### THE MATCHUP

Northwestern Oklahoma State hits the road the first time in the 2013 season when it travels to Searcy, Ark. to meet Harding in Great American Conference action. It's the first of a busy travel stretch that has the Rangers (0-1, 0-1 GAC) playing four of the next six away from Alva. Northwestern saw its four-game winning streak come to an end with a 38-10 setback against Arkansas Tech in week one.

.. Saturday's contest marks the home opener for Harding (0-1, 0-1 GAC). The Bisons - coming off a trip to the NCAA Playoffs last year - ended a brief stay in the national rankings with last weekend's upset loss at Southwestern Oklahoma State.

### RANGER STORYLINES

- The Rangers (1-5 on the road in 2012) captured last year's season finale at Arkansas-Monticello but have lost 11 of their last 13 away games, dating back to the end of the 2011 season.
- This is the Rangers' second official GAC football contest. As a Year Two Candidate, they're now eligible for regular season titles in all sports and postseason bowl games (excluding the NCAA playoffs).
- Redshirt freshman quarterback Reid Miller plays his first road game, but it's not his first road trip. Coach Alan Hall placed Miller on the travel squad in 2012, hoping to get him an early feel for the travel routine.
- Youth is served. 52 of the 99 players on the active roster are redshirt or true freshmen. Six of them are projected starters.
- Northwestern is 10-2 in opening coin flips in just over a season under Hall (1-0 in 2013). Interestingly, they're 2-0 in games where they lose the toss and 2-8 when they win it.

**THE NCAA TRANSITION**

In July of 2013, the NCAA promoted Northwestern Oklahoma State to Year Two Candidacy - the second in a three-step transition process from NAIA to NCAA Division II. Northwestern is targeting full membership in time for the 2015 football season.

The transition began in the summer of 2012 with Northwestern's formal acceptance into the membership cycle. Invitation in hand, the school severed ties with the Sooner Athletic Conference and the Central States Football League to join the Great American Conference as a provisional member.

As a Y2C, the Rangers are now eligible for GAC regular season titles in all sports. They are also be eligible for postseason football bowl games played outside of the NCAA playoff structure.

**LAST WEEK: Tech 38, Northwestern 10**

The Rangers avoided many of the mistakes typical of a young team in the early stages of the year, committing just six penalties, while lasting the entire night without a turnover. But positive, momentum-swinging plays also alluded them. Northwestern managed just 94 total yards in the second half and went scoreless over the final 43 minutes of the game.

Redshirt freshman Reid Miller led a field goal drive on the Rangers' second possession of the night and also scored on a 26-yard run early the second quarter to pull them to within 14-10. For Miller, who showed flashes of potential in his first-career start, that was the high point. He finished the night 11-of-33 passing for 90 yards and was sacked four times by the Wonderboy defense.

Tech punted on its first two drives but wouldn't need to again until the fourth quarter. By then, the margin had widened considerably, thanks to five touchdowns and a field goal in a span of seven possessions. The lone stop came on a missed 31-yard field goal early in the third. With 303 passing yards, Tech became just the second team to break the 300-yard barrier against Northwestern in 12 games under Alan Hall.

Northwestern (0-1, 0-1 GAC) totaled 214 yards on 67 plays and saw its four-game winning streak snapped. The Rangers have now dropped four-straight season openers.

Miller rushed for a team-high 46 yards. Javari Liggins rushed for 35 yards to go with 28 from Zachry Doyle and 32 from Jarion Tudman.

Jeremi Anderson led the receiving core with five catches – one short of his career high. Cameron Allen and Davontaa Bryant had two receptions each.

The Ranger defense keyed up three sacks – more than it had in any one game in 2012. Rontez Smith posted a game-high 11 tackles, and sophomore transfer Alex Hemberger had a solid Ranger debut with nine total stops.

**A LOOK BACK AT 2012**

With a young roster making the transition to NCAA Division II football under a new coach, the 2012 season presented some significant road blocks for Northwestern, which opened the year winless in its first seven starts. Head Coach Alan Hall prefers to focus in on the final four games, when things finally began to click, resulting in four-straight victories to close out the season.

