Setting the Stage:

- NSU will be looking for its first road season-opening win under Dosch and first overall since 2000 when the Wolves beat Wisconsin-Stevens Point 28-21
- With Northern's 29-27 triple overtime win over Wayne State, the Wolves are now 2-2 all-time in season openers under Head Coach Tom Dosch
- USF Head Coach Jed Stugart is entering his fourth season at the helm of the Cougars

Last Meeting:

- The Wolves and the Cougars are meeting for the first time since 1958. Northern won that contest 52-7.

About the Cougars:

- This will be Sioux Falls' third season as a member of NCAA Division II. USF was a member of the NAIA prior to 2011.
- The Cougars won four National Championships as an NAIA member
- Wide receiver Carrington Hanna was named the NSIC's South Offensive Preseason Player of the Year in the coaches' poll

Last Season:

- Last season (6-5) marked the best finish for the Wolves since 2005, which was also the last time NSU posted a winning record. Logan Dosch and Mark Hanley were First Team All-NSIC selections while Logan Fahnhorst, Robert Neisen, Marquis Mulkey, Ikee Sirleaf and Mason Thorstad were second team honorees.

The series:

- NSU is 8-2 all-time against Sioux Falls. The first meeting between the squads was in 1928.

Forecast:

- Saturday's forecast calls temps in the mid-60s. Strong wind gusts are possible and there is a 40 percent chance of scattered thunder storms.

About the NSIC:

- The NSIC expanded once more in 2012 with the addition of Sioux Falls and Minot State as full-fledged members. The NSIC is now a 16-team league. The institutions are the fifth and sixth additional members since the league expanded from 10 to 14 in 2008. Member schools continue to emphasize the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. The NSIC is committed to providing rewarding experiences for its student-athletes, and while the challenges that loom are sizable, indeed, the NSIC is surely well positioned for the future.

Team Notes

- Dating back to last season, NSU has won 4-of-5 games. During that span, the Wolves are averaging 41 points per game.
- The Wolves have now won five-straight home games and eight of their last nine at Swisher Field.
- Since starting the Dosch era 0-4 at home, NSU has compiled a 10-3 record on home soil
- Northern was sixth in the NSIC last season in scoring at 32.5 points per game
- NSU's eight all-conference performers in 2012 are the most for a Wolves squad since the 2005 team had six honorees
- NSU's win over SCSU in Week 8 of last season was its first over the Huskies since 1947.
- The Wolves outscored their northern division rivals by 14 points per game (37-23) in 2012
- The Wolves are looking for consecutive winning seasons for the first time since 2003-05
- The Wolves went a perfect 3-for-3 in the red zone against Wayne State. NSU had a 100 percent red zone efficiency in four games last season

Offensive Notebook:

- Junior quarterback **Jared Jacobson** was the only player in the NSIC a season ago to rush for at least 600 yards and pass for at least 2,500 yards.
- Jacobson is a preseason honorable mention all-american selection by USA Football Network
- Jacobson's 3,190 yards of total offense were the most at NSU since 2003
- Jacobson led the Wolves in rushing yards (628) and rushing TDs (9) in 2012
- Jacobson's 2,562 yards passing were the 6th-most in the league last season
- **John Hughes** led the Wolves in rushing yards per game last season, in nine contests he had 567 yards rushing, an average of 63 per game
- **Connor Doherty** and **Chris Malsam** had great debuts for the Wolves in the passing game. Doherty led Northern with six catches and 79 yards. Malsam had 62 yards on three grabs including a game-high 38-yard reception
- Against Wayne State, the Wolves' offense started off sluggish, recording just 66 yards of total offense in the first half. In the second half and OT, NSU compiled 236 yards of total offense.
- NSU had the fourth-fewest turnovers last season in the league (5 fumbles, 9 INTs)
- Jacobson (136), Hughes (124), **Terrelle Walker** (47) and **Cameron Pudwill** (44) all carried the ball more than 40 times last season, all return in 2013
- In the red zone last season the Wolves scored 37-of-45 times (82 percent), 29 of those scores were TDs
- Hughes' 19 attempts against WSC are the second-most in his career. Hughes had 23 last season against Southwest Minnesota St.
- Jacobson's 17 yards rushing are his fewest since Bemidji State (Oct. 13) last season. Those 17 yards would have been his second-lowest output on the ground last season
- The Wolves' offensive line returns a ton of experience in 2013 as seven linemen return with starting experience from 2012. Included are Jacob Holguin and Justin Parsons who started all 11 games last season. Jon Caspers (eight) and Kyle Cabral (six) also started most of 2012.

