2016 NCAA Championships

• Northwestern will look to continue its recent success in March when it heads to the NCAA Championships at Madison Square Garden in New York City. The championships, running from Thursday, March 17 through Saturday, March 19, mark the culmination of the college wrestling postseason. The Wildcats will look to continue their five-year run with at least one All-American.

• Fans unable to make it to New York City this weekend can watch Chicago's Big Ten Team all weekend long. All six sessions will be available via stream on ESPN3, while the semifinals and finals will be televised live on ESPN. The finals will begin at 7 p.m. CT on ESPN.

New York State of Mind

• Three Wildcats will make the journey to MSG to compete for the title of national champion. Dominick Malone (133), Jameson Oster (141) and Jason Tsirtsis (149) will participate for Northwestern.

• Malone and Tsirtsis received automatic bids after placing at Big Tens, while Oster was granted an at-large bid based on his body of work during the regular season. He holds a 4-4 record against the NCAA tournament field.

• Tsirtsis received the No. 6 seed at 149 lbs. Malone and Oster both enter the championships unseeded.

Elite Company

• Northwestern junior Jason Tsirtsis will look to join elite company as one of only eight Wildcats to earn All-America honors three or more times in their Northwestern careers. The three-time list includes Rory Weber (1960-62), Scott Schatzman (1996, '98, '00), Brandon Precin (2008-09, '11) and Jason Welch (2011-13). Three Wildcats -- Mike Funk (1987, '89-91), Jake Herbert (2005-07, '09) and Mike McMullan (2012-15) -- have gone 4-for-4 at the NCAA Championships.

NU at 2015 NCAA Championships

• Northwestern placed two All-Americans a season ago in St. Louis with Jason Tsirtsis (149) and Mike McMullan (285) each earning third-place finishes.

• Six Wildcats competed at the championships overall, and the team placed 15th, capturing its ninth top-15 finish in the past 11 seasons.

NCAA Championships History

- 10 Wildcats have won national titles, including current Northwestern student-athlete Jason Tsirtsis, who captured the 149 lbs. title during his freshman season in 2014. Northwestern won a title in three straight seasons from 2007-09, and two Wildcats -- Jack Riley (1931-32) and Jake Herbert (2007, 09) -- have won multiple titles.
- 39 different Northwestern wrestlers have combined to earn 67 All-America honors. Northwestern has had at least two All-Americans in each season dating back to 2011 and at least one in 10 of the past 11 seasons.
- 2016 is the 15th consecutive year that Northwestern has had NCAA Championships participants.
- Northwestern has finished as high as fourth in the team standings on two separate occasions -- in 1990 and again in 2007.

Senior Send-Off

- Two Wildcat seniors - Dominick Malone and Jameson Oster - will wrestle their final matches in a Northwestern singlet at the NCAA championships. Malone is making his third appearance, while Oster is making his second.

Sustained Success

Northwestern is at its best when March rolls around as the team has placed in the top 15 at the NCAA Championships in nine of the last 11 years. The Wildcats have also finished in the top 10 in the nation in two of the past four seasons. Here are the results:

Battle Tested

- Jason Tsirtsis wrestled five consecutive matches against top-six ranked opponents at 149 lbs, dating back to the semifinals of the Midlands on Dec. 30.
- The stretch began in the semifinals of the Midlands Championships with a 3-1 win over No. 4 Alexander Richardson (Old Dominion) and continued with two straight matches against No. 2 Brandon Sorensen (Iowa) and a match with No. 1 Zain Retherford (Penn State) in Northwestern's last time out. He ended the run with a 4-2 win in sudden victory over No. 6 Alec Pantaleo of Michigan on Friday night.
- As a team, Northwestern also had one of the hardest stretches in the nation it wrestled four consecutive top-10 opponents. The Wildcats wrestled then-No. 7 Ohio State on Dec. 18 before taking a break for the Midlands and then matched up against No. 2 Iowa, No. 1 Penn State and No. 6 Michigan.

National Leader

- Northwestern senior Dominick Malone (133) is among the nation's best in falls. He is tied for 10th among all NCAA wrestlers with eight wins by fall. He is tied with Oklahoma State's Alex Dieringer and North Carolina State's Nick Gwiazdowski. Michael Woulfe (Navy) leads all wrestlers with 14 wins by fall. Malone has finished his eight pins in a total time of 14:17.

In the Polls

- Jason Tsirtsis is ranked fourth at 149 lbs. by InterMat and FloWrestling and sixth by The Open Mat this week. He is fifth in the Coaches Panel Rankings and fourth in the RPI.
- Dominick Malone is 17th in the Coaches' Poll and 20th in RPI, while Jameson Oster comes in at 25 in the Coaches and 23rd in RPI.

A Pinning Machine

- Dominick Malone has been a pinning machine so far this season, winning eight of his 20 matches by fall. He has outscored his opponents in back points, 78-8.
- All of Malone's falls have come in the first period. His fastest was a 45 second pin of teammate Ian Cramer at the Michigan State Open on Nov. 15. He has two other pins in less than a minute - a 56 second win over Scott Stevens of Franklin & Marshall in the Wildcats 30-18 win at the Grapple at the Garden and a 58 second fall at the Midlands of CSU Bakersfield's Carlos Herrera.
- Malone leads the team with 22 wins. He won eight in a row from Nov. 15 to Dec. 13. Nine of his 10 losses are to ranked opponents.

Tsirtsis Wins...A Lot

- With an 84-12 career record and now in his third season, Jason Tsirtsis ranks fifth on Northwestern's career winning percentage list with a mark of .875. He finished the 2014-15 season with 39 wins, good for seventh on the single-season wins list at Northwestern. Jake Herbert is the most dominant wrestler in program history with a career record of 135-4 for a winning percentage of .971.

Into the Fire

- Season-ending injuries to two projected starters have enabled two true freshman to be plugged into the Northwestern lineup this year. Luke Norland has been wrestling all season at 165 lbs. and has won four matches in place of Johnny Sebastian, while Anthony Petrone made his collegiate debut at 157 lbs. against Iowa in place of Bryce Brill.

Best Conference in America

- Eight Big Ten schools are ranked by InterMat in the dual rankings and nine are ranked in the tournament rankings as of March 1. According to the dual meet rankings, the Big Ten boasts No. 1 Penn State, No. 3 Iowa, No. 7 Michigan, No. 8 Ohio State, No. 9 Nebraska, No. 10 Rutgers, No. 12 Illinois and No. 16 Minnesota.

- The Wildcats wrestled seven of those eight teams (only excluding Rutgers) in 2015-16. The only non-ranked team Northwestern faced in-conference is Michigan State.

NYC, Here We Come

- The Wildcats make two trips to Madison Square Garden in New York City this season.
- Northwestern participated in the fourth annual "Grapple at the Garden" on Nov. 29. Chicago's Big Ten Team split a pair of matches, beating Franklin & Marshall 30-18 after dropping a 20-20 tie to Drexel on criteria. Dom Malone, Bryce Brill, Luke Norland and Mitch Sliga each won both of their matches in their first time wrestling at MSG.
- The 'Cats head back to New York City in March. The 2016 NCAA Championships are at Madison Square Garden and will give the best collegiate wrestlers in the country a chance to wrestle in one of America's most iconic venues.

100 Years of Northwestern Wrestling

- Northwestern wrestling is celebrating its 100th year during the 2015-16 season. The first organized wrestling took place at Northwestern University in 1915 and 1916. Since that time, the Wildcats have produced 10 national champions, 40 Big Ten champions and 63 All-Americans. The team has finished as high as fourth at the NCAA championships twice - in 1990 and again in 2007.

INTERIM HEAD COACH MATT STORNILO



Matt Storniolo was named the interim head coach at Northwestern on Oct. 26, 2015 after six seasons as an assistant for the Wildcats.

In his six seasons as an assistant, two-time All-American wrestler Matt Storniolo made an

immediate and significant impact on NU's success on the mat, particularly at the middle weights.

Beginning with his arrival prior to the start of the 2009-10 season, Storniolo worked closely with Northwestern's starters at 149 and 157 pounds, Andrew Nadhir and Jason Welch. His mentorship paid dividends at the NCAA Championships in 2011, when both Nadhir and Welch wrestled above their pre-tournament seeding and placed sixth at their respective weight classes to become first-time All-Americans. Welch's run included a win in the quarterfinals over the No. 1 seed and previously undefeated Adam Hall of Boise State, while Nadhir responded after dropping his first match to claim five consecutive wrestleback wins and a spot on the podium.

Those strong efforts were part of Northwestern's 13th-place finish at the national meet, capping off a season in which the 'Cats finished 18-2 in dual meets with a 6-2 mark in Big Ten Conference action.

In 2011-12, Storniolo helped guide Northwestern to a ninth-place finish at NCAA's, the Wildcats' first top-10 placement since 2007. Welch once again found the medal stand, placing fourth at 157 lbs. Storniolo worked extensively with Welch throughout his junior season, helping him amass a 27-3 record (was 23-0 at one point) and win 16 of his matches with bonus points.

The trend continued in 2012-13 as Welch capped his career as a national finalist at 157 and three-time All-American. Welch finished runner-up at 157 in 2013, bettering his placement at NCAA's each year (sixth, fourth, second). Storniolo also worked closely with two-time NCAA qualifier, Pierce Harger.

During the 2013-14 season, Storniolo worked extensively with Jason Tsirtsis, who won the 149 lbs. NCAA title as a redshirt freshman and the 'Cats finished No. 9 in the nation, NU's second top 10 finish in the last three seasons.

The 2014-15 season saw Northwestern send six wrestlers to the NCAA Championships, including Jameson Oster (141), Jason Tsirtsis (149) and Pierce Harger (165). Tsirtsis won his second straight Big Ten Championship.

Prior to coming to Northwestern, Storniolo spent two seasons as a volunteer assistant at Old Dominion where he trained closely with Ryan Williams, the 2009 NCAA runner-up at 141 pounds.

Storniolo began his college wrestling career at Penn State, reaching the finals of the Big Ten Championships on his way to winning the conference's Freshman of the Year honors. After

transferring to Oklahoma, Storniolo reached the Big XII Tournament finals each of the next three years, claiming the league championship as a senior in 2007.

A four-time qualifier for the NCAA Championships, Storniolo earned his first All-American honor by placing seventh as a sophomore before improving to a fourth-place finish as a junior. In his senior campaign, he entered the tournament as the second-ranked wrestler in the nation.

Storniolo graduated from the University of Oklahoma with a Bachelor of Science degree in human relations.

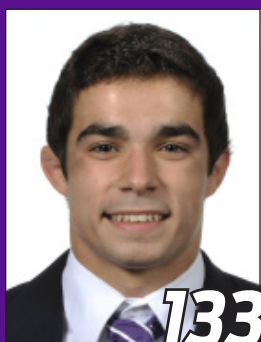

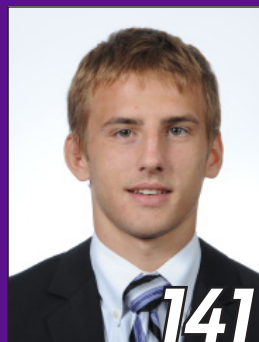

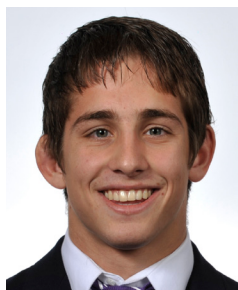
