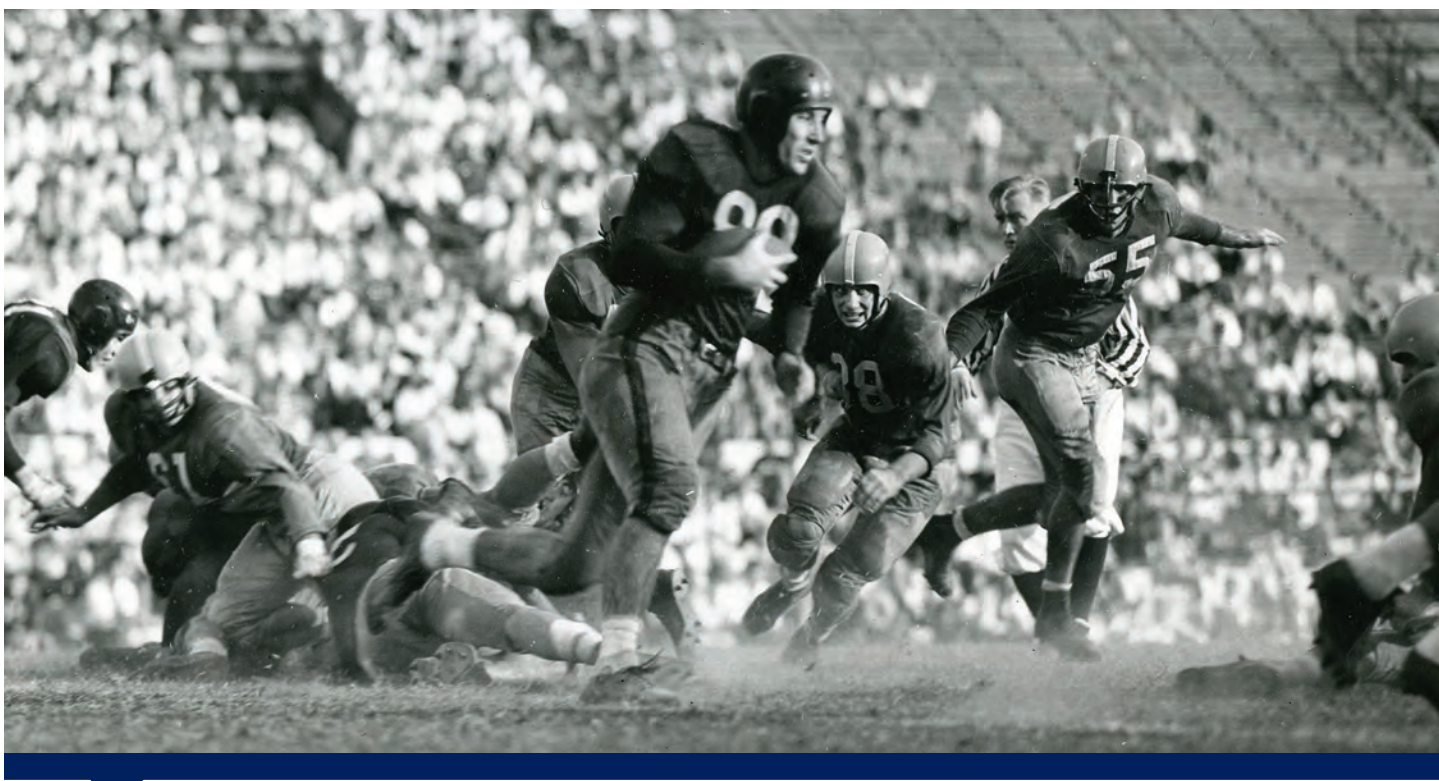

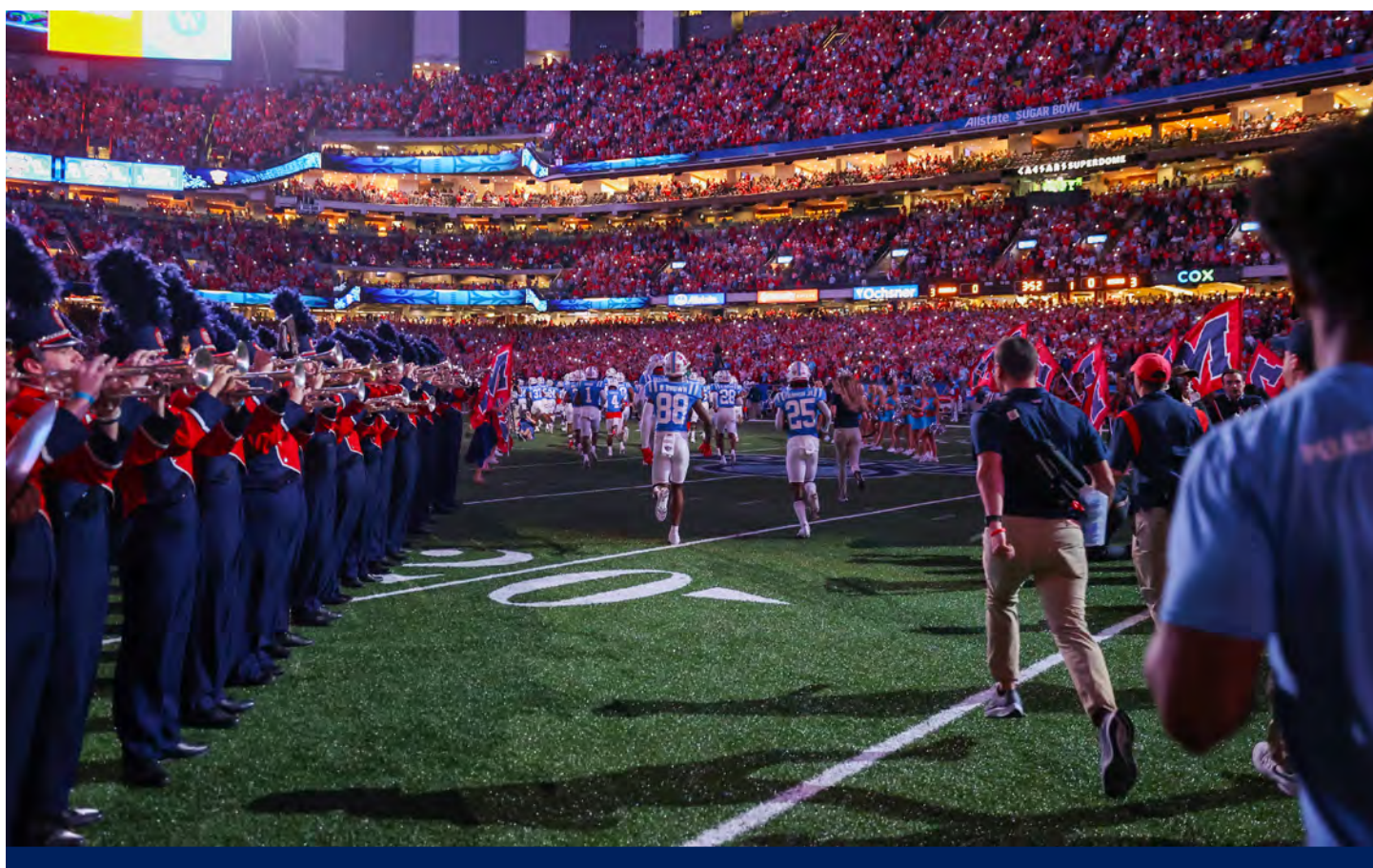

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Ole Miss is making its third straight bowl appearance under **Lane Kiffin**.
- The Rebels are 12-3 in its last 15 bowl games on the field dating back to the 1992 Liberty Bowl.
- This will be the seventh meeting between Ole Miss and Texas Tech ... Ole Miss leads the all-time series 4-2.
- The Texas Bowl will mark the fourth time the Rebels and Red Raiders have met in a bowl game ... Ole Miss is 3-0 vs. Texas Tech in bowl games.
- The Rebels lead the SEC and rank No. 6 in the FBS with 82 plays of 20 yards or more.
- Ole Miss ranks top 20 nationally in total rushing yards (3,139), rushing attempts (571), yards per rush (5.5) and rushing TDs (31).
- The Rebels average 491.3 total yards per game, the fifth-best single-season mark in school history ... Three of the top five offensive seasons in program history have all come under Kiffin.
- The Rebels are second in the SEC and No. 11 nationally converting on third downs 47.7 percent of the time.
- RB Quinshon Judkins** earned numerous postseason awards including CBS National Freshman of the Year and SEC Newcomer of the Year ... Judkins is also a finalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.
- Judkins leads all SEC running backs in both rushing yards (1,476) and rushing touchdowns (16).
- Zach Evans** ranks seventh in the SEC in rushing yards (899).
- WRs **Jonathan Mingo** and **Malik Heath** are only the second set of Rebel teammates to both surpass 800 yards receiving in the same season.
- OL **Jeremy James** has started every game for the Rebels and hasn't allowed a sack in 387 pass blocks.
- K **Jonathan Cruz** is 15-for-17 on field goal attempts and ranks second in the SEC in field goal percentage (.882).

LAST FIVE GAMES AGAINST TEXAS TECH

9/1/18 • Houston, Texas • Ole Miss 47, Texas Tech 27:

It took just 33 seconds for Ole Miss to score its first points of the 2018 season, and from there, the Rebels were off to the races, mounting a 24-7 lead in the first quarter to cruise to victory in the AdvoCare Texas Kickoff at NRG Stadium in Houston. Scottie Phillips ran for 204 yards, while Jordan Ta'amu racked up 336 through the air in the blowout Rebel win.

