2010 Baseball

28-23 Overall

11-13 Big Ten Conference

When Ohio State dropped the first two games of its season-ending series the weekend of May 20-22 against Minnesota, the record run of consecutive Big Ten tournament appearances for Ohio State (13), the coaching career of Hall of Fame Coach Bob Todd and the dreams of back-to-back NCAA Regional appearances came to a surprising, disappointing and abrupt end for the wearers of the Scarlet and Gray baseball jerseys. And so did the collegiate careers of the eight seniors - good guys, class individuals and quite simply good people - on the team.

Eric Best, Ryan Dew, Shawn Forsythe, Chris Griffin, Zach Hurley, Cory Kovanda, Cory Rupert and Michael Stephens had expected to still be practicing and playing on this date, and beyond. Coming off a Big Ten championship in 2009 - the 15th in school history - and an NCAA regional berth, the co-captains - Hurley and Kovanda - and their classmates had designs on a huge 2010 season. With significant talent returning off that 2009 team, there were even optimistic thoughts about 2010 being the year that Ohio State broke its College World Series drought of 43 years.

But for whatever reason...or reasons...the 2010 Buckeyes didn't have it this year. The team started out with a 12-4 record and was sporting a .360 team batting average that was more than enough might to offset 27 errors in its first 16 games.

Thirty games into the season the Buckeyes were 21-9 overall, 6-2 in the Big Ten Conference and sitting in first place. The team's earned run average was at a season-low 4.31 and the batting average was still near the top of the Big Ten at .335.

But starting with a 14-7 Game 3 loss to Michigan State, Ohio State would hit a funk where its hitting, pitching and fielding simply couldn't find the same page for any consistent stretch of games. The Buckeyes lost five consecutive Big Ten series and 14 of its final 21 games to finish in a tie for eighth-place in the Big Ten with an 11-13 record and a 28-23 overall mark.

A 4-3 Game 2 loss to Minnesota on May 22 eliminated the Buckeyes from the Big Ten tournament with a game still to be played. Following a ceremony to honor the eight seniors and to retire coach Bob Todd's No. 18 jersey, the Buckeyes thumped Big Ten champion Minnesota, 9-6, giving the seniors a career-capping victory and No. 1,025 for their coach.

Honors

Alex Wimmers was named the National Pitcher of the Year by the College Baseball Foundation and he was a first-team All-American for a second consecutive year when the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and Ping! Baseball named him to their first teams. Wimmers also repeated as the Big Ten Pitcher of the Year. He was joined on the all-Big Ten first team by outfielder Zach Hurley. Ryan Dew was tabbed the second-team designated hitter and Michael Stephens was named a third-team outfielder.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

The Ohio State men's basketball team advanced to the NCAA Tournament "Sweet 16" in 2010 after claiming a share of the 2009-10 Big Ten regular-season conference title with 14-4 record and capturing the conference tournament championship. Overall, the Buckeyes put together a 29-8 campaign under Thad Matta, who finished his sixth season in Columbus. Matta's Buckeyes have reached at least 20 victories in each of his seasons as Ohio State's head coach. He has three conference titles to his credit and has reached postseason play in all five campaigns in which the Buckeyes were eligible. Four of his teams have competed for an NCAA title, two reaching the "Sweet 16" and one (2007) advancing to the title game. Junior Evan Turner led the way in 2009-10. Despite missing just more than a month of the season recovering from broken bones in his back, the Chicago native posted some of the highest combined numbers in college basketball history. He averaged 20.4 points, 9.2 rebounds and handed out 5.9 assists a game on his way to sweeping national player of the year awards from coast to coast. The 2010 First Team All-American elected to leave the Buckeyes for the NBA, where he was the No. 2 selection in the first round by the Philadelphia 76ers, the sixth first round selection for Ohio State with Matta at the helm.

WHAT THE BUCKEYES DID IN 2009-10

- Ohio State won a record-setting sixth-consecutive Big Ten regular season championship and its 13th overall with a 15-3 mark in the Big Ten. No team - men's or women's - has ever won six straight Big Ten regular season titles.
- The Buckeyes won a program-record 31 games (31-5), their second season with at least 30 wins under head coach Jim Foster.
- Ohio State won its second-consecutive Big Ten tournament championship.
- The Buckeyes earned a No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament, its eighth straight appearance in the Big Dance and the program's 19th overall.
- Ohio State won the 2009 Preseason WNIT with a 93-72 win over Oklahoma State.
- The Buckeyes led the NCAA in 3-point shooting at 40.2 percent. They also ranked in the top 15 in scoring (8th, 78.0), assists (11th, 17.2), assist-turnover ratio (7th, +1.15) and fewest fouls (5th, 13.1). The Buckeyes shot 45.8 percent overall, good for 12th in the NCAA and tops in the Big Ten.
- Ohio State connected on a school record 238 three-pointers, breaking the old mark of 191 set during the 2004-05 season.
- The Buckeyes hit a Big Ten-record 17 three-pointers in the win at Penn State, breaking the old mark of 14.
- Ohio State finished 19-1 at home this year, setting a program record with 19 home wins in a season.
- Jantel Lavender was named the 2010 Big Ten Player of the Year for the third-consecutive season by both the coaches and the media. Also honored was sophomore Samantha Prahalis, who, along with Lavender, were unanimous selections for first team All-Big Ten honors on both sides. Junior Brittany Johnson, one of the top three-point shooters in the country, was an honorable mention selection from the media while Shavelle Little earned her third-consecutive all-defensive team honor.
- Lavender ranked third in the Big Ten with 10.3 rebounds per game and led the conference with a .514 FG percentage and 21.4 ppg.
- Lavender finished the season with 20 double-doubles and now has 57 in her career, the most among active Big Ten players.
- Lavender eclipsed 2,000 points in her 100th career game, becoming the first Buckeye in program history to reach the milestone in her junior season.
- Samantha Prahalis set a Big Ten single-season record with 289 assists, breaking the old mark of 283 held by Penn State's Tina Nicholson during the 1995-96 season.
- Prahalis led the Big Ten and finished second nationally with 8.0 assists per game behind NCAA leader Courtney Vandersloot of Gonzaga (9.4).

Prahalis had 10 games with 10 or more and has dished out at least eight 19 times.

- Prahalis set an Ohio State record with 48-consecutive made free throws. It was the second-longest streak in Big Ten history and the fifth-best in NCAA history.
- Prahalis accounted for nearly 50 percent of Ohio State's offense on either field goals or assists.
- Prahalis ranked third in the Big Ten with 18.2 ppg in Big Ten play.
- Prahalis became just the second Division I player since 1999-2000 to average at least 16.0 points and 8.0 assists per game.
- Brittany Johnson shot 48.1 percent from long range this season, the best in the Big Ten and second-best in the NCAA.
- Brittany Johnson set an Ohio State single-season record for the best 3FG percentage in a season with her .481 clip.
- A total of 11,827 fans showed up for the Feb. 21 overtime thriller with Michigan State, the second-largest crowd at Value City Arena for a women's game and the seventh-largest in program history.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Ohio State has the sixth most wins (169) and the seventh-best winning percentage (.841) over the last six years.
- Seniors Shavelle Little, Andrea Walker, Maria Moeller and Cherise Daniel set a program-record with 110 wins, breaking the old mark of 109 set by the class of 2008 (Packer, Riley, Jamen).
- Ohio State is 127-10 at home overall under Jim Foster and 100-6 since the start of the 2004-05 season.
- Since the start of Ohio State's Big Ten championship run in 2004-05, the Buckeyes are 48-3 in Big Ten games at Value City Arena and 85-14 in Big Ten play overall.
- Ohio State is 9-2 in its last 11 postseason games, having won the last two Big Ten tournaments and going 3-2 in NCAA tournament play the last two seasons.
- The Buckeyes have been ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25 for 115-consecutive weeks.
- Jantel Lavender has scored in double figures in all 102 career games, the longest active streak in Division I.
- Foster won his 700th game Dec. 31 with an 86-60 win at Northwestern.
- Foster is just the second collegiate coach -- men's or women's at any level -- to win at least 200 games at three different schools.
- Head coach Jim Foster made his 11th-consecutive trip to the NCAA tournament and his 24th overall.

SEASON RECAP

Led by 13th-year head coach Robert Gary, the men's cross country team posted one of the best seasons in school history in 2009, earning its 11th trip to the NCAA finals and a runner-up finish at the Big Ten championships.

The Buckeyes were paced all season by senior All-American Jeff See, the 2009 Great Lakes Athlete of the Year and All-Ohio champion. See recorded one of the most successful individual seasons in program history, becoming the first Buckeye A-A since Brian Olinger in 2005, while also joining the current Buckeye volunteer assistant as only the second winner of the Great Lake AOY award.

Sophomore Taylor Williams emerged as a reliable No. 2 runner for Ohio State, finishing in the Top 15 at both the conference and regional championships. Sophomore Adam Green and senior Christopher Olinger brought experience and depth to the Buckeye roster, while freshmen Donny Roys and Julian Meyer made immediate contributions to the squad as first year runners.

