THE OPENING KICK

The Ohio football team (9-3, 7-1 MAC) is set to reprise the Battle of the Bricks when it takes on rival Miami (Ohio) (8-4, 7-1 MAC) for the MAC Championship on Saturday, Dec. 7 at Ford Field. Kickoff is set for 12 p.m. ET and can be seen on ESPN with Anish Shroff, Andre Ware and Paul Carcaterra on the call

The Bobcats' matchup can also be heard on the Ohio Sports Network from Learfield, presented by Holzer Health System. Veteran Ohio radio personality Marty Bannister is stepping into the 2024 play-by-play role and will be joined by Rob Cornelius, who has been a part of the broadcasts for two decades.

SERIES HISTORY VS. MIAMI (OHIO)

The Bobcats and the RedHawks have met 100 times since 1908, posting a 42-56-2 record.

The two teams last met on Oct. 19, 2024, at Yager Stadium in Oxford, Ohio. The Bobcats fell, 30-20.

Saturday's game marks the first time Ohio and Miami will meet in a football championship game.

SCOUTING MIAMI (OHIO)

The RedHawks are currently 8-4 overall and 7-1 against MAC opponents, coming off a 28-12 victory over Bowling Green on Black Friday (Nov. 29). As a team, Miami averages 24.25 points per game on 134.6 rushing yards and 227.75 passing yards.

Miami's offense is led by sixth-year quarterback Brett Gabbert. Currently, Gabbert is 190-for-329 with 10 interceptions, logging 21 touchdowns on 2,610 yards through the air.

On the ground, senior running back Keyon Mozee holds the team-high in carries (159), rushing yards (1,045) and rushing touchdowns (4). He holds the second-longest rush (74 yds), just trailing redshirt junior running back Jordan Brunson (75 yds). On the season, Brunson has recorded two rushing touchdowns on 38 touches and 248 yards. Senior running backs Kevin Davis and Dylan Downing have also contributed to the RedHawks' offense, responsible for the remaining three rushing touchdowns of the season.

Junior wide receiver Reggie Virgil and redshirt sophomore wide receiver Javon Tracey lead the RedHawks'

receiving room with 787 and 760 yards, respectively. They've recorded 16 receiving touchdowns between the two of them, with Virgil claiming a team-best nine receiving touchdowns and Tracey trailing with seven. Redshirt senior wide receiver Cade McDonald has also been a major contributor this season and currently has 47 catches and three touchdowns on 589 yards.

On the defensive side of the ball, sixth-year linebacker Matt Salopek is among the top 10 tacklers in the league with 106 total tackles, including 52 solo stops. Redshirt senior defensive lineman Brian Uwu leads the team in tackles for loss (14) and sacks (7.5). Miami's defense is among the top in the MAC in interceptions (11), with redshirt junior linebacker Corban Hondru and Salopek responsible for three apiece. Sophomore defensive back Raion Strader is responsible for a team-best 16 pass breakups as well as two interceptions and 50 total tackles.

Kicker/punter Dom Dzioban is 22-for-26 on field goals this season, with his longest reaching 51 yards. Kicker/punter Alec Bevelhimer has accumulated 2,177 yards on 53 punts, averaging 41.08 yards per punt.

LAST TIME OUT

The Ohio football team capped off another undefeated season at home after thumping Ball State 42-21 on Friday afternoon (Nov. 29). The victory also punched Ohio's ticket to the Mid-American Conference Championship for the second time in Tim Albin's four years as head coach.

Graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen** kick-started the Bobcats' win with touchdowns in back-to-back drives in the first quarter. His first six points came on a 50-yard reception from graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro**. The latter of his six were collected on a 41-yard reception.

It was during the second quarter in which Owen became the third Bobcat to tally 1,000 receiving yards in a season. He joined LaVon Brazill and Donte' Foster, who reached that benchmark in 2011 and 2013, respectively. Owen finished the afternoon with 142 yards on five receptions.

Ball State's offense was defenseless through the majority of the first half. Graduate student defensive end **Ben McNaboe** sacked Kadin Semonza for a loss of three yards on 2nd and 7 and graduate student defensive end **Bradley Weaver** hurried him the next play to end Ball State's first drive before it truly began.

The same happened on the Cardinals' first drive of the second quarter. McNaboe broke up Semonza's first pass attempt and redshirt junior linebacker **Shay Taylor** did the same on his second. Later in the quarter, graduate student defensive end **Marcel Walker-Burgess** sacked

Semonza for a 1-yard loss.

Ohio had a healthy lead by halftime after Navarro ran in a 20-yard touchdown. Even though Ball State had finally gotten on the board, Ohio knew it was in a good place.

The Bobcats' confidence came through on the first drive of the second half. Weaver sacked Semonza for a loss of 12 yards, which caused him to fumble the ball. Taylor then returned the loose ball for six yards to put the Bobcats in the redzone.

It didn't take long for Navarro to cross the white line for his second rushing touchdown of the day. He ended the afternoon with 110 yards on the ground and 169 yards in the air.

Redshirt junior quarterback **Nick Poulos** took over for Navarro halfway through the third quarter. It was around then that the Cardinals scored their second touchdown of the day. However, the Bobcats did not settle. Junior wide receiver **Max Rodarte** scored on a 19-yard reception to put the Bobcats ahead by 28 points.

The Cardinals picked at the lead with a touchdown in the last three minutes of the game, but it wasn't near enough to dent the Bobcats' total. For the third time this season, the Bobcats scored 40 or more points.

