### WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- This game will be the 121st meeting in one of the nation's most-played rivalries ... Ole Miss holds a 65-47-6 edge in the series dating back to 1901, including a 22-14-3 mark in Oxford (24-14-3 before vacated wins).
- The original record is 65-49-6 in favor of Ole Miss ... The Rebels had wins in 2012 & 2014 vacated due to NCAA ruling, while Mississippi State forfeited wins in 1976 & 1977.
- This game will be the 97th "Battle of the Golden Egg," as the two schools started playing for the trophy in 1927 ... Ole Miss holds a 59-30-5 advantage in the "Egg Bowl."
- The Rebels are 37-13 under **Lane Kiffin** since 2021 and rank third among all SEC schools in wins in that span.
- Ole Miss is 26-3 in its last 29 home games and 12-1 since the start of the 2023 season ... At home since 2023, the Rebels are out-scoring opponents by 27.4 points and out-gaining them by 211.4 yards.
- Ole Miss leads the SEC in 20 stats and tops FBS in seven, including passing (361.8 ypg), TFL (108) and sacks (49).
- In SEC play, the Rebels own a total offense average (453.7) more than 40 yards better than any other team, are the only team averaging at least 300 yards passing (327.0) and own eight more sacks than any other team (36).
- Ole Miss leads ESPN's Game Control metric, ranks fourth in efficiency (86.5) and sixth in FPI (21.3).
- Mississippi State (23.2) and Ole Miss (23.4) own the two fastest offenses in the SEC in seconds per play.
- QB **Jaxson Dart** is 49 passing yards shy of Eli Manning's career record 10,119.
- Dart (3,732) owns more passing yards through 11 games than eight of the last 10 Heisman-winning QBs.
- **Suntarine Perkins** and **Princely Umanmielen** both own 10.5 sacks, 2.0 shy of Ole Miss' single-season record.
- Outland Trophy finalist **Walter Nolen** is PFF's top-rated SEC interior defensive lineman in run defense (No. 2 FBS).

**PRESS CONFERENCES/INTERVIEWS:** Ole Miss will hold its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season beginning at 11:45 a.m. CT, beginning with head football coach Lane Kiffin. The press conference is streamed live on SEC Network+ (ESPN App). Players will follow Coach Kiffin at the Monday press conference. Select players will be also available at approximately noon on Tuesday, while Coach Kiffin will be available Wednesday on the SEC teleconference (noon). There is no media availability on Thursday or Friday. Times are subject to change.

**SEC WEEKLY TELECONFERENCE:** Coach Kiffin will be available on the weekly Southeastern Conference teleconference every Wednesday at noon, beginning week one and concluding the final week of the regular season. The number is available through the SEC office at 205-458-3000.

**PRACTICES:** Practice footage is available periodically on the Ole Miss FTP site. At open practices, video is permitted for stretch only, and use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. Photographers must use tight shots and no formations.

**WORKING CREDENTIALS:** To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: [www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss](http://www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss). Credential requests must be made as early as possible by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: 1) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; 2) daily newspapers; 3) network affiliate television stations; 4) magazines, non-broadcast radio stations and weekly newspapers.

**PARKING:** Gameday media parking will be located in the garage adjacent to The SJB Pavilion. Each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Parking passes may not be picked up at media will-call and must be requested during credential application process.

**MEDIA GATE/WILL-CALL:** Media will enter Gate 35 on the west side of the stadium beginning three hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Photographers may receive a vest at this location.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS/SIDELINE ACCESS:** All photographers must wear a photo vest in order to be admitted to the sidelines. This may be received beside the elevators on the concourse level of The SJB Pavilion. Gameday flip cards will be available there or in the photo workroom, which is located next to the visiting team locker room off the southeast corner of the field. Per NCAA rules, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes without appropriate consent.

**SIDELINE ACCESS:** Excluding select portions of the game, media sideline access is reserved for photographers/videographers. Credentialed photographers/videographers who arrive at media will-call without proper equipment will not be granted a vest for sideline access. When on the sideline, media must remain outside the bench area and may not shoot behind the benches. During pre-game activities, media must remain in the designated area, as posted in the photo workroom, until the team leaves the field after warm-ups.

**VIDEO CONTENT:** Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Facebook Live and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content obtained via FTP. Press conferences, practice footage and other content are available for media on the Rebels' official YouTube page: [www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos](http://www.youtube.com/OleMissSports/videos). Ole Miss also offers free FTP downloads of this content for television stations to use during regularly scheduled newscasts. All content should be credited to Ole Miss Sports Productions.

**RECRUITS:** Per NCAA rules, media are not permitted to have contact with a prospect or family members of a prospect during their official visit, including prospects in attendance at practice or games. In addition, media are forbidden from videoing or photographing prospects during their visit. Media are also asked to make every effort to keep distance from prospects on campus, including at practice, during pre-game activities on the sidelines and in the stands.

**RADIO RIGHTS:** The radio rights to Ole Miss Football are provided by Learfield in partnership with TeleSouth Communications Inc. Visiting networks planning to originate from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field are issued credentials by the Ole Miss Athletics Communications office. Broadcast lines should be ordered through AT&T (1-877-438-0041). Visiting networks may also wish to contact Cabell Philpott with Learfield (336-831-0719 or [cabell.philpott@imgworld.com](mailto:cabell.philpott@imgworld.com)), concerning the SEC's network agreement.

**RADIO/TELEVISION SHOW:** The RebTalk radio show gives fans the opportunity to ask Coach Kiffin questions concerning Ole Miss Football. The talk show, hosted by David Kellum, will air every Thursday during the season at 6 p.m. "The Season: Ole Miss Football" is an award-winning, weekly 30-minute show produced by Ole Miss Sports Productions. It debuts Wednesdays at 6 p.m. CT on [OleMissSports.com](http://OleMissSports.com) and airs on ESPN.

**HONORING FOOTBALL LEGEND MONTE KIFFIN: 1940-2024**



This season, the Rebels will wear helmet decals in memory of coaching legend **Monte Kiffin**, who passed away on July 11. Kiffin coached football for 55 years, which includes 29 seasons in the NFL where he became known for his prowess as a defensive mastermind -- culminating in a Super Bowl victory with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In recent years, Monte had spent time in Oxford with his son, current Ole Miss head coach **Lane Kiffin**, serving as a mentor to the Rebel coaching staff and as a frequent and delightful sight up and down the halls of the Manning Center and around the Ole Miss campus.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

**Lane Kiffin** is in his fifth season at Ole Miss and has led the Rebels to four consecutive bowl berths, including two New Year's Six appearances, under his guidance since 2020. In 11 years at the NCAA level, Kiffin has posted an all-time record of 103-52, including a 42-18 mark at Ole Miss. Kiffin led the 2023 Rebels to the best season in Ole Miss history in terms of wins, notching an 11-2 overall record capped by a 38-25 Peach Bowl victory over Penn State. The Rebels finished No. 9 in both final versions of the AP and Coaches polls, the highest finish overall since 2015 (No. 9 Coaches) and their highest in the final AP poll since 1969 (No. 8). In 2022, Kiffin led the Rebels to the Texas Bowl, thanks to another dynamite offense that ranked No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4) in 2022. Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, its highest final ranking since 2016. Ole Miss ranked top-20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories in his first season in 2020. In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons. In his head coaching stops at USC, Tennessee and FAU, Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

MISSISSIPPI STATE HEAD COACH JEFF LEBBY

**Jeff Leiby** is in his first season at Mississippi State and holds a 2-9 record during his stint in Starkville. Prior to MSU, Leiby spent one season as offensive coordinator at Oklahoma. His 2023 unit with the Sooners scored an FBS-best 65+ points three times and ranked No. 4 nationally in scoring offense (41.7 ppg). Leiby is no stranger to the Southeastern Conference, having spent two seasons in Oxford directing the Ole Miss offense and coaching quarterbacks. Under his direction, the offense led the SEC in total offense in 2020 and again in 2021, twice earning him semifinalist honors for the Broyles Award. Prior to Ole Miss, Leiby spent two seasons at UCF. He coached the quarterbacks in 2018 before being elevated to offensive coordinator in 2019. In 2017, he guided Southeastern University to the NAIA's best scoring offense (55.1 ppg) and ranked third in total offense (557.4 ypg). While at Baylor, he coached running backs from 2012-16 and was also the passing game coordinator and offensive recruiting coordinator in 2015 and 2016. A 2007 graduate of Oklahoma, Leiby was a four-year student assistant for the football program.

