Scott Rueck took over an Oregon State program needing open tryouts to fill out a roster in 2010-11 and turned it into a national power in just six seasons.

A five-time Pac-12 Coach of the Year over 14 seasons in the conference, Rueck is well-known nationally as a coach who gets the most out of his teams.

Nowhere is that more apparent than in 2024-25. After losing the bulk of an Elite 8 team due to conference uncertainty - which has since cleared up - Rueck led a group of overlooked players from a 1-5 start to a West Coast Conference Championship and the NCAA Tournament.

In 2024, he took a team picked 10th in the Pac-12 preseason poll coming off a 13-18 season to the Elite 8 and was named ESPN's National Coach of the Year Runner-Up.

Oregon State won three-straight Pac-12 titles from 2015-17, and has made five Sweet-16's, three Elite Eight's and a Final Four under Rueck. OSU was also poised to earn a top-4 seed prior to the cancellation of the 2019-20 Tournament due to COVID-19.

The Beavers recorded a pair of top-15 wins in 2022-23 while also coaching the school's first Freshman of the Year since 1993. Raegan Beers emerged as a force under Rueck's guidance, including 20-point double-doubles in wins over no. 10 UCLA and no. 15 Arizona. She earned four Pac-12 Freshman of the Week awards - most in school history - and Timea Gardiner earned a fifth to give the Beavs their most ever since the introduction of the honor.

Beers and Gardiner were members of Oregon State's best recruiting class - which included sharpshooters Lily Hansford and Adlee Blacklock as well as international signee Martha Pietsch - ranked third nationally according to ESPNW. Gardiner was the Beavs' best-ever recruit according to ESPN with a no. 6 national

ranking.

Rueck led Oregon State to a record of 17-14 in 2021-22, including a run to the quarterfinals of the WNIT. The campaign featured a pair of wins over ranked opponents, as well as an unprecedented stretch in which OSU played five-straight games against ranked opposition.

Oregon State finished 2020-21 with a 12-8 record, and has won winning nine of its final 12 games, with all three losses in that span coming against teams that made the Final Four. The Beavers had two All-Pac-12 selections in Aleah Goodman and Taylor Jones, and Goodman was selected in the third round of the WNBA Draft, Oregon State's sixth selection in the last six drafts.

The Beavers went 23-9 in 2019-20 and were a top-16 choice before the NCAA Tournament was cancelled. Mikayla Pivec and Destiny Slocum earned All-Pac-12 honors for the second-straight year. Rueck was named a Semi-Finalist for Naismith Coach of the Year.

Oregon State went 26-8 in the 2018-19 campaign. The Beavers took home a pair of All-Pac-12 honors, as Destiny Slocum and Mikayla Pivec both received the award. The duo also netted All-America Honorable Mention, while Pivec was tabbed as a Second Team Academic All-American.

The Beavers recorded another 20-win campaign in 2017-18, making the Elite Eight for the second time in program history and finishing the year with 26 victories. Marie Gulich earned All-Pac-12 honors for the second-straight year, and the Beavers had the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year for the fourth-straight season, as Gulich earned the honor.

Oregon State posted an outstanding campaign in 2016-17, as the team went 31-5 en route to a Sweet 16 showing. Under Rueck's tutelage, senior Sydney Wiese became the 14th player in Pac-12 history to earn All-Pac-12 honors all four years of her career, and the Beavers claimed Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year honors for the third-straight season, as Gabriella Hanson received the award. Rueck took home some hardware of his own as well, as he was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year.

The Beavers enjoyed the best season in program history in 2015-16, winning a school-record 32 games on their way to the team's first ever Final Four. The NCAA Tournament journey was highlighted by a victory over national power Baylor in the Elite Eight and a pair of wins at Gill Coliseum, as Oregon State hosted the first two rounds of the tourney for the second-straight season.