SCOUTING OHIO

The Bobcats are currently 9-3 overall and 7-1 against MAC opponents. They average 28.50 points per game on 210.5 rushing yards and 183.75 passing yards per game.

In the air, graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro** is 156-for-240 on 1,934 yards with 10 touchdowns. Navarro is also a threat on the ground, recording 132 carries for 876 yards and a team-best 13 touchdowns, making him the team's leading scorer. Notably, Navarro broke his single-game rushing yards record against CMU (176) and is the fourth quarterback

in program history to score four rushing touchdowns in a game (Nov. 13 vs. .EMU). Redshirt junior **Nick Poulos** made his Bobcat debut against Morgan State (Sept. 14) and his first start against Kentucky (Sept. 21). He is currently 22-for-49 with one interception on 271 yards in the air while recording 149 rushing yards on 28 attempts.

Graduate student running back **Anthony Tyus III** solidified himself as a force to be reckoned with, finishing the game against Syracuse with 203 rushing yards, marking the first time since 2021 a Bobcat passed the 200-rushing-yards-mark in a single game. On the season, Tyus has 184 carries on a team-leading 960 yards and nine touchdowns (eight rushing, one receiving). Redshirt freshman running back **Rickey Hunt Jr.** has made appearances in 11 games for the Bobcats, recording 365 yards and two touchdowns on 73 touches. Hunt owns the longest rush of the year (59 yards). Freshman running back **Duncan Brune** net 84 rushing yards on 26 carries so far this season, scoring his first collegiate touchdown against Central Michigan (Oct. 12).

Graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen** leads the team with 1,032 yards and seven touchdowns on 62 catches, becoming one of three Bobcats to log over 1,000 receiving yards in a single season during the second quarter of Ohio's Black Friday game against Ball State. Additionally, Owen scored his first rushing touchdown as a Bobcat against Buffalo (Oct. 26). **Chase Hendricks** has accumulated 392 receiving yards and one receiving touchdown so far this season. Redshirt sophomore wide receiver **Rodney Harris II**, redshirt junior wide receiver **Caleb Gossett** and redshirt freshman tight end **Mason Williams** have also contributed. Running backs **Rickey Hunt Jr.** and **Anthony Tyus III** have made themselves known as dual threats; both have multiple receptions under their belt this season, and Tyus's first touchdown against Morgan State (Sept. 14) was the result of a 19-yard pass from Navarro.

On the defensive side of the ball, graduate student linebacker **Blake Leake** leads the team with 73 total tackles, including 30 solo stops and three tackles for loss. Graduate student safety **Dustin Johnson** trails Leake with 67 tackles—including a team-best 42 solo tackles—and 1.5 tackles for loss. Redshirt junior linebacker **Shay Taylor** and graduate student defensive end **Marcel Walker-Burgess** are just behind with 63 and 52 tackles, respectively. Notably, both Walker-Burgess and Taylor added to the Bobcats' nine interceptions on the season, with Taylor closing Ohio's dominant victory against Buffalo (Oct. 26) with a pick-six. Senior cornerback **Tank Pearson** claims

a team-best three interceptions, snagging two against Eastern Michigan (Nov. 13). Graduate student defensive end **Bradley Weaver** leads the defense in sacks (8) and tackles for loss (12.5).

Kicker **Gianni Spetic** is responsible for 72 total points so far this season. Currently, he is 11-for-14 on field goals and 39-for-39 on PATs. Additionally, Spetic has also accumulated 3,947 yards on 64 kickoffs. Punter **Jack Wilson** has 54 punts on the season for 2,219 total yards, with his longest clocking in at 56 yards.

ALBIN NAMED COACH OF THE YEAR

Fourth-year head coach **Tim Albin** was named MAC Coach of the Year, as announced by the league Thursday (Dec. 5). This marks his second Coach of the Year title in four years.

In the Bobcats' four years under Albin, they've recorded three consecutive nine-win regular seasons, two consecutive 10-win seasons and have earned a bid to the MAC Championship twice, with their second appearance slated for Saturday (Dec. 7). Ohio has been bowl-eligible three of the last four season, winning both bowls they attended to match the conference record.

OWEN, WEAVER EARN ALL-MAC FIRST TEAM ACCOLADES

Graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen** All-MAC First Team Offense recognition while graduate student defensive end **Bradley Weaver** represented the Bobcats on All-MAC First Team Defense.

Owen became Ohio's third receiver to record over 1,000 receiving yards in a single season (1,032). With two games left on the 2024 schedule, he is within reach of becoming the Bobcats' all-time single-season receiver. On the season, Owen has scored nine times: seven receiving touchdowns, one rushing touchdown, and highlighted by a 61-yard punt return to the end zone. The team captain earned MAC Offensive Player of the Week honors once (Oct. 28) and a spot on the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll (Oct. 29).

Weaver leads Ohio's defense with 12.5 tackles for loss and eight sacks, making the MAC's top five in both categories. On the season, the captain has logged 36 total tackles—including 22 solo tackles—three forced fumbles, one blocked field goal (Sept. 14) and a team-best seven quarterback hurries.

FIVE BOBCATS NAMED TO ALL-MAC SECOND TEAM

Graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro** was named All-MAC Second Team Offense along with graduate student



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offensive lineman **Parker Titsworth**, redshirt senior offensive lineman **Carson Heidecker** and graduate student running back **Anthony Tyus III**. Redshirt freshman safety **DJ Walker** earned All-MAC Second Team Defense honors.