As a team, the Buckeyes opened the season with a bang, capturing back-to-back title in the first two weeks of the season, including their first All-Ohio championship since 2006. A month later, Ohio State fought its way to second-place at the Big Ten championships, its highest finish in four years. See led the way for the Scarlet and Gray with a third-place finish, while Williams, Olinger and Green all placed within the Top 20.

Ohio State clinched its first trip to the NCAA championships since 2007 with a third-place effort at the Great Lakes regional championships behind See's individual title. Nine days later, the Buckeyes finished 21st overall at the NCAA championships, finishing one point shy of a Top 20 finish. See once again led the way, taking 28th overall.

Despite the graduation of No. 1 runner See and two other seniors, the Buckeyes return the nucleus of their team for the 2010 campaign. With so much young talent returning next season, Ohio State looks to once again be a factor on the national stage.

SEASON RECAP

2009 was a history-making season for the Ohio State women's cross country team. The Buckeyes enjoyed their most successful season in program history, finishing second at the Great Lakes regional championships and qualifying for their first-ever NCAA national championship race, while claiming their first All-Ohio championship in more than 18 years.

Ohio State hit the ground running in the second meet of the year, surprising Big Ten rivals Penn State and Illinois with a second-place finish at the 6k Harry Groves Spiked Shoe Invitational in University Park, Pa. Jordan Jennewine paced the Buckeyes with a runner-up finish in 21:24 and Ellen Birmingham took third in 21:31.

Three weeks later, the Buckeyes cruised to an easy win at the 5k All-Ohio Championships in Delaware, Ohio, their first team championship since the 1981 season. All five scorers for Ohio State finished in the Top 20 overall, with Jennewine becoming the first Buckeye since Theresa Cain in 1993 to win the individual crown.

One month after the All-Ohio race, the Scarlet and Gray returned to Penn State for the 6k Big Ten championships. Running against some of the top collegiate cross country athletes in the nation, the Buckeyes made a two-spot improvement from their 2008 finish, taking eighth overall with 164 points. Jennewine earned the first All-Big Ten award of her career with a 12th-place finish overall in a 6k personal record time of 21:02, while Sarah Foster, Katie Williams and Birmingham joined her among the Top 40 finishers.

The highlight of the 2009 season came two weeks later at the Great Lakes regional championships in Bloomington, Ind. Led by a fifth-place effort from Jennewine, the Buckeyes took the field by storm, finishing second overall and securing a first-ever trip to the NCAA championships. Ohio State's 102 team points was just enough to edge Big Ten rivals Michigan, Indiana and Michigan State for the runner-up spot in one of the most competitive races in regional history.

OSU's dream season came to an end at the NCAA championships nine days later. Led by Katie Williams, the Buckeyes finished 29th overall, an admirable effort for the first time championship competitors. With all but one regular starter returning for 2010, the future looks bright for the women's cross country program at Ohio State.

FENCING

The 2009-10 campaign was one of ups and downs for the Ohio State fencing team. The squad claimed a Top 5 finish at the NCAA Championships for the ninth-consecutive season under 12th year head coach Vladimir Nazlymov, with five players earning All-America status. The Buckeyes' seven-year streak of Midwest Conference championships came to an end, however, after the Scarlet and Gray fell to Notre Dame in both men and women's categories.

The Buckeyes opened up team competition with back-to-back meets in New York City Jan. 23 and 24. Ohio State's men finished 4-2 at the New York University Duals, earning wins against Columbia and Yale, but falling to conference rival Notre Dame by a narrow, 14-13 margin. The women also downed Yale, but dropped their bout against Columbia to finish 3-3. The men went 2-2 at the St. John's Duals the following day, defeating Columbia and host St. John's. The Buckeye women had a rough day, picking up their lone win against Harvard.

The Scarlet and Gray then traveled to Evanston, Ill., to compete in the Northwestern Duals. The two squads combined to post a 9-1 mark after day one, with the lone loss coming for the men against Notre Dame. The men picked it up on day two, finishing 5-0. The women battled, but dropped matches against host Northwestern, Princeton and Notre Dame to wrap up the event with a 9-3 ledger.

Next up for the Buckeyes was a trip to South Bend, Ind., to defend their seven-consecutive Midwest Conference titles. The men earned gold in the epee category after knocking off Notre Dame, but fell to the hosts in the final matches of sabre and foil. The women also picked up one gold medal finish, defeating Northwestern in the final match of the foil division. Both Buckeye teams finished a mere 15 points behind conference champion Notre Dame. The Scarlet and Gray were well-represented in individual competition, closing the event with seven Top 3 finishers and 19 All-MWC fencers.

The squad made a return visit to the Northwestern campus for the Midwest Regional Qualifier March 13-14. Junior foilist Oksana Dmytruk earned a first-place finish, repeating her performance from a season ago. Bryan Cheney and Igor Tolkachev placed first in epee and sabre, respectively. Max Stearns finished two spots behind Cheney at third in epee and Ben Parkins took a third-place finish in foil.

Eleven Buckeyes made the trip to Boston, Mass., March 25 for the NCAA Championships. The team finished day one in seventh place after the women's competitions. Margarita Tschomakova earned 19 wins to enter the medal round, but finished tied for third after falling to eventual sabre champion Caroline Vloka of Harvard in the opening round. Tschomakova's sabre teammate, Alison Miller, picked up nine wins to place 16th. The foil duo of Dmytruk and Allison Henvick earned 14 and 12 wins, respectively. Senior Julia Tikhonova, Ohio State's lone epeeist, claimed 10 victories on the way to a 14th-place finish.

In men's competition, Parkins and Cheney were both a single victory short of reaching the medal rounds at the championships. Both finished fifth in their categories, Parkins with 16 wins and Cheney with 15. Colin Sutter, Parkins' foil teammate, finished 14th with 10 victories. Stearns won 11 bouts on a way to a 13th place finish in the sabre category. In epee, Tolkachev finished sixth with 14 victories and freshman Marco Canevari finished 19th with nine wins. The strong performance of the men pushed Ohio State (139 points) past Harvard (137) and Princeton (135) to preserve the team's streak of Top 5 finishes.

FIELD HOCKEY

The Ohio State field hockey team put together a strong 2009 campaign, finishing tied for second in the Big Ten with a 4-2 record and earning an at-large bid to the 2009 NCAA Tournament for the program's fifth trip to the tourney.

The Buckeyes, 13-7 overall, recorded a league-high six shutouts, five of which were credited to senior goalkeeper Lindsay Quintiliani. The Ohio State backfield recorded a total of seven defensive saves, with sophomore Jenn Sciulli leading the way with four, and limited its opponents to just 9.9 shots and 1.54 goals per game. The team goals-against average of 1.54 is the sixth-lowest average for a Buckeye team since 1994.

On the opposite side of the field, the Ohio State offense recorded 151 points (7.55 per game), the eighth most by an OSU squad, on 54 goals (ninth most) and 43 assists (seventh most). Big Ten Freshman of the Year Berta Queralt led the Buckeyes with 46 points on 17 goals, including five game-winners, and 12 assists. Sophomore Maria Briones was second in scoring with 32 points (12g, 8a) while junior Jena Cacciatore was third with a career-high 25 points (10g, 5a).

NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Buckeyes traveled to Winston-Salem, N.C., to play the North Carolina at Kentner Stadium on the Wake Forest campus. Ohio State fell 4-1 to North Carolina, the eventual NCAA champion, in the first round (Nov. 14) with junior Aisling McKeon notching the unassisted Buckeye goal. Scoring on the 2009 UNC defense was a hard task as the Tar Heels had allowed just nine goals in the regular season. The Buckeyes were only the sixth team to score on UNC.

Ohio State was one of three Big Ten teams to make the 2009 NCAA Tournament, making it the 10th time in the last 11 years the conference sent three or more teams. Michigan State won the Big Ten automatic bid while Indiana also was selected to the field of 16.

COACH ANNE WILKINSON

Head coach Anne Wilkinson has amassed 169 wins in her 14 years at Ohio State. With a .610 winning percentage, she is the winningest coach in OSU history, recording 10 winning seasons and nine Top 3 finishes in the Big Ten standings. At Ohio State, Wilkinson has developed 19 All-America selections, 52 All-Region honorees and 46 All-Big Ten awardwinners. In conference awards, the Buckeyes have earned five Big Ten Player of the Year awards in the last four seasons – the first Big Ten Player of the Year recognitions in Ohio State history.

FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Berta Queralt was selected the 2009 Big Ten Freshman of the Year Nov. 5 after recording 44 points during the regular season, the second-most overall in the conference. Queralt, who led Ohio State in scoring and concluded the 2009 season ranked third overall in the Big Ten with 46 points on 17 goals and 12 assists, became just the second Buckeye to receive the league's rookie of the year honor.

The native of Barcelona, Spain, also became Ohio State's first rookie to be tabbed First Team All-Big Ten and Third Team NFHCA All-America. Queralt also represented the Buckeyes on the Big Ten All-Tournament team.

Queralt, a five-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week honoree, tied two-time All-American Britta Eickhoff (1994-97) for ninth on the Ohio State all-time single-season points record list. Both Eickhoff and Queralt recorded 46 points as Buckeye freshmen with just three-time All-American and U.S. Olympic Team member Sue Marcellus scoring more as a rookie in 1976.

