The Basics

No. 2 Oklahoma State wrestling makes its way to New York City this weekend in search of its 35th NCAA title. The Pokes are one of only three teams taking a full squad to the Big Apple, with Nebraska and Rutgers joining them. The qualifying Cowboys include eight seeded wrestlers with two No. 1 seeds in Dean Heil (141) and Alex Dieringer (165). Set to take place in historic Madison Square Garden, the NCAA Championships will run from March 17-19.

100 Years of Greatness

Oklahoma State wrestling is celebrating 100 years of history this season. The Cowboys, then known as the Oklahoma A&M Tigers and led by A.M. Colville, wrestled their first match in 1915 against the University of Texas. It was a rough start for OSU as it fell to the Longhorns in its lone dual of the season. But the Cowboys pulled through and went on to win 34 NCAA team championships (the most by any school in any sport), 139 individual champions and 444 All-Americans. Overall, the Cowboys hold an incredibly impressive 1,079-125-23 overall record.

John Smith Wraps 25th Year as OSU Head Coach

Not only did John Smith leave his legacy on Oklahoma State wrestling as a competitor, Smith continues to do so as he wraps his 25th year as the head coach of the Cowboy wrestling team. In 1992, John Smith, along with Kenny Monday, took over as co-head coaches for the squad, and Smith took over on his own in 1993. Since taking over, Smith has led his squad to five NCAA team championships and 18 conference championships. He leads all active coaches in NCAA champions coached (29), and has also seen his wrestlers earn All-American honors 111 times. He is the Cowboys' winningest coach with a 384-59-6 record to wrap up his 25th season.

Dual Season Wrap-Up

Oklahoma State finished the season with a 13-3 overall record and a 6-0 mark in conference competition. The Cowboys had arguably the toughest schedule in the country, taking on four teams that finished the season in the top six. The Pokes started slow with a 2-2 record but rattled off 11-straight wins to earn a spot in the NWCA National Duals finals against Penn State. After falling to the Nittany Lions, the Cowboys finished 7-2 on the road. This year's record marks the third-consecutive year with only one loss at home, going 7-1. The Cowboys wrestling program improves to 474-39-6 all-time record at Gallagher-Iba Arena. In all, OSU notched nine wins over top-25 opponents this season.

In the Polls

Oklahoma State stays put at No. 2 in the Intercollegiate tournament rankings. The Pokes finished the dual season at No. 5 in the USA Today/NWCA/Division I Coaches Poll.

The Cowboys are the top-ranked team from the Big 12 in both the USA Today/NWCA/Division I Coaches Poll and the Intercollegiate rankings. Two other Big 12 teams enjoy spots in the top 25 of the tournament rankings with OU sitting at No. 13 and Big 12 newcomer South Dakota State tied at No. 23 with Arizona State and Northwestern.

All ten of the Cowboys' starters are ranked among the top 20 in the nation at their respective weight classes in at least one poll, including a No. 1 rankings in all four polls for two-time national champion Alex Dieringer (165) and 2015 All-American Dean Heil (141). Five other Pokes are ranked in the top-10 in at least one poll: Eddie Klimara (125), Joe Smith (157), Chandler Rogers (174), Nolan Boyd (184) and Austin Marsden (285).

John Smith at the NCAA Tournament

John Smith has led the Cowboys to five NCAA titles and has coached 29 NCAA individual champions and 111 All-Americans since taking over the program in 1991-92.

His 29 NCAA champions leads all active coaches and his 111 All-Americans ranks second to Minnesota's J Robinson, who has coached five more years than Smith.

Cowboys at the NCAA Tournament

The Oklahoma State wrestling program boasts 34 NCAA titles all-time, making it the winningest program in all of college sports.

Cowboy wrestlers have combined to win 139 NCAA individual titles and 444 All-America honors through the years, far surpassing the second-place totals held by Iowa (81 champions and 313 All-Americans).

Cowboys Return Four All-Americans

Two-time NCAA Champion and top-seeded Alex Dieringer is joined by three other All-Americans, going into this season's NCAA tournament.

Sophomore Dean Heil earned the honor after shaking up the 141-pound bracket in 2015, when he entered the tournament seeded 14th and produced a fourth-place finish. Also earning his first All-America honor last season was Eddie Klimara, who finished seventh at 125 pounds.

Austin Marsden, who received All-America honors in 2014, returns for his final NCAA tournament as the No. 4 seed at 285 pounds.