Heidecker started in 10 of 12 games this season, making appearances as both the left and right tackle throughout the season. The redshirt senior helped Ohio lead the MAC in total yards (4,731) and average yards per game (394.3). Additionally, Ohio's offense in four rushing categories: total yards (2,526), average yards per game (210.5), average yards per touch (5.2) and touchdowns (29).

Navarro is the Bobcats' top scorer, leading the league in rushing touchdowns (13). A force to be reckoned with on the ground, the team captain claims second-most rushing yards (876) for Ohio, putting him fifth in the MAC rankings. In the air, the graduate student is 156-for-240 on 1,934 yards, throwing 10 touchdowns to six different receivers. Navarro's performance earned him MAC weekly accolades four times, highlighted by three consecutive weeks in November, as well as a Davey O'Brien "Great 8" following week 14.

Titsworth started in all 12 games at center for the Bobcats this season. The captain helped the offense execute 772 plays this season on a league-best total yards (4,731) and average yards per game (394.3). Additionally, Ohio's offense in four rushing categories: total yards (2,526), average yards per game (210.5), average yards per touch (5.2) and touchdowns (29).

Tyus leads the Bobcats on the ground and currently sits at 960 rushing yards at the end of the regular season. In 11 games, the graduate student has scored eight touchdowns on a league-leading 184 carries. Notably, Tyus is second in the MAC in rushing yards and longest rush (46 yds).

Walker made a name for himself this season, making an appearance in all 12 regular season games. The redshirt freshman currently has 48 tackles on the season, with 28 solo stops and six tackles for loss. Walker is second on the team in pass breakups (7) and has one forced fumble on the season. Additionally, he recorded his career-first interception against Akron (Sept. 28).

LEAKE, OWEN, TAYLOR NAMED ALL-MAC THIRD TEAM

Redshirt junior linebacker **Shay Taylor** and graduate student linebacker **Blake Leake** both earned All-MAC Third Team Defense accolades while graduate student **Coleman Owen** was recognized a second time, this time as an All-MAC Third-Team Specialist for his performance as a kickoff returner.

Leake has played in all 12 games in the 2024 season. He leads the defense with 73 tackles, including 30 solo stops and three tackles for loss. Additionally, Leake has recorded three pass breakups, two quarterback hurries and one forced fumble.

Taylor has 63 tackles on the season, including 27 solo stops and the second-most tackles for loss on the Bobcats' defense (9). Taylor's snagged his career-first pick-six against Buffalo (Oct. 26), closing Ohio's senior day victory on a high note and earning him a MAC Defensive Player of the Week nod.

OWEN JOINS 1,000 CLUB

With a 28-yard pass in the second quarter of Ohio's Black Friday game against the Ball State Cardinals, graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen** became the third Bobcat in program history to log 1,000 receiving yards in a single season. Joining the ranks of LaVonn Brazill (1,146 yds; 2011) and Donte' Foster (1,018 yds; 2013), Owen cemented himself in program history. With 1,032 receiving yards on the season, Owen is within reach of becoming the program's leading single-season receiver.

NAVARRO NAMED IN WEEK 14 "DAVEY DOUBLE"

Graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro** has been named to the Davey O'Brien Great 8 list for Week 14 following his performance against the Ball State Cardinals. With an action-packed week 14 across the country, this week's list is a Davey Double, honoring 16 total quarterbacks.

Navarro led the Bobcats in their dominant 42-21 victory over the Cardinals Friday (Nov. 29). The graduate student finished the day with 169 passing yards, going 7-for-11 with three touchdowns in the air. Additionally, Navarro was the team's leading rusher, recording two touchdowns on 11 touches and 110 yards on the ground.

On the season, Navarro has thrown 10 touchdowns on 1,934 yards in the air. A force to be reckoned with on the ground, Navarro sits at 876 yards and 13 touchdowns.

The Davey O'Brien Foundation was created in 1977, and the National Quarterback Award, the oldest and most prestigious college quarterback award, was first issued in 1981. Over its time, the Davey O'Brien Foundation has given away more than \$1.2 million in scholarships and university grants to help high school and college athletes transform leadership on the field into leadership in life.

BOBCATS MAKING HISTORY (AGAIN)

For the first time in program history, the Ohio football program logged nine regular-season victories in consecutive years (2022-24).

Ohio's first nine-win season was in 1929 under Don Peden; the season also marked the program's first undefeated year, finishing the season 9-0.

In the four years with Tim Albin at the helm, the Bobcats have made the MAC Championship twice (2022, 2024), finished the regular season 9-3 three times and recorded back-to-back 10-win seasons (2022, 2023).

DEFEND THE FRANK

With their Black Friday victory over Ball State, the 2024 regular season marks the Bobcats' second undefeated season at home. Over the past three seasons (2022-24), Ohio is 17-1 on Frank Solich Field.

LAST TIME IN THE MAC CHAMPIONSHIP

The Bobcats' last trip to Detroit was in 2022 when they took on the Toledo Rockets.

The Rockets struck first, taking a 7-0 lead less than five minutes into the game. Ohio evened the score in the second quarter with a rushing touchdown by then-MAC Freshman of the Year, Sieh Bangura, but were unable to find the endzone again.