BULLDOG SCOUTING REPORT

Mississippi State comes into the 2024 Egg Bowl 2-9 overall and 0-7 in SEC play. Offensively, the Bulldogs are averaging 381.5 yards per game, with 235 yards through the air. True freshman, Michael Van Buren Jr., has taken over as MSU's primary signal-caller after senior Blake Shapen suffered a season-ending shoulder injury vs. Florida. Van Buren Jr. has started seven games and has thrown for 1,606 yards and 10 touchdowns. His top receiver is Kevin Coleman Jr., who has hauled in 68 catches for 814 yards and five touchdowns. Utah State transfer, Davon Booth, leads the Bulldog rushing attack with 721 yards and five TDs. On defense, MSU is giving up 462 yards per game, allowing opponents to rush for more than 213 yards per contest. The Bulldogs have given up 30 or more points in nine of their 11 games this season. Safety Isaac Smith and transfer Stone Blanton both rank top 10 nationally in total tackles, with 115 and 111 respectively.

### OLE MISS-MISSISSIPPI STATE SERIES HISTORY

- This game will be the 121st meeting of one of the nation's most-played rivalries.
- Ole Miss holds a 65-47-6 advantage in the series dating back to 1901, including a 22-14-3 mark in Oxford ... The original record in Oxford is 24-14-3 before vacated wins.
- The original record is 65-49-6 in favor of Ole Miss ... The Rebels had wins in 2012 & 2014 vacated due to NCAA ruling, while Mississippi State forfeited wins in 1976 & 1977.
- This game will be the 97th "Battle of the Golden Egg," as the two schools started playing for the trophy in 1927 ... Ole Miss holds a 59-30-5 advantage in the "Egg Bowl."
- This marks the first time the Egg Bowl hasn't been on Thanksgiving since 2020, and will be only the fifth time the two schools have met on a Friday ... State leads 3-1 on Friday.
- The Rebels own the four longest separate winning streaks in the series (nine, six, six and five games).
- Including a pair of forfeited victories, Ole Miss posted a 38-7-2 record versus MSU from 1944-1990.
- From 1947-1963, the Rebels posted a 15-0-2 mark against MSU ... That means a child born in December 1946 was a senior in high school before they saw Ole Miss lose to the Bulldogs.
- From 2004-2014, the home team won all but two games ... Since then, the road team has won six of the last nine.

### THE START OF THE GOLDEN EGG

The Golden Egg was first proposed by members of Sigma Iota, an Ole Miss honorary society in 1927. Sigma Iota proposed that a trophy be awarded in a dignified ceremony designed to calm excited fans, after Ole Miss fans stormed the field at Starkville's Scott Field following the Rebels' 7-6 win in the 1926 contest. The 1926 win snapped a 13-game losing streak to then-Mississippi A&M, and was just Ole Miss' fifth win in 23 tries. Following the game, Ole Miss fans made a dash for the goal posts, while Aggie fans took after them with cane bottom chairs and fights broke out. The mayhem continued until most of the chairs were splintered. After Sigma Iota made its proposal, Mississippi A&M approved the suggestion, and Ole Miss, two weeks before the game, officially added its approval. The trophy, to be called "The Golden Egg," would be a regulation-size gold-plated football mounted on a pedestal. The cost of the \$250 trophy was split between both schools. On Thanksgiving Day, 1927, the first "Battle of the Golden Egg" was waged before a crowd of 14,000 in Oxford. The Rebels won 20-12 and the symbol of supremacy in the series was born.

### ORIGINS OF THE NAME

The term "Egg Bowl" can be traced back to 1978, when Executive Sports Editor of The Clarion-Ledger Tom Patterson decided to spice up the 1978 meeting. A year earlier, the Clarion-Ledger headline on game day had been "Egg Bowl Is Up For Scramble." With the Rebels and the Bulldogs 6-4 and both apparently out of the bowl picture heading into the 1978 game, Patterson instructed his staff to follow the "Egg Bowl" theme throughout the week. The result was a special section on Sunday, which recounted in great detail the Rebels' stunning 27-7 victory. While the game is still officially the "Battle of the Golden Egg," most members of the media now refer to the annual game simply as the "Egg Bowl."

### FRIDAY NIGHT FIGHT

The Egg Bowl and Thanksgiving have become synonymous, with the rivalry being held 32 times on the holiday -- including six of the last seven. But 2024 it moves to a Friday for only the fifth time in 121 contests. This week marks the first time the Egg Bowl will be played on a Friday since 2008 (W, 45-0), and in the series overall it joins previous Friday matchups in 1916 (L, 36-0), 1921 (L, 27-7) and 2007 (L, 17-14). However, this will only be the third true Battle for the Golden Egg held on a Friday, as the 1916 and 1921 meetings were before the trophy was introduced in 1927.

- Ole Miss sits at No. 14 in the CFP rankings, No. 15 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the Coaches poll for Week 14.
- Dating back to 2021, Ole Miss has been ranked in the top-25 in 58 of the last 62 poll releases.
- Ole Miss' current ranked streak stands at 30 consecutive appearances since the beginning of 2023, the longest since being ranked 41 in a row from 2014-16 ... Head coach **Lane Kiffin** also owns a streak of 29 across 2021-22.
- The SEC boasts eight teams in the top 25, including three within the top-10.

**HOT AT HOME**

Ole Miss has only lost at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium three times since the beginning of the 2021 season and only six times total in the Lane Kiffin era. That includes only one loss since the start of the 2023 season back on Sept. 28 to Kentucky. In that span, the Rebels have consistently put on a show for the Ole Miss faithful, welcoming in a grand total of 849,749 fans through its turnstiles -- good for a capacity crowd per game average of 65,365.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

Vaught-Hemingway Stadium has been a safe haven for the Rebels historically, owning a 304-116-8 (.720) record all-time in Oxford before vacated wins (282-113-8), and that's been no different in the **Lane Kiffin** era. Ole Miss is 26-3 in its last 29 home games, and since the beginning of Kiffin's tenure in 2020, the Rebels have gone 26-6 overall at Vaught-Hemingway -- which includes a 14-game home winning streak that spanned Nov. 14, 2020 to Oct. 15, 2022. That streak was among the longest home winning streaks nationally when it was snapped by No. 9 Alabama in 2022. It was also the longest winning streak in Oxford since winning 21 straight games from Nov. 1, 1952 to Nov. 7, 1959. Including a tie to LSU in 1960, the Rebels went unbeaten for 34 games over the course of 12 years (1952-64). Under Kiffin, the Rebels have recorded the first two seven-win home seasons in program history in 2021 and 2023.