Dieringer Wins Fourth Big 12 Title

Alex Dieringer became only the seventh Cowboy wrestler to earn four individual conference titles last weekend as he defeated second-seeded and 10th-ranked Tanner Weatherman of Iowa State in the 165-pound finals, 4-2.

His historical Big 12 career began in 2013, when Dieringer defeated Matt Lester of Oklahoma with a dominating 11-3 major decision for his first Big 12 crown. His second title came when he handily defeated No. 19 Justin DeAngelis of OU, 8-3. Last season, Dieringer snagged his third Big 12 title, shutting down No. 2 Mike Moreno of Iowa State, 14-4.

The only other Cowboys to have done this were Steve Barrett (1974-77), LeeRoy Smith (1977-80), Pat Smith (1990-92, 94), Johnny Thompson (2001-04), Jordan Oliver (2010-13), and most recently Chris Perry (2011-14).

Dieringer Undefeated and On a Roll

Two-time NCAA champion Alex Dieringer is in the midst of a 77-match win streak, dating back to January 2014. Last season he compiled a perfect 33-0 overall record and currently holds a 28-0 mark in 2015-16. Dieringer sits at third all-time for unbeaten streaks in program history and second all-time in total wins with 128. In addition to his impressive career, Dieringer is also the top guy to beat, entering the NCAA tournament as the No. 1 seed for the second year in a row. He has also not been taken down all season.

Welcome to the 100 Club, Cowboys

Senior Eddie Klimara joined the Oklahoma State 100-Win Club on Valentine's Day with his win over No. 15 Connor Schram of Stanford in an exciting overtime bout. Klimara holds a 103-37 career record. He is the second current Cowboy to join the club as Alex Dieringer closed out his junior campaign with his 100th win.

The third current Cowboy to join the club was Austin Marsden, who notched his 100th win a week later on Senior Day, defeating Cory Daniel of North Carolina in his final match in Gallagher-Iba Arena. The Cowboy senior holds a 104-19 overall record.

Champs in the Classroom

The Big 12 Conference announced five Oklahoma State wrestlers to the 2016 Academic All-Big 12 first team this week. OSU's first-team honorees include Nolan Boyd, Anthony Collica, Gary Wayne Harding, Dean Heil and Preston Weigel. This was the second-straight first-team selection for Collica and Heil.

NWCA National Duals

After an 11-match win streak and rising to No. 3 in the USA Today/NWCA Division I Coaches Poll, Oklahoma State's wrestling team was selected by the NWCA to compete against No. 1 Penn State in the championship match of the NWCA Bowl Dual Series on Feb. 21.

The Cowboys, suffering from injuries, brought a depleted lineup to State College, Pa., and suffered a 29-18 loss to the top-ranked Nittany Lions, finishing 13-3 on the season.

The Bowl Dual Series featured the top-eight Big Ten programs each hosting a non-Big Ten school in a weekend of dual competition.

Good Ride, Cowboys

Oklahoma State wrestling honored three senior Cowboys prior to the dual against North Carolina.

Alex Dieringer, a native of Port Washington, Wisc., is a two-time NCAA champion and three-time Big 12 champion, competing at 157 and 165 pounds. He has written himself into the history books, holding the fifth-best win streak, fifth-best win percentage and seventh-best win record in program history. The Cowboy has spent the last two years as the top-ranked wrestler in his weight class and is favored for a third national championship. He has compiled a 128-4 overall record with 94 bonus points. Dieringer has also amassed more than 60 dual wins in his incredible career as a Cowboy.

Eddie Klimara hails from Joliet, Ill., and has been a crucial part of the Cowboy Wrestling squad, competing at 125 pounds. Boasting a 102-38 career record, the Cowboy is a 2015 All-American and a two-time Big 12 Champion. During his time as a Cowboy, he has won 43 duals for the Cowboys and earned 50 bonus-point wins.

Also coming to the squad from Illinois, Austin Marsden has been one of the most successful heavyweights for the Pokes. He sits at 103-19 overall. The Crystal Lake, Ill., native earned All-American status in 2014 and is a two-time Big 12 champion. He has also been ranked in the top-five all season.

Last Time Out - Big 12 Finals

On March 5, the Cowboy Wrestling program clinched its 50th conference title before day one of the Big 12 Championships had concluded. It was also the 300th conference title in OSU history. The Pokes finished the tournament with nine Big 12 finalists, seven Big 12 champs and a record-breaking 161 team points. It was the fourth-straight Big 12 title for OSU and second-consecutive year of seven Big 12 champs.

