THE OPENING KICK

The Ohio football team (3-2, 1-0 MAC) returns to action when they travel to Mount Pleasant, Mich. to take on the Central Michigan Chippewas (3-2, 1-0 MAC) for their first away conference game of the season on Oct. 12. Kickoff is set for 4 p.m. and can be seen on ESPNU with Matt Schumacker and Dustin Fox on the call.

The Bobcats' matchup can also be heard on the Ohio Sports Network from Learfield, presented by Holzer Health System. Veteran Ohio radio personality Marty Bannister is stepping into the 2024 play-by-play role and will be joined by Rob Cornelius, who has been a part of the broadcasts for two decades.

SERIES HISTORY VS. CENTRAL MICHIGAN

The Bobcats and the Zips have met 435 times since 1972, posting a 6-26-2 record.

The two teams last met on Wednesday, Nov. 15, 2023, at Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium, with Bobcats securing their first home victory against the Chippewas since 2000. In the 34-20 game, kicker **Gianni Spetic** finished the day 2-for-3

on field goals and 4-for-4 on PATs, while Shane Bonner snagged his first career pick six in the first quarter.

As Ohio built its lead without any passing touchdowns, scoring three rushing touchdowns.

SCOUTING CENTRAL MICHIGAN

The Chippewas are currently 3-2 overall and 1-0 against MAC opponents. They closed out non-conference play on Saturday, Sept. 28, defeating the San Diego State Aztecs, 22-21. CMU played their first conference game of the season the week prior (Sept. 21), claiming a 37-34 victory over Ball State when wide receiver Chris Parker snagged a 20-yard receiving touchdown with 16 seconds left on the clock.

As a team, CMU averages 30 points per game on 184.6 rushing yards and 245 passing yards. Their opponents average 29.4 points per game.

Redshirt junior quarterback Joe Labas is 88-for-151 on 1,078 yards over five games, throwing seven passing touchdowns and seven interceptions. His longest pass clocks in at 72 yards. The Chippewas have utilized two additional quarterbacks so far this season: redshirt freshman

WEEKLY AWARDS

MAC Offensive Player of the Week

Parker Navarro (Sept. 28)

Tyler Jefferson and redshirt sophomore Bert Emanuel, Jr. Jefferson has contributed to three games this season, going 9-for-13 on 117 yards in the air and logging seven rushing attempts. Emanuel has made two appearances, netting 65 yards and two rushing touchdowns on the ground on 13 carries as well as one passing touchdown.

Senior running backs BJ Harris and Marion Lukes currently lead the Chippewas on the ground. Harris recorded a team-best 273 yards on 37 attempts and two touchdowns, with his longest rush at an impressive 71 yards, while Lukes has accumulated 212 net yards and one touchdown on 46 carries. Fellow senior running back Myles Bailey and redshirt junior running back Nahree Biggins have both logged over 100 rushing yards so far this season—Bailey has two of the team's seven rushing touchdowns while Biggins claims the team's longest rush of the season (76 yards).

Redshirt freshman wide receiver Evan Boyd leads the receiving room with 17 catches and one touchdown on 253 yards. Redshirt junior wide receiver Chris Parker trails Boyd with 15 receptions on 223 yards but leads the team with three touchdowns. Senior wide receiver Solomon Davis and sophomore tight end Gavin Harris have both made appearances in all five games, recording 10 receptions apiece. Davis has a slight edge over Harris, scoring twice on 158 yards, while Harris has accumulated 148 yards and one touchdown.

Defensively, junior linebacker Jordan Kwiatkowski leads CMU with 43 total tackles, including 27 solo stops and a team-best 5.5 tackles for loss. Redshirt junior defensive back Elijah Rikard currently has 30 total tackles on the season, highlighted by 19 solo tackles, two tackles for loss and one sack, while senior linebacker Justin Whiteside recorded 27 tackles and four quarterback hurries on the season. The Chippewas sole interception of the season was snagged by senior defensive back Aakeem Snell, which he returned for 46 yards and a touchdown to close CMU's season opener against Central Connecticut State.

