QUICK NOTES

- The Wildcats are set to play host to the No. 21/15 Ole Miss Rebels on Saturday, Sept. 6 at 3:30 p.m. ET at Kroger Field, marking both teams' Southeastern Conference opener.
 - The two teams are tied in games played in Lexington, 11-11-1.
 - The Wildcats won last season's meeting with the No. 6/5-ranked Rebels in Oxford, 20-17. It marked the Cats' highest-ranked triumph in the Mark Stoops era.
- Kentucky is coming off a win over Toledo, the Mid-American Conference preseason favorite, 24-16, last Saturday in Kroger Field.
 - UK's offense, who converted on 8-of-15 on third downs and went 2-of-2 in the red zone, put up 220 yards rushing as two backs rushed for at least 75 yards apiece and three players earned a rushing score.
 - UK's defense held Toledo to 59 yards rushing and also to 1-of-4 on fourth-down conversions.
- Mark Stoops is the SEC's longest-tenured coach as he enters his 13th season at the helm of the Wildcats. He is UK's all-time winningest head coach with a 68-73 overall record.
- The UK staff executed an expansive overhaul of its roster during the offseason, bringing in 55 new players, including 27 via the transfer portal.
 - The offensive side of the football in particular looks different. UK returned 39 percent of its rushing yards from 2024, 37 percent of its receiving yards and just 15 percent of its passing yards (all by RS-F Cutter Boley).
- Zach Calzada, starting quarterback, is in his seventh season of college football. He began his career at Texas A&M in 2019, playing three seasons for the Aggies, before transferring to Auburn in 2022. After an injury at Auburn, he transferred to play the last two seasons at Incarnate Word in San Antonio, Texas.
 - He is 24-9 overall as a starter overall, including his one game at Kentucky.
- UK has one of the most experienced offensive lines in FBS, with 166 career starts between them (third-most in FBS).
- Defensively, UK returned 46 percent of their total tackles, including four of their top six tacklers in Jordan Lovett, Alex Afari Jr., JQ Hardaway and Ty Bryant.
 - Afari Jr. had a career-best 13 tackles against Toledo in Week 1, the most by a Southeastern Conference player through Week 1.
- According to USA Today, Kentucky will play the nation's fifth-toughest schedule in 2025. UK is set to play six teams currently ranked in the preseason top 25 poll, including two in the top 10 in Texas and Georgia. Three other opponents are receiving votes.

KENTUCKY-OLE MISS

THE SERIES

- Kentucky tails Ole Miss, 30-15-2 in the all-time series, which began in 1937.
 - In Lexington, the series is tied, 11-11-1.
 - UK hasn't hosted UM in Lexington since 2020.
 - Ole Miss has won the past two meetings in Lexington.
 - The last time UK defeated UM in Lexington was on Nov. 5, 2011 (30-13).
- The Wildcats are on a one-game winning streaking after taking the last meeting with the Rebels, 20-17, in Oxford in 2024.
 - Each of the past four meetings have been decided by three points or less (a total of 10 points) with one (2020) going to overtime.
- FUN FACT:** The teams also have met 11 times in either Jackson, Mississippi, or Memphis, Tennessee.

IN THE LAST MEETING

- Kentucky defeated No. 6/5 Ole Miss, 20-17, on Sept. 28, 2024, which marked its highest-ranked triumph at an opponent's Southeastern Conference campus stadium in program history.
 - It also marked UK's highest-ranked triumph in the Mark Stoops era.
 - It also marked its highest Associated Press ranked road win since a victory at No. 4 Penn State in 1977.
 - It also marked its first win over an Associated Press ranked, top-six team since a victory over No. 1 LSU in 2007.
- Against a defense that entered the game first in the nation in scoring defense (5.5ppg) and rushing defense (34.5ypg) and 12th in total defense (239ypg), UK's offense totaled 20 points, 336 yards of total offense, 93 rushing yards and 243 passing yards at UM.
- Against an offense that entered the game first in the nation in scoring (55ppg), total offense (670.8ypg) and passing offense (422.8ypg), and 12th in rushing offense (248ypg), UK's defense held UM to 17 points, 353 yards of total offense, 261 passing yards and 92 rushing yards.

THE CONNECTIONS

- UK RB Dante Dowdell (Picayune) and DL Josaih Hayes (Horn Lake) each hail from the Magnolia State.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

- Kentucky will play the nation's fifth-toughest schedule in 2025, according to USA Today. UK is set to play six teams ranked in the Associated Press Preseason Top 25, including two in the top 10 in Texas and Georgia.
 - Additionally, three other opponents are receiving votes in the preseason poll (Louisville, Toledo and Auburn).
- UK is one of only eight teams in FBS scheduled to face at least six opponents in the AP Preseason Top 25 (Texas, Georgia, South Carolina, Florida, Ole Miss and Tennessee).

