The Ohio football team (0-1) is set to return to Athens, Ohio for their home opener against LIU (0-0). Kickoff is set for 12 p.m. ET at Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium. The game can be seen on ESPN+ with Michael Reghi and Jerod Cherry on the call.

opponents averaged 37.91 points per game.

LIU averaged 127.9 rushing yards per game, while putting up an average of 224.45 yards per game through the air.

The Bobcats' matchup can also be heard on the Ohio Sports Network from Learfield. Russ Eisenstein returns for his 16th season as the "Voice of the Bobcats" and will be joined by Ohio alum Rob Cornelius, who has been a part of the broadcasts for two decades.

Individually, sophomore running back Pat Bowen led the team on the ground, recording 597 yards on 139 attempts. In the air, freshman quarterback threw for 1,219 yards and 13 touchdowns. He played in 11 games for the Sharks.

SERIES HISTORY VS. LIU

Saturday's matchup marks the Bobcats' and the Sharks' first time meeting.

Sophomore defensive back Larry Elder led the defense with 71 tackles, 49 of which were solo, while redshirt freshman defensive end Matthew Nieves recorded a team-best 9 quarterback hurries.

SCOUTING LIU

The Sharks finished the 2022 season 4-7 overall and 4-3 against Northeast Conference opponents.

LAST TIME OUT

Ohio opened their 2023 season with a week zero game in San Diego, Calif., falling 20-13 to the San Diego State Aztecs.

They closed the season with a four-game winning streak, which they kicked off with a 50-48 overtime victory against Duquesne.

Graduate student wide receiver Sam Wiglusz led the receivers with 10 receptions on 103 yards while junior wide receiver Miles Cross scored the Bobcats' only touchdown of the day. On the ground, redshirt sophomore

Sieh Bangura net 65 yards on the ground and recorded 15 carries. Redshirt senior O'Shaan Allison returned to the field for the first time since 2021, finishing the day with six carries on 27 yards.

Defensively, graduate student linebacker Bryce Houston finished with 13 tackles, including seven solo stops. Redshirt senior defensive tackle Rayyan Buell and sophomore safety Adonis Williams Jr. each recorded a quarterback hurry.

Freshman kicker Gianni Spetic made his collegiate debut, going 2-for-3 on field goals and 1-for-1 on PATs.

San Diego State struck first, wrapping up a 10-play, 44-yard drive with a 49-yard field goal. Spetic tied the game 4:22 left in the first quarter, kicking a 19-yard field goal to end an 81-yard drive.

Ohio took the lead with 4:44 remaining in the second half when Spetic kicked a 40-yard field goal, but the Aztecs bounced back after an interception to take a 10-6 lead with the first touchdown of the game.

After a scoreless third, San Diego State extended their lead with a 21-yard field goal, putting the score at 13-6 with 13:32 remaining in the game. The Aztecs scored again, wrapping up an 11-play, 79-yard drive with a four-yard passing touch down, leaving the Bobcats trailing 20-6.

With 1:59 remaining, Cross caught a three-yard pass from graduate student quarterback CJ Harris for the Bobcats' first touchdown of the 2023 season, cutting the Aztecs' lead to seven points.

Unable to score again, Ohio fell, 20-13.

SCOUTING OHIO

So far this season, the Bobcats are 0-1. They scored 13 points on 102 rushing yards and 278 passing yards per game.

In the air, quarterback Kurtis Rourke went 8-for-10 in 75 yards while quarterback CJ Harris finished with 18 completions in 203 yards.

Wide receivers Sam Wiglusz and Tyler Walton led the team, with Wiglusz recording 10 receptions on 103 yards while Walton finished with six receptions on 55 yards. Wide receiver Miles Cross scored the only touchdown of the day.

On the ground, running back Sieh Bangura had 15 carries in 65 rushing yards while running back O'Shaan Allison finished with six rushing attempts and 27 yards.

