Oklahoma State Under Mike Gundy

- Since 2010, Oklahoma State has six seasons with at least 10 wins, an outright Big 12 title (2011) and a share of the Big 12 South title (2010). The Cowboys reached the top 10 of the Associated Press poll in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2013, 2015, 2016 and 2017.
- Gundy has coached the Cowboys to four New Year's Six bowl games since 2010. The Pokes appeared in the 2010 Cotton Bowl, the 2012 Fiesta Bowl, the 2014 Cotton Bowl and the 2016 Sugar Bowl.
- Oklahoma State was one of only 10 teams to post a winning season every year from 2010-19, joining Alabama, Boise State, LSU, Oklahoma, Penn State, San Diego State, Texas A&M, Washington and Wisconsin.
- Including the 2020 season, Oklahoma State has been ranked in the top 15 of the Associated Press poll in 11 of the past 13 seasons and has posted 10-win seasons six of the past 10 years.
- Just since 2017, Gundy has coached the leading passer in the FBS (Mason Rudolph in 2017), the leading receiver in the FBS (James Washington in 2017) and the leading rusher in the FBS (Chuba Hubbard in 2019).

The Basics

The Oklahoma State football team (1-0 overall; 0-0 Big 12) opens Big 12 play when it hosts West Virginia (1-0 overall; 0-0 Big 12) at 2:30 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 26, at Boone Pickens Stadium.

On the Air

The game will be televised by ABC with Bob Wischusen, Dan Orlovsky and Kris Budden on the call. The contest will also be carried live on the Cowboy Radio Network, with Dave Hunziker handling play-by-play, John Holcomb providing analysis and Robert Allen reporting from the sideline. Fans outside of the Cowboy Radio Network can listen to the OSU broadcast for free through TuneIn Radio or the TuneIn Radio app.

Doing Our Part

Under normal circumstances, Boone Pickens Stadium would seat 55,509 fans, but this season the capacity has been reduced to roughly 15,000 in an effort to provide proper social distancing to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. Seating has been limited in both the club level and the lower seating bowl. The last time OSU's football stadium capacity was smaller was from 1930-1946 when it was listed at 13,000. Even then, temporary stands were sometimes added to raise the capacity as high as 18,000.

Additionally, several measures have been taken in effort to make it a safer environment, included but not limited to: mobile ticketing, requiring face masks, prohibiting tailgating, providing hand sanitizer stations and adding Plexiglas to concessions and points of sale throughout the stadium.

In the Rankings

OSU is ranked in both the AP Top 25 (No. 15) and the Amway Coaches Poll (No. 18). Including 2020, OSU has reached the top 15 of the AP poll at some point in 11 of the past 13 seasons. OSU has also seen a top 10 ranking in the AP poll at some point in eight of those 13 years.

The Cowboys have been ranked in the AP preseason top 25 three of the past five and six of the past 10 years. The 2020 preseason AP Top 25 marked the highest preseason rank in the poll for OSU since 2017, when it was voted No. 10. Oklahoma State has received votes in the preseason AP Top 25 each of the past 12 years.

Although the College Football Playoff rankings won't be released until later in the year, it is worth noting that OSU has appeared in the CFP rankings four of the past five seasons entering 2020.

West Virginia is receiving votes in both polls.

The Series

Saturday's game marks the 12th meeting between Oklahoma State and West Virginia, with the series dating back to 1928. The 2020 season also marks the ninth consecutive year the teams have met. OSU owns a 7-4 all-time series advantage, including a 3-2 advantage in games played in Stillwater. OSU has won five straight over the Mountaineers, and won both of the two played in Stillwater. A win Saturday would extend the longest win streak for either team in the series.

Coach Mike Gundy is 6-2 in his career against West Virginia, while WVU coach Neal Brown is 0-1 in his career against the Cowboys.

Ring of Honor - Thurman Thomas

Hall-of Fame running back Thurman Thomas will become the first inductee into the Oklahoma State football Ring of Honor on Saturday. Thomas' name and number will be unveiled atop the west end zone of Boone Pickens Stadium at halftime, and the Cowboys will wear white uniforms that are a replica of what OSU wore in the 1987 Sun Bowl, which was Thomas' last game as a Cowboy. The Cowboys won that game, 35-33, and Thomas was the game's most valuable player.