1/2/09 • Dallas, Texas. • #20 Ole Miss 47, #8 Texas Tech 34:

Jevan Snead threw for three touchdowns, and the dominant running back duo of Dexter McCluster and Brandon Bolden did the rest in the Rebels' upset victory in the Cotton Bowl. McCluster amassed a combined 180 yards rushing and receiving to go along with two touchdowns. Bolden matched those two scores and added 114 yards from scrimmage to create a one-two punch that the Red Raiders simply couldn't match. The Rebels overcame an early deficit and left Dallas with a decisive Cotton Bowl victory.

9/27/03 • Oxford, Miss. • Texas Tech 49, Ole Miss 45: Eli Manning passed for more than 400 yards, and the Rebels scored on seven of eight

drives, but couldn't hold off a late Texas Tech rally. The Rebels led 45-34 with 8:01 left in the game when Texas Tech quarterback B.J. Symons led his team on two solid scoring drives to seal the deal.

8/14/02 • Lubbock, Texas • Texas Tech 42, Ole Miss 28: Texas Tech scored touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams en route to a 42-28 win over Ole Miss in the first-ever regular-season meeting between the two teams. The loss was also the Rebels' first in 25 regular-season games against non-conference opponents. Eli Manning engineered two Rebel TD drives in the fourth quarter to pull within seven, but the Red Raiders iced the game with a touchdown with 3:21 left.

12/29/98 • Shreveport, La. • Ole Miss 35, Texas Tech 18: In Matt Luke's final game in a Rebel uniform, Ole Miss cruised to a 35-18 win over Texas Tech in head coach David Cutcliffe's coaching debut. RB Deuce McAllister scored a touchdown rushing, receiving and on a kickoff return. McAllister put the Rebels up for good when he took a Romaro Miller pass 32 yards for a score to break a 7-7 tie in the second quarter.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin (Fresno State, 1998) is in his third season at Ole Miss and has helped lead the Rebels to three consecutive bowl appearances in his first three years in Oxford. Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll; its highest final ranking since 2016. Ole Miss ranked top-20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories in his first season, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. Kiffin is in his 11th year at the NCAA level and has posted an all-time record of 84-46. In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

TEXAS TECH HEAD COACH JOEY MCGUIRE

Rookie head coach Joey McGuire wraps up his first season as a collegiate head coach with the TaxAct Texas Bowl, having led Texas Tech to a 7-5 season and a bowl game bid in his first year at the helm of the Red Raider football program. A native to Texas his entire life, McGuire has quickly worked his way up the college football coaching ladder having held multiple assistant coaching positions at Baylor for a total of five years. McGuire also served 14 seasons as head coach for Cedar Hill High School in Texas, where he put together a legendary coaching tenure, going 141-42 and leading the Longhorns to three Division 5A Texas High School State Championship victories. Since taking over at Texas Tech, McGuire has maintained an air raid style of offense for the Red Raiders, with his team currently ranking 13th in the nation in passing offense averaging 307.0 yards per game through the air.

RED RAIDERS SCOUTING REPORT

Entering their TaxAct Texas Bowl matchup with the Rebels with a record of 7-5 overall and a 5-4 mark in Big 12 play this season, Texas Tech will look to their pass-heavy offensive playbook to navigate the Ole Miss secondary. Leading the Red Raider offense will be senior quarterback Tyler Shough, the team's opening day starter who missed most of the season with a shoulder injury but returned late in the year to lead the team to a 3-0 record in the final three games of the year. Shough will aim to connect with Texas Tech's leading receiver and All-Big 12 Honorable Mention honoree Jerand Bradley, who enters the team's bowl game matchup with 656 receiving yards and five receiving touchdowns on the year. The Red Raider defense is anchored by the presence of first team All-American (FWAA) Tyree Wilson, with the senior outside linebacker leading Texas Tech and ranking third in the Big 12 in total sacks on the year with seven. A projected top 10 pick in the upcoming NFL Draft, Wilson also leads the Red Raiders and the Big 12 with 14 TFLs this season. Wilson is accompanied by senior defensive back and Second-Team All-Big 12 selection Malik Dunlap, who ranks the best in the conference with 11 pass breakups in the 2022 season.

TEXAS TECH SERIES HISTORY

- This marks the seventh all-time meeting between Ole Miss and Texas Tech, with the Rebels leading 4-2 overall.
- This will be the fourth bowl meeting between the Rebels and Red Raiders ... Ole Miss leads 3-0 with bowl wins in the 1986 Independence Bowl (20-17), the 1998 Independence Bowl (35-18) and the 2009 Cotton Bowl (47-34).

OLE MISS BOWL HISTORY

The 2022 TaxAct Texas Bowl will be Ole Miss' 40th bowl appearance in program history, as well as the first ever appearance in the Texas Bowl. The Rebels' all-time bowl record stands at 24-14, excluding a vacated victory in the 2013 BBVA Compass Bowl. The Rebels lead the SEC and rank third in the NCAA in bowl win percentage at .632. Elsewhere in the bowl record book, Ole Miss is 15th nationally in bowl wins and 25th in bowl appearances. Ole Miss is 12-3 in its last 15 bowl games, including a streak of six straight victories from 2002 to 2013. The 2022 Texas Bowl will also mark the 16th time the Rebels will take on a current Big 12 opponent in their bowl history.

RECENT BOWL SUCCESS

- Ole Miss is 12-3 on the field in its last 15 bowl games dating back to a 13-0 win over Air Force in the 1992 Liberty Bowl.

OFFENSE FLYING HIGH IN KIFFIN ERA

The Rebels under head coach **Lane Kiffin** have sported one of most dynamic offenses in the NCAA, as well as within the Ole Miss record book. Kiffin's Ole Miss teams are each responsible for three of the five best offensive seasons in school history, led by 555.5 total yards per game (5,555 yards) by the 2020 squad that ended the season ranked No. 3 in total offense nationally. His 2021 team ranks fourth in school history at 492.5 yards per game (6,402 yards) and finished the season No. 6 in the FBS, and the 2022 Rebels currently rank fifth in school history and No. 8 in the FBS at 491.3 yards per game (5,895 yards). Impressively, Kiffin's Ole Miss teams have done so with a balanced offensive attack, ranking seventh in the FBS in passing in 2020 (344.9 ypg) before shifting toward the running game in 2021 with the No. 12 ground game (217.6 ypg) and this season's powerful 261.6 yards per game average that leads Power-5 and ranks No. 3 in all of the FBS.

BIG NUMBERS

Helping drive those historic offensive season numbers this year are a handful of monster offensive performances. Against Arkansas on Nov. 19, the Rebels racked up 703 yards of total offense, the fifth-most in school history that gave head coach **Lane Kiffin** three of the five total 700-yard games in Ole Miss history alongside 708 vs. South Carolina in 2020 and 707 vs. Tulane in 2021. Kiffin also owns 20 games with 600 yards of total offense while at Ole Miss, a feat that was accomplished only 16 times from the beginning of the Ole Miss football program in 1893 until Kiffin's arrival in 2020.

Ole Miss ran for a season-high 463 yards at Arkansas, the third-most in program history and the most since rushing for 515 vs. Auburn in 1951. Earlier this year, the Rebels also recorded the sixth-most rushing yards in a single-game against Auburn on Oct. 15, with 448 yards on the ground. At Texas A&M on Oct. 29, the Rebel ground game tallied 390 of the 530 total offensive yards for Ole Miss in its 31-28 win over the Aggies, the most allowed by a Texas A&M defense since yielding a school record 393 to the Vince Young-led Texas Longhorns on Nov. 28, 2003. Ole Miss is currently the only Power-5 school to have multiple 400-yard rushing games this season. Furthermore, those two 400-yard games make Ole Miss the lone school to do so against multiple Power-5 teams, with the only other 400-yard performances against Power-5 schools being Air Force's 435 yards against Colorado (Sept. 10), Texas' 427 against Kansas (Nov. 19), Michigan's 418 against Penn State (Oct. 15) and UCLA's 402 against Arizona State (Nov. 5).

Out of the eight FBS schools to crack 700 yards in a game this year, Ole Miss owns a 101-yard edge in season-best rushing performance, with the Rebels' second-best outing against Auburn (448) still ranking 86 yards ahead of the next best rushing season high from Tennessee (362 at Vanderbilt).

POUND THE ROCK

Ole Miss isn't just running the ball well, it's running the ball a lot. The Rebels stand as one of two Power-5 teams with 5,000 yards of total offense (5,895, No. 16 FBS) and 3,000 yards rushing (3,139, No. 4 FBS) alongside Michigan. The Rebels' No. 4 rushing attack only ranks behind the triple-option oriented service academies Air Force (3,971), Army (3,473) and then Michigan (3,159), which has played one more game due to the Big 10 Championship Game. Ole Miss also ranks tied for 16th among FBS schools in rushing touchdowns with 31. Removed one year from having one of the most feared passing attacks in college football, Ole Miss now sits as one of just two Power-5 programs (alongside Michigan) to have 5,000 yards of total offense with at least 50 percent of its yards coming on the ground. Ole Miss sits fourth among Power-5 schools in both rushing offense percentage (53.2 percent) and percentage of rushing plays against total plays (62.3 percent).