The Beavers also made their mark in conference play, winning their second-straight Pac-12 regular-season title, and notching the program's first Pac-12 Tournament championship. For his leadership, Rueck was named one of four finalists for Naismith National Coach of the

Year and was the runner-up for AP Coach of the Year.

Under Rueck's guidance, Jamie Weisner was named the 2016 Pac-12 Player of the Year, and was tabbed as a WBCA All-American. Ruth Hamblin notched her second-consecutive Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year honor, while Weisner, Hamblin and Wiese were all named to the Pac-12 First Team.

Rueck's outstanding sixth season came on the back of an impressive 2014-15 campaign, as the Beavers notched 27 wins, en route to a Pac-12 Regular Season Title. For his efforts, Rueck was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year by both the media and the coaches, and earned WBCA Region 8 Coach of the Year honors for the second consecutive season. The Beavers' success on the floor was reflected in the national polls, as OSU was ranked as high as No. 7 in both the AP and USA Today/WBCA Polls during the season, the best rankings in school history, before the team ended the year ranked No. 13.

Oregon State also set a new program-best with a 16-2 conference record, surpassing the mark set in 2013-14. The Beavers went 14-2 at home, extending their home winning streak, which began in 2013-14, to 23 straight games. The historic season led to an increase in attendance, as the Beavers averaged a Pac-12 leading 4,167 fans per game, and welcomed 7,652 fans to Gill Coliseum for the Civil War on Jan. 9, the third-largest crowd in school history.

Under Rueck's guidance, Ruth Hamblin earned AP Third Team All-America, Pac-12 Player of the Year (media) and Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year honors, and was joined on the All-Pac-12 team by teammates Jamie Weisner and Sydney Wiese. The Beavers also led the conference with four Pac-12 Player of the Week awards on the season.

The Beavers finished 2013-14 24-11 overall, and ended the year tied for second in the final Pac-12 standings. Oregon State also advanced to its first NCAA Tournament since 1996 and won its first game in the event since 1995. The Beavers ended the year ranked 25th in the USA TODAY Coaches' Poll, their first time in the national rankings since 1996.

For the second time in four seasons the Pac-12's media tabbed Rueck as Coach of the Year and he was picked as the league's best by ESPN. Rueck was also named Russell Athletic/WBCA Region 8 Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the inaugural Pat Summitt Trophy for the 2014 Russell Athletic/WBCA NCAA Division I National Coach of the Year.

Oregon State propelled itself into the national conversation following a late-season 11-game win streak, which matched the second longest in school history and was the best in 31 years. Each win during the run was by at least 10 points, three came by 20 and the average margin of victory was 16.1 points.

Oregon State's 2012-13 campaign was highlighted by another stalwart defensive group. The Beavers finished the season 16th in the nation in field goal percentage defense, holding opponents to a school-record low 34.6 percent. OSU also was 11th in the country in blocks per game (5.5) and was the only team in the nation that boasted seven different players with at least 10 rejections.

With another young squad in 2011-12 picked to finish last in the Pac-12, Rueck and the Beavers defied the odds, finishing fifth in the conference with a 9-9 mark, 20-13 overall, and made the third round of the WNIT. In ending the year seven spots above where they were picked at the beginning of the season, Oregon State made the largest jump between expected finish and actual result in conference history. Those achievements earned Rueck a pick as the Pac-12 Coach of the Year, as voted on by the conference media.

In his inaugural year as head coach of the Beavers, Rueck led an inexperienced squad, with only one player possessing NCAA Division I experience, to a 9-21 record.

Oregon State lost some close games to open Pac-10 play before earning its first conference win over Washington at Alaska Airlines Arena. Shortly after, the Beavers claimed their second Pac-10 victory at home in Gill Coliseum in what is believed to be the biggest come-from-behind victory in program history, overcoming a 20-point deficit to defeat Oregon, 61-59, in the Civil War.

That same year, Rueck was also inducted into the George Fox Sports Hall of Fame.