With 2.30 points per game, Queralt ended the season ranked 19th in the NCAA. Queralt's 17 goals held fourth in the Big Ten standings while her five gamewinners were

good for second in the league and tied for second in the OSU single season record book. Her 12 helpers in 20 games tied for first in assists per game (0.60) and second overall in the Big Ten. In 2009, Queralt posted three-multiple assist games, including a three-assist outing vs. Saint Louis (Aug. 30) which ties the most assists by a Buckeye in a game since 2003.

BUCKEYE ALL-AMERICAN

Berta Queralt was named a Third Team NFHCA All-American, becoming the 24th Buckeye, and the first freshman, to earn the distinction in program history. Queralt is the 10th Buckeye to receive All-America honors under head coach Anne Wilkinson in the last five seasons. Overall, the Buckeyes have had at least one All-American each year since 1999, a span of 11-consecutive seasons and 19 honorees in total, with Wilkinson at the helm.

NFHCA ALL-WEST REGION HONOREES

Ohio State had three members recognized as All-West Region selections this season. Sophomore midfielder Aisling Coyle and Berta Queralt were named first-team honorees while sophomore forward Maria Briones was tabbed a second-team selection.

After earning second-team honors a season ago, Coyle moved up to the All-West Region First Team in 2009. The sophomore captain started 19 of Ohio State's 20 games, directing the Buckeyes through the mid- and backfield. Coyle notched a career-high 25 points on 10 goal and five assists to also earn First Team All-Big Ten honors.

In her first year at Ohio State, Briones provided crucial scores for the Buckeyes late in the season. The sophomore recorded the second-most points on the team with 32 on 12 goals and eight assists in 18 games. A Second Team All-Big Ten honoree as well, Briones often paired with her countrywoman Queralt on the attack combining to score more than half of Ohio State's 54 goals.

ALL-BIG TEN

Berta Queralt, Aisling Coyle and Lindsay Quintiliani were selected First Team All-Big Ten honorees while Maria Briones was named to the second team. Queralt was the lone rookie to earn first-team honors in 2009 and was the first in Buckeye history. Sophomore back Jenn Sciulli was named Ohio State's Sportsmanship Award winner.

Ohio State's three members on the first-team ties the program high first set in 1982. The program again reached the mark in 2001, '06 and '09.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

The Buckeyes earned 10 Big Ten weekly honors, recording the most awards an Ohio State team has won in a single season since the conference honors began in 1992. Michigan State holds the all-time Big Ten record, earning 11 weekly honors this season en route to its first regular-season conference title. Berta Queralt led Ohio State with five rookie of the week honors while Lindsay Quintiliani earned three defensive awards and Maria Briones nabbed two offensive accolades.

QUINTILIANI COVERS GOALKEEPER RECORDS

Senior goalkeeper Lindsay Quintiliani worked her way up the Ohio State record book in 2009.

After setting the Ohio State all-time record for career wins with the 2-0 blanking of Iowa Oct. 11, Quintiliani upped her record to 40 with the 2-1 victory vs. Duke (the Buckeyes' first win against the Blue Devils in program history) Oct. 25. She passed Lindsay Williams (2002-05) who previously owned the record with 36 victories.

With 215 saves in 67 career games, Quintiliani ranks

eighth in the program's all-time record book. Earlier in the season she passed Anna Schwartz (180 saves, 1998) to crack into the all-time career Top 10 and jumped ahead of both Stefanie Eyerkauffer (188 saves, 1993) and Allison Blanton (211 saves, 1998-01) to take over eighth place.

Quintiliani made 61 stops in 2009 to give her three seasons with 60-plus saves. As a freshman in 2006, Quintiliani recorded a career-high 64 saves and followed with 62 as a sophomore.

CLEAN SLATES

Quintiliani posted her fifth shutout of 2009 vs. Iowa Oct. 11, the 14th of her career, to finish her career in second on the all-time list, trailing Sue Willson (1989-92) who owns the record with 15.

TEAM HONORS

Aisling Coyle was voted the Most Valuable Player after serving as an integral part of the Buckeye midfield. The co-captain orchestrated Ohio State's transition game and ended the season with six goals, nine assists and 21 points.

Graduating senior and co-captain Lindsay Quintiliani picked up a bevy of awards, receiving the Harriet Reynolds Scholar-Athlete laurel for owning highest cumulative grade-point average and the Buckeye Spirit Award for exuding the true spirit of a Buckeye. She also shared the Defensive Player of the Year honor with Jenn Sciulli.

Berta Queralt was recognized as the team's Freshman and Offensive Player of the Year. Making an immediate impact, she led the Buckeyes in scoring with 46 points.

HOME, SWEET HOME

Ohio State ended its 2009 home schedule with a 9-1 record, tying for the most home victories in a single season since 2001. The team held its 10 opponents to just eight goals on its home turf. In all, the Buckeyes blanked five teams at North Turf Field: Saint Louis (7-0, Aug. 30), Ohio (3-0, Sept. 11), Vermont (3-0, Sept. 18), Central Michigan (1-0, Sept. 20) and Iowa (2-0, Oct. 11).

The only teams to score multiple goals on Ohio State at home were Michigan (4-3, Oct. 17) and Indiana (3-2, Sept. 27) while Duke (2-1, Oct. 25), Louisville (2-1 OT, Oct. 14) and James Madison (0-1, Aug. 29) each tallied one.

The Scarlet and Gray outscored its opponents, 27-8, at home with assists on 22 of the goals for 76 total points while the Buckeyes limited their five opponents who scored to a combined 22 points.

SIX NAMED TO NFHCA NATIONAL ACADEMIC SQUAD

Six Buckeyes were named to the NFHCA National Academic Squad in March for achieving a cumulative GPA of 3.30 or higher through the first semester of the 2009-10 academic year. As a team, Ohio State was recognized as one of 58 teams in the nation to carry a team grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher in 2009.

Seniors Melissa Hunter, Melissa Palm and Lindsay Quintiliani each earned their fourth-consecutive honor, making them just the fourth, fifth and sixth Buckeyes to receive the accolade each season of their eligibility. Senior Rachel Hunter and junior Alicia Anzvine earn their third national academic laurel while freshman Laura Napolitano received her first.

ACADEMIC ALL-BIG TEN

Ohio State had 11 members earn Academic All-Big Ten honors, including three-time honorees Melissa Hunter, Rachel Hunter, Melissa Palm and Lindsay Quintiliani.

Juniors Alicia Anzvine, Keegan Billick and Bri Doak earned their second awards while Aisling McKeon, Ali Ristas, Jenn Sciulli and Ally Tunitis each earned their first nod.

FOOTBALL

Losing a wealth of experience on both sides of the ball, many thought 2009 might be a rebuilding year for the Ohio State Buckeyes. The team didn't think so, however, winning its fifth consecutive Big Ten title, defeating arch-rival Michigan for a sixth consecutive season and winning the 96th Rose Bowl Game to finish the season 11-2 and ranked No. 5 in the polls.

The Buckeyes opened the campaign with a hard-fought victory over the U.S. Naval Academy. Junior linebacker Brian Rolle intercepted a Navy two-point conversion late in the fourth quarter to seal a 31-27 OSU win. The game took place on Military Appreciation Day in front of an Ohio Stadium opening game record 105,092.

Ohio State welcomed No. 3 Southern California to the Horseshoe the following week for a much anticipated prime time re-match from the previous season. In a back-and-forth game witnessed by an Ohio Stadium record crowd 106,033, USC defeated the Buckeyes, 18-15.

The following week, in a rare neutral site contest, Ohio State battled the Toledo Rockets in Cleveland Browns Stadium. On a record-setting day for sophomore quarterback Terrelle Pryor, the Buckeyes recorded their first of two consecutive shutouts, winning 38-0. Pryor was 17-of-28 for 262 yards, all personal bests at the time, with three touchdown passes. He also rushed 12 times for 110 yards, including a career-long 43-yarder in the third quarter, with one touchdown. In all, he had 372 yards of total offense.

The Buckeyes started the Big Ten schedule with a 30-0 dismantling of Illinois. History was made in Ohio Stadium that afternoon; the Tressel family became only the second family in college football history to win 500 games.

Following a 33-14 win at Indiana, the Buckeyes hosted undefeated Wisconsin. Behind 21 points from defense and special teams, Ohio State knocked off the No. 24 Badgers 31-13. Senior co-captain Kurt Coleman and junior Jermale Hines returned interceptions for touchdowns and senior Ray Small had a 96-yard kickoff return.

The Buckeyes didn't have enough heroics the next week and fell at Purdue, 26-18. Entering the fourth quarter, Ohio State trailed 23-7. Thanks to 177 fourth-quarter yards, the Buckeyes almost pulled off a gritty comeback. The loss snapped Ohio State's school-record 16-game Big Ten road winning streak, just one shy of the all-time conference record.

After a 38-7 Homecoming victory over Minnesota and a 45-0 victory over non-conference New Mexico State (the third shutout of the season for the "Silver Bullets"), a Herculean November test was straight ahead.