Cowboy Wrestling coach John Smith has pulled three true freshmen from their redshirts so far this season. Most recently, his son Joe made his varsity debut in the dual against West Virginia. Smith also pulled freshman Andrew Marsden's redshirt on Jan. 1 as Marsden competed as an attached member of the Oklahoma State team at the Southern Scuffle. The Illinois native went 1-2 at the event. Earlier this season, Smith pulled Kaid Brock's redshirt in the dual versus Oklahoma. Brock won his first match in the lineup for the Cowboys with a 42-second fall over OU's defending national champion and No. 2-ranked Cody Brewer.

Four Cowboys Qualify for Olympic Trials

Eight former Cowboys competed at the US Open last month, which served as a qualifying tournament for the 2016 Olympic Trials. Four Pokes earned top-seven finishes, securing them a spot for the Trials. Chris Perry, a two-time NCAA champion, took second at 74 kilograms. Also qualifying is 2012 Olympic bronze medalist Coleman Scott (57 kg), Tyler Caldwell (86 kg) and Clayton Foster (86 kg).

Historical Grapple on the Gridiron

Oklahoma State opened the season with a trip to Iowa City to take on the then-No. 4 Hawkeyes in a dual that was tabbed as the Grapple on the Gridiron, which marked the first time in NCAA history two wrestling programs competed outside at a Division I football stadium. The dual shattered the NCAA dual attendance record, previously held by Penn State (15,996 vs. Pitt in 2013), with 42,287 tickets sold.

Crutchmer, Heil Compete at NWCA All-Star Classic

Returning All-Americans Kyle Crutchmer and Dean Heil were selected to compete in the NWCA All-Star Classic, which was held on Nov. 1 in Atlanta at Georgia Tech University.

Heil fell in the final seconds of a tight, high-scoring bout against 133-pound 2015 NCAA champion Cody Brewer, 13-12.

Crutchmer also fell in a close one, 2-1 to Zach Epperly of Virginia at 174 pounds.

Alex Dieringer was also invited to compete, but was not able to make it to the competition.

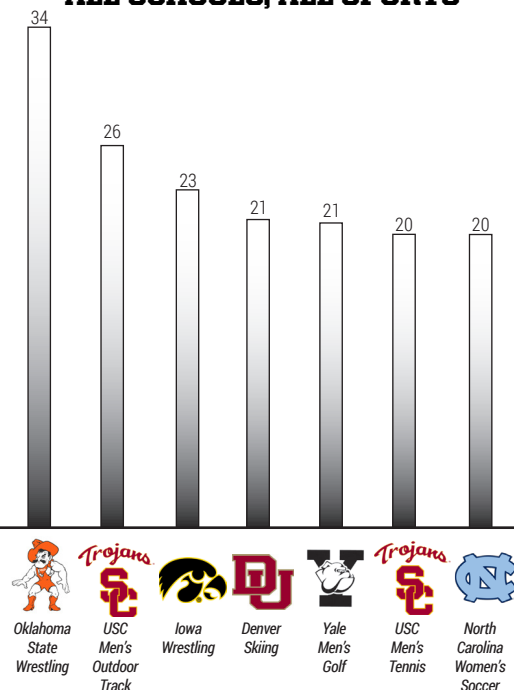
All in the Family

This season's squad features four sets of brothers and a father-son combo.

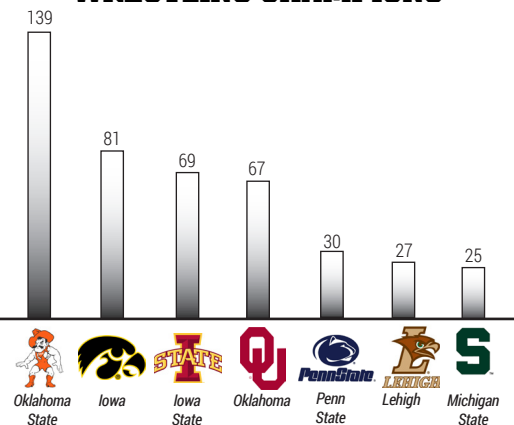

The Rogers brothers, Chandler and Jordan, round out the group of brothers.

Coach John Smith and son Joe, who is a freshman for the Pokes, make up an exciting father-son duo. Under his father's direction, Joe is 30-3 on the season.

