- » Oregon State hits the road to close the 2024-25 regular season, taking on St. Mary's and Pepperdine with WCC Tournament seeding on the line
- » The Beavers are currently in line for the fourth seed, a game up on San Francisco.
- » Winning out would lock in the seed and a spot in the tournament quarterfinals while one or two losses could leave the seeding up to various tiebreakers.
- » The Beavs are coming off a weekend sweep of San Diego and Santa Clara with defense holding both teams to 51 points for comfortable victories
- Kennedie Shuler starred for OSU, recording 13 pts, 7 ast and 7 reb against the Broncos with 12 pts and 7 ast against the Toreros to secure the wins



# NUMBERS TO KNOW

Oregon State simply does not foul. The Beavers rank 12th in the nation committing just 13.3 fouls per game, just over 1 foul behind the national leaders.

Oregon State is the only team in the WCC to have **two different** players pull down 14+ rebounds in a conference game (Rees 14 vs. SD, Ferreira 14 vs. Pepperdine)

### TEAM NOTES

### **WINNERS WIN**

Scott Rueck enters Year 29 at Oregon State as one of college basketball's most proven winners. In 15 years at OSU he took a team that needed tryouts to fill a roster in his first year to three Elite Eights, five Sweet 16s and the 2016 Final Four. Prior to joining OSU, Rueck turned George Fox into a Division III power, winning the 2009 National Championship. In 2024-25, Rueck just earned his 300th win with the Beavers and his 600th career victory. He is one of 15 active D1 coaches with 600 wins.

### **DOMINATING DEFENSE**

The Beavers are known for their lockdown D under Scott Rueck. Oregon State has allowed 59.5 points per game over the course of his tenure and has held opponents under 65 points in 70% of its games. The Beavs are 266-72 (.787) when holding the opponent to 65 points or fewer and 225-39 (.852) when holding opponents under 60 in the Rueck Era.

### PLAYING BEAVER BASKETBALL

Oregon State appears to be rounding into form after a late comeback against Washington State followed by six comfortable victories in seven games. Among the typical tenants of Beaver Basketball under Scott Rueck, in those four wins the Beavs...

- » Averaged just 10.8 turnovers per game to 17.5 assists (both would rank in the top-30 nationally for a full season)
- » Outrebounded the opposition by 11.2 rebounds per game
- » Held the four opponents to 34.9 percent shooting and 32.8 percent from three
- » Limited five of the six leading scorers (entering the game) to 30% FG or worse
- » Played through the post, outscoring the opposition by 100 points (210-110) in the paint
- » Had balanced scoring, with 3-or-more players in double-figures in all six games

### TALK TO YOUR DOCTOR ABOUT OREGON STATE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

After six overtime games this season, watching Beaver basketball isn't exactly cardiologist-recommended. The Beavs went to overtime in their first three WCC games this season (at Pacific, Gonzaga and Portland), and set a school record with their fifth OT game at Pacific (the second time). Three overtime wins also ties a school record with the 2002-03 and 2018-19 teams.

- » The Beavers lead the nation in OT games and OT periods played with six. Chicago State is in second with five OT games and 10 teams have played in four overtime games
- » Back-to-back OT contests vs. the Zags and Pilots were the first since at UW and WSU in 2013 (1/25-27)
- » The Beavs played overtime in both games against Pacific and Gonzaga

### (MISSED) SHOTS! SHOTS! SHOTS SHOTS SHOTS! EVERYBODY!

Òregon State's elite defense is predicated on making opponents take the shots they don't want to take. In a survey of anonymous coaches done by The Athletic, one said of Rueck's defense: "Whatever you're really good at, they're gonna take away. If you're good at ABC, you better come with DEF because they're not gonna give you ABC." Notable Oregon State defensive performances the last two seasons include:

- » Finished possessions, holding USD to a season-low five offensive rebounds
- » On one weekend, held both St.Mary's and Pepperdine to a six-point quarter in two wins
- » Held SMC to its season's second-lowest scoring game of the year (45 points)
- » Held two teams (USF & Santa Clara) scoreless for 10 straight minutes of game time
- » In the first game against Portland, held the Pilots to their fourth-lowest scoring (72) of the year despite going to OT -and second-lowest FG% (35) of the season
- » On Maui, held WKU to its 2nd-worst FG% (35.1) of the year and Miami to its 3rd-worst (39)
- » Limited Boston College to its season-low in scoring (49)

### WINNING TIME

The Beavs are at their best with the game on the line. Oregon State outscores its opponents 478-418 in the fourth quarter with several notable comebacks including going from 12-down to force OT at Gonzaga (a 71-67 victory) in the game's final 3:12 as well as late explosions like a 23-13 final period to put away Santa Clara last Thursday.

### **IRON SHARPENS IRON**

Nobody can argue with Oregon State's strength of schedule in the non-conference. The Beavers ranked 27th in the NCAA NET Non-Con SOS ranking, battling UConn (NET #2) and Minnesota (NET #29) at neutral sites and Illinois (NET #32) on the road within its first six games of the year.

### **NO PRICE LIKE FREE**

The Beavers don't pass up free points, making 75.8 percent free throws. That ranks 50th in the nation and 2nd in the WCC. Seven players are shooting 75% or better at the stripe, led (among players w/ 10+ FTs) by AJ Marotte at 85%.

### **CLEAN DEFENSE**

Oregon State plays clean, fundamentally sound defense under Scott Rueck. In 2024-25, OSU fouls 13.2 times per game, a full foul less than second place Pepperdine in the WCC. The Beavers rank third in the nation in fewest fouls per game over the last ten seasons, and the lack of fouls means fewer opportunities for opponents at the charity stripe, where OSU also ranks among the best over the last 10 years.

### **TOO REES-Y**

In Kelsey Rees, Scott Rueck has likely developed his latest all-conference post. The senior is averaging 13.7 points and 7.9 rebounds in WCC games and hitting career-highs in scoring and rebounding in her second year under Rueck's tutelage with 12.7 points (previous high: 4.9) and 7.8 rebounds (4.3). The senior was named the WCC Player of the Week after recording back-to-back career-highs with 21 and 25 points on the road in wins over Gonzaga and Portland. She also scored 22 on the Beavers' second trip to Pacific.

### **FLOOR GENERAL**

Kennedie Shuler had a steep learning curve to open the 2024-25 season, taking on the starting point guard role after playing just 9.8 minutes per game as a freshman. There were some early bumps in the road, but Shuler has come into her own over the last 10 games, averaging 8.9 points, 4.3 assists, 2.9 rebounds and a 2.69 A/TO ratio. The sophomore had 13p-7a-7r vs. Santa Clara and 12p-7a vs. San Diego last weekend

### **CLUTCH KENNEDIE**

Twice with the game on the line, the Beavers have turned to Kennedie Shuler. She delivered both times. The sophomore point guard hit game-winning and-ones against both LMU (in regulation) and at Santa Clara (in overtime) to secure crucial WCC victories.

### **BOARDING GROUP C**

Catarina Ferreira is on the floor to attack the glass. The senior is just six feet tall, but is second on the OSU team with 7.7 rebounds per game in her first year as a Beaver. If she maintains the average, Ferreira would be one of just six Beavs listed at 6-0 or smaller to record 6+ rebounds per game in a season since 1999-2000, joining Mikayla Pivec, Jamie Weisner, Felicia Ragland, Judie Lomax and Earlysia Marchbanks.

### **BALANCED ATTACK**

One of the Beavers' perceived weaknesses entering the season was the lack of a star player. While that has not turned out to be true (see the notes on Kelsey Rees), the Beavs are a balanced bunch offensively. Five players have scored 20+ points in a game (Rees, Marotte, Bolden, Ferreira and Heide) and Kennedie Shuler scored 16 at Gonzaga and 17 at Arizona State.

