WORTH NOTING...

The Northwestern men's soccer team is heading back to the NCAA Tournament. The Wildcats received an at-large bid to the 2013 NCAA Tournament and will host a first-round match against Bradley on Thursday, Nov. 21 at 7 p.m. at Lakeside Field.

This is the eighth NCAA Tournament appearance for the Wildcats, all of which have come under head coach Tim Lenahan. The Wildcats recorded a 10-7-3 record this year while Bradley brings a 13-6-2 record into the NCAA Tournament. The winner of Thursday's game will travel to face No. 4 seed California on Sunday, Nov. 24 at 3:30 p.m. CT.

Back in the Dance

2013 marks Northwestern's third consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament. The 'Cats have already reached the NCAA Tournament in seven of the last eight season and eight of the last ten (2004, 2006-09, 2011-13).

Those streaks are the second best in the Big Ten, behind Indiana, who has made 27 straight NCAA Tournament appearances.

Putting in Overtime

Overall this season, NU has played seven overtime games, six going into double overtime. The seven OT contests are the fourth most overtime games in a single season in school history, the most being nine in 2012.

Calistri Nets Fourth Hat Trick in School History

A hat trick by sophomore forward Joey Calistri, the fourth hat trick in Northwestern school history, led Northwestern to a 4-0 win over Green Bay in the NIU Tournament at the NIU Soccer and Track & Field Complex Friday.

It marked the the first hat trick by a NU player since Matt Eliason tallied three goals against Eastern Illinois on Sep. 12, 2008. Also, in school history, Patrick Eggen accomplished the feat against North Park Oct. 24, 1997. Andrew McDermott was the first Wildcat to tally three goals in a match, doing so Oct. 21, 1995 against UIC.

Calistri Scores Fastest Goal for NU Since 2004

Sophomore forward Joey Calistri found the back of the net 60 seconds into Northwestern's match against Xavier on Sep. 7 after taking a pass from junior midfielder Grant Wilson. It marked the 'Cats fastest goal to start a match since Gerardo Alvarez tallied a goal against Oral Roberts 0:47 in the match on Sep. 24, 2004.

Calistri added a second goal in the game's 23rd minute. It marked his second career multi-goal game. He also scored a pair of goals against Rhode Island on Sep. 9, 2012.

He became the first Northwestern player to tally multiple games with at least two goals since Oliver Kupe, who registered three in his career. (Sep. 25, 2008 at Notre Dame; Sep. 10, 2010 vs. Cleveland State; Nov. 6, 2010 vs. Michigan).

Preseason Honors for Ritter

Returning for his fifth season in the NU midfield, Chris Ritter has received a number of preseason accolades. He was recently named a candidate for the 2013 Senior CLASS Award. The award, which is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, honors the attributes of senior student-athletes in four areas: community, classroom, character and competition. It focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

He also was named to College Soccer News 2013 Preseason All-America Third Team, is on MLSSoccer.com's Top 10 Players to Watch for 2013 and is one of three Wildcats, along with Layth Masri and Lepe Seetane, on the Big Ten Men's Soccer Preseason Players to Watch List.

WORTH NOTING...

Look Who's Back

Northwestern returns eight starters off of the 2012 Big Ten Championship squad, including four first team All-Big Ten honorees. A two-time first-team honoree, junior Tyler Miller, is back in net for Northwestern while fellow first-team All-Big Ten honoree, junior Nikko Boxall, also returns to the NU defense. Last year's Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year Chris Ritter is back for a fifth season while defending Big Ten Freshman of the Year, Joey Calistri, returns for his sophomore campaign.

Other starters returning for 2013 include junior midfielder/defender Grant Wilson, senior midfielder Lepe Seetane, senior defender Scott Lakin and senior midfielder Layth Masri. Junior forward Eric Weberman, along with sophomore midfielders Henry Herrill and Cole Missimo also return after making key contributions in 2012. After missing the 2012 season due to injury, senior midfielder/defender Connor Holloway also is back for the Wildcats in 2013. Holloway played 19 games, starting 17, during NU's first Big Ten Championship and Big Ten Tournament title in 2011.