First up was a trip to No. 11 Penn State. In front of 110,033 screaming fans, Pryor delivered his best performance, leading the Buckeyes to a resounding 24-7 win. Pryor accounted for three Buckeye touchdowns, including a back-breaking 62-yard strike to

sophomore wide receiver DeVier Posey in the third quarter that extended OSU's lead to 17-7. The Ohio State defense limited a Penn State offense (averaging 35+ ppg in its previous five games) to a season-low seven points and just 201 yards of total offense.

The following week, Ohio State and league front-runner Iowa battled in an Ohio Stadium showdown, with the winner clinching a Big Ten championship and Rose Bowl invitation. Playing one of the more dramatic games in recent Big Ten history, the teams were tied 24-24 at the end of regulation. After a huge stop by the Buckeye defense, walk-on back-up kicker Devin Barclay booted Ohio State to Pasadena and its first Rose Bowl appearance in 13 years, with a 39-yard field goal in overtime.

The Buckeyes finished off their daunting November to Remember with a sixth straight win over Michigan, defeating the Wolverines 21-10 in Michigan Stadium.

Ohio State took on the favored Oregon Ducks New Year's Day in the 96th Rose Bowl Game, winning 26-17. Pryor had a career-high 266 yards passing and two touchdowns, rushed for 72 yards and earned Rose Bowl MVP honors. Oregon featured one of the most efficient offenses in the country, but the Buckeye defense was able to bottle it up much of the day. Duck QB Jeremiah Masoli was just 9-of-20 for 81 yards with an interception and had six rushing attempts for nine yards. Ohio State had a Rose Bowl record 41:37 time of possession.

The 19-member senior class closed out its tenure with a four-year school record 44 victories. Senior co-captain Kurt Coleman and Justin Boren took home first-team all-Big Ten honors. Brandon Saine, Thaddeus Gibson, Cameron Heyward and Ross Homan were second-team selections. Coleman was also voted the team MVP and a first-team All-American by Sporting News.

MEN'S GOLF

For the first time in 37 years, the Ohio State men's golf team was under the direction of a new coach in 2009-10 with Donnie Darr returning to his home state to take over the Buckeye program. In Darr's first season, Ohio State gained plenty of experience in a season that brought success to many of the golfers while posting a 70-58-2 tournament record. The Buckeyes posted three runner-up finishes on the season, including twice in the final month of competition.

The team shuffled the lineup throughout the season looking for the right combination of success. Bo Hoag, in his junior season, was the only Buckeye to play in all 11 events, with classmate Brad Smith and senior Brad Wright playing in 10 apiece. For the second-consecutive season, Hoag led the squad in stroke average at 73.55 as well as rounds under-par (8), rounds in the 60s (5) and top 10 finishes (5). He also fired the low round of the season with a 67 in the second round of the Boilermaker Invitational.

Ohio State started the year off on the right foot by finishing fourth at the Adams Cup of Newport (Sept. 21-22) before taking their first runner-up finish of the year at the Fighting Irish Gridiron Classic (Oct. 5-6). The Scarlet and Gray were led by an impressive performance from sophomore Dan Charen, who put up the best performance of his career as he placed second finish to lead the charge.

After a tough start to the spring schedule, the Buckeyes seemed to right the ship with their second runner-up finish of the season at the Irish Creek Collegiate (April 3-4) with junior Michael Cress leading the way for OSU in a tie for seventh. Just three weeks later, a trip to the Boilermaker Invitational brought another second place finish (April 24-25) along with the low 54-hole score of the season, 4-under 212, shot by Smith to take second in the individual standings.

It seemed that momentum was on the side of the Buckeyes heading into the Big Ten Championships April 30-May 2, but tough conditions and a difficult field kept the starting five of Hoag, Smith, Wright and the freshman duo of Matt Turner and Zack Sobel in check. Ohio State closed out the 2009-10 season with a ninth-place finish at the Big Ten Championships.

Hoag wrapped up his year with his third top-10 finish at the conference tournament in a tie for seventh. For the second-consecutive season, he was named to the PING All-Midwest Region team.

WOMEN'S GOLF

The Ohio State women's golf team concluded its 2009-10 campaign with an overall mark of 121-47-5 after competing in 11 events. The Buckeyes notched eight top 5 finishes throughout the season to close play in the No. 24 slot of the Golfweek/Sagarin ratings and No. 17 of the Golfstat.com standings.

The Buckeyes opened their season with back-to-back top 5 finishes when they carded a fourth-place finish at the inaugural Golfweek Conference Challenge Sept. 13-15 in Las Vegas, Nev., and went on to tie for second at the Lady Northern Invitational Sept. 27-28 while previewing the Big Ten course and competition in Madison, Wis. After a tough outing at the Mercedes-Benz Championship in Knoxville, fall play concluded by hosting the All-Ohio Invitational Oct. 25-26 where four Buckeyes competed as individuals and claimed the top 4 sports on their own Scarlet Course. Sophomore Vicky Villanueva led the charge as medalist at 1-over at the 36-hole event.

With a spring warm-up against OSU alumni and LPGA Tour pros, Ohio State continued its success throughout the second half of its season beginning with a third-place finish at the competitive Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge Feb. 8-10 in Palos Verdes, Calif. Posting their best-ever finish in the 14-year history of the tournament, the Buckeyes would go on to record top 3 placements at four of their next six outings, including runner-up at the inaugural Kinderlou Forest Challenge March 1-2 in Georgia.

Ohio State concluded the regular season with its second-consecutive victory at its own Lady Buckeye Spring Invitational April 17-18 after firing a team score of 919 for a 14-stroke win over Big Ten rival Michigan State. Led by freshman Rachel Rohanna who finished runner-up, five Buckeyes finished in the top 10, including a career-high finish of tied for fourth for senior captain Emma Jandel. The back-to-back victories were the first for the Buckeyes at

their tournament since consecutive titles from 1998-2001.

In postseason action, the Scarlet and Gray returned to Madison, Wis., and finished the 72-hole Big Ten championships in third place. It was Ohio State's third top 3 finish in eight of the last nine conference tournaments. Villanueva and junior In Hong Lim led the way for the team by tying for 11th.

Ohio State was then awarded the fourth seed in the NCAA West Regional and traveled to Stanford, Calif., to make its 16th-consecutive NCAA regional appearance. Firing a team score of 910 to finish in 12th at the NCAA West Regional (May 6-8), the Buckeyes missed the cut to compete for a national championship by seven strokes.

For their efforts throughout the season, Rohanna, Lim and Jandel all earned league recognition. Leading the Buckeyes in stroke average at 75.24, Rohanna was a First Team All-Big Ten selection while the pair of Lim and Jandel received a second team nod. Freshman Amy Meier also garnered a weekly award from the league when she was named Big Ten Golfer of the Week March 3 after leading the Buckeyes in a tie for seventh at the Kinderlou Forest Challenge.

MEN'S GYMNASTICS

After opening the season ranked seventh in the preseason coaches' poll, Ohio State, under the guidance of 13th-year head coach Miles Avery, climbed as high as fifth in the 2010 GymInfo national poll, holding the position for six-consecutive weeks.

Strong leadership from the upperclassmen helped the Buckeyes conclude the regular season with four-consecutive team scores above the 350.000 mark with its highest score, a 354.900, coming vs. No. 2 Oklahoma (March 13). Overall, the squad posted a 7-6 record, including a 3-4 ledger in the Big Ten. Ohio State finished fourth as host of the 2010 Big Ten Championships before qualifying to its second-consecutive NCAA team championships.

In 2010, senior Tai Lee, junior Brandon Wynn and sophomore Ty Echard posted Ohio State program records. Lee tied former Buckeye Jake Bateman (2006-09) with a 15.3 on high bar, Wynn notched an NCAA-high 16.3 on rings and Echard posted a 15.7 on pommel horse.

THE ALL-AMERICANS

Highlighted by junior captain Brandon Wynn's national title on rings, Ohio State had a tremendous night at the 2010 NCAA Individual Championships April 17 in West Point, N.Y., seeing all three qualifiers in Wynn, Philip Onorato and Steven Spencer earn All-America honors. Ohio State head coach Miles Avery has now coached 23 All-Americans to a combined 64 honors.

Wynn accomplished a feat that just one other gymnast in Ohio State history had done so before – be named a national champion on rings. He won his first career NCAA title on rings with a 15.9, .750 points better than the rest of the pack, joining current Buckeye assistant coach and former U.S. Olympian Blaine Wilson as the only two gymnasts to do so.

Wynn is the sixth Buckeye under Avery to win a national title and the first since Pejman Ebrahimi won the vault title in 2007. Avery's six national champions own a combined nine titles.

Spencer delivered a clean routine on pommel horse that the judges awarded a 15.125 which was good for third, making the sophomore a two-time All-American.

Onorato, the 2009 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, earned his first career All-American honor as a sophomore, scoring a 15.95 on vault to tie for fourth place.

THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

Ranked fifth in the nation, Ohio State was selected to the 2010 NCAA Men's Gymnastics National Qualifier, the 13th-consecutive appearances for the Buckeyes under head coach Miles Avery.