**IT JUST MEANS MORE**

Ole Miss has put up impressive numbers on both sides of the ball all season long, but the Rebels have continued to do so within the toughest conference in the nation. The Rebels currently own a total offense average (453.7) more than 40 yards better than any other team, are the only team averaging at least 300 yards passing in SEC play (327.0) and at 36 sacks own eight more than next-best South Carolina (28) despite playing one fewer conference game. In total, the Rebels lead or are tied for the lead in nine conference-only categories and fall within the top-three of two others.

**REBELS AMONG THE PFF RANKS**

Ole Miss ranks among the best FBS teams nationally per Pro Football Focus, ranking second in the SEC and eighth overall in team rating (92.7). Ole Miss owns the top passing offense in the FBS according to PFF at a 91.9 grade, while also leading the SEC in receiving grade (84.5; FBS No. 4) a overall offensive grade (85.4; FBS No. 12). Defensively, Ole Miss is tied for the top pass rush in the SEC and second-best nationally at a 90.3 grade while also ranking FBS top-10 in run defense (2nd, 94.2) and overall defensive grade (6th, 93.0).

In the Kiffin era, the Rebel offense ranks as the most prolific in the nation, leading the FBS in yards per game since the beginning of the 2020 season at 504.5 yards per game. In terms of total yards, Ole Miss ranks second in the FBS at 30,272 yards within the Kiffin era. In that same stretch, Ole Miss ranks fifth among all FBS schools in passing (297.2) and sixth in rushing (207.3) -- which makes the Rebels the lone FBS team to rank within the top-10 in both categories.

Ole Miss is once again running a lightning-quick offense in 2024, currently ranking second in the SEC and seventh in the FBS at 23.4 seconds per play. On the season, Ole Miss owns 25 scoring drives under two minutes and 13 under one minute. Included in the latter total are three furiously fast drives under 10 seconds: two against Furman in the season opener -- a 7-second drive that featured **Austin Simmons'** first collegiate pass, a 35-yard touchdown strike to **Cayden Lee**, and a 9-second score on a 61-yard bomb from **Jaxson Dart** to **Tre Harris** -- as well as an eight-second score on a 62-yard strike from Dart to **Jordan Watkins** at Arkansas. In the Kiffin era, Ole Miss is 34-8 when scoring first.

**RACKING UP THE YARDS**

**Lane Kiffin's** dynamic Ole Miss offenses have single-handedly dismantled the Rebel record books, recording three of the top-five and four of the top-10 offensive seasons in school history. Kiffin owns 27 games during his Ole Miss tenure with at least 600 yards of total offense, as opposed to just 16 times total from the beginning of the Ole Miss football program in 1893 until Kiffin's arrival in 2020. At the 700-yard plateau, Kiffin's Rebels own five of the seven total 700-yard games in Ole Miss history, as well as seven of the top-nine performances all-time.

Senior QB **Jaxson Dart** will step onto the field at Vaught-Hemingway for the final time this Friday against Mississippi State, and regardless of the outcome will leave as one of the best quarterbacks to have ever set foot on it. Dart is already Ole Miss' career leader in wins (26; min. 14 wins) and winning percentage (.722; min. 25 starts) by a starting QB, total offense (11,448), rushing yards by a QB (1,378) and 300-yard passing games (14) -- and he has a chance to add Eli Manning's career passing record this Friday as well, sitting at 10,070 to Manning's 10,119. But Dart has been especially productive in front of the Rebel faithful, owning an exceptional 17-3 home record with 5,307 yards and 40 touchdowns passing.

### PASSING RECORD WITHIN RANGE

Friday could be a memorable day not just for QB **Jaxson Dart**, but for the history of Ole Miss football. Dart stands to surpass Eli Manning as the all-time career leader in passing yards by a Rebel, sitting just 49 yards shy at 10,070 to Manning's 10,119 -- and would do so on Senior Day and in one of the longest running rivalry games in the nation. Breaking Manning's record would also elevate him into the SEC's all-time top-10, as he currently stands as only the 11th conference QB to ever throw for 10,000 yards.

### TOTAL OFFENSE KING

**Jaxson Dart** took control of Ole Miss' total offense record against Arkansas on Nov. 2, and is now close to becoming one of the five best quarterbacks in SEC history in terms of total offense. Dart sits at sixth in conference history at 11,448 yards of total offense, and a performance of 449 yards on Friday -- in the Egg Bowl, no less -- would vault Dart past Mississippi State great Dak Prescott (11,897) for fifth all-time.

### LEGENDARY STATUS

Senior QB **Jaxson Dart** has etched his name all over Ole Miss' record book in three highly successful seasons leading the Rebel offensive attack, but against Arkansas he also became the winningest quarterback of Ole Miss' modern era. At 26-10 (.722) now as a starter at Ole Miss, Dart owns both the most wins (min. 14 wins) and the best winning percentage (min. 25 starts) by any Rebel QB. For this scenario, Ole Miss' modern era is considered since the first career start by Archie Manning on Sept. 21, 1968 at Memphis. Verifying games started prior to Manning's 1968 season is inconsistent via available records, as well as considering that underclassmen rarely started and the quarterback was less of a permanent position in John Vaught's offensive scheme. One unverified source has College Football Hall of Famer Jake Gibbs at 23-3-1 as the starter of Ole Miss' powerhouse teams from 1958-60, while several other QBs during the highly successful 1950s would have potentially high (but unlikely) win totals as well.

Senior QB Jaxson Dart stands among the more decorated signal-callers nationwide in 2024. Dart is one of four active FBS quarterbacks with 12,000 career yards of total offense, the lone QB in the SEC and the only one with 11,000 passing yards at 1,400 rushing yards. Dart owns a career line of 811-of-1,248 (65 percent) for 11,423 yards, 76 TD and a career rushing line of 1,421 yards and 14 scores on 368 carries. In a Rebel uniform since 2022, Dart has gone 694-of-1,059 for 10,070 yards and 67 touchdowns, while racking up 1,378 yards and 12 touchdowns rushing on 346 attempts.

**Jaxson Dart** stands in rare company in the history of college football, owning more passing yards (3,732) through 11 games than eight of the last 10 Heisman-winning quarterbacks, as well as 17 of the last 19 and 25 of the last 30 in available game-by-game splits since Steve Spurrier's win in 1966. Dart has equally impressive numbers in total offense (4,107) as well, with more than 10 of the last 15 and 23 of the last 30 Heisman winners. In order through 11 games, Dart's 2024 season totals would rank him sixth among those Heisman winners in passing and eighth in total offense.

**GO LONG!**

QB **Jaxson Dart** currently owns a substantial lead among all FBS quarterbacks in yards on attempts of at least 20 yards downfield (per PFF). At that distance, Dart owns a line of 31-of-73 (42.5 percent) for 1,305 yards and 14 touchdowns. That constitutes 35 percent of his 3,732 passing yards, as well as 63.6 percent of his 24 passing touchdowns. Against Arkansas alone, Dart was 10-of-13 for 311 yards and four touchdowns on attempts further than 10 yards down field. Dart ranks seventh nationally in completions of at least 10 yards with 131 and leads the FBS in completions of 20 yards (65), 30 yards (34), 40 yards (17), 50 yards (10) and 60 yards (8).