WILDCATS AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

- Ole Miss is the first of six possible ranked opponents for the Wildcats this season.
- UK is 5-10 all-time vs. a ranked Ole Miss team.
- The Wildcats' last win over a ranked Ole Miss team was last season in Oxford when UK upset No. 6 Ole Miss, 20-17.
- UK is 3-3 at home vs. a ranked Ole Miss team. This marks the first time UK has faced a ranked Ole Miss team at home since 1993. UK won that game and defeated the 25th-ranked Rebels, 21-0.
- Kentucky has played 275 ranked teams in the Associated Press poll in its history, holding a 51-217-5 record in those games. (The on-field record is 53-217-5, two wins were vacated by NCAA from 2021).

- In ranked games last season, Kentucky defeated No. 6 Ole Miss, 20-17, on Sept. 28, suffered a narrow defeat to top-ranked Georgia, 13-12, on Sept. 14 and led at No. 7 Tennessee in the second half before losing, 28-18, on Nov. 2.
- The Wildcats are 9-12 on-field against their last 21 ranked AP-ranked teams, dating back to a win over NC State in the 2020 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl.
 - Since 2018, the Cats are 12-18 on-field against AP-ranked teams.

KENTUCKY IN THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

- The Wildcats have a 189-413-12 (.318) all-time record in Southeastern Conference games.
 - UK head coach Mark Stoops has a 31-62 (.333) all-time record in SEC games.
- The Wildcats have won three of their last four league openers.

PROMOTIONS & THEMES: GAME 2

- Blue White Game** - One side of the stadium will wear white and one side will wear blue.
- Ag Roundup** - This annual event welcomes alumni and friends of the Martin-Gatton College of Agriculture, Food and Environment.

HOME SWEET HOME

- In 2025, UK is in its 53rd season playing at Kroger Field, which was formerly named Commonwealth Stadium (1973-2016).
 - The Cats are 184-149-4 (.552) all-time in the stadium, including 48-33 (.593) under Mark Stoops.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

RECONSTRUCTED OFFENSIVE LINE

- The reconstruction of the Big Blue Wall had a significant focus on size, depth - and maybe most important - experience during the offseason. UK now has a group that - prior to the season opener - featured the third-most collegiate starts in the nation and more than 200 career games played.
 - Included in that group is transfer lineman and 2025 Preseason Coaches All-Southeastern Conference Third Teamer Josh Braun, who has played 51 career games (one at Kentucky, 26 at Florida and 24 at Arkansas) with 33 career starts (one at Kentucky, eight at Florida and 24 at Arkansas).
- The Big Blue Wall didn't give up a sack against Toledo in Week 1, while it created holes to rack up 220 yards on the ground.
- FUN FACT:** While offensive lines don't get much of the limelight, the Big Blue Wall is a fairly popular group, from Jager Burton spearheading a tornado relief drive that filled more than two semi-trucks full of goods for those affected this summer in Eastern Kentucky to Shiyazh Pete's unique perspective on his Navajo roots.

BIG Z THE QB

- Zach Calzada, who was named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Preseason Watch List, brings a new energy - and a lot of experience - to Kentucky.
- In his seventh season playing college football, prior to arriving at Kentucky, he appeared in 38 career games (23 at Incarnate Word and 15 at Texas A&M) with 32 starts (22 at UIW and 10 at TAMU).
 - While boasting a 23-9 record as a starter at UIW and TAMU, his career stats included:
 - 731 of 1,163 completions
 - 8,707 passing yards
 - 73 touchdowns
 - 28 interceptions
 - He also had 179 rushes for 381 yards and 11 scores
 - Just last season at UIW, he finished second in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in passing touchdowns with 35.
- FUN FACT:** In a post-scrimmage media availability this fall, Calzada said, "its the perfect fit," to describe how his game lends itself to Bush Hamdan's offense. In a Week 1 media availability, he added, "I like to go by the saying that I've got to be Clark Kent until it's time to be Superman."

THREE UK BACKS LED THEIR TEAMS IN RUSHING LAST SEASON

- The running room features two veteran "big backs" plucked from the transfer portal in Seth McGowan (New Mexico State) and Dante Dowdell (Nebraska) and a pair of young men, Jason Patterson and Jamarion Wilcox, who gained unexpected, valuable experience as UK freshmen in 2024.
 - Kentucky had two players - McGowan and Dowdell - rush for at least 75 yards each in the season opener against Toledo in Week 1. It marked the first time it has had two rushers over 75 yards in a season opener since 2018 (Benny Snell, A.J. Rose).
- Three of those ballcarriers - McGowan, Dowdell and Wilcox - led their teams in rushing last season.
 - McGowan led New Mexico State with 153 carries, 823 yards and three touchdowns rushing - also added three touchdowns receiving - though 12 games and 11 starts.
 - Dowdell paced Nebraska in rushing with 143 carries, 614 rushing yards and 12 touchdowns through 12 games and seven starts.
 - Wilcox came on strong late last season to lead Kentucky with 590 rushing yards (6.4 per carry).
 - Patterson was limited to four games in order to retain his redshirt but showed plenty of ability by running for 111 yards and averaging 5.6 per carry.