Senior quarterback **Kyle Jech** finished out a record-smashing career by setting new single-season marks for passing attempts (433), completions (250) and yards (2,646), despite not having a single receiver with more than 500 yards.

With four freshmen and a sophomore starting on the offensive line, rushing yardage was hard to come by early in the year. In week two, Jech put the ball in the air 69 times, keeping the Rangers in the hunt against #4 CSU-Pueblo.

The youthful Rangers played five of their first games on the road, including a trip to the Alamo Dome to meet Division I UT-San Antonio. By the time the schedule flipped in their favor late in the year, a few things had begun to change. A rapidly-improving offensive line started to establish itself, opening up holes for the ground game. The defense - which had allowed 40 or more points in six straight games to start the year, pinned the opposition to 35 or less in each of the last contests.

Northwestern gained its first Division II win against Panhandle State in week eight, kicking off its late-season surge. Two weeks later, they knocked off their first Great American Conference foe, coming from 14 points down in the final quarter to beat Southern Nazarene. In the finale, the Rangers notched their first road win under Hall, with **Javari Liggins** (200 yards) and **Zachry Doyle** (112) each rushing for 100+ yards.

**SATURDAY'S STAKES:**

**A Ranger victory would...**

- ... improve Northwestern to 1-1 on the season and 1-1 in GAC play.
- ... be Northwestern's first official GAC win (2012 games did not count in the conference standings).
- ... bump their two-year record to 3-5 against GAC schools
- ... give them two-straight wins on the road for the first time since Oct. 2010 when they put together four in a row.
- ... snap a three-game losing streak in road openers.
- ... end a five-game September losing skid.

**A Ranger defeat would...**

- ... drop Northwestern to 0-2 on the season and 0-2 in GAC play.
- ... be Northwestern's first official GAC loss (2012 games did not count in the conference standings).
- ... be their third-straight loss to Harding and sink them to 2-5 all-time vs. the Bisons
- ... make them 0-2 for the fourth-straight year (Northwestern's last 2-0 start came in 2004).
- ... be less good than a win.

**RANGER NOTES:**

**MAN ON THE RUN:**

Not all running quarterbacks are created equal. Some run to throw, using their legs to escape pressure and extend plays until a receiver can pop open. Others serve as glorified running backs. Redshirt freshman Reid Miller showed a little of both last Thursday. He took four sacks in his debut but on several occasions kept himself upright with some fancy footwork. Miller's 26-yard touchdown run in the second quarter was the longest rush by a Ranger QB since the 2009 opener when then-freshman Kyle Jech (also making his first start) scored from 38 yards out.

**GOTTA HAND IT TO THEM:**

Northwestern has turned it over just five times in its last five games, dating back to last season. Not surprisingly, the Rangers are 4-1 over that stretch. Smart decisions by Ranger QBs have helped. Steady hands from the tailbacks have also played a big part. Northwestern running backs has gone just over seven games (29 quarters) without losing a fumble - a streak that spans 188 consecutive carries.

**A FEW MORE THROW-INS:**

- Last Thursday's opener snapped a streak of five-straight games in which the Rangers had thrown for at least one touchdown...
- Jeremi Anderson's five receptions tied his career-high set in week two of last season against Pueblo.
- Miller attempted 33 passes last week, the 10th time in 12 games under Alan Hall that the Rangers have put the ball in the air at least 30 times..... They hit 30 attempts only 16 times in 54 games during former head coach Keith Barefield's five-year tenure.

**FIRST-THINGS BURST:**

The Rangers have discovered the benefits of being the early bird. They've scored first in four-straight games. Opponents drew first-blood in each of the first eight games in 2012.

**THIRD IS THE NEW FIRST:**

A big reason for Northwestern and Harding's week one losses - neither could get the opposing offense off the field. Tech converted 11-of-17 third-downs against the Rangers (64.7 percent), while Southwestern cashed in on 10-of-16 third-down opportunities (62.5 percent).