Rueck came to Oregon State after spending 14 highly successful seasons as the head women's basketball coach at George Fox, compiling a career 288-88 (.766) record. Under his watch, the Bruins recorded winning seasons each year and claimed the Division III National Championship in 2009 with an unblemished 32-0 record. Rueck led his squads to five Sweet 16 appearances, three Elite Eight contests, six NCAA Division III Tournament appearances and seven Northwest Conference Championships.

During his time at George Fox, Rueck coached four NAIA All-Americans, four NCAA All-Americans and 33 All-Northwest Conference honorees. Individually, he was named the NCAA Division III National Coach of the Year in 2009, was a three-time NCAA Division III West Region Coach of the Year (2008, 2009, 2010) and a seven-time Northwest Conference Coach of the Year (2000, 2001, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010).

Rueck got his start coaching while an undergrad at Oregon State. He served as assistant coach at Santiam Christian High School for the boy's basketball team from 1989-93. He then became a women's basketball assistant at George Fox under former head coach Sherri Murrell, helping the Bruins to a 37-23 overall record and two NAIA postseason appearances. Additionally, he coached the women's tennis team in 1995-96.

"The plan has always been to have Eric and Regina be a part of our program and Beaver Nation," Rueck said. "There was a detour beyond our control and to now have him return is a dream scenario. Since he arrived at OSU in July of 2010, Eric has been a vital component in the development of our program. He has been a pillar of strength and a stabilizing force both for our team and in the Corvallis community. He has a huge heart for people, recognizes the needs people have, and then does everything he can to help those around him develop and grow. I could not be more excited for him to jump back in and continue his legacy of impact. Eric is simply one of the great people in our game and it is such a blessing to have him and Regina back in Corvallis."

In 2024-25, the seasoned assistant returned to the bench as an interim assistant coach, working with the OSU posts and helping the Beavers win the 2025 WCC Tournament. Ely helped develop All-WCC First Team selection Kelsey Rees, who recorded career-highs in scoring and rebounding for her senior season. Rees was also named to the All-WCC Tournament team while fellow senior post Sela Heide ranked second in OSU history in field goal percentage under Ely and Deven Hunter's tutelage.

Ely joined the Beavers as an assistant coach alongside Rueck in 2010, and helped guide Oregon State to some of the most successful seasons in program history. A key part of the turnaround within OSU women's basketball, Ely helped the Beavers return to the NCAA Tournament in 2014 - their first appearance in the event since 1996. Oregon State won its first ever Pac-12 title the following season, and snagged a second conference crown in 2015-16, on its way to the Final Four.

During his tenure as an assistant, Ely worked extensively with the Beaver posts - helping develop players such as Patricia Bright, Ruth Hamblin, Deven Hunter, Breanna Brown, Sam Siegner, Kolbie Drum and Marie Gulich. Hamblin and Gulich would both garner All-America honors during their Oregon State careers, and were both selected in the WNBA Draft.

Prior to the 2016-17 season, Ely transitioned into a new position on the OSU staff, taking over as Assistant Athletic Director for Women's Basketball. In his new role, Ely shifted his focus to enhancing the Beavers' community service engagement. He spearheaded a relationship between the Oregon State team and Southside Youth Outreach in

Corvallis, encouraging student-athletes to volunteer with under-privileged kids in the area. Ely also organized numerous events at local nursing homes, schools and community events.

"This is definitely an exciting time for me," Ely said. "I've got so many great memories of Beaver Nation and of working with this team, and I can't say how special it is to be back. I love Oregon State and I love Corvallis. It's truly a family atmosphere here. That's the foundation of this program and it's the foundation of Beaver Athletics. I think this group has a chance to do big things, and I'm looking forward to getting a chance to work with all of them."

Ely left Oregon State in the spring of 2020 to become an assistant coach at Texas Tech. In its first season, the Red Raiders' new staff led the team to a 10-15 record. Texas Tech went 11-19 last season, earning three wins over ranked opponents including a landmark road victory over No. 9 Texas.

