On August 3, the Great American Conference announced the results of its 2021 football preseason coaches' poll. Ouachita edged out Harding for the top spot.

In 2019, the Tigers won their third-straight GAC regular season title with a second consecutive undefeated regular season. They enter 2021 with a 27-game conference game win streak and they have qualified for the previous three NCAA playoffs. They received seven first-place votes.

Harding collected four first-place votes. The 2019 Bisons defense led the GAC in points allowed, yards allowed and sacks in reaching the NCAA playoffs for the fourth-straight season. Cole Chancey, a 2019 Harlon Hill finalist, set the league's single-season record for rushing yards with 1,375.

Henderson State claimed the final first-place vote and placed third in the balloting. The Reddies earned a berth to the 2019 Live United Bowl. L'liott Curry tallied 84 catches, 1,167 yards and 14 touchdowns, marks that all ranked in the top five single-season totals in league history.

Oklahoma Baptist took fourth. In 2019, the Bison offense led the league in scoring, total offense, passing offense and first downs per game. Preston Haire led the league with 3,041 passing yards and 26 touchdown passes. Tyler Stuever's 18 total touchdowns ranked second while Joshua Cornell finished second to Curry with 1,054 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns.

Southern Arkansas placed fifth in the poll, followed by East Central. The Muleriders feature a new head coach as Mike McCarty takes over for the retired Bill Keopple. He inherits quarterback Hayden Mallory who threw 20 touchdown passes in 2019. The Tigers' Mookie Douglas ran for 1,144 yards and scored 18 touchdowns. Quarterback Kenny Hrcir threw for 1,876 yards and ran for 630.

Arkansas-Monticello, Arkansas Tech and Northwestern Oklahoma State garnered the next three positions. The Weevils feature 2019 Freshman of the Year Demilon Brown. He threw for 1,057 yards, ran for 803 and accounted for 14 touchdowns. Devontae Dean, the team's top running back, as well as their top two receivers – C.J. Parham and DeAndre Washington, all return. Caleb Batie led the Wonder Boys in rushing with 620 yards and five touchdowns. The Rangers' Gavin Garner led the team with 37 receptions and 620 yards.

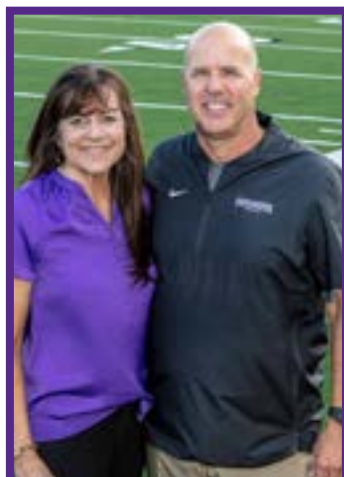
Southwestern Oklahoma State, Southeastern Oklahoma State and Southern Nazarene rounded out the poll. The Savage Storm's Katrell Blakely and Braxton Kincade combined for 101 receptions and almost 1,300 yards. SWOSU's Justin Bailey averaged 18.7 yards per reception. After almost 20 months as head coach, Dustin Hada will finally get the chance to lead the Crimson Storm into competition. Gage Porter threw for 996 yards and ran for 751. He accounted for 12 touchdowns.



THE TIGERS

TODD KNIGHT

HEAD COACH | 22ND SEASON



After 21 seasons - and 22 years - as head coach at Ouachita, Todd Knight is the longest-standing college head football coach in Arkansas. A proven leader, he guides the Ouachita football program with integrity and passion. In the 2019 season, Coach Knight took the Tigers to the Division II playoffs after leading them to an undefeated regular season at 11-0. The 2019 season was Ouachita's third undefeated regular season and the third straight GAC Championship. The Tigers hosted a DII playoff game for the third time since 2014.

In the conference's inaugural 2011 campaign, Knight led the Tigers to the Great American Conference championship, Ouachita's first conference title in over 25 years. The Tigers claimed the conference crown again in 2014, 2017, 2018 and 2019. Knight was named GAC Coach of the Year in all five championship seasons. He was also named Region three Coach of the year in 2014, 2018 and 2019.

Knight has established Ouachita as an elite program among all Division II institutions. He boasts five Great American Conference Championships and 132 All-Great American Conference players in just nine years. The Ouachita football program is the only college football program in the state of Arkansas with twelve consecutive winning seasons, cracking the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Top 25 in ten of those twelve seasons. The Tigers would finish fourteenth in the final Division II AFCA Coaches top 25 poll in 2019.