The Scarlet and Gray qualified for its second-consecutive NCAA championships, scoring a 346.800 team total for third at the national qualifier April 15 in Christl Arena on the campus of the Military Academy in West Point, N.Y. In thrilling fashion, it came down to the final event between Ohio State and Penn State with the Buckeyes just edging the Nittany Lions for the third and final qualifying position, 346.800-345.550.

With a 347.350 team total, Ohio State finished sixth at the 2010 NCAA Team Championships April 16. Michigan won with a 360.500, Stanford was second with a 359.800 and Oklahoma took third with a 357.050.

NABBING BIG TEN HARDWARE

Ohio State gymnasts like collecting hardware and did so as the team combined for five individual Big Ten medals April 4 in St. John Arena.

Junior captain Brandon Wynn earned his first career Big Ten title on rings (15.85) and added third-place finishes on vault and in the all-around. Wynn became the first Buckeye to win an individual conference championship since DJ Bucher (2005-08) and Eddie Hay (2006-09) won parallel bars and floor, respectively, in 2007.

Lancaster, Ohio, native Ty Echard received the first Big Ten medal of his career, taking second on pommel horse (15.325). After finishing third at the NCAA championships as a true freshman in 2009, Echard set the Ohio State program record on pommel horse with a score of 15.7 vs. Michigan March 20.

Sophomore Philip Onorato sprang his way to a career-high 16.3 on vault at the conference finals. The Plano, Texas, native took second on vault for the second-consecutive season to bring his career Big Ten medal count up to three after placing second on rings and vault in his conference rookie of the year season in 2009.

BIG TEN GYMNAST OF THE WEEK

Junior captain Brandon Wynn earned his first career Big Ten Gymnast of the Week honor March 15 after notching a program-best 16.3 on rings vs. No. 2 Oklahoma March 13 in St. John Arena.

The All-American spearheaded the Buckeyes' 1-2-3 finish on the event vs. the Sooners as the team recorded a season-high event score of 61.05 en route to a season-best 354.900 team total.

His 16.3 is the highest score recorded by a gymnast at the collegiate level in the last two seasons. In fact, Wynn is the only NCAA gymnast to score a 16.0 or higher on the event and did so XX times this season.

U.S. NATIONAL TEAM MEMBER

Brandon Wynn won the 2010 USA Gymnastics Winter Cup Challenge rings title with a two-day total of 30.55, earning himself a spot on his second-consecutive U.S. Senior National team in February. At the prelims he recorded a 15.15 and added a 15.4 at the finals with both tallies serving as meet highs.

Wynn becomes the first Buckeye to win a USA event title since Jimmy Wickham (2005-08) won the vault title at the Winter Cup Challenge in 2006. Wynn also finished seventh on vault and 17th in the all-around.

MYERS, WYNN DUBBED CAPTAINS

Senior Justin Myers and junior Brandon Wynn were named co-captains of the 2010 squad prior to the start of the season.

Myers, a three-year letterwinner, increased his role on the squad each season through consistent hard work in the gym. Winner of the team's most improved honor in 2007 and '08, Myers was a mainstay in the Buckeyes' floor, vault, parallel bars and high bar squads.

Wynn returned for his junior campaign after earning All-America honors in the all-around in 2009. The Voorhees, N.J., native has been a key leader on the competition floor in the all-around since joining Ohio State in 2008.

WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS

Despite being hampered by injuries, the Ohio State women's gymnastics team completed its 2010 season with an appearance at the 2010 NCAA Regional championships where the squad placed fifth with a 193.875. Under sixth-year head coach Carey Fagan, the Buckeyes compiled a 4-7 overall record while going 1-3 in Big Ten action.

With a final 194.570 regional qualifying score, the Scarlet and Gray ranked 34th in the country and eighth in the Central Region.

MAKING REGIONALS

Facing a slew of preseason injuries, Ohio State may have started 2010 off slow, but the momentum it gained through the regular season helped the squad qualify for its fifth-consecutive appearance at the NCAA Regional Championships in Buckeye head coach Carey Fagan's sixth season.

HOSTING THE BIG TEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

As host of the 2010 Big Ten Championships March 27, Ohio State scored a 194.700 in St. John Arena in front of a crowd of 1,717. The Buckeyes' team total served as the team's third-best sum this season and was good for a seventh-place finish. Three-time All-Big Ten honoree Rebecca Best finished tied for fifth in the all-around with a 39.275, a season high, after scoring team-high marks on all four events.

ALL-BIG TEN

Senior captain Hillary Dow and junior Rebecca Best received second-team All-Big Ten honors. For Dow, the all-conference honor was the first of her career while Best, a 2009 All-American, earns her third second-team honor. In six seasons, Ohio State head coach Carey Fagan has tutored eight student-athletes to 11 All-Big Ten honors with Best being her first three-time awardwinner.

THE 39.000 CLUB

Ohio State saw four gymnasts hit above a 39.000 in the all-around in 2010. Junior All-American Rebecca Best led the way with a season-best 39.275 notched at the 2010 Big Ten Championships March 27 in St. John Arena.

Sophomore Casey Williamson posted a career-best 39.075 in the upset win over Penn State while senior captain Hillary Dow added a season-best 39.050. Against Auburn, freshman Colleen Dean hit a personal-best 39.075 in the all-around to finish second behind Best's 39.100.

HOME FLOOR ADVANTAGE

With three of its four regular-season home meets scheduled late in the year, Ohio State scored some of the team's best marks in St. John Arena, upsetting nationally-ranked Penn State (Feb. 27) and Auburn (March 13). The Buckeyes recorded their season-best team score, a 195.525, vs. Auburn.

Three of the team's season-best event tallies have come in Columbus with a 48.900 on bars and a 49.000 on beam vs. the Tigers, in addition to a 48.875 on floor vs. the Flames. The Buckeyes' best vault score, a 49.050, came on the road vs. Iowa Feb. 6.

ST. JOHN 'UPSET' ARENA

With strong performances from senior Hillary Dow, sophomore Casey Williamson and freshman Colleen Dean, Ohio State earned its first Big Ten win of the season Feb. 27, downing then-No. 14 Penn State, 194.950-193.850, in St. John Arena. Ohio State is 5-1-1 against PSU in St. John Arena during the regular season since the 1996-97 season.

Williamson took third in the all-around, finishing with a career-best 39.075 while Dow was fourth with a 39.050. Dean, who has championed the Buckeyes on floor all season, finished second on the event with a 9.825 and also finished second with a 9.750 on bars.

Later in the year, the Buckeyes upset then-No. 17 Auburn in St. John Arena March 13 with a season-high 195.525. On Ohio State's senior day, the Buckeye all-arounders swept first through fourth. Junior Rebecca Best had a 39.150 and Dean followed with a career-best 39.075 to finish 1-2. Williamson had a 38.900 for third and senior Kristin Perchatsch competed in the all-around for the first time this season and scored a 38.750 for fourth.

DOW RECEIVES MOST OUTSTANDING SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD

Hillary Dow was recognized with a Big Ten Most Outstanding Sportsmanship Award. She was joined by 21 other student-athletes from around the league who demonstrated positive sportsmanship throughout the 2009-10 academic year.

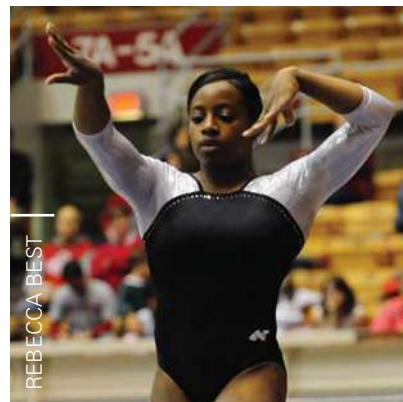

The squad swept Notre Dame in the first round of the league playoffs before dropping a game to top seed Miami in the quarterfinal opener. In game two the Buckeyes downed the RedHawks in overtime, 5-4, on a Sergio Somma goal to tie the series at one game each. In the decisive third game, No. 2-ranked Miami, the league's regular-season champion, came away with a 2-1 victory for the series win.

The Buckeyes were led throughout the year by Zac Dalpe, who had a team-high 21 goals and 45 points en route to second team All-America and first team All-CCHA honors, the first Buckeye so honored since 2003.

WOMEN'S HOCKEY

• Ohio State concluded the 2009-10 season with a 17-15-5 overall record. The Buckeyes tied for fifth in the WCHA standings with 28 points on a 12-13-3-1 record. They won the tiebreaker with Bemidji State with a 2-1-1 regular-season record against the Beavers.

• The Buckeyes' season came to an end with a double-overtime 5-4 loss to Minnesota in a WCHA Final Faceoff semifinal game March 6 at Ridder Arena. Ohio State advanced to the WCHA semifinal game for the first time since 2007.

• It took two overtimes, but fifth-seed Ohio State swept fourth-seed Wisconsin in the WCHA First Round Playoffs, Feb. 26-27 at the Eagle's Nest Arena in Verona, Wis. The Buckeyes won 3-2 the first game and 4-3 the second game.