Thomas was a 2007 inductee into the Pro Football Hall of Fame and a 2008 inductee in the National College Football Hall of Fame. The Buffalo Bills put Thomas on their wall of fame in 2005 and retired his No. 34 jersey in 2018. Thomas was a three-time All-American and is still the all-time leading rusher in Oklahoma State football history with 5,001 rushing yards and 50 total touchdowns.

Oklahoma State from a Distance

Oklahoma State is 1-0 after getting past Tulsa with a 16-7 win last week. Starting quarterback Spencer Sanders was lost to injury in the first quarter. As a result, a pair of newcomers in juco transfer Ethan Bullock and true freshman Shane Illingworth were forced into action. With the quarterback position in flux, the defense carried the day by holding Tulsa to 0-for-12 on third down attempts and just one score on 13 possessions. Linebacker Malcolm Rodriguez led the effort with 10 tackles and nine solo stops.

Heisman candidate running back Chuba Hubbard turned in 93 rushing yards and the game-winning touchdown. Biletnikoff Award candidate Tylan Wallace had four catches for 94 yards.

Team and Player Notes

Making History

Oklahoma State's combination of Tylan Wallace and Chuba Hubbard marks the first time in college football history that one team's roster has featured returning finalists for the both the Biletnikoff Award, given to the nation's best receiver, and the Doak Walker Award, given to the nation's best running back. Wallace was a 2018 Biletnikoff Award finalist, while Hubbard was a finalist for the 2019 Doak Walker Award.

It Takes Two

On top of that, the Wallace-Hubbard duo also makes up the only pair of teammates in college football with more than 2,500 career receiving and rushing yards, respectively. Wallace, a senior, has 2,611 career receiving yards while Hubbard, a junior, has 2,927 rushing yards.

Consistently Strong

Oklahoma State is one of only 10 programs to post a winning season every year from 2010-19. The Cowboys won at least eight games in 10 of the last 12 seasons. Included in that 12-year run are a Big 12 championship in 2011 and four trips to New Year's Six bowl games.

Oklahoma State is 58-31 in Big 12 Conference games since 2010, a mark that ranks second in the league during that time span, trailing only Oklahoma.

Win Indicators

There are many things that factor into whether a team wins a game, but a long-term look at the trends during Mike Gundy's tenure at Oklahoma State shows that winning the turnover battle and winning the run game are two of the best ways to predict an OSU victory.

Since 2005, when the Cowboys win the turnover battle they are 70-10 (87.5 pct.). They are 37-3 (92.5 pct.) in games when they commit zero turnovers. OSU is 100-24 under Gundy when outrushing the opponent (80.6 pct.) and is 42-5 when holding the opponent under 100 yards on the ground (89.4 pct.).

History also shows that OSU is tough to beat when it takes a lead into halftime, as the Cowboys are 99-10 when leading at intermission under Gundy (90.8 pct.).

Gundy-coached teams are undefeated when holding opponents to fewer than 20 points, holding a perfect 61-0 record. OSU has won 69 consecutive games when holding its opponent to fewer than 20 points, dating to Sept. 13, 2003 – the longest active streak in the nation.

Offensive Success

Throughout Mike Gundy's tenure, OSU has been known for offensive success. Despite losing national award winners and having coaching changes and injuries, Gundy has found a way to put together elite offenses year in and year out, and the evidence is in the numbers.

In the past 10 seasons, Oklahoma State has finished among the top four nationally in total offense four times, including being ranked No. 2 nationally in 2017 and No. 10 nationally in 2018. Gundy's teams have finished among the top 16 nationally in total offense nine times during his 15 seasons as head coach.

Offensive Consistency

Despite having a first-year offensive coordinator, a new offensive line coach and a first-time starter at quarterback, Oklahoma State still ranked in the top 25 nationally in total offense, rushing offense and red zone offense last season.

Part of the Cowboys' offensive success came from its balance, as OSU finished the year with 2,985 rushing yards and 2,916 passing yards.

Next Up

In Kasey Dunn, Oklahoma State has its third offensive coordinator in as many years. That said, Dunn knows the personnel and Cowboy offense intimately. The longest consecutively-serving assistant coach at OSU since 1962, Dunn is in his 10th season at Oklahoma State. He arrived in 2011 as wide receivers coach. After a successful run that saw him coach Justin Blackmon and James Washington to Biletnikoff Awards, Dunn added the title of Associate Head Coach for the 2019 season, then was promoted to offensive coordinator following last season. Dunn still coaches OSU's receivers in his new role, but moves from the sideline to the booth as the play caller for the 2020 season.