**VIDEO GAME NUMBERS FOR DART**

QB **Jaxson Dart** put together a historic outing against Arkansas, breaking or tying school records in total offense (562), passing yards (515) and passing touchdowns (6). In SEC history, Dart's sizzling day against the Razorbacks ranks as the fourth-best in terms of total offense, as well as the sixth-best passing performance in an SEC game. This was the 13th game in SEC history with 500 passing yards by one QB, making Dart one of two alongside Missouri's Drew Lock to notch 500 yards and six touchdowns, and the only one to ever do so against a power conference opponent.

**ELITE DEFENSE**

Under **Lane Kiffin**, the explosive Rebel offensive units have received a lot of attention, but the 2024 Ole Miss defense not only ranks as among the most stifling in the FBS this season, but is on pace to become one of the best in recent program history. The Rebels lead the FBS in five defensive categories -- tackles for loss (108), TFL yards (476), sacks (49), sack yards (317) and yards per rush allowed (2.39) -- while leading the SEC in rushing defense (87.5 ypg; FBS No. 2) and rushing touchdowns allowed (6; FBS No. 3). Ole Miss has already shattered the team school record in sacks, and stand just three TFL away from the 2008 record of 111. Right now, the Rebels' SEC-leading 87.5 rushing yards allowed per game would rank eighth in Ole Miss history and would be the best since 2008 -- the last Rebel defense to hold opponents below the century mark for an entire season at 85.5 yards per game.

### HIDE YOUR QB

The Rebels have notched at least four sacks in seven of their 11 games this season, with an additional five games with at least five, three with at least six and the most sacks in back-to-back games in recorded Ole Miss history after bruising Oklahoma for nine and then Arkansas for eight. Ole Miss dominated the line of scrimmage against Oklahoma, racking up nine sacks for 50 yards and 15 TFL for 79 yards. Those nine sacks tie for the most ever yielded by an Oklahoma offense, and are tied for the third-most in Ole Miss history behind 10 in 1996 against Vanderbilt and an 11-sack effort against Mississippi State in 2008. The 15 TFL, meanwhile, were Ole Miss' most against an SEC opponent since charting 17 against Mississippi State in 2000. In terms of yards lost, both the 79 total yards lost are the most since 120 against Mississippi State in 2008, while the 50 lost via sack are the most since 54 against State in 2022. Ole Miss followed that up with a five-sack effort in a historic 28-10 upset over No. 2 Georgia, the most yielded by a Bulldog team in the regular season since 2013. More than half of Ole Miss' season total of 476 forced yards lost have come via the QB sack (317).

### CAUSING MAYHEM

The Ole Miss defense currently leads the FBS in tackles for loss (108) and total forced yards lost at 476 -- averaging 9.8 TFL for 43.3 yards lost per game this season. The Rebels have six games with double-digit TFL this season, the most in available game-by-game data since at least 1997. Of those six double-digit efforts, four have featured at least 13 TFL (Furman, 16; Oklahoma, 15; Georgia Southern, 13; Arkansas, 13), and three have featured at least 50 yards of loss (Oklahoma, 79; Furman, 62; Kentucky, 55; Arkansas, 54). The 16 TFL against Furman are the most by a Rebel defense since notching 17 against Mississippi State in 2000. In the Kiffin era, Ole Miss has recorded multiple sacks in 44 games, at least 5.0 tackles for loss in 42 games, and at least 4.0 sacks in 25 games. Ole Miss is 31-11 in games under Kiffin with at least 5.0 tackles for loss, and in games with at least 4.0 sacks the Rebels are 16-4.

### FEARSOME FRONT

The Ole Miss defensive line entered 2024 with a considerable amount of hype, and per PFF grades the Rebels have lived up to that pressure brilliantly. Among both edge and interior linemen, Ole Miss owns three of the top-15 overall rating in DE **Princely Umanmielen** (3rd, 90.7), DE **Jared Ivey** (7th, 89.6) and DT **Walter Nolen** (15th, 85.8). In run defense, Nolen -- a finalist for the Outland and semifinalist for the Walter Camp and Bednarik -- ranks as the top interior lineman in the SEC and the second-best in the FBS overall at a 91.0 grade. Combined, Ole Miss' five main starters on the line -- Ivey, Nolen, Pegues, DE **Suntarine Perkins** and Umanmielen -- have tallied up 198 tackles, 59.0 TFL for 304 yards, 36.0 sacks for 236 yards and 25 QB hurries. That accounts for 54.6 percent of all Rebel TFLs and 73.5 percent of all Rebel sacks this season. Perkins (10.5), Umanmielen (10.5) and Ivey (7.0) own more combined (28.0) than nine entire SEC schools this season and would rank eighth as their own team.

### SACKS RECORD IN DANGER

Defensive ends **Suntarine Perkins** and **Princely Umanmielen** stand among the elite pass rushers nationally this season, with both tied for sixth nationally and second in the SEC at 10.5 sacks apiece. However, that also puts both Rebels within striking distance of Sam Williams' 2021 single-season record of 12.5. Much of Perkins' season total comes from a monster day against Oklahoma on Oct. 26, when he sacked the Sooners four times for a loss of 14 yards in addition to 5.0 total tackles for loss and 11 total tackles. Those 4.0 sacks rank as the most by an individual Rebel defender since 1993, when Cassius Ware recorded four sacks against Georgia. Umanmielen has been consistently important for the Rebel defense down the stretch, notching seven of his 10.5 sacks in the last four games.

### GARNERING ATTENTION

DT **Walter Nolen** was highly touted as one of the top rated transfers in the nation last offseason, and he has responded with a powerful first season with the Rebels. His presence on the defensive line has helped clear holes for the rest of Ole Miss' fearsome defense that leads the nation in both sacks and TFL, with Nolen chipping in 40 tackles, 10.5 TFL, 5.0 sacks, three pass breakups, three QB hurries and two fumble recoveries. The college football world has noticed his importance to the Rebel front-seven, with PFF rating him as the No. 5 run defender in all of college football, as well as making the finalist cut for the Outland Trophy (Interior Lineman) and semifinalist cutoffs for the Walter Camp Award (Player of the Year) and Bednarik Award (Defensive Player of the Year).

**PUNCH-OUTS AND PICK-OFFS**

Senior safety **John Saunders Jr.** has been a steady presence in the secondary in his two seasons with the Rebels, having started all 24 of his games played at Ole Miss. As a Rebel, Saunders Jr. owns 106 tackles, 15 total passes defended with six interceptions and three forced fumbles -- all this season. In fact, combined with his three interceptions this year, Saunders Jr. stands as one of only three FBS defenders with at least three of each alongside Washington State's Taariq Al-Uqdah (three forced fumbles, three INT) and Old Dominion's Angelo Rankin Jr. (three forced fumbles, three INT). On the FBS active career lists, Saunders Jr. ranks tied for sixth in career INT (11) and tied for 11th in total passes defended (35).