Redshirt senior placekicker Tristian Mattson is currently the team's leading scorer, putting up 37 of the team's 150 total points across the first five games. Mattson is 8-for-9 on field goals, with his longest clocking in at 46 yards, and 13-for-14 on PATs. Mattson has also accumulated 1,702 yards on 27 kickoffs, averaging 64 yards per kick. Senior punter David Chapeau's longest of 18 punts this sason is 56 yards; he averages 41.39 yards per punt.

LAST TIME OUT

The Ohio football team celebrated homecoming with a 30-10 victory over the Akron Zips Saturday (Sept. 28) evening. The victory marked the first time Ohio opened Mid-American Conference play at Peden Stadium

since 2011.

The Zips charged down the field in their first drive to put themselves in field goal range. Garrison Smith booted the ball from the 49-yard line for three points to put the Zips ahead.

Akron's lone touchdown of the evening came on a 17-yard pass to Jake Newell. Ohio managed to thwart Akron's plans on the ground and forced it into -18 rushing yards. Saturday marked the first time since Ohio held a team to 0 or less rushing yards since it played Akron in 2006.

Ohio didn't connect the wires on offense until the second quarter. It got the ball back after redshirt freshman safety **DJ Walker** snagged a pass from Finley for his first career interception. After several short drives, graduate student running back **Anthony Tyus III** got Ohio to the endzone, however, it was redshirt freshman tight end **Mason Williams** who scored. Tyus fumbled the ball in the endzone, and Williams recovered it for his first touchdown of the season.

With just a few seconds left in the quarter, graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen** caught an 18-yard over-the-back pass from graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro** to reclaim Ohio's lead.

Owen collected his second touchdown in the fourth quarter: a season-high 75-yard reception to mark second-longest of his career. Owen recorded 130 yards on six receptions Saturday night.

Navarro also had a career day, setting a new career highs in all-purpose yards (317) and rushing yards (113). The quarterback went 12-for-18 for 204 yards and two touchdowns in the air, matching his single-game passing yards record as well.

The defense didn't relent in the second half, either. Graduate student defensive end **Marcel Walker-Burgess** sacked quarterback Finley for a loss of three yards into the endzone for a safety in the third quarter. In the fourth quarter, redshirt sophomore safety **Austin Brawley** intercepted a pass to give Ohio the ball for Navarro's final touchdown.

Sophomore kicker **Gianni Spetic** (Chardon, Ohio) ended the night 2-for-2 in PATs.

SCOUTING OHIO

The Bobcats are currently 3-2 overall and 1-0 against MAC opponents. They average 21.2 points per game on 191.8 rushing yards and 177.2 passing yards per game.

In the air, graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro** is 62-for-91 on 751 yards with four touchdowns. Navarro is also a threat on the ground, recording 44 carries for 220 yards

and three touchdowns. Redshirt junior **Nick Poulos** made his Bobcat debut against Morgan State (Sept. 14) and his first start against Kentucky (Sept. 21). He is currently 10-for-23 with one interception on 135 yards in the air while recording 62 rushing yards on 13 attempts.

Graduate student running back **Anthony Tyus III** solidified himself as a force to be reckoned with, finishing the game against Syracuse with 203 rushing yards, marking the first time since 2021 a Bobcat passed the 200-rushing-yards-mark in a single game. On the season, Tyus has 87 carries on a team-leading 500 yards and five touchdowns (four rushing, one passing), making him the team's leading scorer. Redshirt freshman running back **Rickey Hunt Jr.** has made appearances in all five games for the Bobcats, recording 152 yards on 40 attempts. Freshman running back **Duncan Brune** net 33 rushing yards on six carries against Kentucky (Sept. 21).

Graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen** leads the team with 466 yards and two touchdowns on 31 catches. **Chase Hendricks** has accumulated 136 receiving yards and one receiving touchdown so far this season while redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Rodney Harris II**, redshirt junior wide receiver **Caleb Gossett** and redshirt freshman tight end **Mason Williams** have contributed as well. Running backs **Rickey Hunt Jr.** and **Anthony Tyus III** have made themselves known as dual threats; both have multiple receptions under their belt this season, and Tyus's first touchdown against Morgan State (Sept. 14) was the result of a 19-yard pass from Navarro.

On the defensive side of the ball, graduate student linebacker **Blake Leake** leads the team with 35 tackles—including 16 solo stops—and two quarterback hurries. Junior safety **Austin Brawley** is just behind Leake with 33 total tackles, 22 of which were solo, one interception and one pass breakup, while graduate student safety **Dustin Johnson** has 27 tackles on the season. In addition to Brawley's, senior cornerback **Tank Pearson**, graduate student defensive end **Marcel Walker-Burgess** and redshirt freshman safety **DJ Walker** each snagged one interception apiece for the Bobcats.

Kicker **Gianni Spetic** is 5-for-6 on field goals and 11-for-11 on PATs. Spetic has also accumulated 1,383 yards on 22 kickoffs. Punter **Jack Wilson** has 25 punts on the season for 1,061 total yards, with his longest clocking in at 56 yards.

MAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

The Ohio football program's graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro** earned Mid-American Conference Co-Offensive

Player of the Week accolades for his performance against the Akron Zips. He shares the title with Bowling Green's junior tight end, Harold Fannin Jr.

Navarro had a career day against the Zips, leading the Bobcats to a 30-10 Homecoming victory to open MAC play. The quarterback set career highs in single-game yards (331) as well as rushing yards (113), leading the team on the ground with 13 carries and a touchdown. Notably, Navarro tied his single-game record for passing yards (204) as well. He finished the game with three total touchdowns (2 passing, 1 rushing).

OWEN GOES FOR 100

Graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen** has consistently led the receiving room this season. On Saturday (Sept. 14), he reached a significant milestone—over 100 receiving yards in one game. Owen finished the game with 6 receptions and 112 yards, highlighted by a 53-yard catch to end the first quarter.

600 WINS FOR OHIO

The Bobcats' 27-20 victory over South Alabama (Sept. 7) not only marked the team's first home victory of the season, but also a major program milestone: 600 wins.

Ohio played its inaugural game in 1894, falling to Marietta College, 8-0. Their first coach was named for the 1895 season, where they finished with a 2-3 record.

Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium carries the names of two legendary Ohio football coaches: Don Peden and Frank Solich. Peden led the team from 1924-46, touting a 121-46-11 record. After 16 seasons at the helm, Solich retired the "Winningest Coach in the MAC" with 75 conference victories.

NAVARRO TAKES OFF

Parker Navarro led the Bobcats to their 600th program win last Saturday (Sept. 7), defeating South Alabama 27-20. Navarro finished the game 20-28 on 204, marking career highs for the quarterback in pass attempts, completions and passing yards. Navarro closed the first half with the Bobcats' first passing touchdown of the season, giving Ohio a 17-10 lead after a 33-yard throw to wide receiver Chase Hendricks. Later, he earned his first touchdown of the season on a designed keeper in the eighth minute of the third quarter.

TOUCHDOWN TYUS x2

Running back **Anthony Tyus III** made a splash in his Bobcat debut (Sept. 7), scoring both of Ohio's touchdowns against Syracuse. In the process, Tyus amassed 203 rushing yards—a mere 19 yards behind the program's top 10 individual rushing yards



in a game. The most recent record in this bunch is from 2012, when Beau Blankenship recorded 269 rushing yards against UMass.

The last time a Bobcat rushed for over 200 yards in a single game was in 2021. Ohio's 34-17 victory over Akron marked Tim Albin's first victory as head coach and was accompanied by a whopping 398 rushing yards—with De'Montre Tuggle contributing 201 of them. On the day, Tuggle also recorded one rushing touchdown on 17 attempts, with his longest rush clocking in at 63 yards.