Stepping Up the Ground Game

Oklahoma State finished 2019 ranked second in the Big 12 and 17th in the FBS by averaging 229.6 rushing yards per game. The Cowboys' season rushing total marked the most in a season for OSU since 2008.

They're Back

OSU's win over Tulsa marked the return to action for several big-name Cowboys, including All-America receiver Tylan Wallace, who missed the last five games of 2019 to injury, Big 12 Freshman of the Year quarterback Spencer Sanders, who missed almost all of the last three and half games, and first team all-Big 12 safety Kolby Harvell-Peel, who missed the bowl game.

Welcome to Stillwater

The Oklahoma State offense added two new faces in the weeks leading up to the 2020 season, as wide receiver Dee Anderson came to Stillwater as a graduate transfer from LSU and wide receiver Tay Martin arrived from Washington State after the cancellation of the Pac-12 season.

Big Play Kings

Oklahoma State's offense was full of big plays last year. The Cowboys finished the season ranking No. 1 in the FBS with 20 offensive plays of 50 yards or longer, 12 plays of 60 yards or longer, seven plays of 70 yards or longer, three plays of 80 yards or longer and two plays of 90 yards or longer.

Defense Rising

Oklahoma State's defense had one of its most impressive season opening games during Mike Gundy's tenure as head coach, holding Tulsa to 0-for-12 on third downs and just seven total points. It was just the fourth time in Mike Gundy's 16 years that the OSU defense has held its opponent to seven or fewer points in a season opener, and the first since time it's happened since 2016.

The performance placed the Cowboys in the top 20 nationally in several statistical categories. A look:

He stormed onto the national stage in 2019 as he became the most productive player in the nation and performed at a level consistent with Heisman Trophy-winning running backs of the past. He opened the season with a 93-yard rushing day last week.
- Tylan Wallace was fantastic last week in his first game back after missing the final five games of last season with an injury. He finished with four catches for 94 yards to lead all players in yards from scrimmage. Wallace was an integral part of the offense last season and he was leading all Power Five conference players in receiving yards when he was injured.
- Three quarterbacks played in the season opener last week after starter Spencer Sanders left in the first quarter after sustaining a lower extremity injury. Junior college transfer Ethan Bullock played most of the second and third quarter while freshman Shane Illingworth came in late in the third.
- 2020 marks the debut season as offensive coordinator for coach Kasey Dunn. Dunn had coached receivers at OSU for each of the previous nine seasons. He was promoted to Associate Head Coach prior to the 2019 season and to offensive coordinator following that year. He still coaches OSU's wide receivers and now serves as the primary play caller in his new role as offensive coordinator.
- 2020 is also the debut season for OSU quarterbacks Coach Tim Rattay, who arrived in Stillwater after coaching quarterbacks last season for the NFL's Washington Football Team.
- The OSU offensive line includes four new starters, but senior Teven Jenkins is the anchor for the group. The redshirt senior has 29 career starts to mark the most on the Cowboy offense and has started games each of the prior three seasons. Ry Schneider and Hunter Anthony also provide some consistency to the group, as both have started a handful of games.

Chuba Hubbard's Historic Season

Chuba Hubbard put together one of the most impressive seasons in college football history last season. Here's a look at how his numbers from last year stack up:

Game Notes

Canada's Cowboy

Chuba Hubbard is the all-time NCAA leader in single-season rushing yards by a Canadian, as his 2,094 rushing yards surpassed the previous mark of 1,818 set by Michigan's Tim Biakabutuka in 1996.

Hubbard's season earned him video shout outs from fellow Canadians Wayne Gretzky and Howie Mandel, and captured the attention of football fans across North America in Canada and the United States alike. The attention spawned the hashtag #CanadasCowboy to promote Hubbard for the Heisman Trophy.