Defensively, linebacker Bryce Houston led the charge, recording 13 tackles and 1.5 tackles for loss. Safety Austin Brawley finished the game with four solo tackles, four assisted tackles, one pass break-up and one fumble recovery.

Freshman kicker Gianni Spetic made his collegiate debut in San Diego, going 2-for-3 on field goals and 1-for-1 on PATs. His longest field goal was 40 yards.

ROURKE'S RETURN

After a season-ending injury in the Bobcats' 11th game of the 2022 season, Kurtis Rourke is set to return as Ohio's first-string quarterback.

In the air, Rourke went 244-for-353, throwing 25 touchdowns in 3,256 yards over 11 games. The he made program history against Fordham (Sept. 24), going for 527 yards in the air,

breaking a record that was set in 1983. He is also second in program history in passing yards in a season as well as passing touchdowns in a season.

Rourke's performance earned him numerous accolades, highlighted by being named the MAC Offensive Player of the Year, earning the Vern Smith Leadership Award and getting named the 2022 Cornish Trophy runner-up as well as earning First Team All-MAC honors. He was named one of the Manning Award "Stars of the Week" twice, was a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist and was also named to the 2022 Phil Steele First Team Offense in addition to earning MAC Offensive Player of the Week three times. Off the field, he was named Academic All-MAC, 2022 Academic All-America® Second Team and earned MAC Scholar Athlete of the Week honors once.

So far this pre-season, Rourke has made four watch lists: Allstate Sugar Bowl Manning Award, Davey O'Brien, Maxwell Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year.

DEPTH IN THE RUNNING BACK ROOM
Rourke isn't the only Bobcat set to make an appearance in 2023. After getting hurt early in 2022 Fall Camp, running back O'Shaan Allison missed the entire 2022 season.

Allison hit the ground running in 2023 Fall Camp and has returned to the Bobcats' depth chart, now behind 2022 MAC Freshman of the Year Sieh Bangura.

NO. 1 CFL DRAFT PROSPECT
Graduate student quarterback Kurtis Rourke headlines the Fall Edition of the Canadian Football League (CFL) Scouting Bureau. The native of Oakville, Ont., sits in the No. 1 spot among prospects eligible for the 2024 CFL Draft.

The CFL Scouting Bureau, comprising CFL scouts, as well as player personnel directors and general managers from the league's nine clubs, annually releases its rankings in the fall, winter and, for a third and final time, in the spring ahead of the coming draft.

ROURKE NAMED TO 2024 REESE'S SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST
Ohio football captain Kurtis Rourke was named on the 2024 Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List, as announced by the organization (Aug. 23).

The Reese's Senior Bowl is widely regarded as the preeminent college football all-star game and the first stage in the NFL Draft process. The longest continual-running all-star game has taken place in Mobile, Ala. the past 74 years. More than 900 NFL personnel, including key decision-makers from all 32 teams, and over 1100 media

members from around the country were credentialed this year. This past April, the game produced 100 total picks for the third straight year, representing 40 percent of the entire NFL draft, including 40 selected on the first two days.

ROURKE NAMED ON JOHNNY UNITAS GOLDEN ARM AWARD 2023 WATCH LIST
The Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Educational Foundation, Inc., along with presenting sponsor A. O. Smith Corporation announce the 2023 list of Golden Arm Award candidates. All 10 FBS conferences as well as a football independent are represented on the list, rounding out this season's list at 48 of the nation's leading quarterbacks.

Representing Ohio is Kurtis Rourke.

The namesake of the Golden Arm Award has a storied history. Johnny Unitas was an 18-year veteran of the NFL, who played his collegiate career at the University of Louisville before joining the Baltimore Colts in 1958. His career passing figures include 2,830 pass completions for 40,239 yards, 290 touchdowns and throwing a touchdown pass in 47 consecutive games.