Defensive Notebook:

- Senior safety **Logan Dosch** needs just two tackles to become Northern's all-time leader in that category.
- Dosch was named a 2013 First Team Preseason All-America by USA College Football and second team by Beyond Sports Network

- Dosch led the Wolves and was fifth in the league with four interceptions in 2012
- Dosch was top-20 in the league with 83 tackles and top-10 with 52 solo stops in 2012
- As a team, NSU forced 22 turnovers (6 fumbles, 16 INTs) and had a +8 turnover margin which was the fourth-best in the NSIC
- Northern's 16 interceptions were tied for the third-best mark in the conference in 2012
- Three Wolves (**Michael Alberts**, **Devin Olson** and **Blaine Schmidt**) led the team with eight tackles against WSC. While Schmidt and **Channing Barber** each led the team with three pass break-ups each
- Northern swarmed on defense last Saturday against the Wildcats as 11 Wolves recorded a tackle-for-loss in the game
- NSU's 12 TFLs are the ninth-most in the country
- Alberts' eight tackles are a career-best for the linebacker
- Schmidt's eight tackles and three pass break-ups are both career-highs for him
- Dating back to last season, in the last three games, the Wolves have allowed just 121 yards passing per game. WSC's 203 last weekend are the highest during that span
- The senior safety tandem of Dosch and Geditz combined for nine tackles, two TFLs and three pass break-ups against Wayne.
- Dosch (five), Geditz (five) and **Paul Woodward** (four) have combined for 14 career interceptions amongst the three of them
- Dating back to 2011, Dosch, Geditz, **Mike Tuch** and Woodward have been staples in the Northern defensive lineup. The quartet have started together in 19 of the last 20 games.
- The Wolves allowed scoring drives on the first and last WSC possessions of regulation. NSU held the Wildcats scoreless for a stretch of 12 consecutive possessions Saturday
- The Northern defense bolstered after the first quarter against Wayne. The Wildcats went 5-of-7 on third-down conversions in the first quarter, including converting a fourth-down try. After that, WSC went just 4-of-15 on third downs and 2-for-9 in the second half
- After struggling to produce interceptions in their first two seasons under Dosch (8 in 2010, 9 in '11) the Wolves forced 16 picks in 2012, the most since they had 18 in 2003

TOM DOSCH

HEAD COACH • FOURTH SEASON

CAREER RECORD: 14-20 (39-37 OVERALL)

The 26th football coach in Wolves football history, Tom Dosch, enters his fourth year at the helm of the Wolves and 22nd year of collegiate coaching in 2013.

Dosch is coming off of his best campaign at NSU, going 6-5 in 2012, including a third-place finish in the division. Dosch also coached eight NSIC All-Conference performers last season, including first team selections Logan Dosch at defensive back and Mark Hanley at wide receiver.

Prior to his time at Northern, Dosch spent two seasons at Southern Illinois University, overseeing the inside linebackers and special teams for the Salukies, who won the Missouri Valley Conference title both years. SIU qualified for the NCAA Division I-Football Championship Sub-Division (FCS) playoffs in both 2008 and 2009, finishing the 2008 season ranked eighth in the nation. The Salukies were also ranked No. 1 in two national polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season.

Prior to his time at SIU, he compiled a 25-17 record in four seasons as the head coach at Jamestown College. Under his direction, the Jimmies qualified for the NAIA playoffs twice and were ranked as high as sixth in the nation in 2007. He also coached players to 14 All-America honors and 18 Academic All-America accolades in those four seasons.

