FIRST AND TEN

- The Buckeyes are 991-337-53 all-time in program history and have the highest winning percentage in college football history (.737 pct.).
- Ohio State's 157 wins since 2000 are 10 more than any other program in the country.
- Ohio State's 27 consecutive season-opening wins is the second longest win streak in D-I era (since 1973), tying Florida (1990-2016) and only trails Nebraska with 29 straight from 1986 to 2014.
- After the win on Saturday, Ohio State improved to 91-13-1 all-time as the top-ranked team in the country. Additionally, the Buckeyes have won 25 of its last 26 games as the No. 1 team, dating back to the 2010 season.
- Texas will be head coach Ryan Day's 32nd game against a non-Big Ten opponent in his tenure as head coach (wins vs. Oregon State and TCU as acting head coach in 2018 included).
- Day's Buckeyes are 25-6 in the previous 31 games and average 42.2 points per game.
- Included in those 24 wins are seven against teams ranked in the Top 10: vs. No. 1 Texas (2025), vs. No. 3 Clemson (2020), No. 5 Texas (2024), No. 5 Notre Dame (2022), No. 7 Notre Dame (2024), No. 9 Tennessee (2024) and No. 9 Notre Dame (2023).
- Day's teams are 25-1 in the month of September and 20-1 in regular season non-conference games.

THE STANDARD

Since entering college football in 2024, Jeremiah Smith leads all players in receptions (171), receiving yards (2,709) and receiving TDs (29).

SETTING THE PACE

In the opener, Smith had eight catches for 151 yards and two touchdowns all in the first half. His 151 yards are the second-most in a half in his career (Oregon - 2024).

RECORDS WATCH

Smith goes into Saturday needing 35 receptions, 190 yards and seven touchdowns to break all three Ohio State receiving records.

OHIO STATE FOOTBALL HISTORY

- The 2026 football season will be the 137th in Ohio State program history.
- Ohio State has won nine national championships: 2024-2014-2002-1970-1968-1961-1957-1954-1942.
- Ohio State is second in Big Ten Conference history with 39 conference championships.
- Ohio State is the only Big Ten school to win four consecutive outright Big Ten titles (2017-18-19-20).
- Ohio State leads all Big Ten teams with 566 conference victories.
- Ohio State leads all Big Ten schools with five Big Ten Championship Game wins.
- Ohio State's three national championships in the 2000s are second-most nationally (tied with LSU) this century (since 2000), trailing only Alabama's six.
- During the historic, 2024 season Ohio State: Tied the school record with 14 victories and set school record with 16 games played; Became the first FBS school to defeat five Top 5 teams in one season; Had six wins over Top 10 teams.
- Ohio State has been the winningest program in college football in the last 25 years, the last 50 years and the last 75 years. The Buckeyes have also been the winningest program since the turn of the century, leading the country in wins and win percentage:

THE STANDARD

- Ohio State has 11 12-win seasons (or more), a total that does not include the 2010 season's 12 wins (vacated) or the Covid limited 2020 campaign.
- Only Alabama, with 15 12-win seasons, has more than Ohio State.
- The 2025 season was the 14th consecutive season for at least an 11-win season for Ohio State, a streak that started in 2012 but excludes the 2020 COVID-19 season.
- In the CFP era (since 2014), Ohio State has the best winning percentage (.881; 141-19), has the fewest losses and is second in wins (Alabama leads with 148).

- Only four teams have made the CFPs in both the 2024 and 2025 post-seasons as part of the current 12-team format: three from the Big Ten – Ohio State, Indiana and Oregon –and Georgia.
- Ohio State has developed 99 consensus All-Americans, a total that includes 41 unanimous All-Americans.

THE WINNINGEST IN THE CFP ERA

- In the CFP era (since 2014), Ohio State has the best winning percentage (.882; 142-19), has the fewest losses and is second in wins (Alabama leads with 149).
- Only four teams have made the CFPs in both the 2024 and 2025 post-seasons as part of the current 12-team format: three from the Big Ten – Ohio State, Indiana and Oregon and Georgia.

OHIO STATE AS NO. 1

- Ohio State opened the season as the preseason No. 1 team in the country. After the win on Saturday, Ohio State improved to 91-13-1 all-time as the top-ranked team in the country.
- Additionally, the Buckeyes have won 25 of it's last 26 games as the No. 1 team, dating back to the 2010 season.
- When Ohio State is in a matchup where both teams are ranked, the Buckeyes hold a 162-102-10 record all-time
- When Ohio State's opponent is ranked in the Top 10, the Buckeyes have a record of 96-66-8.

OHIO STATE IN TOP 5 VS. TOP 5 GAMES

- Saturday's No. 1 vs. No. 5 matchup marks the 45th game in program history where both teams are ranked inside of the top five. Ohio State holds a record of 22-21-1 all-time:
- Home: 12–4–0
- Road: 5–6–1
- Neutral: 5–11–0
- Over the last two years, Ohio State is 3-2 in those games.

DAY'S EXPLOSIVE OFFENSES

- Ohio State has had the best offense in the country since Coach Ryan Day took over as head coach ahead of the 2019 season. Teh 39.6 points per game is nearly a point better than anyone else in the country and over three points better than the next closest Big Ten school:

HISTORIC RUN ON DEFENSE

- Since the start of the 2024 national championship season, Ohio State has allowed just 10.9 points per game which is 2.6 points better than any team in the country while also ranking first in yards allowed (235.7) and passing yards allowed (148.6).

- The Buckeyes ranked nationally either No. 1 or No. 2 in nine different categories in 2025, including No. 1 in scoring (9.3), total defense (219.1) passing yards (129.7), first down defense (184), red zone scores (66.67) and fewest plays of 10-or-more yards (90) in 2025.
- The 130 points allowed and 9.3 points allowed per game are both FBS records in the College Football Playoff Era (2014-Present).
- Additionally, it is the second-fewest in the BCS and CFP era (1999-Present).
- It is the fewest allowed since Alabama allowed 106 points and 8.1 points per game in 2011.

KEEP 'EM OUT OF THE ENDZONE

- Since the start of the 2024 season, Ohio State has allowed just 37 overall touchdowns in 31 games (1.19 TD/G), seven fewer than the next closest defense. Ohio State has had nine games in this stretch without allowing a touchdown.
- Ohio State had a historic scoring defense, allowing just 9.3 points per game in the 2025 season which was the third-fewest in the BCS and CFP era (1999-Present) and were one of just five FBS defenses in those two eras combined to allow less than 10.0 points per game:

- Jeremiah Smith has already set more than a handful of school records, including the fastest Buckeye to 100 receptions, to 1,000, 1,500 and 2,000 receiving yards, and to 25 TD receptions.
- His unanimous All-American season in 2025 – 87 receptions for 1,243 yards and 12 touchdowns – leaves him in striking distance of all three of Ohio State's major career receiving records:
- He has 171 receptions and needs 35 to break Emeka Egbuka's mark of 205;
- He has 2,709 receiving yards and needs 190 to break Michael Jenkins' record of 2,898; and
- He has 29 TD receptions and needs seven to break Chris Olave's standard of 35.
- Since entering college football in 2024, Smith leads all players in receptions (171), receiving yards (2,709) and receiving TDs (29).

