THE OPENING TIP...

- Northwestern is coming off a 77-52 victory at Minnesota on Saturday. Freshman Aaron Falzon matched a career high with 20 points, including hitting six 3-pointers. Bryant McIntosh dished out a career-best 11 assists and Sanjay Lumpkin pulled down 10 rebounds as NU outscored the Golden Gophers 45-26 in the second half.
- The Wildcats' 25-point margin of victory was their largest in a Big Ten road game since a 77-20 victory at Chicago on Jan. 14, 1944. It was the largest winning margin in a Big Ten game overall since a 78-47 home win over Ohio State on Jan. 25, 1997.
- Saturday's win improved Northwestern to 4-0 through its first four true road games for the second time in school history. The 1930-31 team also won its first four road games en route to 7-0 road
- Northwestern is 8-0 this season when making 10 or more 3-pointers in a game. Five different Wildcats have hit at least 21 triples during the 2015-16 season.

SCOUTING WISCONSIN

The Badgers suffered a 63-60 home loss to third-ranked Maryland on Saturday, dropping them to 9-8 overall and 1-3 in Big Ten play. The three league losses have been by a combined 10 points. Nigel Hayes posted 17 points against the Terrapins while Ethan Happ added 16 points and 11 rebounds. Hayes and Bronson Koenig lead the team with averages of 15.8 and 13.9 points per game, respectively. Greg Gard is the interim head coach of the Badgers, taking over for Bo Ryan who retired just prior to the new year.

LAST TIME OUT

Aaron Falzon matched a career high with 20 points, including hitting a career-best six 3-pointers as Northwestern rolled to a 77-52 victory at Minnesota on Saturday. **Bryant McIntosh** dished out a career-high 11 assists while **Sanjay Lumpkin** pulled down 10 rebounds as the Wildcats shot 65.2 percent from the field in the second half in out-scoring the Golden Gophers 45-26 after the break.

WINNING WAYS

THWESTERN

Northwestern put together a pair of impressive winning streaks this season. The team's 10-game winning streak from Nov. 24 through Dec. 30 was just the second double-figure winning streak in school history. NU won a school-record 12 in a row from Dec. 8, 1930 through Feb. 14, 1931. Also, dating back to last season, the Wildcats posted a school-record 13-game home winning streak. NU won its last four home games of the 2014-15 campaign before winning its first nine games at Welsh-Ryan Arena this season. The previous record was 12 in a row from 1933 through 1934.

A DISH TO PASS

Northwestern ranks seventh in the nation with a 1.73 assist-to-turnover ratio. The Wildcats have dished out 306 assists while committing only 177 turnovers through their first 17 games. NU's average of 18.0 assists per game ranks 17th nationally and second in the conference. Individually, **Tre Demps** ranks 18th in the nation with a 3.47 assist-to-turnover ratio. **Bryant McIntosh** is averaging 7.2 assists per game to rank eighth in the nation. He has handed out at least eight assists in a game 10 times this season.

MCINTOSH'S HOT START

Bryant McIntosh has enjoyed a tremendous start to his sophomore season. He is the only Big Ten player with multiple 30-point games this season. On Nov. 20, McIntosh tallied 32 points on 11-of-17 shooting (5-of-6 from 3-point range) while dishing out 6 assists in an overtime win over Columbia. McIntosh then established a new career high with 33 points on 11-of-15 shooting to go along with 8 assists in a victory over Loyola (Md.) on Dec. 27. The 33 points are the most in a game by a Northwestern player since Drew Crawford scored 34 at 23rd-ranked Creighton on Dec. 22, 2011.

McIntosh set a career best in assists by posting 11 against Minnesota on Jan. 9.

He also posted 10 assists vs. Sacred Heart on Dec. 21 making him the first NU player in school history with multiple 10+ assist games in the same season.

AS LONG AS IT TAKES

With the Dec. 19 game at DePaul, Northwestern has played six overtime games over the last two seasons. The Wildcats are 3-0 this season in contests that have needed an extra session. On Nov. 20, NU defeated Columbia 83-80 in OT at Welsh-Ryan Arena and topped Virginia Tech 81-79 Dec. 1 in Blacksburg. Northwestern has won its last five overtime games overall.

A LONG (AND SUCCESSFUL) DECEMBER

Northwestern finished the month of December with a perfect 8-0 record. The 'Cats last went undefeated in the month during the 2007-08 season when they won all four of their games. The only other time NU went 8-0 in December was 1968.

LOCKING DOWN ON 'D'

The 35 points allowed by Northwestern against Chicago State on Dec. 13 matched a low for NU during **Chris Collins'** three seasons as head coach and equaled a low for an NU opponent in the last 17 seasons going back to a 68-30 win over Oakland on Nov. 21, 1998. Northwestern has held its opponents to a .387 field goal percentage this season, the 26th best mark in the nation.

20-20-20-20-20 VISION

Northwestern has one of its most balanced offensive attacks in recent history this season. Six different players (**Tre Demps, Aaron Falzon, Scottie Lindsey, Bryant McIntosh, Alex Olah, Dererk Pardon**) have scored 20 or more points in a game. Northern Colorado is the only Division I team with more 20-point scorers (7) than the Wildcats this season.