**TACKLES FOR POOH**

Butkus Award finalist and LB **Chris "PooH" Paul Jr.** has consistently ranked among the top rated defenders in all of college football in 2024, currently rated as PFF's No. 11 overall defender and No. 2 linebacker in the SEC at a season grade of 89.8. Paul Jr. leads Ole Miss with 82 total tackles and ranks fifth on the team with 10.0 TFL alongside 2.5 sacks, nine QB hurries, four pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

**GIVE JJ THE ROCK!**

Ole Miss senior DT, Wuerffel Trophy semifinalist and Chucky Mullins Award winner **JJ Pegues** isn't just a great defender or a caring member of the Oxford community: he's also the not-so-secret offensive weapon for the Rebels. In his career, Pegues has scored seven TD since coming home to Lafayette County: a one-yard receiving TD in the 2022 Egg Bowl, and six rushing scores so far this season. Since 2015, Pegues is among 13 total FBS defenders to score at least five rushing touchdowns, and one of two defensive linemen in that span alongside UConn's Jelani Stafford in 2023 (6). Offensive prowess is no stranger to Pegues, though, who was a top-10 prospect nationally coming out of Oxford High School as a tight end before switching to defensive tackle while at Auburn. At six touchdowns for 36 points this season, Pegues is the all-time leading points scorer by Chucky Mullins Award winners, and he is the first to score those points on offense.

**UNSTOPPABLE**

WR **Jordan Watkins** didn't just have a career day at Arkansas -- he had an otherworldly day. Watkins was the key cog in Ole Miss' record-breaking offensive explosion against the Razorbacks, breaking the single-game school records in both receiving yards (254) and touchdowns (5) on eight catches. His five receiving scores tied the SEC single-game record, making him one of six in SEC history to ever haul in five touchdown passes and the first since Tennessee's Jalin Hyatt against Alabama in 2022. His 254 yards, meanwhile, constituted the 12th game of 250 yards receiving in SEC history, and it made him one of two receivers in SEC history with 250 yards and five scores in the same game alongside Heisman Trophy winner DeVonta Smith's 2019 performance against Ole Miss. Since 2013, Watkins is among five FBS receivers nationally to haul in five touchdowns in one game, and one of three total to add on 250 yards through the air. Prior to Nov. 2, Watkins' single-game receiving career-highs were 119 yards and one touchdown.

**WIDE OPEN WATKINS**

**Jordan Watkins** has been a deep threat since first arriving at Ole Miss, as evidenced by his seven career receptions of at least 60 yards as a Rebel. That includes an FBS-leading four catches of at least 60 this season, three of which came for TDs in a record-setting day at Arkansas. That game, all eight of Watkins' catches went for a least a first down, averaging a whopping 31.8 yards per reception against the Razorbacks. Per PFF, Watkins has the second-most yards after catch when targeted at least 20 yards downfield at 146 -- trailing only Alabama freshman Ryan Williams' 187.

**DOWNFIELD DEPTH**

QB **Jaxson Dart** has had plenty of options downfield this season, with Ole Miss' four main wide receivers all owning at least 27 receptions and 521 yards. Combined, **Tre Harris** (60 rec., 1,030 yards, 7 TD), **Cayden Lee** (46 rec., 790 yards, 2 TD), **Jordan Watkins** (37 rec., 687 yards, 7 TD) and **Antwane Wells Jr.** (27 rec., 521 yards, 5 TD) own 170 catches for 3,028 yards and 21 TDs -- respectively accounting for 67.2, 76.1 and 80.8 percent of Ole Miss' team totals.

### TRE-MENDOUS

Despite missing three games, senior WR and preseason All-American **Tre Harris** still ranks among the top pass-catchers nationwide. Harris remains PFF's top-rated SEC WR (89.8) and still leads all SEC receivers with 1,030 yards. Harris' 804 yards through five games were the most by any receiver pre-October in the College Football Playoff era, and were the most by a Power-5 receiver since Oregon State's Brandin Cooks tallied 807 before October in 2013 (per Connor O'Gara). On the FBS active career lists, Harris is one of seven with 3,000 career yards and 25 receiving touchdowns.

### BIG TARGETS

Ole Miss tight ends **Caden Prieskorn** (20 rec., 322 yards, 2 TD) and **Dae'Quan Wright** (23 rec., 304 yards, 3 TD) have been key in the Rebel offense as well, combining for 43 catches, 626 yards and five touchdowns. Prieskorn is climbing up Ole Miss' all-time rankings among tight ends, owning 50 catches for 771 yards and six TD in his Rebel career. He currently ranks top-10 in all three of those categories, sitting fifth in yards, tied for seventh in touchdowns and eighth in receptions. Wright, a Virginia Tech transfer, set career-highs in catches and yards in two straight appearances vs. Oklahoma and at Arkansas -- highlighted by a nine-catch, 99-yard and two touchdown performance in Fayetteville.

### BIG BOOT

Lou Groza Award semifinalist **Caden Davis** is 21-of-25 on field goals this season, including 9-of-11 from 40 yards or further -- but none longer than his 57-yard behemoth in overtime at LSU, a Tiger Stadium record that tied for third-longest in Ole Miss history. Davis stands alongside Cloyce Hinton as the lone kickers in Ole Miss history with multiple 55-yard field goals, with Davis owning makes from 56 (Tulane, 2023) and 57 (LSU, 2024). Davis was crucial in Ole Miss' 28-10 victory over No. 2 Georgia, going 5-of-5 on field goals in the rain. Earlier this season, Davis broke the Ole Miss single-game record with 10 PATs, and with 107 points he is just 17 away from Jonathan Nichols' 2003 record 124.

### DOWN UNDER

Ray Guy Award semifinalist and senior punter **Fraser Masin** has been excellent for the Rebels in 2024, averaging 46.4 yards on 28 punt attempts, with 11 traveling at least 50 yards and 13 downed inside the 20 -- helping lead Ole Miss to the SEC's best net punting average of 43.9 (FBS No. 3). Masin has also booted two punts beyond the 60-yard threshold, a 64-yarder against Oklahoma and a 65-yarder vs. Georgia that tied his career long. His current season average of 46.4 would rank as the third-best punting season in Ole Miss history, and his career average 43.3 currently rests seventh.

### HISTORIC COMPANY

Head coach **Lane Kiffin** recently became the fastest in Ole Miss history to 40 wins, and he is also shooting up both Ole Miss all-time lists in both total wins (4th) and winning percentage (2nd).

**WIN NO. 100 FOR LANE KIFFIN**

With Ole Miss' 27-3 win at South Carolina, head coach Lane Kiffin passed the century mark in his coaching career with his 100th total victory. Kiffin is 103-52 overall and 42-18 in his five seasons with the Rebels, which joins a 7-6 record at Tennessee (2009), a 28-15 mark at USC (2010-13) and a 26-13 split at Florida Atlantic (2017-19). Kiffin is one of only four coaches in the SEC with 100 wins across all levels of college football alongside LSU's Brian Kelly (290), Alabama's Kalen DeBoer (113) and Georgia's Kirby Smart (103). But in FBS-only victories, Kiffin is among a company of just 17 active coaches with 100 wins while at an FBS school -- one of three in the SEC alongside Kelly (193) and Smart (103).

**DOWN GO THE DAWGS**

Ole Miss used a dominant defensive effort and was able to move the ball in crucial situations, despite the rain, to take down the No. 2 Georgia Bulldogs, 28-10, at home on Nov. 9. This is the highest ranked win overall for the Rebels since a win at No. 2 Alabama in 2015 (43-37), the first top-five win in Oxford since a victory in the 2014 Egg Bowl against No. 4 Mississippi State (31-17; later vacated by the NCAA), and the highest ranked win in Oxford since beating No. 1 Alabama in 2014 (23-17; later vacated by the NCAA). Ole Miss is the first non-Alabama team to best Georgia since Florida in 2020, and was the largest top-five win by a Rebel team since Archie Manning led the Rebels to a 38-0 victory over No. 3 Tennessee in 1969.

