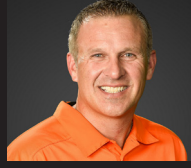

GAME NOTES



Colin Carmichael
Head Coach,
21st Season

Colin Carmichael has been at OSU since the inception of the women's soccer program in the fall of 1996, and he continues to help lead Cowgirl soccer to new heights and a spot among the nation's elite.

OSU is in the midst of the most successful stretch of seasons in its history as the program is in its 30th year, 21 of those with Carmichael as head coach.

Carmichael, who served as OSU's co-head coach with Karen Hancock during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, entered the 2025 season with a 265-110-53 career record in 20 seasons as the Cowgirls' head coach, compiling a winning percentage of .681. He has led OSU to 12 appearances in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship, including six straight from 2006-11, and after advancing to the second round of the NCAA tourney four-straight years, the Cowgirls made back-to-back trips to the Elite Eight in 2010 and 2011.

The Cowgirls have been a force in the Big 12 Conference under Carmichael, capturing six league titles. OSU claimed four consecutive conference championships from 2008-11 and added crowns in 2017 and 2019; the Cowgirls won regular season titles in 2008, '11, '17 and '19 and Big 12 Soccer Championship titles in 2009 and 2010.

Carmichael has guided OSU to a 15-12-4 record and four finals appearances at the Big 12 Championship and an 11-9-6 record in NCAA tourney play.

ABOUT OKLAHOMA STATE

- Oklahoma State is 4-8-2 overall and 0-5-1 in Big 12 Conference play. Up next, the Cowgirls host UCF Thursday night at Neal Patterson Stadium before traveling to Fort Worth for a Sunday match at TCU.
- The Cowgirls are coming off a 14-5-3 season in 2024 in which they finished fifth in the Big 12 Conference standings with a 6-3-2 mark and earned a berth in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship, where OSU lost in the first round to No. 2 national seed Arkansas.
- OSU returned seven players who started at least 10 games for the Cowgirls last season, including All-Big 12 performers Gracie Bindbeutel, Xcaret Pineda and Laudan Wilson.
- Colin Carmichael entered his 21st season as OSU's head coach in 2025 with a career record of 265-110-53 (.681).

THREE DECADES

The 2024 season marks the 30th in program history, and Oklahoma State has built itself into one of women's college soccer's top programs.

- Over its first 29 seasons, OSU posted a 348-190-66 (.631) record.
- OSU has made 14 appearances in the NCAA Women's Soccer Championship. The Cowgirls have earned a NCAA tourney berth in 13 of the last 19 years (beginning in 2006) and seven of the last 12.
- From 2006-11, the Cowgirls earned six-straight NCAA tourney bids and advanced to at least the second round each time, including back-to-back Elite Eight appearances in 2010 and 2011.
- From 2008-11, OSU celebrated four consecutive Big 12 championships — two regular season (2008, '11) and two tournament ('09, '10). The Cowgirls also won regular season titles in 2017 and 2019.
- Six Cowgirls have earned All-America honors, with Yolanda Odenyo, AD Franch, Melinda Mercado, Haley Woodard, Kim Rodriguez and Grace Yochum on that elite list.

LAST TIME OUT

OSU dropped a 2-1 match at home to Kansas State. Sonora DeFini scored for the Cowgirls, and Logan Marks recorded seven saves.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

- UCF is 8-2-3 overall and seventh in the Big 12 standings with a 2-1-3 mark.
- Tiffany Roberts Sahaydak is in her 13th season as UCF's head coach. In 19 seasons as a head coach, which also includes six seasons at VCU, she has compiled a career record of 182-113-54.
- The Cowgirls are 2-2-0 all time against UCF. Last season, OSU was a 2-0 winner in Orlando.
- Ranked 13th nationally, TCU is 10-2-1 overall and fourth in the Big 12 standings with a 4-1-1 mark going into a Thursday night match at home against Baylor.
- Eric Bell is in his 14th season as TCU's head coach and owns a career 159-83-41 record.
- OSU is 6-9-2 in the all-time series with TCU. The Frogs have won the last six matches and are 7-0-1 against the Cowgirls since 2018.

IN THE RANKINGS

In the latest official NCAA RPI, the Cowgirls check in at No. 98, while UCF is No. 29 and TCU No. 5. OSU's schedule is ranked as the sixth toughest nationally.

