OKLAHOMA STATE UNDER KENNY GAJEWSKI

► Gajewski's 70 wins during his first two years in Stillwater are the most by an Oklahoma State softball head coach in his or her first two seasons in team history.

► At OSU, has overseen 22 Academic All-Big 12 selections, as well as two Academic All-District and two Academic All-America honors.

► Has coached seven All-Region selections, seven All-Big 12 honorees. Among the All-Big 12 selections is the 2016 Big 12 Player of the Year, Vanessa Shippy, who has also earned All-America honors in each of the past two seasons under Gajewski's tutelage.

► Led the Cowgirls to their first victory over a No. 1 opponent since 2011 when OSU defeated top-ranked Florida, 1-0, in Gainesville to advance to the regional championship game.

► Guided the Cowgirls to 12 wins in the Big 12 Conference in 2017 - the squad's most since also winning 12 during the 2010 campaign. OSU's third-place finish in the Big 12 was also its highest since finishing third in 2010.

► Gajewski's Cowgirls have been selected to the NCAA Tournament in each of his first two seasons, and on both occasions his team advanced to the winner-take-all regional championship game.

► During his tenure at Oklahoma State, the Cowgirls have broken 12 individual single-season records and 10 team single-season records.

THE BASICS

The Oklahoma State softball team opens the 2018 season at the Kajikawa Classic in Tempe, Arizona, where the Cowgirls will face five of the nation's best teams over a three-day stretch. OSU's five opponents in the southwest will be: Oregon State, No. 7/7 Arizona, Missouri, New Mexico and Western Michigan.

IN THE RANKINGS

Oklahoma State is ranked No. 21 in the *ESPN.com/USA Softball* 2018 Preseason Top 25 and No. 24 in the *USA Today/NFCA Coaches* Preseason Poll, marking the first time that the Cowgirls will enter a season ranked since 2011. The No. 21 ranking is four spots higher than the Cowgirls' No. 25 finish in the *ESPN.com/USA Softball* rankings last season.

OSU's ranking could also be a good omen for this year's squad, as the previously mentioned 2011 team was the last group of Cowgirls to compete in the Women's College World Series. Overall, this is the third time since 2000 that the Pokes have been ranked to start the season.

OSU AND THE KAJIKAWA CLASSIC

Oklahoma State has competed in the Kajikawa Classic three times throughout its history, doing so in 2008, 2009 and 2011. The Cowgirls found plenty of success in the desert, as they racked up an 11-3 record during their three trips to Arizona. Included in that success was a 3-2 win over No. 15 Washington in 2008 and a 1-0 victory over No. 11 Stanford in 2009. The comparisons to the 2011 OSU squad that advanced to the Women's College World Series continue with the Kajikawa Classic, as that year's group of Cowgirls and this year's squad both began, or will begin, the season in the American Southwest.

OKLAHOMA STATE FROM A DISTANCE

Oklahoma State enters the 2018 season with a genuine buzz surrounding the program. Much of that has to do with a highly-successful first two years under head coach Kenny Gajewski, as well as a large crop of returning and new talent among the squad this season.

OSU was one of the best team's in the nation at getting on base last season, doing so at a .396 clip. That trend figures to remain a fixture of the team's success in 2018, as much of last year's core returns in this season's lineup. Senior Vanessa Shippy, who owns OSU's career on-base percentage record (.502), will lead the line once again as she looks to cement her place among the all-time great Cowgirls.

Along with Shippy, Oklahoma State's lineup will feature stars like Taylor Lynch, Madi Sue Montgomery, Randee O'Donnell and a host of other top-notch competitors. Among the 13 returners this year, OSU brings more than 75 percent of its total number of at-bats from a season ago (1,219-1,592 AB). That percentage grows when you look strictly at the number of hits that still reside in Stillwater from a season ago (77 pct./355-458 H).

The Cowgirl defense and pitching staff also looks to be improved in 2017. With seven of the eight everyday position starters returning to the field this year, along with a revamped pitching staff, OSU looks like a squad that will be able to keep the opposition's bats in check. This year's group of pitchers is made up of three transfers - Samantha Clakley, Emmie Robertson and Kendal Judge - as well as two returners - Logan Simunek and Whitney Whitehorn.

GAJEWSKI AHEAD OF THE KAJIKAWA CLASSIC

On the upcoming season:

"I wish it was Friday, to be honest. This team has prepared very well throughout this whole spring camp, and I'm just ready for them to just go out and play and see how we match up with some of the best teams in the country. That's all that's on my mind right now."

On what he wants to see from Friday's doubleheader:

"Competitiveness. I want to see us fight and see the things that we talk about. I'm ready to see the growth from year one to year two to year three. I think that's what we're about - continuing to grow each year. These kids are ready and I can see it. This is as far as we've been along at this point - we're as far along to start a year as we've ever been - in my time here. I know it's not a lot of time, but it's our third year and they're ready to go. This is the first time I've felt like that. It's the first time I'm tired of watching us scrimmage against each other and to me that tells me that we're ready. I can see it in these kids' eyes and I can see it all week. The mentality has been even better than its been and I think that's just because it's game week and we're finally there."

