UCF has accepted an invitation to join the Big 12 Conference, as announced by Big 12 commissioner, Bob Bowlsby, UCF director of athletics Terry Mohajir, and UCF President Alex Cartwright on Sept. 10.

The Knights athletics program has now moved from Division III, Division II, the FCS level, the FBS level that included time in the MAC, Conference USA, the AAC, and now to the Big 12 Conference.

KNIGHT NOTES

HISTORIC START

- UCF is undefeated through four games.
- The Knights are off to their longest unbeaten streak to start a season since they started the 2002 season 4-0-0.
- A win or draw on Thursday would be the longest unbeaten streak to start a season since UCF's first ever season in 1981 when they started 7-0. It would also be the longest streak since joining the NCAA in 1982.

NOW PREMIERING WORLDWIDE

- This summer Head Coach Tiffany Roberts Sahaydak served as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team, helping to guide them to a CONCACAF W Championship to earn bids to the 2023 World Cup and the 2024 Olympics.
- Head Coach Tiffany Roberts Sahaydak will be away from the team over the next week as she coaches the USWNT through their September friendlies.

BRICK WALL

- Goalkeeper Caroline DeLisle collected her 20th career clean sheet against Utah Valley.
- She ranks sixth in program history in shutouts and is tied for 17th in the nation amongst active leaders.
- Her save percentage of .923 ranks first in the American Athletic Conference

BIG SAVE, BIG VIEWS

- Goalkeeper Caroline DeLisle made an incredible save jumping to the top right corner to preserve a 1-1 draw against LSU.
- The save has garnered 195.6k views on social media in just under 36 hours.
- The play made it on SportsCenter Top Ten Plays, debuting at number four.
- Her efforts against Florida and LSU resulted in her winning American Athletic Conference Goalkeeper of the week.
- Her 10 saves on the week moved her into seventh in program history in career saves.

FAR IN THE GLORIOUS WEST FOR THE FIRST TIME

- The Knights made their first ever trip to the state of Utah in program history.
- This will be the first ever match between UCF and Utah Valley.
- The match will also be UCF's first ever against a school from the state of Utah.

OPENING KNIGHT FUN

- The win was head coach Tiffany Roberts Sahaydak's 100th win at UCF. She is only the second coach in program history to accomplish that feat.
- UCF shut out Florida for a third consecutive game and have not conceded a goal against them since 2016.
- The Knights have held the Gators scoreless over their last 272:21.
- Caroline DeLisle earned her 19th career clean sheet with her four-save performance.
- With 161 career saves, she is now one save shy of tying seventh all-time in program history.

NEW FACES HITTING THE FIELD

- Five newcomers saw game action against Florida including three in the starting lineup.



ADDITIONAL KNIGHT NOTES

- Freshman Polly Watson picked up a point with her assist on Kristen Scott's goal in the 54th minute against Florida.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- Goalkeeper Caroline DeLisle was tabbed as AAC Preseason Goalkeeper of the Year for the second consecutive year. She was also named to the Preseason All-Conference Team
- Darya Rajae and Kristen Scott join DeLisle on the Preseason All-Conference Team as well
- Rajae was also named to the Top Drawer Soccer Top 100 Rankings

NEW YEAR, NEW FACES

- UCF will welcome seven new faces to the squad in 2022, three transfers and four freshmen.
- Transfers, Annika Huhta from UNC, Georgia Eaton-Collins from Florida, and Kelis Barton from Washington State will all add valuable experience to an already veteran team.
- The four freshmen entering are Jessica McCullen, Polly Waton, Brooke Mulroney, and Audrey Buck.
- Redshirt Freshman Mia Asenjo will also be a strong addition to the team after missing her freshman season due to injury.

A YEAR AGO

- The Knights went 8-7-1 in the 2021 campaign.
- UCF returns a staggering 24 players from last season including the top nine goal scorers from the 2021 squad.
- Kristen Scott led the team in goals (10) and points (23) last season and was tied with Ellie Moreno for the team in lead game-winning goals (2).
- 2021 AAC Goalkeeper of the Year Caroline DeLisle had 78 saves with a save percentage of .813.
- Darya Rajae was named AAC Midfielder of the Year after her stellar 2021 campaign.

STORIED HISTORY

- Since 1981, UCF has accumulated 22 conference championships and 21 NCAA. Tournament berths, which include appearances in the 1982 NCAA title game, 1987 Final Four, 2011 Elite Eight and 2014 Sweet 16.

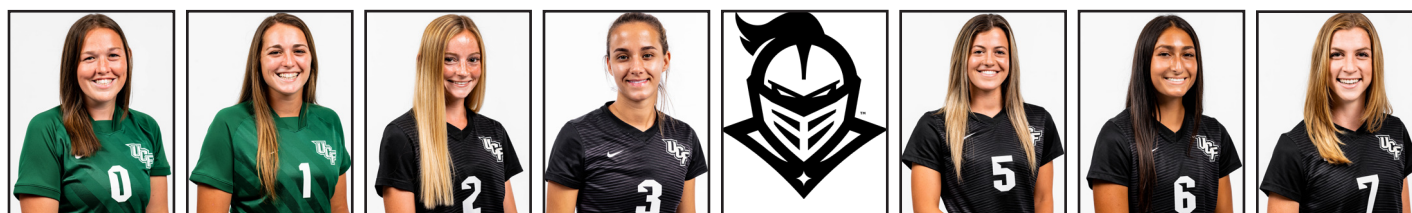