OSU fell out of the national rankings following the opening week of the season after being ranked No. 22 in the United Soccer Coaches Preseason Poll. That appearance marked the first time the Cowgirls had been ranked to open a season since 2021 when they were No. 16 in the preseason rankings.

NEXT UP

A year ago, the Cowgirls outscored their opponents, 42-15, while recording 15 shutouts in 22 games. However, in 2025, OSU had to replace two-year starting goalie Grace Gordon, who played all but 70 minutes in goal last season, as well as 55 percent of its scoring as the returning group combined for just 19 goals in 2024. The only returning Cowgirls who had more than two goals a year ago are Xcaret Pineda (6) and Laudan Wilson (5).

PRESEASON LOVE

Three Cowgirls were on the 27-member Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league's head coaches. Midfielders Xcaret Pineda and Laudan Wilson and defender Jazmin Brown collected the honor.

Additionally, Pineda was named to the *TopDrawerSoccer.com* Preseason Best XI Third Team and was ranked No. 30 on the outlet's National Top 100 list.

DYNAMIC DUO

Senior Xcaret Pineda and junior Laudan Wilson are both on the United Soccer Coaches 2025 Women's Midfielders to Watch list, which is compiled and released by the Division I All-America Committee.

IT'S AN HONOR

OSU returns four players who were recognized with Big 12 honors in 2024 in All-Big 12 First Team midfielders Xcaret Pineda and Laudan Wilson, All-Big 12 Second Team forward Gracie Bindbeutel and defender Katelyn Hoppers, who was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team.

The Cowgirls also added transfer Jazmin Brown, who was an All-Big 12 Second Team defender at Kansas State a year ago.

ELITE

Xcaret Pineda is one of 43 players on the 2025 Hermann Trophy Watch List, which was compiled by members of the Division I Women's All-America Council.

The Hermann Trophy is the nation's highest individual honor recognizing the National Player of the Year as determined by voting of Division I head coaches who are members of United Soccer Coaches.

OSU has had two Hermann Trophy semifinalists in its history, Yolanda Odenyo in 2008, and AD Franch, who made the list in 2010 and 2011.

INJURY BUG BITING

Injuries have taken a huge toll on the Cowgirls this season, with numerous key players forced to go on the shelf. Those injuries have prohibited OSU from having the same starting lineup in multiple games this season. Among the injured:

- All-Big 12 midfielder Laudan Wilson, OSU's leading scorer last season, played in only one of the Cowgirls' first eight games (vs. Oklahoma on Aug. 17). She returned to action off the bench vs. Kansas.
- Gracie Bindbeutel, an All-Big 12 forward, was lost for the remainder of the season with a knee injury after starting the first five games
- Starting midfielder Chloe Wright has missed two games
- Lexi Lee has missed 11 games
- Emmy Hedden missed the first seven games of the season
- Juliette Perreault missed the first five games of the season
- Leading goal scorer and All-Big 12 midfielder Xcaret Pineda was injured late in the first half against Oral Roberts and did not return to the game; she missed the next five games before returning vs. BYU
- Starting goalie Logan Marks was injured in the first half vs. Kansas and missed the final 57 minutes
- Bella Pierotti was injured in the first half vs. KU and did not return; she missed the last five games
- Aubrey Wagner missed three games after suffering an injury at Arizona State
- Starting defenders Sophie Wilson and Jazmin Brown were injured in the opening half at Texas Tech and did not return; both missed the BYU game

X GON' GIVE IT TO YA

It's safe to say OSU's offense runs through Xcaret Pineda.

The Cowgirls' senior midfielder has played a role in six of OSU's 16 goals this season, finding the back of the net five times and also recording an assist. She notched the first multi-goal game of her career with a brace against Arkansas State.

With just one more goal, Pineda will tie her career high for goals in a season — she has tallied six each of the last two years.

In 70 career games, 68 as a starter, Pineda has recorded 19 goals and 12 assists while taking 161 shots.

SHE'S A GIVER

Laudan Wilson tallied nine assists last season as a sophomore, which ranked second in the Big 12 and was the most assists in a season by a Cowgirl since Jaci Jones had 12 in 2019.

Wilson also added five goals, which ranked third on the squad, as she led the Cowgirls with 19 points.