BOOSTS OFF THE BENCH

Northwestern has had a pair of players post huge performaces off the bench this season. Sophomore **Scottie Lindsey** had the most productive game of his career against New Orleans Nov. 28. Coming off the bench, Lindsey's 26 points topped his previous career best of 12 points that he posted on two occasions as a freshman. His 6-for-7 effort from 3-point range marked the fourth-best performance in school history (min. 5 attempts). The six 3-pointers were the most by a Northwestern player in a game since Alex Marcotullio hit six triples vs. Penn State March 7, 2013. **Dererk Pardon** bested Lindsey by scoring 28 points in a non-starting role in just his second career game at Nebraska on Dec. 30, hitting 11 of 14 field goal attempts.

NOTEWORTHY VICTORY

Northwestern's win over Sacred Heart on Dec. 21 was noteworthy on many levels:

- The 30 assists were the most by the team in a game since it had 30 vs. Mississippi Valley State on Dec. 2, 2011. The total ranks as a tie for the second-best single-game effort in school history.
- The Wildcats' 103 points were their most in a game since a 103-94 double-overtime win over Dartmouth on Dec. 29, 1990 and ranks as a tie for the 10th-best single-game output in school history.
- The team's .610 field goal percentage was its best since shooting 64.6 percent in a win over Georgia Tech on Nov. 30, 2010.

OLAH TABBED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior center **Alex Olah** was honored as the Big Ten Co-Player of the Week on Nov. 16 for his performance in the Wildcats' 79-57 win over UMass Lowell on Nov. 13. Olah posted 21 points and 12 rebounds, marking his ninth career double-double and his third career game with 20+ points and 10+ rebounds. Olah shot 7-of-11 from the field and 7-of-8 from the free throw line. He also had two blocked shots.

FALZON'S DAZZLING DEBUT

Aaron Falzon had a freshman debut like no other in Northwestern history in the Wildcats' win over UMass Lowell Nov. 13. The 20 points scored by Falzon in the contest are the most ever by an NU freshman in his collegiate debut. The previous record was 18 points by Michael Jenkins vs. Illinois Wesleyan on Nov. 30, 1979. Falzon went 8-of-11 from the field in the contest, including going a perfect 6-for-6 with 15 points in the second half. He went 4-for-6 from 3-point range in the win.

POSTSEASON HONOREES RETURN

A trio of Northwestern players picked up postseason honors from the Big Ten Conference. Redshirt junior guard **Tre Demps** was a consensus honorable mention All-Big Ten selection, earning the recognition from both the league's coaches and media. Junior center **Alex Olah** was named an honorable mention pick of the media. Additionally, guard **Bryant McIntosh** earned a selection to the five-member Big Ten All-Freshman Team. McIntosh is the fifth Northwestern player to receive the honor over the last 10 years.

TRIO NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

Redshirt senior **Tre Demps**, senior **Alex Olah** and redshirt junior **Sanjay Lumpkin** are serving as team tri-captains for the 2015-16 season. Demps, a native of Concord, California, has appeared in 117 career games, including making 58 starts. A native of Timisoara, Romania, Olah has started 105 of the 108 contests that he has appeared in during his time at Northwestern. Lumpkin, a native of Wayzata, Minnesota, has seen action in 86 career contests while making 75 starts with the Wildcats.

WILDCATS TAKE EXHIBITION TOUR OF SPAIN

From August 22 through September 1, the Wildcats participated in a foreign tour of Spain. Along the way, the team visited Madrid, Valencia, Alicante and Barcelona. Northwestern posted a 4-1 record in its five games against professional teams.

BLOCK PARTY

Alex Olah already is the top shot blocker in Northwestern history. He currently has 169 career blocks, a mark that ranks second to only Purdue's A.J. Hammons among all current Big Ten players. Olah matched a career high when he blocked six shots in a win over New Orleans on Nov. 28. His 59 blocked shots last season are the most by a Wildcat since blocks became tracked as a statistic in the 1978-79 season. The total bested the 58 blocks he notched during the 2013-14 campaign. As a team, Northwestern swatted 11 shots in a Dec. 5 win over SIU Edwardsville. It was the third-best single-game total in school history and only one shy of the school record.

LAW TO MISS 2015-16 SEASON DUE TO SHOULDER INJURY

Sophomore forward **Vic Law** underwent surgery in November on a torn labrum in his left shoulder and will miss the 2015-16 season. Law appeared in all 32 games, including making 19 starts, as a freshman during the 2014-15 season. He averaged 7.0 points and 4.8 rebounds per game while ranking fifth in the Big Ten in conference play with a .442 3-point field goal percentage.

DEMPS, MCINTOSH PARTICIPATE IN ELITE SUMMER CAMPS

Redshirt senior guard **Tre Demps** and sophomore guard **Bryant McIntosh** both earned invitations to elite summer camps this past August. Demps was one of 20 of the top college players in the nation to take part in the Nike Basketball Academy in California. Meanwhile, McIntosh was one of just four college players invited to NBA MVP Stephen Curry's SC 30 Select Camp that was held in California as well.