### **NO CHARITY**

As in year's past, Oregon State's clean defense means opposing teams rarely make it to the charity stripe. The Beavers rank last in the WCC in opponent free throw attempts at 320 despite playing at least two more games (29) than the next three closest teams (LMU -  $26 \, \text{G} / 323 \, \text{FTA}$ , San Francisco =  $27 \, \text{G} / 352 \, \text{FTA}$ , Pepperdine -  $27 \, \text{G} / 360 \, \text{FTA}$ ).

### SHOOTIN' SCHIMEL

Ally Schimel joined Oregon State as a walk-on after dominating 3A Oregon high schools for four years at Corbett on the way to two state runner-ups and a title as a senior. The freshman quickly proved herself as a Beav, leading the team in season plus-minus, and earned a scholarship at the team's holiday party. Schimel recorded a career-high 13 points at LMU and four assists at San Diego in a road sweep.

### **NEW ROLE, STILL AJ**

Oregon State needed the same AJ Marotte, but more often in 2024-25. So far, so good. Marotte is running the highest usage rate of her career (21.8%) and posted two separate stretches with double-figure scoring in five straight games. Some efficiency stats have dropped with the ball in her hands more but according to Her Hoop Stats, Marotte's assist rate (15.6%) is the highest of her career and her Player Efficiency Rating (11.7) is as well.

### LIKE MOTHER, LIKE DAUGHTER

Sela Heide thréw a block party for Oregon State's annual field trip game. The senior post rejected 8 shots for a career-high and was two blocks away from a triple-double. Heide's eight rejections add her to an elite list of OSU posts that includes her mom - Sissel Pierce - who blocked eight Arizona State shots in 2000. The mother-daughter duo are two of five Beavs with 8+ blocks in a game.

### **KELSEY (TH)REES**

Kelsey Rees showed off massive year-over-year development in her first season as a Beaver, most notably as a floor-spacer at the 4 and 5. The senior improved her three-point percentage by almost seven points over her best year at Utah, making 37.7 percent from deep. According to StatsPass, Rees was one of just three players who are 6-foot-5 or taller to shoot 37.5 percent or better from deep and did so on a higher volume (61 attempts) than the other two combined.

### **HELPING HANDS**

The Beavers pride themselves on versatility and nowhere is that more apparent than OSU's assist numbers. Every member of the team's starting five (Shuler, Bolden, Marotte, Ferreira and Rees) can initiate the offense and all five are averaging career-highs in assists. Shuler leads the bunch at 2.9 dimes per game with Marotte (2.4) and Ferreira (2.1) also averaging at least two. All five starters have also handed out at least four assists in a game and it's common to see 2-3 players with at least three.

### **OWNING THE BOARDS**

Oregon State has been one of the top rebounding teams in the country over the last ten seasons. The Beavs have a rebounding margin of +8.1 during that time, which ranks ninth nationally. In five of those seasons, OSU ranked top-10 in the country in ninth margin while finishing in the top-25 twice more (#23 last season at +7.1)

### **HOME SWEET HOME**

Beaver Nation has long been among the best women's basketball fan bases in the nation. and last year they set several new records in support of the 2023-24 Beavs as the team went 18-2 at home including the postseason (7,227), single-season (103, 110) and student (2,329 vs. UCLA) attendance records. This year, Beaver Nation ranks second in the WCC in average attendance at 4,263, more than 3,000 fans better than the third place school and under 1,000 back of Gonzaga.

### **PRO BEAVS**

Development in the Oregon State program helped several former players earn spots on pro teams all over the world. Numbers fluctuate as seasons start and end, but OSU has 10 alumni playing professionally. Notable performances include Kat Tudor earning a spot on the WBBL Team of the Year and Mikayla Pivec earning NBL1 East First-Team honors. Tudor and Tea Adams also recently led the Caledonia Gladiators to their first Super League Basketball Final with a 68-62 win over the Sheffield Hatters. Marie Gulich (Germany) and Ali Gibson (Puerto Rico) each represented their countries at the Olympics. Gibson was OSU's first two-time Olympian in women's basketball.

