MEET THE BEAVS: AN INTRODUCTION TO OREGON STATE WBB

ON THE COURT

THE PORTAL TAKETH

After realignment cost the old Pac-12, the Beavs lost eight players to the transfer portal, comprising a significant portion of last year's production including...

- Points – 81.8% lost (2030/2483)
- Rebounds – 68.9% lost (964/1399)
- Assists – 79.9% lost (494/618)
- Minutes – 72.3% lost (5125/7089)

THE PORTAL GIVETH

Despite entering the fray nearly after the portal had closed (all 13 players could have returned and playing in the Elite 8 forced them to make decisions late), Scott Rueck and co. found some gems in the portal. Notably, Cat Ferreira - the WCC Tournament MVP - came from Baylor. Local product and 32-game starter Tiara Bolden joined OSU from La Salle.

GOING LOW

Oregon State's defense makes offenses take tough shots. Of the 19 teams they faced, the Beavs held 17 of them to FG% below their season averages. In the WCC championship game, the Beavs handed Portland their lowest FG% of the season, 21.7%.

LEADING THE OFFENSE

Offensively, the Beavers have been led by forward Kelsey Rees, who averages 12.8 points and 7.6 rebounds per game. Point guard Kennedie Shuler contributes significantly with 7.9 points and a team-high 3.6 assists per game. Forward Sela Heide leads in field goal percentage, converting 71.6% of her attempts.

STEPPING UP

Oregon State's starting five is stepping up across the board. Every member of the Beavers' first unit—Kelsey Rees (12.8), AJ Marotte (11.4), Cat Ferreira (10.0), Tiara Bolden (8.2), and Kennedie Shuler (7.9)—is averaging a career high in points per game. Sixth woman Sela Heide also owns a career-best mark with 7.4 points per game this season.

HEAD OF THE BOARD(S)

Oregon State owned the glass in the West Coast Conference. The Beavs ranked second in the league in rebound margin at +6.4 and outrebounded WCC foes in 15 of 20 league games. Kelsey Rees (7.8) and Catarina Ferreira (7.7) ranked fourth and fifth in the conference in rebounding, making OSU the only team with two in the top-10.

BEHIND THE SCENES

WE ARE FAMILY

Anyone can tell you what Oregon State doesn't have. But what makes the Beavers' special is the culture built by Rueck, the players and the staff over 15 seasons in Corvallis where the team - even one representing six countries and with four languages spoken - is truly more than the sum of its parts.

A few quotes from the team on how the 2024-25 senior class set the tone for a close-knit group this season:

"She's the glue of the team, I feel, and she just connects everyone" - Elisa Mehyar on Sela Heide

"She's the true definition of a senior, always helping others all the time." - Cloe Vecina on Kelsey Rees

"AJ is such a great teammate and a great person. She has been there since the moment I came to Corvallis" - Lucia Navarro on AJ Marotte

"When I got here, she was the person who made me feel so welcome and like I was home" - Catarina Ferreira on AJ Marotte

RETURN OF THE BEAVS

Deven Hunter and Sydney Wiese were members of perhaps the two most impactful classes in Oregon State women's basketball history: 2016 and 2017. The duo made history in 2016 with the team's first Final Four appearance and OSU won back-to-back-to-back Pac-12 titles in 2015, 2016 and 2017. Now, both returned to Corvallis as members of the coaching staff. Hunter, in her fourth season, works primarily with posts and is the staff's lead assistant. Wiese, in her first season, takes the lead with the guards and had the scouts for WCC Tournament games against San Francisco and Portland en route to the tournament title.

THE CONFERENCE SITCH

Oregon State is grateful to be an affiliate member of the West Coast Conference for the 2024-25 and 2025-26. The Beavers and Washington State are also Pac-12 members and the conference will resume its storied women's basketball tradition with both schools in 2026-27.

THEY SAID IT BEST

"I don't know if we've had a better athlete here overall, as far as speed, quickness and the ability to elevate," OSU's 15th-year coach Scott Rueck said of the 6-foot **Cat Ferreira**.

"When we execute, along with the defensive intensity that's become so consistent, I think we're a tough out," OSU coach **Scott Rueck** said.

"With a relatively young and inexperienced team, it's just put so much more importance on her role," Rueck said. "**(Shuler's)** carrying the burden of ball control, communication, being the quarterback (and) basically keeping everybody on the same page."

"Making sure my team doesn't go on (scoring) droughts, being disciplined, knowing our scouts, the personnel we're playing," **Shuler** said explaining all the things she has to be aware of when on the court. "Those are just a few."

"I haven't looked back since to be honest," **Sydney Wiese** said. "... And this (job at Oregon State) felt like the best one for where I was at as a person, as a competitor in my own life, and then obviously everything that is taking place here and how it, just for me, it was like, how could I say no to an opportunity like that?"

