The 2019-20 Oklahoma State wrestling lineup boasts returning All-Americans in Nick Piccininni, Dakota Geer, Boo Lewallen and Joe Smith, along with Big 12 champion Kaden

The Cowboys are coming off a perfect 15 win dual season. Those wins pushed coach John Smith to sixth place among NCAA Division I coaches with the most all-time dual wins.

At the Big 12 Championships in Tulsa, the Pokes claimed their seventh straight conference title and crowned six individual champions.

OSU wrapped up the year in Pittsburgh with a third-place finish at the NCAA Championships and five All-Americans.

MEDIA INFORMATION AND POLICIES

The Oklahoma State athletic communications office welcomes you to another season of Cowboy wrestling. The communications staff is here to assist members of the media in their coverage of Oklahoma State athletics. Please take a moment to become familiar with the following media policies.

CREDENTIALS

Members of the media should contact Emily Lingenfelter in the Oklahoma State media relations office to request credentials to OSU wrestling duals (emily.lingenfelter@okstate.edu or 405-744-3654). Credentials can be picked up at the southwest pass gate of Gallagher-Iba Arena on match days.

INTERVIEWS

Media interview requests for Oklahoma State head coach John Smith, assistant coaches and wrestlers should be directed to Emily Lingenfelter in the OSU media relations office. Coaches and wrestlers are typically available for interviews before practice starts on Tuesday (usually around 2:30 p.m. CT), but arrangements can be made to accommodate most schedules.

MEDIA PARKING

Members of the media attending duals at Gallagher-lba Arena should park in the lot just south of the arena and Boone Pickens Stadium. The entrance to the lot is off Knoblock Street. No parking pass is necessary for entry into the lot.

VISITING RADIO, PHONE LINES

Phone lines will be provided to the primary radio broadcast crews for both the Cowboys and the visiting team. Additional lines are available to the media on a first-come, first-served basis in the Gallagher-lba Arena media room.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Photographers may shoot from the east and west sides of the mat, but are prohibited from shooting in front of either team's bench. Photographers and videographers must stay seated while shooting to avoid obstructing fans' views.

COWBOYS ON THE AIR

Rex Holt and Roger Moore are in their 15th year together as the radio broadcast team of Oklahoma State Cowboy Wrestling. OSU wrestling can be heard on its primary home of 93.7 KSPI-FM radio in Stillwater. Occasional events are aired on 105.5 KGFY-FM radio or 780 AM radio Stillwater should programming conflicts arise. Any time the Cowboys are on the air, the live broadcast can also be accessed live on the official website of OSU athletics, www. okstate.com.

Head Coach | 29th Year | Oklahoma State, 1988

Smith begins his 29th season at Oklahoma State in 2019 after accepting the head coaching position at his alma mater in 1992. The accolades and accomplishments since that time are remarkable. In his 28 complete seasons heading the program, the Cowboys have claimed five NCAA team titles (1994, 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2006). He has coached 32 NCAA individual champions and five Olympians. Under his watch, the Cowboys have brought 19 team conference tournament championships, two Big 12 regular season titles and 120 individual conference titles back to Stillwater. His student-athletes have earnen All-America recognition 134 times, an average of 4.8 All-America honorees per year.

Nick Piccininni, Daton Fix and Kaden Gfeller each claimed wins over ranked opponents at 125, 133 and 149 pounds, respectively, before Chandler Rogers (165 pounds), Jacobe Smith (174 pounds) and Dakota Geer (184 pounds) won three-straight major decisions to separate the Cowboys from the Gophers for a comfortable dual win.

"I thought we did a good job as far as winning the second and third periods in some of those closer bouts," coach John Smith said. "Looking at the positives, we had Kaden Gfeller with a good win. It was a nice match to watch from a guy who had to bump up a weight with short notice.'

At 149 pounds, Gfeller stepped in for injured Boo Lewallen to upset No. 18 Tommy Thorn, 9-3. The Cowboy's offense started early with a takedown and finished strong with a takedown and two-point nearfall to close out the final

Fix matched up with No. 6 Ethan Lizak at 133 pounds and defeated the 2017 NCAA finalist, 6-1. The ninth-ranked Cowboy scored two takedowns and a reversal, holding Lizak to only one escape in the bout.

"I was really excited for this trip," Fix said. "It was my college debut, really, and I was looking forward to wrestling Seth Gross and Ethan Lizak. I only got the opportunity wrestle one, and I took advantage of it. I've been looking forward to this year for as long as I can remember."

Piccininni was tested at 125 pounds in a matchup with the Minnesota's Sean Russell but held on to defeat the fifth-ranked Gopher, 3-0. The Poke moves to 3-2 in the series against Russell and handed Russell his first loss of the season.

The string of three consecutive major decisions began with a Rogers win over Minnesota's Carson Brolsma, 10-2. Rogers picked up four takedowns in the bout and also earned a riding time point. Smith notched an 11-2 major over Devin Skatzka in the 174 bout, and Geer shut out Owen Webster in his 10-0 major at 184 pounds.