Voice of the Beavers Ron Callan has called 536 Oregon State women's basketball games since joining the program in the 2007-08 season, holding a record of 329-207 during that span. Ron called his 500th game of OSU women's basketball against Utah last season, a 91-66 victory.

### **BEAVER STAFF NOTES**

- » Assistant Coach **Deven Hunter** enters her fourth season on the Oregon State staff. Hunter worked at San Diego prior to joining the Beavers, and was part of OSU's 2016 Final Four squad as a player. She played a major role in developing All-American post Raegan Beers as well as helping Sela Heide and Kelsey Rees make major improvements in their first years in Corvallis.
- » Fellow assistant and 2016 Final Four team member **Sydney Wiese** returned to her second home after a lengthy professional career that included stints with the LA Sparks, Washington Mystics and several international teams.
- » Director of Player Personnel and Interim Assistant Coach **Eric Ely** is back on the bench for his 13th season with Rueck and the Beavs. A post coach by trade, Ely played a major role in developing players like Pac-12 DPOYs Ruth Hamblin and Marie Gulich during his earlier coaching stint in Corvallis. Ely whose wife is from Brazil and speaks Portuguese was the primary recruiter for Catarina Ferreira.
- » Associate AD for Sport Performance **Jeff Macy** oversees all of Oregon State's strength and conditioning programs and is the strength coach for the Beaver women. He spent ten years in the NBA, five with the Chicago Bulls (2001-2006) and five with the Milwaukee Bucks (2008-2013). Macy is in his second stint with Oregon State.
- » Director of Operations **Olivia Murphy** is in her fifth year with the team. An Oregon State alumnus, Murphy was previously the DOBO for Cal men's basketball
- » Athletic Trainer **Jason Lieuw** is the longest serving member of the Oregon State staff, currently in his 16th year and recently worked his 500th game with the program (at Pacific, 1/25/25)
- » Graduate Assistant/Video Coordinator **Jared Vedus** joined the staff last season after spending three years as a practice player for the Beavers.

### **HEAD COACH SCOTT RUECK (15TH SEASON)**



It was a homecoming of sorts for OSU alumnus Scott Rueck, who was named the fifth head coach in the history of the Oregon State women's basketball program on June 30, 2010.

Rueck has been the architect of an accelerated turnaround of the women's basketball program at Oregon State, bringing the team onto the national stage.

Rueck has led the Beavers to eight NCAA Tournaments, including the 2024 event where he took a team picked 10th in the Pac-12 preseason poll to the Elite 8. OSU was also poised to earn a top-4 seed prior to the cancellation of the 2019-20 Tournament due to COVID-19. Oregon State won three-straight Pac-12 titles from 2015-17, and has made five Sweet-16's, three Elite Eight's and a Final Four.

The two-time OSU graduate entered the Oregon State Hall of Fame for the first time with his 2016 Final Four Team on November 10, 2023. Rueck led the Beavers to a sweep of the Pac-12 regular season and conference titles in addition to the Final Four

The now-15th-year coach has led the Beavers to 49 wins over AP Top 25 programs during his time at Oregon State, including 16 over top-10 teams. Squaring off against some of the best players in the nation, the Beavers have often at least held their own. OSU went 4-4 against Oregon during Sabrina lonescu's time in Eugene and recorded an 7-1 mark against Washington while Pac-12 all-time leading scorer Kelsey Plum played for the Huskies.

Oregon State also developed its own superstars under Rueck. Five players earned All-America honors in six years between 2015-2020. Jamie Weisner and Ruth Hamblin won back-to-back Pac-12 Player of the Year honors in 2015-16 and Hamblin, Gabby Hansen and Marie Gulich won Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in four straight seasons between 2015-18. Sydney Weise was another of the All-Americans and also won the Senior Class Award in 2017 after earning All-Pac-12 recognition for four straight seasons.