Knight leads in all aspects of life; his players have been recognized for outstanding achievements on the field, in the classroom and in the community. He has recruited and coached six professional football players, 210 All-Conference players, 29 All-Americans, three Honorable Mention All-Americans, 56 Academic All-Conference players and many GAC honor roll athletes.

During the 2014 season, the Tigers finished the regular season 10-0 for the first time in program history. After winning its second GAC championship, Ouachita earned the top seed in the region for the Tigers' first ever appearance in the NCAA Division II National Championship Tournament.

Knight's seniors have had a 90% graduation rate and the team has been involved in service to the community for many years. He has been quoted in saying that one of the most gratifying things in coaching is watching his players grow into the total man during their time at Ouachita, graduate and go on to be successful in all aspects of life.

Knight's development as a coach has come under solid leadership, playing under coach Buddy Benson at Ouachita, and later coaching under Red Parker and Don Skelton at Delta State from 1986-1989 and David Lee at the

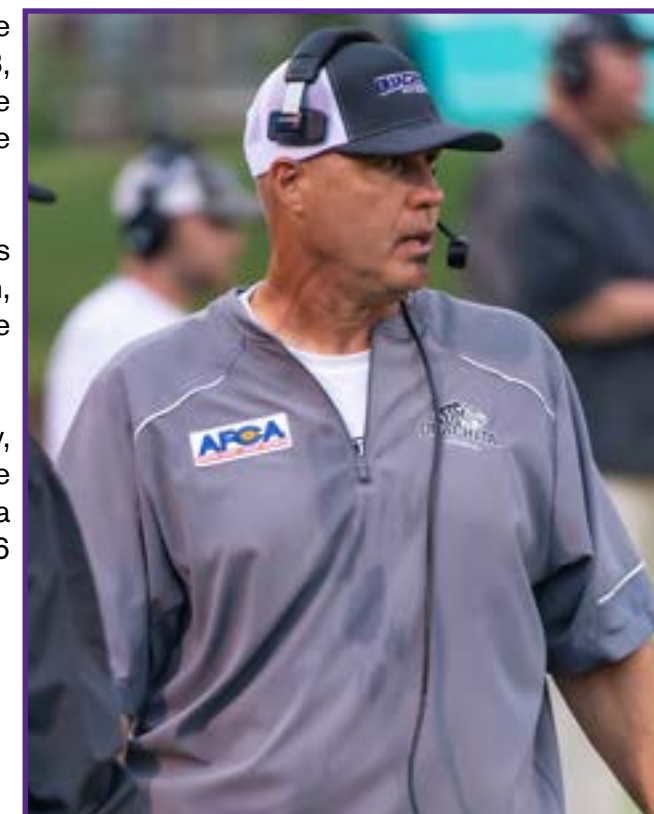

University of Texas at El Paso from 1990-1992. When he returned to Delta State as head coach from 1993-1998, he led the team to its first ever Gulf South Conference Championship in 1998, also earning GSC Coach of the Year honors.

Knight was named to the AFCA Board of Trustees following the conclusion of the 2012 football season, adding to his list of accolades. He also served on the NCAA Rules Committee.

Knight and his wife Julie have three children: Casey, a 2013 graduate of Ouachita; Spencer and his wife Megan, both 2015 graduates of Ouachita; and Jake, a 2017 graduate of Ouachita, and his wife Kelsey, a 2016 graduate of Ouachita.

JAY DERBY

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/QUARTERBACKS COACH | 22ND SEASON



Jay Derby is entering his 22nd season on the Ouachita staff after coming to OBU from Delta State with head coach Todd Knight.

Derby will be in his 16th season as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He served as the recruiting coordinator for Ouachita from 1999-2004, coached the defensive line from 1999-2001 and coached the wide receivers from 2002-2003.

In 2019, Derby Coached All Great American Conference QB Brayden Brazeal to the best completion percentage in NCAA Division II Football and second overall across all divisions of NCAA Football finishing at 75.94 percent, only .36% behind Heisman Trophy winner Joe Burrow. In the same season, the Ouachita Offense led the Nation across all Divisions of NCAA Football in 3rd Down Conversion percentage at 62.34. That was a new Great American Conference record.

Ouachita's offense also finished in the top 10 nationally in numerous NCAA Division II offensive categories, including passing efficiency and turnovers lost, while also finishing ranked No. 3 nationally in interceptions thrown.

In 2017, the Tiger offense reset a trio of school records. The Tigers averaged a school best 37.8 points a contest in 2017, they also reset the program record for points in a season with 453. Ouachita also ran up 632 yards of total offense against Oklahoma Baptist this past year.