• The fifth-seeded Buckeyes became just the second team to upset a higher-seeded team in the five-year history of the WCHA hosting the best-of-three playoff series. Bemidji State then pulled the third upset Sunday with a victory over St. Cloud State to win the series, 2-1.

• Hokey Langan was named WCHA Rookie of the Year and earned a spot on the Second Team All-WCHA, along with senior defenseman Rachel Davis. Sophomore forward Natalie Spooner was a First Team All-WCHA selection.

• Langan led the Buckeyes in points (53) and goals (25), while Laura McIntosh led the team in assists (35).

• Langan's point total ranked second in the Ohio State season records, just one shy of tying the record. She set the Buckeye record for freshman scoring by nine points. McIntosh's assists also rank second in the season records and she is just the second player to set up over 30 goals in a season.

• During the season, Langan tied for the second-longest point streak in team history with 14 games (from Oct. 23-Jan. 3). She had 24 points in that span. She led the Buckeyes with 15 multiple-point games. She was held without a point in back-to-back games just twice.

• Only two years into their careers, McIntosh and Spooner rank in the top 15 of career scoring in the OSU records. McIntosh has 84 points (21g, 63a) to stand in 11th, while Spooner has 74 points (43g, 31a) for 14th.

• In net for the majority of the season was freshman goalie Chelsea Knapp – the first rookie in net for Ohio State since the inaugural 1999-2000 season. She was 15-15-5 with a 3.02 goals-against average and .894 save percentage.

• Knapp had 883 saves to finish three saves away from tying Ohio State's season record of 886 set by Liana Bonanno in 2008-09. They are the only two Buckeyes to make more than 800 saves in a season.

• Davis was named to the West team to compete in the 2010 NCAA Skills Challenge at the NCAA Men's Frozen Four in Detroit.

• Ohio State had four representatives play in the 2010 Winter Olympics in Vancouver with each of them picking up a medal. Two-time All-American Tessa Bonhomme earned gold as a defenseman with Canada, three-time All-WCHA honoree Lisa Chesson earned silver as a defenseman with the United States and All-American Emma Laaksonen, the Finnish team captain, and freshman forward Minttu Tuominen were bronze medalists with Finland. It was the first Olympic appearance for Bonhomme, Chesson and Tuominen and the fourth Games for Laaksonen.

• Ohio State played in their 11 overtime games, setting a team record after two seasons with 10 OT games. They were 3-3-5 in extra session games. Five of Ohio State's 11 overtime games were played in February and one in March.

• The Buckeyes had at least one win against six of the seven WCHA opponents, with Minnesota the only won OSU did not defeat. Ohio State was the last team to beat Minnesota Duluth (6-3 win Feb. 13) before its run to the WCHA and NCAA championships.

• OSU defeated the Badgers four times this season (4-2-0). The team had just three total wins over UW in the previous 10 seasons.

• The Buckeyes were 9-6-4 on the road.

• Ohio State set a team record with four hat tricks in 2009-10: two by Hokey Langan (including a four-goal game), one by Natalie Spooner and one by Minttu Tuominen. Other season team records were set include: goals (122), assists (204), points (326) and shots (tied, 1,214).

• Ohio State had the fifth-highest scoring offense in the NCAA at 3.30 goals per game and the power play was third in the nation at 21.8 percent (36-of-165).

MEN'S LACROSSE

In its first season as a member of the ECAC Lacrosse League, Ohio State was 7-8 overall and 3-4 in conference action. The squad was 5-2 at home, including a win in the third annual Showdown in the Shoe in front of an NCAA record crowd.

Freshman Logan Schuss led the Buckeyes in scoring throughout the season en route to ECAC Rookie of the Year and first team all-conference accolades. He was named an honorable mention All-American by the USILA, the first Buckeye to earn All-America honors as a rookie, and his team-high 56 points were the most for a freshman in Ohio State history.

The Buckeyes hit goals throughout the season. Before the spring campaign began the team had already reached its target of 500 community service hours. With 26 players invited to the Ohio State Scholar-Athlete Dinner and a team cumulative grade point average of 3.02, the squad also achieved its academic goals for 2009-10. The squad aimed for half of its 46-man roster to post a 3.0 cumulative GPA to earn an invitation to the annual scholar-athlete dinner and to combine for a squad cumulative GPA of 3.0.

For the third-consecutive season, the Buckeyes set national men's lacrosse records for regular-season and on-campus attendance when 31,078 watched Ohio State down Air Force in Ohio Stadium prior to the football spring game, surpassing the 30,192 from 2009.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE

The Ohio State women's lacrosse team wrapped up the 2010 season with a 9-8 overall record and a 1-4 mark in the American Lacrosse Conference. The Buckeyes were powered by one of the most successful scoring tandems in the NCAA in Kelly Haggerty and Alayna Markwordt. The pair combined for 150 points, the sixth-most of any point-scoring duo in the nation.

In addition, Haggerty wrapped up her career as one of the most prolific scorers in program history with the all-time records for career points and goals at Ohio State with 243 and 143, respectively. With 100 assists, the First Team All-ALC selection also is one of just two Buckeyes to eclipse the century mark in their career.

Markwordt finished second on the team in both goals and assists with 43 and 29, respectively, for 72 total points. The Woodbine, Md., native had 12 multi-goal games, including back-to-back five-goal performances vs. Northwestern and Florida.

On the other end of the field, Annie Carruthers was tabbed the ALC Goalie of the Year after leading the conference throughout the regular season in save percentage (0.506) and saves per game (10.1), totals that placed her third and sixth in the NCAA, respectively in the two categories. The junior stopper also made a career-high 22 saves against Northwestern March 24, the second-most of any NCAA goalie in the 2010 season, and had at least 10 in eight games this year.

At the end of the season, Sue Stimmel, the only head coach in Buckeye lacrosse history, resigned from her post after 15 years.

POSTSEASON NOTES

BUCKEYE BOUNTY - ALC STYLE

Annie Carruthers headlined the list of Buckeye award winners as the 2010 American Lacrosse Conference Goalie of the Year. Carruthers joined senior Kelly Haggerty as members of the All-ALC First Team, while sophomore Alayna Markwordt earned second-team recognition. Carruthers is the second ALC Goalie of the Year for the Buckeyes, joining Erin Forquer from the 2003 season. The program has had 29 total all-conference selections, including 17 on the first team.

RECORDS WATCH

With two assists vs. Vanderbilt April 12, senior Kelly Haggerty broke the all-time record for career points at Ohio State. The West Chester, Pa., native finished her career with 143 goals and 100 assists for 243 points, passing Kristen Slahor's 221 (82g, 139a) earned during the 2005-08 seasons. She also holds the all-time record for career goals at Ohio State with 143, tying the previous leader in that category - Megan Mirick (143, 1999-2003). With 100 assists, the First Team All-ALC selection also is one of just two Buckeyes to eclipse the century mark in their career.

ANNIE GET YOUR SAVE

Carruthers, the ALC Goalie of the Year, led the conference throughout the regular season in save percentage (0.506) and saves per game (10.1) and was ranked third and sixth in the NCAA, respectively in the two categories. The Columbus Academy product made a career-high 22 saves against Northwestern March 24, the second-most of any NCAA goalie in the 2010 season, and has had at least 10 in eight games this year. With 172 saves to her credit, Carruthers tallied the third-most all-time in a single season at Ohio State, trailing second-place Nicole Morris and her 174 (1997) by just two.

RANK AND FILE

After four-consecutive weeks in the IWLCA Top 20, the Buckeyes dropped out after their loss to Hopkins May 2. They had re-entered at No. 20 April 5 for the first time since the March 1 edition and had since moved up three spots. After being limited to receiving votes beginning March 8, Ohio State went 6-4 with its losses coming at the hands of then-No. 1 and undefeated Northwestern, No. 10 Vanderbilt, No. 18 Penn State and No. 12 Notre Dame before dropping out of the national rankings.

DYNAMIC DUO

Kelly Haggerty and Alayna Markwordt comprise one of the most successful scoring duos in NCAA lacrosse, combining for 150 points this season, the sixth-most among Division I scoring tandems entering the week of competition. Haggerty led the Buckeyes with 38 goals and 39 assists, while Markwordt was second with 43 goals and 29 assists.

MARGIN OF VICTORY

In games won, the Buckeyes outscored their opponents 157-69 - an 88-goal difference and an average of 9.8 goals per game. Their largest win this season came against Detroit last Sunday, a 21-4 victory. They previously had beaten Cincinnati 20-5.

DEFENSIVE DIVA

Maghan Beaudrault led the team with 25 caused turnovers this season - eight more than her closest teammate (Lindsey Gysin, 17). Her 1.47 caused turnovers per game ranked 48th in the NCAA and third in the ALC. She has had multi-CT games in four contests this season, including a career-high seven against Canisius April 5 in Buffalo, N.Y.

GONE STREAKING

Two Buckeye attackers hold point-scoring streaks of at least 20 games. Kelly Haggerty notched at least one goal or assist in each of her last 35 career games - the 14th-longest active streak in the country at the close of the season - while Alayna Markwordt posted points in 31-consecutive games.

