COWBOY QUICK HITS

► The Cowboys have started the 2016-17 campaign off strong, winning four of their first five dual matches by 30 points or more, including a 39-0 shutout of Pittsburgh earlier this month. The Pokes are looking to build off a 23-19 victory over No. 8 Cornell in Gallagher-Iba Arena in their last time out.

► The Cowboys enter this weekend's matchups ranked No. 1 in both the *USA Today*/NWCA Coaches Poll and the *Intermat* Tournament Rankings.

► This year's appearance in Chattanooga marks the Cowboys' fifth consecutive appearance at the Southern Scuffle. The Cowboys have finished in the top three in each appearance at the Southern Scuffle, coming in second three of the last four years.

► Dean Heil will look to become the fifth Cowboy to win multiple Southern Scuffle championships. With a win this week, he would join Dieringer (three titles), Marsden (two titles), Jon Morrison (two titles) and Chris Perry (two titles).

MEDIA INFORMATION AND POLICIES

The Oklahoma State athletic communications office welcomes you to another season of Cowboy wrestling. The communications staff is here to assist members of the media in their coverage of Oklahoma State athletics. Please take a moment to become familiar with the following media policies.

CREDENTIALS

Members of the media should contact Harry Endicott in the Oklahoma State media relations office to request credentials to OSU wrestling duals (harry.endicott@okstate.edu or 405-744-3654). Credentials can be picked up at the Southwest pass gate to Gallagher-Iba Arena on match days.

INTERVIEWS

Media interview requests for Oklahoma State head coach John Smith should be directed to Sean Maguire in the OSU media relations office. Any requests for assistant coaches and wrestlers should be directed to Harry Endicott in the OSU media relations office. Coaches and wrestlers are typically available for interview before practice starts (usually around 3 p.m. CT), but arrangements can be made to accommodate most schedules.

MEDIA PARKING

Members of the media attending matches at Gallagher-Iba Arena should park in the lot just south of the arena and Boone Pickens Stadium. The entrance to the lot is located off Knoblock Street. No parking pass is necessary for entry into the lot.

VISITING RADIO, PHONE LINES

Phone lines will be provided to the primary radio broadcast crews for both the Cowboys and the visiting team. Additional lines are available to the media on a first-come, first-served basis in the Gallagher-Iba Arena media room.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers may shoot from the east and west sides of the mat, but are prohibited from shooting in front of either team's bench on the north and south sides of the mat.

COWBOYS ON THE AIR

Rex Holt and Roger Moore are in their eighth year together as the radio broadcast team of Oklahoma State Cowboy Wrestling. OSU wrestling can be heard on its primary home of 93.7 KSPI-FM radio in Stillwater. Occasional events are aired on either 105.5 KGFY-FM radio or 780 AM radio Stillwater should programming conflicts arise. Any time the Cowboys are on the air, the live broadcast can also be accessed live on the official web site of OSU athletics, www.okstate.com.

JOHN SMITH

Head Coach | 26th Year | Oklahoma State, 1988

Entering his 26th year, Smith accepted the head coaching position at Oklahoma State in 1992 and the numbers and accomplishments since that time speak for themselves.

He has led his alma mater to five NCAA team titles in 1994, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006, and he has coached 31 NCAA individual champions and five Olympians. Under his watch, the Cowboys have brought 16 team conference tournament championships, two Big 12 regular season titles and 102 individual conference titles back to Stillwater. He has seen his student-athletes earn All-America recognition 117 times, an average of 4.7 All-America honorees per year.

LAST APPEARANCE

Jan. 1-2, 2016 | Chattanooga, Tenn.

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. – Oklahoma State had three Cowboy wrestlers crowned champions at the 2016 Southern Scuffle with Alex Dieringer winning his third, Austin Marsden winning his second and Dean Heil winning his first.

The Cowboys finished the team race in second with 158 points, trailing Penn State by 25 points.

"I think we can take a lot out of this tournament overall," coach John Smith said. "It's pretty good to finish with three champs and several guys placing in the top-seven. The one thing we're going to have to do is get more aggressive. Our mentality on the mat is not exactly where I want it but that's where we need to get it in the next month."

Heil became the first champion for the Pokes, defeating three-seed Joey McKenna of Stanford. The two wrestled cautiously, tying the match 1-1 at the end of regulation. With no points scored in sudden victory, the bout went to a tiebreaker. Heil went down first and was not able to escape, but McKenna was hit with two stalling calls, resulting in a point for Heil. The Cowboy was able to ride out McKenna for the second part of the tiebreaker and won the title, 2-1.

In the 165-pound final, top-seeded Dieringer won his third title, making it look easy against No. 10 Logan Massa of Michigan. Dieringer scored a takedown halfway through the first period and kept the lead. He opened the second period with an escape and notched another takedown. The Cowboy sealed the win with a third takedown with seven seconds to go, defeating Massa, 8-2. Dieringer now has a 63-match win streak and sits fifth all-time, tied with Dwayne Keller.

"I'm happy that I had five bonus-point matches. That's always good for the team," Dieringer said. "I only beat a true freshman in finals 8-2 so there's room to make improvements. When it comes to the team race, it's all about bonus points. That's why Penn State won NAAs four years in a row. That's the biggest thing moving forward."

Austin Marsden was the final champ for the Pokes with his win at heavy-weight over No. 3-seed Denzel Dejourmette of Appalachian State. Marsden opened scoring with a takedown late in the first period to carry a 2-0 lead into the second period. His escape in the second was the last point scored, but riding time advantage gave Marsden a 4-0 win.

"It feels good to win a second Southern Scuffle title," Marsden said. "It's a tough tournament. I still think I have a lot of work to do. I'm not where I want to be so I have to work really hard for that national title."