Toledo scored two more times, tallying 10 more points to take home a 17-7 victory and the 2022 MAC Champions title.

THE 1968 CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

The Ohio football program was last crowned the Mid-American Conference Champions in 1968.

Head Coach Bill Hess earned Coach of the Year honors after leading his team to a 10-1 season, going undefeated until their 49-42 loss at the Tangerine Bowl against Richmond on Dec. 28. Overall, the team had seven First-Team All-MAC and three Second-Team All-MAC honorees.

Over 50 years later, the 1968 championship team still holds multiple records. To name a few, Todd Snyder claims the first two spots for most receiving yards in a game, with 214 against Richmond and 203 against Dayton. Snyder finished 1968 with 777 receiving yards, tying him for first among the all-time junior class. Cleve Bryant is seventh overall in most yards per game (225.8) as well as touchdowns (22).

Ken Carmon marks one of four Bobcats to be named First-Team All-MAC three times. Snyder, Bryant and Carmon all earned All-America accolades.

OVERALL OHIO CHAMPIONSHIPS

In program history, the Bobcats have won five MAC Championships, four of which were under Bill Hess' guidance.

Ohio won their first championship in 1953



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under Carroll Widdoes. Seven years later, Hess' team won the first of four championships in 1960. Hess's squads were also crowned champions in 1963 and 1968 with a first-place tie in 1967.

MAC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

The Ohio football program has boasted five Mid-American Conference Offensive Players of the Week so far this season. Graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro** earned MAC Offensive Player of the Week accolades four times this season, marking the first Bobcat to win conference honors after his performance against the Akron Zips when he shared the title with Bowling Green's junior tight end, Harold Fannin Jr. Following Ohio's 35-10 win over Eastern Michigan, Navarro's record-setting performance earned him his second conference accolade of the season, marking his first solo MAC Offensive Player of the Week nod. Navarro's performance against the Toledo Rockets earned him another Co-MAC Offensive Player of the Week nod, sharing the title with Bowling Green wide receiver Rahkeem Smith. The following week, Navarro closed the regular season on a high note, claiming another Co-Offensive Player of the Week title alongside Miami (Ohio) quarterback, Brett Gabbert. Graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen** was awarded the title after his dominant performance against Buffalo.

Navarro had a career day against the Zips, leading the Bobcats to a 30-10 Homecoming victory to open MAC play (Sept. 28). The quarterback set career highs in single-game yards (331) as well as rushing yards (113), leading the team on the ground with 13 carries and a touchdown. Notably, Navarro tied his single-game record for passing yards (204) as well. He finished the game with three total touchdowns (2 passing, 1 rushing).

Navarro had a career night as he led the Bobcats to a 35-10 victory over Eastern Michigan (Nov. 13). On the ground, Navarro was a force to be reckoned with, recording his third game this season with over 100 rushing yards (106). Additionally, he scored four rushing touchdowns, matching the program record for most rushing touchdowns in a game and marking the fourth quarterback in program history to hit this benchmark. In the air, the graduate student set a personal record for single-game passing yards (277).

After a slow start first half Wednesday evening (Nov. 20), Navarro led Ohio's offense to a 24-point second half, ultimately defeating Toledo, 24-7. The graduate student was responsible for half of those points, recording two of the three rushing touchdowns on the evening. On the day, he finished with 104 rushing yards on 18 touches. In the air, Navarro went 11-for-19 on 129 yards.

Navarro led the Bobcats in their dominant 42-21 victory over the Ball State Cardinals Friday (Nov.

29). The graduate student finished the day with 169 passing yards, going 7-for-11 with three touchdowns in the air. Additionally, Navarro was the team's leading rusher, recording two touchdowns on 11 touches and 110 yards on the ground.

Owen was instrumental in the Bobcats' dominant 47-16 victory over the Buffalo Bulls (Oct. 26). During his charge to victory, Owen recorded 146 receiving yards and two receiving touchdowns, both marking individual records as a Bobcat. Owen's 65-yard receiving touchdown gave Ohio a 10-point advantage over Buffalo with just over six minutes remaining in the half. Owen slipped into the end zone again in the second quarter, putting the score at 24-10 heading into halftime. Additionally, he scored his first rushing touchdown of the season, wrapping up a six-play, 57-yard drive in the fourth quarter.

MAC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

The Ohio football program's graduate student wide receiver Eamonn Dennis earned Mid-American Conference Co-Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance against the Kent State Golden Flashes. He shared the title with Northern Illinois' wide receiver Cam Thomson.

Dennis made a splash on the special teams unit during Ohio's shutout victory on Wednesday (Nov. 6). The wide receiver opened the third quarter with a 96-yard kickoff return, marking the first Bobcat to score a touchdown off a kickoff return since 2022 as well as his first touchdown for OU. After a successful PAT, Dennis' touchdown extended Ohio's lead to 27 points.

MAC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK
Redshirt junior linebacker Shay Taylor marked the first Bobcat of the 2024 season to earn Mid-American Conference Defensive Player of the Week accolades (Oct. 28).

Taylor put a bow on Ohio's 47-16 victory over Buffalo. With 11:58 left on the clock, Taylor snagged an interception, returning it 30 yards for the final touchdown of the game. This marked Taylor's career-first pick-six. On the game, Taylor recorded a team-leading 11 tackles, including four solo stops and 1.5 tackles for loss.