**DEFENSE SHINES AGAINST GEORGIA**

In front of a record 68,126 fans, the Rebel defense frustrated the Bulldogs in ways few teams have been able to in the Kirby Smart era. The Rebels shut down Georgia to only 10 points, tied for the fewest of the Smart era and the fewest yielded by an Ole Miss defense vs. Georgia since 1995 (10). Offensively, Georgia was only able to muster 245 yards of total offense, its fewest since 2017, and 59 rushing yards, its fewest since 2021. The 18-point Rebel edge marked the largest margin of defeat for the Bulldogs since the 2019 SEC title game vs. LSU (37-10), and their largest difference in the regular season since 2018 vs. LSU (36-16). The Rebels terrorized UGA QB Carson Beck for five sacks, the most allowed by the Bulldogs since yielding five to Alabama in the 2022 CFP National Title Game, and the most in a regular season game since allowing five at Georgia Tech on Nov. 30, 2013.

### HEAD COACH LANE KIFFIN

Lane Kiffin is in his fifth season at Ole Miss and has led the Rebels to four consecutive bowl berths, including two New Year's Six appearances, under his guidance since 2020.

Kiffin led the 2023 Rebels to the best season in Ole Miss history in terms of wins, notching an 11-2 overall record capped by a 38-25 Peach Bowl victory over Penn State. Kiffin owns the only two 10-win regular seasons in Ole Miss history, and alongside legendary coach John Vaught, is one of two Rebel coaches with multiple 10-win seasons overall.

Ole Miss succeeded in 2023 with a balanced attack, finishing within the top-15 in the final FBS ranks in yards per completion (10th, 14.5), passing efficiency (12th, 162.9) and total offense (13th, 461.9), while also leading the nation in fewest turnovers (7) and leading the SEC and ranking fifth nationally in turnover margin (+11).

The Rebels once again ranked amongst the top of the nation in multiple offensive statistics in 2022. Ole Miss was No. 3 nationally in rushing offense (256.6) and No. 8 in total offense (496.4), helped in large part by freshman running back Quinshon Judkins and his school record 1,567 rushing yards and 16 rushing touchdowns.

Kiffin guided the Rebels to a 10-3 record in 2021, the first 10-win regular season in school history. That included a perfect 7-0 mark at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. The Rebels finished the season ranked No. 11 in both the AP and AFCA Coaches Poll, their highest final ranking since 2016.

Kiffin's second year at Ole Miss was once again highlighted by one of college football's most exciting offenses. For the second straight season, the Rebels led the SEC in total offense (492.5 ypg). The Rebel defense ranked as one of the top-five most-improved units in the FBS, allowing 13.6 fewer points per game this season compared to 2020.

Kiffin quickly turned the Rebels into an offensive machine in 2020, leading the program to an Outback Bowl win over No. 7 Indiana and a 5-5 record against an all-SEC schedule. Ole Miss ranked top 20 in the FBS in nine different offensive categories, including having the No. 3 team in the country in total offense, shattering the school record with 555.5 yards per game. The Rebels broke the SEC record for total offense in conference games (562.4 ypg), besting LSU's mark of 550.0 yards per game set during the Tigers' run to a national title in 2019.

The offensive explosion by the Rebels came as no surprise, as Kiffin has shown a propensity in helping turn programs around. In his first season at FAU, USC and Tennessee, Kiffin's team improved in win differential (+3.33), scoring (+10.2), passing (+34.5 ypg) and rushing (+51.3 ypg).

In December 2016, Kiffin took over an FAU program that had won a total of nine combined games over the previous three seasons. Kiffin proceeded to take the Owls to new heights over the last three years, including two conference titles and two 10-win seasons.

Kiffin led the Owls to a 10-3 record in 2019, including a 49-6 win over UAB in the Conference USA Championship Game. The Owls led the nation in interceptions (19) and turnovers gained (29). FAU also led C-USA in scoring offense (34.1), red zone offense (0.911), fumbles lost (3) and turnover margin (1.58).

In his first season in Boca Raton, Kiffin started 1-3 but reeled off a program-high 10 consecutive wins to finish the 2017 campaign at 11-3. The Owls' 11 victories were two more than the previous three seasons combined and earned the program votes in national polls. The seven-game improvement tied for the fifth-best turnaround in FBS history.

The Owls captured their second conference title in program history, the first since joining C-USA and first since 2007. FAU remained a perfect 3-0 in bowl play by defeating Akron in the Boca Raton Bowl, 50-3.

Kiffin joined the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurts, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurts finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to an SEC title and to the National Championship game. Hurts was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the Year and the SEC Freshman of the Year.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranked as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school-and SEC-record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying and then developing quarterback Blake Sims in 2014. Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award.

He spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous first team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998.

Kiffin attended Bloomington Jefferson High in Bloomington, Minnesota, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

**OXFORD, Miss.** — Lane Kiffin's No. 6 Rebels dominated Furman from start to finish in a 76-0 in Ole Miss' 2024 season opener. The Rebels' 76 points were the most in a single game in the Lane Kiffin era and tied for the most since 1935.

Ole Miss outgained Furman by an even 600 yards: 772-172. The Rebels totaled 529 yards through the air and 243 on the ground while holding the Paladins to just 146 and 26, respectively. The 772 yards of total offense were the second-highest total in program history.

Dart put up a full game's worth of stats in just one half. He was 22-for-27 with 445 total yards, six total touchdowns and no interceptions at halftime, and Ole Miss led 52-0 at the break, allowing the Heisman candidate to check out early. Dart became the first SEC QB since Joe Burrow in 2019 with more than 350 passing yards in a half, tallying 418 through the air.

Tre Harris led the way on the receiving end with 179 yards and two touchdowns on eight receptions. Cayden Lee, Caden Prieskorn, Antwane Wells Jr. and Dae'Quan Wright all hauled in touchdown passes as well.

On the ground, Ole Miss averaged 6.6 yards per carry with Matt Jones leading the way at 68 yards and two TDs on just three touches.

Ole Miss' defense didn't allow a single red zone appearance and held Furman to 3-for-17 on third downs attempts. It's the first time since 2014 that the Rebel defense held a team to under 10 first downs. The Rebel offense amassed 37 first downs, while the defense yielded just eight.

**OXFORD, Miss.** — Jaxson Dart made Ole Miss history through the air, Henry Parrish Jr. had a four-touchdown day on the ground and the No. 5 Rebels rolled once again, dominating Middle Tennessee 52-3 to start the 2024 season at 2-0.

Dart completed 24 straight passes to set an Ole Miss record and finish just two completions shy of the single-game NCAA mark. Prior to Dart's assault on the record book, the story was the ground game, where Parrish burned the Blue Raiders for 165 yards and four scores on just 14 carries.

Ole Miss outgained Middle Tennessee 655 to 279 in its 24th 600-yard game under head coach Lane Kiffin. The balanced Rebel attack notched 397 yards through the air and 258 on the ground. The Rebel defense has not allowed a touchdown in two games to start the year and held the Blue Raiders to just 28 yards rushing at a rate of 1.1 yards per carry.

Dart finished 25-for-27 for 377 yards and two total touchdowns, one rushing and one passing. Tre Harris continued his Biletnikoff Award campaign with a team-high nine receptions for 130 yards. Antwane Wells Jr. caught his first touchdown pass as a Rebel and totaled 78 yards as one of nine Rebels with a reception on the day. Parrish averaged 11.8 yards per carry on 165 yards to lead the ground game, while Matt Jones added in his third rushing TD of the season.