SPETIC'S STRONG START

Sophomore kicker **Gianni Spetic** scored Ohio's first nine points of the season with three field goals in the first half against Syracuse. Spetic's longest of the day clocked in at 43-yards, giving Ohio an early 3-0 lead. He doubled that lead with just 11 seconds remaining in the first quarter, kicking a 37-yard field goal to wrap up a 12-play, 54-yard drive.

At the end of the second quarter, Spetic struck again, cutting Syracuse's lead to one point with a 20-yard kick. On the day, he was also 1-for-1 on PATs and amassed 389 yards on six kickoffs, averaging 64.8 yards per kick.

RETURN OF RICKEY HUNT JR.

Rickey Hunt Jr. cemented himself in Ohio and NCAA history with his awe-inspiring performance in the Bobcats' 41-21 victory over Georgia Southern in the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl. The then true freshman recording his first five collegiate touchdowns, tying the NCAA record for touchdowns scored in a bowl game.

Additionally, he set the program record for most touchdowns scored in a game (5), which also marks the most touchdowns a Bobcat scored in a bowl game since Dorian Brown in Bahamas Bowl (4). This stellar performance earned him 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl MVP accolades.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The Ohio football team named six captains for the 2024 season—graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro**, graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen**, graduate student offensive lineman **Parker Titsworth**, redshirt junior defensive end **Bradley Weaver**, junior safety **Adonis Williams Jr.** and graduate student safety **Jeremiah Wood**. All six athletes are entering their first season as team captains.

Navarro led the Bobcats to their 41-21 victory over Georgia Southern in the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl (Dec. 16), throwing for 120 yards while also accumulating 71 rushing yards.

Owen is entering his first season with Ohio. He spent last five seasons with Northern

Arizona, appearing in 39 total games. Owen scored 18 touchdowns over his NAU career, including an 85-yard punt return in 2023. He's earned numerous accolades, including 2022 and 2023 Second Team All-Big Sky recognition.

Titsworth has been a staple in the Bobcats' offensive line since 2021 and has started in every game since 2022. In 2023, the offensive line helped the offense average 24.31 points and 348 yards per game, scoring 37 touchdowns on the season. Off the field, Titsworth earned academic accolades as well when he was named to the College Sports Communicators 2023 Academic All-District® Football Team as well as the 2023 Academic All-MAC Team.

Weaver was a force to be reckoned with in the 2023 season, playing in all 13 games, 12 of which he started in. He totaled 34 tackles, 13 tackles for loss and six sacks. Against Kent State (Oct. 7), he tallied a season-best six tackles.

Williams was a staple in Ohio's defensive unit in 2023, starting in 11 of 13 games. In his 12 appearances, Williams tallied 39 tackles—including 20 solo stops—one interception and three pass deflections.

Wood has been with the Bobcats since the 2018 season. He appeared in 10 games for Ohio in 2023, starting five times. On the season, he recorded 26 tackles along with 2.5 tackles for loss and an interception against Georgia Southern (Dec. 16).

10-WIN TIM

After three seasons at the helm, head coach **Tim Albin** has firmly cemented himself in the Ohio record books. The 2022 Bobcats kicked off a seven-game winning streak with a 55-34 Homecoming victory over Akron, culminating in the MAC East Champion title and a trip to Detroit for the MAC Championship. Capping off the 2022 season with an overtime victory at the Barstool Sports Arizona Bowl, the team went down in history as the fourth team in program history to record 10 wins.

The 2023 squad finished the regular season 9-3 overall, earning a bid to the Myrtle Beach Bowl. They kicked off bowl season on Dec. 16, holding the Georgia Southern Eagles scoreless into the third quarter. With 29 seconds on the clock, quarterback **Parker Navarro** took a knee, and the Bobcats went into victory formation, solidifying their 41-21 win and their second-consecutive 10-win season, marking a program first.