Returning to the Beavers as Director of Player Personnel/Assistant to the Head Coach, Ely will focus on the development of the student-athletes, as well as carrying out administrative duties and working to continue the Beavers' extensive community service efforts.

Deven Hunter joined the Oregon State women's basketball staff in the summer of 2021.

The Beaver alumnus works primarily with Oregon State's post players while taking on scouting reports throughout the season. She also helps run the Oregon State Women's Basketball Camps each year.

In her last three years on staff, Hunter developed three all-conference posts - Kelsey Rees, Raegan Beers and Timea Gardiner - en route to two NCAA Tournament appearances and an Elite Eight.

Hunter helped Rees transform from a little-used post elsewhere to a valuable contributor as a junior and an all-league choice with career-highs across the board in her final year. Rees and Hunter worked collaboratively to develop Rees into an inside-outside threat who could score all over the floor by the end of her time as a Beav.

In two seasons with Hunter, Raegan Beers was a two-time All-Pac-12 choice, Pac-12 Freshman of the Year and an All-American. She racked up 30 double-doubles in two seasons as a Beav. In 2023-24, Timea Gardiner returned from an injury-disrupted freshman year to earn All-Pac-12 and Pac-12 Sixth Player of the Year honors as a sophomore.

Hunter also helped Jelena Mitrovic earn Pac-12 All-Defense honorable mention honors after finishing third in the conference in blocks per game.

During her first season on the coaching staff, Hunter helped Oregon State to a record of 17-14, including a run to the quarterfinals of the WNIT. The campaign featured a pair of wins over ranked opponents, as well as an unprecedented stretch in which OSU played five-straight games against ranked opposition.

Hunter makes her return to Oregon State, where she played from 2012-2016. The Keizer, Ore. native spent the last two seasons at the University of San Diego, where she served as a graduate assistant. During her tenure, Hunter helped the Toros reach a mark of 32-18, including an appearance in the WCC Championship game in 2020.

San Diego players earned a total of seven All-WCC honors during Hunter's two seasons with the team. Before joining the Toros, Hunter was worked at McNary High school, where she coaches basketball and worked as a classroom assistant in special education for three years.

"I'm excited be back with the Oregon State program," Hunter said. "I know first-hand what it means to be part of the OSU Family, and I look forward to the opportunity to work with this outstanding group of coaches and student-athletes. The way Beaver Nation supports this team is second-to-none, and I can't wait to get back to Corvallis in this new role."

Hunter's playing career at Oregon State was highlighted by some of the most successful campaigns in program history. Over the course of her four seasons, Hunter was part of two Pac-12 Championship winning squads, made the NCAA Tournament three times and was a key piece of OSU's 2016 Final Four run. She played in all 135 of Oregon State's games over the course of her career, making 132 starts. At the time of her graduation, Hunter was fourth in Beaver history and 31st in Pac-12 history with 893 career rebounds. She memorably knocked down five 3-pointers to finish with 19 points and 12 rebounds, helping the Beavers overcome an 11-point deficit in the final seven minutes to take down Stanford at Gill Coliseum in 2016.

Sydney Wiese is back home.

The Oregon State Hall of Famer and Pac-12 career three-point record-holder joined Scott Rueck's staff as an assistant coach, the 15th-year head coach announced on Friday, July 12.

Wiese, inducted into the Hall of Fame last year with fourth-year assistant Deven Hunter and their 2016 Final Four teammates, joins the staff immediately and will be on the road recruiting this weekend.

"Syd is an Oregon State legend. Her success on the court, endearing qualities to the fan base and the person she was to our community cemented her as one of the best to ever play in our program and we are thrilled that she is choosing to come home. After graduating and being a first round pick in the WNBA Draft, she has been a high-level player in the best basketball leagues all over the world.

Sydney thrived at building relationships with teammates, coaches and fans while she was here and there is no doubt her transition to coaching will be seamless in all aspects. She is, once again, the perfect person at the perfect time. I am excited to welcome her back to Oregon State Women's Basketball," Oregon State head coach Scott Rueck said.