ALLISON NAMED TO COMEBACK PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST
The College Sports Communicators (formerly CoSIDA) in association with The Associated Press (AP) and the Fiesta Bowl Organization, today released a "Watch List" of 100 college football student-athletes from 67 different schools currently under consideration for the 2023 Comeback Player of the Year Award.

Representing Ohio is redshirt fifth year running back O'Shaan Allison. During the 2021 season, Allison net 317 yards on the ground on 82 attempts. His longest rush was 37 yards.

Since 2018, the award has recognized college football student-athletes from all divisions of college football for overcoming injury, illness, or other circumstances. At the conclusion of each season, in a vote by a panel of college football writers, editors, and sports information directors, three college football student-athletes are honored as Comeback Player of the Year Award winners at the Vrbo Fiesta Bowl. College athletic communications professionals working with football programs are encouraged to nominate deserving candidates at www.Comeback-Player.com.

ROURKE NAMED TO ALLSTATE SUGAR BOWL MANNING AWARD WATCH LIST
The Manning Award, sponsored by the Allstate Sugar Bowl, announced its preseason Watch List on Tuesday (Aug. 15).

The list includes 33 of the top quarterbacks in the nation heading into the 2023 season. The winner will again be selected by a voting panel, which includes national media and each of the Mannings, after the bowls.

ROURKE NAMED TO 2023 WALTER CAMP PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Representing Ohio is Kurtis Rourke.

Players from 35 different schools representing 11 conferences (including independents) are represented on the preseason watch list.

BANGURA MAKES 2023 DOAK WALKER AWARD WATCH LIST

The PwC SMU Athletic Forum released the preseason candidates for the 2023 Doak Walker Award on Aug. 9. The Forum annually presents the award to the nation's top college running back.

Representing Ohio is Sieh Bangura.

ROURKE NAMED TO DAVEY O'BRIEN 2023 PRESEASON WATCH LIST

The Davey O'Brien Foundation unveiled the 2023 Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award Preseason Watch List on Aug. 8, a group that includes 35 of the nation's top returning college quarterbacks.

Representing Ohio is Kurtis Rourke.

Compiled by a subset of the Davey O'Brien National Selection Committee, this year's list was selected based on career player performance and expectations heading into the 2023 college football season. All nominees are required to have previously started at least one game at an NCAA Division I institution.

In 2022, Rourke was named to the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2022 (Nov. 1) and was a Davey O'Brien Great 8 QB (Nov. 7).

WIGLUSZ NAMED TO PRESEASON BILETNIKOFF AWARD WATCH LIST

The Tallahassee Quarterback Club (TQC) Foundation, Inc., the Florida-based creator and sponsor of the prestigious Biletnikoff Award, released its watchlist (Aug. 7).

Representing Ohio is wide receiver Sam Wiglusz.

The Biletnikoff Award annually recognizes the college football season's outstanding FBS receiver. Any player, regardless of position (wide receiver, tight end, slot back, and running back) who catches a pass is eligible for the award. As such, the Biletnikoff Award recognizes college football's outstanding receiver, not merely college football's outstanding wide receiver.

ROURKE NAMED ON 2023 MAXWELL AWARD WATCH LIST

The Maxwell Football Club announced its watch list for the 87th Maxwell Award presented annually to the outstanding player in college football (July 31). The Maxwell Award has been presented to the College Player of the Year since 1937 and is named in honor of Robert "Tiny" Maxwell who was a former standout at Swarthmore College and a renowned sportswriter and football official.

Representing Ohio is quarterback Kurtis Rourke.

The Maxwell Award is a member of the National College Football Awards Association (NCFAA), which encompasses college football's most prestigious awards. The NCFAA's 24 awards have honored more than 900 recipients since 1935. This season, 12 NCFAA awards will honor national players of the week each Tuesday.

OHIO FOOTBALL RANKED 17TH IN HERO SPORTS' GROUP OF FIVE TOP 25

HERO Sports announced their Group of Five Top 25 and All-American teams on July 21.