BRIAN SMITH NAMED OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Brian Smith is stepping into a new role for Ohio in 2024—play caller and offensive coordinator. Smith came to the Bobcats in spring 2022 by way of Washington State,

where he was the offensive coordinator and associate head coach.

In his time at Ohio, he's developed two of Ohio's more infamous running backs: Sieh Bangura and **Rickey Hunt Jr.** Bangura was named 2022 MAC Freshman of the Year honors, finishing the season fourth in the league with 1,078 total rushing yards and third in total rushing touchdowns (13). In MAC play, Bangura recorded a conference-best 11 rushing touchdowns. The next season, Hunt made a splash at the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl (Dec. 16). Hunt not only scored his first rushing and receiving touchdowns during the bowl game but set a program record for most touchdowns scored in a single game (5) and tied the NCAA record for number of touchdowns scored in a bowl game.

Smith was a long snapper and center at Hawaii from 1998-01 before signing professional contracts with the Baltimore Ravens (2002) and Green Bay Packers (2003). He earned his bachelor's degree from Hawaii and continued his education at California Lutheran, earning his master's degree.

JOHN HAUSER NAMED DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

After earning his first promotion in spring 2023, **John Hauser** was named the Bobcats' new defensive coordinator in spring 2024.

The 2023 season was a historic one for the Bobcats, and a large portion of that success can be credited to the defense, who finished the season No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference and No. 4 in FBS football. Notably, the defense held Power 5 opponent to only seven points (Sept. 16), Western Michigan (Oct. 21) to their lowest number of rushing yards in the season (79) and set the program record for the most turnovers forced in a bowl game (5) at the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl.

Previously, Hauser was Miami's (OH) cornerbacks coach for eight years, where he mentored several memorable MAC defenders including Quinten Rollins and Emmanuel Rugama.

Hauser started his career in 2002 at his alma mater, Wittenberg University, where he was an assistant coach. While he was a student-athlete at Wittenberg, Hauser was named all-conference three times and earned a spot on the Division III All-American team in 2002.

ANDRE ALLEN NAMED OHIO'S WIDE RECEIVERS COACH

College football coaching veteran **Andre Allen** joined Ohio in spring 2024 as their wide receivers coach. He brings with him over 30 years of coaching experience, including 27 years at the City College of San Francisco.



Most recently, Allen served as the wide receivers coach at UC Davis and Washington State for two years each. While in Pullman, the Cougars' 2021 Apple Cup win marked the program's largest margin of victory in the rivalry game's history. Allen coached four wideouts to conference accolades in 2021, marking the first set of Cougar wideouts to earn all-conference first or second team since 2004.

A San Francisco native, Allen played at CCSF from 1987-89 and the University of Tennessee—Martin from 1989-91. He earned a bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Ashford.

KURT MATTIX JOINS BOBCATS COACHING STAFF AS PASS RUSH SPECIALIST AND DEFENSIVE ENDS COACH

Kurt Mattix arrived in Athens in April 2024 as the football team's new defensive ends coach. Shortly after his arrival in Athens, Mattix added Pass Rush Specialist to his title.

Mattix comes to Ohio by way of San Diego State, where he served as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2020-23. Since Mattix took over as the defensive coordinator, the Aztecs rank ninth in rushing defense, 17th in total defense, and 18th in scoring and pass efficiency rating. The 2023 season saw Mattix's defense force 18 turnovers with 10 interceptions and eight fumble recoveries. The 10 interceptions ranked 22nd in FBS and this performance earned three athletes All-Mountain West honors.

Mattix started his collegiate career at the University of Indianapolis, where he was a student-athlete from 1994-95 before using his final two years of eligibility at Valparaiso. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education at Valparaiso in 1999.