JUST SAYIN

- QB Julian Sayin led Ohio State to a 14-7 win over No. 1 Texas in his first start and led Ohio State to 12 consecutive regular season wins, including a 27-9 win at Michigan.
- In the process, he became a Heisman Trophy finalist and led the nation in completion percentage (77.0 pct.), ranking second nationally in efficiency (177.5) while throwing for 3,610 yards and 32 touchdowns (fourth nationally) with only eight interceptions.
- 77.0 completion percentage in 2025 is the best in single-season program history, is a Big Ten Record and also is third highest in FBS history (Bo Nix in 2023 at Oregon (77.4 pct.) and Mac Jones in 2020 at Alabama (77.4 pct.)).
- Sayin is the most accurate quarterback in program history with a career completion percentage of 76.4 pct. which also would be an NCAA record (min. 875 attempts).
- His seven 300-yd passing games are tied for the fifth most in program history.

BO KNOWS 1K

- Bo Jackson was one of three true freshmen to top 1,000 rushing yards last season (Caleb Hawkins, North Texas; Nate Sheppard, Duke).
- He was the fifth Buckeye true freshman to top 1,000 rushing yards for a season after Robert Smith (1,126 yards in 1990), Maurice Clarett (1,237 yards in 2002), JK Dobbins (1,403 yards in 2017) and TreVeyon Henderson (1,248 yards in 2021).
- Ohio State has had 39 individual 1,000-yard rushing seasons in school history.
- Jackson was even better at home as a freshman, tallying 607 yards over six games (101.2 yds/g).
- In game one, Jackson averaged 9.2 yards per carry including a career-long 65-yard touchdown.

SCHEDULE NOTES

- Ohio State's regular season schedule shapes up to not only be one of the strongest in the country but also in school history. Six of the regular season opponents rank inside of the top 25 and also include three teams in the preseason top-6 (No. 2 Oregon, No. 4 Texas and No. 6 Indiana). Michigan and USC are the only other teams in the country to play three teams ranked inside of the top-6 in the preseason poll.
- Additionally, the first four potential ranked matchups all come on the road against No. 4 Texas (Sept. 12), No. 22 Iowa (Oct. 3), No. 6 Indiana (Oct. 17) and No. 14 USC (Oct. 31).
- Prior to potentially this season, Ohio State has had four prior seasons where they have played six or more top-25 teams in the regular season and this marks the first time since 2005 this could occur. Those seasons all came in an 11-year stretch from 1995-2005: 1995 (seven times), 1999 (six times), 2003 (seven times) and 2005 (six times.).

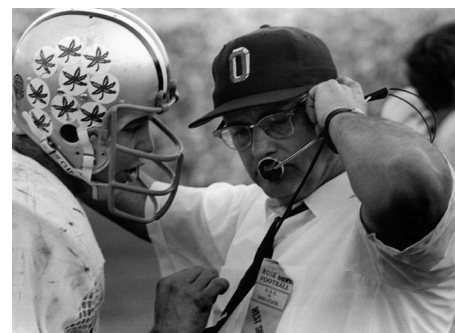

Woody Hayes famously said of Archie Griffin: "He's a better young man than he is a football player and he's the best football player I've ever seen." It didn't take long for Griffin's greatness to emerge. He rushed for an Ohio State single-game record 239 yards against North Carolina in the second game of his freshman season (1972) and the following season he became the first Ohio State sophomore to rush for more than 1,000 yards (1,577) and he was named All-American and the Chicago Tribune's Silver Football award winner as the Big Ten player of the year.

Griffin, from Columbus and Eastmoor High School, won his first Heisman Trophy as a junior in 1974 when he rushed for a school record 1,695 yards and led the Buckeyes to a third of what would become a conference-record six consecutive Big Ten championships. He was also a unanimous All-American, the repeat Big Ten Silver Football award winner and the UPI and Walter Camp player of the year. Griffin, who graduated from Ohio State with a degree in industrial relations and received the NCAA's prestigious Top Five Award for combined excellence in athletics, academics and leadership, would go on to achieve legendary status in the world of college football as an Ohio State senior in 1975.

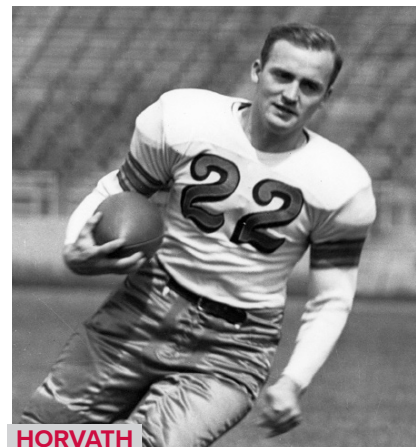

Archie Griffin achieved legendary status in 1975 when he won his second Heisman Trophy. And, to this day, he is still the only two-time winner of the bronze statue that symbolizes the most outstanding player in college football. Griffin rushed for 1,450 yards as a senior in 1975 and, in addition to his second Heisman Trophy, he earned unanimous All-America honors and the UPI and Walter Camp player of the year awards. He closed his brilliant collegiate playing career with a then-NCAA-record 5,177 yards rushing (excluding bowl game yards), 27 touchdowns and additional NCAA records for 100-yard games (33) and consecutive 100-yard games (31).

The next four decades would be full of achievement and accolades for the only player to ever start in four Rose Bowl Games and who was president and CEO of the Ohio State Alumni Association from 2004 to 2015. He was elected to the College Football Hall of Fame in 1986. In 2006 he was named one of the NCAA's "100 Most Influential Student-Athletes". In 2011 he was the first recipient of the Big Ten's Ford-Kinnick Leadership Award. In 2013 he was named the Rose Bowl's "All-Century" Player. Griffin's name, along with that of Red Grange, graces the Big Ten championship game MVP award. Ohio State retired his jersey number "45" Oct. 30, 1999.

22 LES HORVATH Back – 1941-42, 1944

- Heisman Trophy Winner (1944)
- Ohio State's first Heisman Trophy Winner
- Chicago Tribune Silver Football Award Winner
- Led Big Ten in rushing and total offense
- College Football Hall of Fame (1969)

Les Horvath made Ohio State history in 1944 by becoming the school's first Heisman Trophy winner. Playing both quarterback and halfback on offense and safety on defense, Horvath led the Buckeyes to a perfect 9-0 record and the Big Ten championship in 1944. In addition to leading the Big Ten in rushing with a conference-record 669 yards, and in total offense with 953 yards, the Parma, Ohio, native accounted for 1,248 all-purpose yards and was named the Big Ten's MVP. Ironically, Horvath almost didn't play in 1944. After helping the 1942 Buckeyes to a 9-1 record and the school's first national championship, Horvath entered dental school at Ohio State and did not play in 1943. But when Coach Carroll Widdoes asked him to play in 1944, Horvath, who had an extra year because of wartime rules, agreed to return to the gridiron.