Fab Freshmen

The Wildcats have already had plenty of contributions this season from their freshman class. Forward Mike Roberge scored NU's first goal of the season, knocking the ball in against UC Santa Barbara on Aug. 30. Midfielder Brandon Medina scored the 'Cats game-winning goal against DePaul on Sept. 2. Medina also assisted on Roberge's goal vs. UCSB and the freshman leads the team with three points.

Miller on MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List

Tyler Miller has been named to the 2013 Missouri Athletic Club Hermann Trophy watch list. The Hermann Trophy, the most prestigious individual award in intercollegiate soccer, is awarded to the country's top Division I soccer player. Miller is one of 34 players in the nation to make the watch list and is the Big Ten's only representative.

A two-time First Team All-Big Ten goalkeeper, Miller played every minute of the 2012 season in net (2,185), starting all 23 games for Northwestern as NU won its second Big Ten title in as many years and advanced to the third round of the 2012 NCAA Championships.

Last year, he compiled a 13-6-4 record with a .730 save percentage and 0.82 goals-against average, the third best single-season mark in Wildcats history. A Second-Team All-Great Lakes Region and Academic All-Big Ten selection, Miller recorded 10 shutouts in 2012, the second most in a single season in NU history. He ranks second in school history with 20 all-time shutouts.

Returning Offense

Northwestern returns 75 percent of its scoring from a year ago. The Wildcats scored 28 goals and seven different NU returnees accounted for 21 of those goals. Joey Calistri's nine goals led Northwestern in 2012 while Chris Ritter contributed five. Eric Weberman had three goals, while Grant Wilson, Henry Herrill, Nikko Boxall and Lepe Seetane each contributed a goal last season.

WORTH NOTING...

Incredible Turnaround

Head coach Tim Lenahan has completely turned around the Northwestern men's soccer program during his tenure and before he arrived, it was rare for the Wildcats to win a Big Ten game. Before Lenahan arrived at Northwestern in 2001, the program had just four total Big Ten wins. Lenahan's turnaround was a progression in the early years as the Wildcats won eight games his second year (2002), seven his second season (2003) and then a program-record 15 wins in 2004 with the team's first NCAA Tournament appearance. Lenahan has compiled a 24-36-12 Big Ten regular-season record with the Wildcats, including a 24-21-9 mark since 2004. Below is a look at Northwestern's overall records before Lenahan and then the team's records under Lenahan since 2004:

New Faces on Lenahan's Bench

There are two new faces on the Wildcats' coaching staff for 2013 as Joe Ahearn and Jeff Oleck joined the squad in the offseason as assistant coaches. Ahearn arrived at Northwestern in February after spending six seasons as the head coach at Missouri S&T and also worked on the coaching staffs at Colgate and DePaul. Oleck was hired in June after spending the previous four seasons, including one as an associate head coach, at his alma mater Valparaiso.

Ahearn and Oleck replaced Neil Jones and Mike Babst, who both earned head coaching jobs in the Chicago area. Jones is now head coach at Loyola University while Babst is at the University of Chicago. Jones and Babst were the 15th and 16th members, respectively, of Lenahan's coaching tree picked to lead a program.

Big Ten Champions Again

The Wildcats finished the Big Ten regular season with 11 points (3-1-2) and shared the 2012 crown with co-champion Penn State (3-1-2, 11 points). It was the second-consecutive conference crown for head coach Tim Lenahan's Wildcats after they won the first title in program history during the 2011 campaign. Lenahan has guided the team to a 7-1-4 record during regular-season Big Ten games the last two years.