NORTHWESTERN SIGNS THREE TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT

Head coach Chris Collins signed three individuals to National Letters of Intent on Nov. 11. The trio will join the Wildcats for the 2016-17 season. Bios on the three signees follow.

HEAD COACH CHRIS COLLINS

43-39 CAREER RECORD (THIRD SEASON)

Chris Collins was named the 24th head men's basketball coach at Northwestern University on March 27, 2013.

Collins' second season with the Wildcats saw the young team continue to improve throughout the season. Despite a stretch of heartbreaking losses, Northwestern showed the resilience to bounce back late in the year to post four straight Big Ten victories and five of six.

Despite being without the services of leading returning scorer JerShon Cobb for a good portion of the season, the 'Cats came together during their late-season surge. Three of the team's top six scorers were true freshmen, including point guard Bryant McIntosh who set the school freshman record with 150 assists to go along with an average of 11.4 points per game en route to being named to the five-member Big Ten All-Freshman Team. Juniors Tre Demps and Alex Olah both earned honorable mention All-Big Ten recognition.



In his first season at the helm, Collins led the Wildcats to an impressive string of road victories. Collins won his debut as a head coach, notching a 72-55 victory over Eastern Illinois Nov. 9. He traversed the 'Cats through a grinding Big Ten schedule, including earning his first conference triumph at home against 23rd-ranked Illinois Jan. 12.

Northwestern's string of road success began Jan. 18 at Indiana before the Wildcats earned a 65-56 win at 14th-ranked Wisconsin. The winning ways continued three days later when the 'Cats notched a one-point win at Minnesota, marking NU's first three-game road winning streak since 1960.

The Wildcats finished the season strong as they defeated Purdue on the road to wrap up the regular season before upsetting sixth-seeded Iowa in the opening round of the Big Ten tourney.

The Wildcats held four of their Big Ten opponents below 30 percent shooting in a game. NU allowed a mere 63.3 points per game in conference play to rank second in the league. Meanwhile, the team's .419 opponents field goal percentage ranked third in the Big Ten.

Collins came to Evanston after serving on the coaching staff at Duke since July 22, 2000. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach in the summer of 2008. During Collins' 13 seasons on the Blue Devils' staff, Duke posted an overall record of 385-77 while recording eight ACC tournament championships, four ACC regular season titles, eight in-season tournament titles and national championships in 2001 and 2010.

Collins worked primarily with backcourt players during his time at Duke and tutored All-Americans Jason Williams, Mike Dunleavy, Chris Duhon, J.J. Redick, Gerald Henderson, DeMarcus Nelson, Jon Scheyer, Nolan Smith and Austin Rivers, in addition to NBA draft picks Daniel Ewing, Kyrie Irving and Kyle Singler.

Before returning to his alma mater, Collins served as an assistant coach at Seton Hall for two years with Tommy Amaker. In 1999-2000, Collins was part of a staff that guided the Pirates to a 22-10 record and the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament. Prior to Seton Hall, Collins spent the 1997-98 season as an assistant with the WNBA's Detroit Shock.

As a player, Collins played professional basketball in Finland during the 1996-97 season, leading the league in scoring.

Collins also served as a court coach and scout for Mike Krzyzewski, assisting the USA Basketball Senior National Team staff with on-court duties as well as game preparation from 2006-12, including during the program's gold-medal performances at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, 2010 FIBA World Championships and 2012 London Olympics. During the summer of 2014, he served as the coach of the USA Select Team which consisted of a group of up-and-coming NBA players who practiced against the USA National Team in preparation for the National Team's participation in the FIBA World Cup.

Collins is the son of former NBA All-Star and coach, Doug Collins, who is currently an NBA television analyst for ESPN. A native of nearby Northbrook, Ill., Collins is a 1996 graduate of Duke with a bachelor's degree in sociology.

Collins and his wife, Kim, have two children: Ryan and Kate.



Game 1 NU 79, UMass Lowell 57 Nov. 13, 2015 • Evanston, Ill.

Alex Olah poured in 21 points and 12 rebounds, Aaron Falzon scored 20 points and Northwestern limited UMass Lowell to 32 percent shooting on the way to a 79-57 victory at Welsh-Ryan Arena. Sanjay Lumpkin matched a career high with 12 rebounds and Bryant McIntosh dished out a game-high eight assists. The Wildcats overcame a slow start, shooting 59 percent in the second half, including 8-of-16 from beyond the arc. After missing their first seven shots of the game, the River Hawks hit six straight field goal attempts and took a 25-16 lead as the 'Cats missed their first 11 3-point attempts. But NU battled back and when McIntosh hit a jumper as the half expired, the 'Cats headed into the break down 34-32. Just before the 18-minute mark, Tre Demps nailed his first 3-pointer of the game, giving the 'Cats a 38-35 lead. They extended their lead to 45-39 behind five quick points from McIntosh and a 3-pointer from Nathan Taphorn. Northwestern's 3-point barrage continued with Falzon's second of the game, then McIntosh and Taphorn knocked down threes on back-to-back plays to stretch Northwestern's lead to 61-50, its first double-digit advantage of the game. Falzon stayed red-hot, hitting a pair of threes, grabbing an offensive rebound for an easy putback layup and assisting on an Olah layup - all within a span of just over three minutes. Northwestern ended on a 24-7 run, scoring from all over the court. The 'Cats finished with a 38-14 advantage on points in the paint but scored more than half its second-half points—24 of 47—on 3-pointers. NU did a good job taking care of the basketball, committing only six turnovers while handing out 18 assists. Falzon's point total was the most ever by a Northwestern freshman in his collegiate debut.