Andrew Marsden picked up OSU's seventh win of the dual at 197 pounds, beating Brandon Krone, 2-0.

Redshirt junior Kaid Brock and Andrew Shomers lost decisions at 141 and 157, respectively. No. 8 Mitch McKee upset Brock, 6-3, to mark the 141-pounder's first loss in the series. Shomers dropped a close bout to No. 11 Steve Bleise, 8-5, when the Gopher picked up a late takedown and nearfall. Third-ranked Derek White fell to No. 5 Gable Steveson at heavyweight, 8-2.

It marked OSU's fourth-straight win over Minnesota, and its second-straight in Minneapolis. OSU would have won the match 24-9, but was docked a team point during Fix's

The Cowboys open the home portion of their schedule next week, facing the Wyoming Cowboys on Nov. 25 in Gallagher-Iba Arena.

The Basics

The Oklahoma State wrestling team (1-1 overall; 0-0 Big 12) hosts a classic Big 12/Big 10 matchup Sunday against the No. 12 Minnesota Golden Gophers at 2 p.m. CST. The Cowboys opened the season at Drexel with a 30-6 victory over the Dragons before dropping a tight, 21-20, dual to 10th-ranked Lehigh in Bethlehem, Pa. OSU hasn't dropped back-to-back duals since the beginning of the 2013-14 season.

On the Air

The Cowboys' first home dual of the season will broadcast live on the Big 12+ App. The contest with Minnesota will stream over on 93.7 KSPI-FM with Rex Holt and Roger Moore on the call.

The Series

Oklahoma State holds a 26-14 all-time record against Minnesota. Of the 26 wins, 19 have come during the John Smith era, with OSU claiming the four most recent meetings between the programs.

In 2018, OSU took seven of 10 matches and defeated 13th-ranked Minnesota on the road in Maturi Pavillion, 23-3, in its second dual of the year.

The most recent dual between the Cowboys and Gophers in Gallagher-Iba resulted in a 30-3 victory for the Pokes

Brandon Eggum is 0-3 against the Cowboys in his three complete seasons at Minnesota, with the closest contest taking place a year ago in Minneapolis.

Minnesota comes to Stillwater a week after an upset loss to unranked Rider at home, and the Pokes look to bounce back from a tough loss at Lehigh. This dual marks the 34th time in 24 seasons that the two programs have met.

About the Cowboys

In 2019, the Cowboys finished with a 15-0 dual mark, completing a perfect season for the 46th time in program history and the seventh in Smith's tenure. It was the first undefeated dual team for the Pokes since 2005.

OSU earned nine allocations at the NCAA Championships in Pittsburgh last season, with Daton Fix (133) and Derek White (HWT) claiming the top seed in their respective weight classes. Both Cowboys made strong title runs and finished as runners up at the event.

Additionally, Preston Weigel made an unprecedented recovery from an injury that sidelined him for the majority of the 2019 season to finish third in Pittsburgh and claim his second All-America bid.

Dakota Geer holds his spot in the Cowboy lineup after securing All-America status at the NCAAs in 2019. He entered the tournament as the No. 26 wrestler in the first season of fully seeded brackets, only to upset No. 2 Shakur Rasheed (PSU), No. 3 Zach Zavatsky (Va. Tech), No. 7 Nick Reenan (NCSt.) and No. 13 Nino Bonaccorsi (Pitt) en route to a seventh-place finish. He owned two of the four largest upsets at the event.

Senior staple Nick Piccininni (125) enters the season ranked No. 4 after earning All-America status for the second time in his career in March. He won all but one match in Pittsburgh with bonus points attached after going undefeated through the regular season and leading the Cowboys in numerous statistical categories.

With freestyle World Team member Daton Fix taking an Olympic redshirt and All-American Kaid Brock out of the lineup with a knee injury, the Cowboys look to fill a serious void at 133 pounds. Boo Lewallen (149) returns to the Cowboy lineup after a serious shoulder injury took him out of competition last season, along with Wyatt Sheets (157) and Kaden Gfeller (141).

Look for new faces in the Pokes' lineup in redshirt freshmen Anthony Montalvo and Travis Wittlake, who will likely make appearances in the upper weights.

Newcomer Wittlake also made forward moves in the polls, bumping from No. 20 to No. 15, after topping No. 10 Ebed Jarrell of Drexel.

Senior 125-pounder Piccininni comes in across *Intermat, WIN Magazine* and FloWrestling's ranks at No. 4 and moved up one spot in the Open Mat rankings to No. 3. Not far behind is teammate and returning All-American Lewallen. The redshirt senior comes in as high as No. 3 with his lowest ranking from Flo at seventh

Heavyweight Austin Harris wrestled in a hard-fought 9-4 loss to third-ranked Jordan Wood before Nick Piccininnitook an 11-3 major from 17th-rankedBrandon Paetzellin the final bout

Wyatt Sheets faced No. 13 Josh Humphreys for the second time in the 2019 calendar year. After a sudden-victory thriller over the Mountain Hawk in February, Sheets lost a 16-2 major to the sophomore. With seven home duals slated for the 2019-20 season, the Pokes have ample opportunity to reach the 500-win milestone on their home mat.