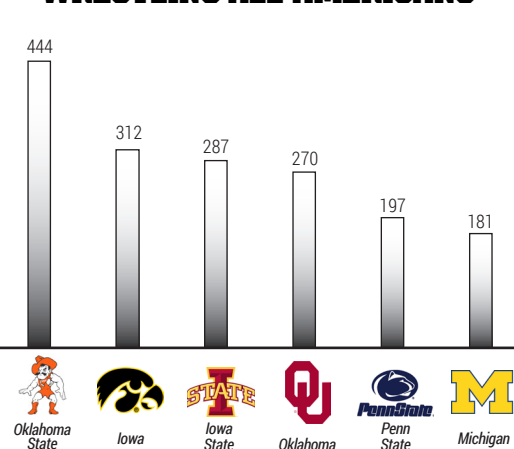

Signing Day Recap

In mid-November, John Smith announced the signing of three wrestlers during the 2015 early signing period. Signing with the Pokes are Wyatt Sheets of Oklahoma, Keegan Moore of Minnesota and Ethan Andersen of Iowa.

Son of OSU great Mike Sheets, Wyatt is a three-time state champion for Stillwell High School. Moore, a senior at Jackson County High School, is a two-time state champion and a 2014 Cadet National champion. Ethan Andersen is a two-time state champion for Southeast Polk High School and a 2014 FILA Cadet World team in Greco-Roman.

Big 12 Expansion

This year the Big 12 conference has added six new affiliate members for wrestling, bringing the conference to a total of 10 teams. Joining the Big 12 is Air Force, North Dakota State, Northern Colorado, South Dakota State, Utah Valley and Wyoming.

With the addition of the new members, the Big 12 Championships will now serve as a qualifying tournament for the 2016 NCAA Championships.

NCAA Implements New Rules

The NCAA implemented several new rules for the 2015-16 season. Below are a few:

- Awarding two points for a near fall if the referee reaches a two-count. Four points would be awarded if the referee reaches a four-count.
- When wrestlers interlock fingers in the neutral position, the referee will stop the action and call it stalemate, and any subsequent offenses would require the referee to call stalling on the wrestler who initiates the interlocking.
- When wrestling is stopped in the neutral standing position for going out of bounds, the referee can make one of the three following calls:
 - Stalling on one or both wrestlers for leaving the wrestling area.
 - Stalling for pushing or pulling the opponent out of bounds.
 - Wrestling action is taking place.

COWBOY WRESTLING TRADITION

By any measure, Oklahoma State is the gold standard within the world of college wrestling.

On the national level, the Cowboys have won 34 NCAA team titles, crowned 139 NCAA individual champions and earned 444 All-America honors.

No other program even comes close to those astounding numbers.

It's a similar story on the conference level, with OSU winning 49 league titles as a team and Cowboy wrestlers combining to win 262 conference individual championships.

Furthermore, every four years, the O, S and U in Oklahoma State's name could easily be replaced by Olympic Stage University. Since 1924, 32 Oklahoma State wrestlers have fought their way to Olympic team membership a total of 41 times, with nine athletes winning a gold medal a total of 11 times.

From the individual perspective, any list of greatest wrestlers in NCAA history must include Oklahoma State's Yojiro Uetake, who was a perfect 57-0 with three NCAA titles and Pat Smith, who was the first four-time NCAA champion in history.

That list doesn't even include the accomplishments of Pat's older brother, John Smith, who was a two-time NCAA champion for the Cowboys and went on to win a staggering six world-level gold medals from 1987-92 or his OSU teammate, Kenny Monday, who won four world-level medals, including gold in 1988 and 1989.

All told, 26 members of the Cowboy wrestling program are Distinguished Members of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame and an additional 14 combined to earn Outstanding Wrestler distinction at the NCAA Championships a total of 15 times (Uetake took home the honor twice in 1965 and 1966).

A contributing factor to Oklahoma State wrestlers performing as well as they have over the years is the elite level of coaching that has taken - and continues to - take place in the Cowboy wrestling room on a daily basis.

Ed Gallagher is credited with the title of Father of Intercollegiate Wrestling. He launched Oklahoma State into a dominant position within the sport by coaching the Cowboys to 11 NCAA titles from 1928-1940. His impact on the sport is still felt today.

He was followed by Art Griffith and his eight NCAA titles, then by Myron Roderick and his seven crowns. Tommy Chesbro and Joe Seay combined to win three NCAA titles before John Smith took over and rattled off five NCAA titles and counting.

Dating back to the inception of the NCAA Wrestling Championships in 1928, every Oklahoma State head coach has led the Cowboys to at least one NCAA title and Gallagher, Griffith, Roderick, Seay and John Smith have all served as coaches for Team USA at either the Olympics or the World Championships.

In 1917, Gallagher delivered the first dual match win in OSU wrestling history and in 2011, John Smith led the Cowboys to their 1,000th dual match triumph. In between those landmark wins, OSU won better than 89 percent of its duals all-time to further its stranglehold as the gold standard in college wrestling.

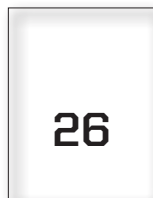

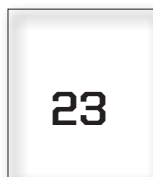

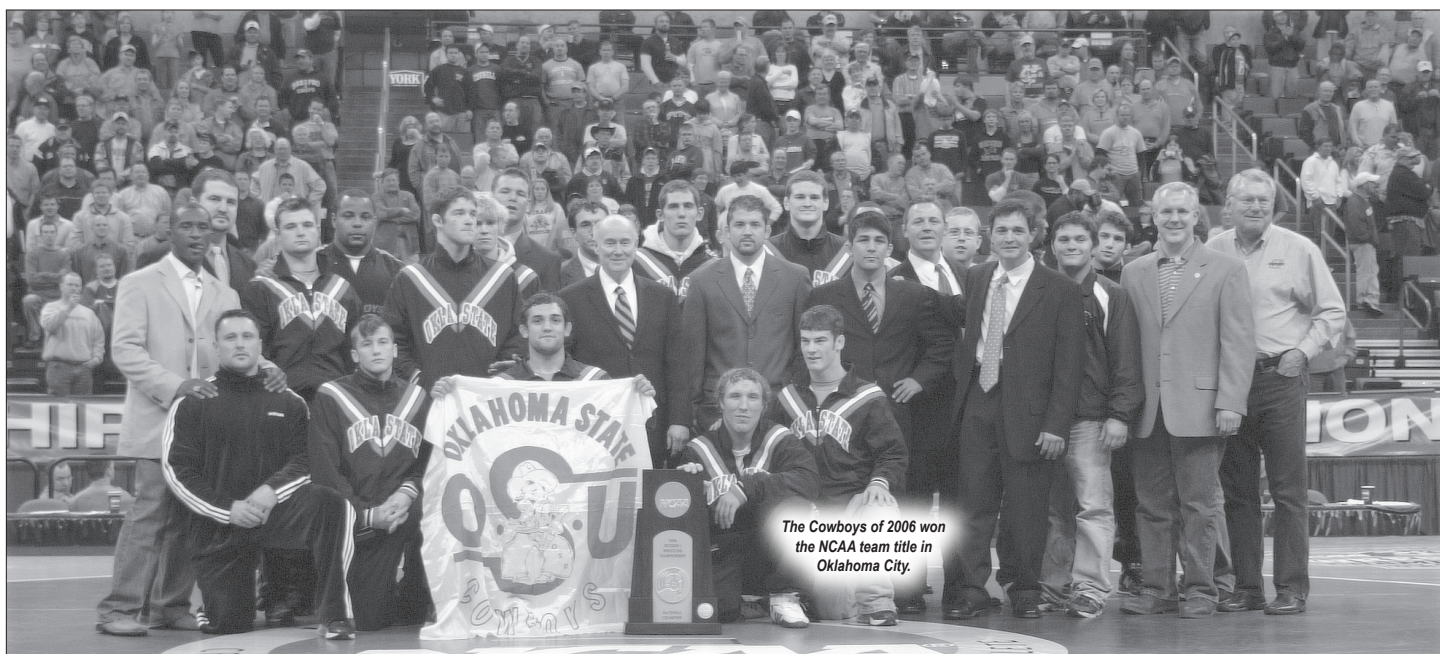

Oklahoma State has finished first as a team 34 times at the NCAA Wrestling Championships, including a tie in 1933. The NCAA did not keep team points in 1928 and 1930-33; therefore, the team championships are considered "unofficial" by the governing body during those years. The Cowboys have finished second 11 times and third 11 times. At least one individual champion has been from Oklahoma State in 65 of the 83 NCAA tournaments. 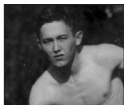
NCAA OUTSTANDING WRESTLERS



ALAN KELLY

1933 // 145 pounds

Alan Kelley capped a perfect 10-0 1933 season by storming to wins over Franklin&Marshall's Cassell in the first round of the NCAA Championships and Lehigh's B. Bishop in the second round. In the championship match, Kelley pinned Southwestern Oklahoma's F. Stout at the 12:12 mark to claim the 1933 NCAA Championship and earn Outstanding Wrestler honors. The next season, Kelley went 10-0 yet again and won his second NCAA Championship. Of his 10 wins in 1934, seven came by fall.



ROSS FLOOD

1935 // 126 pounds

Ross Flood compiled a 31-1 overall record in three years at Oklahoma State, capped by a perfect 11-0 mark in 1935 that was highlighted by a win by fall over Southwestern Oklahoma's Gott in the NCAA Championship match. Flood pinned his opponent in three of his four matches at the 1935 NCAA Championships en route to earning Outstanding Wrestler recognition. Flood won the final 27 matches of his career, with 17 of those victories coming by fall. He went on to win the silver medal at the 1936 Berlin Olympics.



STANLEY HENSON

1937 // 145 pounds

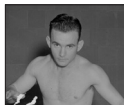
Stanley Henson was recognized as the Outstanding Wrestler at the 1937 NCAA Championships. He pinned his first opponent, Doolittle of Lafayette at the 3:17 mark, then came back to pick up another win by fall in the second round when he pinned Iowa State's Linn at 6:45. A semifinal win over Chicago University's Finwall preceded Henson's NCAA Championship-winning match over Illinois' McIlvoy. Henson compiled a 31-1 record during his three years at Oklahoma State that included wins in each of his final 29 bouts.



JOE MCDANIEL

1938 // 118 pounds

Joe McDaniel capped a perfect 1938 season by earning Outstanding Wrestler accolades at the NCAA Championships that year. McDaniel won each of his three matches at NAAs that year, pinning Penn State's King at the 2:50 mark in his first match before winning by decision over Minnesota's Hanson in the semifinal and Indiana's Duffy in the championship match. McDaniel started his OSU career by losing two of his first three bouts. He didn't lose again after that, rattling off 27 consecutive wins to finish out his career.



AL WHITEHURST

1941 // 136 pounds

Al Whitehurst was tabbed as the Outstanding Wrestler at the 1941 NCAA Championships after picking up four wins, two of which came by fall. Whitehurst claimed a 6-2 win over Michigan State's Maxwell in the championship match to cap a 1941 season in which he put together a perfect 10-0 record. Whitehurst finished his two-year OSU career with a 19-1 overall record, with his lone setback a 1-0 overtime defeat in his first season.



DAVID ARNDT

1942 // 145 pounds

David Arndt never lost a match during his three-year career at Oklahoma State, stringing together a 23-0 career mark. A three-time NCAA champion, he was honored as the Outstanding Wrestler after

storming through the 1942 NCAA Championships. Arndt picked up a healthy 13-3 win over Nebraska's Stout in his first match at NAAs before replicating that score with a 13-3 wipeout of Rutgers' Paterno in his second match. Arndt pinned Cornell's Ellison at the 7:36 mark of the semifinal match before romping to an 18-5 win over Michigan's Johnson in the championship match.



CHARLES HETRICK

1949 // 128 pounds

Charles Hetrick earned Outstanding Wrestler honors at the 1949 NCAA Championships. Hetrick finished his perfect 12-0 campaign that year by picking up a 6-2 win over Virginia Military's Perry in the first round. He pinned Colorado's Korbatsch at the 5:40 mark in the second round before claiming a 4-2 win over Northern Iowa's Bush in the semifinal. The championship match resulted in a 4-1 Hetrick win over Cornell's Thomsen.



YOJIRO UETAKE

1965 and 1966 // 133 pounds

Just one year after winning the gold medal for his native Japan in the 1964 Tokyo Olympics, Yojiro Uetake took the mat for Oklahoma State and rolled to Outstanding Wrestler honors at the 1965 NCAA Championships. Uetake won each of his five matches at NAAs that year, highlighted by a 6-1 win over Lehigh's Peritore in the championship match. His closest match at the 1965 NAAs was a 5-3 semifinal win over Michigan State's Behm. He became the first Cowboy ever to be named Outstanding Wrestler at the NCAA Championships twice when he secured that recognition in 1966 after steamrolling to five one-sided victories. Uetake pinned Lehigh's Peritore at the 4:31 mark of the championship match to cap a dominating run through the NCAA Championships in which he won his bouts by scores of 12-4, 11-2, 18-3 and 11-2. Uetake finished his collegiate career with a 57-0 record before going on to claim his second Olympic gold medal at the 1968 Mexico City Olympics.



DWAYNE KELLER

1968 // 123 pounds

Dwayne Keller was honored as the Outstanding Wrestler at the 1968 NCAA Championships after picking up a series of hard-fought victories in each of his final three matches. Keller started his run with a 12-5 victory over UCLA's Vallance, then pinned Army's Patton. A pair of one-point wins over Indiana State's Parker (5-4) and SUNY-Cortland's DeSario (3-2) ensued, putting Keller into the championship match, where he claimed a 4-2 win over Portland State's Sanders. Keller won three NCAA championships during his freshman, sophomore and junior seasons at OSU and lost in the championship bout his senior year. He compiled a 64-1 record during his time at Oklahoma State.



DARRELL KELLER

1971 // 142 pounds

Darrell Keller claimed Outstanding Wrestler honors at the 1971 NCAA Championships after claiming the second of his two national titles. Keller stomped his first two opponents to the tune of a 6-0 win over Stanford's Thomas and an 8-0 win over Western Michigan's Bacon. Keller's semifinal match against Navy's Keaser was a classic, with Keller claiming an overtime win to set up a 16-12 victory over Washington's Owings in the championship match.



MIKE SHEETS

1983 // 167 pounds

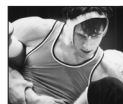
Mike Sheets went a perfect 29-0 in 1983 and was honored as the Outstanding Wrestler of the NCAA Championships that year after dominating the competition. Sheets started his run by romping to a 29-2 win over St. Lawrence's Todd Northrup in the first round before crushing Portland State's Kevin Benson, 14-0 in the second round. Sheets beat Illinois State's Mike Jones, 6-0 in the quarterfinal before handing Nebraska's Ray Oliver a 5-1 defeat in the semis. A convincing 14-0 win over Navy's John Reich put a cap on Sheets' impressive performance.



JOHN SMITH

1987 // 134 pounds

Just one year after winning the first of his U.S. Freestyle National Championships and claiming gold at the Goodwill Games in Moscow and well on his way toward establishing himself as the best wrestler in the world, John Smith was recognized as the Outstanding Wrestler at the 1987 NCAA Championships. Smith crushed the opposition at NAAs that year, pinning Drexel's Tim Rothka at the 6:30 mark in his first-round match before rolling to a 23-8 technical fall win over Michigan State's Dan Matauch in the second round. Smith made it two technical fall victories in a row when he handed Lehigh's Jim Frick a 22-7 beating in the third round. A 20-9 semifinal win over Ohio's Rob Johnson set up a rematch with Nebraska's Gil Sanchez for the national title. Sanchez handed Smith his only loss of the year in Smith's first match of the regular season. Smith avenged that loss with an 18-4 pounding of Sanchez for the crown.



CHRIS BARNES

1990 // 177 pounds

Chris Barnes secured NCAA Outstanding Wrestler honors in 1990 after storming through the competition. Barnes pinned Duke's Keith Girvan at the 6:31 mark in the first round before picking up technical fall wins over North Carolina's Ben Oberly (19-4) and Rider's John Hangey (22-7) in the second and third rounds, respectively. William & Mary's Rob Larmore suffered a 14-8 defeat at the hands of Barnes in the semifinals before Barnes put a cap on his run to the NCAA crown with a 10-2 major decision victory over Minnesota's Marty Morgan in the championship match.



PAT SMITH

1994 // 158 pounds

The only four-time national champion in Oklahoma State's illustrious history, Pat Smith earned Outstanding Wrestler honors his senior year at the 1994 NCAA Championships. Smith won by technical fall in each of his first two matches at NAAs that year, claiming a 23-8 win over Kent State's Jim Andrassy in the first round before disposing of Nebraska's Jason Kraft by a 26-10 spread in the second round. Smith beat Oregon State's Dan Alar by a 14-3 major decision before moving on to the semifinals, where he beat Boston University's Earl Walker, 6-2. Smith was crowned with his fourth NCAA championship when he beat Michigan's Sean Bormet, 5-3 in the championship match.