NAVARRO RUNS FOR FOUR

Graduate student quarterback Parker Navarro etched his name in the record books during the Bobcats' 35-10 victory over the Eastern Michigan Eagles. Navarro scored four rushing touchdowns, becoming the ninth Bobcat since 1966 to do so.

Additionally, he joins Nathan Rourke (2018 vs. Akron), Kareem Wilson (1996 vs. Bowling Green) and Andy Vetter (1976 vs. Northern Illinois) as the only quarterbacks in program history to score four rushing touchdowns. Redshirt freshman running back Rickey Hunt Jr. was the last Bobcat to join this exclusive club,

doing so after his breakout performance in the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl.

600 WINS FOR OHIO

The Bobcats' 27-20 victory over South Alabama (Sept. 7) not only marked the team's first home victory of the season, but also a major program milestone: 600 wins.

Ohio played its inaugural game in 1894, falling to Marietta College, 8-0. Their first coach was named for the 1895 season, where they finished with a 2-3 record.

Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium carries the names of two legendary Ohio football coaches: Don Peden and Frank Solich. Peden led the team from 1924-46, touting a 121-46-11 record. After 16 seasons at the helm, Solich retired the "Winningest Coach in the MAC" with 75 conference victories.

TOUCHDOWN TYUS x2

Running back **Anthony Tyus III** made a splash in his Bobcat debut (Sept. 7), scoring both of Ohio's touchdowns against Syracuse. In the process, Tyus amassed 203 rushing yards—a mere 19 yards behind the program's top 10 individual rushing yards in a game. The most recent record in this bunch is from 2012, when Beau Blankenship recorded 269 rushing yards against UMass.

The last time a Bobcat rushed for over 200 yards in a single game was in 2021. Ohio's 34-17 victory over Akron marked Tim Albin's first victory as head coach and was accompanied by a whopping 398 rushing yards—with De'Montre Tuggle contributing 201 of them. On the day, Tuggle also recorded one rushing touchdown on 17 attempts, with his longest rush clocking in at 63 yards.

SPETIC'S STRONG START

Sophomore kicker **Gianni Spetic** scored Ohio's first nine points of the season with three field goals in the first half against Syracuse. Spetic's longest of the day clocked in at 43-yards, giving Ohio an early 3-0 lead. He doubled that lead with just 11 seconds remaining in the first quarter, kicking a 37-yard field goal to wrap up a 12-play, 54-yard drive.

At the end of the second quarter, Spetic struck again, cutting Syracuse's lead to one point with a 20-yard kick. On the day, he was also 1-for-1 on PATs and amassed 389 yards on six kickoffs, averaging 64.8 yards per kick.

RETURN OF RICKEY HUNT JR.

Rickey Hunt Jr. cemented himself in Ohio and NCAA history with his awe-inspiring performance in the Bobcats' 41-21 victory over Georgia Southern in the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl. The then true freshman recording his first five collegiate touchdowns, tying the NCAA record for touchdowns scored in a bowl game.

Additionally, he set the program record for most



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touchdowns scored in a game (5), which also marks the most touchdowns a Bobcat scored in a bowl game since Dorian Brown in Bahamas Bowl (4). This stellar performance earned him 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl MVP accolades.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The Ohio football team named six captains for the 2024 season—graduate student quarterback **Parker Navarro**, graduate student wide receiver **Coleman Owen**, graduate student offensive lineman **Parker Titsworth**, redshirt junior defensive end **Bradley Weaver**, junior safety **Adonis Williams Jr.** and graduate student safety **Jeremiah Wood**. All six athletes are entering their first season as team captains.

Navarro led the Bobcats to their 41-21 victory over Georgia Southern in the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl (Dec. 16), throwing for 120 yards while also accumulating 71 rushing yards.

Owen is entering his first season with Ohio. He spent last five seasons with Northern Arizona, appearing in 39 total games. Owen scored 18 touchdowns over his NAU career, including an 85-yard punt return in 2023. He's earned numerous accolades, including 2022 and 2023 Second Team All-Big Sky recognition.

Titsworth has been a staple in the Bobcats' offensive line since 2021 and has started in every game since 2022. In 2023, the offensive line helped the offense average 24.31 points and 348 yards per game, scoring 37 touchdowns on the season. Off the field, Titsworth earned academic accolades as well when he was named to the College Sports Communicators 2023 Academic All-District® Football Team as well as the 2023 Academic All-MAC Team.

Weaver was a force to be reckoned with in the 2023 season, playing in all 13 games, 12 of which he started in. He totaled 34 tackles, 13 tackles for loss and six sacks. Against Kent State (Oct. 7), he tallied a season-best six tackles.

Williams was a staple in Ohio's defensive unit in 2023, starting in 11 of 13 games. In his 12 appearances, Williams tallied 39 tackles—including 20 solo stops—one interception and three pass deflections.

Wood has been with the Bobcats since the 2018 season. He appeared in 10 games for Ohio in 2023, starting five times. On the season, he recorded 26 tackles along with 2.5 tackles for loss and an interception against Georgia Southern (Dec. 16).

10-WIN TIM

After three seasons at the helm, head coach **Tim Albin** has firmly cemented himself in the Ohio record books. The 2022 Bobcats kicked off a seven-game winning streak with a 55-34 Homecoming victory over Akron, culminating in the MAC East Champion title and a trip to

Detroit for the MAC Championship. Capping off the 2022 season with an overtime victory at the Barstool Sports Arizona Bowl, the team went down in history as the fourth team in program history to record 10 wins.