Horvath went on to play professional football with the Los Angeles Rams and Cleveland Browns. Following his professional career, he returned to Los Angeles and practiced dentistry. Horvath, who died in November of 1995, is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame (1969) and the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame (1977). His jersey number "22" was retired Oct. 6, 2001.

31 VIC JANOWICZ

Back – 1949-51

- Heisman Trophy Winner (1950)
- "Great runner, passer, blocker, kicker and punter"

- College Football Hall of Fame (1976)

How good was Vic Janowicz? Good enough to win the 1950 Heisman Trophy as a junior on a team that posted a modest 6-3 record. And good enough that, to this day, most historians consider him among the greatest athletes ever to play football at Ohio State. Janowicz accounted for 16 touchdowns and 875 yards in total offense in 1950. The Elyria, Ohio, native also led the Buckeyes in scoring with 65 points. In an 83-21 win over Iowa, he ran for two touchdowns, passed for four more and set a Big Ten record with 10 extra points. Perhaps even more remarkable was a 27-yard field goal against Michigan in the now famous 1950 Snow Bowl. The kick was into a driving snow storm with the goal post barely visible. Janowicz, who was a consensus All-American in 1950, also set two more records in the Snow Bowl, punting 21 times for 685 yards.

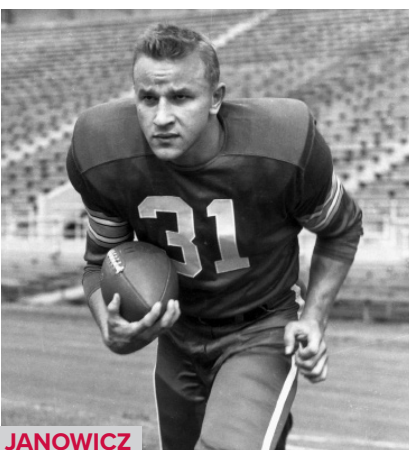
After graduation, Janowicz played two years of professional baseball with the Pittsburgh Pirates and a year of football with the Washington Redskins. A member of the College Football Hall of Fame (1976) and the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame (1977), Janowicz died in February of 1996. His jersey number, "31" was retired Sept. 23, 2000.

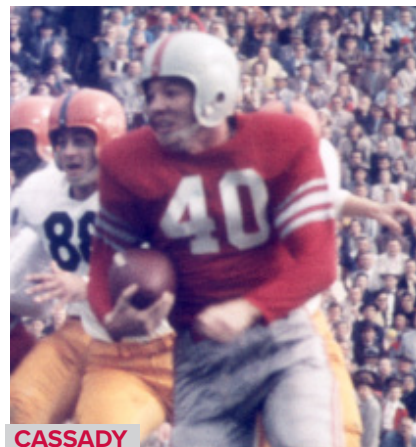

It didn't take Ohio State fans long to realize Howard "Hopalong" Cassady was something special. In his first game, against Indiana in 1952, he came off the bench to score three touchdowns and lead the Buckeyes to a 33-13 victory. From then on, "Hop" was a regular in the OSU lineup, playing in 36 of 37 games and leading the Buckeyes to a record of 29-8 during the next four years. In 1954, Cassady won unanimous All-America honors and helped the Buckeyes to a perfect 10-0 record and the first of five national championships for Coach Woody Hayes. Cassady again won All-America acclaim in 1955, when he rushed for 958 yards and 15 touchdowns. He won the Heisman Trophy – he was the first winner to exceed 2,000 points in voting – and was named by the Associated Press as the 1955 Athlete of the Year.



CASSADY

Cassady finished his collegiate career with 2,466 rushing yards and 37 touchdowns. After graduation, he was a first-round pick of the Detroit Lions. He also played for Cleveland and Philadelphia before retiring. Cassady, from Columbus, is a member of the Ohio State Athletics (1997), College Football (1979) and Columbus Baseball (2005) Halls of Fame. His jersey number "40" was retired Nov. 18, 2000.

At the start of the 1995 season, Eddie George was, at best, a long-shot contender for the Heisman Trophy. By season's end, he was the runaway choice and became Ohio State's sixth Heisman recipient. George rushed for a school-record 1,927 yards and 24 touchdowns with three 200-yard games, one of which was an Ohio State record 314 yards against Illinois Nov. 11, 1995. George's honors in 1995 include the Doak Walker Award, the Maxwell Award, the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award and Big Ten MVP.

THE PEOPLE

George, who attended Abington (Pa.) High School, rushed for 1,442 yards as a junior and completed his career as the second leading rusher in Ohio State history with 3,768 yards. Set school record for receptions by a running back with 47 in 1995. Selected by the Houston Oilers in the first round of the NFL Draft, he was the 1996 NFL Rookie of the Year and played nine years in the NFL, earning four Pro Bowl berths and rushing for 10,441 yards and 68 touchdowns. He is in the Oilers' Titans ring of honor and his No. 32 jersey will be retired by Tennessee in 2019. George earned a bachelor's degree in landscape architecture from Ohio State. He was a 2006 inductee into the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame. His jersey number "27" was retired Nov. 10, 2001. In July 2012 he was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. The Big Ten's top offensive player receives the Graham-George Offensive Player of the Year award.

Troy Smith may not have been Ohio State's star recruit in the spring of 2002, but by the end of the 2006 football season and his Buckeye career there were few Buckeyes with a brighter aura. Smith led the Buckeyes to a 4-1 record as a sophomore in 2004, including a 37-21 win over Michigan, in which he accounted for three touchdowns and 386 yards in total offense. In 2005, Smith guided the Buckeyes to a 10-2 record that included a thrilling come-from-behind victory at Michigan and a decisive win over Notre Dame in the Fiesta Bowl.

Smith saved his best for last, piloting the No. 1 ranked Buckeyes to a 12-0 regular season record and a spot in the national championship game as a senior in 2006. He threw for a school single-season record 30 touchdowns and became just the second quarterback in Ohio State history to post a 3-0 record against Michigan as a starter. The consensus All-American was a landslide winner in the Heisman Trophy voting, recording the second largest margin of victory ever in the balloting. Smith, who recorded a 25-3 record as a starter and is the NCAA record holder in passing efficiency for 400-499 completions (157.1), entered the Ohio State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2014 and he had his jersey No. 10 enshrined Nov. 10, 2014.

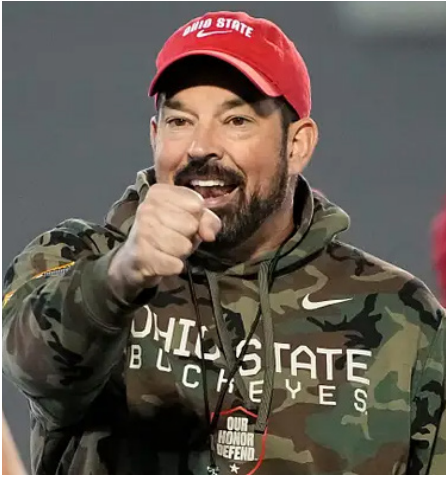

ANNUAL MURPH CHALLENGE

- Honoring fallen heroes and Navy Seal Lt. Michael Murphy, Ohio State hosts the annual Murph Challenge: a 1-mile run, 100 pull-ups, 200 push-ups, and 300 squats. Members of the Ohio State football program take part and support the participants.
- Proceeds raised by supporting sponsor Anduril and Michael P. Murphy Foundation go to support the people and families of military members who lost their lives in service.