WIDE NET OF WIDE RECEIVERS

- While one name stands out as an obvious leader in the receiver room in Ja'Mori Maclin, with turnover, its sure to be a competitive room, which now includes a whopping 18 men.
 - The wide receiver room includes:
 - No returning starters.
 - Two returners that played on offense in all 12 games last season - Ja'Mori Maclin, Fred Farrier II.
 - Five transfers - Troy Stellato (Clemson), Kendrick Law (Alabama), J.J. Hester (Oklahoma), Hardley Gilmore IV (Nebraska), Ashton Cozart (SMU).
 - FUN FACT:** Gilmore did not actually play for Nebraska, he played for Kentucky last season. However, he did enter the transfer portal and signed with the Cornhuskers in the offseason, following former UK wide receivers coach Dakiel Shorts. He made his return back to the Bluegrass in April. In an interview with the Lexington Herald Leader, Hardley said, "I'm where I'm supposed to be.... I'm comfortable here.... It's just genuine love here.... There isn't anybody like Coach Stoops to me."
 - Five scholarship freshmen - DJ Miller (4-star), Cam Miller (4-star), Quintin Simmons Jr. (4-star), Montavin Quisenberry (3-star), Preston Bowman (3-star).
 - Maclin, who prior to the season opener had 87 career receptions for 1,702 career yards and 17 career scores, recorded 13 catches for 313 yards and four scores last season at Kentucky. However, seven of his 13 catches came in the final four games, while three catches for 121 yards and two touchdowns came in the season finale against Louisville.
 - Not included in his four TDs, he also caught a two-point conversion pass following his own TD at Tennessee.
 - FUN FACT:** Maclin desires to have an impact on younger players - both on and off the field. He has been using TikTok and YouTube to post free workouts / drills / technical tips, while also slipping in life wisdoms, too.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

FOUR YEARS OF CONTINUITY

- The Wildcats' defensive coaches have been together for at least four years:
 - Brad White (defensive coordinator) - Eighth season at UK
 - Chris Collins (co-defensive coordinator/defensive backs coach) - Fifth season
 - Frank Buffano (safeties coach) - Sixth season
 - Anwar Stewart (defensive line coach) - Sixth season
 - Mike Stoops (inside linebackers coach) - Fourth season

GOOD TO SEE YOU BACK!

- Two defensive linemen were tagged as Comeback Player of the Year Watch List candidates this preseason after suffering injuries in Spring 2024.
 - Tavion Gadson, a sophomore, has been very patient since stepping foot in Lexington as a freshman two years ago. He played just four games as a freshman in 2023, with the goal to redshirt, then he suffered a knee injury in Spring 2024. It kept him out for majority of last season, playing limited snaps in just two games in 2024.
 - Josaih Hayes is due for a big season. This will mark his sixth season in the program, with 45 career games, four starts and 57 career tackles under his belt prior to this season. He sat out most of last season after suffering a torn Achilles tendon in Spring 2024. He, too, played limited snaps in three games in 2024.



A DEFENSE THAT RANKS...

Kentucky concluded last season ranked in the nation's top 25 and the Southeastern Conference's top five in five categories, including two special teams categories, which is coached by Jay Boulware.

BRAD'S BENCHMARKS

- Brad White is in his seventh season as the defensive coordinator, and his eighth season overall at Kentucky, since Mark Stoops plucked him from the NFL in 2018. He became defensive coordinator in 2019, and UK has steadily become more stout on that side of the ball.
 - Other programs have taken notice, too, as White has turned down other coaching opportunities in that time.
- Kentucky's defense has remained constant under White, and that is evident by the benchmarks he continues to reach year-in and year-out.
 - The UK defense has held opponents to 30 points or fewer in 58-of-74 games - 78.4 percent - with White as the defensive coordinator (2019-present).
 - The UK defense has held opponents to 24 points or fewer in 29 of the last 41 games - 70.7 percent - since November 2021.
 - For the first time since 1983-89, UK has allowed 26 points or fewer per game in seven straight seasons (2018-24).
 - For the first time since 1946-54, UK has yielded fewer than 162 rushing yards per game for seven straight seasons (2018-24).

STEVEN "SACK 'EM" SOLES JR.

- In Week 1, Steven Soles Jr., sophomore linebacker, had a career-high two quarterback sacks (-20 yards), causing a fumble on both plays.
 - He is the first player to have two sacks in a game since Octavious Oxendine had two at Ole Miss on Sept. 28, 2024.

STOPPING THE RUN

- Kentucky has held 13 of its last 27 opponents - 48.1 percent - to less than 100 yards rushing, dating back to the final game of 2022.
 - In Week 1, Kentucky held Toledo to 59 net rushing yards. Kentucky has held its opponents to under 100 yards rushing in each of its last three straight season openers (2023-25).