Chris Paul Jr., TJ Dottery and Trey Washington tied for the team lead with six tackles apiece. Yam Banks matched Paul with a team-high 1.5 tackles for loss. Banks and Washington each added a pass breakup, while Jadon Canady led that category with two deflections. John Saunders Jr. pulled down the game's lone interception, while Princely Umanmielen logged his first sack in an Ole Miss uniform, in addition to a team-high two QB hurries.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — A myriad of miscues kept Wake Forest in the game, but it was never in doubt as No. 5 Ole Miss was dominant once again in a 40-6 victory in its first road trip of the 2024 season.

Ole Miss raced out a 20-3 lead in the first quarter and never looked back, but it wasn't a perfect outing from Lane Kiffin's Rebels, who were penalized 11 times for 114 yards and turned the ball over twice.

Despite an uncharacteristic number of mistakes, the Rebels still thoroughly controlled the action, outgaining the Demon Deacons 650-311, including just 46 yards rushing by the home team. The Ole Miss defense also forced two turnovers of its own, as well as two turnovers on downs, and held its opponent out of the end zone for the third straight game to start the season as the Rebels have now outscored their opponents 168-9.

Jaxson Dart posted Heisman Trophy numbers once again, going 26-for-34 through the air for 413 total yards (377 pass, 36 rush) and three total touchdowns. Henry Parrish Jr. stayed hot on the ground, amassing 148 yards and two touchdowns on 23 carries (6.4 YPC). Tre Harris also continued his Biletnikoff Award-worthy pace, leading Ole Miss with 127 receiving yards and 11 catches. Cayden Lee was next with five receptions for 83 yards, while Antwane Wells Jr. and Jordan Watkins each had long touchdown catches.

TJ Dottery was Ole Miss' leading tackler on the day with eight stops. Louis Moore and Jared Ivey were next with six apiece. Ivey added two sacks and a QB hurry, while Moore shared a sack and recovered a fumble. Suntarine Perkins had an interception and a sack. JJ Pegues combined on a sack, had two QB hurries and a first-down run for good measure.

OXFORD, Miss. — The No. 5 Ole Miss football team closed out a perfect 4-0 non-conference schedule with a dominant 52-13 win over Georgia Southern in front of a record crowd of 67,505 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Ole Miss outgained Georgia Southern 607-194 on the night, holding the Eagles to just 37 yards rushing and 157 passing. The yellow flags were a thorn in Ole Miss' side for the second straight week as the Rebels overcame 11 penalties for 133 yards for a still-decisive victory.

Lane Kiffin's Rebels have outscored their opponents 220-22 through four games. The Ole Miss defense yielded its first touchdown of the 2024 campaign early in the second quarter. The Rebels went 195:47 of game time before allowing their first TD of the season, the program's most consecutive game time without allowing a touchdown since 1959.

Jaxson Dart continued his Heisman Trophy-caliber pace, going 22-for-31 through the air for 382 yards and four touchdowns, adding 36 yards on the ground. Tre Harris was unstoppable as he finished 23 yards shy of the program's single-game receiving record, catching 11 passes for 225 yards and two touchdowns. Henry Parrish Jr. once again led the ground game, tallying 89 yards and a score on 13 carries.

Chris Paul Jr. paced the Rebel defense with 10 tackles, including two tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. Khari Coleman wasn't far behind with nine tackles and a forced fumble. Princely Umanmielen and Walter Nolen were disruptive as usual up front. Nolen totaled four tackles, including a shared sack, and added a QB hurry.

**OXFORD, Miss.** — The No. 5 Ole Miss football team could never find its rhythm offensively in its Southeastern Conference opener against Kentucky, falling 20-17.

It was a defensive battle throughout, and the slow game pace favored Kentucky, as the visitors dominated time of possession 39:43 to 20:17, and the Wildcats were able to execute late offensively, scoring on a fumble recovery in the end zone to tip the scales. Ole Miss had just 55 total yards and one first down in the fourth quarter of the defeat, falling to 4-1 (0-1) on the year. Rebel fans set a new attendance record with 67,616 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Ole Miss narrowly outgained Kentucky, 353-336. Penalties once again hurt the Rebels, who were flagged eight times for 53 yards, all in the first half. Jaxson Dart was sacked four times, while Ole Miss notched five sacks on the day.

Dart finished 18-for-27 passing with 261 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions, adding 22 yards on the ground. Henry Parrish Jr. tallied 62 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries. The Harris had a phenomenal day individually, hauling in 11 catches for 176 yards and a touchdown.

TJ Dottery logged a team-high 10 tackles and added three QB hurries. Santarine Perkins was outstanding as well with six tackles and a pair of sacks. It was also another big outing from Princely Umanmielen, who had three tackles for loss, including 1.5 sacks. Trey Amos led the Rebel secondary with three pass breakups, while Trey Washington had one breakup, a forced fumble and seven tackles. Walter Nolen led the Rebel D-line with seven tackles, including one for a loss.

Up 17-13 late in the fourth, it looked like the Rebels had a quick stop, but the Wildcats rolled the dice on a 4th-and-7 deep, and Vandagriff hit a 63-yard gain to Brown. It looked again like Ole Miss would escape danger when Trey Washington jarred the ball loose on a Gavin Wimsatt run, but UK's Josh Kattus recovered the fumble in the end zone for the go-ahead touchdown.

**COLUMBIA, S.C.** — The No. 11 Ole Miss football team passed its first SEC road test with flying colors on Saturday, turning in a dominant 27-3 victory at South Carolina for its first conference win of the 2024 season.

The Rebels were outstanding defensively, notching a pair of turnovers, six sacks and 10 tackles for loss, holding South Carolina to just 313 total yards and turning the Gamecocks away twice in the red zone. Offensively, Ole Miss left some points on the field, including a fumble through the end zone, but racked up 425 total yards and mounted a 24-3 lead at halftime to take control early in a victory that was never in doubt.

It was win No. 100 for head coach Lane Kiffin's career, including 39 during his Ole Miss tenure. Kiffin is one of 30 active FBS coaches to surpass the century mark in career wins and one of just three in the SEC alongside LSU's Brian Kelly and Alabama's Kalen DeBoer.

Jaxson Dart finished 14-for-27 with 329 total yards (285 passing, 44 rushing) on a solid day against one of the nation's top pass-rushing defenses. Henry Parrish Jr. led the way rushing with 81 yards and a touchdown on 21 carries.

Antwane Wells Jr. had a team-high 97 receiving yards, while Jordan Watkins led Ole Miss with five catches for 72 yards. Tre Harris had three catches for 81 yards but departed the game early due to injury. Ole Miss' 425 total yards is the most given up by the South Carolina defense this season.

TJ Dottery had a team-high 13 tackles, including two for a loss, a sack and a pass breakup. Santarine Perkins was second with 12 tackles, matching Dottery's sack and two TFLs. Trey Amos had an INT and led all DBs with eight tackles. Walter Nolen had a spectacular day with a fumble recovery and a team-high three tackles for loss and tied Jared Ivey with a team-best two sacks.

Ole Miss held South Carolina to only three points, the fewest allowed by a Rebel defense against an SEC opponent since holding Texas A&M to three in 2015. The Rebel defense had six sacks, setting a season-high for the second week in a row and now have 24 sacks on the season.