In the 125-pound finals, Eddie Klimara took on top-seeded Nico Megaludis of Penn State. The Cowboy was outwrestled as Megaludis picked up three takedowns for an 8-1 win. Earning his best finish at the event, Klimara went 5-1. He now holds 93 career wins.

True freshman Joe Smith finished second in his Southern Scuffle debut, wrestling unattached. He faced No. 1-seed Jason Nolf of Penn State. Nolf controlled most of the match, picking up two takedowns. Smith earned a takedown in the third, but it was not enough as he fell 7-3.

Seven other Cowboys finished in the top-eight.

Chandler Rogers fell to tenth-seed Casey Kent of Penn in a 10-0 major decision to finish fourth at 165 pounds.

Kyle Crutchmer and Nolan Boyd finished fifth at 174 pounds and 184 pounds, respectively. Crutchmer knocked off No. 1-seed Brian Realbuto with a last-second takedown to win 4-3, while Boyd defeated teammate Jordan Rogers with a dominant 12-2 major decision.

Three Cowboys finished sixth, including Kaid Brock (133), Anthony Collica (149) and Jordan Rogers (184). Brock, a true freshman, medical forfeited out of the tournament to earn a sixth-place finish, and Collica fell in a 10-8 heartbreaker to Mitch Finesilver of Duke.

Finally, Eli Hale was awarded seventh place with a medical forfeit over after Connor Schram of Stanford.

The Cowboys will be back in action on Jan. 15 and 17 as they travel to West Virginia and Pittsburgh for a pair of duals.

ABOUT THE COWBOYS

Facing the challenge of replacing three starters from last season's squad, including three-time NCAA Champion Alex Dieringer and two-time All-American Austin Marsden, the 2016-17 Oklahoma State wrestling team is up to the task of chasing the program's 35th team championship.

There is reason for optimism, as the Pokes' roster boasts plenty of wrestlers that can make an impact this season. Head coach John Smith returns 2016 NCAA Champion at 141 pounds Dean Heil, along with All-Americans Nolan Boyd, Anthony Collica and Joe Smith from an NCAA Runner-Up finish at the NCAA Championships in Madison Square Garden last spring.

The Cowboys have started the 2016-17 campaign off strong, winning four of their first five dual matches by 30 points or more, including a 39-0 shutout of Pittsburgh earlier this month. The Pokes are looking to build off a 23-19 victory over No. 8 Cornell in Gallagher-Iba Arena in their last time out.

Along with Smith, who enters his 26th season at the helm of the Oklahoma State wrestling program, the Cowboys are led by associate head coaches Eric Guerrero and Zack Esposito, along with volunteer assistant coach Chris Perry.

IN THE POLLS

The Cowboys enter this weekend's tournament ranked No. 1 in both the *USA Today*/NWCA Coaches Poll and the *Intermat* Tournament Rankings.

Individually, Oklahoma State has all 10 starters ranked in each of the four major national polls. Returning NCAA Champion 141-pounder Dean Heil remains slotted at No. 1 in all four major polls. Aside from Heil, seven other Cowboys received top-eight rankings from *Intermat*, including Kaid Brock (133, No. 5), Anthony Collica (149, No. 3), Joe Smith (157, No. 3), Kyle Crutchmer (174, No. 6), Nolan Boyd (184, No. 6) and Preston Weigel (197, No. 5). At 125 pounds, Nick Piccininni is ranked No. 12 by *Intermat*, while Chandler Rogers is ranked 10th at 165 and heavyweight Austin Schafer comes in at No. 11.

HISTORY AT THE SOUTHERN SCUFFLE

This year's appearance in Chattanooga marks the Cowboy's fifth consecutive appearance at the Southern Scuffle. Oklahoma State has brought home 12 total individual championships at the event since 2013, with three Cowboys having won titles each year.

The Cowboys have finished in the top three in each appearance at the Southern Scuffle, coming in second three of the last four years. The team's only third place outing came in 2015.

Last season, the Cowboys finished second in the team race behind championship performances from Dean Heil (141), Alex Dieringer (165), and Austin Marsden (HWT). Dean Heil will look to become the fifth Cowboy to win multiple Southern Scuffle championships. With a win this week, he would join Dieringer (three titles), Marsden (two titles), Jon Morrison (two titles) and Chris Perry (two titles).

LAST TIME OUT

Despite no starters making the trip, the Oklahoma State wrestling team brought home the Reno Tournament of Champions team title on Dec. 18 behind individual championship performances from Boo Lewallen, Jordan Rogers and Derek White. Competing in the first collegiate event of his career, Lewallen was also named the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler. In all, OSU wrestlers combined for 12 medals at the event.

The Cowboys will bring a number of starters and reserves to Chattanooga this week. All 10 Cowboy starters will make the trip, along with reserves Eli Hale (125), Boo Lewallen (141), Tristan Moran (141), Jonce Blaylock (149), Davey Dolan (157), Heston Lamons (165), Jordan Rogers (174), Derek White (197) and Tanner Allen (HWT).

CREEPING UP ON 100

Oklahoma State seniors Anthony Collica and Nolan Boyd each find themselves within 10 wins of joining the program's 100-win club. The exclusive club currently features 39 former Cowboy greats, led by John Smith, who wrapped up his career with 152 wins.

Collica currently owns 90 career wins to go against 29 losses, putting him only 10 wins away. With a 95-31 overall record for his career, Boyd is only five wins away from breaking onto the list.

No current Cowboy wrestlers are on the list as it stands now; however, all four members of the OSU coaching staff are part of the club.