With 15 assists in her career, Wilson is five away from cracking the top 10 list in program history.

FOUR CORNERS

OSU has recorded 72 corner kicks, an average of nearly just over five per game, and the Cowgirls have taken advantage of those scoring opportunities as six of their 18 goals have come off corner kicks.

Taryn Thibreau has a team-leading and career-high four assists, three of those off corner kicks. Jazmin Brown's two goals are a career best and came on headers off corners, and Sonora DeFini also has two goals on headers off corners.

I CAN SCORE TOO

Ellie Geoffroy has established herself as one of OSU's top defenders over the last three seasons, but against East Texas A&M, she proved she can be a scoring threat.

Geoffroy recorded the first multi-goal game of career with a brace against the Lions as she netted OSU's first two goals of the game in a five-minute span in the first half. She also had an assist in the game.

Entering the game, Geoffroy did not have a goal or assist on the season, and she previously had four career goals in 65 games.

DANDY DEBUT

Emmy Hedden had an immediate impact in her first collegiate game. After missing OSU's first seven games due to injury, Hedden was in the starting lineup against East Texas A&M and produced a goal and an assist to earn Big 12 Co-Freshman of the Week honors.

Hedden notched an assist on OSU's second goal then converted her only shot of the game as she scored on a 35-yard strike upper 90 for the first goal of her career.

LOCKDOWN LO

In her first season as OSU's starting goalie, sophomore Logan Marks leads the Big 12 with 68 saves and an average of nearly five saves per game. She ranks 34th nationally in total saves.

Marks recorded a career-high nine saves and her first clean sheet in Big 12 play against 17th-ranked Arizona State and followed that with an eight-save performance against Arizona.

COACH COLIN

Colin Carmichael has been a member of the OSU coaching staff for each of the program's 30 seasons, including 21 as a head coach. He has been named Big 12 Coach of the Year a conference-record six times.

Carmichael entered the 2025 season with 265 career wins in 20 seasons, ranking third among active Big 12 coaches in wins at their current school behind only BYU's Jennifer Rockwood (464 wins in 31 seasons) and West Virginia's Nikki Izzo-Brown (402 wins in 29 seasons).

REPRESENT

Current Cowgirls Chloé Joseph and Murphy Sheaff are also members of national teams, Joseph with Haiti and Sheaff with New Zealand.

A number of other OSU standouts have gone on to represent their respective countries as members of national teams, including three Cowgirls — AD Franch, Courtney Dike and Coumba Sow — who have been on FIFA Women's World Cup rosters.

Franch joined the United States Women's National Team in 2012 and earned her first-career cap in 2019 at the SheBelieves Cup. The former Cowgirl All-American was on the roster of the 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup champion U.S. squad and won a bronze medal at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, where she started in goal in the U.S.'s medal game against Australia.

Dike was the first-ever Oklahoma State player to appear in the World Cup when she earned two caps for Nigeria in 2015, including starting against the eventual champion United States team. Dike was a four-time All-Big 12 Conference forward for the Cowgirls from 2013-16.

Sow was a starting midfielder for the Switzerland National Team at the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup. Sow was part of the OSU program in 2016 and 2017, scoring three goals in 23 games for the Cowgirls' 2017 Big 12 Conference championship squad.

Other Cowgirls who have earned national team status include:

Former Cowgirl All-American Kim Rodriguez received her first call up to the Mexico National Team in Feb. 2019 and continues to be a part of that team.

Other former Cowgirls who have competed for their respective national teams include Kathrin Lehm-ann (Switzerland), Peyton Vincze (Wales) and Grace Neville (New Zealand).

NEAL PATTERSON STADIUM

Neal Patterson Stadium was officially dedicated on Aug. 19, 2018, prior to the Oklahoma State-Oklahoma match. The Cowgirls were 2-1 victors in that contest as an OSU women’s soccer record crowd of 4,122 fans were in attendance. Kim Rodriguez scored the first-ever goal in the stadium when she converted a penalty kick in the 15th minute.

A \$20 million project, Neal Patterson Stadium is a showcase for Cow-girl Soccer and one of the top soccer facilities in the collegiate ranks. It is named for its major benefactor and Oklahoma State alumnus, the late Neal Patterson.

