Game Notes

▲ Oregon State opens the 2023 season when it visits San José State Sunday at CEFCU Stadium in California. Kickoff is slated for 12:30 p.m. PT.

▲ The game will air live on CBS. Chris Lewis (play-by-play), Ross Tucker (analyst) and Justin Walters (sideline) will call the action.

▲ The game will air live on the Beaver Sports Radio Network. For a list of affiliates, turn to page two of these notes.

▲ Every game this season can be heard live on the Varsity Network, a free application available via computer browsers, smartphones and tablets. After downloading the application, search for Oregon State.

▲ Oregon State opens on the road for the third time in six seasons under head coach Jonathan Smith. The Beavers snapped a six-game losing streak in season openers with a 34-17 win over Boise State last season.

▲ OSU comes into the game on a four-game win streak, tied for the 10th longest nationally.

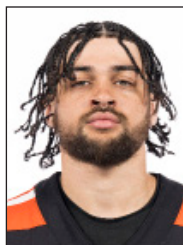

Against San José State

▲ Oregon State and San José State are meeting for the seventh time and third in San José.

▲ OSU is 4-2 all-time in the series, carrying a four-game win streak into Sunday's matchup. Three of those four wins came in Corvallis, including the last meeting, a 35-21 victory in 2015.

▲ The Spartans won the first game between the two, 24-14, in 1979 but later forfeited the matchup.

▲ The last meeting in San José came in 1988, a 41-27 Beaver win.

▲ San José State head coach Brent Brennan is in his seventh season leading the Spartans. He was an assistant coach at Oregon State from 2011-16, coaching the team's wide receivers.

▲ SJSU's offensive coordinator, Kevin McGiven, was an assistant and OC at OSU in 2016 and 2017. Defensive coordinator Derrick Odum coached defensive backs at OSU in 2015 and 2016.

▲ Defensive line coach Joe Seumalo held the same position at Oregon State from 2006-14.

▲ SJSU offensive line coach Josh Oglesby was a quality control assistant at Oregon State from 2015-17. Lyle Moevao, an analyst at SJSU, lettered for the Beavers at quarterback from 2006 through 2009.

Win Streak

▲ Oregon State carries a four-game win streak into Sunday's season opener. That streak is tied for the 10th-longest in the nation, one win behind Air Force, Marshall, Penn State and Pittsburgh, which are all tied for sixth.

▲ The Beavers are looking to extend their streak to five games for the first time since the 2013 team won six straight after losing its season opener.

▲ Oregon State won seven of its last eight games to end the 2022 season, out-scoring opponents, 252-124. That's an average of 31.5 points for and 15.5 points allowed per game.

Ranked

▲ Oregon State is ranked 18th in both the Associated Press Top 25 and USA Today Coaches Polls. Both rankings came out in the preseason.

▲ It's the eighth time OSU has been ranked by either the coaches poll or the Associated Press to open a season, and the fourth time since 2001.

▲ Oregon State was in the AP Top 25 for six weeks during the 2022 season, which included a final ranking at No. 17 after the win over Florida. The Beavers also finished 17th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Reigning Pac-12 Co-COTY

▲ Oregon State head coach Jonathan Smith was named the Co-Coach of the Year in the Pac-12 last season, joining Washington's Kalen DeBoer. Smith was the first

OSU coach to be honored since Mike Riley in 2008.

▲ Smith was also named the Region 5 Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA). He was the first Beaver coach to earn that honor since Riley in 2012.

Martinez Back For Soph. Season

▲ Damien Martinez ran for 982 yards as a freshman for the Beavers in 2022. He was thusly named the Pac-12 Conference's Offensive Freshman of the Year.

▲ He was also selected as a Freshman All-American by multiple media organizations.

▲ Martinez was the first Beaver to be named the Pac-12's Offensive Freshman of the Year since Jermar Jefferson in 2018.

Uiagalelei Gets The Nod

▲ DJ Uiagalelei was named the team's starting quarterback toward the end of camp. The Inland Empire, Calif., native transferred to Oregon State from Clemson after the 2022 season.

▲ Uiagalelei played in 36 games for Clemson from 2020-22, making 28 starts. He was 22-6 during his tenure with the Tigers, passing for 5,681 yards and 36 touchdowns.

▲ His 22 victories rank seventh most for a career by a Clemson quarterback.

▲ He also departed Clemson ranked in the top 10 in career pass attempts (861, fifth), completions (515, sixth), passing touchdowns (36, seventh), rushing touchdowns by a quarterback (15, tied for seventh) and passing yards (5,681, eighth).

Under Jonathan Smith

▲ Oregon State is 20-6 when leading at halftime. The Beavers are also 19-3 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter.

▲ The Beavers are 17-12 when controlling time of possession.

▲ Oregon State is 17-13 at home.

▲ The Beavers have scored 30 or more points in 28 of his 57 games, going 21-7.

▲ Oregon State is 17-7 when outgaining its opponent.

▲ OSU is 21-11 when scoring first.

▲ The Beavers are 16-2 when holding an opponent to 21 points or less.

The Defense

▲ The Oregon State defense, in its first full season under coordinator Trent Bray, made its mark. The Beavers finished first in the Pac-12 in total defense (332.8 yards per game allowed), scoring defense (20 points allowed per game) and rushing defense (108.2 yards per game).

▲ The Beavers also finished third in passing defense, at 224.5 yards per game, just 15 more than No. 1 Stanford.

▲ OSU held opponents to less than 400 yards of total offense in all but two games. From 2015-2021, the defense had held opponents to 400 yards or less just 22 times in an 80-game stretch.

All-Americans Return

▲ Anthony Gould and Taliese Fuaga both return after being named All-Americans in 2022. Jack Colletto is the only All-American lost from the 2022 squad.

▲ Oregon State also returns Damien Martinez and Jack Velling, who were each selected as Freshman All-Americans.

Fewest Departures

▲ Per Max Olson of The Athletic, the Beavers had the fewest departures to the Transfer Portal from 2022 to 2023. Just seven scholarship Oregon State players entered the portal after the team's 10-3 season.

▲ The Beavers are one of two teams nationally in single digits, joining Ohio State (nine).

▲ UCLA, with 10, is the only other Pac-12 Conference Team to rank in the top 15 for the fewest entries.

On Fourth

▲ Oregon State has converted on 77 fourth-down conversions under head coach Jonathan Smith since 2018, the most in the Pac-12. UCLA has the second-most at 69.

▲ OSU is tied for 11th nationally.

▲ OSU has converted on 61.6 percent of its 125 attempts over that stretch, third-best in the Pac-12. OSU is ranked 11th nationally.

All-Conference

▲ Oregon State set a single-season record with 18 players recognized as all-conference by the Pac-12's coaches in 2022.

▲ Nine of those 18 return in 2023, includ-

ing first-team selections Anthony Gould and Damien Martinez.

▲ Second-team selections returning include Silas Bolden, Taliese Fuaga and Joshua Gray. Those who earned honorable mention and are return are Ryan Cooper Jr., Sione Lolohea, Kitan Oladapo and James Rawls.

▲ The Beavers also became the first team in the Pac-12 era to sweep selections for first and second team returners (Gould and Bolden).

Home Sweet Home

▲ Oregon State has been one of the best home teams in the country the past two seasons, amassing an 11-1 record at Reser Stadium. The lone loss was a 17-14 setback to USC last season.

▲ The Beavers are averaging 404 yards of offense and just under 34 points per game during that stretch.

▲ Conversely, OSU has allowed 322 yards and just over 17 points per game the last two seasons.

And On The Road

▲ Oregon State went 3-2 in true road games last season. The 2021 Beavers were 1-5 on the road, but over the two seasons, just 25 points separates the Beavers and their opponents.

▲ OSU is averaging 28 points per game on the road, compared to 30.3 for its opponents.

▲ The Beavers are averaging 415 yards of offense per game the last two seasons. Opponents are averaging 420.

Martinez Going For 100

▲ Damien Martinez reached 100 yards on the ground six times in 2022, which culminated with a 103-yard effort against Oregon the regular-season finale.

▲ Those 100-yard efforts came over six

consecutive games, making him the first Beaver to accomplish the feat since Steven Jackson in 2003. Both Martinez and Jackson came up one shy of the longest streak in school history, held by Ken Simonton from 1998-99.

▲ Martinez needs four more 100-yard efforts to become the eighth Beaver in school history with 10 or more. Simonton (1998-2001) holds the record with 26.

Gray, Hodgins At 33

▲ Offensive lineman Joshua Gray and defensive lineman Isaac Hodgins have each started 33 career games, tying them for the team lead.

▲ Gray's 33 games have all come consecutively, with defensive back Kitan Oladapo at 24 straight being No. 2.

▲ Twenty-three Beavers all-time have started 40 or more games in their careers, with offensive lineman Brandon Kipper (45 games) and defensive back Jaydon Grant (40 games) reaching the plateau last season.

▲ Gray is aiming to become just the eighth Beaver to start 40 or more straight. Kipper was the last to reach that mark with 45 straight to end the 2022 season.

That's Rare

▲ Damien Martinez and Deshaun Fenwick have combined for 11 career 100-yard efforts. Fenwick has five, including three since transferring to Oregon State.

▲ The Beavers have had two or more rushers with 100 yards in the same game 19 times, including twice under head coach Jonathan Smith. It happened most recently in 2021 when B.J. Baylor ran for 145 yards and Fenwick went for 127 yards and two touchdowns.

Completed Reser Stadium

▲ Oregon State is set to play its first game in the Completed Reser Stadium Sept. 9 when hosting UC Davis.

▲ The \$161 million project has made Reser into a national best-in-class facility.

▲ An anonymous donor made a historic \$50 million lead gift to transform Oregon State University's Reser Stadium into a national best-in-class football facility with year-round programs and facilities for all OSU students, faculty and staff.

▲ The project received approval by the OSU Board of Trustees Finance and Administration Committee on Jan. 28, 2021. The west side of the stadium was imploded nearly a year later in January 2022.

▲ The project involved the complete demolition and rebuilding of the west side of Reser Stadium and the construction of year-round university facilities, including a new state-of-the-art interactive welcome center for new students considering attending OSU; new health center facilities for Corvallis campus students; health care facilities for OSU faculty and staff; and additional meeting space for university students, fac-

▲ Reser Stadium will now feature a 360-degree stadium concourse and includes expanded concessions and restroom facilities, enhanced sightlines, accessibility improvements and other fan amenities comparable to the east side of Reser, which was renovated prior to the 2005 season.

On This Date

▲ Oregon State has played on Sept. 3 six times previously, going 2-4.

▲ The Beavers opened the 2022 season on the date, defeating Boise State, 34-17.

The HC

▲ Oregon State head coach Jonathan Smith is in his sixth year leading the program.

▲ Smith quarterbacked the Beavers to the 2001 Fiesta Bowl (2000 season), and was a two-time team captain for Oregon State. The Beavers went 28-18 from 1998-2001, and the QB helped OSU to the 1999 Oahu Bowl in addition to the 2001 Fiesta Bowl.

2023 Opponents

▲ Oregon State's opponents combined to go 80-70 (.533) during the 2022 season. That includes three 10-game winners: Washington (11), Oregon (10) and Utah (10).

▲ OSU's six home opponents - UC Davis, San Diego State, Utah, UCLA, Stanford and Washington - combined to go 46-30 (.605) a year ago.

▲ Six of the Beavers' 11 FBS opponents advanced to bowl games last season.

On The O-Line

▲ Oregon State returns four starters on the offensive line from last season, and the quartet has 85 career starts entering 2023.

▲ That's tied with Nebraska for the eighth-most nationally.

▲ OSU's returners have started 96 career games, which does not include Grant Starck. He started 12 career games at Nevada.

▲ OSU's offensive line returns 189 career games played, 18th most nationally. Again, that does not include Starck's 22 games played at Nevada.

TOP

▲ Oregon State finished the 2022 season

ranked 20th averaging 31:58 of offensive possession. That was second in the Pac-12, trailing only Utah, which averaged 33:40.

▲ The Beavers are 16-4 under Smith when controlling the ball for more than 32 minutes.

▲ Oregon State is 17-12 under Smith when controlling the time of possession. OSU, meanwhile is 9-19 when an opponent controls it.

3-And-Out

▲ Oregon State's defense forced 38 three-and-out drives by opponents in 2022. Conversely, the offense totaled 22 three-and-out drives.

▲ The 2021 Beavers, meanwhile, forced just 25 three-and-out drives in their 13 games.

Red Zone Return

▲ Oregon State was the best team in the nation last season in red zone defense, allowing opponents to score on just under 67 percent of their opportunities. Opponents scored on 28-of-42 opportunities.

▲ Twenty of those 28 scores went for touchdowns, a 47.6 percent success rate. The Beavers ranked 16th in that category.

On CBS

▲ Oregon State is playing its first game on CBS since Dec. 31, 2008 when the Beavers defeated Pittsburgh, 3-0, in the Sun Bowl.

▲ Prior to that game, OSU had appeared on CBS just once, defeating Missouri, 39-38, in the 2006 Sun Bowl. The Beavers won that game, 39-38.

▲ The Beavers are also 4-1 on the CBS Sports Network, last defeating Fresno State on the network, 35-32, in 2022.

Points Allowed

▲ Oregon State, over 26 games, has allowed an average of 22.9 points per game over the last two seasons, which ranks 29th nationally.

▲ That trails only Utah among Pac-12 teams. The Utes have allowed 22 points per game, and rank 25th.

Ground Notables

▲ OSU has scored 128 times on the ground

during Jonathan Smith's tenure, with only Utah (141) and Oregon (137) totaling more among conference teams.

▲ The Beavers have averaged 4.8 yards per carry, which is tied for 28th nationally and third in the Pac-12. OSU trails Utah (5.1 ypc) and Oregon (5.0).

▲ Since 2021, the Beavers have scored 69 touchdowns on the ground, third in the Pac-12 and eighth nationally. Oregon State is 17th nationally averaging 5.1 yards per carry.

All-American On The Punt Return

▲ The Sporting News has Anthony Gould as a First-Team Preseason All-American on the punt return, and for good reason.

▲ Gould, now a redshirt junior, led the nation averaging 18.57 yards per punt return last season. That was nearly three more yards per return than No. 2 Kool-Aid McKinstry from Alabama.

▲ Gould was also just one of five players in the nation with multiple punt returns for touchdown.

▲ He was equally dangerous at home and on the road. He made eight returns for 126 yards and a score at Reser Stadium, and six returns for 134 yards and one touchdown away from home.

▲ Gould was the first Beaver with multiple punt return TDs in the same season since Sammie Stroughter tallied three in 2006.

Holding On To The Ball

▲ Oregon State has turned the ball over 68 times under head coach Jonathan Smith. That is tied with Washington for the fewest among Pac-12 teams since 2018.

▲ The Beavers and Huskies are tied for 10th nationally, just one more than No. 9 Navy.

▲ Oregon State has gone 16 games without committing a turnover under Smith, going 10-6.

▲ OSU has won seven consecutive games dating back to 2020 when not committing a turnover.

Grads

▲ A total of 19 Oregon State players have earned their degrees prior to the start of the 2023 season.