PLAYERS WHO SERVED

- **Lou Groza:** After attending Ohio State for just one year, the legendary placekicker and offensive tackle enlisted in the Army and served as a surgical technician in the Pacific Theater during World War II.
- **Chuck Csuri:** An All-American tackle for the 1942 National Championship team, Csuri was drafted into the military in 1943. He earned the Bronze Star for his exceptional bravery during the Battle of the

Bulge.

- **Don Scott:** One of the most talented multi-sport athletes at Ohio State. He played quarterback and halfback and earned All-American honors. The Chicago Bears picked him No. 9 overall in the first round of the 1941 NFL Draft. With World War II closing in, Don Scott made a massive decision by turning down his NFL contract entirely. He flew a B-26 Marauder bomber on 10 dangerous missions over Nazi-occupied Europe. Each mission carried a 50% chance he wouldn't return. Sadly, in October 1943, at just 23 years old, he died when his plane crashed during a training flight in England.
- **Rick Hausman:** A walk-on player from the legendary 1968 National Championship team. Coach Woody Hayes gave him his blessing to leave the team for the Army, but Hausman was tragically killed in action in Vietnam in May 1969 while protecting his wounded comrades.
 - Ohio State established the Rick Hausman Silver Bullet Award to honor the top Cadet in their ROTC program.
- **Joe Brown:** A defensive lineman who played until 2001 and had a brief stint with the Seattle Seahawks. Following the September 11 attacks, he walked away from the NFL to enlist in the military and eventually became an elite Army Ranger.

COACH HAYES MILITARY SERVICE

- Legendary head coach Woody Hayes notably served as a Lieutenant Commander in the U.S. Navy during World War II.
- In 2025, Ohio State dedicated a portrait to Woody Hayes in the campus Army ROTC building to honor his legacy as a military historian and veteran.



THE TRADITION

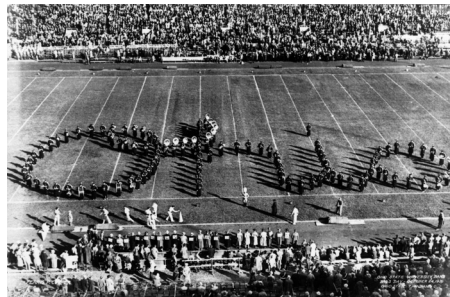


DOTTING THE I

Each time the band performs Script Ohio, a different fourth- or fifth-year sousaphone player is chosen to stand as the dot in the “i” of “Ohio.” Because the Script Ohio formation was one of many new formations included by director Weigel, no extra emphasis was placed on the dotting. Originally, an E-flat cornet player, John Brungart, was the first “i”-dotter, but in the fall of 1937, Weigel turned to Glen Johnson, a sousaphone player, and had him take his place in the dot. A year later, when the drum major arrived at the top of the “i” three or four measures too early, Johnson turned and bowed to the crowd to use up the rest of the music. The crowd roared, and the bow has been part of the show since then. On very rare occasions, exceptional non-band members are offered the invitation to be an honorary i-dotter in recognition of their service to Ohio State and to the band. Previous honorary i-dotters have included comedian Bob Hope (1978), former Ohio State coach Woody Hayes (1983), golfer Jack Nicklaus (2006), Sen. John and Annie Glenn (2009), retiring Marching Band director Jon R. Woods (2011) and former Ohio State football coach Earle Bruce, who dotted the “i” on Oct. 1, 2016, and said, “I think this is the greatest honor I’ve ever received.” In 2018, the honorary i-dotter was 100-year-old Anthony Violi, an alumnus who dotted during the Alumni Reunion game against Tulane. The most recent honorary i-dotter was Archie Griffin in 2024.

SCRIPT OHIO

- Script Ohio was first performed by the band on Oct. 10, 1936, and has become the quintessential formation of The Ohio State University Marching Band. While many point out that a similar formation of “Ohio” was performed by the University of Michigan Marching Band in 1932, it was not performed as the classic, constantly flowing script that has become the — literal — signature of The Ohio State University Marching Band.
- Band Director Eugene J. Weigel based the looped “Ohio” script design on the marquee sign of the Loew’s Ohio Theatre in downtown Columbus and created the most identifiable trademark associated with Ohio State football and the Marching Band.



SKULL SESSION

- The warm-up routine of the Ohio State University Marching Band takes place in St. John Arena, right across the street from Ohio Stadium, two hours before kickoff of home games. In 1932, band director Eugene Weigel began having his marching band memorize the music they would be playing that week. Before game-time, the band would go through its routine as a final rehearsal. For 24 years it went on in the band’s rehearsal hall, before moving inside St. John Arena in 1957. Along the way, the format was tweaked to make it more of a pep-rally atmosphere, and crowds have responded, often to the tune of over 10,000 people. In 2001, Coach Tressel began bringing the football team by the skull session on their way into the stadium for the game.

CARMEN OHIO

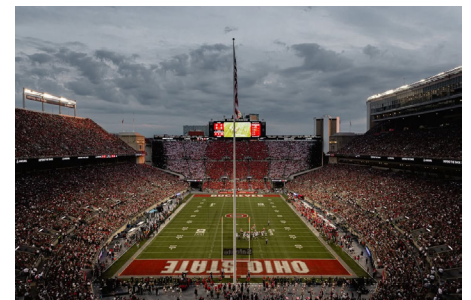
- Written by student-athlete Fred Cornell in 1903, it is set to the tune of the 19th-century Christian melody “Spanish Hymn.” “Carmen” translates to “song” in Latin,

making the title literally mean “Song of Ohio”

- Cornell was a football player and Men’s Glee Club member.
- The Men’s Glee Club first performed the song publicly at an off-campus event on New Year’s Eve, 1903.
- Since 1906, it has been sung after home games. Former football coach Jim Tressel famously established the modern tradition in 2001 of the entire team and coaching staff gathering in the south end zone to sing the alma mater with the band and fans, win or lose.

COLOR OUT GAMES

- Coordinated efforts to color the stadium stands help create a unified and energized atmosphere inside Ohio Stadium and can provide an unmistakable home-field advantage. The traditional games include:
 - Scarlet the ‘Shoe
 - Helmet Stripe
 - Wear Black



HANG ON SLOOPY

- “Hang On Sloopy” will still echo through Ohio Stadium. While it has traditionally been a third quarter break moment, this year the band will have flexibility to play it in the second half when the energy and timing feel right.
- “Hang on Sloopy” was released during the summer of 1965 and getting serious play on radio stations nationwide about the same time John Tatgenhorst, a percussion student at Ohio State, was working at the Ohio State Fair.
- He convinced then director Charles “Charlie” Spohn to perform it and it was first performed on Oct. 9, 1965.