The 2023 squad finished the regular season 9-3 overall, earning a bid to the Myrtle Beach Bowl. They kicked off bowl season on Dec. 16, holding the Georgia Southern Eagles scoreless into the third quarter. With 29 seconds on the clock, quarterback **Parker Navarro** took a knee, and the Bobcats went into victory formation, solidifying their 41-21 win and the their second-consecutive 10-win season, marking a program first.

BRIAN SMITH NAMED OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Brian Smith is stepping into a new role for Ohio in 2024—play caller and offensive coordinator. Smith came to the Bobcats in spring 2022 by way of Washington State, where he was the offensive coordinator and associate head coach.

In his time at Ohio, he's developed two of Ohio's more infamous running backs: Sieh Bangura and **Rickey Hunt Jr.** Bangura was named 2022 MAC Freshman of the Year honors, finishing the season fourth in the league with 1,078 total rushing yards and third in total rushing touchdowns (13). In MAC play, Bangura recorded a conference-best 11 rushing touchdowns. The next season, Hunt made a splash at the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl (Dec. 16). Hunt not only scored his first rushing and receiving touchdowns during the bowl game but set a program record for most touchdowns scored in a single game (5) and tied the NCAA record for number of touchdowns scored in a bowl game.

Smith was a long snapper and center at Hawaii from 1998-01 before signing professional contracts with the Baltimore Ravens (2002) and Green Bay Packers (2003). He earned his bachelor's degree from Hawaii and continued his education at California Lutheran, earning his master's degree.

JOHN HAUSER NAMED DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

After earning his first promotion in spring 2023, **John Hauser** was named the Bobcats' new defensive coordinator in spring 2024.

The 2023 season was a historic one for the Bobcats, and a large portion of that success can be credited to the defense, who finished the season No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference and No. 4 in FBS football. Notably, the defense held Power 5 opponent to only seven points (Sept. 16), Western Michigan (Oct. 21) to their lowest number of rushing yards in the season (79) and set the program record for the most turnovers forced in a bowl game (5) at the 2023 Myrtle Beach Bowl.

Previously, Hauser was Miami's (OH)

cornerbacks coach for eight years, where he mentored several memorable MAC defenders including Quinten Rollins and Emmanuel Rugama.

Hauser started his career in 2002 at his alma mater, Wittenberg University, where he was an assistant coach. While he was a student-athlete at Wittenberg, Hauser was named all-conference three times and earned a spot on the Division III All-American team in 2002.

ANDRE ALLEN NAMED OHIO'S WIDE RECEIVERS COACH

College football coaching veteran **Andre Allen** joined Ohio in spring 2024 as their wide receivers coach. He brings with him over 30 years of coaching experience, including 27 years at the City College of San Francisco.

Most recently, Allen served as the wide receivers coach at UC Davis and Washington State for two years each. While in Pullman, the Cougars' 2021 Apple Cup win marked the program's largest margin of victory in the rivalry game's history. Allen coached four wideouts to conference accolades in 2021, marking the first set of Cougar wideouts to earn all-conference first or second team since 2004.

A San Francisco native, Allen played at CCSF from 1987-89 and the University of Tennessee—Martin from 1989-91. He earned a bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Ashford.

KURT MATTIX JOINS BOBCATS COACHING STAFF AS PASS RUSH SPECIALIST AND DEFENSIVE ENDS COACH

Kurt Mattix arrived in Athens in April 2024 as the football team's new defensive ends coach. Shortly after his arrival in Athens, Mattix added Pass Rush Specialist to his title.

Mattix comes to Ohio by way of San Diego State, where he served as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach from 2020-23. Since Mattix took over as the defensive coordinator, the Aztecs rank ninth in rushing defense, 17th in total defense, and 18th in scoring and pass efficiency rating. The 2023 season saw Mattix's defense force 18 turnovers with 10 interceptions and eight fumble recoveries. The 10 interceptions ranked 22nd in FBS and this performance earned three athletes All-Mountain West honors.

Mattix started his collegiate career at the University of Indianapolis, where he was a student-athlete from 1994-95 before using his final two years of eligibility at Valparaiso. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education at Valparaiso in 1999.

BOBCATS IN THE CFL

Quarterback **Nathan Rourke** returned to the BC Lions for the 2024 season after spending 2023 in the NFL. In his first stint with the CFL (2021-22), Rourke was named Most Outstanding



Canadian (Nov. 17, 2022). He is the first BC Lions' quarterback and the third quarterback in CFL history to earn the honor. Upon his return, Rourke became the highest-paid CFL athlete, signing a lucrative contract that includes \$200,000 of marketing money, which does not count toward the CFL's salary cap.

Running back **AJ Ouellette**, who quickly became a CFL household name, is currently playing for the Saskatchewan Roughriders. Previously, Ouellette played for the Toronto Argonauts, who are the 109th Grey Cup Champions. Defensive tackle **Casey Sayles**, who was a member of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers at the time, competed in the same Grey Cup. Both Sayles and Ouellette were named 2023 CFL Division All-Stars. Currently, Sayles is on the Hamilton Tiger-Cats.

Ohio football alumnus **Chip Cox** is a part of the 2022 CFL Hall of Fame class, earning the honor in his first year of eligibility. Cox played 13 seasons for the Montreal Alouettes, wrapping up his career with the fourth highest total defensive tackles in CFL history (979).

