Revenge is still on the mind of OBU, who lost a controversial game in Durant last year. Both teams are 1-1 after picking up their first wins last week.

BISON AT HOME

Since restarting the program in 2013, the Bison are 8-9 at home. and are trying to reach the .500 mark at home for the first time since 2015 when East Central plunged the Bison below .500 at home since the reboot.

STEGALL SAFE HANDS

Bison quarterback Dez Stegall continued his streak of pass attempts without a pick last week. He has thrown 105 consecutive passes without an interception, dating back to the Henderson State game in 2015.

STILL THE ONE

The Bison remain No. 1 in the NCCAA after beating Arkansas Tech last week. Only one NC-CAA team - rankings newcomer Northwestern Minnesota - is unbeaten this season.

TAYLOR HONORS

Charles Taylor III forced a fumble and picked off a pass in the end zone, both perserving the OBU win and earning himself GAC Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors. He also was named NCCAA Player of the Week

HEAD COACH CHRIS JENSEN



Hired in 2012, Chris Jensen is the first Oklahoma Baptist University head football coach since 1940.

Through three seasons, he has compiled a 14-19 record, having doubled his win total in 2014 from a 4-7 mark in his first season of college coaching. His 8-3 mark in 2014 landed the Bison in the No. 26 spot in the NAIA rankings and tied a school record for single-season wins.

In his three seasons, he has coached one All-American, five NAIA Scholar Athletes, 26 All-Conference selections, 53 players who were Academic All-Conference and one Academic All-American.

Jensen came to OBU from Southmoore High School, whose football program Jensen also began. He rebooted the Bison program in 2012 and had the first season in the fall of 2013.

Jensen started the South-

moore football program in 2008. In his and the program's second year, the SaberCats were 11-2 and reached the Class 6A semifinals. Jensen was named Oklahoma 6A-1 Coach of the Year in 2009.

Jensen's coaching stops also include assistant posts at Westmoore (defensive coordinator), Bartlesville (offensive coordinator), Durant (offensive coordinator and assistant head coach), Moore (offensive line) and Little Axe (offensive line and outside linebackers).

Jensen was a varsity letterman at the University of Oklahoma, playing on the offensive line.

A self-described Army brat, Jensen graduated from Lawton High School and received a Naval Academy nomination. He achieved the level of Eagle Scout in Boy Scouts of America.

Jensen received his bachelor of science degree in education in December 1992 from OU. He earned his master's degree in education administration from Southwestern Oklahoma State University in May 2006.

Chris and his wife, Patti, have three children, Taylor, Tanner and Camryn. They are members of Immanuel Baptist Church in Shawnee.

OC GRANT GOWER



Grant Gower joined the staff of Oklahoma Baptist in the Spring of 2016 as Offensive Coordinator after a

successful high school coaching career.

Gower, who played baseball at Oklahoma Baptist, has been a coach and educator in central Oklahoma since 1984. Gower is the winningest football coach in Deer Creek history with an overall record of 57-32 since 2007 and seven appearances in the State Playoffs. He started his stay at Deer Creek in 2012 as an assistant coach.

Gower graduated from OBU in 1984 with a bachelor's of science degree in social science and mathematics and earned his master's of science degree from Oklahoma State in 1992.

Coach Gower was selected as the All State Football Head Coach for the West team in 2011. He was also the Edmond Sun Coach of the Year, as well as The Oklahoman Edmond Coach of the Year.

He and his wife Paula, who is OBU's associate vice president for marketing and communication, have three children – Matt, Cami and Macy.

Gower is a deacon at Quail Springs Baptist Church and was 2015 Youth for Christ Impact Man of the Year.

DC PAUL SMITH



Paul Smith joined the OBU Football staff in January 2013 as the defensive coordinator.

Smith, a 1984 grad-

uate of Southeastern Oklahoma State, began his coaching career as an assistant for the Durant freshman team in 1983. He served as a graduate assistant at the University of Oklahoma from 1990-92 before becoming defensive coordinator at Wilburton High School.

Smith's first head coaching job in football came in 1993 at Little Axe, where he worked one year before becoming the defensive coordinator at Norman High. While there, the NHS defense was ranked No. 1 in 6A in 1996 and No. 3 in 1997.

In 1999, Smith took the head coaching and athletic director posts at Durant High School and was there until joining the Ardmore. The Ardmore defense was No. 1 in 5A in 2005 and No. 3 in 2003.