BUCKEYE GROVE

- Since 1934, a Buckeye tree has been planted in honor of each of Ohio State's All-American.
- Trees are usually planted in a pregame ceremony at the spring game. With the renovation of Ohio Stadium in 2001, the Buckeye Grove is now located at the southwest corner of the stadium.

VICTORY BELL

- Located in the southeast tower of Ohio Stadium, the Victory Bell is rung after every Ohio State victory. It was a gift of the classes of 1943, 1944 and 1945.
- Resting 150-feet up in the southeast tower, members of Alpha Phi Omega ring the bell after victories, a tradition that began after OSU beat California Oct. 2, 1954. On a calm day, it is said the bell can be heard five miles away. The bell weighs 2,420 pounds and cost \$2,535 to install.
- The bell is rung before the start of every game starting in the 2025 season with the following Ohio State greats ringing the bell in its first season as a tradition:

HISTORICAL STADIUM DATES

- **1921** - Ohio Governor Harry Davis joined a crowd of over 2,500 to officially break ground on the massive new stadium.
- **Oct. 7, 1922** - Ohio Stadium, a double-decked, horseshoe-shaped structure, opened on Oct. 7 with a 5-0 Ohio State victory over Ohio Wesleyan before 25,000 fans.
- **Oct. 21, 1922** - The Ohio Stadium dedication game came against Michigan in front of 72,000 fans.
- **1925** – The final college game of legendary Illinois halfback Harold “Red” Grange was on Nov. 21, 1925 in Ohio Stadium.
- **1928** – The traditional Ohio State Marching Band ramp entrance was first performed at Ohio Stadium in 1928.
- **1936** – Script Ohio, one of the greatest traditions in all of college football, was first performed by the Ohio State Marching Band on Oct. 10, 1936 in Ohio Stadium.
- **1938** – Block O, the official student section of Ohio State athletics, was originated in 1938.
- **Nov. 25, 1950** - Ohio State and Michigan engage in the Snow Bowl. An early winter storm hit Columbus with heavy snow, 28 miles-per-hour winds and temperatures in the teens. The teams punted 45 times and UM won, 9-3.
- **Oct. 2, 1954** – The sound of the Victory Bell, located in the Southeast tower of Ohio Stadium, was first heard after Ohio State defeated Cal.
- **March 1974** – Ohio Stadium became the first football stadium to be officially listed on the National Register.
- **1985** – Ohio Stadium had used portable lights several times to complete late afternoon starts, but the 1985 season opener vs. Pitt was the first true collegiate night game in stadium history. Kickoff was at 8:08 p.m.
- **2006** – One of the greatest games in Ohio Stadium history took place on Nov. 18: No. 1 Ohio State vs. No. 2 Michigan. Ohio State won, 42-39, to clinch its first outright Big Ten championship since 1984.
- **2014** – A 13.7 million renovation to 92-year-old Ohio Stadium included a new FieldTurf playing surface, 2,522 additional seats in the south stands, concrete water proofing and permanent lights. Capacity is now at an all-time high of 104,581 ... but only until 2020.
- **2016** – Ohio State defeated Michigan, 30-27, in double overtime in front of a record Ohio Stadium crowd of 110,082 fans. Curtis Samuel's game-winning, 15-yard touchdown run electrified the house after J.T. Barrett's successful, 4th-and-1 conversion from the UM 16.

THE TRADITION



BLOCK O RECIPIENTS

Ohio State's tradition of awarding the Block "O" is inspired by one of the all-time greats to ever don the Scarlet and Gray: Bill Willis. A defensive end whose career spanned from 1942-44, Willis was an All-American and national champion during his time with the Buckeyes. He later went on to break the color barrier in the National Football League as a member of the Cleveland Browns and was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame as well as the College Football Hall of Fame.

Willis' No. 99 is retired at Ohio State and what he stood for – toughness, accountability and the highest of character – are values that the current-day Buckeyes strive for every day. With Willis' jersey being retired, the player dons the No. 0 each year.

2026 CAPTAINS

- Ahead of the 2026 season, wide receiver Brandon Inniss, defensive end Kenyatta Jackson Jr., safety Jaylen McClain, linebacker Payton Pierce, quarterback Julian Sayin, offensive lineman Austin Siereveld and wide receiver Jeremiah Smith were all named team captains.
- The captains were selected through a vote of members of the Buckeyes football program. Juniors, seniors and fifth-year players are eligible to be chosen by their peers to lead the team. This marks the seventh time in program history that Ohio State has had seven or more team captains.

IRON BUCKEYES

- Iron Buckeye is a prestigious distinction awarded twice-a-year (end of winter program and end of summer program).
- The honor recognizes unquestionable training, dedication, determination, discipline, toughness, and leadership. It is a reminder of what being an Iron Buckeye means, of why shirts aren't necessary.
- Given out by Associate AD for Football Sports Performance Mickey Marotti

- Jeremiah Smith and linebacker Sonny Styles are the only four-time Iron Buckeyes in program history.

BUCKEYE LEAVES ON THE HELMET

- The tradition of placing Buckeye Leaves on the Ohio State helmets started in 1968 when Woody Hayes and longtime trainer Ernie Biggs changed the look of the Ohio State uniforms.
- The stickers currently used on the Buckeyes' helmets are 1.25 inches in diameter, meaning 47 of them can fit on each side of the helmet. If a player earns more stickers than can fit on the helmet, a running tally is kept on paper to make sure the accomplishment is recorded in some way.

- The stickers are meant to signify some kind of achievement, whether by the team or the individual who earns the sticker.
- Stickers are handed out at the discretion of Coach Ryan Day and position coaches.

GOLD PANTS

- A gold charm replica of a pair of football pants is given to players and coaches following wins over Michigan.
- The tradition started in 1934 when first-year coach Francis Schmidt told those wondering how OSU would fare with its nemesis from Ann Arbor: "They put their pants on one leg at a time just like everybody else." Schmidt's Buckeyes then went and defeated Michigan four-consecutive times, all by shutout.
- Gold pants are traditionally handed out the following spring and engraved with the player's initials on the front, and the year and score of "The Game" on the back.

SENIOR TACKLE

- A last practice of the year tradition since 1913 where the seniors hit the blocking sled one final time.
- For many years it was held following the last practice prior to the season finale with Michigan. But depending upon the Buckeyes' bowl obligation, it has sometimes been moved to the last home practice before the team departs for its bowl obligation.

TUNNEL OF PRIDE

- The brainchild of ex-OSU quarterback Rex Kern and former Director of Athletics Andy Geiger, the Tunnel of Pride actually started in 1995, when Notre Dame visited Ohio Stadium for the first meeting between the two teams in nearly 50 years.
- In an effort to generate even more emotion, excitement and enthusiasm than already existed, Kern and Geiger reached out to former Buckeye football players who were attending the game and asked them to form a tunnel for the team to run through as it came onto the field. Thus a tradition was born, which is now continued every other year when Michigan visits Ohio Stadium.