Game 2 NU 79, Fairfield 72 Nov. 18, 2015 • Evanston, Ill.

Bryant McIntosh scored a game-high 20 points, including 14 in the second half, and four Wildcats scored in double figures as Northwestern held off a second-half push by visiting Fairfield to secure a 79-72 victory at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Wildcats jumped out to an early 13-6 lead behind three 3-pointers in as many attempts by freshman Aaron Falzon. The hot start gave Falzon seven consecutive makes from beyond the arch spanning two games. A 3-pointer by McIntosh pushed Northwestern's advantage to 27-14, but Fairfield went on an 8-0 run to cut their deficit to five. The 'Cats eventually took a 39-29 halftime lead as it forced 10 turnovers by the Stags that they converted into 16 points. The Wildcats stretched their lead to as much as 16 when Scottie Lindsey's 3-pointer pushed the score to 57-41 with 13 minutes remaining, but a 17-4 Fairfield run closed the gap to three. The Stags were within three points on four separate occasions, including trailing 68-65 with under three minutes remaining. However, McIntosh hit a jumper in the lane and then converted a three-point play with under a minute left to seal the win for NU. Tre Demps contributed 14 points and Falzon pitched in with 13 for the Wildcats to help them improve to 2-0. In addition to his 20-point performance, McIntosh contributed 5 rebounds, 5 assists and a career-best 4 steals. Northwestern committed only 7 turnovers in the contest while forcing Fairfield into 14 miscues that the 'Cats turned into 23 points.

Game 3 **NU 83, Columbia 80 (OT)** Nov. 20, 2015 • Evanston, Ill.

Sophomore guard Bryant McIntosh scored a career-high 32 points while handing out 6 assists to help lead Northwestern to an 83-80 comeback win in overtime over Columbia at Welsh-Ryan Arena. Tre Demps added 22 points and 6 assists to the Wildcats' charge. The visiting Lions were red-hot from 3-point range to start the game, hitting seven of their first 11 shots from behind the arch. Columbia surged out to a 17-5 lead and the advantage was still 12, 25-13, just beyond the midway point of the opening half. Down 11, Northwestern finally got things going offensively, talling 11 straight points to tie the game but Columbia ended the half on a 9-2 run to take a 35-28 lead at halftime. The Lions seemed to have an answer every time that the 'Cats appeared primed to make a charge. Things didn't look good for NU trailing by eight, 71-63, following a layup by Maodo Lo with 3:39 remaining. However, the hosts weren't wiling to go away. A basket by McIntosh followed by a 3-pointer Aaron Falzon got Northwestern within three with three minutes still remaining. Columbia went back up by six, but a jumper by Tre Demps and a dunk by Gavin Skelly preceded McIntosh's game-tying baseline jumper with 40 seconds remaining to force overtime. In the extra session, a free throw by Falzon with 3:36 to go gave Northwestern its first lead of the game. NU's advantage was 77-76 before Demps nailed a triple to stretch the lead to four with a minute left. Columbia had one last chance after taking a timeout with 2.8 seconds remaining, but Alex Rosenberg wasn't able to get off a potential game-tying 3-point attempt at the buzzer.

Game 4 #9/8 North Carolina 80, NU 69 Nov. 23, 2015 • Kansas City, Mo.

Northwestern gave No. 9/8 North Carolina all it could handle in the first half, but the Wildcats eventually succumbed to the Tar Heels, 80-69, at the CBE Hall of Fame Classic at Sprint Center. Tre Demps led NU with 21 points, while Bryant McIntosh dished out a career-high nine assists. The Wildcats got off to a good start offensively as they hit four of their first five field goal attempts and trailed only by a point, 9-8, three minutes into the contest. A 9-0 run by the Tar Heels extended their lead to 10, but three consecutive 3-pointers by Scottie Lindsey, Aaron Falzon and Demps got NU within one, 18-17. The Wildcats eventually tied the game at the 7:08 mark when Alex Olah hit a hook in the lane and was fouled. His free throw knotted the score at 27-27. Lindsey, who scored 9 first-half points off the bench, gave Northwestern its first lead of the game when he followed by drilling his second triple of the half. When Lindsey later converted a three-point play, the Wildcats increased their advantage to 35-29 with four minutes left in the half. However, the Tar Heels ended the stanza on a 14-1 run to take a 43-36 lead at the break. After being limited to 3 points in the first half, Demps caught fire early in the second stanza to keep the Wildcats in the game. He scored 10 points in the first 2:35 of the half as Northwestern closed to within 48-46. UNC would gain some cushion with a 12-2 run that extended its lead to 60-48 with 13 minutes remaining. The Tar Heels' lead eventually grew to 20 before the Wildcats attempted to mount a comeback. McIntosh's three-point play with 6:24 to go got NU within 71-58. A 3-pointer by Demps made it 75-64 with 3:39 remaining, but the 'Cats were unable to get closer than nine the rest of the way.