NOTABLE STREAKS AND TRENDS ENTERING THE TOURNAMENT

- ▶ Oklahoma State has won 25 of its 44 neutral-site invitational games during Kenny Gajewski's two-year tenure as head coach.
- ▶ OSU is 28-16 in games decided by two runs or less since the start of the 2016 season.
- ▶ Vanessa Shippy has tallied 148 hits to only 40 strikeouts over the past two seasons.
- ▶ Rylee Bayless has drawn at least one walk in 13 of her last 17 games.
- ▶ Vanessa Shippy has recorded 14 hits over her last 14 games played.
- ▶ Vanessa Shippy enters the 2018 season having started 173 consecutive games. She has started every game through her junior season and is OSU's most experienced player on the field this year.
- ▶ Vanessa Shippy has reached base in seven straight games dating back to the Cowgirls' win over Iowa State on May 12, 2017 in the Big 12 Championship tournament.
- ▶ Madi Sue Montgomery has started 121 consecutive games entering this season. Like Shippy, she has started every possible contest during her OSU career. Last season, she was one of three Cowgirls to start a record-setting 63 games, doing so despite offseason knee surgery that forced her to miss the entire fall season.
- ▶ Rylee Bayless has started 63 consecutive games at Oklahoma State - the third-longest active streak among the Cowgirls to start the season.
- ▶ OSU has committed just 12 errors over its last 26 games dating back to April 7, 2017. The Cowgirls did not commit an error during the final six games of the season and only once during the 26-game stretch did they commit more than one error in a game.
- ▶ OSU has finished with a .500-or-above record in its first invitational tournament in nine of the past 11 seasons, dating back to 2007. That includes a 3-1 mark during the 2009 Kajikawa Classic and a 4-1 mark at the Arizona-based tournament in 2011.

Team and Player Notes

WIN INDICATORS

There are many things that factor into a team's ability to win a game, but a look at the trends during Kenny Gajewski's short tenure at Oklahoma State shows that simply out-hitting opponents and grabbing an early lead are two of the biggest predictors of an OSU victory.

Since the start of the 2016 season, when the Cowgirls out-hit their opponents, they are 50-5 (90.9 pct.). The inverse is true when the opponent tallies more hits, as OSU has gone 15-42 (26.3 pct.) in those instances.

Grabbing an early lead has also been a key part of Gajewski's ability to turn the program around. In his two years at the helm, OSU is 39-6 when leading after the game's first two innings. The Cowgirls' winning percentage only rises as the game goes on. Last season, they went 28-0 when leading after three innings, an unblemished mark which followed up on a 25-2 record when leading after three innings in 2016.

COWGIRLS IN CLOSE GAMES

One of the best marks of a great program is finding a way to win when the game is close at the end. Under Kenny Gajewski, the Cowgirls have been excellent during these situations.

In 2017, OSU posted an impressive 15-6 mark in games decided by two runs or less. That includes winning six of the final eight close games throughout the regular and postseasons. When looking at Gajewski's tenure as a whole, the Cowgirls are 28-16 in games decided by two runs or less since the start of the 2016 season.

DEFENDING THEIR TURF

Oklahoma State's 32-10 record at Cowgirl Stadium over the past two seasons is indicative of its success during the brief tenure of head coach Kenny Gajewski. But what makes the record even more impressive is that the Cowgirls posted a 9-2 mark at home during Big 12 Conference action last season. All nine wins were a result of three-game sweeps of Kansas, Texas and Texas Tech. OSU's nine home victories in league play was tied with Baylor for the most by a Big 12 squad in 2017, while no other team in the league posted more than six wins on their respective home field. COWGIRLS SLOTTED FOURTH BY BIG 12 COACHES

The Oklahoma State softball team was voted to finish fourth in the Big 12 Conference in 2018, marking the third time the Cowgirls have been selected fourth since the poll's inception in 2000. It is the second straight year that OSU has been selected to finish fourth by the league's coaches.

Head coach Kenny Gajewski and the Cowgirls are coming off a third-place finish last season that saw them record sweeps of Kansas, Texas and Texas Tech. The Pokes also picked up two wins over Iowa State and one over Baylor.

OSU earned 23 points in the preseason poll, but was edged out by Oklahoma (36), Baylor (31) and Texas (24). The fourth-place selection is tied for OSU's highest-ever ranking in the league's preseason poll.

WEEK ONE TALKING POINTS - BATTING

► Runs became scarce for all teams down the stretch in 2017, but the Cowgirls were still able to bring home runners at key moments in several contests. Against Baylor in the first game of the reinstated Big 12 Championship, OSU pushed two runs across the plate in the third inning to take the first lead of the game. The

Cowgirls held on to win, 2-1. They did the same against FIU in the opening game of the NCAA Gainesville Regional, only this time OSU pushed its runs across in the sixth inning to win 2-0. The clutch hits continued in the regional when Vanessa Shippy delivered an RBI double to help the Cowgirls topple No. 1 Florida, 1-0, on the Gators' home field.