The Ohio football team ranked 17th, finishing ahead of their non-conference opponent FAU (No. 18) and Mid-American Conference foes Miami (No. 21) and Eastern Michigan (No. 22). The Bobcats' week zero match up, San Diego State, were ranked 16th.

Sam Wiglusz and Keegan Wilburn represented Ohio on HERO Sports' All-American teams. Wiglusz was one of three wide receivers to earn Second Team Offense accolades while Wilburn made Second Team Special Teams.

AYE AYE, CAPTAIN

The Ohio football team named five graduate student captains for the 2023 season — wide receiver Sam Wiglusz, linebacker Keye Thompson, quarterback Kurtis Rourke, linebacker Bryce Houston and defensive tackle Rodney Mathews.

Houston and Rourke are both entering their third season as captains, while Wiglusz, Thompson and Mathews are entering

their first. In addition to the five captains, coaches will vote an additional captain every game based on "brickworthy" leadership. "Brickworthy" leaders are those who exhibit the program's core values.

CONTINUITY ON THE COACHING STAFF

With head coach Tim Albin at helm, all 11 coaches returned for the 2023 season.

Additionally, three were promoted. John Hauser is now the Defensive Passing Game Coordinator and Safeties Coach, Brian Metz is the Recruiting Coordinator and Tight Ends Coach and Brian Smith is now the Associate Head Coach, Passing Game Coordinator and Running Backs Coach.

UNDEFEATED ON THE FRANK

The Ohio University Board of Trustees agreed to name the football field in Peden Stadium to honor long-time Ohio head coach Frank Solich, as announced by the program on Aug. 18, 2022.

The Bobcats opened the 2022 season against FAU on Frank Solich Field, snagging their first victory of the season and on the newly-named field. Ohio continued this streak, taking a 6-0 record when in Athens, Ohio and closing the regular season with a 38-14 victory over Bowling Green to clinch the MAC East title.

Solich owns a career coaching record of 173-101. His 173 overall wins rank as the fourth most among active NCAA FBS head coaches. He is the winningest head coach in Mid-American Conference history with 115 overall victories while his 77 conference-only wins rank second to former Central Michigan head coach Herb Deromedi's 90. His 16 years of service match Deromedi's (1978-93) for the most in MAC history. Ohio is 115-82 during the Solich era. His 115 victories are the second-most in program history behind Don Peden (121; 1924-46). Ohio has gone 77-46 in conference play since Solich's arrival in Athens in 2005.

Ohio has had a run of 12-straight non-losing seasons that has included 11 winning campaigns and six years with at least nine victories -- including a 10-win campaign in 2011. The 2012 season began with the Bobcats earning a signature win at Penn State, upsetting the Nittany Lions by a score of 24-14. Ohio captured division titles in 2006, 2009, 2011 and 2016. Solich led the Bobcats to 11 of their 13 bowl appearances and the first five bowl victories in program history, with back-to-back wins in the 2011 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl and '12 Independence Bowl and back-to-back-to-back victories in the 2017 Bahamas Bowl, '18 DXL Frisco Bowl and '20 Famous Idaho Potato Bowl (2019 season).



YEAR THREE FOR ALBIN

Tim Albin enters his third season as head coach in 2023 after serving as Ohio's offensive coordinator for 16 years under Frank Solich.

The 2022 football team finished the season as MAC East (7-1) and Arizona Bowl Champions with a 10-4 record, marking its first 10-win season since 2011 and the second-best turnaround in FBS football last year. The Bobcats were also undefeated at home, posting a 6-0 record on Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium, and wrapped up the regular season with a seven-game winning streak.

This performance earned Albin MAC Coach of the Year honors, quarterback Kurtis Rourke MAC Offensive Player of the Year honors as well as the Vern Smith Leadership Award and running back Sieh Bangura MAC Freshman of the Year accolades.