"I could not be more excited to come home as an assistant coach," Wiese said. "Even as I have been away- playing in different cities, living in different countries- I have never felt more at home than in Corvallis. Through prayer and conviction rooted in deep belief toward this university, it is a privilege to commit to Oregon State a second time- as an assistant coach for the women's basketball program. I love this university. I believe in this program. And there is no support better than Beaver Nation."

The Oregon State legend joins the team after a successful professional career that saw her play five WNBA seasons while logging time internationally in Spain, Italy and Turkey. Most recently, Wiese played for Emlak Konut Istanbul, averaging 12.1 points, 4.4 assists and 4.1 rebounds per game in Turkish league play while contributing 10.8 points and 3.8 assists per game in six EuroCup contests.

In the WNBA, Wiese was the 11th overall pick of the 2017 draft as the first round selection for the LA Sparks. She played for both the Sparks and Washington Mystics before sustaining an injury that sidelined her for the 2022-23 season.

Wiese started her coaching career as an assistant at Bella Vista College Prep while rehabbing the injury. She helped develop seven players who went on to play collegiately, including four at the Division I level.

While at Bella Vista, Wiese assisted with practice planning and player development with a focus on the team's guards. As a team, the Bears won the 2023 Grind Season – a tournament featuring prep schools from across the country.

As a player for the Beavers, Wiese helped OSU reach new heights with back-to-back-to-back Pac-12 Championships and a trip to the 2016 Final Four. The Beavs made the NCAA Tournament and won at least one postseason game in all four of her years in Orange and Black. As a freshman, Wiese's 26 points helped OSU to its first NCAA Tournament win in 29 years and her decisive free throw pushed OSU past Baylor to reach the Final Four.

Wiese was an All-American as a senior and left Corvallis as a four-year All-Pac-12 honoree. She is one of only 20 Pac-12 players to earn all-league honors four times and one of two Beavers alongside Tanja Kostic.

In OSU history, Wiese owns the school records for career assists and career and single-season three-pointers. She ranks fifth in career scoring, fourth in three-point percentage. Wiese is one of four players at Oregon State to record a triple-double.

GILL COLISEUM

Gill Coliseum is the competitive home of the Oregon State men's basketball, women's basketball, women's gymnastics, wrestling and volleyball teams. The arena's capacity is 9,301 for competitions on Ralph Miller Court, and the building also includes a weight room, equipment center, locker rooms and offices for the athletic department and its teams.

Named after the late Slat's Gill, who was Oregon State's head men's basketball coach for 36 years, the Coliseum is an excellent facility spanning more than an acre.

Enhancements are being made to Gill Coliseum heading into the 2018-19 sports seasons, headlined by the installation of a center-hung video board. The display features two 14.5-foot-high by 26-foot-wide displays facing the sidelines and two 9.5-foot-high by 16.5-foot-wide displays facing the ends of the arena. The project also includes all new LED lighting.

Gill Coliseum also has a state-of-the-art sports medicine center, located on the lower level, that provides leading-edge injury prevention and rehabilitation services. The center includes cardiovascular equipment and improved training facilities.

With the improvements, Gill Coliseum continues to be an integral part of the heritage of Oregon State athletics. Since its opening in 1949, Gill Coliseum has been part of more than 3,000 victories, more than 150 Oregon State All-Americans and more than 25 individual and team titles.



OREGON STATE BASKETBALL CENTER

Opened in the summer of 2013, the OSU Basketball Center is complete with two regulation basketball courts, which occupy the first and third floors of the building, along with locker rooms, satellite training and medical areas, and service and mechanical spaces.

The alternate floors -- second and fourth -- consist of 2,000-square-foot partial floors containing coach and program staff offices. These spaces run the length of the building and offer panoramic views of the court below. Together, the court and program space create a "home" where the sense of family that is the distinctive edge for every Oregon State team can be fostered.