JUDKINS IN THE RUNNING FOR FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

Ole Miss RB **Quinshon Judkins** has been selected as a finalist for the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award, the Maxwell Football Club recently announced. The Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award has been presented to the College Freshman Player of the Year since 2018 and is named in honor of Shaun Alexander, a former standout at the University of Alabama and with the Seattle Seahawks in the NFL. Judkins burst onto the scene as a true freshman and has made an immediate impact for an Ole Miss offense that leads the SEC and ranks No. 3 nationally in rushing yards per game (261.6 ypg) behind only Air Force (330.9) and Army (289.4). Judkins leads the SEC and ranks top-10 nationally in rushing touchdowns (7th, 16), total touchdowns (7th, 17), rushing yards (7th, 1,476) and rushing yards per game (9th, 123.0), while also ranking national top-30 in points per game (18th, 8.5; 4th SEC), all-purpose yardage per game (19th, 132.7; 3rd SEC), total points scored (23rd, 102; 4th SEC) and yards per carry (29th, 5.9; 4th SEC). Judkins has broken both the Ole Miss single-season rushing touchdown record (16), the single-season rushing yards record (1,476), the single-season rushing attempts record (251), the single-season record for games with multiple rushing touchdowns (6) and the single-season record for 100-yard rushing games (8). He also is currently tied for both the all-purpose touchdown record (17) and most single-season points scored by a non-kicker (102), while also currently sitting fourth in single-season all-purpose yardage (1,592), seventh on the career 100-yard games list (8) and tied for seventh on the single-season scoring list (102). In the single-game ranks, Judkins is one of two Rebels to ever record multiple 200-yard rushing games, with his 214-yard outing at Arkansas ranking No. 10 and his 205 yards at Texas A&M resting at No. 13. The winner of the fifth annual Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year award will be announced on Dec. 29.

JUDKINS SMASHES ALL-TIME RUSHING RECORD

True freshman RB **Quinshon Judkins** stands as the best single-season rusher in Ole Miss history after his 214-yard performance at Arkansas pushed him past fullback Kayo Dottley's 1949 record of 1,312 yards. In the 73 years since the All-American Dottley set that record in just 10 total games played, no Rebel had eclipsed 1,200 rushing yards in a season, let alone 1,300. Judkins now sits atop the list at 1,476 yards on the season. Only nine Rebels have ever rushed for 1,000 yards in a season, and Judkins and Dottley are the only Rebels to reach 1,000 in nine games, with Dottley notching 1,113 through nine contests and Judkins 1,036.

Ole Miss stands as one of just 11 FBS schools with three 500-yard rushers alongside Air Force, Auburn, Florida, Georgia, Georgia State, Louisville, North Texas, Ohio State, Oregon, UCF and UTSA. QB **Jaxson Dart** ranks 15th among FBS quarterbacks in rushing at 548 yards, which is also good for No. 4 in the SEC among fellow signalcallers.

TWO-HEADED MONSTER

Ole Miss possesses the most powerful one-two rushing punch in all of college football in true freshman RB **Quinshon Judkins** and junior RB **Zach Evans**, who own a combined 2,375 yards on the ground this season. With Judkins at his school record 1,476 yards and Evans at 899, no other rushing tandem in the nation has 890 yards apiece. The closest school is Michigan, which has Blake Corum's 1,463 and Donovan Edwards' 872. Only two other schools have at least two rushers beyond 800 yards (Penn State, UAB), with an additional two with multiple 750-yard rushers (Oregon, UCF). At those 2,375 combined yards, the Judkins/Evans tandem would rank No. 31 in the FBS as their own team. Judkins (214) and Evans (207) combined for 421 yards at Arkansas on Nov. 19, marking the first time in SEC history and just the eighth time in FBS history that one team had two rushers with at least 200 yards on the ground.

DOUBLE TROUBLE

In addition to the fearsome one-two punch on the ground of Judkins and Evans, Ole Miss also possesses a talented receiving duo in senior wideouts **Malik Heath** and **Jonathan Mingo**. Combined, the pair own 1,642 yards receiving this season, with Heath hauling in 834 and Mingo 808. Currently, Ole Miss stands as one of just nine FBS programs with multiple FBS receivers this year alongside Akron, Arizona, ECU, Ohio State, Tulsa, UTSA, Washington and WKU. Combined with Judkins' 1,476 and Evans' 899 yards rushing, Ole Miss is the lone FBS program with multiple 800-yard rushers and multiple 800-yard receivers. In the Ole Miss record books, this marks just the second time ever that two Rebels have eclipsed 800 yards receiving and the first since the 2018 season, when A.J. Brown set the single-season record at 1,320 yards, while DaMarkus Lodge added 877 yards of his own.

TOUCHDOWN KING

Quinshon Judkins became Ole Miss' all-time single-season rushing touchdown leader after a two-score performance against Alabama on Nov. 12, first tying the record with his 14th score in the first quarter and then breaking the record first set in 1949 with his second TD in the second quarter. His 16 total rushing scores this year breaks the previous record set by four Rebel greats who crossed the goal line 14 times in one season: Kayo Dottley in 1949, Archie Manning in 1969, Deuce McAllister in 2000 and Brandon Bolden in 2010. Judkins has also scored multiple touchdowns on the ground in six games this season, breaking the single-season record of five set by both Bolden (2010) and McAllister (1999, 2000). Judkins scored multiple touchdowns in three consecutive games earlier this year, becoming the first Rebel to do so since Bolden did in four straight in 2010.

Judkins' speed has put him in rare company as well. He passed the 1,000 yard rushing mark against Texas A&M on Oct. 29 in just his ninth collegiate game -- putting him into an elite group of true freshman SEC running backs. Judkins' 1,036 yards through nine games only ranks behind two legends in SEC history among the fastest true freshman to 1,000 yards: Emmitt Smith's 1,011 yards through an NCAA record seven games during his freshman year at Florida in 1987, and Herschel Walker's 1,096 yards through eight games in his first year at Georgia in 1980. Overall, Judkins was the 144th freshman running back in FBS history to break 1,000 yards for a season and one of 21 in SEC history. Among all freshmen (redshirts included), Judkins is the fastest in the SEC to break 1,000 yards since Georgia redshirt freshman Knowshon Moreno hit 1,003 yards through nine games in 2007.

QUICKLY TO 1,000

Among the FBS ranks, Judkins' nine-game burn to 1,000 yards is among the fastest by a freshman over the last several seasons. Judkins is one of six FBS freshmen to do so in at least nine games since 2017, ranking behind only Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor in 2017, who tied the NCAA record with 1,112 yards in seven games en route to his NCAA freshman record 1,977 yard season, and Oregon State's Jermar Jefferson, who hit 1,034 yards in eight games for the Beavers in 2018. This year, Judkins is the only freshman at 1,000 yards and is among 37 FBS rushers to have crossed the plateau.

ANCHOR ON THE LINE

Senior starting left guard **Nick Broeker** has been a stalwart member of the Ole Miss offensive line his entire career, but has been particularly stout for the Rebels in 2022. The Springfield, Illinois, native has started all 12 games for the Rebels at left guard, playing in nearly all offensive snaps (907). Broeker hasn't allowed a sack in 505 pass blocking snaps and is anchor for an Ole Miss offense that ranks No. 3 in the FBS in rushing yards per game (261.6) and No. 8 in total offense (491.2). Broeker is a member of offensive line unit that has helped blocked for a rushing attack that features the only team in the country with two players over 890 yards rushing. Ole Miss is one of only two FBS teams with more than 5,500 yards of total offense and more than 3,000 yards rushing. For his efforts, Broeker has earned second-team All-America from both Walter Camp and the Football Writers Association of America. He also has been named second-team All-SEC by the league coaches, and he became the fourth Rebel to ever win the Kent Hull Trophy, which is given out annually to the top offensive lineman in the state of Mississippi.

NO SACKS FOR YOU!

The Ole Miss offensive line ranks third in the SEC and 21st in FBS, yielding just 1.8 sacks per game. Only four opponents -- Alabama, LSU, Arkansas and Mississippi State -- have been able to get to the Rebel quarterback multiple times, doing so in Ole Miss' lone losses of the season. The Rebel offensive line unit has been recognized as one of the top in college football as a member of the Joe Moore Award Midseason Honor Roll for its efforts in protecting the quarterback.

SACKS APLENTY

Ole Miss ranks third in the SEC and No. 28 in the FBS with 2.8 sacks per game. DE **Tavius Robinson** leads with 6.0 sacks, including two games with multiple sacks against Auburn (2.0 for loss of 16 yards) and Mississippi State (2.0 for loss of 18 yards). LB **Khari Coleman** ranks second at 4.5, followed by DE **Cedric Johnson**'s 4.0 and **Jared Ivey**'s 3.5. A total of 12 different Rebels have at least 1.0 or more sacks for Ole Miss this year. Ole Miss has recorded at least three sacks in eight of the 12 games played this season, and at least two in nine of 12 contests.

BIG LEG JON

K **Jonathan Cruz** is 6-of-8 in his collegiate career on field goals from 50 yards or more, including a 53-yard FG vs. No. 7 Kentucky. Cruz's kick tied for the sixth longest kick in school history and the longest since 2012 (Bryson Rose vs Arkansas). A transfer from Charlotte, Cruz holds the 49ers' school record with five field goals made 50-plus yards, including a program-best two 56-yard field goals. He also has had 39 of his 71 kickoffs in 2022 go for touchbacks. This year, Cruz is 15-of-17 overall and 7-of-8 from 40 yards or further, he has hit at least one field goal in eight straight games, and he has five multi-field goal games this season. His 88.2 percent field goal clip ranks second in the SEC and 19th in the FBS, and at 92 points scored this year Cruz ranks No. 10 on the Ole Miss single-season list -- No. 7 among Rebel kickers.

BY LAND OR BY AIR

The Rebels have held a fearsome rushing offense throughout 2022, but a bombastic aerial showing against Vanderbilt put Ole Miss right into the discussion nationally as a feared passing attack as well. Ole Miss is the only school in the FBS with a single-game 440-yard passer (**Jaxson Dart**, vs. Vanderbilt, 448 yards), a 240-yard receiver (**Jonathan Mingo**, 247 yards, vs. Vanderbilt) and a 200-yard rusher (3x: **Quinshon Judkins**, at Arkansas, 214 yards; **Zach Evans**, at Arkansas, 207 yards; **Quinshon Judkins**, at Texas A&M, 205 yards). Ole Miss is also currently one of just three FBS schools and four Power-5 schools to have a 1,400-yard rusher (Judkins, 1,476 yards, No. 7 FBS) and an 800-yard receiver (Mingo, 808 yards, No. 67 FBS; **Malik Heath**, 834 yards, No. 57 FBS), alongside Ball State and Pitt, with Ole Miss being the only school of this category with multiple 800-yard receivers.