GRADING OUT

- In May, the NCAA released the latest Academic Progress Report, receiving a perfect 1000 APR Multi-Year Rate which ranked No. 1 in FBS. The Buckeyes were one of just two FBS programs to receive a perfect score.
- In the latest Graduation Success Rate (GSR), maintained the program-best score of 89 it recorded last year, the fourth year it improved or maintained its GSR.
- A program-record 61 Ohio State football players were named Academic All-Big Ten honorees for having a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.00 and above.
- The Buckeyes also set a record, totaling 101 OSU Scholar-Athletes for the 2025-26 academic year. To qualify as an Ohio State Scholar-Athlete, a student-athlete must carry a cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of 3.00 or higher.

NFL STARS DEVELOPED HERE

Overall, Ohio State had 11 Buckeyes taken during the 2026 NFL Draft, which is the most of any school in the country.

Ohio State is the only school in the seven-round draft era (1994–present) to have at least three NFL Draft classes with 12 or more players selected, most recently in 2025 when 14 Buckeyes were drafted.



Ohio State had four Buckeyes taken in the top 11 and became the first program since the NFL merger to accomplish that feat (Previously: 1956: Notre Dame – 4 // 1967: Michigan State – 4).

• Arvell Reese, 5th Overall, Round 1 – New York Giants

• Sonny Styles, 7th Overall, Round 1 – Washington Commanders

Ohio State has had a pair of Buckeyes taken in the top five of the NFL Draft on four occasions over the last 30 years (since 1996) and is the only school in the country who has achieved this milestone this multiple times:

• Orlando Pace, 1st Overall, Round 1 – St. Louis Rams

• Shawn Springs, 3rd Overall, Round 1 – Seattle Seahawks

2016:

• Joey Bosa, 3rd Overall, Round 1 – San Diego Chargers

• Ezekiel Elliott, 4th Overall, Round 1 – Dallas Cowboys

2020:

• Chase Young, 2nd Overall, Round 1 – Washington Redskins

• Jeff Okudah, 3rd Overall, Round 1 – Detroit Lions

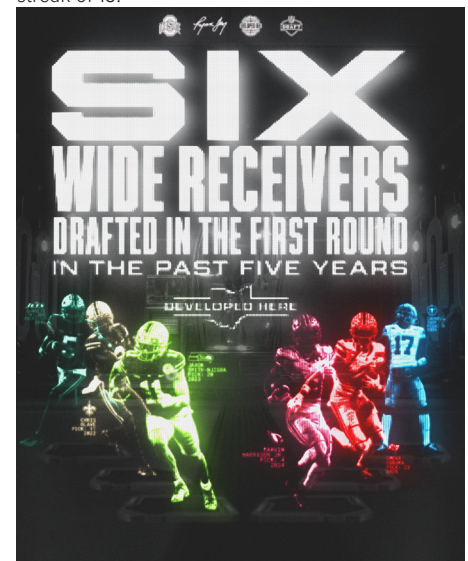

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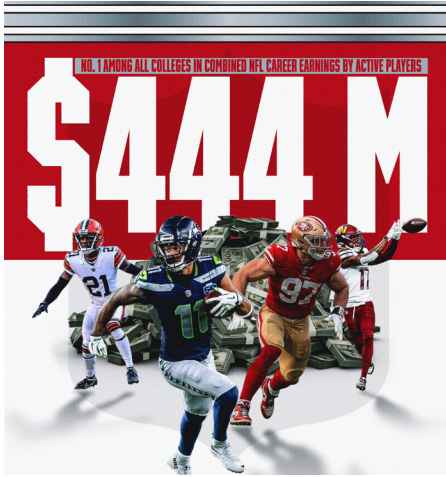
With that, Alabama (2023), Oklahoma (2010), Auburn (2005), Texas (2002), Penn State (2000) and Illinois (1996) have all accomplished this on one occasion.

The four first-round picks increase Ohio State's record total of first round draft picks to 99 all-time and to 30 in the last 11 years with multiple first-round Buckeyes selected in nine of the last 11 drafts (2016-17-18-19-20-22-23-25-26). Ohio State has produced multiple first-round picks 26 times in all.

The Buckeyes have had a first-round draft pick for 11 consecutive years, second only to Alabama's streak of 18.

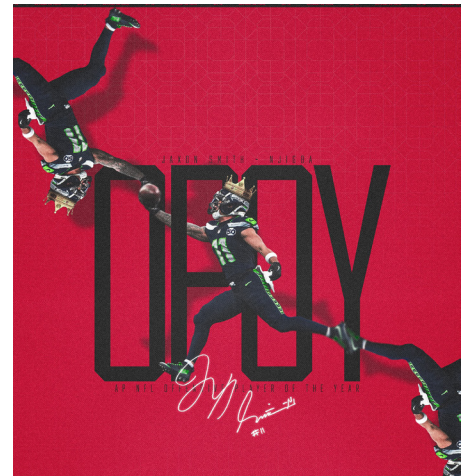
CHASING DOWN LOMBARDI TROPHIES

Ohio State has had 39 players win a Super Bowl title which ranks in the top 10 among all colleges. This includes most recently wide receiver Jaxon Smith-Njigba who led the Seattle Seahawks to a win in Super Bowl LX.

Buckeyes have made memorable contributions to



Super Bowl wins but maybe none more memorable than Buckeye great Santonio Holmes in the Steelers Super Bowl XLIII victory. Holmes won MVP honors, pulling in nine receptions for 131 yards and the game-winning touchdown with just 35 seconds remaining in the game.



REIGNING NFL OPOY

Smith-Njigba, who led the Seattle Seahawks to a Super Bowl title, led the NFL in receiving yards with 1,793 -- more than he'd had in his first two seasons combined -- on 119 catches with 10 touchdowns. What was arguably most impressive about his third NFL season was his consistency: Smith-Njigba accumulated 72 or more receiving yards in 15 of his 17 games.

He is just the second Seattle Seahawks player to ever win the award (Shaun Alexander in 2005).

HEAD COACH RYAN DAY

2019 DAVE McCLAIN BIG TEN COACH OF THE YEAR • 83-12 CAREER RECORD

Ryan Day has established himself as one of the defining coaches in college football during his seven seasons leading Ohio State, guiding the Buckeyes to championship success, national prominence and remarkable consistency across every phase of the program.

Since taking over as head coach in 2019, Day has compiled an 83-12 record, the best winning percentage among active FBS head coaches, and he has led Ohio State to five College Football Playoff appearances, more than any other program during that span. His teams have won 10 championships, including the 2024 College Football Playoff national title, two Big Ten championships, three Big Ten East Division titles, two Rose Bowl victories, a Sugar Bowl win and a Cotton Bowl win.

Day's greatest accomplishment came in 2024, when he guided Ohio State through the first 12-team College Football Playoff format and into the program's ninth national championship. Over a 31-day stretch, the Buckeyes beat Tennessee, Oregon, Texas and Notre Dame to become the first FBS team to defeat five top-five opponents in a single season and the first to win four CFP games in one year. That run capped a 14-win season and cemented Day's place alongside Paul Brown, Woody Hayes, Jim Tressel and Urban Meyer as an Ohio State coach to win a national title. He is also one of only four active head coaches with a CFP championship.