**TIME, WHY YOU PUNISH ME?**

Northwestern's 24 minutes, 51 seconds of possession times was their lowest total since a playoff trip to Sioux Falls in Nov. 2010, when they held the ball for 24:36.

**RANGERS AMONG THE GAC LEADERS:**

- Rontez Smith (11 tackles) sits second on the GAC tackle chart, one behind Harding's Philip Mion (12). Alex Hemberger (9) is seventh...
- Jeremy Gutierrez, Donavon Guidry and Kevin Price all logged a sack last week and are part of an 11-way tie for the conference lead..
- Traveon Kelly ranks fourth in the GAC in punt return average (9.0 yard average on two returns)...
- Punter Alex Dorrell is eighth on this distance list (34.3 yards per punt)...
- Kevin Ditch is one of four GAC place kickers still perfect on the year. He made his only attempt (a 25-yarder) on the Rangers' opening drive. Ditch is one of just five kickers who have yet to miss a PAT (he's 1-for-1)...
- Northwestern finished in the top half of the GAC in kick return average last year (18.9 yards per return) and seems poised to improve on those numbers. The Rangers averaged 23.7 yards on their six returns against Tech, good for fourth.

Harding broke open a tight game with a pair of late scores. Future Ranger head coach Tim Albin led the way with three catches for 35 yards and a touchdown. Both teams passed for only 108 yards, while Harding out-rushed the Rangers 230-110. The Bisons turned it over twice on interceptions, but Northwestern's three fumbles offset them.

The Bisons opened the game with a 13-play drive, with quarterback Greg Cox and running back Chris Hill alternating carries out of the option. Harding shifted to the wishbone to finish the drive, a four-yard Hill plunge for a 7-0 lead.

Northwestern fumbled on the first play of their first and third drives and managed just five offensive snaps in the opening quarter. The second of those turnovers helped set the Bisons up with a field goal and a 10-0 lead, which they would carry all the way into the half.

The Rangers finally put together some offense early in the third with a lengthy touchdown drive. 11 of the 13 plays were runs, though a pair of Thad Dilbeck completions to Janson Robinson provided the big yardage. Dilbeck's two-yard run and a PAT made it a 10-7 game with 7:06 to go in the third.

Cox completed three long passes - two of them to Mike Alexander - for 66 yards to lead Harding to a TD of their own on the ensuing possession.

Northwestern answered another 11-play march, converting on fourth-and-short to keep the drive alive at the Harding 11. One play later, Dilbeck found Albin for a 12-yard score, cutting the lead to 17-14 with 13:57 to play in the game.

One more costly mistake doomed the Rangers. They fumbled a Bison punt, setting up Harding with

For the fourth time in five meetings, the outcome was decided by less than a touchdown. The 1977 meeting remains the lowest-scoring in the history of the series. Northwestern would bounce back to win three of its next four but finished winless in Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference play. Head coach Glen Wolfe was replaced a few months later by Bill Massey.

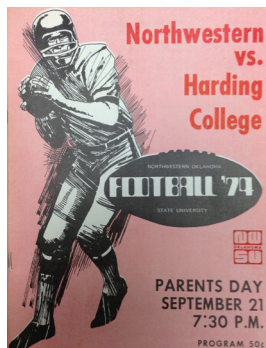

They won seven games in '74 to match - at the time - the school record for victories in a season.

**HEAD COACH ALAN HALL**



Alan Hall was introduced as head coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State University on Dec. 1, 2011 and is preparing for his second season.

Under Hall's guidance, Northwestern tackled the first year of a transition from NAIA to NCAA Division II in 2012, finishing 4-7. The Rangers played some of their best football late in the year, ending on a four-game winning streak.

Regarded as one of the bright young offensive minds in the game of football, Hall's spread offense spared no time rewriting portions of the Northwestern record book, taking down the school's single-season marks for most completions (250), attempts (433) and passing yards (2,646 yards). Ranger QB's combined for just four interceptions.

The 16-year coaching veteran owns a National Championship ring from his playing days at the University of Miami. He was a backup to Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Gino Torrett during the 1990 season.

Hall resides in Alva with his wife and two children.