AND MINGO WAS HIS NAME-O

Jonathan Mingo's performance vs. Vanderbilt during Week 6 not only ranks tops in the Ole Miss record books, but it also still ranks at the top of the FBS leaderboard. Mingo's 247-yard day topped the previous best of 246 set by Kent State's Dante Cephas against Ohio on Oct. 1. Mingo's game against the Commodores ranks 40 yards better than the next-best performance by an SEC receiver this season (Tennessee's Jalin Hyatt, 207 yards, vs. Alabama) and 10 yards better than any receiver against a Power-5 defense (Nebraska's Trey Palmer, 237 yards, vs. Purdue). Mingo is one of just 15 FBS receivers to cross the 200-yard plateau in a game this season.

GOIN' DEEP

WR **Jonathan Mingo** has been particularly dangerous from far away, recording 13 receptions of at least 20 yards, 10 of at least 25, nine of at least 30, five of at least 40, four of at least 50 and two beyond 70 yards. He ranks eighth in yards per reception (16.8). Mingo has set his career-long reception three times this season, starting with a 51-yard strike against Central Arkansas and his two 70-yard touchdowns against Vanderbilt of 72 and 71 yards. In his career, Mingo owns 18 receptions of at least 30 yards, seven of at least 40, five of at least 50 and two beyond 70 yards. From 30 yards or further in his career, Mingo has hauled in five total touchdowns.

KD HILL RECEIVES CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD, WILL WEAR NO. 38

Ole Miss DT **KD Hill** was recently named the winner of the 2022 Chucky Mullins Courage Award. The award, sponsored by Phi Beta Sigma fraternity, honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. A native of Eufaula, Alabama, Hill becomes the 32nd recipient in the 33-year history of the award. Hill will wear Mullins' No. 38 number throughout the 2022 season.

HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin is in his third season at Ole Miss and has helped lead the Rebels to three straight bowl appearances in his first few years in Oxford.

Kiffin is in his 11th year at the NCAA level and has posted an all-time record of 84-46, including a 23-12 mark at Ole Miss.

The Rebels once again rank amongst the top of the nation in multiple offensive statistics this season. Ole Miss is No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (261.6) and No. 7 in total offense (491.2). Kiffin has helped mentor and recruit talented true freshman running back Quinshon Judkins. Judkins set the Ole Miss single-season record in both rushing yards (1,476) and rushing touchdowns (16).

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. That included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, part of an ongoing nine-game home win streak for Kiffin's teams.

The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll; its highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg).

The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer

points per game this season compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. Wide receiver Elijah Moore and quarterback Matt Corral were two of the main cogs in the Rebels' high-powered offense.

Moore earned first-team consensus All-America accolades after a historic and shortened 2020 junior season. The Fort Lauderdale, Florida, native hauled in a school record 86 receptions for 1,193 yards and eight touchdowns during his last season in a Rebel uniform. Moore, a Biletnikoff finalist, led the country in receiving yards per game (149.1) and receptions per game (10.8).

Corral became just the fourth SEC player ever to finish as the NCAA leader in total offense per game (384.9), joining Pat Sullivan (1970), Rex Grossman (2001) and Johnny Manziel (2012). The signal-caller also finished No. 5 in passing yards per game (333.7), No. 7 in passing TDs (29), No. 9 in passing efficiency (177.6) and No. 11 in passing yards per completion (14.5).

The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set last season during the

Tigers' run to a national title.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first seasons at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

Kiffin has 12 years of head coaching experience, including nine years at the NCAA level where he has posted an all-time record of 76-42.

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record this season, including Saturday's 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls lead the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also leads C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-

best turnaround in FBS history. Along the way, 41 individual or team records were amassed, and an FAU-record 21 players earned All-Conference USA recognition.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3. Statistically, the Owls finished in the top-25 in 16 team categories, including: No. 2 in passes intercepted, No. 5 in first down offense, No. 6 in rushing offense, No. 8 in kickoff return defense, red zone offense and turnovers lost, and No. 9 in total offense and turnover margin (by comparison, FAU was No. 72 the previous season in total offense and No. 99 in turnovers gained).

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year. He was a finalist for the Manning Award, the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, a semifinalist for the Walter Camp Player of the Year and the Davey O'Brien Award, presented annually to the nation's top quarterback.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranks as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns. Henry's 2,219 yards was also the fifth-most rushing yards in a single season in college football history.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying a starting quarterback and then developing Blake Sims in 2014. With three-year starter and All-American AJ McCarron off to the NFL, Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards and 3,837 yards of total offense while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. He ranked tied for fourth nationally in total QBR (83.7) and seventh in passing efficiency (157.9). Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of

the Year. Quarterback Matt Barkley, who won the Wuerffel Trophy, set conference records for passing yards and passing touchdowns.

Kiffin led the Trojans to a 10-2 record in 2011 and a sixth-place finish in the final Associated Press poll. The team finished first in the Pac-12 South with a 7-2 mark. His 2011 USC offense produced a 3,500-yard passer, a pair of 1,000-yard receivers and a 1,000-yard rusher. Three Trojans earned First Team All-America honors (Matt Kalil, Robert Woods and T.J. McDonald) and five were named Freshman All-Americans.

In his first year as the head coach at USC, Kiffin led the Trojans to an 8-5 record (5-4 Pac-10). Before his arrival, the Trojans were averaging 26.5 points per game in scoring offense and 389.1 yards per game in total offense. In his first two seasons, those numbers increased to 31.0 points per game and 431.5 yards in 2011 and 35.8 points and 456.8 yards in 2012.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures. Tennessee improved from 17.3 to 29.3 points per game while going from 268.8 to 383.5 yards per game in total offense.

Kiffin came to Tennessee from the Oakland Raiders, where he served as head coach from 2007-08. At 31, he was the youngest head coach in the NFL's modern era. Oakland's offense significantly improved in his first year, up 7.2 points per game and 48.6 yards per game from 2006.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). During his first tenure with the Trojans, USC captured two national championships and compiled a 65-12 record. Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

He took over as USC's offensive coordinator in 2005 and led the Trojans to a scoring average of 49.1 points per game and 579.8 yards per game of total offense during his two years as offensive coordinator. Kiffin started at USC in 2001 as the tight ends coach and then coached the wide receivers during his remaining five years.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Colorado State in 1999 as a graduate assistant. He spent the 2000 season as defensive quality control assistant with the Jacksonville Jaguars under Tom Coughlin.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

GAME ONE #21 OLE MISS 28, TROY 10

Sept. 3, 2022

Attendance: 60,533 • Vaught-Hemingway Stadium • Oxford, Miss.

OXFORD, Miss. — New names and faces were an important part of the outcome as the Rebels defeated the Troy Trojans, 28-10, on Saturday afternoon.

A total of 27 new Rebels made their debut on Saturday, helping push Ole Miss to its 10th straight home victory dating back to Nov. 14, 2020 — the longest home winning streak in program history since winning 33 in a row from Nov. 1, 1952 to Nov. 7, 1964.

Defensively, junior TCU transfer Khari Coleman was a one-man wrecking crew in his Rebel debut, terrorizing the Troy backfield with 5.0 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks on eight total tackles — marking just the third time since 1999 that a Rebel has notched at least 5.0 tackles for loss, joining Mark Robertson's 5.0 in 2021 and Kendrick Clancy's 6.0 in 1999. After Ole Miss won the opening coin toss and deferred, Troy took the kickoff and had an eight-play drive to midfield. But the Trojans stalled there as the Rebel defense stepped up. Dart was 1-for-3 on his first drive as a Rebel that also stalled for Ole Miss near midfield.

After another early Troy drive produced nothing, the Rebels went to work for the game's first points. Nine plays and 82 yards later, Ulysses Bentley IV took it in from two yards out for a touchdown, and the PAT by Jonathan Cruz made it 7-0 Rebels with 2:25 to go in the first. On that drive Dart connected on a 16-yard pass to Jonathan Mingo, and a big Evans rush of 46 yards setup the Bentley score.

Ole Miss added two touchdowns in the second quarter, a two-yard scamper by Mingo and then another two-yard rush, this time by the freshman Judkins to the right pylon to give Ole Miss an early 21-0 lead with 6:38 to go in the first half.

Troy got its first points of the game to end the first half on a 31-yard field goal by Brooks Buce as time expired, making it a 21-3 game at the break.

The Rebels took the second half opening kickoff and impressively drove 75 yards in 13 plays, capped by a 12-yard touchdown pass from Dart to senior wide receiver Malik Heath. The extra point by Cruz made it 28-3 Rebels, and even though there was a lot of time remaining, this one was all but over less than five minutes into the third quarter.

Later in the quarter, Ole Miss seemed poised for more points at the Troy 22 after Miles Battle intercepted a Gunnar Watson pass with 6:26 to go in the third. But on the very next play, Dart was intercepted in the end zone by the Trojans' Markeis Colvin.

In the fourth quarter, Troy scored its lone touchdown on fourth and goal at the Rebel 3-yard line on a pass from Watson to Rajae Johnson, the end of a 39-yard drive that took 11 plays. The point after by Buce was good, and it was 28-10.

GAME TWO #22 OLE MISS 59, CENTRAL ARKANSAS 3

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss grabbed the lead from the jump and never looked back in a dominant 59-3 victory over Central Arkansas at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday night. The Rebels played well in all three facets of the game with seven touchdowns on offense, as well as one on special teams, while forcing four turnovers.