BOBCATS IN THE CFL

Quarterback **Nathan Rourke** returned to the BC Lions for the 2024 season after spending 2023 in the NFL. In his first stint with the CFL (2021-22), Rourke was named Most Outstanding Canadian (Nov. 17, 2022). He is the first BC Lions' quarterback and the third quarterback in CFL history to earn the honor. Upon his return, Rourke became the highest-paid CFL athlete, signing a lucrative contract that includes \$200,000 of marketing money, which does not count toward the CFL's salary cap.

Running back **AJ Ouellette**, who quickly became a CFL household name, is currently playing for the Saskatchewan Roughriders. Previously, Ouellette played for the Toronto Argonauts, who are the 109th Grey Cup Champions. Defensive tackle **Casey Sayles**, who was a member of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers at the time, competed in the same Grey Cup. Both Sayles and Ouellette were named 2023 CFL Division All-Stars. Currently, Sayles is on the Hamilton Tiger-Cats.

Ohio football alumnus **Chip Cox** is a part of

the 2022 CFL Hall of Fame class, earning the honor in his first year of eligibility. Cox played 13 seasons for the Montreal Alouettes, wrapping up his career with the fourth highest total defensive tackles in CFL history (979).

BOBCATS IN THE NFL

Multiple former Ohio football student-athletes are representing the Bobcats at the highest level of the sport.

Wide receiver **Sam Wiglusz** signed with the Los Angeles Rams on April 27, 2024, as an undrafted free agent. Defensive tackle **Rodney Mathews** signed with the Seattle Seahawks as an undrafted free agent on July 31, 2024 after he was released from the Green Bay Packers.

Former Ohio quarterback **Armani Rogers** signed with the Washington Commanders as a tight end in 2022. Currently, he is with the Philadelphia Eagles. Offensive lineman **Austen Pleasants** signed with the Arizona Cardinals after spending the 2023 season with the Los Angeles Chargers.

Prior to his return to the CFL, quarterback **Nathan Rourke** spent the 2023 season with the Jacksonville Jaguars. He was claimed off waivers by the New England Patriots in Dec. 2023, who released him in May 2024. Rourke was signed by the New York Giants and the Atlanta Falcons before re-signing with the CFL's BC Lions.

Tim Albin was named the head football coach at Ohio on July 14, 2021.

The 2023 squad finished the regular season with a 9-3 record, marking the first time Ohio football finished consecutive regular seasons with nine wins. Notably, Ohio defeated Iowa State 10-7 at home (Sept. 16) to mark its first Power Five win since 2017 during a five-game winning streak. Later in the season, their 34-20 victory over Central Michigan marked the first time since 2011 the Bobcats defeated the Chippewas and the first time they won this matchup at home since 2000.

The 2022 football team finished the season as MAC East (7-1) and Arizona Bowl Champions with a 10-4 record, marking its first 10-win season since 2011 and the second-best turnaround in FBS football last year. The Bobcats were also undefeated at home, posting a 6-0 record on Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium, and wrapped up the regular season with a seven-game winning streak.

This performance earned Albin MAC Coach of the Year honors, quarterback Kurtis Rourke MAC Offensive Player of the Year honors as well as the Vern Smith Leadership Award and running back Sieh Bangura MAC Freshman of the Year accolades.

Since his arrival in Athens, Albin has produced offensive units that have consistently ranked among the top of the Mid-American Conference. He also has directed an offensive attack that has practically rewritten all of Ohio's rushing, passing records, and scoring records. In the past 10 seasons, Albin's offensive units rank No. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 on the Ohio all-time Top 10 single season scoring list. The Bobcats 368 points in 2016 rank fourth on the all-time list.

In 2016, the Bobcats had the most pass attempts (458) and second-most completions (250) in school history. The offense totaled 5,492 yards of total offense which is third all-time at Ohio. The Bobcats also compiled the second-most pass yards in school history (3,142) and the fourth most touchdown passes (22).

In 2015, the offense totaled 5,378 yards, which ranks third all-time in program history. The Bobcat quarterbacks passed for 3,026 yards, which ranks third all-time in program history as well.

