## **BEAVER NOTES**

#### THIS WEEKEND

- The Beavers will stay in Washington this weekend and face the Washington Huskies on Sunday afternoon starting at 3 p.m.
- The match will be broadcast on Pac-12 Networks with Ann Schatz and Krista Blunk serving as talent.

#### A WIN ON SUNDAY WOULD

- Be the 245th in program history.
- Be the Beavers seventh of the season and second away from Paul Lorenz Field
- Be the Beavers second in Pac-12 Conference play.
- Be the first since defeating Michigan State on Sept. 9.
  Be the Beavers first Pac-12 road victory of the season.
- Be OSU's first Pac-12 road win since defeating Washington State on Oct. 18, 2013.
- Be the ninth against Washington, (28th meeting).
  Be OSU's fourth at Washington, (12th time).
- Be HC Linus Rhode's fourth over the Huskies, (9th time).

### SCOUTING THE HUSKIES

- UW enters Sunday's match with a 7-10-1 overall mark and 2-7 in Pac-12 action
- The Huskies' first Pac-12 win was 2-1 victory to Arizona, which snapped a six-match slide and a four-match skid in its Pac-12 schedule.
- Washington picked up its second conference victory with a 2-1
- win over Oregon last Thursday in Seattle.
   The Huskies started the season 5-3-1 in their non-conference schedule, including four shutouts.
- Seven of Washington's nine conference matches have been decided by one goal.
- Since starting loop play, UW has struggled, scoring only 10 goals and have been shutout three times.

  • UW is 0-5 against ranked teams this season

- The Huskies carry a 2-8 record in their last 10 matches.

  Why opponents hold a slight goal advantage, outscoring the Huskies 26-22 and holding them to 1.22 goals per match.

  Redshirt junior Sarah Shimer has logged the majority of the
- time between the pipes, totaling 31 saves and three shutouts—ranked tied for eighth in the Pac-12 Conference
- Junior **Shannon Simon** paces UW with seven goals and 50 shots—ranked 10th in the Pac-12.
- · HC for Washington is Lesle Gallimore in her 23rd seasonlongest in the Pac-12—and holds a 245-198-44 overall record.

## **WASHINGTON SERIES HISTORY**

- Sunday's match will mark the 28th meeting between Oregon State and Washington.
- UW holds an advantage in the series, with a 16-8-3 overall record in a run that started back in 1988.
- The Beavers held a 3-2 series lead to start, but a nine-match winning streak, running from 1994-2002 by the Huskies have given them a series advantage.
- Since the skid, the series is knotted at 5-5-3, which includes
- the Beavers longest winning streak in the series from 2009-11.

   Oregon State is 3-6-2 while playing at Washington with its last victory coming in 2010 when the Beavers were ranked No. 19.
- OSU has dropped the last two matches and finished with a tie in the two previous to those, with its last series win coming five matches ago in 2011 when it was ranked No. 23.
- In the last five matches, three have gone into double overtime and two ended in a draw.
- The Beavers have been shutout nine times and have dealt out six in the series
- The last time OSU has been shutout against the Huskies was a 3-0 loss in 2014. Last time the Beavers have given a shutout was a 1-0 win in the 2010 season. Both matches were at UW.
- Washington saturates the series in goals, with the Huskies holding a 52-27 advantage over the Beavers.

  • One goal has decided 10 of the matches, with three ties and
- six overtimes, (last OT was a season ago with UW winning 2-1 in 20T in Seattle).

## **FOLLOW THE RHODE**

- Head coach Linus Rhode is in his ninth season.
  Has guided the Beavers to three NCAA Tournament appearances, including a Sweet-16 run in 2009.
- Is 3-3-2 all-time against Washington.
  Holds a 78-83-20 overall record and 29-56-6 in Pac-12 matches

• The Beavers close its season next Friday, Oct. 4, with the Civil War game at Oregon starting at 3 p.m., on Pac-12 Networks.

#### LAST WEEK

Oregon State traveled to Washington State for a Pac-12 match this past Thursday and suffered a 2-1 defeat to the Cougars. The Beavers scored early off a header by junior Nikki Faris to lead at half, but could not hold on to the lead down the stretch.

- The squad also welcomed six newcomers to start their careers at
- The Beavers have 26 student-athletes on the roster, including 10-of-13 players that appeared in all-19 or 18 matches last year.
- Of the 26 SA's on this year's roster, three started every match last year.

#### WORKING UP THE RECORD BOOK

- •Junior goalkeeper, Bella Geist is working her way up the all-time saves list at Oregon State.
- The Milwaukee, Ore., native has tallied 283 saves in her career and ranks third in school history.
- Geist recorded four saves against USC on Oct. 2 to pass Colleen Boyd
- Mellissa Onstad (2003-06) is second with 337 saves.

#### CLASSROOM PERFORMANCE

- Oregon State women's and men's soccer teams were honored as 2015-16 Team Academic Award winners by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA).
- The women's team checked in with a GPA of 3.38 during the 2015-16 academic year, while the men's team recorded a 3.14 GPA.

#### OVERTIME

- Oregon State holds a 2-1-2 record this season in overtime matches. • OSU carries a combined 5-2-5 record in the last two seasons in matches that on the distance.
- HC Linus Rhode holds a 10-10-19 record in extra-time matches.

- The Beavers hold an all time 13-14-2 record in opening day matches.
- OSU recorded a 1-1 tie this season against CSUN.
- HC Linus Rhode is 4-4-1 all-time in season oneners.