HOME, SWEET 'HOMA

The 2016-17 Cowboy wrestling roster features more of a local taste than usual with 22 of its 39 total wrestlers hailing from Oklahoma. Aside from the five Stillwater Cowboys (Kaid Brock, Tristan Moran, Andrew Nieman, Chandler Rogers and Joe Smith), the OSU roster features wrestlers from Blackwell, Tulsa, Edmond, McAlester, Guthrie, Berryhill, Miami, Collinsville, Tahlequah, Yukon, Welling, Stilwell and Muskogee.

BACK IN THE SADDLE

The Cowboys will get a couple of wrestlers back in the lineup whose 2015-16 campaigns were cut short due to injury, including 2015 All-American Kyle Crutchmer, a 174-pound senior, and 133-pound redshirt freshman Kaid Brock, who made noise in his first dual match when he pinned defending national champion Cody Brewer of Oklahoma shortly before his season-ending injury.

HEIL NAMED TO PRESEASON HODGE TROPHY CANDIDATE LIST

Oklahoma State junior 141-pounder Dean Heil is one of eight wrestlers that have been named to the preseason *WIN Magazine/Culture House* Hodge Trophy candidate list.

Heil has racked up a 67-11 overall record in his two-plus seasons of competition at Oklahoma State, including a 32-1 campaign last year that was capped with his first career NCAA Championship. The Brunswick, Ohio, native won 13 matches against ranked opponents as a sophomore, including six against top-five opponents. Heil is off to a nice start for his junior year, posting an 8-0 mark thus far with five of his eight wins coming with bonus points.

With two former wrestlers having won the award, Oklahoma State is one of five programs to boast multiple Hodge Trophy winners. Last season, Alex Dieringer hoisted the trophy following a dominant 33-0 senior campaign to join Steve Mocco on the list of former Cowboy recipients.

The winner of the 2017 Hodge Trophy will be named following the 2017 NCAA Wrestling Championships.

LEWALLEN EARNS BIG 12 WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

Oklahoma State redshirt freshman Boo Lewallen has been named Big 12 Co-Wrestler of the Week, the conference announced Monday, Dec. 19.

Lewallen went 5-0 at the Reno Tournament of Championson Dec. 18, including a pair of major decisions, to bring home the 141-pound title. Competing in the first collegiate event of his career, Lewallen was also named the tournament's Most Outstanding Wrestler. The redshirt freshman, who sat out last season due to injury, capped off the event by knocking off seventh-ranked and last year's NCAA runner-up Bryce Meredith of Wyoming in a 7-3 decision.

Although Lewallen was competing as a non-counting member for Oklahoma State at the competition, the Cowboys brought home the team title with two other champions and a slew of medalists.

The Yukon, Okla., product joins teammates Jacobe Smith, Austin Schafer and Kaid Brock who have each won Big 12 weekly awards this season.

OKLAHOMA STATE IS "WRESTLING U"

Last month, Dan Lobdell and Andrew Spey of FloWrestling have highlighted the best schools at each weight class over the last 15 years. The 10-part series goes weight class by weight class, using an algorithm that factors in a school's NCAA qualifiers, All-Americans and national champions over that time span to name one school the best at each class.

Oklahoma State took top honors in four weight classes (133, 149, 165 and 174), while finishing second at heavyweight. Not only were the Cowboys one of two schools to take multiple weight classes, but OSU was the only program to take more than two.

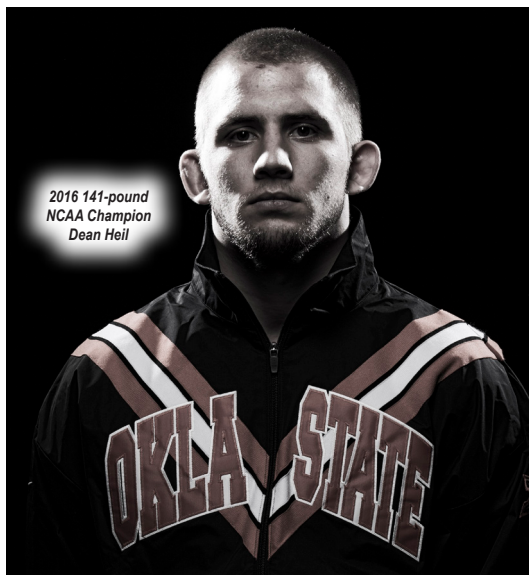

ALL IN THE FAMILY

This season's squad features two sets of brothers and a father-son combo, along with a handful of Cowboys whose family members formerly wrestled at Oklahoma State.

Dalton and Tristan Moran are originally from Arizona. Dalton transferred to OSU two seasons ago from South Dakota State. Tristan is a sophomore this year. The Rogers brothers, Chandler and Jordan, round out the group of brothers.

Coach John Smith and son Joe, who is a sophomore and returning All-American for the Pokes, make up an exciting father-son duo.

The 2016-17 roster also features freshman Wyatt Sheets, whose father is two-time national champion 167-pounder Mike Sheets. Senior Kyle Crutchmer and redshirt freshman Andrew Marsden's brothers Brian and Austin both wrestled for OSU last season.

CHAMPS IN THE CLASSROOM

Oklahoma State landed five wrestlers onto the 2016 Academic All-Big 12 first team last year. OSU's first-team honorees included Nolan Boyd, Anthony Collica, Gary Wayne Harding, Dean Heil and Preston Weigel. The selections marks the second-straight first-team selection for Collica and Heil.

COLLICA VICTORIOUS AT NWCA ALL-STAR CLASSIC

Oklahoma State wrestling senior Anthony Collica recorded a 7-5 decision over No. 3 Lavion Mayes of Missouri in the 149-pound match at the National Wrestling Coaches Association All-Star Classic Saturday night at Cleveland State University's Wolstein Center.

