### Oklahoma State

Oklahoma State returns to action this weekend with a pair of matches against in-state foes. On Friday, the Cowgirls travel to Norman to square off against Bedlam-rival Oklahoma in a non-conference showdown in what will mark the first of two meetings with the Soooners this season. Sunday marks OSU's 2016 home opener when the Cowgirls host Oral Roberts at the Cowgirl Soccer Complex. Both OSU matches this weekend kick off at 7 p.m.

OSU is 1-0-1 on the year after a season-opening weekend on the road that saw it tie Georgia Friday night by a 2-2 count before defeating Mercer, 3-0, on Sunday. The Cowgirls are coming off a 2015 season in which they compiled a 9-9-2 record and finsihed eighth in the Big 12 Conference standings with a 2-4-2 mark.

The Cowgirls return seven starters and 18 letterwinners from last season, including a pair of three-time All-Big 12 performers in forward Courtney Dike and defender Natalie Calhoun.

The 2016 season marks the 21st in the history of the OSU women's soccer program. Over their first 20 seasons, the Cowgirls compiled a 238-141-44 (.615) record, and head coach Colin Carmichael entered his 12th season at the helm with a 155-61-31 mark. The Cowgirls have earned a berth in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship in eight of the last 10 years and have claimed Big 12 titles in four of the last eight seasons.

### **About The Opponents**

Oklahoma is also 1-0-1 on the season after opening its season at home last week. The Sooners tied 24th-ranked South Carolina, 1-1, in the season opener before toppling No. 25 Loyola Marymount by a 4-1 margin on Sunday.

OSU owns a 20-6-3 record in the all-time series against OU. The Sooners won both games last season, claiming a 2-0 victory in the non-conference game in Stillwater and a 2-1 Big 12 win in Norman.

Oral Roberts went 1-1-0 on opening weekend, beating Arkansas-Pine Bluff 3-0 in the opener and dropping a 1-0 match to North Texas two days later. The Golden Eagles face Abilene Christian on the road Friday before coming to Stillwater. OSU is 11-2-0 all time against ORU and has won nine-straight meetings, including an 8-0 victory last year in Stillwater.

## Colin Carmichael

## Head Coach, 12th Season

Carmichael has been at OSU since the inception of the women's soccer program in the fall of 1996, and he continues to help lead Cowgirl soccer to new heights and a spot among the nation's elite.

OSU is in the midst of the most successful stretch of seasons in program history as the program enters its 21st year in what will mark Carmichael's 12th season as head coach

Carmichael, who served as OSU's co-head coach with Karen Hancock during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, enters the 2016 season with a 155-61-31 career record in 11 seasons as the Cowgirls' head coach, compiling a winning percentage of .690. He has led the Cowgirls to eight appearances in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship, including six straight from 2006-11, and after advancing to the second round of the NCAA tourney four-straight years, the Cowgirls made back-to-back trips to the Elite Eight in 2010 and 2011.

The Cowgirls have also been a dominant force in the Big 12 Conference under Carmichael as they captured four consecutive league titles from 2008-11. OSU won the regular season title in 2008 and Big 12 Soccer Championship titles in 2009 and 2010 before claiming another regular season championship in 2011.

Carmichael has guided OSU to a 12-5-3 record and four finals appearances at the Big 12 Championship and a 9-5-4 record in NCAA tourney play.

### **WINNING IS A HABIT**

The 2016 season marks the 21st in the OSU program's history and over those two-plus decades, the program has been built into an established winner.

- OSU has earned a berth in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship eight of the last 10 years (beginning in 2006).
- From 2006-11, the Cowgirls earned six-straight NCAA tourney bids and advanced to at least the second round each time, including back-to-back Elite Eight appearances in 2010 and 2011.
- From 2008-11, OSU celebrated four consecutive Big 12 championships two regular season (2008, '11) and two tournament ('09, '10).
- In 2011, OSU set a school record with 22 wins. The Cowgirls finished the '11 regular season 17-0-2, joining the 1996 Nebraska team as the only Big 12 Conference teams in history to go unbeaten during the regular season. OSU was 6-0-2 in conference play to claim its second regular-season Big 12 title and in doing so became the first Big 12 team since Texas A&M in 2002 to complete the league schedule without a loss.

### **BACK IN THE SADDLE**

OSU returns seven players who started at least 10 games during the 2015 season. Of the 16 returning letterwinners, 14 are field players, and that group combined for 24 of the Cowgirls' 36 goals a year ago, as well as 18 of its 23 assists.

### PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATIONS

In preseason voting by the league's head coaches, OSU was picked to finish fifth in the Big 12 Conference standings behind four-time defending league champion West Virginia, Texas Tech, Oklahoma and Baylor. A pair of Cowgirls — forward Courtney Dike and defender Natalie Calhoun — were named to the Preseason All-Big 12 team.

### **HOME SWEET HOME**

The Cowgirls were 6-2-2 on their home field in 2016. OSU is 70-11-9 (.828) at the Cowgirl Soccer Complex since 2008 and is 128-35-16 (.760) all time on its current home turf.