Albin joined the Ohio Football coaching staff as offensive coordinator in 2005, reuniting with Frank Solich after four seasons together at Nebraska. The 2021 season will mark Albin's 17th year in Athens. Since his arrival in Athens, Albin has produced offensive units that have consistently ranked among the top of the Mid-American Conference. He also has directed an offensive attack that has practically rewritten all of Ohio's rushing, passing records, and scoring records. In the past 10 seasons, Albin's offensive units rank No. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 on the Ohio all-time Top-10 single season scoring list. The Bobcats 368 points in 2018 rank fourth on the all-time list.

Albin spent the 2004 season as offensive coordinator and running backs coach at North Dakota State, helping the Bison to an 8-3 record and No. 25 national ranking in their first season at the Division I-AA level. NDSU finished the season averaging 378.5 yards of total offense, including 192.4 on the ground, and had four offensive players named first-team All-Great West Football Conference. Albin served with Solich at Nebraska from 2000 to 2003. He started with the Cornhusker program as a graduate assistant, a position he held for three seasons before being promoted to running backs coach and passing game coordinator for the 2003 season. Prior to his stint at Nebraska, Albin was the head coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State for three seasons, winning the NAIA national championship in 1999 with a 13-0 record. He was named NAIA Football Coach of the Year by Rawlings and American Football Coach Magazine as the Rangers recorded their first undefeated season in history.

BOBCATS IN THE CFL

Three former Bobcats are currently active in the CFL. Defensive tackle **Casey Sayles** is with the Hamilton Tiger-Cats while running back **De'Montre Tuggle** plays for the Ottawa RedBlacks.

Running back **AJ Ouellette** plays for the

Toronto Argonauts, who are the 109th Grey Cup Champions. Sayles, who was a member of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers at the time, competed in the same Grey Cup,

While with the BC Lions, **Nathan Rourke** was named Most Outstanding Canadian (Nov. 17, 2022). He is the first BC Lions' quarterback and the third quarterback in CFL history to earn the honor.

Ohio football alumnus **Chip Cox** is apart of the 2022 CFL Hall of Fame class, earning the honor in his first year of eligibility. Cox played 13 seasons for the Montreal Alouettes, wrapping up his career with the fourth highest total defensive tackles in CFL history (979).

OL **Austen Peasants** was signed to the Los Angeles Chargers' practice squad on Nov. 9, 2022. He signed a reserve/futures contract in Jan. 2023.

Tim Albin was named the head football coach at Ohio on July 14, 2021.

The 2022 football team finished the season as MAC East (7-1) and Arizona Bowl Champions with a 10-4 record, marking its first 10-win season since 2011 and the second-best turnaround in FBS football last year. The Bobcats were also undefeated at home, posting a 6-0 record on Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium, and wrapped up the regular season with a seven-game winning streak.

This performance earned Albin MAC Coach of the Year honors, quarterback Kurtis Rourke MAC Offensive Player of the Year honors as well as the Vern Smith Leadership Award and running back Sieh Bangura MAC Freshman of the Year accolades.

Since his arrival in Athens, Albin has produced offensive units that have consistently ranked among the top of the Mid-American Conference. He also has directed an offensive attack that has practically rewritten all of Ohio's rushing, passing records, and scoring records. In the past 10 seasons, Albin's offensive units rank No. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 on the Ohio all-time Top 10 single season scoring list. The Bobcats 368 points in 2016 rank fourth on the all-time list.

In 2016, the Bobcats had the most pass attempts (458) and second-most completions (250) in school history. The offense totaled 5,492 yards of total offense which is third all-time at Ohio. The Bobcats also compiled the second-most pass yards in school history (3,142) and the fourth most touchdown passes (22).

In 2015, the offense totaled 5,378 yards, which ranks third all-time in program history. The Bobcat quarterbacks passed for 3,026 yards, which ranks third all-time in program history as well.