Fresh(man) Faces

This season's OSU starting lineup could feature as many as five freshmen or redshirt freshman at any point

With Daton Fix and Kaid Brock out of the lineup for the fall, redshirt freshmen Conner Wilson and true freshman Reece Witcraft will contend for the spot at 133 pounds. Former Cowboy and current club coach Alex Dieringer also competed for a place on the World Team late in the summer. The three-time NCAA champ wrestled 2019 World gold medalist Kyle Dake in a special wrestle-off in Austin, Texas, in August.

Dieringer came up short but is competing in order to qualify an Olympic spot for the USA at 86 kilograms.

Cowboy Wrestling Signs Top Recruiting Class

John Smith and staff announced the signing of the top-ranked class in the country for 2020 on Wednesday, Nov. 13. The class of eight includes No. 1 pound-for-pound wrestler AJ Ferrari and No. 2 overall recruit and top 182-pounder Dustin Plott of Tuttle, Okla.

Joining the top two recruits are Blair Academy standout Trevor Mastrogiovanni, Jakason Burks, Luke Surber, Konner Doucet, Daniel Jezik and Alexander Yokubaitis.

Allen, Texas native Ferrari is projected to go at 197 pounds for the Cowboys. He announced his commitment on Oct. 2, following his official visit to Stillwater. He's a two-time Ironman champion and 2018 Cadet World bronze medalist





Oklahoma's own Plot committed to the Pokes in the fall of 2018 and honored that commitment, singing his NLI on Wednesday. Plot is a three-time Oklahoma high school state finalist and two-time champion. The future Cowboy owns KC Stampede and Geary Tournament titles and finished runner up at Fargo this summer.

Mastrogiovanni also verbally committed to OSU in 2018. Out of Blair Academy, he projects as a lighter weight and holds the No. 11 overall spot in this year's senior class along with the second place ranking at 126 pounds. Some of his accolades include: three-time National Prep Tournament champion, 2019 Junior Pan American Champion (57kg) and Fargo All-American.

Out of Nebraska, Jakason Burks signed his letter as the No. 2 120-pound wrestler in the country. He comes to Oklahoma State from Nebraska where in 2018 he capped off a 58-0 season with a Class A title at 120 pounds. He won his first title in 2017 and placed fourth at 106 pounds his freshman season.

Luke Surber, son of Tuttle High's wrestling coach, joins high school teammate Plott in this year's signing class. He most recently claimed a title at 152 pounds last season, outscoring his competition, 46-1, at the state tournament. Surber took first at the Junior National Duals in June to help Team Oklahoma edge Illinois for the title.

Another Oklahoman, Konner Doucet, out of Comanche signed his NLI to wrestle at OSU beginning in 2020. The No. 6 220-pounder has won three state titles and finished runner-up in 2018 at the UWW Cadet World Team Trials. He projects to be a heavyweight for the Pokes.

Rounding out the incoming class are Daniel Jezik of Coal City, Illinois, (No. 15 at 182) and Alexander Yokubaitis, a three time state champion from Louisiana. Jezik won a 2A Illinois State title in 2019.

When wrestlers come to compete at Oklahoma State, they are coached by some of the greatest to ever step on the mat. John Smith holds six world championships and two Olympic gold medals. Smith, Zack Esposito, Chris Perry and Tyler Caldwell also combine for five NCAA championships and 13 All-America honors. Smith brings in a plethora of international coaching experience. Most recently, he coached the 2017 USA Women's Cadet World Team, for which he was named USA Wrestling Women's Co-Coach of the Year alongside Campbell's Kary Kolat.

Wrestling's House of Horrors

No venue in America has a richer wrestling tradition than Gallagher-Iba Arena, home of Oklahoma State wrestling since 1939. In its beginning as Gallagher Hall, the gymnasium was named for Edward Clark Gallagher, the Oklahoma A&M wrestling mentor who never wrestled competitively but became the greatest coach of his time.

Since wrestling began in Gallagher-Iba Arena, the Cowboys have won 25 NCAA titles and have had 41 unbeaten and untied campaigns at home, the most recent coming in 2019. One of the program's longest winning streaks ran with the arena's opening in 1939 and lasted until Feb. 16, 1951. During that period, Oklahoma State won 37 straight home duals, with no ties.

Gallagher-Iba Arena has proved to be one of the most difficult venues for opponents to win in across all of college sports, as the Cowboy wrestling program boasts an impressive 496-40-6 overall record in the areas.

From the final dual of 1959 through the first five home duals of the 1967 season, Oklahoma State wrestled 67 duals without a loss, finishing with an impressive 60-0-1 record before the streak was broken by Oklahoma. 19-13.