### **DYNAMIC DUO**

Natalie Calhoun and Courtney Dike are already in rare company and could join an elite list in 2016. Both Cowgirls have earned All-Big 12 Second Team honors three times, making them two of only seven OSU players to be named all-conference three times in a career. Only two Cowgirls — Yolanda Odenyo and AD Franch — have achieved All-Big 12 status four times

## R-E-S-P-E-C-T

Prior to the season, *TopDrawerSoccer.com* released its list of the Top 100 players in women's college soccer, a list that ranks sophomores, juniors and seniors. A pair of Cowgirls made the list as Courtney Dike was ranked No. 73 while Natalie Calhoun checked in at No. 82.

### **MILESTONE FOR CARMICHAEL**

Oklahoma State head coach Colin Carmichael recorded career win No. 150 on Sept. 18, 2015, against Arizona State. Now in his 12th season as the Cowgirls' head coach, Carmichael has been on the OSU coaching staff since the program's inception in 1996.

### **NEW FACES**

Twelve newcomers joined the OSU roster in 2016, and the group includes 10 freshmen, a sophomore transfer and a junior college transfer.

Six different newcomers earned starting roles on opening weekend — defenders Elise Hawn and Charmé Morgan and midfielders Julia Lenhardt and Coumba Sow started the opener at Georgia, while Lenhardt, Sow, Claire Gantzer and Jaci Jones were in the starting 11 at Mercer. All told, nine newcomers made their OSU debuts on opening weekend.

## SHE SHOOTS, SHE SCORES

Courtney Dike quickly established herself as a prolific scorer at the collegiate level as a freshman in 2013, and she has continued that scoring production throughout her career for the Cowgirls.

The forward from Edmond, Okla., ranked second in the Big 12 in 2013 with 13 goals and 30 points and earned All-Big 12 Second Team and All-Newcomer Team honors. Her 13 goals tied for the fourth most in a single season in OSU history, three shy of Yolanda Odenyo's record 16, while her 30 points was the eighth highest single-season total all time.

Dike recorded three two-goal performances — vs. Vanderbilt, Oklahoma and Missouri State — which marked the most multi-goal games by a Cowgirl since 2010, and of her 58 shots, 30 of those (52 percent) were on goal. She was named the Big 12 Offensive Player and Newcomer of the Week on two occasions in 2013.

In 2014, Dike recorded three goals, two of them game winners, and three assists in 19 games. As a juninor, she ranked in the top six in the Big 12 in goals (5), assists (7) and points (17), and her two goals on opening weekend this season tie her atop the conference.



# COWGIRL SOCCER BY THE NUMBERS

### **CLIMBING THE CHARTS**

Courtney Dike scored a pair of goals on opening weekend of the 2016 season and ranks 10th on OSU's career goals list with 23. She needs five goals to move into the top five, while the all-time record is 35 and held by a pair of Cowgirls — Yolanda Odenvo and Jolene Schweitzer.

Dike also ranks 10th on OSU's all-time charts with 60 career points, and with 14 career assists, she needs just one more to move into OSU's all-time top 10 in that category.

Junior goalie Michela Ongaro is also among OSU's all-time statistical leaders in the net. The Wisconsin native and former walk-on is fourth on the Cowgirls' career charts with a 1.04 goals against average, and she is sixth in both career shutouts (9) and saves (121).

### THE BIGGEST STAGE

Courtney Dike is one of a select few collegiate players who can boast of having played in a Women's World Cup.

Dike earned a pair of caps for Nigeria at the 2015 FIFA Women's World Cup in Canada. Her first came as a reserve in a match against Australia, and in the Super Falcons' final tourney game, Dike was in the starting lineup against the eventual champion United States. She played 50 minutes against the U.S. before subbing out early in the second half.

Dike concluded her first trip to the Women's World Cup playing 56 minutes and recording one shot. Nigeria finished 0-2-1 at the tourney and failed to advance out of Group D.

The experience was historic as Dike became the first OSU player to participate in a World Cup and also the first-ever Oklahoman to compete in a Women's World Cup.

In 2014, Dike was a member of the Nigeria U-20 Women's National Team at the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup. That trip proved highly successful, though it meant OSU was without its top scorer for the first two games of 2014.

During that tourney, Dike helped the Falconets into the U-20 World Cup final, where they dropped a 1-0 decision to Germany. A starter at forward throughout most of the tourney, Dike recorded a pair of goals in six games. In pool play against South Korea, she scored the fastest goal in FIFA Women's World Cup history as she found the back of the net just 18 seconds into the match, and she scored a goal 64 seconds into the semifinal match against North Korea to help Nigeria advance to the final.

Dike's parents, Vincent and Jacinta, are natives of Nigeria, and her older brother, Bright, is on the country's men's national team.

### HER DEFENSE NEVER RESTS

Natalie Calhoun has been an anchor at defender since arriving on campus in 2013. The center back has played in all 64 of OSU's games during her career and been a starter in 63 of those, and she has ranked either first or second in minutes played among field players each of her first three seasons. The lone game she in which she was not in the starting lineup was the season opener her freshman season.

A three-time All-Big 12 Second Team performer, Calhoun has played a part in 20 shutouts during her career.

### **BIG 12'S BEST**

After recording a pair of goals on opening weekend, Courtney Dike was named the first Big 12 Conference Offensive Player of the Week for the 2016 season.

In Friday's season opener against Georgia, Dike's goal in the 62nd minute gave OSU its first lead of the contest, and on Sunday against Mercer, she scored just 72 seconds into the match to help the Cowgirls record their first win of the season. Dike finished the weekend with six shots, three of those on goal, in 158 minutes of action.

This marks the fifth time in Dike's career she has been recognized with a Big 12 weekly award.
