team, with just eight seniors. The recruiting classes of 2018 and 2017 continue to add depth to the squad. More on some new faces who have seen action this year:

• Eleven true freshmen have seen their first career action: **QB D'Andre Thomas and Isaiah Wilson, LB Allen Boykins, TE Kareem Burgess, DB Shaviaea Williams, Justin Toler, R.J. Coles and Brandon Savage, K Owen Malik, DL D.J. Djonkam and WR Quentin Greene.**

• Redshirt freshmen who have seen their first career collegiate action include **OL Justin Redd, LB Marquis Hall, WR Stuart Anderson and DB Johnathan Gregory.**

• Players who have started their first collegiate games include **Redd, WR Marcque Ellington, DE Ricky Thomas Jr., DT Kyron Speller and Josh Bryant, ILB Dale Craig, LB Marquis Hall and OLB Tyre Givers-Wilson.**

• Last year's Spartans were, by most any measure, among the youngest teams in the MEAC. Thirty-eight players among the 80 on the roster were freshmen - either true freshmen or redshirt freshmen who did not play the previous year. That figure was the highest of any MEAC team.

LIMITING THE MISTAKES

NSU continues to be one of the least-penalized teams in the MEAC under coach **Latrell Scott**. The Spartans have committed the fewest penalties in the conference the last three years. In 2017, NSU was flagged just 68 times in 11 games (6.2 per game). NSU ranked in the top 50 in the FCS in both fewest penalties against and least penalty yardage.

This season, NSU is third in the conference in fewest penalties per game (7.0). That, despite a

15-penalty game at FAMU, the most by an NSU team since 2012.

CAPTAINS

NSU players voted **WR Marcus Taylor, C Wes Jones, LB Nigel Chavis** and **DB J.T. Wahee** as its four captains for 2018 in a preseason team vote.

PRESEASON HONORS FOR CHAVIS, TAYLOR

In addition to receiving preseason All-MEAC honors, senior receiver **Marcus Taylor** and junior linebacker **Nigel Chavis** also received national preseason recognition:

• **Taylor** was named to the preseason watch list for the Black College Football Player of the Year Award, given by the Black College Football Hall of Fame. He is one of 52 players on the list representing a total of 25 different HBCUs. The winner will be announced at the BCHOF induction ceremony on Feb. 16 in Atlanta and will be awarded the Deacon Jones Trophy.

• **Chavis** was named to the BOXTOROW preseason HBCU All-America first team. BOXTOROW is a nationally syndicated radio program and web site devoted to covering black college sports.

HIGHLAND SPRINGS CONNECTION

The Spartans have benefited from having four players from Virginia prep powerhouse Highland Springs High on their roster - **QB Juwan Carter, DL Tavien Blackwell** and **WR Marcus Taylor** and **Isaiah Winstead**. Carter is the Spartans' starting quarterback, Taylor and Winstead are the teams' two leading receivers, while Blackwell is a reserve nose guard. The Springers have won three straight VHSL Division 5 titles.

ALL-LOCAL SECONDARY

All four starters in the NSU secondary are "757" natives, including three players from Lake Taylor High in Norfolk. Safety **Nhyre' Quinerly** and cornerbacks **J.T. Wahee** and **Aaron Chandler** all played on at least one state championship team while at Lake Taylor, while safety **Bobby Price** was an all-state selection at private Bishop Sullivan Catholic High.

GOOD LINEAGE

Once again this year, several Spartans have familial ties to NSU athletics:

• Junior **DB Nhyre' Quinerly** is the son of **John Quinerly**, a former All-CIAA running back who played at NSU from 1993-96, running for 1,020 yards as a senior in 1996.

• Sophomore **DB Mark Brown's** father of the same name also played football at NSU.

• Sophomore **LB Matt Hodges'** mother, Shelita, ran track at NSU from 1987-91.

NEW LEADER IN THE TRENCHES

NSU's lone addition to the coaching staff this season is the addition of veteran offensive line coach **Kris Sweet**. Most recently, Sweet spent 10 seasons as an offensive line coach in the Canadian Football League, with the Montreal Alouettes (2014-16), Edmonton Eskimos (20013), Saskatchewan Roughriders (2012) and Calgary Stampeders.

A native of Salem, Virginia, Sweet also had college stints at Presbyterian, Kentucky State, Columbia, Holy Cross, Elon and Tennessee Tech.