"A year ago, I didn't believe in myself. I didn't believe I could play at this level," **Ferreira** said. "I took a chance, and see what happened? That's why I get so emotional. This team, and this staff, they believed in me more than anybody."

"The student-athletes who stayed, and those who joined them, just proved that you can throw any adversity you want in our way. Beavers will find a way to rise above it," said **Sara Elcano**, an OSU senior administrator who was with the team in Las Vegas.

"We've had turnover, but Oregon State is still Oregon State. I'm still who I am," **Rueck** said. "The people have changed, the confidence has changed, but the culture and who we are, I don't how to be anything else."

"You saw from Day One, they played hard. I think Beaver Nation is proud of that," **Rueck** said. "So, this team hopefully put a big smile on everyone's face, because yeah, it's been tough to be us."

TEAM NOTES

WINNERS WIN

Scott Rueck enters Year 29 as a head coach as one of college basketball's most proven winners. In 15 years at OSU he took a team that needed tryouts to fill a roster in his first year to three Elite Eights, five Sweet 16s and the 2016 Final Four. Prior to joining OSU, Rueck turned George Fox into a Division III power, winning the 2009 National Championship. In 2024-25, Rueck just earned his 300th win with the Beavers and his 600th career victory. He is one of 15 active D1 coaches with 600 wins.

DOMINATING DEFENSE

The Beavers are known for their lockdown D under Scott Rueck. Oregon State has allowed 59.5 points per game over the course of his tenure and has held opponents under 65 points in 70% of its games. The Beavs are 270-72 (.787) when holding the opponent to 65 points or fewer and 228-39 (.852) when holding opponents under 60 in the Rueck Era.

PLAYING BEAVER BASKETBALL

Oregon State hit its stride to end the 2024-25 season with 10 wins in the final 12 games. Among the typical tenants of Beaver Basketball under Scott Rueck the Beavs...

- » Averaged just 13.3 turnovers per game to 14.9 assists
- » Outrebounded the opposition by 9.4 rebounds per game (39.3-29.9)
- » Held the seven opponents to 34.7 percent shooting and 30 percent from three
- » Limited 10 of the 12 leading scorers (entering the game) to 30% FG or worse
- » Played through the post, outscoring the opposition by 164 points (302-158) in the paint
- » Used an inside-out gameplan, hitting 37.6 percent of their three-pointers

TALK TO YOUR DOCTOR ABOUT OREGON STATE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

After six overtime games this season, watching Beaver basketball isn't exactly cardiologist-recommended. The Beavs went to overtime in their first three WCC games this season (at Pacific, Gonzaga and Portland), and set a school record with their fifth OT game at Pacific (the second time). Three overtime wins also ties a school record with the 2002-03 and 2018-19 teams.

- » The Beavers lead the nation in OT games and OT periods played with six. Chicago State is in second with five OT games and 10 teams have played in four overtime games
- » Back-to-back OT contests vs. the Zags and Pilots were the first since at UW and WSU in 2013 (1/25-27)

(MISSED) SHOTS! SHOTS! SHOTS SHOTS SHOTS SHOTS! EVERYBODY!

Oregon State's elite defense is predicated on making opponents take the shots they don't want to take. In a survey of anonymous coaches done by The Athletic last year, one said of Rueck's defense: "Whatever you're really good at, they're gonna take away. If you're good at ABC, you better come with DEF because they're not gonna give you ABC." Notable Oregon State defensive performances this season include:

- » Holding Portland to a season low in scoring by 19 points (46, prev: 65) and FG% by nearly 14 percentage points (21.7%, prev: 35.1%)
- » Limited Boston College to a season-low 49 points in a 56-49 win in the Bahamas
- » In addition to the two season-lows, held seven opponents to at least one of their five-worst scoring games of the 2024-25 season

CLEAN DEFENSE

Oregon State plays clean, fundamentally sound defense under Scott Rueck. In 2024-25, OSU fouls 13.9 times per game, a full foul less than second place Pepperdine in the WCC. The Beavers rank third in the nation in fewest fouls per game over the last ten seasons, and the lack of fouls means fewer opportunities for opponents at the charity stripe, where OSU also ranks among the best over the last 10 years.

CAT: LET'S DO THE WORK

WCC Tournament MVP Cat Ferreira always finds a way to impact the game. The senior was one of only two players in the WCC to rank in the league's top five in both rebounds and steals, pulling down 7.7 boards per game (5th) while swiping 2.1 steals per contest (4th). The only other player to match that versatility? LMU's Maya Hernandez. In the WCC Tournament, Ferreira had her most consistent scoring stretch of the season, leading OSU in all three games with 19, 19 and 16 points.