Ohio State has been dominant in nearly every statistical area under Day's leadership.

The Buckeyes have ranked No. 1 nationally in scoring offense and total offense, and they have also finished No. 1 in total defense, passing defense and scoring defense in multiple seasons under his watch. His teams have been especially dangerous in high-stakes games, going 27-11 against ranked opponents, 16-10 against top-10 teams, 8-7 against top-five teams and 8-6 in postseason play. He also was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year award in his first season in 2019, when the Buckeyes won 13-straight games by an average of more than 36 points and became the first Big Ten team to win three-consecutive outright conference titles.

Day's impact has extended well beyond wins and losses.

He has coached 27 first-team All-Americans, seven Heisman Trophy finalists and multiple major national award winners, including Caleb Downs, Julian Sayin, Chase Young, Marvin Harrison Jr., C.J. Stroud and J.K. Dobbins. Under his direction, 69 Buckeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft, including 20 first-round picks. Ohio State's program-wide success has also shown up in the classroom, where Day's teams have set records for Scholar-Athletes and Academic All-Big Ten honorees, while posting consecutive record Graduation Success Rate figures and one of the nation's top APR marks.

Before becoming head coach, Day built a strong reputation as an offensive coach and developer of quarterbacks. He spent 2018 as Ohio State's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach after serving as co-offensive coordinator the year before, and he briefly served as acting head coach for the first three games of the 2018 season.

Prior to Ohio State, he coached at Boston College, Temple, Florida, the Philadelphia Eagles and the San Francisco 49ers, and he also held earlier collegiate roles at New Hampshire. A native of Manchester, N.H., Day played quarterback at New Hampshire, earned a degree in business administration and later completed a master's in administrative studies at Boston College.

He and his wife, Christina, known as Nina, have three children: Ryan Jr. (RJ), Grace and Nia.





The Start of the Ryan Day Era

Coach Day was named Ohio State’s head coach by then-Senior Vice President and Wolfe Foundation Endowed Athletics Director Gene Smith on Dec. 4, 2018, but his path to the full-time job began well before that. Day had already served as Ohio State’s acting head coach for the first eight weeks of the 2018 season, guiding the Buckeyes to wins over Oregon State, Rutgers and No. 15 TCU and opening his head coaching record at 3-0.

His official tenure as head coach began after Ohio State’s 28-23 win over Washington in the Rose Bowl on Jan. 1, 2019, when retiring head coach Urban Meyer placed the whistle around Day’s neck in front of the team. Technically, Day’s first official day on the job was Jan. 2, but that moment in the locker room before more than 124 players — including over 100 who would be part of his first team — marked the true beginning of his era.

At 46, the Manchester, N.H., native became the 25th head coach in the history of one of college football’s most storied programs.

2024 CFP National Championship

In one 31-day stretch, Coach Day led his team and coaching staff on the greatest and most difficult journey to win a national championship in college football history.

Between Dec. 21, 2024, and Jan. 20, 2025, Day’s Buckeyes defeated No. 7 Tennessee, 42-17, in a College Football Playoff game at Ohio Stadium, No. 1 Oregon, 41-21, at the Rose Bowl, No. 3 Texas, 28-14, in a quasi-road game

in Dallas at the Cotton Bowl, and No. 5 Notre Dame, 34-23, in the CFP championship game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.

Ohio State’s dominant run through that difficult gauntlet secured the program’s ninth national championship, third of the century after titles in 2002 and 2014, and capped a record-tying 14-win season.

Day joined Paul Brown (1942), Woody Hayes (1954-57-61-68-70), Jim Tressel (2002) and Urban Meyer (2014) as Ohio State coaches to win a national championship, and he joined Meyer as the only Ohio State head coaches with multiple seasons of at least 13 wins.

Among active head coaches, Day is one of only four to have won a College Football Playoff national championship. The others: Georgia’s Kirby Smart, Clemson’s Dabo Swinney and Indiana’s Curt Cignetti.

Day’s leadership during this NCAA record, 16-game 2024 season enabled Ohio State to set some monumental records, including:

- Becoming the first FBS school to defeat five opponents ranked in the Top 5 in one season;
- Winning a record four CFP games in one season; and
- Claiming two bowl wins in one season, one of only three schools to do so.

- 16-10 vs. Top 10 teams

Coach Ryan Day’s .874 winning percentage (83-12) in 95 games at Ohio State ranks No. 1 nationally among all Division I head coaches and is currently No. 2 all-time. In 94 of those 95 games, his team has been ranked in the AP Top 25, and in 84 it has been ranked in the Top 5.

Championship Tradition

Day has led Ohio State to more College Football Playoff appearances over the last seven years than any other program, with five. In 2024, he accomplished something no team had done before, guiding the Buckeyes through four wins in a 12-team playoff bracket on the way to the program’s ninth national championship.

In seven seasons as head coach, Day has guided Ohio State to 10 championships, including the 2024 College Football Playoff national title, back-to-back Big Ten championships in 2019 and 2020, Rose Bowl wins in 2022 and 2024, Sugar Bowl and Cotton Bowl victories in 2022 and 2024, and three Big Ten East Division titles. He is also the only coach to lead his team to the College Football Playoff five times since the format began in 2019.

Ohio State Year-By-Year Recap

Under Ryan Day, Ohio State has consistently ranked among the nation's best teams on both sides of the ball, with the Buckeyes producing elite offenses, dominant defenses and a steady run of postseason success. From 2019 through 2025, Day's teams were defined by efficiency, explosiveness and balance, and each season featured either a nationally elite offense, a nationally elite defense, or both. That sustained excellence helped turn Ohio State into one of college football's most complete programs and a perennial College Football Playoff contender.

Specifically, Day's teams have been among the best offensive teams in the nation, ranking in the Top 3 nationally in scoring three times and Top 10 in total offense four times. Ohio State was No. 1 in the nation in both total offense and scoring offense in 2021. Additionally, Ohio State has been No. 1 in the nation eight times on defense: in total defense in 2019, 2024 and 2025; in passing defense in 2019, 2023 and 2025; and in scoring defense in 2024 and 2025.

2019

In Day's first full season as head coach, Ohio State finished 13-1, won the Big Ten championship and reached the College Football Playoff before falling to Clemson in the Fiesta Bowl semifinal.

The Buckeyes were dominant offensively, averaging 42.5 points per game behind quarterback Justin Fields, who was one of the nation's top players and Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year. Running back J.K. Dobbins became the first Buckeye to rush for 2,000 yards in a season, while a loaded receiving corps featuring K.J. Hill, Chris Olave, Binjimen Victor and Garrett Wilson gave Ohio State one of the country's most dangerous passing attacks.

Defensively, the Buckeyes were just as impressive, finishing No. 1 nationally in total defense and ranking among the top five nationally in passing defense, scoring defense, red-zone defense and pass efficiency defense. Individually, Chase Young anchored that unit with one of the greatest seasons in school history, winning the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Ted Hendricks Award and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year honors while also becoming a Heisman Trophy finalist. He set the program record with 16.5 sacks and ranked second in program history with 21.0 tackles for loss.