STOPPING THE PASS

- Last season, UK concluded the season ranked 21st in the nation and fourth in the league in passing defense giving up 183.7 yards passing per game.
 - UK allowed less than 200 yards passing in nine total games in 2024.
- Last season, UK allowed less than 200 yards passing in each of the first four games, including against South Carolina and No. 1/1 Georgia, for the first time since 1989.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

AIDAN LAROS' "ZERO TOUGHNESS"

- Aidan Laros (pronounced luh-ROSS), starting punter, was named to the 2025 Preseason Coaches All-Southeastern Conference Third Team after handling kickoffs and also was the primary punter in the last nine games last season.
 - Last season, he had 49 kickoffs for 3,064 yards and 32 touchbacks.
 - Last season, he had 32 punts for 1,453 yards with three touchbacks, 10 fair catches, 11 inside the 20 and 10 with 50 yards or more for a 45.4 average.
- He's become wildly popular for his "zero toughness" rating on EA Sports' College Football 26, which he humbly and comically calls an obvious mistake. He's undoubtedly the first rugby player in history to have a zero toughness rating (see below).
 - FUN FACT:** Aidan played rugby growing up in South Africa. Also, his father, Adrian, played 14 seasons of Division I rugby in South Africa and three seasons of professional rugby in France.
- Laros had an outstanding performance in the season. He punted five times, four inside the 20-yard line and three inside the 10. His fifth punt landed on the three-yard line before skipping into the end zone. Including the touchback, Toledo's average starting yardline was inside its own 12.
- Laros also had a booming performance on kickoffs; all totaled, UK had a +15 yard advantage on average starting yardline, as UK's average starting yardline was its own 38 while Toledo's average starting yardline was its own 21.

NONCONFERENCE COMPETITION

- The Wildcats have won 20 of their last 21 nonconference games in the regular season.
 - Kentucky had won 19 straight nonconference games in the regular season, a stretch that was second in the nation behind Georgia, before falling to Louisville on Nov. 30, 2024.
- Kentucky has won 23 of its last 26 nonconference games.
 - That stretch featured 16 straight nonconference wins, which was the longest active streak in FBS at the time, including four straight bowl wins. The streak began in the season opener on Sept. 1, 2018 and ended in the Music City Bowl game on Dec. 31, 2022.

SUPER SENIORS

Kentucky has six "Super Seniors" who return for their final year of eligibility in 2025.

- QB Beau Allen - Transferred back to Kentucky in 2024 as a graduate transfer after one season at Georgia Southern (2023) and one at Tarleton State (2022). He started his collegiate career as a Wildcat in 2020-21.

- Kentucky welcomes a pair of new coaches to its on-field coaching staff, including La'Damian Washington (wide receivers) and Derek Shay (tight ends).
- Washington, a former National Football League and Canadian Football League receiver, opens his first season in Lexington with a strong resume that includes both playing and coaching in the Southeastern Conference.
 - Washington starred at Missouri from 2009-2013, helping lead the Tigers to four bowl games. He returned for one year as the school's Director of Player Development in 2020. He then spent time at Southern University and Oklahoma as a wide receivers coach before moving to South Florida the past two seasons, which both ended in bowl appearances.
- Shay played at both Western and Eastern Illinois before beginning his coaching career as a student assistant in 2011.
 - One of Shay's early stops included prep powerhouse IMG Academy, where he was the Co-Offensive Coordinator and Offensive Line Coach. He guided six All-American linemen while there and 10 who signed Division I.
 - Shay's collegiate coaching experience includes stops at McNeese State, LSU, Missouri and Marshall before spending the 2024 season as a senior offensive analyst and run game specialist at Kentucky.



WILDCATS IN THE NFL DRAFT

- Two players were drafted in 2025, giving head coach Mark Stoops a total of 30 drafted players since his arrival in 2013.
 - Twenty-six of those 30 selections have come in the last seven drafts (2019-25).
 - Eighteen of those 30 selections were defensive players.
 - 26 of the 28 players in previous drafts (not including 2025) have played at least one season in the league
- The 2025 NFL Draft marked the seventh straight year UK had at least one player drafted in the first three rounds.
- UK has had at least two players drafted in seven consecutive drafts, the first time that has happened since the 1984-91 drafts.
- With DB Maxwell Hairston being selected 30th overall by the Buffalo Bills, UK has had four first-round draft choices under Stoops. They include Alvin "Bud" Dupree (2015), Josh Hines-Allen (2019), Jamin Davis (2021) and Hairston.

DID YOU KNOW?