Mayes attacked early, scoring a takedown in the opening 10 seconds of the match to take an early 2-0 lead. After a Collica escape, the Cowboy trailed 2-1 after the first period. Collica would answer in the second, however, and a late takedown inside of 25 seconds gave the senior a 5-4 lead after two frames.

Collica opened the third period on top, but Mayes recorded an escape early on to tie the match at five apiece. With under a minute left, Collica made his move, scoring a takedown with 45 seconds left to take a 7-5 advantage that he would retain for the decision.

JOHN SMITH WRAPS 25TH YEAR AS OSU HEAD COACH

Not only did John Smith leave his legacy on Oklahoma State wrestling as a competitor, Smith continues to do so as he wrapped up his 25th year as the head coach of the Cowboy wrestling team last season. In 1992, John Smith, along with Kenny Monday, took over as co-head coaches for the squad, and Smith took over on his own in 1993. Since taking over, Smith has led his squad to five NCAA team championships and 18 conference championships. He leads all active coaches in NCAA champions coached (31), and has also seen his wrestlers earn All-American honors 117 times. After the Cowboys' win over Bucknell earlier this month, he is the Cowboys' winningest coach with a 385-59-6 record as he begins his 26th season.

LIVE FROM RIO

After bringing home two Olympic gold medals as a wrestler and coaching Team USA at the Olympics three times, Oklahoma State wrestling coach John Smith took on a different role this year at the Summer Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, serving as an analyst for NBC Sports' coverage of Olympic wrestling.

SMITH SIGNS FOUR OKLAHOMANS TO NLI'S

The Oklahoma State wrestling team has signed four Oklahomans to National Letters of Intent, head coach John Smith announced. Daton Fix, Christian Bahl, Jet Taylor and Kaden Gfeller will join the Cowboys in the fall of 2017.

Sand Springs native Daton Fix enters his senior season looking for his fourth state championship at Sand Springs High School. Coming off a 46-0 junior season, his overall high school record stands at a perfect 119-0. Fix was a 2015 Fargo National Freestyle Champion at 120 pounds and earned the bronze medal at the 2016 Junior World Championships earlier this year.

Jet Taylor of Sallisaw High School signs with the Cowboys after winning his second-straight Oklahoma 4A State Championship at 120 pounds. With the win, Taylor was named the Outstanding Wrestler for the state tournament and became Sallisaw's 11th multiple-time state champion. This summer he also earned Fargo All-American status, finishing third in Greco-Roman and sixth in freestyle at the FargoDome.

Hailing from Oklahoma City where he attends Heritage Hall, Kaden Gfeller is a three-time Oklahoma state champion, coming off a 132-pound 3A state title in February. Gfeller is a multiple-time Fargo All-American, most recently placing third at the 2015 Junior Men's Freestyle Nationals.

Stillwater High School product Christian Bahl is coming off an Oklahoma 6A State Championship at 160 pounds last February. He's racked up a 163-24 career record in high school, and is a three-time state placer while earning five all-conference honors. Bahl, who is a three-time national team member for both Oklahoma and Minnesota, has also excelled in football where he was a varsity starter all four years of his high school career.

COWBOY WRESTLING TRADITION

Oklahoma State wrestling celebrated 100 years of history last season. The Cowboys, then known as the Oklahoma A&M Tigers and led by A.M. Colville, wrestled their first match in 1915 against the University of Texas. It was a rough start for OSU as it fell to the Longhorns in its lone dual of the season. But the Cowboys pulled through and went on to win 34 NCAA team championships (the most by any school in any sport), 141 individual champions and 450 All-Americans. Overall, the Cowboys hold an incredibly impressive 1,080-125-23 overall record.



MATCH NOTES

WRESTLING'S HOUSE OF HORRORS

No venue in America has a richer wrestling tradition than Gallagher-Iba Arena, home of Oklahoma State wrestling since 1939. In its beginning as Gallagher Hall, the gymnasium was named for Edward Clark Gallagher, the Oklahoma A&M wrestling mentor who never wrestled competitively but became the greatest coach of his time.

Since wrestling began in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the Cowboys have won 25 NCAA titles and have had 40 unbeaten and untied campaigns at home. One of their longest winning streaks ran with the arena's opening in 1939 and lasted until Feb. 16, 1951. During that period, Oklahoma State won 37 straight home duals, including no ties.

Gallagher-Iba Arena has proved to be one of the most difficult venues for opponents to win in across all of college sports, as the Cowboy wrestling program boasts an impressive 477-39-6 overall record in the arena.

From the final dual of 1959 through the first five home duals of the 1967 season, Oklahoma State wrestled 67 duals without a loss, finishing with an impressive 60-0-1 record before the streak was broken by Oklahoma, 19-13.

OSU's latest home winning streak of 50 consecutive duals was the second-longest such streak without a loss or tie, as it began near the end of the 1986 season and lasted until Jan. 30, 1993.

2015-16 WRAP-UP

Oklahoma State celebrated 100 years of wrestling history as well as 25 years of John Smith at the helm of the program, ending the season with a second-place finish at NCAAs, a 50th team conference championship, six All-Americans, two NCAA individual champions, a Hodge Trophy recipient and a 13-3 dual record.

Held at the Sprint Center in Kansas City, Missouri the Big 12 Championships were hosted at a neutral site for the first time. It also featured six new teams as Big 12 affiliates for a 10-man bracket at each weight. OSU sent nine wrestlers to the finals and clinched the team title before day one had concluded. Seven Cowboys claimed Big 12 titles and just weeks later, all 10 Pokes stepped onto the mat in the world's most famous arena, Madison Square Garden, in New York City.

Aside from All-Americans Nolan Boyd, Joe Smith, Austin Marsen and Anthony Collica, the Pokes brought home two national champions, increasing Oklahoma State wrestling's total to 141 NCAA champions.