Outstanding APR for the Wildcats

NU men's soccer was one of 14 Wildcat varsity programs honored by the NCAA with public recognition awards for being in the top 10 percent with their latest multi-year APR score, helping Northwestern rank third in the nation with 74 percent of its varsity programs receiving the honor. The NU men's soccer program tied for 10th nationally in APR and led the Big Ten with a 995 multi-year rate.

Former 'Cats Shine vs. Messi & Friends

Members of the Northwestern men's soccer family took centerstage with a handful of the world's most elite footballers July 7 at the Messi and Friends exhibition event at Soldier Field. With Tim Lenahan, the architect of the two-time Big Ten champion Wildcats program, serving as an assistant coach in the game, nine former 'Cats had the opportunity to test themselves against many of the same players they have idolized throughout their soccer careers.

In addition to Argentine superstar Lionel Messi, the squads for the game -- which aired nationally on ESPN -- included French footballing legend Thierry Henry, former US National Team captain and World Cup veteran Carlos Bocanegra, Premier League star Florent Malouda, and famed Brazilian goalkeeper Julio Cesar.

Despite the array of stars on the pitch, it was 2011 Northwestern alum Matt Eliason-- the all-time leading scorer in Northwestern men's soccer history (33 goals) -- who shined as bright as any of them. Eliason twice found the back of the net in highlight-reel fashion, including a moment he'll never forget in the first half. Eliason received a pass from Henry off his chest and set himself up for a perfectly executed bicycle kick goal from the penalty spot, wowing the large crowd in attendance at Soldier Field.

Following the match, Eliason, who is a financial analyst for GE Capital in Chicago, appeared on ESPN SportsCenter's Top 10 as the No. 1 play, was an in-studio guest on SportsCenter and appeared in numerous national as well as international media publications. Eliason earned a trial with the New York Red Bulls and played two reserve team games in New York.

In total, nine former NU players, including Eliason, Gerardo Alvarez, Brad Napper, Dave Roth, Geoff Fallon, Mark Blades, Cody Stanley, Oliver Kupe and Tommy Tombridge, played in the match.

2012 SEASON NOTABLES

- Northwestern won its second Big Ten regular season title in 2012. The Wildcats finished the regular season with 11 points (3-1-2) and shared the conference crown with co-champions Penn State. It was the second title in as many years for NU, who won the program's first Big Ten title in 2011.
- Freshman forward Joey Calistri was the unanimous selection as 2012 Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Senior midfielder Chris Ritter was tabbed the 2012 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year. Both Calistri and Ritter, along with sophomore goalkeeper Tyler Miller and sophomore defender Nikko Boxall earned First Team All-Big Ten recognition. Senior defender Jarrett Baughman received Second Team accolades while Calistri and midfielder Cole Missimo made the All-Freshman Team. It was the first time in NU history the program had four First Team All-Big Ten honorees.
- Northwestern made its seventh NCAA Tournament appearance and advanced to the Sweet 16 for the fourth time in school history. NU defeated Western Illinois in its first-round game at Lakeside Field, upset No. 7 seed Marquette, 1-0, and played a tightly-contested match against No. 10 seed Louisville.
- Joey Calistri was also named First Team All-Freshman by College Soccer News and received third team accolades on the All-Great Lakes Region team. Tyler Miller, Nikko Boxall and Chris Ritter were all Second Team honorees for the All-Great Lakes Region team.
- During the regular season, Northwestern upset then-No. 7 Notre Dame at Lakeside Field on Oct. 9, which was one of a number of quality wins for the 'Cats. Notre Dame went on to receive the No. 1 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament and NU posted four wins and a tie against teams ranked in the top-30 RPI, including eventual NCAA Champion Indiana.
- Sophomore goalkeeper Tyler Miller further cemented his name in the NU record books, finishing the season with 10 shutouts and has 19 career shutouts to rank second in school history. Miller needs 10 more to tie the NU record of 29 shutouts set by Misha Rosenthal from 2005-09. His 0.82 goals-against average in 2012 ranks third in single-season history.
- The 'Cats began the season on an eight-match unbeaten streak and won 10+ games for the seventh time in the last nine years.
- The NU defense only allowed three goals in Big Ten regular-season play, which was the least amount of goals allowed in the conference, and posted a 0.45 goals-against average during the conference season. The Wildcats were 8-0-2 when shutting out their opponent and 4-2-2 when allowing one goal.
- Northwestern started and ended the regular season in similar fashion, playing four consecutive overtime matches. NU's first four games went to extra time and its final four matches of the regular season also went to overtime. Before this year, the Wildcats had never played four consecutive overtime matches. In total, Northwestern played nine overtime matches this year, breaking the school record of eight set in 2009 and 2004. NU was 3-2-4 in overtime this year.
- Northwestern once again had an APR that ranked in the top 10 percent nationally. A school-record 14 of Northwestern's 19 varsity athletic programs received Public Recognition Awards as part of the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR) program, ranking NU third nationally in honors per sport offered. The most recent APRs are multi-year rates based on scores from the 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12 academic years.
- A total of 14 men's soccer players earned Academic All-Big Ten distinction, including Jarrett Baughman, Peter Beasley, Nikko Boxall, Nick Gendron, Peter Horner, Scott Lakin, Layth Masri, Tyler Miller, Chris Ritter, Jeff Rogers, Kyle Schickel, Tommy Tombridge, Michael Walbridge and Grant Wilson.