- A picture of longevity, UK Equipment Manager Tom Kalinowski enters his 48th season in that role in 2025. He also was a student manager in 1974-77, now marking his 52nd year working with UK football in 2024.
 - He has worked more than 500 consecutive games. In honor of his 50th season in 2023, Kalinowski was named an honorary captain for the home finale against Alabama.
- UK is one of only 11 schools that have won an NCAA men's basketball championship, while also having a claim on a national championship in football.
- UK is one of only eight universities in the United States with the full complement of liberal arts, engineering, professional, agricultural and medical colleges and disciplines on one contiguous campus.
- The Kentucky cheerleaders have won an unprecedented 24 national cheerleading championships at the annual Universal Cheerleaders Association championships.

KROGER FIELD

On game day, Kroger Field often becomes the third-largest city in Kentucky.



- Since its opening in 1973, Kentucky has played 333 games within the friendly confines of newly-named Kroger Field. **UK has a 184-148-4 record (.553), 48-32 (.600) under Mark Stoops.**
- 2024 marks the 52nd season at the facility.
- UK set a new Kroger Field attendance record when 63,543 fans packed the stadium for the Nov. 3, 2018 game vs. No. 6 Georgia.
- Two of the top five crowds in Kroger Field history came in 2018.
- UK announced its first sellout since 2015 when 62,945 fans attended the Florida game on Sept. 23, 2017.
- Since the 1999 expansion, UK has averaged 60,261 fans per game and ranked in the nation's top 30 teams in attendance in 17 of the last 19 seasons. Both the single game and season attendance record has been broken in recent years. *Note: Kroger Field capacity was limited to 12,000 fans per game in 2020 due to COVID-19 restrictions
- The stadium footprint is named C.M. Newton Grounds at Kroger Field in honor of the former UK Director of Athletics.

KROGER FIELD

Commonwealth Stadium was renamed to Kroger Field in May of 2017. The agreement--which is between Kroger and JMI Sports, UK's multimedia rights partner-- begins at approximately \$1.85 million annually with a term of up to 12 years. With the partnership, Kroger becomes the Official Fuel Partner of the University of Kentucky and the Official Grocery Partner of Move-In at UK while also providing additional engagement opportunities with UK students. Per the agreement, Kroger is also the Official Nutrition and Pharmacy Partner of UK Athletics.

Kroger Field was transformed into a state-of-the-art facility after a \$126-million reinvention which was completed prior to the 2015 season. The project was handled by HNTB. The outside of the stadium underwent a dramatic external facelift, receiving a modern look, but one that remained uniquely Kentucky. Inside, the capacity of Kroger Field was reduced over the course of the two-year project to approximately 61,000, but the value of all remaining seats were increased, from the top of the upper deck to front-row seats at midfield. Concourses were revamped and widened throughout the stadium with improved concessions, restrooms and security. Players and coaches reaped the benefits of the new Kroger Field as well, as home-team facilities were built, and a multi-purpose recruiting room hosts future Wildcats on their on-campus visits.

NEW LIGHTING, RIBBON BOARDS

In 2024, Kroger Field featured brand new lighting and ribbon boards. The LED lighting system will include the ability to do light shows during timeouts and breaks in play similar to those at games in Rupp Arena and Kentucky Proud Park. The new ribbon boards have greater functionality, featuring sharper visual resolution than the previous set and expanded capability for display of video and graphics.

FACTS AND FIGURES

Seating Capacity: 61,000, including the Commonwealth Suites

Playing Field: UK switched from natural grass to synthetic turf for the 2015 season. Other SEC schools with a turf surface are: Arkansas, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Missouri. The end zones and team sideline areas feature a checkerboard pattern in alternating shades of blue. It was designed to mimic the pattern of Secretariat's silks, which has been part of the football uniforms for five seasons. The school's

new interlocking "UK" logo is positioned in the center of the field.

Video Boards: Video boards by Daktronics measuring at 39 by 79 feet, each, bring a total of 6,162 square feet of video capability. The video boards put UK among the nation's leaders in video square footage.

Sound System: Sportsound system delivers pounding bass energy, smooth mid- and high-range frequencies, and high-impact entertainment. Components of the sound system include a main speaker cluster behind the end zone, under-balcony speakers and concourse speakers.

GAME DAY EXPERIENCES

The "Cat Walk" on Talbott Todd Way: With the unveiling of the new \$45 million Kentucky Football Training Facility in August of 2016, the headquarters of the program moved next door to Kroger Field. Therefore, the Cat Walk was moved to Talbott Todd Way. The Cat Walk typically begins outside Gate 1 two hours and 15 minutes prior to kickoff, and the team proceeds past Gate 1 and between Kroger Field and Nutter Field House. It was dedicated to former Wildcat Talbott Todd (1963-65) who passed away from ALS in August of 2017 and was an avid supporter of the program. From Talbott Todd Way the team walks to the locker room in the Joe Craft Kentucky Football Training Facility.

