OKLAHOMA STATE SIGNING CLASS JUDGED AS BEST OF GUNDY ERA THE CLASS FEATURES 14 DEFENSIVE PLAYERS AND 11 OFFENSIVE PLAYERS

STILLWATER – Oklahoma State football coach Mike Gundy announced the signing of 25 student-athletes to national letters of intent. According to Rivals, this is the highest-ranked recruiting class Gundy has attracted to Stillwater since taking over as head coach in 2005.

The class features 14 defensive players and 11 offensive players, with the Cowboys addressing a specific area of need by signing five offensive linemen. The two most well-represented states in the class are Texas, with 13 signees and Oklahoma, with seven signees. There are 21 high school players in the class and four junior college products.

Included in the class are quarterback Spencer Sanders (Denton, TX/Ryan), receiver C.J. Moore (Tulsa, OK/Union) and defensive back Sean Michael Flanagan (Charleston, AR/Charleston).

A highly-regarded quarterback with the ability to do damage as both a passer and a runner, Sanders capped his senior season by being selected as the Gatorade Texas Player of the Year as well as Mr. Texas Football by Dave Campbell's Texas Football Magazine. He passed for 3,845 yards and 54 touchdowns and rushed for 1,380 yards and 16 touchdowns as a senior.

Considered the best wide receiver in the Oklahoma prep ranks and one of the state's best overall players, regardless of position, Moore chose Oklahoma State over reported offers from Alabama, Ohio State, Georgia, Texas and several other traditional programs.

Rivals rated Flanagan as the No. 1 overall player in Arkansas, regardless of position. The Cowboys were able to pry him away from the in-state Razorbacks late in the recruiting process.

Flanagan is one of five members of the class who enrolled in January, joining offensive lineman Hunter Anthony, linebacker Blake Barron, defensive back Jarrick Bernard and tight end Jake Ross. Additionally, it should be noted that receiver Patrick McKaufman is already on campus.

TUTTLE, OKLA./TUTTLE

Ranked as a three-star prospect by 247Sports, ESPN and Rivals ... Helped his team compete in the Oklahoma Class 4A state playoffs in three of his seasons at Tuttle High School ... ESPN ranks him as the No. 59 offensive tackle prospect in the country ESPN, 247Sports and Rivals all list him as a top-20 prospect in Oklahoma, at Nos. 11, 14 and 17, respectively.

High School: Played for coach Brad Ballard at Tuttle ... Helped lead his team to three state playoff appearances, including a trip to the quarterfinals in 2016 ... Despite falling in the quarterfinals, Tuttle finished 11-1 and 7-0 in district play in 2016, thanks in part to Anthony anchoring the offensive line ... Led an offensive line that helped Tuttle rush for 2,311 yards on 376 carries in 2016 ... The Tigers also averaged 6.1 yards per carry, racked up 192.6 yards per game on the ground and scored 27 total rushing touchdowns behind the Anthony-led offensive line ... Helped Tuttle rush for 272.4 yards per game as a sophomore ... Tuttle ended the 2015 season with 2,996 rushing yards on 512 carries, scoring 42 rushing touchdowns and finishing with a 10-1 record ... Was a 2017 Preseason All-State Selection by OKPreps ... A four-time academic state champion and a two-time all-district honoree ... Chose Oklahoma State over Oklahoma, Iowa State, Tulsa and Central Arkansas.

A physical linebacker that stood out within the Dallas-Fort Worth area during his high school career ... A three-star prospect according to ESPN, Rivals and 247Sports ... Ranked as a top-25 linebacker in this year's class by ESPN and Rivals, which slot him at No. 25 and No. 23, respectively ... Rivals rates him as the No. 88 player in the state of Texas this year.

High School: Coached by Rodney Webb at Rockwall High School ... Was a force at the inside linebacker position, as he racked up 104 total tackles as a senior ... 75 of his total tackles in 2017 were unassisted ... Also stuffed opposing offenses with 13.0 tackles for loss in 11 games played ... Constantly pressured opposing quarterbacks, collecting 15 quarterback hurries and five quarterback sacks, according to MaxPreps ... Aided Rockwall to a 10-4 season as a sophomore and helped the Yellowjackets make an appearance in the Class 6A D2 quarterfinals ... Also competed in wrestling and track and field, participating in the 200-meter dash and throwing competitions ... Posted a personal-best 24.56-second time during the 2017 Mesquite ISD Invitational ... Also recorded a 34' 1.75 personal-record shot put at the 2016 Mesquite Skeeter Relays and an 89' 3.5 discus throw at the 2016 Wylie East Nahum Martinez Invite ... ESPN, 247Sports and Rivals all have him ranked as a top-15 player in the state of Oklahoma, at Nos. 7, 10 and 14, respectively ... 247Sports has him listed as the No. 26 offensive guard in this year's recruiting class, while ESPN ranks him as the No. 30 player at his position.

High School: Played for coach Loren Montgomery at Bixby ... Won the Oklahoma Class 6A-II state championship in each of his first three seasons and finished as the state runner-up in 2017 ... 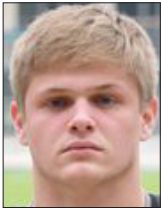

The next in a long line of Cibolo Steele High School graduates to play football at Oklahoma State, joining a group that includes safety Jordan Sterns and linebacker Ryan Simmons.

A four-star recruit by ESPN and Rivals, which also lists him as the No. 1 overall recruit in the state of Arkansas and as the No. 26 safety in the national class ... ESPN ranks him as the No. 32 safety in the class.

High School: Played both wide receiver and defensive back for coach Greg Kendrick at Charleston, finishing his high school career with nearly 5,000 all-purpose yards, 2,858 receiving yards, 1,318 return yards, 448 rushing yards, nearly 200 tackles, nine interceptions, 14 pass breakups and two blocked field goals ... Scored a total of 67 touchdowns and 432 points for Charleston ... Helped lead his team to a 12-1 finish as a senior, with the only loss coming in the state quarterfinals ... Finished his senior year with a team-bests at 1,476 all-purpose yards and 20 total touchdowns in just 10 games, including 826 receiving yards and 12 touchdowns on 41 catches, 212 rushing yards and six touchdowns on 37 carries, 268 kick return yards and two touchdowns on just six returns, and 150 yards on just four punt returns ... The next member of Oklahoma State's San Antonio-rooted pipeline, as he comes to Stillwater from William J. Brennan High School ... Rated as a three-star prospect by 247Sports, ESPN and Rivals ... ESPN rates him as the No. 48 running back in this year's class, while 247Sports puts him at No. 57.

High School: Coached by Stephen Basore at Brennan ... Rushed for 1,033 yards as a senior at Brennan and scored 16 touchdowns on the ground ... His 1,000-yard season was good for a 129.1 rushing yards per game average at the 2017 season's conclusion ... His senior season capped off an impressive high school career that saw him rush for 4,008 yards while also scoring 48 touchdowns over his final three season (16 each year) ... Racked up nine rushing touchdowns as a freshman, bringing his career total to 57 ... Also scored one receiving touchdown ... Rushed for 1,576 yards (131 YPG) as a junior ... 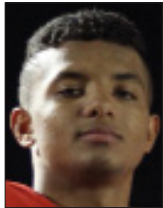

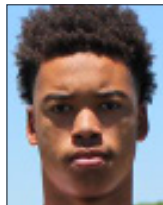

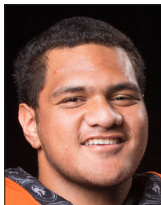