In 2014, the offense totaled 4,443 yards of offense which ranked fifth all-time in program history. The combination of Derrius Vick and JD Sprague proved to be dynamic through the air as the quarterbacks combined to pass for 2,474 yards for the season which is sixth all-time in program history.

The Bobcat offense found a balanced attack with AJ Ouellette in the backfield. The freshman ran for 785 yards ranking him only behind Kareem Wilson for most yards on the ground for a freshman.

In 2013, under Albin's watchful eye, Ohio's offensive attack averaged 379.4 yards per game and surpassed 400 yards of total offense in seven games during the 2013 campaign. The Bobcats closed the year with 4,932 yards of total offense. The 2013 campaign also marked the final season of Ohio's most prolific offensive trio in school history as quarterback Tyler Tettleton, running back Beau Blankenship and wide Donte' Foster all concluded their respective collegiate careers.

Albin recruited all three players and all three players flourished in his offensive scheme. At the end of their respective careers, Tettleton, Blankenship and Foster accounted for over 25,000 yards of total offense and 128 touchdowns.

Tettleton finished his career at Ohio with 27 school records and once again passed for over 2,500 yards through the air. He is the only quarterback in school history to pass for over 2,500 yards in three-consecutive seasons.

Blankenship closed his senior campaign with 910 yards rushing and five touchdowns. He finished his career fifth on the all-time rushing list with 2,976 yards.

Foster concluded his senior campaign with his best single-season of his career as he finished with 1,018 yards receiving and seven touchdowns. The Guthrie, Okla., native became just the second wide receiver in school history to surpass 1,000 yards receiving. He also finished his career with the most all-time touchdown receptions (21). Following the year, Foster was selected to the All-MAC Second Team.

In 2012, Albin's offensive unit that accounted for 5,782 yards. In fact, Ohio was one of just four teams in the Mid-American Conference to post 5,500-yards or more of total offense in 2012 (Northern Illinois, Ball State and Toledo). Ohio had seven games in which it surpassed 450 yards of total offense.

Albin's offensive unit played a major role in Ohio's 45-14 victory in the Advocare V100 Independence Bowl. In the win, the Bobcats' 556 yards of total offense served as an Independence Bowl record, while their 45 points tied the Bowl record. Following the game, Blankenship and Tettleton were named Co-Offensive Most Valuable Players of the Independence Bowl.

Ohio's 2012 offensive unit averaged over 30 points per game for the second straight season and the third time in the last six years. In addition, the Bobcats scored 40-or-more points in four different games.

The 2012 campaign also saw Blankenship rush for a single-season school record 1,604 yards and 15 touchdowns. He became the eighth running back in school history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a single season. Following the year, Blankenship was named All-MAC Second Team. Offensive lineman Skyler Allen

and Eric Herman joined Blankenship on the All-MAC Second Team. Since taking over as offensive coordinator in 2005, Albin has coached 26 All-MAC players and All-Americans LaVon Brazill (2009) and Joe Flading (2011).

Tettleton once again posted a memorable season under Albin's direction as he passed for 2,844 yards and 18 touchdowns, while throwing just four interceptions in 12 games.

In April of 2013, Herman became the third offensive player to be selected in the NFL Draft over the last four years as he was drafted by the New York Giants in the seventh round.

In 2011, Albin's offensive scheme led to the most prolific year in school history. Ohio set eight team single-season offensive records, posting school standards for most yards gained (6,241), most passing yards gained (3,482), most offensive plays (1,026), average yards per game (445.8), passing attempts (429), most points scored (427), most passing completions (276) and most passing yards per game (248.7).

Under Albin's watchful eye, Tettleton re-wrote the Bobcats' single season record book in his first-year as a starting quarterback as he set 12 school standards, while becoming the first signal caller in program history to throw for over 3,000 yards. In addition, Tettleton accounted for 38 total touchdowns (28 passing and 10 rushing) and nearly 4,000 yards of total offense (3,960) en route to being named All-MAC Third Team.