A two-story glass atrium, strikingly illuminated at night, serves as the

main entrance and features a Basketball Hall of Fame highlighting the greatest achievements and players of Oregon State's past -- and future. A mural stretching to the height of the atrium celebrates the legacy -- and the terrific student-athletes and coaches -- of Oregon State Beavers basketball.



OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY

- Oregon State's programs in forestry, oceanography, marine biology, natural resources, agriculture, human development and family sciences, computer science and robotics are ranked among the best in the U.S. and the world.
- U.S. News & World Report has ranked Oregon State's Ecampus No. 4 in the nation and in the top 10 for online bachelor's degree programs the last seven years in a row.

RESEARCH

Oregon State University earned nearly \$450 million in external research funding in the 2020 fiscal year, a new record. Oregon State is one of only three land, sea, space and sun grant universities in the U.S. and is the only university in Oregon to have earned both Carnegie Classifications for Highest Research Activity and Community Engagement. Oregon State is recognized for both scholarly achievement and the direct impact of applied development, fulfilling the land-grant mission to serve the public good.

The OSU research agenda, integrated with our strategic plan, guides faculty inquiry in three signature areas:

- Advancing the science of sustainable Earth ecosystems.
- Improving human health and wellness.
- Promoting economic growth and social progress.

Oregon State researchers are top-ranked in their fields, hold leadership positions in international and national professional organizations and have earned prestigious honors.

Jayathi Y. Murthy, (Jay-uh-thee Moor-thee), a national leader in higher education engineering teaching, research and service, began as Oregon State University's 16th president on Sept. 9, 2022.

As OSU's president, Murthy is committed to improving access to college for all learners; advancing student success, undergraduate graduation rates and inclusive excellence throughout the university; expanding OSU's strong research portfolio by investing in research infrastructure; and supporting faculty excellence in teaching, research and Extension and engagement programs.

Prior to joining Oregon State, Murthy served as the Ronald and Valerie Sugar Dean at the UCLA Henry Samueli School of Engineering and Applied Science since January 2016. Murthy, 64, was the first woman dean at UCLA's engineering school.

During her tenure, she made expanding access to a UCLA engineering education a top priority by deepening relationships with local community colleges, increasing outreach to underrepresented minority groups and easing the transition for transfer students. She led the effort to establish a Women in Engineering program at UCLA that supports the full participation of women in engineering.

Under Murthy's leadership at UCLA, the engineering school focused on growth in areas critical to the 21st century, including engineering in medicine and biology; sustainable and resilient urban systems; artificial intelligence, machine learning and data science; cybersecurity and the future internet; robotics and cyberphysical systems; as well as advanced materials and manufacturing. She also has served as a distinguished professor in the school's mechanical and aerospace department.

Before joining UCLA, Murthy was chair of the mechanical engineering department at the University of Texas at Austin and held the Ernest Cockrell, Jr. Memorial Chair in Engineering from 2012-2015. Prior to that, Murthy was a mechanical engineering professor at Purdue University from 2001-2011 and served as a professor of mechanical engineering at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh from 1998 to 2001.

While at Purdue and University of Texas, Murthy served as the director of the Center for Prediction of Reliability, Integrity and Survivability of Microsystems (PRISM) from 2008 to 2014, a center of excellence supported by the National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA).

Murthy received a doctorate in mechanical engineering from the University of Minnesota, a master's degree in mechanical engineering from Washington State University and a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology, Kanpur, where she was named a distinguished alumna in 2012.

She is a member of the National Academy of Engineering (NAE), foreign fellow of the Indian National Academy of Engineering (INAE), fellow of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME) and the recipient of many honors, including the ASME Heat Transfer Memorial Award in 2016 and the ASME Electronics and Photonics Packaging Division Clock Award.

Her research interests include nanoscale heat transfer, computational fluid dynamics, and simulations of fluid flow and heat transfer for industrial applications. Recently, her focus is on sub-micron thermal transport, multiscale multi-physics simulations of micro- and nano-electromechanical systems (MEMS and NEMS) and the uncertainty quantifications involved in those systems.