Dean Heil, a sophomore for the Cowboys, put up a 32-1 record on the season, dominating the 141-pound weight class. He entered the season ranked No. 1 and maintained the ranking despite suffering a sudden-victory loss to Joey Ward of UNC at home in February. He avenged the loss in the quarterfinals of the NCAA tournament, controlling No. 8 Ward, 8-3. Another 8-3 win in the semifinals sent him to the championship bout, where he faced new Big 12 rival Bryce Meredith of Wyoming. The Cowboy edged out Meredith with a 4-3 effort. He finished the season an NCAA champ, a two-time All-American and a two-time Big 12 champion.

Alex Dieringer lived up to the country's expectations, winning his third NCAA championship. The Cowboy senior served up a 33-0 record last season, recording bonus points in all but six matches. His 27 bonus-point wins included 12 falls—10 of which came in the first period—eight major decisions and seven technical falls. He proved his dominance even more as he allowed only one takedown last season and just three takedowns the past two seasons.

In its beginning as Gallagher Hall, the gymnasium was named for Edward Clark Gallagher, the Oklahoma A&M wrestling mentor who never wrestled competitively but became the greatest coach of his time.

The 1987-88 season brought a new look and a new name to the hallowed hall. When renovations were completed in January 1988, it was renamed Gallagher-Iba Arena to honor the late Mr. Henry P. Iba, Oklahoma State's legendary basketball coach.

Gallagher-Iba Arena took on a new look once again in 2001. On Jan. 4, 2001 the OSU wrestling team hosted Oregon in the first match in the newly renovated arena. Gallagher-Iba Arena underwent a \$56 million renovation, that increased the seating capacity of Gallagher-Iba Arena to its current total of 13,611 seats.

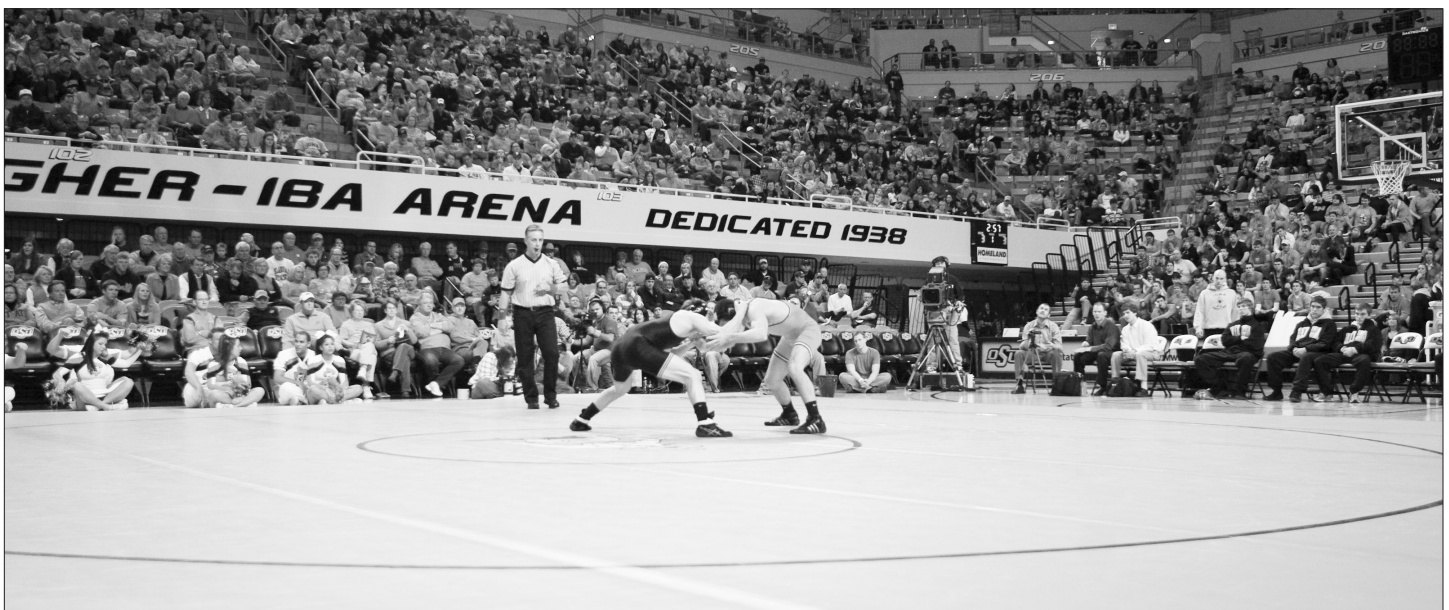
The Cowboys set a new wrestling attendance record in the first season, packing in 10,802 for a Bedlam Series dual against Oklahoma on Feb. 18. Previously, the largest crowd was estimated at 8,300.

Since wrestling began in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the Cowboys have won 25 NCAA titles and have had 40 unbeaten and untied campaigns at home. One of their longest winning streaks ran with the arena's opening in 1939 and lasted until Feb. 16, 1951. During that period, Oklahoma State won 37 straight home duals, including no ties.

From the final dual of 1959 through the first five home duals of the 1967 season, Oklahoma State wrestled 67 duals without a loss, finishing with an impressive 60-0-1 record before the streak was broken by Oklahoma, 19-13.

On Feb. 3, 1939, Oklahoma A&M wrestled for the first time inside the arena, defeating Indiana by an 18-6 margin. On Feb. 3, 1989, the Oklahoma State Cowboys hosted the Hoosiers in a celebration of the 50-year anniversary of the first Gallagher Hall dual. The Cowboys defeated the Hoosiers, 28-6, in the 1989 dual.