▲ They are: Heneli Bloomfield (sociology), Andrew Chatfield Jr. (sociology), Michael

▲ Oregon State head coach Jonathan Smith announced the team's 2023 captains at the end of the Beavers' preseason camp.

▲ Five Beavers will serve as team captains this year. They are: offensive linemen Taliese Fuaga, Joshua Gray and Jake Levengood, defensive lineman Isaac Hodgins and defensive back Kitan Oladapo.

▲ Hodgins and Levengood are both captains for the second time. Hodgins was a captain in 2020, with Levengood serving as one in 2022 as well.

▲ The home of the Beavers has had over \$360 million in fiscal improvements completed since the 2005 season.

▲ The stadium was re-named on that date after a personal seven-figure gift by Al and Pat Reser of Beaverton, Ore.

▲ The Valley Football Center, which houses the coaching staff's offices and the team's locker room, underwent an enhancement that was completed in the summer of 2020. It included new graphics to celebrate the accomplishments of Beaver football alumni and a stronger presence highlighting bowl victories.

▲ A new videoboard, measuring 145 feet high by 50 feet wide, was installed before the start of the 2022 season. It measures approximately 6,750 square feet and has more than 6.3 million pixels.

Beavers In The NFL

▲ As of Aug. 26, 19 Beavers are in the NFL.

▲ An Oregon State player has been an on NFL Super Bowl roster for 10 consecutive seasons. Most recently, Isaac Seumalo and Noah Togiai were on the roster of the Philadelphia Eagles, who competed against Kansas City in Super Bowl LVII.

- Jonathan Smith is in his sixth season as Oregon State's head coach, having been officially introduced on November 29, 2017.
- Smith led OSU to a 10-3 mark in 2022, the program's third 10-win season. OSU also finished with a 6-3 record in Pac-12 play in '22, the team's most wins since 2012 also tallied six. The Beavers had back-to-back winning seasons in conference play for the first time since 2008 and 2009.
- Smith was named the Co-Head Coach of the Year in the Pac-12 in 2022. He was also named the AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year.
- Oregon State saw a school-record 18 all-conference selections in a vote by the Pac-12's coaches in 2022. The Beavers had five first-teamers, tying USC for the most. Oregon State's 18 all-conference selections also led the league.
- Anthony Gould, Jack Colletto and Taliese Fuaga were all named All-Americans in 2022. Damien Martinez, who was the Pac-12's Freshman Offensive Player of the Year, was named a Freshman All-American along with Jack Velling.
- Overall, eight Beavers have been named All-Americans during Smith's tenure, which also includes running backs Jermar Jefferson and B.J. Baylor, linebackers Avery and Hamilcar Rashed Jr. and offensive lineman Nathan Eldridge.
- OSU has tallied 59 All-Pac-12 selections the past five seasons.
- Prior to returning to Oregon State, Smith served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Washington Huskies, a program that he helped build into a conference and national championship contender. During his tenure he coached Husky record-setting quarterback and 2016 Pac-12 Player of the Year Jake Browning, and helped the Huskies to the 2016 College Football Playoff and the 2017 Fiesta Bowl.
- Has played and coached in 12 bowl games. Coached in the 2017 Fiesta Bowl after playing in the game as a collegiate quarterback in 2000, earning the victory over Notre Dame.
- Was a four-year letterwinner at Oregon State. He was the Fiesta Bowl Offensive Most Valuable Player, earned Pac-10 Conference Offensive Player of the Week multiple times and was a two-time member of the league's Honorable Mention team.
- Smith left the Oregon State program as the program's all-time leader in passing yardage at 9,680. He also passed for 55 touchdowns during his collegiate career. He still holds the OSU record for longest touchdown pass at 97 yards to Chad Johnson in 2000.
- He and his wife, Candice, have three children: Robert, Bella, and Charles.

- OSU defense allowed nearly 20 fewer yards through air in 2022 (224.5) than in 2021 (243.5)
- Appointed the team's cornerbacks coach on Jan. 24, 2022 in time for the team's spring practices