More on Chuba

Hubbard's résumé is as good as anyone's in college football. Included are the following:

- Hubbard's 296 rushing yards in Oklahoma State's win over Kansas State represented the largest single-game output for any Power Five player in the country last year.
- Last year in a close game against a TCU squad that entered the contest ranked 15th in the FBS by allowing only 103.7 rushing yards per game, Hubbard rushed for 223 yards on 20 carries (11.1 yards per carry). He rushed for 192 yards in the second half alone and scored the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter. Hubbard became the first player to rush for more than 200 yards against TCU in Gary Patterson's 19 years as head coach.
- Hubbard led the FBS with four 200-yard rushing games 12 100-yard rushing games in 2019.
- Hubbard had a streak of 11 straight games with more than 100 rushing yards.
- Hubbard was the premier big-play threat in college football. He led the FBS in rushes of 30 yards or longer, 40 yards or longer, 50 yards or longer, 60 yards or longer, 70 yards or longer, 80 yards or longer and 90 yards or longer.

California Kid

Quarterback Shane Illingworth entered the game against Tulsa late in the third quarter, becoming the first OSU true freshman to quarterback the Cowboys in his first career game since Wes Lunt in 2012. He completed all three pass attempts for 78 yards on his first drive, capped by a Chuba Hubbard touchdown run. The Norco, California native finished the game 4-of-5 passing for 79 yards, while his only incomplection came on a ball thrown away to avoid a sack.

An early enrollee in the spring, Illingworth provided a spark to the Cowboys when he entered the game, as his first career drive was OSU's only touchdown drive of the game.

Illingworth started 11 games as a high school senior in 2019, completing 150 passes on 230 attempts for 3,081 yards and 40 touchdowns with only two interceptions. In three years of varsity football, he totaled 6,433 passing yards, 184 rushing yards, 79 passing touchdowns and six rushing touchdowns.

A unanimous four-star prospect, Illingworth elected to play for the Cowboys over offers from Arizona, Arizona State, Arkansas, Boston College, Colorado, Louisville, Missouri, Oregon State, Washington State and others. He grew up in California, but visited Oklahoma many times and has family from Perry, Lindsay and Mustang.

Game 2 Talking Points - Defense

- The OSU defense played an enormous role in the win over Tulsa last week, holding the Golden Hurricane to 0-for-12 on third down attempts, 1-for-4 on fourth down attempts and seven total points.
- Malcolm Rodriguez led the way for the defense with 10 tackles and a sack that sealed the win in the fourth quarter. He also finished with nine solo stops and now ranks No. 2 in the FBS in that category.
- Oklahoma State returns 10 of 11 starters from last year's team that already featured the best OSU defense in several seasons.
- Safety Kolby Harvell-Peel finished last year as one of the nation's best safeties and picked up right where he left off. He finished the regular season leading all Power Five players with 18 pass breakups and intercepted Tulsa's final pass attempt last week to finish off the OSU win.
- OSU returns two of the top five tacklers in the Big 12 from last season in linebackers Malcolm Rodriguez and Amen Ogbongbemiga.
- The Cowboys rank among the FBS leaders in several defensive categories, including third down defense (No. 1), fewest first downs allowed (No. 6), scoring defense (No. 11), fourth down defense (No. 11), total defense (No. 12), rushing defense (No. 14), fewest passing yards allowed (No. 16), team tackles for loss (No. 20) and team pass efficiency defense (No. 20).
- Defensive coordinator Jim Knowles is in his third season as the leader of the Cowboy defense. The improvement from year one to year two was dramatic and there is already evidence mounting that the unit will be even better in 2020.
- Cornerback Rodarius Williams has a streak of 40 consecutive starts, marking the most in the FBS among all defensive backs. Williams, a redshirt senior, has been an everyday starter since the beginning of the 2017 season.
- Linebacker Calvin Bundage made his highly anticipated returned to the lineup last week after missing all of 2019 to injury. With a well-earned reputation as a disruptive pass rusher, he finished with two tackles and assisted on a tackle for loss.

What a Difference a Year Makes

A year ago, the Oklahoma State defense entered the season with a grand total of zero career starts on the defensive line and few starts across the board. In total, nine Cowboy defenders made their first career starts during the course of the 2019 season.

A year later, the Cowboys entered 2020 with 10 of 11 starters returning and proven experience across the field. In total, 17 players on the OSU roster entered this season with at least one career start.

Harvell-Peel's Incredible Season

Safety Kolby Harvell-Peel earned first-team All-Big 12 honors after leading all Power Five players in passes defended during the 2019 regular season. He also set an OSU single game record with six pass break ups at Iowa State and has forced five turnovers in his last four games alone. He earned Big 12 defensive player of the week honors three times and his 13 pass break ups ranked as the ninth-best season total in school history.