OSU's latest home winning streak of 50 consecutive duals was the second-longest such streak without a loss or tie, as it began near the end of the 1986 season and lasted until Jan. 30, 1993.

MIAMI, Okla. – The Oklahoma State wrestling team proved worthy of its No. 1 ranking in its season opener Sunday afternoon, dominating Bucknell in a 36-3 dual victory behind five bonus-point wins at NEO Fieldhouse.

Kyle Crutchmer highlighted the day with a first-period fall in the 174-pound bout, while Nick Piccininni and Jonce Blaylock recorded technical falls and Kaid Brock and Chandler Rogers added major decisions. Dean Heil was also victorious at 141 pounds in the only match that featured two ranked wrestlers.

"I'm feeling better about my team right now," head coach John Smith said. "I was a little concerned going in with a few starters out, and you don't like starting your season like that."

The Cowboys opened the match with bonus points at 125 pounds as 15th-ranked Nick Piccininni recorded a 15-0 tech fall over Jordan Gessner in 3:46. Piccininni jumped out early, scoring 12 points in the first period, thanks to a takedown, a two-point near fall and a couple of four-point near falls. Starting the second period on bottom, the redshirt freshman escaped and converted a takedown 45 seconds into the frame to finish the match and pick up the first dual victory of his career.

At 133 pounds, redshirt freshman Kaid Brock scored bonus points in his return to the mat from a season-ending injury last year. Brock knocked off Bucknell's Joey Gould in a 16-6 major decision to expand the Oklahoma State lead to 9-0.

"In the end, I thought we looked pretty sharp at 125 and 133," Smith said. "Not that we were perfect. It's hard to be perfect, but getting out there, scoring points and a lot of riding on our part. I didn't expect that."

Matched up with 19th-ranked Tyler Smith, returning 141-pound NCAA champion Dean Heil recorded a decision to push the Cowboy lead to 12-0. Heil notched three takedowns in the opening period to take an early 6-2 lead, and after a takedown with 35 seconds left in the second, Heil took an 8-5 lead into the final frame. The junior would close it out with ease, earning a 14-7 decision with riding time.

Jonce Blaylock impressed in his 2016-17 debut, tallying a 21-2 tech fall over Seth Hogue in the 149-pound bout. Blaylock dropped Hogue for a takedown 30 seconds into the match, and recorded a pair of two-point near falls to cap off the first period. Leading, 14-2, heading into the third period, Blaylock would finish strong and score seven quick points to record the tech fall in 6:37.

The Cowboys took their lone loss of the day at 157 pounds, as Bucknell's Victor Lopez held off junior Davey Dolan in a 7-5 decision.

Fifth-ranked Chandler Rogers posted a 9-1 major decision over Bucknell's Logan Kerin in his first match down at 165 pounds after competing at 174 last season. Rogers led throughout the match, and picked up the riding time point for the bonus point win.

Returning from an injury that cut his 2016 campaign short, senior Kyle Crutchmer couldn't have asked for a better return. Crutchmer pinned Chad Reese 1:32 into the first period to put the Pokes up, 27-3.

"This was something that I had been looking forward to," Crutchmer said. "Not just the pin, but the match. I've been out for about six months. I've been training a little bit for the last couple of months, but coming back and having a pin. It's unbelievable."

Senior Nolan Boyd (184), redshirt sophomore Preston Weigel (197) and senior Austin Schafer (285) each recorded decisions to close out the match, giving the Cowboys their first triumph of the season.

Oklahoma State's next dual match will send the Cowboys back out on the road to face No. 15 Minnesota on Nov. 27 in Minneapolis.

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. – The top-ranked Oklahoma State wrestling team handed its first ranked opponent of the season in dominating fashion Sunday afternoon, dropping No. 16 Minnesota, 34-3, at the Minnesota Sports Pavilion to move to 2-0 on the dual season.

Heavyweight Austin Schafer had the biggest highlight of the day, upsetting No. 5 Michael Kroells for the first ranked win of his career with a thrilling 3-2 decision that was decided in the final 30 seconds. Adding to Schafer's big win, four Cowboys recorded bonus point victories to put the Gophers away, including a first-period fall by Chandler Rogers at 165 pounds.

"Overall, I'm pleased," head coach John Smith said after the match. "You obviously have some matches that you kind of scratch your head at. I don't think any of our guys really felt like they were in any kind of rhythm today, but that's okay. It's tough to get in that rhythm."

Following up Preston Weigel's loss to No. 2 Brett Pfarr at 197 pounds after halftime to cut the Cowboy lead to 18-3, Schafer killed whatever momentum the Gophers had. Tied at one with under a minute to go in the final period, the senior made his move. Schafer's decisive takedown came with 30 seconds on the clock, and while Kroells would escape for a final effort, the Cowboy heavyweight held on for the 3-2 decision.

Starting the match at 149, third-ranked Anthony Collica recorded a 6-4 decision with riding time over Fredy Stroker of Minnesota in his first true match of the season. Collica sat the Cowboys' opening dual out after defeating third-ranked Lavion Mayes in the All-Star Classic the previous day, but the match didn't count toward his NCAA record.

Jonce Blaylock kept things rolling, moving up to 157 to fill in for third-ranked Joseph Smith against Minnesota's Carson Brolsma. Trailing 4-3 in the third period, Blaylock dropped Brolsma for a takedown in the final 30 seconds of the match to gut out a 5-4 decision.

Rogers recorded the first bonus point win for the Cowboys Sunday afternoon, pinning Minnesota's Brandon Kingsley nearly a minute and a half into the match. It marked Rogers' second pin of the season and the second-quickest of his career, moving him to 5-0 overall for his redshirt sophomore campaign.