Smith also was guest speaker at the Oil Bowl All-Star Game and at the University of Oklahoma's Coach's Clinic in 2006.

Along the way, Smith also has coached power lifting, track, baseball and basketball.

COACH JASON MELOT



Jason Melot was hired in 2012 as assistant football coach for the first Bison football team since 1940.

Melot

came to OBU from Southmoore High School where he worked as assistant head football coach under Chris Jensen. He works with inside linebackers and coordinates recruiting.

Melot earned his bachelor of science degree in biology education from East Central University in 1993 and was hired that fall at Wynnewood, where he coached football and basketball.

The 2012 president of the Oklahoma Football Coaches Association, Melot worked as a head coach and defensive coordinator at Pauls Valley from 1999-2004 and became assistant football coach at Westmoore in 2004. In 2008, he joined the staff at Southmoore.

He has been Teacher of the Year at both Pauls Valley (2002) and Wynnewood (1998). He also has been a clinic speaker for the Oil Bowl (2000) and has coached on three district championship teams.

Melot is a graduate of Tecumseh High School and has a daughter, Madalynne. He married OBU alum Rachael Monroe in 2015.

COACH GREG GOTHARD



Greg Gothard came to OBU in the summer of 2014 as offensive line coach after 16 years at Velma-Alma High School.

He was promoted to run-

ning game coordinator prior to the 2014 season and will continue as offensive line coach.

Gothard was 143-51 as the head coach at Velma-Alma, reaching the State Championship twice. He also coached the golf team to three state titles and a state runner-up finish. He additionally coached the school power-lifting team. He took the reins of the Velma-Alma program after serving as defensive coordinator at the school from 1989-97, helping the squad to two state titles. He also coached football as an assistant at Kingston High. Over the years, he also has coached baseball and basketball.

A 1981 graduate of Kingston High School, Gothard received his bachelor of science degree from Southeastern Oklahoma State in 1985 and a master's of education degree from East Central in 2001.

Since his college days, Gothard has served as president of the Oklahoma Football Coaches Association, been an All-State and Oil Bowl coach and been an All-State Fellowship of Christian Athletes coach.

He and his wife, Leslie, have two children. They are members at Immanuel Baptist Church.

COACH BRANDON MORRIS



Brandon Morris was hired as OBU football's outside linebackers coach prior to the 2014 season after two years as middle linebackers coach

at Southmoore High School and one year at Edmond North High School.

He was promoted to strength and conditioning coordinator prior to the 2015 season and will continue coaching linebackers.

After playing nose guard at Westmoore High School, he played middle linebacker at the University of Oklahoma.

Morris is assistant youth pastor and assistant to the head pastor at Revival for Christ Club and is part of a live Christian Dinner Theater in Moore that helps raise funds for missions to the Philippines, as well as reaching families in need in the local community.

COACH CY STALLARD



Cy Stallard joined the football staff prior to the 2015 season after completing his final two playing seasons as a Bison. The former OBU receiver will coach wide re-

ceivers for his alma mater.

A native of Cleveland, Stallard played two seasons at Baker University before transferring to OBU. He was a two-time Academic All-Central States Football League honoree and scored OBU's first two-point conversion.

He and his wife, Casey, attend Immanuel Baptist Church. Stallard enjoys golf, video games and Star Wars.

COACH HERMAN SMITH



Herman Smith joined the Bison Football staff in the Spring of 2016 after a successful stint at Victor Valley Junior College (California) where he coached defensive line and

assisted the defensive coordinator with fronts and blitzes.

Victor Valley was undefeated in 2014 with the top-ranked defense in the state and Coach Smith helped the team to a second consecutive American Mountain Conference championship in 2015.

Coach Smith started his football journey at Dillard High School in Fort Lauderdale, continuing to play at Merced Junior College before a stop at Portland State University.

From there, he played professionally for 11 years, including five years in the NFL for the Philadelphia Eagles, Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Dallas Cowboys and San Francisco 49ers.

He played another six years in the Canadian Football League where he was 2000 CFL Defensive Player of the Year, helping his squad win the Grey Cup.

Coach Smith said his passion in life, next to his family, is football. Having played and coached the sport, he said he wants to take all the skills he has developed in the NFL and CFL and use them to help mentor the next generation of elite-level athletes.

COACH SHEVERAN GLOVER



Sheveran Glover joined the OBU football coaching staff in 2016-17 as cornerbacks coach and video coordinator.

Coach Glover was defensive coordinator at Mount

St. Mary's High School in 2015.