► Led by Rylee Bayless and Vanessa Shippy, Oklahoma State ranked No. 20 nationally in on-base percentage with a .396 clip last year. The Cowgirls' average was the second-highest single-season mark in team history, trailing only the 2016 squad's .408 mark. Bayless (.530) and Shippy (.517) were the anchors of OSU's impressive on-base performance, as they ranked 15th and 24th in the nation, respectively, last year.

► OSU has shown itself to be capable of scoring runs with anyone in the country, as the Cowgirls have scored at least seven runs on 46 different occasions during head coach Kenny Gajewski's two years at the helm. Included in those showings were two 21-run performances, which is tied for the program's all-time single-game runs record. Oklahoma State is 39-7 in Gajewski's tenure when scoring at least seven runs.

► Already holding OSU's all-time on-base percentage mark, Vanessa Shippy has a chance to continue her assault on the program record book this season. She needs two walks to tie Tiffany Mikkelsen's OSU career record, and will also have a chance to top all other Cowgirls in: hits, runs scored, runs batted in, doubles and potentially total bases accumulated.

WEEK ONE TALKING POINTS - PITCHING & DEFENSE

► The 2018 campaign will mark the first official season for Jeff Cottrill as the Oklahoma State pitching coach. Cottrill has spent the past two years on head coach Kenny Gajewski's staff as the program's director of operations, but will step in to a new, albeit familiar, role this season with the pitchers. He previously served as the Cowgirls' pitching coach for a 30-day stretch of the 2016 season - his first at OSU - after former OSU pitching coach Charlotte Morgan took a leave of absence for health-related reasons.

► OSU's pitching staff will be a mixture of fresh and familiar faces, as three transfers and two returners make up the group of Cowgirls that will occupy the circle in 2018. Samantha Clakley, a junior transfer from UT Arlington, figures to be one of the group's key contributors despite being in her first season at OSU. Behind her, Emmie Robertson - a senior from Pittsburg State - and Kendal Judge - a sophomore from Minnesota - make up the trio of talented transfers. Whitney Whitehorn and Logan Simunek both return to Stillwater this year, and figure to also play key roles within the staff.

► While the pitching staff is loaded with new faces, the opposite is true for the defense, as OSU returns seven of its eight position starters in 2018. Included in that group is the entire starting infield and two outfielders. Last year's squad was one of the best defensively in the Big 12, and that figures to remain a strong point of success for Oklahoma State in 2018.

► The Cowgirls have undergone a shuffle among the returning fielders, as Rylee Bayless transitions from third base to left field and Vanessa Shippy steps out from behind the plate to primarily cover the hot corner in 2018. Shippy's move leaves the catcher spot to be manned by Mackenzie Thomas and Raquel Dominguez.

THREE-HEADED ATTACK

Oklahoma State returns one of the most dynamic offensive trios in the Big 12 this season, as only the Cowgirls' in-state rival Oklahoma returns three players with similar numbers to what Rylee Bayless, Taylor Lynch and Vanessa Shippy combined to put up a season ago. AMONG THE NATION'S ELITE: VANESSA SHIPPY

Vanessa Shippy is one of 50 nominees named to the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year watch list as well as a College Sports Madness 2018 Preseason All-American (First Team - Utility). She has been the anchor in Oklahoma State's lineup throughout the past three seasons, starting in 173 of a possible 173 games during that time. In that span, the Cowgirls have won 91 games, including 70 over the past two years.

Shippy currently owns no fewer than six school records, including career on-base percentage, single-season games played and runs scored, among others. She is also currently on pace or has a chance to match or surpass several Oklahoma State career records this season, including most total games played, started, hits, runs scored, doubles and walks, among others.

Shippy has been the recipient of numerous awards throughout her Oklahoma State career. She has twice been named both an All-American and Academic All-American, making her the first player in team history to

TOURNAMENT NOTES

BAYLESS ON BASE

Rylee Bayless returns to Oklahoma State this season after smashing the OSU record with 71 walks in 2017. Her mark was good enough to lead the nation in both total walks and walks per game, making her the fourth Cowgirl to earn the title of NCAA statistical champion. She fell two walks shy of tying Taylor Hoagland's (Texas) Big 12 record, which was set in 2013.

This year, Bayless has positioned herself well to climb to the top of OSU's career walks list. She currently ranks 11th in program history with her 71 walks drawn while competing for the Cowgirls. With another solid season, Bayless could be the third player in team history to draw at least 100 bases on ball, and could wind up at or near the top of the program's all-time record.

A PROGRAM BUILT ON TRADITION

The Oklahoma State softball program is one rooted in tradition that stems back to the team's inception in the 1970s. Among its most notable feats, OSU currently ranks in the top 15 for all-time appearances at the Women's College World Series. A look at the list:
