



OREGON STATE FOOTBALL GAME NOTES

October 14, 2023 vs. UCLA | Corvallis, Ore. | Reser Stadium

Final Score: No. 15 Oregon State 36, No. 18 UCLA 24

Game Notes

- The game was broadcast on FOX with Tim Brando (play-by-play) and Spencer Tillman (analyst) on the call.
- Weather was 62 degrees and cloudy. Wind was 3 mph from the South.
- Oregon State wore its Black uniforms with black helmets that were adorned with the team's Retro Benny logo.
- Oregon State won the coin toss and elected to defer to the second half. The Beavers have won the coin toss in all seven games this season.
- Attendance was 37,600, the largest crowd at Reser Stadium this season.

Oregon State Notes

- Oregon State improved to 6-1 for the first time since 2013.
- Oregon State won its eighth consecutive game at home. The Beavers are 15-1 in their last 16 games at Reser Stadium dating back to 2021.
- It's the longest home win streak for the Beavers since 2007-2008.
- The win made Oregon State bowl eligible. It's the earliest in program history that the Beavers have been bowl eligible.
- The Beavers became the third team from the Pac-12 to become bowl eligible this season.
- Oregon State intercepted three passes for the first time since Sept. 17, 2022 against Montana State. It's the first for the Beavers in a conference game since Sept. 25, 2021 at USC.
- Ryan Cooper Jr. became the first Beaver with a pick six since Easton Mascarenas-Arnold at Washington on Nov. 4, 2022.
- Cooper's return was for 67 yards, the Beavers' first of 65 or more yards since Treston Decoud had a 75-yarder versus Idaho State in 2016. It's the first of 65 or more yards in conference play since Jordan Poyer in 2010 versus USC.
- Akili Arnold intercepted his second pass of the season and third of his career in the first quarter.
- Andrew Chatfield Jr. intercepted his first career pass.
- Jack Velling has five receiving scores in his last two games.
- Velling has seven touchdowns on the season, equaling Tim Euhus (2003) and Joe Newton (2004 and 2006) for the most by a Beaver tight end since 2003.
- Atticus Sappington posted his fourth career multi-field goal effort, and third of the season.
- Silas Bolden caught his fourth touchdown of the season in the third quarter.
- Joshua Gray made his 40th consecutive start. He is the eighth player in school history to reach 40 consecutive starts. He is also the 24th to start 40 or more overall.
- Grant Starck made his first start as a Beaver and 13th all-time at the collegiate level.
- Oregon State scored first for the sixth time this season, and is 6-0 when that happens.