Seniors Kyle Crutchmer and Nolan Boyd both recorded decisions to give the Cowboys an 18-0 lead at the intermission. Crutchmer survived a late push from No. 14 Nick Wanzek to get the 7-5 win. Boyd got out with a 2-1 decision over Robert Steveson.

After Schafer's match put the win well in hand, redshirt freshmen Nick Piccininni and Kaid Brock, along with top-ranked Dean Heil buried the Gophers with bonus-point wins in their matches.

Piccininni was relentless in his match against Skyler Petry at 125 pounds, piling up points to get the 17-1 tech fall. The East Setauket, N.Y., product moved to 6-0 on the season, and boosted his dual point total to 10 after tech falls in both of the first two dual matches of his career.

Brock came out of the gate hot, dropping Minnesota's Mitch McKee in under 10 seconds. Leading 3-2 after one, Brock pulled away in the second with the help of a four-point nearfall. The Stillwater native would finish off the match with a 10-2 major decision.

Dean Heil closed out the match with a 12-3 major decision over Gannon Volk to move to 6-0 on the season. The 2016 NCAA Champion was dominant throughout, recording five takedowns to pick up the riding time point easily with just over four minutes on top.

Senior heavyweight Austin Schafer picked up his second-straight top-15 win Saturday night with a 5-2 decision over No. 15 Ross Larson that extended the Cowboy lead to 6-0. After a scoreless first period, Schafer got the high end of a scoring flurry to start the second, escaping before taking down Larson to jump out to a 3-2 lead after the first two periods. The Edmond, Okla., product closed it out, escaping to open the period and holding off Larson for the remainder of the match.

125-pounder Nick Piccininni tallied a 12-2 major decision over Christian Moody for the first bonus point win of the night for the Pokes. Despite neither wrestler finding a way to score in the first, the redshirt freshman used three takedowns and a four-point nearfall in the final two periods to run up the score in a hurry and convert the major decision. In three duals this season, Piccininni has recorded a pair of technical falls and tonight's major decision to boost his dual point total to 14 on the year.

Kaid Brock recorded a 10-7 win over Oklahoma's Trae Blackwell at 133 pounds to move to 7-0 overall this season and 3-0 in duals. Brock recorded a couple of takedowns in the first period, following with a couple more in the second to lead 9-5 after three. Starting the third on bottom, the Stillwater native escaped to make his lead five. Blackwell would score on a takedown late in the final period, but it was too late as Brock ran out the clock for the decision.

Reigning NCAA Champion Dean Heil came out of the gate hot at 141 pounds, recording three takedowns and a four-point nearfall to lead 10-2 after one frame. The scoring slowed down with each wrestler only adding an escape in the remaining two periods, but that opening spurt and riding time put Heil on top with a 12-3 decision.

Anthony Collica picked up his second win of the season in as many matches with a 10-5 decision over No. 14 Davion Jeffries at 149 pounds to bump the Cowboy lead to 20-0. After a takedown in each of the first two periods, Collica finished strong with a takedown and reversal in the final frame to wrap up the win.

At 157 pounds, Jonce Blaylock dropped 13th-ranked DaWaylon Barnes in a 6-3 decision to seal the victory for the Pokes with three matches to go. Blaylock took a 1-0 lead into the final period. After Barnes escaped to open the third and tie the match at one, the match looked to be headed for sudden victory as both wrestlers struggled to score, but Barnes was called for his second stalling of the night, putting Blaylock ahead. The redshirt sophomore just built his lead after that, closing the match with a pair of takedowns to seal the upset and his second career win over a ranked foe.

Chandler Rogers was the only Cowboy to be defeated Friday night, falling in a 3-1 sudden victory decision to No. 11 Clark Glass at 165 pounds.

Kyle Crutchmer surged late to pick up a 21-6 technical fall over Oklahoma's Hayden Hansen. Leading 5-1 after the first two periods, Kyle Crutchmer found no trouble scoring in the third. Crutchmer tallied five takedowns and two near-falls in the final frame to get the tech, marking his second bonus point victory of the season.

Nolan Boyd finished off the Cowboy rout with a technical fall win over OU's Andrew Dixon. Boyd jumped out to a 6-0 lead after the first period, and got the tech fall in 5:43 after a couple of takedowns and a four-point nearfall over the final two periods.

The dual win was the Cowboys' sixth straight over the Sooners and their 13th in the last 14 meetings.

STILLWATER – The top-ranked Oklahoma State wrestling team continued its early-season dominance Sunday afternoon, notching seven bonus-point victories on the way to a 39-0 shutout of No. 21 Pittsburgh at Gallagher-Iba Arena. The win marked the Cowboys' second-straight shutout of the Panthers. Through four duals, Oklahoma State has imposed its will on each of its opponents, taking all four by 30 points or more. Sunday's 39-point triumph was the highest point differential in a win for OSU since last season's 41-0 drubbing of Stanford in Stillwater on Feb. 14.

Redshirt freshman Nick Piccininni got things started for the Cowboys at 125 pounds with a 12-0 major decision over Pittsburgh's LJ Bentley. Holding a 1-0 lead after two periods and starting the final period on top, Piccininni caught fire in the final minutes of the match. The East Seatauket, N.Y., product opened with a two-point nearfall before scoring twice more with a pair of four-point nearfalls to close the match. Piccininni has recorded bonus-point victories in each of his four starts with a pair of technical falls and two major decisions.

Kaid Brock had a strong showing as well Sunday, dropping eighth-ranked Dom Forsy in a 10-3 decision at 133 pounds. Brock would lead, 8-2, after the first period and was in control throughout as he allowed Forsy just three points all on escapes in the match. The win moved the Stillwater native to 8-0 overall this season and 4-1 against ranked opponents in his career.