Lift Them Up: A unique partnership with Toyota Motor Manufacturing Kentucky (TMMK), the Kentucky College of Engineering and the Kentucky Children's Hospital was launched in 2019 that brings special guests to the Cat Walk as the Kentucky football team arrives at Kroger Field. A specially built push cart vehicle provides a Kentucky Children's Hospital patient the chance to both accompany the Wildcats on the Cat Walk and attend a game at Kroger Field. A new patient is chosen by the Kentucky Children's Hospital each week to participate.

HEAD COACH MARK STOOPS / 13TH SEASON / IOWA, 1989



The longest-termed coach in Kentucky history and having the longest term of any current coach in the Southeastern Conference, Mark Stoops looks to add to his legacy of success entering his 13th season with the Wildcats in 2025.

Stoops holds school records for wins (68), home wins (48), SEC wins (31) and wins over ranked opponents (12). Last season's victory at No. 6 Ole Miss was fifth straight season that his Wildcats had knocked off a ranked opponent, yet another school record.

In addition to the records listed above, a partial accounting of Stoops' exploits features:

- **Seven bowl appearances**
- **A school-record, 16-game win streak against nonconference competition (2018-22), which was the nation's longest active streak at the time.**
- **First top-10 ranking in each the Associated Press poll and the coaches' poll since 2007 (Sept. 11, 2022)**
- **First consecutive top-10 rankings in each poll since 1977 (Sept. 18, 2022)**
- **First home win over Florida since 1986, also marking the first win over an Associated Press top 10-ranked opponent since 2010 (2021)**

- **First win at Tennessee since 1984 (2020)**
- **First New Year's Day Bowl win since 1951 (2018 season)**
- **First 10-win season since 1977 (2018)**
- **First SEC Coach of the Year since 1983 (2018)**
- **First final poll ranking since 1984 (2018)**
- **First bowl win since 2008 (2018 season)**
- **First win vs. Florida since 1986 (2018)**
- **First bowl appearance since 2010 (2016)**

Individually, Stoops' players have won All-America accolades, along with honors such as the Bronko Nagurski Award, Chuck Bednarik Award, Paul Hornung Award, Ronnie Lott Trophy, Ray Guy Award, Danny Wuerffel Trophy, Jason Witten Man of the Year, Pop Warner Award, Freddie Solomon Spirit Award, Academic All-America and National Good Works Team.

Kentucky's football team has fared well academically under Stoops, as each year UK's football score in the NCAA Academic Progress Rate has been well above the benchmark of 930.

Off the field, Stoops is a staunch supporter of the Kentucky Children's Hospital, helping raise more than \$500,000 annually for the kids. He was named the Honorary Coach of the 2022 AFCA Good Works Team.

The bountiful crop of victories and honors are the fruit of the last nine seasons, but the harvest didn't come easily. Arriving in 2013, inheriting a team that had gone 2-10 the season before, it took three years of plowing, planting and growing before the results came.

Stoops earned his first bowl game as head coach in 2016, when the Wildcats overcame an 0-2 start to go 7-3 down the stretch and advance to the TaxSlayer Gator Bowl. UK duplicated seven wins in 2017, playing in the Franklin-American Mortgage Music City Bowl.

Led by linebacker Josh Allen, the National Defensive Player of the Year, and Benny Snell Jr., the school's all-time leading rusher, the 2018 squad went 10-3. It was UK's best season in 41 years, topped by a win over Penn State in the VRBO Citrus Bowl. It was only the third 10-win season in school history.

In addition, the 2018 campaign featured a win at Florida -- the Wildcats' first victory over the Gators in 32 years -- resulting in UK being named the National Team of the Week by the Football Writers Association of America. The regular season concluded with a 56-10 win at in-state rival Louisville, the largest margin of victory in the history of the Governor's Cup series.

UK was No. 11 in the final USA Today coaches' poll and No. 12 in the final Associated Press tabulation, the school's first appearance in the final rankings since 1984. The 2018 season also continued a remarkable trend -- since Stoops took over as coach of the Cats in 2013, UK was the only school in the nation that tied or improved its win total in six straight seasons.

CollegeFootballNews.com listed Stoops as the best coaching performance of the season and he was named Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year by The Associated Press, Athlon Sports and the league coaches.

The 2019 season was one of the most unusual in school history. A succession of injuries decimated the quarterbacks and Stoops turned to wide receiver Lynn Bowden Jr. to man the QB position. Running the ball almost exclusively, UK went 6-2 down the stretch and closed the season with four straight wins, topped by a dramatic come-from-behind Belk Bowl win over Virginia Tech when Bowden threw the game-winning touchdown pass with only 15 seconds remaining.

Stoops followed with the Covid-shortened 2020 season that was capped by a Gator Bowl win over No. 23 North Carolina State.

More winning seasons and bowl appearances have followed, giving Stoops the school records in both categories, and prompting ESPN analyst Tom Luginbill to call Stoops "the best program



builder in all of college football.”

How has Stoops accomplished all of this? The coach would tell you that there’s been nothing magical about the process.