2020

In this COVID-shortened season, Ohio State went 7-1, won its fourth-straight Big Ten championship and advanced to the national championship game after defeating Clemson in the Sugar Bowl.

Fields again led the offense and earned his second-straight Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year honor, while Trey Sermon emerged as a late-season breakout star in the run game including a memorable, record-breaking 331 rushing yard performance in the Big Ten Championship Game. Chris Olave and Garrett Wilson continued to give the Buckeyes elite playmakers on the perimeter.

Defensively, Ohio State finished with one of the nation's top rushing defenses and posted a strong turnover margin, while the defensive line earned widespread recognition for its depth and production.

Ohio State had several major All-America honorees, led by OG Wyatt Davis as a unanimous first-team selection. CB Shaun Wade and DT Haskell Garrett also earned first-team recognition, while a trio of Buckeyes received second-team honors.

2021

Ohio State's 2021 team might have been Day's most explosive offense before the playoff run in 2024. The Buckeyes finished 11-2, closed the season with a Rose Bowl win over Utah and averaged 45.7 points per game, the highest mark in the country.

Individually on offense, C.J. Stroud took over at quarterback and delivered one of the best passing seasons in program history, throwing for 4,435 yards and 44 touchdowns while finishing fourth in Heisman Trophy voting and earning Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year honors. WR Jaxon Smith-Njigba led the Big Ten in receiving yards, RB TreVeyon Henderson provided balance in the backfield, and the offense remained one of the most efficient in the sport.

Defensively, Ohio State tied for ninth nationally in turnover margin, and had five Buckeyes earn All-Big Ten honors.

2022

Day's offense again ranked near the top of the national leaderboard. Ohio State finished 11-2, reached the College Football Playoff and nearly knocked off top-ranked Georgia in the semifinal.

Individually on offense, Stroud threw for 3,688 yards and 41 touchdowns, finishing third in the Heisman voting while Marvin Harrison Jr., Jaxon Smith-Njigba and Emeka Egbuka formed one of the country's best receiver groups, and RB TreVeyon Henderson remained a key playmaker. Overall, The Buckeyes averaged 44.2 points

per game, which ranked second nationally, and all five starting offensive linemen earned All-Big Ten honors.

That same season, Ohio State's defense had five All-Big Ten honorees, including a pair of First Team selections with DE JT Tuimolou and LB Tommy Eichenberg.

2023

Ohio State finished 11-2, won its first 11 games and returned to the New Year's Six stage in the Cotton Bowl.

While the Buckeyes' offense was more balanced than in previous seasons, it still averaged 30.5 points per game and relied heavily on its passing attack. Quarterback Kyle McCord threw for 3,170 yards in the regular season, Marvin Harrison Jr. finished with 1,211 receiving yards, and tight end Cade Stover became a major part of the offense with 41 catches for 576 yards and five touchdowns. Harrison finished fourth in the Heisman voting that season and won the Biletnikoff Award.

On defense, Ohio State remained one of the nation's most efficient units, finishing first in passing defense, third in total defense, second in scoring defense, and seventh in rushing defense.

2024

Day guided Ohio State through one of the greatest postseason runs in college football history, culminating in the Buckeyes' first national championship of the 12-team playoff era. Ohio State finished 14-2 and averaged 36.3 points per game across four CFP wins, while the full-season offense ranked among the nation's best under offensive coordinator Chip Kelly.

Defensively, the Buckeyes were outstanding, finishing No. 1 nationally in both scoring defense and total defense under Jim Knowles.

2025

Ohio State remained elite on both sides of the ball, finishing 12-0 in the regular season and earning a second straight CFP berth.

The offense was led by redshirt freshman Julian Sayin, whose precision passing and efficiency helped the Buckeyes remain one of the nation's most productive teams, while the tight end group added depth and balance to the attack. Sayin finished fourth in the Heisman voting.

On defense, Ohio State again ranked No. 1 nationally in total defense, passing defense and scoring defense under Matt Patricia, while also leading the country in opposing red-zone percentage and first downs allowed per game. Ohio State allowed just 9.3 points per game in the 2025 season which was the fewest by any FBS team in the CFP era (2014-Present).

Ohio State is the only school in the seven-round draft era (1994–present) to have at least three NFL Draft classes with 12 or more players selected, most recently in 2025 when 14 Buckeyes were drafted.

Additionally, the Buckeyes have had 25 players selected over the last two years which is tied for the most in consecutive drafts in the seven-round draft era (1994-Present).

Georgia is the only other school to accomplish this feat (2022-23).

All 11 defensive starters from Ohio State's 2024 College Football Playoff National Championship win over Notre Dame are now NFL Draft picks, with none selected lower than the fifth round.

That doesn't include the aforementioned Arvell Reese, who was in the rotation as a backup.

Ohio State tied its own program record with seven selections in the first two rounds in 2026.

The Buckeyes previously accomplished that in 2016 and 2025.

Additionally, Ohio State's eight selections through the first three rounds of the 2026 NFL Draft were the most of any school in the country.

Ohio State had four Buckeyes taken in the top 11 in the 2026 NFL Draft and became the first program since the NFL merger to accomplish that feat (Previously: 1956: Notre Dame – 4 // 1967: Michigan State – 4).

Ryan Day’s teams have been among the best offensive teams in the nation, ranking in the Top 3 nationally in scoring three times and Top 10 in total offense four times. Ohio State was No. 1 in the nation in both total offense and scoring offense in 2021.

Additionally, Ohio State has been No. 1 in the nation five times on defense: in total defense in 2019, 2024 and 2025; in passing defense in 2019, 2023 and 2025; and in scoring defense in 2024 and 2025.

In 2018 Day was Ohio State quarterbacks coach and the team ranked second nationally in total offense and passing yards, and No. 8 in scoring. It established Big Ten Conference records for offensive yards per game (535.6), passing yards (5,100), passing yards per game (373.0), touchdown passes (51), completions (396) and total plays (1,131).

Individually, quarterback Dwayne Haskins was a Heisman Trophy finalist who became just the sixth player to throw 50 touchdown passes in a season.

Barrett, was a finalist for the Davey O’Brien National Quarterback of the Year Award and he was named the Big Ten’s quarterback of the year after a season in which he set seven school single season records and broke the Big Ten Conference career mark for touchdowns responsible for with 147.

Quarterbacks Justin Fields and C.J. Stroud each won two Big Ten Conference offensive player of the year awards and two Big Ten quarterback of the year awards and joined Haskins as Heisman Trophy finalists with Stroud earning the honor twice (in 2021 and 2022).

Day recruited from the portal and mentored QB Will Howard during Ohio State’s national championship 2024 season.

In addition to his two NFL seasons as a quarterbacks coach, Day has 23 years of collegiate coaching experience, including offensive coordinator positions at Temple and Boston College, as well as positions with Florida – as a graduate assistant under Meyer – and at his alma mater, New Hampshire.

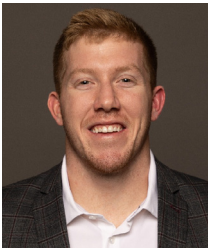