BIG GAMES, SMALL SCREEN

Buckeye lacrosse made four appearances on national television this season, three on the Big Ten Network and one on ESPNU. Ohio State made its debut on Big Ten Network with the Penn State game April 18 before making a second appearance vs. Notre Dame later that week and a third vs. the Nittany Lions in the ALC Tournament. The game against Johns Hopkins was on ESPNU, the first for Ohio State on the ESPN family of networks.

Ohio State closed its season with a 14th-place finish at the 2010 NCAA Championships May 28-30 on Lake Natoma in Gold River, Calif. After three-consecutive regular-season road regattas and hosting the fourth at Griggs Reservoir on the Scioto River, the Buckeyes' postseason also included the Big Ten championships in Laingsburg, Mich., and the Aramark South/Central Region Sprints in Oak Ridge, Tenn. Ohio State finished fourth as a team on both occasions.

Senior Charlott Goldstein earned All-America honors as a second-team honoree. Goldstein (first team) also was an All Big-Ten selection, joining Sara Wallace (second team) and Claudia Herpertz (second team). Goldstein (first team) and Wallace (second team) were also placed on the Collegiate Rowing Coaches Association (CRCA) All-Central Region team. The CRCA also announced the 2010 Scholar-Athletes, which included 10 Buckeyes.

A LOOK BACK AT 2009

August 19 - The Buckeyes reported to fall camp the day before with six starters returning from the 2008 squad, as well as 10 additional letterwinners and 11 newcomers. All 27 team members were present and accounted for at the first of two sessions of the day. Under heavy rain, the Buckeyes spent over an hour doing drills and possession work before taking part in a 40-minute intra-squad scrimmage.

September 4 - Ohio State opened the 2009 campaign against Gonzaga in its annual Bert & Iris Wolstein Classic. The Buckeyes played the Zags to a 1-1 tie with Austin McAnena scoring his first collegiate goal. Former players and friends of the program descended upon Columbus for Alumni Weekend.

September 6 - They would come back on the second day of tourney action and defeat Cal State Fullerton, 1-0, on a late-game goal by Eric Shrigley - also the first of his career - to capture the Wolstein Classic crown. Doug Verhoff was named MVP of the tournament, while Dalton Summers, Matt Gold and Shrigley all earned all-tournament team recognition.

September 11 - In a 1-1 draw with Hofstra, redshirt freshman keeper Ryan Dalton played all 110 minutes in goal, making his second collegiate start and making 10 saves - the most for a Buckeye since Oct. 18, 2008 when Byron Neal also tallied 10 vs. Wisconsin.

September 13 - Doug Verhoff propelled the Buckeyes with two goals in the team's 4-2 win over Hofstra in the Penn State Classic. Austin McAnena and Andrew Magill also put up scores in the contest, marking the first four-goal output for Ohio State since nearly a year earlier when it earned a 4-1 win over Furman Sept. 14, 2008 in Charleston, S.C.

September 18 - Chris Hegngi and Joshua Breto teamed up to lead the team to a 2-1 win over Butler with Hegngi tallying both goals off assists from Breto, handing the Bulldogs their first loss of the 2009 season.

September 23 - Doug Verhoff scored on a penalty kick in the 81st minute to give OSU a 1-0 win over IUPUI remaining undefeated through seven games (4-0-3) and tying the most games without a loss to start the season during head coach John Bluem's 13 seasons. Verhoff's goal was the seventh-consecutive head PK for Ohio State, dating back to 2005.

September 27 - Sam Scales scored his first goal of the season to lead the Buckeyes to a 1-0 win over No. 21 Michigan State, giving them the best start in program history by remaining unbeaten through eight games (5-0-3). The MSU loss was the first to a conference team for the defending Big Ten champs on its home field since Nov. 4, 2007, when the Buckeyes defeated the Spartans in the Big Ten Tournament. Matt Lampson stopped all four shots on goal to secure his third-consecutive shutout through 322:19 of game action.

September 28 - Matt Lampson earned Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors after securing back-to-back shutouts over IUPUI and Michigan State. He would go on to earn two more player of the week honors.

October 2 - The Buckeyes spent this Friday night with about 100 kids, eighth grade and younger, at a skills clinic in the Woody Hayes Athletic Center.

October 7 - Joshua Breto scored the lone goal of the game in the ninth minute in a 1-0 win over Oakland to snap a brief two-game losing skid. Breto has three career goals to his credit, all standing as game-winners.

October 18 - Austin McAnena and Konrad Warzycha each scored and tallied an assist as the Buckeyes defeated No. 24 Penn State, 2-1. With the three points, McAnena took over the Buckeye scoring totals with four goals and three assists, totaling 11 points. Sam Scales, the team leader in assists, also helped out on both goals, extending his total to five. Head coach John Bluem would foreshadow things to come by saying, "The race for the Big Ten championship started today" after the game.

WOMEN'S SOCCER

14-4-2, 7-2-1 Big Ten
2nd place in Big Ten
Hosted NCAA Columbus Regional

The 2009 season was one full of program bests and record-setting performances for the Ohio State women's soccer team.

The Buckeyes finished second in the Big Ten Conference for their best finish ever and reached their fifth NCAA tournament. Their 14-3-2 regular season record marked the best in school history. The seven wins Ohio State posted in Big Ten play were a program best and the four total losses tied for the fewest in school history. The Buckeyes gave up just 13 goals, four fewer than any other season and were 4-0-1 against ranked opponents.

"I am very proud of our accomplishments," head coach Lori Walker said. "We set goals of winning the Big Ten, embraced that challenge and the girls held it in their hands for weeks so it was a tangible, critical experience for our players."

Five Buckeyes were named All-Big Ten, including captains Ashley Bowyer and Cassie Dickerson on the first team. Another Buckeye captain, Lauren "Taz" Robertson, received second team honors along with Lauren Steuer while rookie Tiffany Cameron made the All-Freshman team.

Bowyer and Robertson will leave Ohio State as two of the most decorated players in program history. Only three players have started more games for the Buckeyes than Bowyer. In her 82 games played, all starts, the Aliso Viejo, Calif., native scored 10 goals and added 16 assists, good for sixth all-time at Ohio State.

Robertson posted one of the most dominant seasons in program history in 2009, recording an Ohio State record 12 shutouts and a 0.63 goals-against average, the second-best ever. The 29 career shutouts posted by the Mission Viejo, Calif., native are the most ever at Ohio State and second-most all-time in Big Ten history. Taz's career goals-against average of 1.03 ranks second at Ohio State and her 283 career saves are the third-most in program history.

"To go from giving up 31 goals (in 2008) to 13 is incredible," Walker added. "The 13 shutouts were a very high number and going 14-4-2 against a competitive schedule will only help us down the road."

Junior Lauren Steuer was able to make a successful transition to the midfield from the back line, tallying four goals while leading the team with seven assists for a team-leading 15 points.

Despite the production from the upperclassmen, 2009 was not all about the veterans as freshmen or sophomores accounted for 24 Buckeye goals and eight game-winners. Freshman Lauren Granberg and sophomore Paige Maxwell led the team with six goals each while Cameron added four goals and four assists.

The 2009 campaign may go down as one of the best seasons in program history, but the Buckeyes will look at it as a foundation to build upon in 2010.

MEN'S SWIMMING AND DIVING

9-1 Overall; 3-1 Big Ten Conference
1st at Big Ten Championships
9th at NCAA Championships

Ohio State swimming and diving capped its finest season in nearly 50 years March 27 at the McCorkle Aquatic Pavilion – the center of the college swimming universe this season – with 136.5 points and a ninth-place finish at the 2010 NCAA championships.

This coming exactly one month after Ohio State, before a raucous and packed McCorkle Aquatic Pavilion crowd, captured their first Big Ten championship in 54 years with a stunning and winning total of 860.50 points. The remarkable team effort saw all 25 members of the championship roster scoring points with four individual Big Ten champions plus a relay crown. Two-time defending champion Michigan was runner-up with 715.50 points with Minnesota third with 497.

“This is clearly the best team Ohio State has put in the pool since 1962 (the year of the school’s last NCAA championship),” Ohio State swimming coach Bill Wadley said. “And this is probably the deepest team, in terms of depth, of any Ohio State team. I am totally satisfied with everything this team gave athletically, academically and competitively.”

The 2010 Big Ten champion Buckeyes included George Markovic (500 free), Elliott Keefer (100 breaststroke), Andrew Elliott (100 backstroke), Stefan Sigrist (1650 free) and the 200 freestyle relay team of Joel Elber, Lincoln Fahrback, Andrew Olson and Tim Phillips.

OHIO STATE WOMEN'S SWIMMING AND DIVING

Ohio State started the final day of the 2010 Big Ten Swimming and Diving championships in fifth-place and with coach Bill Dorenkott knowing it would be extremely difficult to hold off Wisconsin and Penn State on the final day for the school's first Top 5 finish in 13 years.

Well, the Buckeyes did it! Sparked by an avalanche of strong swims, every swimmer embracing her role and building upon every swim, Ohio State increased its slim margins over both schools heading into Saturday to finish in fifth place with 399.5 points. Wisconsin was sixth with 384.5 points and Penn State was seventh with 333 points.