When Tim Lenahan was hired at Northwestern prior to the 2001 season, he had already displayed a keen ability to build programs--first at his alma mater, Richard Stockton College, then at Lafayette College.

And after 12 seasons in Evanston and seven NCAA tournament appearances in the past nine years, not only has the reputation been cemented, Lenahan has proven himself to be one of the premier college coaches in the game today.

Lenahan inherited a Wildcat program that went winless in 2000. However, in the 12 years since then, the Northwestern program has made itself into a force to be reckoned with both in the Big Ten and nationally.

Over the past nine seasons, Lenahan's Wildcats have amassed 108 victories, including a school-record 15 wins in 2004 and again in 2008. Coach Lenahan also has coached players who have gone on to the professional ranks such as Dave Roth (New York Red Bulls, 2008), Brad North (DC United, 2007), Brad Napper (FC Dallas 2006) and JD Martin (Chicago Fire, 2003).

In 2012, Lenahan's Wildcats made a remarkable run in the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the third round for the fourth time in program history. Northwestern hosted Western Illinois in its first-round game and recorded a 1-0 shutout to meet No. 7 seed Marquette on their home pitch. Once again, the Wildcats used dominating defense to record their 10th shutout of the season to advance to the third round with a 1-0 upset over the Golden Eagles.

Northwestern earned its second Big Ten regular-season title in as many years, posting a 3-1-2 mark in conference to share the crown with Penn State. The Wildcats were well-represented in conference honors as forward Joey Calistri, a Deerfield, Ill., native, was the unanimous choice for Big Ten Freshman of the Year. Chris Ritter earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year accolades as both, along with defender Nikko Boxall and goalkeeper Tyler Miller earned First-Team All-Big Ten accolades. Defender Jarrett Baughman received second-team honors, giving NU a record-tying five players on the All-Big Ten teams.

The 2011 season was a banner year for Lenahan's Wildcats as the team won the double Big Ten Championship (the regular season and tournament titles) for the first time in school history, went unbeaten in conference play (4-0-2) and rattled off an 11-match unbeaten streak, the second-longest streak of its kind in program history. Lenahan was honored as the Big Ten Coach of the Year, another program first, and coached five all-conference honorees (tied a program best). Unanimous first-team All-Big Ten selection Oliver Kupe was drafted by Real Salt Lake in the 2012 MLS Supplemental Draft. With Northwestern's 2-1 win over Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament championship game, Lenahan became the all-time winningest coach in NU history with 111 wins. He also was named the NSCAA/Mondo Great Lakes Regional Coach of the Year, the third regional coaching honor of his career.