In 2014, the offense totaled 4,443 yards of offense which ranked fifth all-time in program history. The combination of Derrius Vick and JD Sprague proved to be dynamic through the air as the quarterbacks combined to pass for 2,474 yards for the season which is sixth all-time in program history.

The Bobcat offense found a balanced attack with AJ Ouellette in the backfield. The freshman ran for 785 yards ranking him only behind Kareem Wilson for most yards on the ground for a freshman.

In 2013, under Albin's watchful eye, Ohio's offensive attack averaged 379.4 yards per game and surpassed 400 yards of total offense in seven games during the 2013 campaign. The Bobcats

closed the year with 4,932 yards of total offense. The 2013 campaign also marked the final season of Ohio's most prolific offensive trio in school history as quarterback Tyler Tettleton, running back Beau Blankenship and wide Donte' Foster all concluded their respective collegiate careers.

Albin recruited all three players and all three players flourished in his offensive scheme. At the end of their respective careers, Tettleton, Blankenship and Foster accounted for over 25,000 yards of total offense and 128 touchdowns.

Tettleton finished his career at Ohio with 27 school records and once again passed for over 2,500 yards through the air. He is the only quarterback in school history to pass for over 2,500 yards in three-consecutive seasons.

Blankenship closed his senior campaign with 910 yards rushing and five touchdowns. He finished his career fifth on the all-time rushing list with 2,976 yards.

Foster concluded his senior campaign with his best single-season of his career as he finished with 1,018 yards receiving and seven touchdowns. The Guthrie, Okla., native became just the second wide receiver in school history to surpass 1,000 yards receiving. He also finished his career with the most all-time touchdown receptions (21). Following the year, Foster was selected to the All-MAC Second Team.

In 2012, Albin's offensive unit that accounted for 5,782 yards. In fact, Ohio was one of just four teams in the Mid-American Conference to post 5,500-yards or more of total offense in 2012 (Northern Illinois, Ball State and Toledo). Ohio had seven games in which it surpassed 450 yards of total offense.

Albin's offensive unit played a major role in Ohio's 45-14 victory in the Advocare V100 Independence Bowl. In the win, the Bobcats' 556 yards of total offense served as an Independence Bowl record, while their 45 points tied the Bowl record. Following the game, Blankenship and Tettleton were named Co-Offensive Most Valuable Players of the Independence Bowl.

Ohio's 2012 offensive unit averaged over 30 points per game for the second straight season and the third time in the last six years. In addition, the Bobcats scored 40-or-more points in four different games.

The 2012 campaign also saw Blankenship rush for a single-season school record 1,604 yards and 15 touchdowns. He became the eighth running back in school history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a single season. Following the year, Blankenship was named All-MAC Second Team. Offensive lineman Skyler Allen and Eric Herman joined Blankenship on the All-MAC Second Team. Since taking over as offensive coordinator in 2005, Albin has coached 26 All-MAC players and All-Americans LaVon Brazill (2009) and Joe Flading (2011).

Tettleton once again posted a memorable season under Albin's direction as he passed for 2,844 yards and 18 touchdowns, while throwing just four interceptions in 12 games.

In April of 2013, Herman became the third offensive player to be selected in the NFL Draft over the last four years as he was drafted by the New York Giants in the seventh round.

In 2011, Albin's offensive scheme led to the most prolific year in school history. Ohio set eight team single-season offensive records, posting school standards for most yards gained (6,241), most passing yards gained (3,482), most offensive plays (1,026), average yards per game (445.8), passing attempts (429), most points scored (427), most passing completions (276) and most passing yards per game (248.7).

Under Albin's watchful eye, Tettleton re-wrote the Bobcats' single season record book in his first-year as a starting quarterback as he set 12 school standards, while becoming the first signal caller in program history to throw for over 3,000 yards. In addition, Tettleton accounted for 38 total touchdowns (28 passing and 10 rushing) and nearly 4,000 yards of total offense (3,960) en route to being named All-MAC Third Team.