RB TRANSFERS ADD DEPTH

The Spartans were inexperienced and thin last year at running back, but that should change this year. Aside from starter **Aaron Savage** and returning backup **Malik Butts**, the Spartans also welcome two transfers to the backfield this year:

- **Gerald Hulett Jr.** is a junior college transfer from Fullerton (Calif.) College, which was crowned national champion by JCGridiron.com and JC Football. Hulett was a first-team all-state pick who ran for 895 yards and 18 touchdowns while catching 33 passes for 307 yards and four more TDs. He is a native of Springfield, Virginia.

- **Cameryn Brent** is a JC transfer from Holmes Community College in Mississippi. He led all JC players nationally with 152.6 rushing yards per game and 15 touchdowns. He is an Atlanta native.

STREAMING SPARTANS

NSU will have all 11 games on ESPN's family of streaming networks this year.

- All six of NSU's home games and all five road games against MEAC opponents will be carried on ESPN3. The home games will include the audio feed from the NSU Sports Network (91.1 FM).

- Fans with a current cable network subscription, such as on Cox or Verizon Fios in Hampton Roads, can view ESPN3 games for free.

ALL GAMES ON HOT 91.1 FM

Campus radio station WNSB Hot 91.1 FM will serve as the carrier of all 11 Spartan football games this fall, plus any potential postseason games.

This marks the first time since 2009 that 91.1 FM will serve as the sole carrier of NSU football games. The station simulcast the games the last eight seasons. Fans can also listen to the games online at www.nsu.edu/wnsb, or through TuneIn.com and the TuneIn Radio app by searching for WNSB 91.1 FM.

GAME PROMOTIONS SCHEDULE

A look at NSU's schedule of promotions for the remaining home games:

- **Nov. 10 vs. Howard, 1 p.m.** - NSU Day of Service - Fans are asked to participate in a campus-wide canned food drive.

- **Nov. 17 vs. Morgan State, 1 p.m.** - 1st Responders and Military Appreciation Day, and also Senior Day for the NSU football team.

HOME SWEET HOME

NSU's roster is again loaded with in-state talent. Fifty-nine (57) of NSU's 79-man roster hail from the Commonwealth of Virginia. As usual, the Spartans are faring well close to home in their recruiting endeavors. Thirty-one of the 59 Virginia natives are from the Hampton Roads area. Seventeen are from the Richmond and surrounding areas, while another 11 come from points north or west.

Aaron Savage tied his career high with 112 rushing yards and scored two touchdowns, and Norfolk State pulled away with a strong second-half performance to top Virginia State.

Savage caught a 30-yard touchdown pass in the first half and helped seal the game with a 19-yard TD run in the fourth quarter for the Spartans (1-0), who outscored the Trojans (0-1) 17-0 in the fourth quarter to break the game open.

VSU scored on its first drive of the game, a 13-play, 74-yard march that Cordelral Cook capped with a 19-yard TD pass to TreQuan Reed with 8:39 left in the opening quarter. But Savage hauled in a 23-yard touchdown pass from Juwan Carter on 3rd-and-11 just more than four minutes later to tie the score.

Josh Nardone's first field goal of the night, a 26-yarder in the second quarter, gave the Spartans a 10-7 going into the half.

The second half was controlled by the Spartans. Four plays after NSU lost Carter due to an ejection, backup quarterback D'Andre Thomas threw a 15-yard TD pass to Chuma Awanna at the 6:10 mark of the third, giving the Spartans a 10-point cushion.

VSU crept back within 17-13 on Cook's 3-yard TD run on 4th-and-goal with 2:25 left in the third. But NSU scored 17 unanswered points in the fourth quarter, including TD runs by Savage and Cameryn Brent in the final four minutes, to pull away for the win.

NSU held the Trojans to 82 rushing yards on 27 carries and forced four turnovers. Quinerly intercepted two passes and Nigel Chavis recovered a fumble. Linebackers Quintreil Chung (career-high 12) and Dale Craig (nine) paced the Spartans in tackles.

GAME 7: SAVANNAH STATE 32, NSU 3

Running back Rashad Saxton and quarterback D'Vonn Gibbons combined for 215 rushing yards to help Savannah State win its third straight game over Norfolk State.

Behind 118 rushing yards from Saxton and 97 from Gibbons, the Tigers amassed 293 yards on the ground as a team, most by an NSU opponent this year. Gibbons added two scoring passes. Not to be outdone, the Tiger defense forced three turnovers and kept the Spartans out of the end zone as NSU dropped its third straight game.

The teams traded turnovers to begin the game, but Saxton scored on a 1-yard run on SSU's second possession to stake the Tigers to the early 7-0 lead.