After winning the coin toss and taking the kickoff, Altmyer immediately took a shot down the sideline to Mingo for a 36-yard gain. Ole Miss ran the ball four straight times before Altmyer punched the first score of the game with a 7-yard touchdown pass to Trigg.

The Rebel defense stopped Central Arkansas' offense on its first drive and forced a punt. The Bears' fumbled the snap, which was picked off the ground by Tennison and taken to the end zone. Central Arkansas was unable to get anything going on offense on the ensuing drive, and Ole Miss blocked a punt to regain the ball on the UCA's 4-yard line. It took two plays for Altmyer and Trigg to connect on their second touchdown of the night.

Following a Bears' three-and-out, Ole Miss would score once more before the end of the first quarter. He put the offense in position to score with a 26-yard pass to Malik Heath down the middle of the field on a 1st-and-24.

The scoring settled down in the second quarter as Cruz's field goal were the only points of the frame. Ole Miss went into the half leading 31-0.

Ole Miss ramped it back up to start the second half. The defense forced a three-and-out, giving the ball to the Rebel offense. On the second play of the drive, Dart launched a 51-yard bomb to Mingo with an incredible catch over the Bears' cornerback. Two plays later, Zach Evans bulldozed his way into the endzone. On the very next drive, Dart found Dayton Wade behind the defense for a 39-yard reception. The next play, he located Trigg open to the left for six, extending the Rebel lead to 45 after the Cruz extra point. Trigg became just the 11th Rebel to score three touchdowns in a single game.

The Rebels' offense continued to command the game as they crossed the goal line one more time before the third quarter finished.

In the fourth, Central Arkansas marched down the field, cutting a big chunk of the field by throwing it deep for 36 yards. However, the Bears settled for a field to get on the board, down 52-3. The Rebels would add a late TD for the 59-3 victory.

#17 OLE MISS 42, GEORGIA TECH 0

ATLANTA — Ole Miss was dominant in its first road contest of the year on Saturday, as the Rebels ran right through Bobby Dodd Stadium to take a convincing 42-0 victory from Georgia Tech.

From the opening drive it looked like Ole Miss (3-0) was on a mission in Atlanta, as the three-headed Rebel backfield of Zach Evans, Quinshon Judkins and Ulysses Bentley IV put together their best performance of the season against Georgia Tech (1-2) to help lead the Rebels to a season-high 316 rushing yards on the day, as well as six total rushing touchdowns.

Evans (18 carries, 134 yards), Judkins (19 carries, 98 yards) and Bentley IV (eight carries, 27 yards) each finished with two rushing touchdowns apiece, marking the first time three Rebels recorded at least two rushing touchdowns since the team's 1979 matchup with Vanderbilt.

The Rebel defense also played a major role in the team's win over the Yellow Jackets, pitching their first full-game shutout since 2014 when Ole Miss took down Presbyterian, 48-0. The Ole Miss defense stonewalled Georgia Tech, allowing just 214 total yards along with seven total sacks on the day. The stout Rebel defensive unit has allowed only 13 points through its first three games of 2022, and have held opponents scoreless in nine of 12 quarters this season — including seven of the last eight.

The Rebels got to work right away after receiving the opening kickoff, as the Jaxson Dart led offense marched down the field on a 74-yard scoring drive that only took 1:21 off the clock in five plays before it was capped off with an Evans 3-yard touchdown run. Despite only completing one pass on the opening drive, Dart would still record a season-high 207 yards through the air for the Rebels on a 10-of-16 clip before his day would come to an end.

Momentum remained in the Rebels' corner on the defensive side of the ball, when a three-and-out drive for the Yellow Jackets led to a punt being blocked and recovered by Cedric Johnson at the Georgia Tech 20-yard line. The Rebels would capitalize on the field position, with Judkins running for a 7-yard touchdown to put Ole Miss up 14-0 early in Atlanta.

Johnson's punt block marks the second of the season for the Rebel special teams unit, as well as the first time that an Ole Miss team has had two punt blocks in a single season since 2007. It also stands as the first time the Rebels have blocked a punt in consecutive games since 1998.

The second quarter saw Evans continue his dominance running the ball, as he ripped off a 26-yard touchdown scamper to bump the Ole Miss lead up to 21-0, while hitting 100 first-half rushing yards for the second time this season. The Rebel defense held strong for the remainder of the frame, holding the Yellow Jackets scoreless into the halftime break.

It marked the second consecutive game in which Ole Miss has held their opponent to under 250 total yards on offense.

#13 OLE MISS 35, TULSA 27

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss anticipated an aerial shootout against Tulsa's top-ranked passing offense, but a tough Rebel running game and a defensive effort that never fully broke helped the 13th-ranked Rebels hold on, 35-27, over the Golden Hurricane on Saturday.

The Rebels (4-0) battled back from an early 14-7 first quarter deficit to take a 35-17 halftime lead over Tulsa (2-2), but the second half became a defensive slugfest highly dependent on the running game and field position.

On the ground, Ole Miss tallied 308 of its 462 total yards, led by another impressive showing from freshman running back Quinshon Judkins, who ended the day on a career-high 140 yards and two scores on 27 carries. Today's matchup marks the first time since 1999 that Ole Miss has had at least one 100-yard rusher in four consecutive games, as well as the first time since at least 1976 in available game-by-game data that Ole Miss has opened the year with four straight games with a 100-yard rusher.

Judkins had three runs of 20 yards or more, and his two touchdowns in the second quarter pushes him to five in four games.

Judkins, starting quarterback Jaxson Dart (13 carries, 116 yards) and Zach Evans (10 carries, 48 yards, 1 TD) all secured high numbers in the rushing game for the Rebels, while Malik Heath (4 catches, 75 yards, 1 TD) and Jonathan Mingo (3 catches, 54 yards, 1 TD) hauled in 129 of Ole Miss' 154 passing yards.

It was an offensive back-and-forth battle as both teams secured at least 450 yards on offense, but the Rebels were able to put up the points needed in the first half, while the defense closed out the game in the back half.

The Rebel defense stymied Tulsa's FBS-leading passing attack to 218 yards fewer than its No. 1 ranked average of 413 yards per game entering, throwing for just 195 on Saturday.

Holding off a late surge by Tulsa, the Rebels held on for their 35-27 win over the Golden Hurricane, moving to 4-0 as the team heads into its first SEC game of the year against Kentucky.

GAME FIVE #11 OLE MISS 22, #7 KENTUCKY 19

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss recovered two Kentucky fumbles to preserve a dramatic 22-19 victory and move to 5-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC play. The Wildcats fell to 4-1 and 1-1.

With the Rebels clinging to a three-point lead, a 26-yard field goal by Jonathan Cruz their only points of the second half, it was the Ole Miss defense which saved the day.

Ole Miss jumped out to an early 14-0 lead, but this one would be far from over. Dart was the key to the Rebels' first scoring drive. In six plays from his own 35-yard line, the Rebel signal-caller had Ole Miss in the end zone. Zach Evans took it in from the 4 for his lone touchdown of the day. Cruz made the extra point and Ole Miss led 7-0 with 7:09 to go in the first quarter.

After Kentucky placekicker Matt Ruffolo missed a 39-yard field goal, Ole Miss moved downfield for another touchdown. Quinshon Judkins burst through the middle of the line and raced 48 yards for a touchdown, a beautiful run that had those in red and blue among the capacity crowd roaring their approval. The point after by Cruz made it 14-0 with 59 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

The Rebels' own defense was also able to slow down a potent Wildcat offensive attack. However, UK did answer the two early touchdowns with one of its own.

Kentucky's Barion Brown returned the kickoff from his own goal line to the Ole Miss 15 to set things up for the visitors. Christopher Rodriguez's touchdown rush of 10 yards cut the UM lead to 14-6. The first quarter ended with Ole Miss up eight points.

After the Rebels' subsequent drive stalled, Fraser Masin punted to Kentucky and the ball was downed at the 1-yard line. Tavius Robinson of Ole Miss was then credited with a sack as Levis delivered the football in the right flat - to nobody. The ruling was intentional grounding, and a safety was awarded to the Rebels for a 16-6 UM lead.

On fourth and 20, Cruz connected on a 53-yard field goal, and Ole Miss led 19-6 with 7:03 to go before halftime. The kick was tied for sixth longest field goal in school history and the longest since Bryson Rose kicked a game-winner against Arkansas in Little Rock in 2012.

A nine-play drive capped by a Levis to Robinson touchdown pass of five yards made the score 19-12. The extra point kick was not attempted with a bobbled snap and a tackle by Ole Miss. There was 1:23 left before halftime.

To open the third quarter starting at the UM 49, the Wildcats soon scored on a 17-yard pass from Levis to Jordan Dingle. This time, Ruffolo was good on the extra point. It was 19-19 with 6:22 to go, and it was clearly anybody's ballgame.

Ole Miss started a drive at its own 35 for what would be the game's final points. With 2:19 to go in the third, a Cruz field goal of 26 yards put the Rebels back in front 22-19.

GAME SIX #9 OLE MISS 52, VANDERBILT 28

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Despite entering the game with the No. 4 rush offense in the nation, the Rebels took to the air in record-setting fashion to take down Vanderbilt, 52-28, in Nashville on Saturday.

The Rebels (6-0, 2-0 SEC) saw career days from Jaxson Dart, Jonathan Mingo and Jordan Watkins as the team logged a season-high 591 total yards of offense en route to their road win over the Commodores (3-3, 0-2 SEC) at FirstBank Stadium.

Dart's day ended with the sophomore finishing 25-of-32 for a career-high 448 yards along with a season-high three passing touchdowns. The game ties Dart for fifth in the Ole Miss record books for single-game passing yards, matching Jordan Ta'amu's 2018 performance against Southern Illinois.