BOBCATS IN THE NFL

Multiple former Ohio football student-athletes are representing the Bobcats at the highest level of the sport.

Wide receiver **Sam Wiglusz** signed with the Los Angeles Rams on April 27, 2024, as an undrafted free agent. Defensive tackle **Rodney Mathews** signed with the Seattle Seahawks as an undrafted free agent on July 31, 2024 after he was released from the Green Bay Packers.

Former Ohio quarterback **Armani Rogers** signed with the Washington Commanders as a tight end in 2022. Currently, he is with the Philadelphia Eagles. Offensive lineman **Austen Pleasants** signed with the Arizona Cardinals after spending the 2023 season with the Los Angeles Chargers.

Prior to his return to the CFL, quarterback **Nathan Rourke** spent the 2023 season with the Jacksonville Jaguars. He was claimed off waivers by the New England Patriots in Dec. 2023, who released him in May 2024. Rourke was signed by the New York Giants and the Atlanta Falcons before re-signing with the CFL's BC Lions.

Tim Albin was named the head football coach at Ohio on July 14, 2021.

The 2023 squad finished the regular season with a 9-3 record, marking the first time Ohio football finished consecutive regular seasons with nine wins. Notably, Ohio defeated Iowa State 10-7 at home (Sept. 16) to mark its first Power Five win since 2017 during a five-game winning streak. Later in the season, their 34-20 victory over Central Michigan marked the first time since 2011 the Bobcats defeated the Chippewas and the first time they won this matchup at home since 2000.

The 2022 football team finished the season as MAC East (7-1) and Arizona Bowl Champions with a 10-4 record, marking its first 10-win season since 2011 and the second-best turnaround in FBS football last year. The Bobcats were also undefeated at home, posting a 6-0 record on Frank Solich Field at Peden Stadium, and wrapped up the regular season with a seven-game winning streak.

This performance earned Albin MAC Coach of the Year honors, quarterback Kurtis Rourke MAC Offensive Player of the Year honors as well as the Vern Smith Leadership Award and running back Sieh Bangura MAC Freshman of the Year accolades.

Since his arrival in Athens, Albin has produced offensive units that have consistently ranked among the top of the Mid-American Conference. He also has directed an offensive attack that has practically rewritten all of Ohio's rushing, passing records, and scoring records. In the past 10 seasons, Albin's offensive units rank No. 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 on the Ohio all-time Top 10 single season scoring list. The Bobcats 368 points in 2016 rank fourth on the all-time list.

In 2016, the Bobcats had the most pass attempts (458) and second-most completions (250) in school history. The offense totaled 5,492 yards of total offense which is third all-time at Ohio. The Bobcats also compiled the second-most pass yards in school history (3,142) and the fourth most touchdown passes (22).

In 2015, the offense totaled 5,378 yards, which ranks third all-time in program history. The Bobcat quarterbacks passed for 3,026 yards, which ranks third all-time in program history as well.

In 2014, the offense totaled 4,443 yards of offense which ranked fifth all-time in program history. The combination of Derrius Vick and JD Sprague proved to be dynamic through the air as the quarterbacks combined to pass for 2,474 yards for the season which is sixth all-time in program history.

The Bobcat offense found a balanced attack with AJ Ouellette in the backfield. The freshman ran for 785 yards ranking him only behind Kareem Wilson for most yards on the ground for a freshman.

In 2013, under Albin's watchful eye, Ohio's offensive attack averaged 379.4 yards per game and surpassed 400 yards of total offense in seven games during the 2013 campaign. The Bobcats closed the year with 4,932 yards of total offense. The 2013 campaign also marked the final season of Ohio's most prolific offensive trio in school history as quarterback Tyler Tettleton, running back Beau Blankenship and wide Donte' Foster all concluded their respective collegiate careers.

Albin recruited all three players and all three players flourished in his offensive scheme. At the end of their respective careers, Tettleton, Blankenship and Foster accounted for over 25,000 yards of total offense and 128 touchdowns.

Tettleton finished his career at Ohio with 27 school records and once again passed for over 2,500 yards through the air. He is the only quarterback in school history to pass for over 2,500 yards in three-consecutive seasons.

Blankenship closed his senior campaign with 910 yards rushing and five touchdowns. He finished his career fifth on the all-time rushing list with 2,976 yards.

Foster concluded his senior campaign with his best single-season of his career as he finished with 1,018 yards receiving and seven touchdowns. The Guthrie, Okla., native became just the second wide receiver in school history to surpass 1,000 yards receiving. He also finished his career with the most all-time touchdown receptions (21). Following the year, Foster was selected to the All-MAC Second Team.

In 2012, Albin's offensive unit that accounted for 5,782 yards. In fact, Ohio was one of just four teams in the Mid-American Conference to post 5,500-yards or more of total offense in 2012 (Northern Illinois, Ball State and Toledo). Ohio had seven games in which it surpassed 450 yards of total offense.

Albin's offensive unit played a major role in Ohio's 45-14 victory in the Advocate V100 Independence Bowl. In the win, the Bobcats' 556 yards of total offense served as an Independence Bowl record, while their 45 points tied the Bowl record. Following the game, Blankenship and Tettleton were named Co-Offensive Most Valuable Players of the Independence Bowl.

Ohio's 2012 offensive unit averaged over 30 points per game for the second straight season and the third time in the last six years. In addition, the Bobcats scored 40-or-more points in four different games.