True to his blue-collar roots in Youngstown, Ohio, the methodical advancement made by Stoops’ teams is a reflection of the coach’s rock-steady work ethic, tireless recruiting, and ability to adapt.

Stoops came to Kentucky from Florida State, where he was defensive coordinator from 2010-12. He inherited a unit a unit ranked 108th in the nation in total defense and turned it into one of the nation’s best. In the 2012 season, the Seminoles were second in the nation in total defense, allowing 254.1 yards per game, and sixth nationally in scoring defense at 14.7 points per game. Playing well against the run and the pass, FSU was third in the country in rushing defense and led the nation in pass defense. FSU led the ACC in seven defensive categories. Stoops also coached the defensive backs under head coach Jimbo Fisher.

Eight Seminoles on defense earned 2012 All-ACC honors, including four first-team selections, highlighted by one of the nation’s top defensive end duos in Bjoern Werner and Cornellius Carradine, who combined for 24 sacks and 31 tackles for loss. Werner was a finalist for the 2012 Bronko Nagurski Award as the National Defensive Player of the Year and was among the national leaders in sacks with 13.

Stoops also coached cornerback Ronald Darby to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year. The Seminoles’ prowess was a continuation of the 2011 season, when Stoops’ defenders led the nation in fewest yards allowed per carry (2.3),

ranked fourth in the nation in total defense (275 yards per game), second in rushing defense (82.7 ypg), fourth in scoring defense (15.1 points per game), and eighth in tackles for loss (8.6 per game) and quarterback sacks (3.1 per game). FSU led the ACC in eight defensive categories.

Stoops overhauled the Florida State defense in 2010, his first season as defensive coordinator. The Seminoles gave up 19.6 points per game, third-best in the ACC and 20th nationally. FSU ranked 42nd nationally in total defense that season; in contrast, the team was 108th nationally in total defense and 94th in scoring defense in 2009, the year before Stoops’ arrival. FSU improved its overall defense by more than 80 yards per game, primarily by limiting opponents to 75 fewer rushing yards per game. The Seminoles ranked third in the nation in quarterback sacks and were 21st in tackles for loss. In the secondary, Stoops coached Xavier Rhodes to ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year honors and National Defensive Freshman of the Year accolades.

During Stoops’ three seasons, FSU went 10-4, 9-4 and 12-2, including wins over South Carolina in the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl, Notre Dame in the 2011 Champs Sports Bowl and Northern Illinois in the 2013 Orange Bowl.

Stoops was defensive coordinator and DBs coach at Arizona from 2004-09, working for his brother, Mike, who was head coach of the Wildcats. During Mark’s time there, Arizona’s records improved steadily, going 3-8, 3-8, 6-6, 5-7, 8-5 and 8-5. The Wildcats advanced to the Las Vegas Bowl and Holiday Bowl during the last two years.

Stoops inherited an Arizona unit that was

109th in the nation in total defense and 107th in scoring defense in 2003, the year before he arrived. By the end of his term at Arizona, the Wildcats ranked in the nation’s top 25 in total defense his final two seasons and ranked as high as 33rd in scoring defense.

Mark and Mike are also brothers of Bob Stoops, who spent 18 years as the Oklahoma head coach and has been elected to the College Football Hall of Fame. The eldest Stoops brother, Ron Jr., is retired after coaching at Youngstown State. Mark and Mike have reunited in Lexington, as Mike joined the UK staff in 2022 as inside linebackers coach.

Prior to Arizona, Mark Stoops coached the defensive backs three years at Miami (Fla.). The 2001 national champion Hurricanes led the nation in pass efficiency defense, scoring defense and turnover margin. That team also established a school record with 27 interceptions and 45 total takeaways.

Stoops’ 2002 secondary led the nation in pass defense and pass efficiency defense. Despite having to replace all four starters in the defensive backfield, the 2003 team led the nation in pass defense. In his three seasons, Miami went 35-3, including the 12-0 Rose Bowl title campaign, plus appearances in the Fiesta and Orange bowls. Ten Miami defensive backs who played at least one season under Stoops were eventually selected in the National Football League draft – seven in the first round.

Stoops got his first experience in leading a defense as co-defensive coordinator at Houston in the 2000 season. He coached the secondary at Wyoming from 1997-99 and the Cowboys notched three straight winning seasons. A highlight of his time there was

Now in his 13th season at the helm of the Kentucky football program, head coach Mark Stoops and his staff have been making noise on the recruiting trail. a school-record 24 interceptions in the '97 season. His first full-time coaching job was in 1996 at South Florida, helping USF in the start-up of its program before the Bulls had their first kickoff in '97.

Stoops has recruited and developed numerous outstanding defensive backs, many of whom went on to National Football League careers. Among the notables are Antoine Carson and Michael Johnson at Arizona, Miami's Philip Buchanon, Kelly Jennings, Brandon Meriweather, Ed Reed, Antrel Rolle, Mike Rumph and Sean Taylor and Wyoming's Brian Lee.