Dart's stat-line can be credited in large part to his favorite target on the day, Jonathan Mingo, who broke the Ole Miss single-game receiving record set by Elijah Moore in 2020 (238 yards) by logging nine catches for 247 yards and two touchdowns. The performance shatters Mingo's previous career-high of 136 yards in his standout game last season against Tulane.

Mingo's day also currently stands as the nation's top single-game receiving performance of the year, surpassing Kent State's Dante Cephas, who logged 246 yards through the air a week ago against Ohio.

Also bringing in a career-high in receiving yards on the day was Watkins, who ended his day with 117 yards on seven catches, including a 61-yard touchdown strike in the opening half.

The Rebel backfield still found the endzone on numerous occasions, with the team tallying four rushing touchdowns on the day — including two more from freshman running back Quinshon Judkins. Judkins has now scored touchdowns in each of his last four games, with his eight rushing touchdowns on the year marking the most by an Ole Miss freshman since John Rhys Plumlee scored 12 in 2019.

The Ole Miss defense was headlined by starting safety AJ Finley, who finished with a career-high 13 total tackles.

#9 OLE MISS 48, AUBURN 34

OXFORD, Miss. — Although it took much of the first quarter for points to be scored in Saturday's Southeastern Conference game between No. 9 Ole Miss and Auburn, it then became a scoring fest as the Rebels won 48-34.

Ole Miss is now 7-0 overall and 3-0 in the SEC, while Auburn is 3-4 and 1-3.

The final stats proved that offense was indeed the name of this game. Ole Miss finished with 578 yards, and Auburn had 441. It was the ground game for both teams that was impressive — Ole Miss with 69 rushing attempts for 448 yards, while Auburn ran the football 48 times for 301 yards.

The 448 yards for the Rebels were the fifth most rushing yards in school history for a single game and the most since 1962. Against an SEC opponent, it was the most rushing yards in a game since 1951.

For the first time since 1975, Ole Miss had three 100-yard rushers in a game. Quinshon Judkins and Zach Evans were the Rebels one-two punch on the ground today— Judkins with 25 carries for 139 yards and two touchdowns, while Evans had 136 yards on 21 carries and a touchdown. But quarterback Jaxon Dart also ran effectively with 14 carries for 115 yards.

Dart ended the day 9-for-19 in the passing department for 130 yards, with three touchdowns and one interception. Ole Miss had 29 first downs to 18 for Auburn.

Otis Reese led the Rebels with 10 tackles, four of them solos, while A.J. Finley had eight, including four solos.

The game's first points came with 6:42 to go in the first quarter, a direct result of an interception by the Rebels' Finley of a Robby Ashford pass. After a Dayton Wade run of 11 yards, it was Dart to Wade for a 35-yard touchdown pass that got the day's scoring started. Jonathan Cruz was good on the extra point, and Ole Miss led 7-0.

After a lightning delay of 30 minutes, Auburn was moving downfield in the final two minutes, but an Ashford pass was intercepted by Deantre Prince to seal the win.

BATON ROUGE, La. — No. 7 Ole Miss was able to get another productive day out of freshman running back Quinshon Judkins, but a feisty Tiger defense and the dual-threat capabilities of quarterback Jayden Daniels pushed LSU past the Rebels, 45-20, in Death Valley on Saturday afternoon.

A strong start from the Rebels (7-1, 3-1 SEC) wasn't enough to keep the team's winning streak alive, as a big second half scoring run by the Tigers (6-2, 4-1 SEC) handed Ole Miss its first loss of the season.

Judkins carried the Rebel offense on his back, serving as the team's primary running back and finishing his day with 25 carries, 111 yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns. This now marks the fifth time this season Judkins has rushed for over 100 yards, as well as the fifth time that the Pike Road, Alabama, native has run for two rushing touchdowns in a single game.

Quarterback Jaxon Dart went 19-of-34 for 284 yards passing, primarily linking up with Malik Heath, who ended up with a career-high 145 yards receiving on eight catches.

The Rebels got to work right away on offense, stringing together a five-play, 70-yard drive with only 1:37 coming off the clock before Judkins punched in his first touchdown of the day to put Ole Miss up 7-0. Following a Tiger field goal, the freshman would run in for yet another first quarter rushing touchdown, expanding the Rebel lead to 14-3 with 6:01 to go in the opening quarter.

Jonathan Cruz opened the second frame by drilling a 32-yard field goal for the Rebels, taking the team's lead up to 14 early-on in the quarter. However, a pair of LSU touchdowns from Daniels drew the score level at 17-17 with 8:20 remaining in the half.

Another Cruz field goal, this time from 48 yards out, helped the Rebels carry a 20-17 lead into the halftime locker room over the Tigers.

The second half opened with the Tigers marching down the field to score a goal line touchdown to jump ahead of the Rebels, 24-20, with 8:25 to go in the third. Following an Ole Miss interception, LSU padded its lead with yet another rushing touchdown from Daniels to expand its lead up to 11 with 14:18 remaining on the clock.

LSU didn't let that extra yardage go to waste, putting the game out of reach with an additional pair of rushing touchdowns in the final eight minutes of play to close the door on the Tiger victory.

BRYAN-COLLEGE STATION, Texas — Ole Miss football has a new all-time freshman rushing leader following Saturday night's game at Kyle Field, as Quinshon Judkins and the Rebels pounded the rock in a 31-28 victory over Texas A&M.

The Rebels (8-1, 4-1 SEC) ran their way through College Station with Judkins leading the charge, as Ole Miss' 390 total rushing yards proved too much for the Aggies (3-5, 1-4 SEC) to thwart. Under the lights in Texas, it was the freshman Judkins who shined the brightest, as the Pike Road, Alabama, native netted a new career-high 205 rushing yards en route to becoming the program's freshman rushing leader with 1,036 yards on the year.

Judkins now ranks fifth in program history in both rushing yards and rushing touchdowns (13) in a single season, becoming just the ninth Rebel to ever pass the 1,000 rushing yard mark in a season. Furthermore, Judkins' 205-yard effort on Saturday is just the 12th 200-yard game in Ole Miss history.

The Rebels got the ball moving from the very first snap of the game, leaning heavily on Judkins. To cap the drive off, Dart connected with Dayton Wade on an 18-yard touchdown strike just 1:58 into the game to put the Rebels up seven early.

After some big defensive stops from both teams, Ole Miss would ultimately connect on a 46-yard field goal by Jonathan Cruz to cap off the drive and take the game into halftime trailing 14-10.

A defensive stop by Ole Miss to start off the second half saw its offense backed up deep inside of its own 10-yard line, but that didn't slow the Rebel offense from marching down the field that resulted in Casey Kelly bringing in a touchdown strike from Dart to give the Rebels a 17-14 lead.

The Rebel offense kept their third quarter momentum going with yet another long scoring drive, as Jonathan Mingo took in a touchdown grab from two yards out to cap off the 85-yard drive and boost the team's lead to 24-14 over the Aggies to end the quarter.

A touchdown for the Aggies with 9:11 left on the clock cut the Rebel lead back down to three, but Judkins didn't let that last long as he crossed the 1,000-yard mark on an Ole Miss season-long 61-yard rush. Judkins went on to score from one yard out to put the Rebels back up by 10.

A late touchdown for the Aggies would bring the score back to within three, but one last defensive stop was enough to get the job done as the Rebels would walk out of Kyle Field with the 31-28 road win over Texas A&M.

OXFORD, Miss. — Ole Miss and Alabama waged war for four quarters, but it was the 9th-ranked Crimson Tide that came out on top, 30-24, at a packed Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Saturday.

The Rebels (8-2, 4-2 SEC) got out to a 17-7 lead with 5:09 to go in the first half, but Alabama (8-2, 5-2 SEC) bounced back and outscored Ole Miss 23-7 the remainder of the game. The Rebel offense tallied 403 yards, and the defensive effort kept Ole Miss in the game down the stretch, holding Alabama to just 317 yards of total offense — their fewest since 2012.

Ole Miss opened the scoring after Quinshon Judkins found the end zone from one yard out to put Ole Miss up 7-0 with 1:43 to go in the opening quarter. On the next drive, the Rebel defense got a huge stop from Otis Reese to give Ole Miss the ball back early in the second quarter. Nine plays later, Ole Miss led 10-0 on a 22-yard field goal by Jonathan Cruz.

Alabama responded though, and drove the football 80 yards in seven plays, with Bryce Young connecting on a 19-yard scoring pass to Jermaine Burton to cut the Ole Miss lead to 10-7.

Judkins' second and record-breaking rushing score with 5:09 in the second quarter put the Rebels back in front 17-7, but the Crimson Tide would get a break soon. Zach Evans fumbled at his own 23-yard line with 2:23 to go before the break, and the Tide took advantage. Young connected with Cameron Latu for a touchdown with eight seconds to go before halftime, and Reichard's PAT pulled his team to with 17-14 at halftime.

The Rebel defense got a victory of its own early in the third, stopping the Alabama offense, which had to settle for a 49-yard field goal with 12:31 to go in the third to tie the score 17-17.

Ole Miss answered, though, to regain the lead. Quarterback Jaxon Dart led his troops on an 11-play, 75-yard march for a touchdown. Young continued to lead his team back, finding Ja'Corey Brooks on a five-yard strike to cap off a 14-play drive and knot things up 24-24.

The Crimson Tide took advantage of good field position after a punt in the fourth, as Reichard connected on a 23-yard field goal to retake the lead at 27-24 with 11:19 to go.