Game 5 NU 67, Missouri 62 Nov. 24, 2015 • Kansas City, Mo.

Northwestern put together a stellar first half and then held on late to defeat Missouri 67-62 at the CBE Hall of Fame Classic at Sprint Center. Bryant McIntosh and Tre Demps led the Wildcats with 13 points apiece, while Scottie Lindsey dished out a career-high 7 assists. McIntosh came out on fire as he scored each of Northwestern's first 11 points, including drilling each of his first three 3-point attempts in helping the Wildcats jump out to an 18-7 lead eight minutes into the contest. NU didn't let up, though. Jordan Ash, Aaron Falzon and Sanjay Lumpkin each knocked down triples of their own as the lead grew to 31-11 thanks to a 22-4 run. The Wildcats would eventually take a 38-24 halftime lead. Missouri continued to cut into the lead early in the second half as it scored the first five points of the period to trim the Northwestern lead to nine, 38-29. The 'Cats continued to shoot the ball well from 3-point range as triples by Lumpkin and Lindsey made it 44-31. The Tigers continued to battle back, however, closing to within six points on two free throws by Jakeenan Grant with 9:56 remaining. The lead was still six with just over eight minutes left when Demps completed a three-point play to extend the lead to nine. Missouri continued to chip away, getting within 60-55 on a three-point play by Terrence Phillips with 5:32 left. NU was up four when Lumpkin and Olah each hit one of two from the charity stripe before Olah hit a pair to put the 'Cats up 65-57 with 2:07 remaining. But again, Missouri charged back and had a chance to make it a two-point game with 33.6 seconds remaining. Kevin Puryear could only make one of two from the free throw line and Northwestern sealed the game from the line at the other end.

Game 6 NU 90, New Orleans 63 Nov. 28, 2015 • Evanston, Ill.

Scottie Lindsey scored a career-high 26 points to help lead Northwestern to a 90-63 win over New Orleans at Welsh-Ryan Arena. Lindsey shot 75 percent from the field (9 of 12), including making 6-of-7 shots from 3-point range. Four Wildcats scored in double figures, as Lindsey was joined by Tre Demps (16), Bryant McIntosh (13) and Gavin Skelly (10). Chicago's Big Ten Team shot 55.2 percent from the field, 46.2 percent from 3-point range and made 14 of 15 from the free throw line in the team's best offensive performance of the season to date. McIntosh dished out seven assists, while Demps added five. Skelly and center Alex Olah each grabbed eight rebounds, and Olah matched a career high by blocking six shots. Northwestern led for all but 32 seconds of the game. The Wildcats came out firing on all cylinders in the first half, scoring 48 points while shooting over 58 percent from the floor. Northwestern shot 58 percent from beyond the arch as well, with four different players knocking down triples in the half. Demps scored the first 10 Northwestern points of the game on 4-of-4 shooting and poured in 14 total first-half points. Northwestern grabbed a double-digit lead less than eight minutes into the game and continued to extend it, building up a 23-point advantage at halftime. The 'Cats used a 13-0 run midway through the half to grab control. New Orleans led only once, a 2-0 lead in the first minute of the game. The Wildcats continued to build on their lead, stretching it out to 33 late in the second half, the largest lead of the game before finishing it off to improve to 4-0 at Welsh-Ryan Arena this season. Northwestern dominated on the glass, out-rebounding New Orleans by a 40-24 margin.

Game 7 NU 81, Virginia Tech 79 (OT) Dec. 1, 2015 • Blacksburg, Va.

Bryant McIntosh scored 19 points, including hitting a game-winning layup in overtime, and four Wildcats scored in double figures as Northwestern came away with a hard-fought 81-79 victory at Virginia Tech in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. Tre Demps added 17 points while Sanjay Lumpkin and Nathan Taphorn contributed a season-highs of 12 and 11 points, respectively. Demps had the hot hand early for the Wildcats, scoring the team's first nine points. NU surged out to an early nine-point lead, but the Hokies hung around and closed to within four on numerous occasions. Two free throws by Gavin Skelly gave Northwestern its largest lead of the half, 40-30, with 3:23 to go in the opening stanza. As time expired on the first half, Alex Olah banked in a 3-pointer from the top of the arch, sending the 'Cats into halftime with a 45-36 lead. The Hokies rallied back and tied the score at 58 with 8:45 left on a tip-in by Satchel Pierce, but Taphorn immediately responded with his third 3-pointer to put Northwestern back on top. A triple by McIntosh with 3:19 left put the Wildcats up by six, but Virginia Tech rallied back to tie the game. Demps had a chance to win the game at the end of regulation, but his runner in the lane was off the mark and the teams went into overtime tied 73-73. The Hokies opened overtime with a four-point run, but Lumpkin and McIntosh hit 3-pointers on back-to-back possessions to regain the lead. Then, with the score tied at 79, McIntosh drove in finished a contested layup with 27.4 seconds remaining, which proved to be the game-winner. Virginia Tech had one last chance, but following a scramble, Chris Clarke's rushed baseline jumper was off the mark.