Ouachita's offense also finished in the top-three of numerous Great American Conference offensive categories. The Tigers finished number one in Red Zone offense and in fourth down conversion ratings. Ouachita finished second in scoring offense, passing efficiency, rushing offense and sacks allowed. The Tigers also finished third in total offense and turnovers lost.

In 2015, the Tiger offense averaged more than 30 points per game for its seventh year in a row, setting team records in non-consecutive seasons. The offense has now joined the 300/4,000 club the last five seasons with more than 4,000 yards of total offense and 300 plus points per season.

In 2014, the OBU offense broke the school record in scoring set in 2013, averaging 37.7 points per game, leading the team to its seventh consecutive winning season.

In 2012, the American Football Coaches Association named three finalists for the NCAA Division II Assistant Coach of the Year. Derby was one of those finalists, recognizing him for his community involvement and the productivity of Ouachita's offense.

In Derby's second season as offensive coordinator for the Tigers, the offense set

In the homecoming game against Arkansas Tech, the offense set the school record for most yards in a game (573), as well as the record for most passing yards in a single game (478). Also during the 2011 GAC Championship campaign the offense ranked first in points per game and total offense.

In his 13 years as a quarterback coach, Derby has coached four different Ouachita record-holders in all statistical categories, along with three different quarterbacks earning All-Conference honors, including the 2011 GAC Offensive Player of the Year Casey Cooper. In 2010, Eli Cranor set the Ouachita record for passing yards, total offense in a single season and the Gulf South Conference/Ouachita record for completion percentage in a single game at 93.8% against Southern Arkansas. In 2008, Lance Parker set the school record for most passing yards in a single game at 478 against Arkansas Tech. In 2011, Casey Cooper set the rushing record for QB's with just under 1,000 yards rushing. In 2014, Kiehl Frazier led the offense to a school

record of points per game and a regular-season record of 10-0, the first undefeated/untied regular season in school history. The top 3 passers in Ouachita history have all been coached by Derby.

Derby has coached and recruited over 70 All-Conference and NFL athletes in his career, including 2 different offensive players of the year, 3 freshmen of the year, 6 professional athletes, and two NFL players in wide receiver Julius Pruitt and tight end Phillip Supernaw.

Derby, a native of Goldsboro, N.C., played football at Guilford College in North Carolina where he won the Old Dominion Athletic Conference Championship as a senior. He began his coaching career at his alma mater in 1992, coaching wide receivers and tight ends.

BRETT SHOCKLEY

RECRUITING COORDINATOR/ OFFENSIVE LINE AND TIGHT ENDS COACH | 15TH SEASON



Brett Shockley is entering his 15th season as Offensive Line / Tight Ends Coach & his 12th as Recruiting Coordinator.

During the 2017 season, Ouachita's offensive front paved the way for another great offensive output. The Tigers were second in the Great American Conference in scoring at 37.8 points per game, second in rushing yards per game at 238.8, and first in red zone offense at 92.9%. This was the 8th consecutive year the offense recorded over 4,000 total yards and over 330 points in a season.

Shockley's units are known for opening running lanes, having paved the way for eight 1,000-yard rushers and have averaged over 2,400 rushing yards per season in his tenure. The Tiger front five has also been known for keeping record-setting quarterbacks upright. In Shockley's first eleven seasons,

Ouachita averaged only 8.8 sacks allowed per season.

Shockley has been privileged to coach many great athletes during his time at Ouachita. In the 12 seasons he has had 29 All-Conf. selections and 8 All-Americans.

Ouachita has been dominant in recruiting the state of Arkansas over the past 10 years, this is evident in the Ouachita offense as all of the starters are from the state of Arkansas and 35 of the 44 in the team's 2 deep are from the Natural State. The Tigers also love to go get HS Athletes from East Texas and North Louisiana. As Recruiting Coordinator, Shockley has made the emphasis on recruiting HS athletes from the surrounding area the top priority.

Shockley is a 2001 graduate of the University of Arkansas where he earned his Bachelor of Science on Agriculture and Agriculture Marketing. While there, he was a three year letterman playing OL for the Razorbacks. He participated in the 1999 Citrus, 2000 Cotton, & 2000 Vegas Bowl Games. Thompson has transformed the Tigers' defense into one of the top defensive units nationally, ending the 2019 regular season No. 4 in scoring defense in the country and finishing No. 1 in Division II in scoring defense during the 2018 regular season.

The 2019 defensive unit helped Ouachita capture its third consecutive Great American Championship, reach the NCAA playoffs for the third straight year, and finish with an 11-1 record.