Trailing 30-24, Ole Miss got its final shot and entered its two-minute offense with two timeouts at its disposal. Judkins made things happen on the drive, highlighted by a big 35-yard run to the Alabama 31-yard line. After another pickup of 14 yards, Ole Miss was knocking on the door at the Alabama 14, but was unable to convert as an incomplete pass in the endzone to Mingo on fourth down sealed the game.

OLE MISS 27, ARKANSAS 42

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — The Ole Miss rushing attack was out in full force on a cold night in Fayetteville, but early success from the Razorbacks proved too big of a hill to climb as Arkansas came away with the 42-27 win on Saturday night.

Despite Ole Miss (8-3, 4-3 SEC) receiving two huge 200-yard nights on the ground from Quinshon Judkins and Zach Evans, a high-scoring Razorback offense and three defensive takeaways helped Arkansas (6-5, 3-4 SEC) pull away early and hold on late as the Rebel ground attack heated up.

Both Judkins (214 yards, one touchdown) and Evans (207 yards, one touchdown) carried the load for the Rebel offense, marking the first time in school history that two Rebel rushers eclipsed 200 yards in the same game. Saturday's offensive performance ranks third all-time in program history in terms of team rushing yards (463), while the team's total yardage of 703 on the night ranks fifth all-time.

The Razorbacks took full advantage of a Jaxson Dart fumble on the Rebels' opening drive, riding the momentum shift behind the arm of KJ Jefferson as Arkansas connected on a pair of early touchdown passes to jump ahead 14-0.

Jonathan Cruz got the Rebels on the board after converting on a 45-yard field goal try, but the Razorback offense got right back to work, with Jefferson throwing for his third touchdown pass of the half. Another Cruz field goal from 32 yards out saw Ole Miss trail 21-6 with 4:38 remaining in the half.

The turnovers, paired with the running of Arkansas' Raheim Sanders, helped the Razorbacks take a 35-6 lead into the locker room at the break. Of Sanders' 232 yards rushing, 153 yards and two touchdowns came in the first half alone.

Sanders opened the second half much like the first, with the sophomore ripping off a 68-yard touchdown scamper to bump the Razorback lead up to 36 points.

The Rebel offense found some traction in the fourth quarter, though, behind their backfield of Judkins and Evans as both running backs found their way into the endzone to cut down the Arkansas lead. Judkins also made history on the day as the game came to a close, eclipsing the Ole Miss single-season rushing record of 1,312 yards set by Kayo Dottley in 1949.

OXFORD, Miss. — In the 119th Egg Bowl matchup between two in-state rival teams, the Ole Miss Rebels fought through a rainy Thanksgiving night at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium to fall in a close-knit battle to the Mississippi State Bulldogs, 22-24.

The Rebel defense gave Ole Miss (8-4, 4-4) multiple momentum sparks, forcing three fumbles into turnovers against the Mississippi State (8-4, 4-4) offense. Troy Brown (14), Otis Reese (11), and Tysheem Johnson (10) all walked away with double-digit tackles for the night — Brown and Reese earning season-high numbers.

Ole Miss struck first with a 32-yard field goal from Jonathan Cruz to make it a 3-0 game with 12:16 left in the opening quarter. Mississippi State responded quickly, driving down the field in 10 plays before Jo'quavious Marks completed the drive running up the middle into the end zone to bounce the game back in the Bulldogs' favor.

After an up-tempo drive where Ole Miss gained 58 yards down the field, the Bulldogs stalled the Rebels in the red zone, forcing them to settle with a Cruz 33-yard field goal with 1:33 left in the first quarter.

The following drive led the Ole Miss offense to the Mississippi State 39-yard line. The Rebels looked to Cruz for a 49-yard field goal attempt, which Cruz completed right up the middle for Ole Miss to take back the lead 9-7 in the second quarter.

The drive was highlighted by the run game with a 17-yard rush by Quinshon Judkins to put the Rebels inside the 10. On a fourth down conversion on the three-yard line, a trick play was brought to perfect execution with a completed pass to JJ Pegues in the end zone to give Ole Miss its first touchdown of the night.

At the Ole Miss 19, Rogers found Lideatrick Griffin in the end zone to complete the 75-yard drive to end the half with a score of 16-14 in favor of the Rebels.

The rain came down to begin the second half, bringing out big-time defensive stops for both teams.

After completing a 78-yard drive, Mississippi State converted a 34-yard field goal to regain the lead, 17-16, in the fourth quarter with 13:46 left in the game.

Following another defensive stop, the Bulldogs connected on a 22-yard touchdown pass from Rogers to Rara Thomas to give Mississippi State an eight-point lead at 24-16.

In the dying minutes, Ole Miss marched down 99 yards ending with a 23-yard pass to Dayton Wade into the end zone to score a touchdown that put the Rebels two points away from equalizing. Ole Miss elected to go for two but ultimately failed to convert, keeping the Rebels behind 22-24.

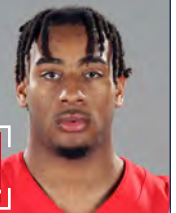

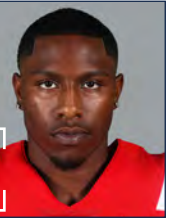

OLE MISS BOWL HISTORY

Ole Miss has a proud tradition of bowling that dates back to 1935, including what once was a national record of consecutive bowl appearances — from 1957 to 1972. It is a high standard of excellence which present-day Ole Miss football teams continue to strive for.

Ed Walker coached the first Ole Miss bowl team, the high-scoring outfit of 1935 which outplayed, but was nipped by Catholic University, 20-19, in the 1936 Orange Bowl.

The next bowl for the Rebels was for the 1947 squad, a 12-year wait. But from there, with Coach John Howard Vaught at the Ole Miss helm, bowls came and kept coming after the Rebels following each season. Vaught took the Rebs to the ill-fated Delta Bowl in 1948, as the 1947 SEC Champions beat Texas Christian 13-9. Vaught had to wait until 1952 to go bowling again, but from that point forward, the Rebel mentor made post-season games a habit that was hard to break.

All-in-all, the Rebels participated in six Sugar Bowls, two Gators, one Cotton, two Bluebonnets, two Liberties, one Sun and one Peach during that run of 15 straight. Vaught's personal bowl record was 10-8, while Billy Kinard's 1971 Rebels, with a 9-2 record, earned a bid to play Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl, which produced a 41-18 triumph.

Ole Miss dropped out of the bowl picture after that 1971 Peach Bowl appearance with Georgia Tech. When Billy Brewer became head coach prior to the 1983 season, the Rebels had not been bowling for 12 years. During Brewer's 11 years as head coach, Ole Miss went to five bowls, twice to the Independence, twice to the Liberty, and once to the Gator. Brewer was 3-2 as a coach in bowl games.

The Rebels returned to postseason action in 1997 for the first time since the 1992 Liberty Bowl, and for the first time under Tommy Tuberville, as Ole Miss was invited to the inaugural Ford Motor City Bowl in Pontiac, Mich., where they defeated Marshall 34-31.



The Rebels then followed with what was probably the biggest upset of the 1998 bowl season, as Ole Miss defeated heavily favored Texas Tech, 35-18, in the Sanford Independence Bowl in head coach David Cutcliffe's debut. Ole Miss went 4-1 in the five bowl games it played in under Cutcliffe as head coach, including three victories in the Independence Bowl, and one victory in the Cotton Bowl (2004).

Ole Miss returned to the Cotton Bowl in 2009 and 2010 under Houston Nutt, who led the Rebels to 47-34 and 21-7 victories, respectively.

Under first-year head coach Hugh Freeze, Ole Miss defeated Pittsburgh 38-17 in the BBVA Compass Bowl on Jan. 5, 2013, although the game was later vacated by NCAA ruling. The Rebels set a number of BBVA Compass Bowl records, including most points scored by a team (38). Ole Miss followed that with a 25-17 win over Georgia Tech in the Music City Bowl in Nashville, Tennessee, on Dec. 30, 2013.

The Rebels made consecutive New Year's Six bowl appearances beginning with the Peach Bowl in 2014 and followed up the 2015 season with a record-setting 48-20 win over Oklahoma State in the Sugar Bowl on January 1, 2016. As a unit, the Rebels put up 554 yards of total offense, the most of any Ole Miss team in any bowl game, and also broke the previous record for points in a bowl game.

Ole Miss returned to the postseason in 2020, earning an Outback Bowl bid after a four-year bowl drought. In his first year as head coach, Lane Kiffin led the Rebels to a 4-5 record in nine SEC games during the truncated season. The Rebels earned a date with No. 7 Indiana and didn't disappoint. Ole Miss never trailed and held off a late Hoosier rally in a 26-20 victory to win its first Outback Bowl title.

The Rebels kept the bowl train rolling in 2021-22, mounting a 10-2 regular-season record to earn a Sugar Bowl berth for the 10th time in program history, ultimately falling 21-7 in a defensive slugfest to Baylor.

In its inaugural bowl game, Ole Miss fell 20-19 to an opportunistic Catholic University squad from Washington, D.C., which at the time ranked as an Eastern power.

The Rebels held a 15-7 advantage in first downs and out-gained the Cardinal 265-172. However, Ole Miss was unable to overcome deficits of 13-0 and 19-7.

Catholic took a 7-0 lead after converting one of four Ole Miss

picks on the day into a 51-yard scoring drive, capped by Bill Adamaitis' two-yard touchdown run.

The Cardinal increased its lead to 13-0 in the second quarter when Adamaitis connected with Speck Foley on a 48-yard touchdown pass.

Ole Miss would pull to within seven at 13-6 before halftime when Ned Peters ran 67 yards for a score.

The Rebels would hold Catholic without a first down in the second half; however, the Cardinal went up 20-7 by scoring a touchdown off a blocked punt.