Game 8 NU 81, SIU Edwardsville 56 Dec. 5, 2015 • Evanston, Ill.

Alex Olah scored 21 points and grabbed eight rebounds, Aaron Falzon added 17 points and Northwestern outrebounded SIU Edwardsville 45-31 on the way to an 81-56 win at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The 'Cats nearly doubled up SIUE on points in the paint with a 40-22 advantage. NU finished with 11 blocked shots in the contest—one shy of the team single-game record—with Joey van Zegeren leading the way with five. Though the 'Cats missed their first six 3-point attempts, they led 18-13 with eight minutes left in the half. Eleven of those points came from Olah, who also added two first-half blocks. Falzon capped an 8-2 run with Northwestern's first triple of the game, extending the advantage to 29-15 with 4:25 remaining in the first half. However, the Cougars crept back within seven before eventually trailing 35-26 at the intermission. Consecutive 3-pointers by Falzon to open the second half helped the Wildcats extend their lead to a comfortable margin. SIUE hung around and was within 12 with 12:30 to go, but triples by Nathan Taphorn and Tre Demps ignited an 18-6 surge by the Wildcats over a seven and a half minute span that extended the advantage to 24 and put the game out of reach. Northwestern converted on 18 of its 27 second-half field goals (66.7 percent) to help it pull away. The Wildcats assisted on 24 of their 30 field goals in the contest paced by eight from Bryant McIntosh, while Demps matched a career high with seven assists. Sanjay Lumpkin led Northwestern's dominating edge on the boards by pulling down a game-high nine rebounds.

Game 9 NU 77, Chicago State 35 Dec. 13, 2015 • Evanston, Ill.

Tre Demps matched a career high with 23 points and established new bests with nine rebounds and five 3-pointers as Northwestern rolled to a 77-35 victory over Chicago State at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Wildcats held the Cougars to 25 percent shooting from the field, including 1-of-19 from 3-point range. Meanwhile, Northwestern knocked down a season-high 15 triples in the contest. Playing their first game in eight days, the Wildcats got off to a slow start and held a slim 16-13 lead with eight minutes left in the first half. However, NU kicked things into gear and finished the half on a 15-2 run to lead 31-15 at the break. Demps finished the opening 20 minutes of play with 13 points and six rebounds. The intermission didn't do anything to slow the Wildcats down as they opened the second half by scoring 25 of the first 31 points, making it a 40-8 run spanning both halves. Northwestern would knock down 10 triples and shoot 60 percent following halftime as it pulled away for the easy win. Nathan Taphorn connected on a trio of 3-pointers in matching a season high with 11 points. The Wildcats assisted on 24 of their 30 made field goals with Bryant McIntosh leading the way with six helpers. Chicago State entered the game 10th in the nation forcing 18.2 turnovers per game, but NU coughed the ball up only eight times in the contest. The Cougars' 35 points matched a low for a Northwestern opponent under head coach Chris Collins and equaled the low for an NU foe in 17 years. The Wildcats posted a 15-2 edge in fastbreak points.

Game 10 NU 78, Mississippi Valley State 48 Dec. 15, 2015 • Evanston, Ill.

Alex Olah scored a game-high 21 points and grabbed 11 rebounds for his 10th career double-double, and Northwestern picked up its ninth win of the season, beating Mississippi Valley State, 78-48, at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Wildcats' 9-1 start matches the best 10-game stretch to open a season since 2011-12. Northwestern went to Olah early and often as the senior center scored 11 of the Wildcats' first 15 points. He shot 8-11 over the course of the game, including making all six of his first-half shots. Olah was joined in double figures by Bryant McIntosh (14), Tre Demps (13) and Aaron Falzon (12). McIntosh handed out eight assists to go along with four rebounds and two steals. Falzon hit four of Northwestern's seven three-pointers. Northwestern really asserted itself in the second half, outscoring Mississippi Valley State, 41-21 and proving especially dominant in the paint using a 36-22 advantage to build a comfortable lead in the second half. Chicago's Big Ten Team led by 10 at halftime despite shooting 48 percent and holding the Delta Devils to just 28 percent from the field. Mississippi Valley State put up 39 shots compared to only 25 from Northwestern in the first 20 minutes. Defense remained crucial for the Wildcats, as they held the Delta Devils to just 29 percent shooting for the game. Northwestern has held five of its first 10 opponents to under 30 percent from the field. A 28-5 run midway through the second half allowed the Wildcats to extend the lead to a game-high 30 and pull away from the Delta Devils for good. Northwestern pulled down 53 rebounds in the contest, their highest single-game total in 17 years. After turning the ball over nine times in the first half, the Wildcats coughed it up only two times following the intermission while assisting on 21 of their 26 field goals in the contest.

Game 11 NU 78, DePaul 70 (OT) Dec. 19, 2015 • Rosemont, Ill.