The 2011 Ohio offensive unit also produced record-breaking performances from Brazill and Donte' Harden as the two combined to set eight single-season records. Brazill would go on to finish his career as the program's all-time leader for receiving yards (2,511) and receptions (189).

At the end of the year, a league-best six Bobcats were named to the MAC's All-League team on the offensive side of the ball.

In April of 2012, Brazill was selected in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts.

In 2010, Boo Jackson finished his career as Ohio's career leader in completion percentage (.604), pass efficiency (136.3), total offense per play (6.18), passing yards per attempt (7.7) and touchdown passes (38). He also finished the season responsible for 26 touchdowns, 48 in his career, which is fourth all-time, and with 18 passing touchdowns in 2010 (fourth all-time on the single-season list).

Ohio also had the best red zone efficiency among all MAC teams in 2010, converting 88.4 percent of its tries inside the 20-yard line. The Bobcats converted 38 times on 43 occasions, scoring 38 touchdowns and five field goals. Ohio was also outstanding at running the football, finishing second in the conference with 1,416 yards on the ground (177.0 per game average) for the 2010 season and 19 touchdowns.

In 2009, Albin's offense took aim at more of Ohio's all-time marks. Quarterback Theo Scott threw 20 touchdown passes, which stood as a school record until the 2011 season, while receiver Terrence McCrae tied Andrew Mooney's then single-season touchdown

reception mark of nine.

The 2009 team also finished with passing yards (2,774), completions (228) and total offense (4,342) all of which rank among the program's top five all-time marks.

Albin mentored running back Calvin McRae who earned first-team All-MAC honors in 2005, 2006 and 2007. McRae is the first Bobcat in history to crack the 1,000-yard mark in three straight seasons. Under Albin's tutelage, McRae rushed for 4,398 yards and 45 touchdowns. McRae owns the second, fourth and sixth-highest single-season rushing totals in school history after setting the single-season rushing, touchdown and points scored records.

Albin spent the 2004 season as offensive coordinator and running backs coach at North Dakota State, helping the Bison to an 8-3 record and No. 25 national ranking in their first season at the Division I-AA level. NDSU finished the season averaging 378.5 yards of total offense, including 192.4 on the ground, and had four offensive players named first-team All-Great West Football Conference.

Albin served with Solich at Nebraska from 2000 to 2003. He started with the Cornhusker program as a graduate assistant, a position he held for three seasons before being promoted to running backs coach and passing game coordinator for the 2003 season. Working with the Nebraska tight ends as a graduate assistant, Albin helped Tracey Wistrom earn third-team All-America status in back-to-back seasons.

Prior to his stint at Nebraska, Albin was the head coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State for three seasons, winning the NAIA national championship in 1999 with a 13-0 record. He was named NAIA Football Coach of the Year by Rawlings and American Football Coach Magazine as the Rangers recorded their first undefeated season in history. Six of his players earned NAIA All-America honors. Albin's three squads improved every season going from 5-5 in 1997 to 7-3 in 1998.

Returning to his alma mater in 1994, Albin served as Northwestern Oklahoma State's offensive coordinator and head men's and women's cross country and track and field coach prior to his promotion to head coach of the football program.

He earned Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference Coach of the Year honors twice for his work with the men's track program, leading them to back-to-back league titles. Albin got his start in coaching at Northeastern State (Okla.) in 1989 where he won two conference titles as an assistant football coach and two more as head of the men's track program.

As a player, Albin was a first-team All-Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference selection as a wide receiver in each of his final three seasons as a member of the Northwestern Oklahoma State squad. He added to those honors by becoming the first Rangers' player to earn All-District IX status three times.

Albin received His bachelor's of science in business administration from Northwestern Oklahoma State in 1989 and a master's of science from Northeastern State in 1991. A native of Woodward, Okla., Albin was born on Sept. 13, 1965. He and his wife, Brooke, have two children - daughter Tori, and son Treyce.