During his Ouachita career Thompson has coached five All-Great American Conference linebackers, including 2018 All-Region linebacker Aric Parker, and multiple All-Conference defensive linemen during his time as the Defensive Line Coach for the Tigers including two All Americans, two All-Region performers and an NFL free agent.

Thompson spent 2014 and 2015 as the Assistant Head Coach/ Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Backs Coach at Mendocino College in Ukiah, California. Thompson's defensive unit finished the 2015 season ranked No. 4 in total defense in the state of California as well as the, No. 1 defense in the Pac-7 Conference and No. 15 nationally in total defense.

Thompson is in his 15th season coaching with other stops including Highland Community College in Kansas and Belhaven University in Jackson, Mississippi.

Spencer Knight is entering his third season on the Ouachita coaching staff. Knight spent three seasons as a graduate assistant on the University of Memphis coaching staff before returning to OBU.

During the 2019 season, Knight coached All-Conference and All-Region wide receiver Allie Freeman. Freeman led the GAC in receptions (95) and broke the GAC career reception mark with over 250 career receptions. Knight's unit accumulated almost 2,000 yards receiving and 14 TD. During the 2018 season, Knight coached two All-Conference wideouts in Drew Harris and Allie Freeman. The receiving corps led a solid passing game with over 120 receptions for 1500 yards and 11 TD's. Knight's senior-heavy group included two offensive captains voted on by the team in La'Darius McElroy and Drew Harris.

While at Memphis, Knight worked with both the special teams and outside linebacker units. He had the opportunity to learn under two rising FBS head coaches in Justin Fuente (Virginia Tech) and Mike Norvell (Florida State). Knight worked directly with Special Teams Coordinator Joe Lorig, who is regarded as the top Special Teams Coordinator in FBS and is currently at Penn State. Knight helped guide the special teams unit to a number one ranking in the American Athletic Conference for three consecutive seasons. Knight also coached the AAC Special Teams player of the year for three straight seasons (Jake Elliot '15 and Tony Pollard '16-17). The Tigers scored seven touchdowns on kickoff returns during a two-year span and ranked in the top 3 in kickoff coverage for three consecutive seasons.

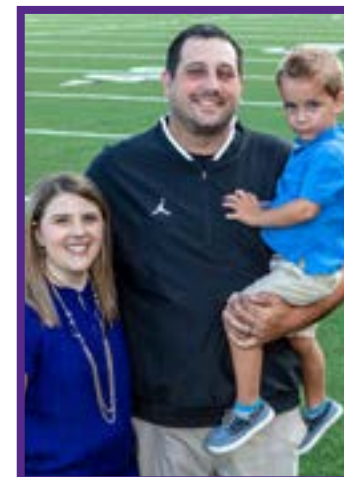

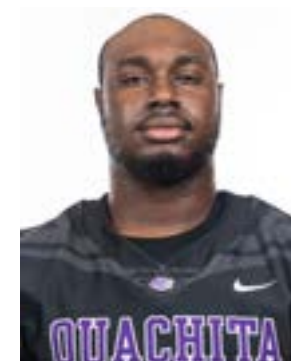

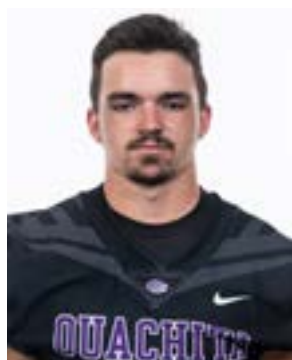

CLIFF HARRIS STADIUM

Cliff Harris Stadium, named in honor of Ouachita Tigers and Dallas Cowboys football star Cliff Harris, was dedicated in 2014. The stadium features the state-of-the-art George Dunklin Family Press Box. The home stands seat 3,060 fans, including 572 reserved seats. Artificial turf was installed in 2019. A high-definition video board was added in the west end zone in the fall of 2020.



The stadium is a tribute to Ouachita's rich football tradition that dates back to 1895. Cliff Harris Stadium features Benson-Williams Field, named in memory of longtime Ouachita football coach Buddy Benson and A.U. Williams, a Hot Springs physician who donated the land to Ouachita in the early 1900s.

The Tigers christened their new home with a 28-7 victory over Southern Nazarene on September 13, 2014. Cliff Harris Stadium hosted its first playoff game that season, as the Tigers hosted Minnesota-Duluth on November 29, setting stadium records for combined points (93) and total yards (1,085) that still stand. Through the stadium's first six seasons, Ouachita has posted a 30-7 record at home while welcoming more than 131 thousand fans. A crowd of 9,868 - the largest in stadium history - saw the Tigers take on Henderson State in the Battle of the Ravine on November 14, 2015.