Junior Dean Heil and senior Anthony Collica continued the Cowboy dominance with a pair of major decisions.

Heil was consistent throughout his win over Pittsburgh's Robert Lee, recording four total takedowns and over three minutes of riding time for an 11-3 major decision that moved him to 8-0 on the season.

Collica was impressive as well, bouncing back from an early takedown by Pittsburgh's Mike Racciato with an escape and takedown of his own to lead 3-2 after one frame. The Solon, Ohio native separated himself over the final two periods for the 12-3 decision, moving to 3-0 for his senior campaign and recording his first bonus point victory of the season.

Coming off a win over No. 13 DaWaylon Barnes in the Cowboys' win over Oklahoma Friday night, 157-pounder Jonce Blaylock had another solid showing on Sunday in a 12-10 win over Taleb Rahmani. Blaylock and Rahmani traded leads throughout the match, as Rahmani led 6-5 after one period before the pair were tied at nine after two. Blaylock pulled away in the final frame, dropping Rahmani for a takedown and earning the riding time point. Rahmani nearly converted on a reversal at the buzzer that would tie the match at 12, but after a review, Blaylock was awarded his team-leading 12th overall victory of the season.

Chandler Rogers bounced back from an early scare at 165 pounds where he found himself in a 6-2 hole after No. 13 TeShan Campbell notched a reversal and a four-point nearfall, nearly pinning Rodgers in the first period. Rogers got a reversal of his own late in the first to survive and cut Campbell's lead to 6-4 after the first three minutes. The Stillwater product tallied a takedown in the third that would give him the lead for good, and didn't let Campbell score again, pulling away for a 10-6 decision.

Four-straight bonus point wins wrapped up the victory for the Pokes, the first coming from senior Kyle Crutchmer at 174 pounds, who dominated Pittsburgh's Austin Bell in an 18-5 major decision. Coming off a 21-6 technical fall in the Cowboys' Bedlam win, Crutchmer was relentless. The Tulsa, Okla., native tallied six takedowns and a four-point nearfall to overwhelm Bell and improve to 4-0 on the season.

Senior Nolan Boyd added a major decision of his own, defeating Christian Dietrich, 15-3, for his seventh win of the season in as many matches. The win was never in doubt, as Boyd came out with a takedown right out of the gate and didn't let up. Overall, Boyd recorded four takedowns, a reversal and a four-point nearfall to easily pick up the victory.

A hot start from 197-pounder Preston Weigel gave the redshirt sophomore a technical fall over Zach Bruce to boost the Cowboy lead to 34. After a takedown and four nearfalls, Weigel lead 14-0 after one period. Weigel's riding time put him over the top for the tech fall win.

Heavyweight Austin Schafer finished off the first shutout of the season for the Pokes in a 21-6 technical fall of Pittsburgh's John Rizzo. Schafer bounced back from a 6-0 hole, where Rizzo posted a takedown and four-point nearfall before Schafer responded with a reversal and pair of nearfalls to take an 8-6 lead into the second period. It was all Schafer from that point on as he posted a takedown and three nearfalls in the final two periods to earn the tech fall.

STILLWATER – The top-ranked Oklahoma State wrestling team improved its undefeated record to 5-0 Friday night, coming back to defeat No. 8 Cornell, 23-19, in Gallagher-Iba Arena.

Senior Anthony Collica provided the highlight of the dual, pinning Joey Galasso in 3:31 to put the Cowboys up six with two matches remaining and allowing Joe Smith to seal the win for the Cowboys with a major decision over Kyle Simaz in his first action of the year.

Cornell jumped up early, taking a 7-0 lead after taking the first two matches of the night. Cowboy senior Kyle Crutchmer dropped the first match of the night, 3-2, to sixth-ranked Brian Realbuto at 174 pounds for his first loss of the season. Senior Nolan Boyd was defeated by top-ranked Gabe Dean in a 14-6 major decision at 184 pounds.

Redshirt sophomore Preston Weigel got the Cowboys on the board at 197 pounds, gutting out a 3-2 decision over Cornell's Ben Honis thanks to a takedown with 40 seconds remaining in the match that put the Russell, Kan., product on top.

Heavyweight Austin Schafer continued the strong start to his senior season, recording a 7-3 decision over Craig Scott that would pull Oklahoma State within one of the Big Red. Schafer led throughout the match and moved to a perfect 8-0 on the season with the win.

Moving back down to 125 pounds, Cornell halted the Cowboys' momentum as Noah Baughman notched a non-control fall over redshirt freshman Nick Piccininni late in the second period. The fall dug the Cowboys into a 13-6 hole with five matches to go.

Redshirt freshman Kaid Brock sparked the Cowboys at 133 with a major decision over 17th-ranked Mark Grey that was the first of four-straight wins for OSU. Leading, 4-1, after one period, Brock turned it on in the second, outscoring Grey, 9-3, to seize control of the match. The win was Brock's second of the season over a ranked opponent and moved him to 5-1 for his career against ranked foes.

Top-ranked Dean Heil evened the team score at 13 apiece after a 6-1 decision at 141 pounds. The win pushed his perfect record on the year to 9-0.

Collica gave the lead to the Cowboys for good with his pin. The senior started hot, picking up three takedowns and a nearfall halfway through the first to eventually lead 13-4 after one. Collica continued that aggressiveness in the second, picking up a couple more takedowns before finally getting Galasso on his back for the fall. The win was Collica's second-straight bonus point victory, moving him to 4-0 overall this season.

Smith sealed the win for OSU in his return to the mat, posting a 15-6 major decision over Simaz to put the Cowboys on top, 23-13.

The Big Red would get on the board one more time at 165 pounds, as No. 20 Brandon Womack pinned Chandler Rogers just over a minute into the first period.