The Top 5 championships effort by Ohio State represents the highest finish for the team in 13 years, or since the 1997 team finished fifth. The 399 points was the most scored by Ohio State in 16 years. The 1994 team scored 440 points and finished third.

"This was a terrific day," Ohio State coach Bill Dorenkott said. "We had a really good prelim session this morning followed up by the best session of the entire meet this evening.

"The team raced with a ton of heart today. It was awesome. I am most excited because we became a better team this weekend. The passion and the pride in representing Ohio State and wearing the Scarlet and Gray couldn't have been more evident. This is just another step for us building this program up to where we want it to be."

The team sent five student-athletes - swimmers Megan Alexander, Sam Cheverton and Shannon Draves, and divers Chelsea Davis and Bianca Alvarez - to the NCAA championships. The Buckeyes were 22nd at NAAs with Davis taking seventh on the 1-meter springboard to earn All-America honors and Alvarez picking up honorable mention accolades on both the 1- and 3-meter boards with ninth-place finishes on each, respectively.

NCAA Results for the swimmers: Alexander - 27th in 100 breaststroke; 28th in 200 breaststroke; Cheverton - 17th in 500 free in school record 4:42.64; 18th in 200 free and 25th in 200 backstroke; Draves - 26th in 100 butterfly in school record 53.54; 23rd in 200 fly.

MEN'S TENNIS

Following a season that included a NCAA final appearance and the loss of two four-time All-Americans, the 2009-10 Ohio State men's tennis team returned to the courts in the same dominating fashion. Under 11th-year head coach Ty Tucker, the team continued to pile up win after win, which included its fifth-consecutive trip to an NCAA quarterfinal match.

Although the No. 4 Buckeyes fell short of their ultimate goal after dropping a 4-0 decision to No. 5 USC in a rematch of the 2009 final at the Dan Magill Tennis Complex in Athens, Ga., Ohio State showed the tennis community the program will continue to be a powerhouse for years to come.

The Buckeyes (35-2; 10-0) completed the campaign with a list of impressive program statistics, both individual and team, including second in wins (35) and winning percentage (.946) with the 2007-08 season and the second-longest dual-match winning streak at 27 victories. Along with winning their fifth-consecutive Big Ten regular-season and tournament crowns, the team improved its remarkable home win streak to 110 consecutive wins, dating back to 2003. With 10 members on the squad returning in 2011, it is safe to say the Scarlet and Gray will be a force not only in conference play, but also on the national stage.

WOMEN'S TENNIS

The 2009-10 season was a record-breaking campaign for the Ohio State women's tennis team. The squad not only earned the highest ranking in program history, reaching No. 17 Feb. 23 – March 2, but also became the first team in school history to reach 20 wins. Ten of those 20 wins were shutouts, also a school record.

The Buckeyes' success was a result of their fast start, winning nine of their first 10 matches, and outstanding play against ranked opponents, particularly on the road where the team earned seven of its 10 victories against ranked teams. Big road wins included a 5-2 victory over No. 23 Virginia and a 6-1 defeat of No. 15 Fresno State in the ITA National Indoor Qualifier. The Scarlet and Gray also took advantage of an 8-3 record at home, with victories against No. 58 LSU and No. 34 Kentucky.

The team battled through Big Ten play, finishing .500 in conference matches. The conference experienced great success as a whole, finishing with nine teams in the ITA Top 75 and six NCAA tournament qualifiers. The Buckeyes produced big wins against No. 56 Minnesota and No. 38 Indiana to earn a seventh seed in the Big Ten tournament. The squad won its opening-round conference tournament match for the second-straight year, this time shutting out Michigan State, 4-0.

Ohio State carried momentum from the Big Ten tournament into the NCAA Championship as an at-large qualifier, downing No. 30 DePaul, 4-1, in the first round for the school's first NCAA victory since a 4-2 win against Harvard in 2004.

Doubles was once again a strength for the Buckeyes, as the team won 19 of 30 doubles points throughout the dual season. The pairing of Christina Keeseey and Paloma Escobedo proved to be the most successful for the Scarlet and Gray, finishing 8-2 in Big Ten matches and leading the team with 20 wins.

In singles, freshman Gabby Steele proved to be a catalyst for the Buckeyes' run to the NCAA tournament, winning 19 matches in the spring while playing at Nos. 3, 4 and 5. Steele's 25 overall wins led the team, but Kelsey Haviland and Kirsten Flower each tied the freshman's mark with 19 dual match victories.

Flower garnered All-Big Ten honors for the second-consecutive season, becoming the first Buckeye to do so since Monica Rincon from 2000-2002. Flower also picked up Big Ten Athlete of the Week honors in February after leading Ohio State to victories over three Top 50 opponents, including an upset of No. 23 Virginia.

Haviland racked up 23 wins, including five-straight to finish the season. Senior Christina Keeseey earned 18 singles victories to finish her career fifth in Ohio State history with 81 wins. She also finished ninth in the OSU record books in doubles with 82 victories.

MEN'S TRACK AND FIELD

The Ohio State men's track and field team posted another solid all-around season with Top 3 finishes at the Big Ten's indoor and outdoor championships.

During the indoor campaign, the Buckeyes scored their highest finish since the 1996 season with a second-place finish at the conference meet. Ohio State captured four individual Big Ten titles on their way to a total team score of 112.50. The Buckeyes defended their 2009 indoor and outdoor titles in the 4x400m relay with Thomas Murdaugh, Elon Simms, Brandon Woodard and Stephen Robinson taking home the win. Ohio State also swept the Top 3 spots in the 200m dash, led by Robinson, who won his first Big Ten title. All-American Murdaugh won his first Big Ten individual title in the 400m dash and after winning the 3000m run the day before, senior All-American Jeff See finished third in the mile.

At the NCAA indoor championships, three Buckeyes - See, Murdaugh and Matt DeChant - were named Division I All-Americans. See claimed top honors with a sixth-place finish in the mile, his second AA award in the indoor mile. Big Ten Indoor Athlete of the Year Murdaugh earned his second All-American award as a Buckeye after finishing ninth in the 400m. Like Murdaugh, DeChant claimed All-American honors - his first - despite finishing outside of the Top 8.

Gary's Buckeyes finished third overall at the Big Ten outdoor championships in May with a team score of 115 points. On the final day, the 4x400m relay team of Woodard, Korbin Smith, Simms and Murdaugh won its fourth-consecutive conference crown while Robinson won his second 200m dash conference title of the year. Freshman Smith won the long jump title on the second day of competition.

See and DeChant captured All-American honors once again at the NCAA outdoor championships. See used a time of 3:48.37 to finish fifth-overall, good for the fourth All-American award of his career on the track and fifth overall as a Buckeye. The fifth-place effort also marked the third-consecutive season that See finished in the Top 6 in the 1500m at the championships. DeChant earned the second All-American award of his career with an eighth-place and season-best throw of 18.54m in the shot put. See (four points) and DeChant (one) combined to help Ohio State to a 42nd-place finish overall, the highest team finish since a fourth-place finish in 2004.

Also during the outdoor season, four Buckeye middle-distance runners made headlines at the Drake Relays when Jared Hall, Cory Leslie, Daniel White and See set a new 2010 world-best time in the 4x800m relay. Their performance earned a spot at the top of the world rankings with a first-place and school-record time of 7:17.68.

WOMEN'S TRACK AND FIELD

The women's track and field team continued to make big strides under head coach Karen Dennis, highlighted by a dazzling second-place finish at the Big Ten indoor championships, its highest team finish in nine years and a year removed from placing ninth.

Sophomore Christina Manning stole the show at the conference meet, recording two runner-up finishes and an individual title in the 60m hurdles. Manning and Letecia Wright went one-two in the 60m hurdle finals. Manning followed up her title in the hurdles with runner-up finishes in both the 200m and 60m dash. The upset of the championships came in the 400m dash, where Buckeye sophomore Shaniqua McGinnis captured her first individual Big Ten title by defeating Penn State All-American Fawn Dorr.

Manning would finish the indoor season with a bang, becoming an All-American after a seventh-place finish in the finals of the 60m hurdles at the NCAA indoor championships.

Sophomore Maggie Mullen won the first conference title of her career at the 2010 Big Ten Outdoor Championships, OSU's only Big Ten champion of the outdoor season. Ohio State's defending outdoor champion 4x400m relay team eclipsed the previous track record at Indiana, but was unable to duplicate its win from 2009. McGinnis turned in an equally impressive performance for the Buckeyes in the 400m dash, finishing second. The Buckeye 4x100m relay team of McGinnis, Letecia Wright, Christienne Linton and Christina Manning finished third in a season-best time of 44.91. Manning was unable to overtake Penn State All-American Shavon Greaves in the 100m dash title, as the Waldorf, Md., product finished third in 11.77. Wright and Manning failed to duplicate their 1-2 preliminary finish in the 100m hurdle championship run. Wright settled for a third-place finish in 13.42, while Manning failed to finish the race after catching a hurdle while leading midway through the race.

Three Buckeyes qualified for the NCAA outdoor championships in Eugene, Ore. Mullen earned the first All-American award of her career with an eighth-place finish in the javelin, while Manning and Wright competed in the prelims of the 100m hurdles.