The 2012 campaign also saw Blankenship rush for a single-season school record 1,604 yards and 15 touchdowns. He became the eighth running back in school history to rush for over 1,000 yards in a single season. Following the year, Blankenship was named All-MAC Second Team. Offensive lineman Skyler Allen



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and Eric Herman joined Blankenship on the All-MAC Second Team. Since taking over as offensive coordinator in 2005, Albin has coached 26 All-MAC players and All-Americans LaVon Brazill (2009) and Joe Flading (2011).

Tettleton once again posted a memorable season under Albin's direction as he passed for 2,844 yards and 18 touchdowns, while throwing just four interceptions in 12 games.

In April of 2013, Herman became the third offensive player to be selected in the NFL Draft over the last four years as he was drafted by the New York Giants in the seventh round.

In 2011, Albin's offensive scheme led to the most prolific year in school history. Ohio set eight team single-season offensive records, posting school standards for most yards gained (6,241), most passing yards gained (3,482), most offensive plays (1,026), average yards per game (445.8), passing attempts (429), most points scored (427), most passing completions (276) and most passing yards per game (248.7).

Under Albin's watchful eye, Tettleton re-wrote the Bobcats' single season record book in his first-year as a starting quarterback as he set 12 school standards, while becoming the first signal caller in program history to throw for over 3,000 yards. In addition, Tettleton accounted for 38 total touchdowns (28 passing and 10 rushing) and nearly 4,000 yards of total offense (3,960) en route to being named All-MAC Third Team.

The 2011 Ohio offensive unit also produced record-breaking performances from Brazill and Donte' Harden as the two combined to set eight single-season records. Brazill would go on to finish his career as the program's all-time leader for receiving yards (2,511) and receptions (189).

At the end of the year, a league-best six Bobcats were named to the MAC's All-League team on the offensive side of the ball.

In April of 2012, Brazill was selected in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts.

In 2010, Boo Jackson finished his career as Ohio's career leader in completion percentage (.604), pass efficiency (136.3), total offense per play (6.18), passing yards per attempt (7.7) and touchdown passes (38). He also finished the season responsible for 26 touchdowns, 48 in his career, which is fourth all-time, and with 18 passing touchdowns in 2010 (fourth all-time on the single-season list).

Ohio also had the best red zone efficiency among all MAC teams in 2010, converting 88.4 percent of its tries inside the 20-yard line. The Bobcats converted 38 times on 43 occasions, scoring 38 touchdowns and five field goals. Ohio was also outstanding at running the football, finishing second in the conference with 1,416 yards on the ground (177.0 per game average) for the 2010 season and 19 touchdowns.

In 2009, Albin's offense took aim at more of Ohio's all-time marks. Quarterback Theo Scott threw 20 touchdown passes, which stood as a school record until the 2011 season, while receiver Terrence McCrae tied Andrew Mooney's then single-season touchdown

reception mark of nine.

The 2009 team also finished with passing yards (2,774), completions (228) and total offense (4,342) all of which rank among the program's top five all-time marks.

Albin mentored running back Calvin McRae who earned first-team All-MAC honors in 2005, 2006 and 2007. McRae is the first Bobcat in history to crack the 1,000-yard mark in three straight seasons. Under Albin's tutelage, McRae rushed for 4,398 yards and 45 touchdowns. McRae owns the second, fourth and sixth-highest single-season rushing totals in school history after setting the single-season rushing, touchdown and points scored records.

Albin spent the 2004 season as offensive coordinator and running backs coach at North Dakota State, helping the Bison to an 8-3 record and No. 25 national ranking in their first season at the Division I-AA level. NDSU finished the season averaging 378.5 yards of total offense, including 192.4 on the ground, and had four offensive players named first-team All-Great West Football Conference.

Albin served with Solich at Nebraska from 2000 to 2003. He started with the Cornhusker program as a graduate assistant, a position he held for three seasons before being promoted to running backs coach and passing game coordinator for the 2003 season. Working with the Nebraska tight ends as a graduate assistant, Albin helped Tracey Wistrom earn third-team All-America status in back-to-back seasons.

Prior to his stint at Nebraska, Albin was the head coach at Northwestern Oklahoma State for three seasons, winning the NAIA national championship in 1999 with a 13-0 record. He was named NAIA Football Coach of the Year by Rawlings and American Football Coach Magazine as the Rangers recorded their first undefeated season in history. Six of his players earned NAIA All-America honors. Albin's three squads improved every season going from 5-5 in 1997 to 7-3 in 1998.

Returning to his alma mater in 1994, Albin served as Northwestern Oklahoma State's offensive coordinator and head men's and women's cross country and track and field coach prior to his promotion to head coach of the football program.

He earned Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference Coach of the Year honors twice for his work with the men's track program, leading them to back-to-back league titles. Albin got his start in coaching at Northeastern State (Okla.) in 1989 where he won two conference titles as an assistant football coach and two more as head of the men's track program.

As a player, Albin was a first-team All-Oklahoma Intercollegiate Conference selection as a wide receiver in each of his final three seasons as a member of the Northwestern Oklahoma State squad. He added to those honors by becoming the first Rangers' player to earn All-District IX status three times.

Albin received His bachelor's of science in business administration from Northwestern Oklahoma State in 1989 and a master's of science from Northeastern State in 1991. A native of Woodward, Okla., Albin was born on Sept. 13, 1965. He and his wife, Brooke, have two children - daughter Tori, and son Treyce.