Aaron Falzon hit a pair of clutch 3-pointers in overtime as Northwestern improved to 3-0 in OT games this season with a 78-70 win over DePaul at Allstate Arena. Falzon was 0-of-6 from the field and 3-point range in the contest, but his triple with 3:33 remaining in the extra session gave NU the lead for good. His connected a second time from behind the arch with 38 seconds left to push the lead from five to eight and seal the victory. The 'Cats came into the game averaging 10.1 3-pointers per game but had hit on only four of their 25 attempts prior to Falzon's clutch baskets. Tre Demps led Northwestern with 18 points, 7 rebounds and 4 assists. Sanjay Lumpkin contributed 14 points and 7 rebounds apiece. Lumpkin scored the Wildcats' first seven points of the game but no one else on the team was able to get things going in the first half. DePaul led by as many as five in the opening stanza before taking a 30-29 lead at the break. The Blue Demons' advantage eventually grew to seven, 43-36, just over four minutes in to the second half. Demos led the NU comeback, scoring 13 points in the second period after posting only two in the first. The 'Cats were down six until Demps hit a big 3-pointer with 4:21 to cut the deficit in half. Northwestern still trailed by three with a minute and a half left before McIntosh scored on a layup and Lumpkin hit one of two from the free throw line with 47.4 seconds left to tie the game. The 'Cats had a chance to win it at the end of regulation, but jumpers by Scottie Lindsey and Demps were off the mark. However, Falzon's timely baskets in overtime helped Northwestern improve to 10-1.

Game 12 NU 103, Sacred Heart 67 Dec. 21, 2015 • Evanston, Ill.

Alex Olah scored a team-high 21 points and surpassed 1,000 for his career as Northwestern rolled to a 103-67 victory over Sacred Heart at Welsh-Ryan Arena. Tre Demps contributed 17 points while Bryant McIntosh posted a career-high 10 assists. The Wildcats' point total was their highest in a game in 25 years while their .610 field goal percentage was a season high. Meanwhile, the team's 15 3-point field goals matched a season high. Northwestern held a slim 18-15 lead eight minutes into the contest when it finally got things going on the offensive end. A 13-2 run over an eight-minute span extended the advantage to 34-17 with just under five minutes to go in the opening stanza. The Wildcats would eventually take a 48-32 halftime lead following McIntosh's buzzer-beating 3-pointer. Sacred Heart managed to hang around, trailing by 14-55-41-three minutes into the second half. However, Northwestern's offense exploded as it went on a 23-5 run over a seven-minute span to extend the lead to 32. The 'Cats eventually surpassed 100 points for the second time in head coach Chris Collins' three seasons when Jordan Ash hit a 3-pointer with 2:23 remaining. Northwestern assisted on 30 of its 36 field goals in the contest and posted a 40-4 advantage in bench points. Five different NU players scored in double figures while two others finished with nine. Northwestern connected on 21 of its 32 field goal attempts in the second half (65.6 percent) as it scored 55 points following the intermission.

Northwestern shook off a slow start to wrap up the nonconference portion of its season with a victory as it defeated Loyola (Md.) 74-59 at Welsh-Ryan Arena. Playing without the services of senior center Alex Olah, the Wildcats got off to a slow start. The Greyhounds scored the first nine points of the game and were ahead 20-6 with under seven minutes remaining in the opening half. Bryant McIntosh kept Northwestern in the game as he scored 12 first-half points, but the Wildcats trailed 33-22 at the intermission as the team connected on only seven of its 20 field goal attempts over the opening 20 minutes of play. The deficit was 12 with 17 minutes remaining when the Wildcats finally were able to get things going. A second consecutive basket by freshman Dererk Pardon—who was appearing in his first collegiate game—got an 18-4 run started. Pardon's third basket of the half cut the deficit to three before fellow freshman Aaron Falzon tied the game, 42-42, with a 3-pointer with 13:08 remaining. Northwestern's advantage was one, 49-48, with under 10 minutes left when back-to-back triples by Scottie Lindsey and McIntosh gave the hosts some breathing room. The duo followd with consecutive layups to extend the cushion to 11, 59-48, with seven minutes to go and Northwestern never led by less than nine the rest of the way. McIntosh finished with a career-high 33 points to go along with 8 assists to pace the Wildcats. Lindsey contributed 14 points off the bench and NU shot 65.6 percent (21-32) from the field in the second half en route to tallying 52 points following the break. After missing their first six 3-point attempts in the contest, the 'Cats connected on eight of final 11 tries from behind the arch.

NU 81, Nebraska 72 Dec. 30, 2015 • Lincoln, Neb.

Northwestern earned its second double-digit winning streak in school history as it rallied back in the second half for an 81-72 victory at Nebraska in the Big Ten opener for both teams. The Wildcats trailed by as many as 12 points in the second half but surged back for the victory behind a 28-point, 12-rebound performance from freshman Dererk Pardon who was appearing in just his second collegiate game. The Wildcats trailed by as many as six in the first half before freshman Aaron Falzon led the visitors back as he hit three consecutive 3-pointers, the last of which put NU in front 26-22 with just under eight minutes left in the first half. Northwestern lead 35-30 with 2:46 to go following a triple by Tre Demps, but Nebraska scored the final eight points of the stanza to take a three-point lead at the break. The Cornhuskers knocked down seven 3-pointers over the opening 20 minutes of play, surpassing their season average for a game. Nebraska's lead grew to 12 points, 51-39, 2:17 into the second half before the Wildcats rallied back. NU chipped away and eventually tied the game, 60-60, on a Scottie Lindsey 3-pointer with 7:09 to go. Nebraska was up by three when Bryant McIntosh connected on a jumper and then Pardon followed with a putback slam that put Northwestern in front for good with 4:03 left. The lead was three when Pardon connected on a pair of free throws with 1:33 remaining. The Huskers hit one of two from the charity stripe on the other end before Pardon scored with a minute left to extend the lead to six and help seal the win. Pardon totaled 23 points and 11 rebounds after halftime and connected

Bryant McIntosh posted 17 points, 9 assists, 5 rebounds and 3 steals, but Northwestern couldn't overcome a cold shooting performance from 3-point range in dropping their Big Ten home opener to fourth-ranked Maryland 72-59 at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Wildcats came into the game averaging 10.0 3-point field goals per contest, but connected on only two of their 20 attempts against the Terrapins. Uncharacteristic turnovers early in the contest allowed Maryland to jump out to an early advantage. Northwestern was within 17-11 just beyond the midway point of the opening half when the visitors went on a run to open up a big lead. A 21-5 surge by the Terrapins expanded their advantage to 22 points before eventually taking a 40-20 halftime lead. The Wildcats shot only 32 percent from the field over the opening 20 minutes of play and committed eight turnovers to only one for Maryland. Northwestern was much more effective following the intermission and appeared primed to make a charge on multiple occasions. The Wildcats got to within 14 on three occasions with plenty of time remaining, but each time a 3-pointer by the Terrapins helped quell the Northwestern surge and silence the large contingent in attendance. All-America candidate Melo Trimble posted 24 points, 8 assists and 8 rebounds to pace Maryland while Rasheed Sulaimon contributed 16 points, 6 assists and 6 rebounds. Northwestern managed to post a convincing 38-24 edge in points in the paint paced by centers Joey van Zegeren and Dererk Pardon who posted 8 points apiece.

GAME RECAPS AND BOX SCORES

Game 16 Ohio State 65, NU 56 Jan. 6, 2016 • Evanston, Ill.

Bryant McIntosh scored 15 points and Dererk Pardon pulled down 14 rebounds but Northwestern succumbed to a late Ohio State run in falling 65-56 at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The Wildcats trailed 51-50 following a 3-pointer by Aaron Falzon with 6:03 remaining, but the Buckeyes responded with a 14-3 run over the next four minutes to pull away. Four days after a cold shooting performance from 3-point range against Maryland (2 for 20), NU continued to struggle from behind the arch against Ohio State. Northwestern missed its first 11 3-point attempts during the first half vs. OSU. Despite the struggles, the 'Cats were in front 10-6 following a layup by Tre Demps six and a half minutes into the contest. With the game tied 17-17 with six minutes to go in the half, Ohio State rattled off nine straight points to go up 26-17 with four minutes remaining. A pair of buckets by Gavin Skelly helped spark a Northwestern comeback. A triple by Demps finally got the lid off for NU before Nathan Taphorn drilled a 3-pointer out of the corner in the closing seconds of the first half as the Wildcats closed the stanza on a 10-0 run to take a 27-26 lead at the break. The second period started well for Northwestern when Joey van Zegeren converted a three-point play to push the lead to four. The teams would battle back and forth throughout the majority of the stanza. Ohio State was up by three when McIntosh drilled a 3-pointer from the top of the key to tie the game for the 11th time, 44-44, with 9:10 left. The Buckeyes went up by five following Kam Williams' fifth triple of the game with 7:25 remaining, but NU got it to one on Falzon's trey with 6:03 left, but the Buckeyes made the key plays down the stretch to earn the victory.

Game 17 NU 77, Minnesota 52 Jan. 9, 2016 • Minneapolis, Minn.

Freshman Aaron Falzon matched a career high by scoring 20 points, including hitting six 3-pointers, as Northwestern rolled to a 77-52 road win over Minnesota at Williams Arena. Bryant McIntosh dished out a career-best 11 assists and the 25-point margin of victory was the Wildcats highest in a Big Ten road game since a 77-20 win at Chicago on Jan. 14, 1944. Trailing 9-5 early on, the 'Cats got things going behind Falzon as he hit a trio of triple during a 15-2 run that put the visitors in front 20-11. The Northwestern lead grew to as many as 11, 29-18, before Minnesota got back within striking distance at 32-26 at halftime. After Joey van Zegeren closed the Wildcats' first-half scoring with a pair of dunks, he started the second stanza with two more before a jumper by Falzon forced the Golden Gophers to burn an early timeout. Falzon hit his fifth triple of the game to stretch the lead to 15 before Nate Mason hit a pair of 3-pointers to get Minnesota back within nine. However, Falzon answered by draining his sixth trey and Northwestern led by double figures the rest of the way. Minnesota was still in contention trailing by 13, but a 14-5 Northwestern run increased the advantage to 60-38 with just over eight minutes remaining and the 'Cats cruised the rest of the way. NU shot 65.2 percent (15-23) from the field in the second half as it out-scored Minnesota 45-26. The victory margin was Northwestern best in a Big Ten game since a 78-47 win over Ohio State on Jan. 25, 1997. The win improved the Wildcats to 4-0 in true road games for the first time since the 1930-31 campaign.