Ole Miss would get two fourth-quarter scores for the 20-19 final. Dave Bernard scored on a one-yard run to make it 20-12 after the PAT attempt failed, and Herb Baumstein found Buster Poole for a 24-yard touchdown pass.

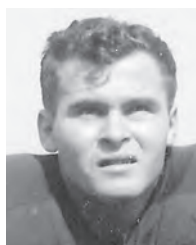

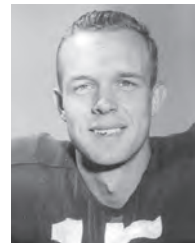

After a short punt, the Gators took over at the Rebel 26 and advanced to the 15 before Bill Churchwell forced and recovered a fumble.

The two teams would then exchange punts, however, Jimmy Dunn bobbled a Rebel punt at the Florida 48 and Ole Miss recovered. The Rebels then ran out the final 3:10 of the game.

A little over two months after Billy Cannon's famous 89-yard punt return on Halloween night lifted LSU to a 7-3 win over Ole Miss in Baton Rouge, the second-ranked Rebels and third-ranked Tigers were rematched in the 1960 Sugar Bowl.

This time, Ole Miss made sure there would be no heroics from Cannon. The Rebel defense limited the 1959 Heisman Trophy winner to

eight yards on six carries. The Tigers managed just 74 yards total on the night and were a -15 in the rushing department.

Ole Miss, led by Bobby Franklin's two touchdown passes, totaled 363 yards of offense and rolled to a 21-0 victory.

Franklin finished 10-of-15 passing for 148 yards and had touchdown passes of 18 yards to Larry Grantham and nine yards to George Blair in the second half. He would garner the game's Outstanding Player honor.

Ole Miss would finish the year 10-1 and was recognized as national champions by the Berryman, Billingsley, Dunkel and Sagarin ratings.

The 1959 squad would also go on to earn "Team of the Decade" honors within the SEC by the Associated Press.

Jake Gibbs scored both of Ole Miss' touchdowns with runs of eight and three yards. Gibbs' eight-yard scamper gave the Rebels a 7-0 lead

in the first quarter.

The Owls used an 18-play, 77-yard scoring drive to make it 7-6 in the third. Butch Blaine completed the march with a two-yard run around the right end on fourth down. However, the PAT attempt failed, leaving the Rebels clinging to a one-point lead.

Ole Miss iced the game in the fourth quarter behind the running of Jim Anderson. Anderson's running helped set up Gibbs' three-yard score with 5:16 left.

Anderson finished the game with 59 yards rushing on 15 carries.

Following the game, Ole Miss was awarded the national title by the Football Writer's Association, and became the first SEC team to win the Grantland Rice Award.

Ole Miss came into the contest sporting a 9-1 record and having outscored its opponents 326-40. However, without Adams, the Longhorns made sure the Rebels didn't do damage through the air with All-America quarterback Glynn Griffing.

The Rebels held a 319-183 advantage in total offense, but couldn't overcome six turnovers, including five interceptions.

Griffing was 12-of-29 for 163 yards with three interceptions and a touchdown. Doug Elmore was intercepted twice in eight pass attempts.

Ole Miss' only points of the day came in the third quarter when Reed Davis scored on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Griffing to make it 12-7.

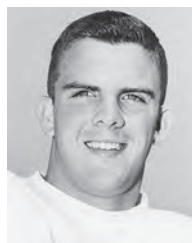

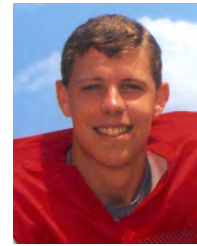

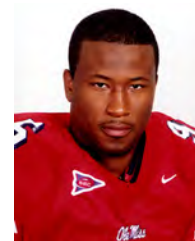

Behind Jevan Snead's passing, Dexter McCluster's squirming runs and some big returns by Marshay Green, No. 20 Ole Miss overcame an early deficit and beat No. 8 Texas Tech 47-34 Friday in the final Cotton Bowl played in the stadium of the same name.

The Red Raiders (11-2) converted a pair of early turnovers into a 14-0 lead, but Snead led the Rebels to touchdowns on their next

three drives, followed by a go-ahead field goal shortly before halftime. Once Green returned an interception 65 yards for a touchdown early in the third quarter, Ole Miss (9-4) was well on its way to capping coach Houston Nutt's first season in grand style.

This was Ole Miss' sixth straight win, matching its longest streak since 2003, when Eli Manning was a senior. That also was the last time the Rebels had been to a bowl.

Dexter McCluster gave Ole Miss fans a finale to remember, rushing for 184 yards and two touchdowns, including the go-ahead 2-yard run on a direct snap with 4:03 left as the Rebels beat No. 18 Oklahoma State 21-7 in the Cotton Bowl on Saturday.

McCluster also had an 86-yard TD run in the second quarter after the senior had already become the first Southeastern Conference player with 1,000 yards rushing and

500 yards receiving in the same season.

Ole Miss (9-4) had five turnovers in the game, but Oklahoma State had six in the fourth quarter, and seven overall.

McCluster was the obvious standout, the game's offensive MVP for the second year in a row. He had 34 carries along with five catches for 45 yards. He leaves Ole Miss with 3,923 career all-purpose yards, second in school history behind Deuce McAllister's 4,889.

After becoming only Ole Miss' fourth 1,000-yard rusher on his third carry of the game, McCluster surpassed 500 yards receiving on the final play of the first quarter. Yet, his best was still to come.

McCluster's 86-yard TD run in the second quarter came on a handoff from freshman quarterback Nathan Stanley. McCluster went to the right and through a gap, running untouched for the second-longest run in the 74-year history of the Cotton Bowl.

Six weeks after closing out its regular season by defeating No. 24 Mississippi State to bring home the Egg Bowl trophy for the first time since 2008, Ole Miss (7-6) took down Pitt in the BBVA Compass Bowl in Birmingham, Ala., 38-17. It was Ole Miss' first bowl appearance since topping Oklahoma State 21-7 in the 2010 AT&T Cotton Bowl. The 38 points scored by Ole Miss is a BBVA Compass Bowl record.

Ole Miss sophomore quarterback Bo Wallace, the BBVA Compass Bowl MVP, finished the game 22-32 passing for 151 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions. The Rebels spread the ball around through the air with three receivers catching five or more passes. Freshman running back I'Tavius Mathers led Ole Miss on the ground with six carries for 96 yards, including a 62-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter, the longest in BBVA Compass Bowl history.

On the defensive side of the ball, junior middle linebacker Mike Marry led Ole Miss with seven tackles, four tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

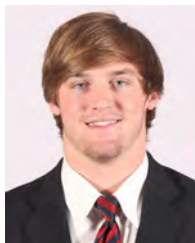

Ole Miss junior quarterback Bo Wallace threw one touchdown and ran for two more, and the Rebels' defense held the Georgia Tech triple-option attack in check en route to a 25-17 victory at LP Field in the 2013 Franklin American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

The Rebels' victory was their sixth straight bowl victory, which was currently the longest in the country.

Wallace, who was named the game's MVP, finished the game 22-32 for 256 yards, as well as a career-high 86 yards rushing on 13 carries. The Pulaski, Tenn., native's 342 total yards Monday pushed his season total to 3,701, topping Eli Manning's school record of 3,572 yards set in 2003.

Junior Donté Moncrief led the Ole Miss receiving corps with six catches for 113 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, junior linebacker Serderius Bryant and sophomore defensive tackle Issac Gross each had eight tackles, while freshman Tony Conner and senior defensive end D.T. Shackelford had seven tackles. Bryant led the Rebels with a team-high six solo tackles, and Gross recorded a team-high three tackles for loss.

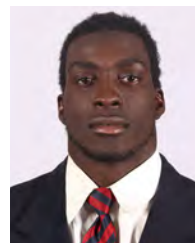

A dominant effort by No. 6 TCU on both sides of the ball was too much to overcome for No. 9 Ole Miss, as the Rebels (9-4) lost 42-3 in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl.

The nation's second-leading offense, the Horned Frogs scored early and often, and the defense suffocated the Ole Miss offense, holding the Rebels to a season-low 10 first downs and 129 yards of total offense.

Senior cornerback Senquez Golson tied the school record with his 10th interception of the season, the 16th of his career, which is tied for third place in Ole Miss history. It also helped set up the Rebels' lone score of the game, a 27-yard field goal by freshman kicker Gary Wunderlich.

Playing in its third straight bowl game for the first time since 1998-2000, Ole Miss had its six-game bowl winning streak snapped, which was tied with Florida State for the longest in the nation.

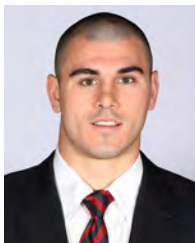

How sweet it was. No. 12 Ole Miss dominated No. 16 Oklahoma State, 48-20, in the 82nd annual Allstate Sugar Bowl.

It was a record-breaking night for the Rebel offense, but the defense wouldn't be outshined, holding the nation's 18th-ranked offense to its lowest point total of the season.

Junior quarterback and Sugar Bowl MVP Chad Kelly connected on four touchdown passes, the most by a Rebel quarterback in bowl history. He fired three touchdown passes to junior star receiver Laquon Treadwell, who finished with six catches for 71 yards.

As a unit the Rebels put up 554 of total offense, the most of any Ole Miss team in any bowl game, and also broke the previous record for points in a bowl game.

Lane Kiffin's squad made the most of it, putting together a valiant effort in Raymond James Stadium to knock off the No. 7 ranked Indiana Hoosiers 26-20 in the 2021 Outback Bowl, concluding the 2020 football season with their

first bowl win since the 2016 Sugar Bowl.

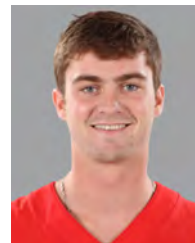