Cliff Harris Stadium has been home to four Great American Conference championship-winning teams and has hosted four NCAA playoff games in its first six seasons. Only once have the Tigers lost more than one home game in a season since its opening.

ALLCARE FIELDHOUSE

AllCare Field House is the hub for both the Tiger football and Tiger baseball programs. It houses the Kluck Team Meeting Room for football, which includes 100 theater-style seats and a state-of-the-art audio/video system. In 2015, the weight room was completely renovated and was named the Crittenden Strength Center; it is a 3,500-square-foot state of the art weight training facility. The fieldhouse also houses the offices for the football coaching staff, football locker room, an athletic training room, laundry facilities, the baseball clubhouse and baseball coaches' offices.



AllCare Field House was dedicated in 2016 in honor of Sen. Percy Malone's contributions to the facility. Malone is an Arkadelphia pharmacist and businessman and has served in both the Arkansas Senate and House of Representatives. Kluck Team Meeting Room was named in honor of Dr. Wesley Kluck, team doctor, university physician, vice president for student development and Tiger athletics supporter. The Crittenden Strength Center is named in honor of James E. "Jim Ed" Crittenden, a 1950 Ouachita graduate, distinguished alumnus and faithful Ouachita supporter.



CREWS ATHLETIC PAVILION

Crews Athletic Pavilion features an artificial turf football field, 50 yards long and regulation width. Ouachita athletics teams use the indoor facility to practice during inclement weather. The pavilion is also used for hosting football camps and the annual Great American Conference Pro Day. Built in 2004, it was named for Quintus and Betty Baker Crews in appreciation for more than 30 years of support for Ouachita athletics. Quintus was a former assistant football coach at Ouachita.





HISTORY



HARRIS TO THE HALL

The odds were long for Cliff Harris to even play college football. After transferring to Des Arc High School for his senior year, he played well enough to earn one scholarship offer – from Ouachita Baptist University, where his father played.

Going undrafted, he faced long odds to beat out 120 other rookies in Dallas Cowboys camp in 1970. Harris surmounted those odds to earn the starting free safety spot in Tom Landry's flex defense that season.

"How does a kid from a small D2 school in Arkadelphia, Arkansas make it to five Super Bowls and the Hall of Fame?" Harris said in his enshrinement speech. "I may be the only one who knows how truly slim that chance was. But if I can make it, anyone can achieve their goals. The key is to never quit. Never give up. Keep trying, keep learning, and keep growing."

Harris has earned numerous honors in the game of football. He was a two-time All-Conference selection and 1966 Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference champion at Ouachita Baptist. His professional career saw him become a two-time Super Bowl champion, six-time Pro Bowl selection, three-time First Team All-Pro honoree and member of the Ring of Honor for the Dallas Cowboys. He is the namesake of both an award presented to the top defensive player in the country representing small schools and his alma mater's football stadium.

On August 7, Harris added the sport's top honor to his long list of accolades when he joined the Pro Football Hall of Fame with the Class of 2020 at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton, Ohio. He was presented by longtime Cowboys teammate Charlie Waters.

Ouachita was the only school to offer Harris a scholarship out of Des Arc High School, and he came to Arkadelphia to follow in his father, O.J. "Buddy" Harris' footsteps. Under head coach Buddy Benson, the Tigers won the 1966 AIC title in Harris' freshman season. Harris was named All-AIC in 1968 and 1969, but was not selected in the 1970 NFL Draft.

Dallas invited him to training camp in 1970 and signed him to a free agent contract. That year, he beat out third-round draft pick Charlie Waters to crack the starting lineup and helped Dallas



to victory in Super Bowl VI over the Miami Dolphins. In his 10-year NFL career, all with the Cowboys, Harris recorded 29 interceptions, which he returned for 281 yards and a touchdown, recovered 18 fumbles, recorded 3.0 unofficial sacks* and racked up over 2,000 yards in kick and punt returns.

One of only 13 players to ever play in five Super Bowls, Harris helped Dallas bring home a second Lombardi trophy in 1978. He retired after the 1979 season, and despite being named a finalist for the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2004, he was not selected to the Hall until January 15, 2020, as part of the Centennial Class of inductees. As if 40 years wasn't long enough to wait, the 2020 enshrinement ceremony was postponed to a combined celebration with the Class of 2021.

Beyond his belief in himself, Harris attributed the success he has achieved to his faith in God.

"One last thing that has been vitally important to me has been my faith in God," Harris said. "I've had good fortune in my life, but God has always been in control. God gives us the freedom to choose our challenges and how we'll face those challenges and opportunities in our lives."