The 2011 Ohio offensive unit also produced record-breaking performances from Brazill and Donte' Harden as the two combined to set eight single-season records. Brazill would go on to finish his career as the program's all-time leader for receiving yards (2,511) and receptions (189).

At the end of the year, a league-best six Bobcats were named to the MAC's All-League team on the offensive side of the ball.

In April of 2012, Brazill was selected in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts.

In 2010, Boo Jackson finished his career as Ohio's career leader in completion percentage (.604), pass efficiency (136.3), total offense per play (6.18), passing yards per attempt (7.7) and touchdown passes (38). He also finished the season responsible for 26 touchdowns, 48 in his career, which is fourth all-time, and with 18 passing touchdowns in 2010 (fourth all-time on the single-season list).

Ohio also had the best red zone efficiency among all MAC teams in 2010, converting 88.4 percent of its tries inside the 20-yard line. The Bobcats converted 38 times on 43 occasions, scoring 38 touchdowns and five field goals. Ohio was also outstanding at running the football, finishing second in the conference with 1,416 yards on the ground (177.0 per game average) for the 2010 season and 19 touchdowns.

In 2009, Albin's offense took aim at more of Ohio's all-time marks. Quarterback Theo Scott threw 20 touchdown passes, which stood as a school record until the 2011 season, while receiver Terrence McCrae tied Andrew Mooney's then single-season touchdown reception mark of nine.

The 2009 team also finished with passing yards (2,774), completions (228) and total offense (4,342) all of which rank among the program's top five all-time marks.

Albin mentored running back Calvin McRae who earned first-team All-MAC honors in 2005, 2006 and 2007. McRae is the first Bobcat in history to crack the 1,000-yard mark in three straight sea-

sons. Under Albin's tutelage, McRae rushed for 4,398 yards and 45 touchdowns. McRae owns the second, fourth and sixth-highest single-season rushing totals in school history after setting the single-season rushing, touchdown and points scored records.

Albin spent the 2004 season as offensive coordinator and running backs coach at North Dakota State, helping the Bison to an 8-3 record and No. 25 national ranking in their first season at the Division I-AA level. NDSU finished the season averaging 378.5 yards of total offense, including 192.4 on the ground, and had four offensive players named first-team All-Great West Football Conference.

Albin served with Solich at Nebraska from 2000 to 2003. He started with the Cornhusker program as a graduate assistant, a position he held for three seasons before being promoted to running backs coach and passing game coordinator for the 2003 season. Working with the Nebraska tight ends as a graduate assistant, Albin helped Tracey Wistrom earn third-team All-America status in back-to-back seasons.

Prior to his stint at Nebraska, Albin was the head coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State for three seasons, winning the NAIA national championship in 1999 with a 13-0 record. He was named NAIA Football Coach of the Year by Rawlings and American Football Coach Magazine as the Rangers recorded their first undefeated season in history. Six of his players earned NAIA All-America honors. Albin's three squads improved every season going from 5-5 in 1997 to 7-3 in 1998.

Returning to his alma mater in 1994, Albin served as Northwestern Oklahoma State's offensive coordinator and head men's and women's cross country and track and field coach prior to his promotion to head coach of the football program.

He earned Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference Coach of the Year honors twice for his work with the men's track program, leading them to back-to-back league titles. Albin got his start in coaching at Northeastern State (Okla.) in 1989 where he won two conference titles as an assistant football coach and two more as head of the men's track program.

As a player, Albin was a first-team All-Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference selection as a wide receiver in each of his final three seasons as a member of the Northwestern Oklahoma State squad. He added to those honors by becoming the first Rangers' player to earn All-District IX status three times.

Albin received His bachelor's of science in business administration from Northwestern Oklahoma State in 1989 and a master's of science from Northeastern State in 1991. A native of Woodward, Okla., Albin was born on Sept. 13, 1965. He and his wife, Brooke, have two children - daughter Tori, and son Treyce.