Murthy is married to Sanjay Mathur, an aerospace engineer who works at Spark-Cognition, a firm specializing in artificial intelligence systems and development.

Scott Barnes was named Vice President and Director of Athletics Dec. 22, 2016 by then Oregon State University President Dr. Ed Ray.

In 2021, Barnes spearheaded the start of the Completing Reser Stadium project, a \$153 million renovation that will make the Beavers' home a best-in-class football facility with year-round programs and facilities for all OSU students, faculty and staff.

The gymnastics program opened a 20,000-square foot practice facility, the largest in the Pac-12. It is now a part of over \$14-million of completed improvements to women's facilities stemming from the Oregon State Athletics Strategic Plan Barnes initiated in 2018.

Oregon State, in 2021, finished 55th in the Learfield Directors' Cup as 11 of the program's teams advanced to the post-season. It's the program's best finish in the Cup in 15 years.

In Barnes' tenure, OSU Athletics has made significant strides academically and athletically. Beaver student-athletes are among the leaders in the Pac-12 Conference for academic accomplishments, the Valley Football Center officially reopened and the popular Fan Experience Committee was created. In addition, he has increased the emphasis on fundraising and developing a sustainable business model that will ensure Beaver Athletics continues to progress and thrive, and debuted the BUILD THE DAM Strategic Plan to guide the program forward for future years.

Facilities have been at the forefront of Barnes' leadership at OSU. He has spearheaded facility projects that include a \$3.5 million refresh of the Sports Performance Center, completion of phase II of the Valley Football Center, a remodel of the men's and women's basketball locker rooms, the construction of Casey Corner at Goss Stadium at Coleman Field, the remodel of Paul Lorenz Field (soccer), among other projects.

Barnes has made numerous strategic hires with the Beavers' intercollegiate programs, including head football coach

Pac-12 committees: the Executive Committee (2019-20 Chair), NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Oversight Committee, Bowls Committee, Men's Basketball Tournament Committee, Men's Basketball Liaison, Television Committee, and Rose

Bowl Management Committee. In addition, he is a faculty member on the Lead 1 Athletic Directors Association and in January 2018 he was one of four Director of Athletics in the country to visit Asia on a Nike sponsored trip.

Barnes has spent over three decades in athletics administration, including more than 20 years as an athletics director. He arrived back to his native Pacific Northwest from the University of Pittsburgh, where he served as the Panthers' Director of Athletics for nearly two years. Pittsburgh achieved high success academically and athletically that included bowl trips, conference titles and record academic achievements.

Prior to Pitt, Barnes headed the Utah State University athletics program from 2008-15 as Director of Athletics and was promoted to Vice President in 2012. While at Utah State, the Aggies experienced unprecedented success that included multiple bowl trips in football, 20 league titles and a successful transition to the Mountain West Conference.

Barnes has also served as the Director of Athletics at Eastern Washington University and Humboldt State University. In addition, he has held various athletics roles at the University of The Pacific, the University of San Diego, Iowa State University and the University of Washington. He also has experience in corporate business and professional basketball.

The Spokane native graduated from Fresno State with a bachelor's degree in 1986 and a master's degree in athletics administration and physical education in 1993. A basketball letterman under coach Boyd Grant, he helped the Bulldogs advance to two NCAA Tournaments and two NITs. Barnes was a second-team all-conference player as a senior before playing professionally in Germany.

He and his wife, Jody, have two children: Daughter, Milanna, and son, Isaac.

- Oversaw final fundraising in the \$42 million Valley Football Center project.
- Spearheaded remodel and expansion of Goss Stadium at Coleman Field (2018-19), the Sports Performance Center (weight room), the Valley Football Center, the OSU Softball Complex (now Kelly Field), Paul Lorenz Field and the 20,000-square foot gymnas-