Patterson, who passed away during the summer of 2017, grew up near his family’s farm in Manchester, Okla. He earned a bachelor’s degree in finance and a master’s degree in business from Oklahoma State. He was one of five entrepreneurs who founded Sporting Club, which in 2006 purchased the Sporting KC Major League Soccer franchise. He was also chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Cerner Corporation, a company he co-founded with two colleagues in 1979. Today, Cerner is the world’s largest publicly traded health information technology company with \$4.8 billion in revenues in 2016 and approximately 24,000 associates worldwide. FORTUNE recently named Cerner one of the world’s most admired companies.

The new facility includes club seats, plaza and upper bowl gathering areas and a north end zone terrace area and seating designed specifically for OSU students. Team facilities include locker rooms, meeting areas, kitchen facilities, sports medicine areas and equipment rooms. The stadium can accommodate 2,500 fans in permanent seats.

The west side of the stadium includes 346 reserved chairback seats and 810 reserved bleacher-back seats. There are 552 general admission seats.

The north end zone includes bleacher seating for more than 500 and includes a patio and concourse area and a building housing a weight room for the Cowgirls.

Atop the west side of the stadium are two club levels with a capacity

of 80 and two suites with a capacity of 20 guests each. A new press box sits atop the stadium. The west side is anchored by a club area at field level that can host more than 100 and serve as a player lounge and nutrition area on non-game days.

Other unique aspects of Patterson Stadium include:

- A large roof that covers much of the seating areas, providing shade and a soccer-specific feel like that in many international venues;
- Home and visitor bench areas with chairback seating built into the stadium;
- A 26 feet by 40 feet high-definition video scoreboard in the south-east corner of the facility.

“A facility of this magnitude is a game changer for our program,” said OSU head soccer coach Colin Carmichael. “It helps the current student-athletes to be in one of the nicest facilities in the country. Our fans are going to have a much better game day experience. We want it to be a real family atmosphere...”

“Every recruit wants to know that how serious a school is about their sport. This is a huge statement from our administration.”

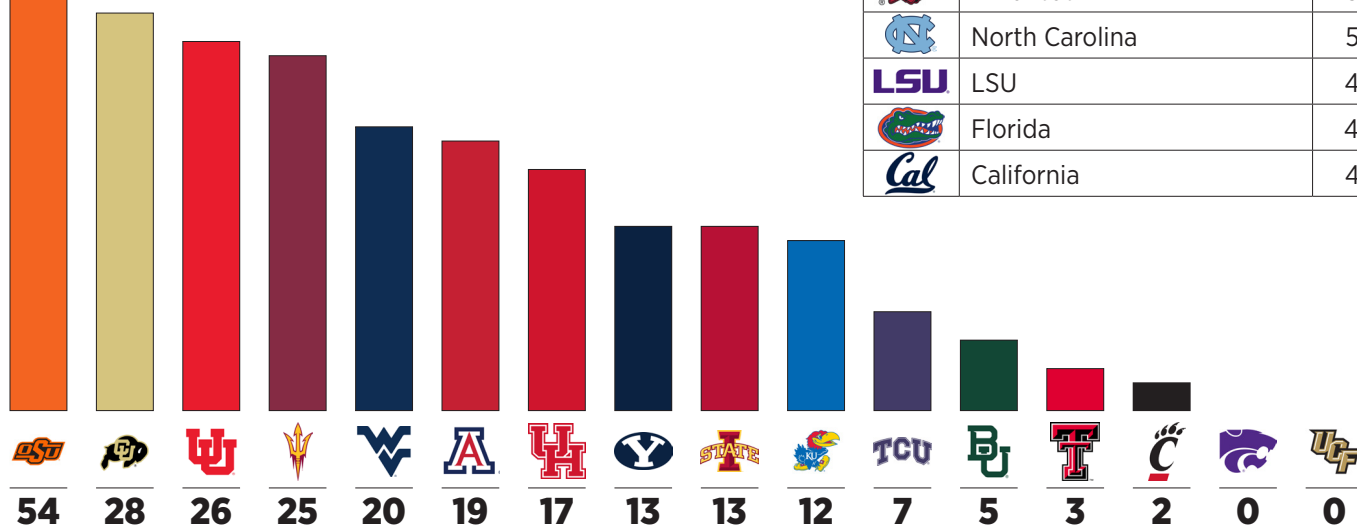