Ole Miss didn't trail until the final play of the game, but had a sure touchdown dropped, a turnover on downs inside the 5-yard line and a missed short field goal, as well as 12 penalties for 110 yards, including two in overtime, as it fell short of its first win at Tiger Stadium since 2008.

The Rebels had one 100-yard rusher and two 100-yard receivers in the loss. Ulysses Bentley IV led the ground attack with 107 yards on 11 carries, with one touchdown. Cayden in both receptions (nine) and yards (132). Tre Harris registered his fifth 100-yard receiving game of the season, hauling in seven catches for 102 yards and one touchdown.

Ole Miss tallied two interceptions and held LSU to just 84 rushing yards, an average of 3.3 yards per carry. Chris Paul Jr. led the Rebels with seven total tackles. Trey Washington finished second on the team with six tackles and a team-high 1.5 tackles for loss. Trey Amos and Jamarious Brown both registered an interception.

Caden Davis finished five-of-six on field goal attempts, including a long of 57 yards to get the Rebels on the board in overtime. Fraser Masin average 46.0 yards per punt on three attempts, with two downed inside the 20-yard line.

It was the first overtime game for Ole Miss since defeating Kentucky, 42-41, in 2020.

### GAME EIGHT #18 OLE MISS 26, OKLAHOMA 14

**OXFORD, Miss.** — No. 18 Ole Miss football used an overwhelming pass rush to pitch a shutout in the second half and beat Oklahoma 26-14 in the first Southeastern Conference meeting between the two schools.

The Rebels found themselves trailing 14-10 at halftime against the SEC newcomers, but the defense dominated the second half, allowing just 94 total yards and zero points to comfortably complete the comeback. Ole Miss had nine sacks on the day, including seven in the second half to win in front of a record crowd of 67,926 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Ole Miss outgained the Sooners 380-329 on the afternoon, including 311-182 through the air. Each team overcame seven penalties, with the Rebels being penalized for 94 yards.

Lane Kiffin became the fastest head coach to 40 wins in Ole Miss history at 57 games, joining John Vaught, Billy Brewer and David Cutcliffe as the fourth 40-win coach in program history.

Jaxson Dart turned in a strong day, going 22-for-30 for 311 yards and one touchdown, adding 24 yards on the ground. Henry Parrish Jr. led the rushing efforts with 44 yards and a score on 15 carries. Caden Prieskorn was Ole Miss' leading receiver with five catches, 71 yards and a touchdown. The Rebel offensive line turned in an outstanding performance against a dangerous pass rush. Oklahoma entered the game at No. 2 in the SEC and No. 3 in the nation with 25.0 sacks on the year but notched just one on Dart at The Vaught.

The Ole Miss pass rush dominated the game, totaling nine sacks for a loss of 50 yards and 15 tackles for loss in total. The nine sacks were tied for the most ever given up by an OU team and tied for the third-most in Ole Miss history, two shy of the school record 11 set in 2008. FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — Behind record-setting days for both quarterback Jaxson Dart and receiver Jordan Watkins, the No. 18 Ole Miss football team reversed its fortunes in Fayetteville, dominating SEC rival Arkansas, 63-31.

Jaxson Dart set the single-game passing record, along with a number of career marks and Watkins broke the single-game receiving yards and touchdown records.

Dart finished 25-for-31 for an Ole Miss single-game record 515 passing yards. Dart threw six touchdowns, and Austin Simmons added one as the Rebels tied their single-game team passing TD record.

Watkins caught eight passes and broke Ole Miss' single-game records with 254 receiving yards and five touchdowns. Tight end Dae'Quan Wright led the Rebels in receptions with nine, notching 99 yards and two touchdowns. Cayden Lee also hit the century mark with 127 yards on just five catches.

Playing with a large lead for much of the day, the Ole Miss defense pinned its ears back and finished with eight sacks and 13 tackles for loss. TJ Dottery led the way with a team-high six tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and a forced fumble. Princely Umanmielen recovered that fumble for a touchdown and added two sacks.

OXFORD, Miss. — No. 3 Georgia had no answer for the elite pass rush of No. 16 Ole Miss football as the Rebels dominated the Bulldogs 28-10 in front of a record crowd of 68,126 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The massive win for Lane Kiffin and his squad puts the Rebels squarely in a chaotic race for the College Football Playoff. Jaxson Dart led an Ole Miss offense that scored on seven of its 10 drives, including a key touchdown strike in the third quarter to Antwane Wells Jr. to put the home team ahead by two scores.

From there, the Ole Miss pass rush snuffed out all hopes of a Georgia comeback. The Rebels finished with five sacks, five pass breakups, four forced fumbles and four QB hurries as they disrupted Carson Beck and the Bulldogs offense all night.

Jaxson Dart finished 13-for-22 with 249 total yards (199 passing, 50 rushing) and one key touchdown strike late to Antwane Wells Jr. Cayden Lee and Jordan Watkins led the receiving efforts with four catches apiece for 81 and 68 yards, respectively. Ulysses Bentley IV notched 66 all-purpose yards on 13 carries and four catches with one rushing TD.

Jaxson Dart finished 13-for-22 with 249 total yards (199 passing, 50 rushing) and one key touchdown strike late to Antwane Wells Jr. Cayden Lee and Jordan Watkins led the receiving efforts with four catches apiece for 81 and 68 yards, respectively. Ulysses Bentley IV notched 66 all-purpose yards on 13 carries and four catches with one rushing TD.

Ole Miss joined Alabama as the only teams to defeat Georgia since 2021. The last non-Alabama team to beat Georgia in the regular season was Florida in 2020. This marked Ole Miss' largest top-five victory since beating No. 3 Tennessee 38-0 in 1969.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. — The No. 9 Ole Miss football team outgained Florida by 100 yards at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium, but the Rebels were unable to turn production into points, going 0-for-3 in the red zone and turning the ball over three times in a 24-17 defeat.

Jaxson Dart was 24-for-41 for 323 yards with two touchdowns but was sacked four times and threw interceptions on each of the last two Rebel drives as Ole Miss couldn't complete a comeback. Ole Miss was 3-for-14 on third down and turned it over twice on downs, in addition to two INTs and a muffed punt.

Ole Miss got on the board in the second quarter as Dart dropped a dime to Tre Harris for a 43-yard touchdown to tie the game at 7-7.

The Rebels quickly turned that tie into a lead. John Saunders Jr. pulled in a spectacular one-handed interception on the following drive to set Ole Miss up for a chance to take the lead. With just 55 yards to travel, Dart went to work, connecting with Caden Prieskorn and Jordan Watkins before delivering a 22-yard touchdown pass to Lee over the middle to give Ole Miss a 14-7 advantage.

Florida answered right back as Lagway notched a pair of long completions of his own, in addition to a pass interference call against the Rebels, and tied it back up on a 25-yard touchdown connection with Jadan Baugh.

After Florida took a 17-14 lead due to a muffed punt from the Rebels, Caden Davis drilled a 42-yard field goal to tie game at 17-17 headed into the fourth quarter.

Then came the game's winning drive. Lagway hit Chimere Dike for a 41-yard reception, then Montrell Johnson Jr. took three straight runs, going 12, five and nine yards for the go-ahead touchdown, making it 24-17.

Ole Miss had two chances late in the game to draw even, but Dart was intercepted twice in the final few minutes to seal the win for the Gators.