Stoops was raised in Youngstown, Ohio. As did brothers Bob and Mike, Mark played in the secondary at the University of Iowa for Hall of Fame coach Hayden Fry. He participated in four bowl games as a player. Fry hired Stoops as a graduate assistant coach at Iowa in the 1990 and '91 seasons. The Hawkeyes won the 1990 Big Ten title and played in the Rose Bowl, duplicating feats Stoops also achieved as a player. Stoops went on to coach four years in high school before entering the collegiate ranks.

Stoops has two sons, Will and Zack.

Dante Dowdell rushed for 129 yards and a touchdown as Kentucky topped Toledo 24-16 at Kroger Field in the season opener.

Kentucky got 78 rushing yards from Seth McGowan. The Cats rushed for 252 total yards in the game.

Quarterback Zach Calzada and the UK passing game had their moments in the game. Calzada connected on 10 of 23 through the air for 85 yards. Josh Kattus caught a career-high three passes for 43 yards for the Cats.

The UK defense held Toledo in check for most of the after-

noon. The Cats held the Rockets to just 59 yards on the ground. Senior linebacker Alex Afari led the defense with a career-high 13 tackles, including a sack and two tackles for loss. Davern Rayner and Ty Bryant each had six tackles for UK, while sophomore linebacker Steven Soles had two sacks for the Cats.

Kentucky received the opening kickoff and the Cats were able to make a first down when Calzada connected with Ja'Mori Maclin for an 11-yard gain. UK appeared to have another first down but Calzada's pass to JJ Hester was ruled incomplete after video review and the Cats were forced to punt.

Toledo took over at its own 10 yard line and on the second play of the possession, JQ Hardaway intercepted a Tucker Gleason pass and the Cats took over at the Toledo 29.

UK would turn to the ground game on the ensuing drive, which ended with a one-yard touchdown rush by Calzada. Jacob Kauwe added the point after and Kentucky led 7-0 with 6:27 remaining in the first quarter.

The UK defense held Toledo in check again on the next drive and the Rockets were forced to punt. Kentucky took over at its own 43 yard line with 4:02 left in the first period.

Kentucky would give the ball back on the third play of the next possession when Calzada was intercepted by Toledo's Nasir Bowles at the Toledo 46 yard line. The Rockets would drive deep into UK territory as the first quarter ended with the Cats leading 7-0.

The Rockets would get inside the UK five yard line, but on fourth and two, Afari stopped Gleason short of a first down and the Cats took over at their own three with 13:13 left in the half.

On the first play of the ensuing drive, Calzada was sacked in the end zone for a safety, making the score 7-2.

After the UK free kick, Toledo took over at its own 23 yard line. However, the Rockets were unable to do anything with the possession and were forced to punt. Kentucky took over at its own 47 with 11:25 left in the half.

On the second play of the next drive, Calzada hit tight end Willie Rodriguez for a big gain, but Rodriguez fumbled and Toledo recovered at its own 27. The Rockets would make one first down but the UK defense stopped Toledo on fourth and one near midfield and the Cats took over with 7:28 left in the half.

Kentucky got into Toledo territory but the drive stalled and the Cats settled for a 45-yard field goal from Kauwe, taking a 10-2 lead with 2:04 left in the half.

The Rockets made one first down before punting the ball back to the Cats with 1:07 left in the half. UK punted it back to Toledo and after one play, the half expired with Kentucky leading 10-2.

Toledo got the ball at the beginning of the third quarter, but the UK defense forced a three-and-out and the Rockets punted. Kentucky took over at its own 12 yard line.

Kentucky moved the ball into Toledo territory when Calzada connected with Kattus for 18 yards. However, the drive stalled and the Cats were forced to punt. Toledo took over at its own seven with 10:03 left in the third quarter.

After getting one first down, Toledo punted again and UK took over at its own 38 yard line with 8:21 left in the third quarter. The teams would then exchange punts before Kentucky was able to move the ball near the end of the quarter. Calzada and Kattus connected again, this time for 12 yards, followed by a 16-yard rush from Dante Dowdell got the Cats to the Toledo 35. UK was threatening as the quarter ended with the Cats leading 10-2.

On the sixth play of the fourth quarter, UK's Seth McGowan rushed for a six-yard touchdown to cap a 12-play, 76-yard drive. Kauwe added the extra point and UK led 17-2 with 12:30 left in the game.

Toledo answered with its first scoring drive of the game. The Rockets went 69 yards in seven plays, capped by a nine-yard touchdown run from Gleason. Dylan Cunanan added the point after and UK's lead was cut to 17-9 with 9:38 to play.

On the first play of the next drive, Dowdell broke loose on the right and scampered 79 yards for a touchdown. Kauwe added the PAT and Kentucky led 24-9 with 9:22 remaining.

Toledo was able to add a late touchdown, but Kentucky recovered an onside kick and ran out the clock to preserve the victory.