Before taking over at Jamestown, Dosch spent eight years as the defensive line/outside linebackers coach at the University of North Dakota. The Sioux won five North Central Conference titles, made two national title game appearances and won the Division II national crown in 2001. Dosch was also a graduate assistant for the Sioux for the 1993-94 seasons. All told, the Sioux compiled a record of 97-27 with 20 all-conference picks and nine All-Americans in his ten seasons on staff.

A 1992 graduate of Dickinson State University, Dosch was a four-year letter-winner for the Blue Hawks and is a current member of the school's Hall of Fame. He also earned two letters as a member of the basketball squad. Following his playing career, he spent the 1991 season as the wide receivers coach for Dickinson State.

Dosch's teams – as a player, head or assistant coach – have won 12 conference championships and advanced to the national playoffs 14 times, including two national title games. He has also compiled a 190-70 record in games in which he has been involved in some capacity.

Dosch's family has some familiarity with the university including his father, Al Dosch, who is a 1969 graduate of Northern State. He retired as the winningest high school football coach in North Dakota history with a record of 229-61-4.

He and his wife Tina, have two children Lauren (8) and Matthew (6)

Aberdeen, S.D. -- The Northern State football team opened its 2013 season in exciting fashion Saturday night in front of 6,134 at Swisher Field as the Wolves used a 14-point fourth quarter to help propel them to a 29-27 triple overtime win over Wayne State.

Jared Jacobson hit Tanner White on the first play of the third overtime to put the Wolves up. Terrelle Walker then took a pass from Jacobson into the end zone for the two-point conversion and 29-21 Northern advantage. After a three yard run by Charlie Davidson cut the lead to 29-27, the Wolves forced an incomplection on the conversion to seal the victory.

NSU (1-0, 1-0 NSIC) overcame a lethargic first half in which it mustered just 66 yards of total offense and trailed 7-0 going into the break. However, the Northern defense rose to the occasion numerous times forcing the Wildcats into multiple mistakes to keep the Wolves in the game.

Northern forced WSC to miss two field goals from 40 and 33 yards, blocked two punts, had an interception and forced two turnovers on downs. The first came with 3:03 left in the third quarter, Wayne State went for it on a fourth and one from the NSU 31, but failed to convert when All-NSIC safety Logan Dosch recorded a tackle for loss. The second led to Northern's first score of the game as WSC failed to convert on a fake punt. Three plays later, Jacobson scored from a yard out to tie the game a 7-7.

The Wolves then took the lead for the first time on the evening when Jacobson hit John Hughes for an eight-yard score to put the Wolves up 14-7 with 4:47 to go.

The Wildcats showed resilience and marched down the field, even converting on a fourth and five to knot the game up with 1:52 remaining after Davidson's second score of the contest. NSU's last shot to win the game in regulation was a 46-yard field goal from freshman Nathan Shaw. The kick was blocked and the game was sent to bonus football.

After both teams opened the first OT with scores, the defenses held in the second extra frame as both kickers missed field goal attempts.

Jacobson went 14-of-37 passing for 214 yards and two TDs in the victory while also rushing for 17 yards and a score. Hughes led the Wolves ground attack with 50 yards on 19 carries. Tight end Connor Doherty caught six passes for 79 yards through the air for NSU. Chris Malsam had three grabs for 62 yards and a game-long grab of 38 yards.

The Wildcats were a one-two punch on offense Saturday. 2012 NSIC Offensive Newcomer of the Year Davidson, rushed for 190 yards and a pair of scores on a whopping 41 attempts. Toney Abraham also had a big day receiving for Wayne. Abraham caught 12 passes for 140 yards and also scored once.

The swarming Northern defense got great performances from multiple players. Michael Alberts, Devin Olson and Blaine Schmidt led the team with eight tackles each. Schmidt also had an interception in the game. Ikee Sirleaf had seven total tackles including one for loss. Dosch recorded five stops and two tackles-for-loss. Dosch is now just three tackles away from setting the NSU all-time record in that category. Linebacker Mike Tuch also recorded a sack in the win for the Wolves.