TOO REES-Y

In Kelsey Rees, Scott Rueck developed his latest first-team all-conference post. The senior averaged 14.5 points and 7.8 rebounds in WCC games and hit career-highs in scoring and rebounding in her second year under Rueck's tutelage with 12.9 points (previous high: 4.9) and 7.7 rebounds (4.3). The senior was named the WCC Player of the Week after recording back-to-back career-highs with 21 and 25 points on the road in wins over Gonzaga and Portland. She also scored 24 to close the season at Pepperdine.

FLOOR GENERAL IN TRAINING

If there were an award for most improved player from Game 1 to Game 34, Kennedie Shuler would win it going away. The first-year starter at point guard had 32 assists to 41 turnovers in her first 10 games. Over the season's middle 11 games, it was 30 assists: 29 turnovers. Then, in the final 10 games of the regular season, Shuler had 51 dimes with just 12 giveaways. During the final 10-game stretch, OSU went 7-3 with season-highs in scoring and assists as well as their three lowest-turnover games of the year.

SHE'S A WINNER

The Beavers turned to Shuler with the game on the line three times. She delivered in all three times. The sophomore point guard hit game-winning and-ones against both LMU (in regulation) and at Santa Clara (in overtime) to secure crucial WCC victories before making a game-winner over three defenders to beat Gonzaga in the WCC Semifinals.

THE CAPTA11N

AJ Marotte's return to Corvallis bouyed Oregon State during a turbulent offseason and her play has done the same over the last 10 games. A team captain, Marotte averaged 12.8 points on 40.3% shooting and 36.5% shooting from three during the closing stretch. She scored in double figures in 8 of 10 games.

AJ'S OUT THERE

Only one player has been on the court more than AJ Marotte in a single season: Sydney Wiese in 2013-14 (1,198) and 2016-17 (1,245). The senior plays 34.8 minutes per game and has been on the floor for 1,182 minutes in her final year in the Orange and Black. Marotte will almost certainly pass Wiese's freshman year against North Carolina and with a win could play more than any Beav in school history.

OLD SCHOOL POST

Sela Heide developed into an offensive weapon off the bench over the course of the 2024-25 season. The daughter of former Oregon State posts Sissel (Pierce) Heide and Jason Heide, Sela is averaging career-highs in scoring (7.4ppg) on a team-high 71.6 percent shooting from the floor. The senior has a developed post-up game with a bevy of simple moves to get easy buckets for the Beavers.

NOTES

BALANCED ATTACK

One of the Beavers' perceived weaknesses entering the season was the lack of a star player. While that has not turned out to be true (see the notes on Kelsey Rees), the Beavs are a balanced bunch offensively. Five players have scored 20+ points in a game (Rees, Marotte, Bolden, Ferreira and Heide) and Kennedie Shuler scored 16 at Gonzaga and 17 at Arizona State.

BOARDING GROUP C

Catarina Ferreira is on the floor to attack the glass. The senior is just six feet tall, but is second on the OSU team with 7.8 rebounds per game in her first year as a Beaver. If she maintains the average, Ferreira would be one of just six Beavs listed at 6-0 or smaller to record 6+ rebounds per game in a season since 1999-2000, joining Mikayla Pivec, Jamie Weisner, Felicia Ragland, Judie Lomax and Earlysia Marchbanks.

SHOOTIN' SCHIMEL

Ally Schimel joined Oregon State as a walk-on after dominating 3A Oregon high schools for four years at Corbett on the way to two state runner-ups and a title as a senior. The freshman quickly proved herself as a Beav, leading the team in season plus-minus, and earned a scholarship at the team's holiday party. Schimel recorded a career-high 13 points at LMU and four assists at San Diego in a road sweep. In the WCC Championship game, the freshman guarded Portland's best guard (Maisie Burnham) and held her to 3-of-12 shooting from the floor. Schimel was a team-best +16 in the title game.

NEW ROLE, STILL AJ

Oregon State needed the same AJ Marotte, but more often in 2024-25. So far, so good. Marotte is running the highest usage rate of her career (21.8%) and posted two separate stretches with double-figure scoring in five straight games. Some efficiency stats have dropped with the ball in her hands more but according to Her Hoop Stats, Marotte's assist rate (15.6%) is the highest of her career and her Player Efficiency Rating (11.7) is as well.

LIKE MOTHER, LIKE DAUGHTER

Sela Heide threw a block party for Oregon State's annual field trip game. The senior post rejected 8 shots for a career-high and was two blocks away from a triple-double. Heide's eight rejections add her to an elite list of OSU posts that includes her mom - Sissel Pierce - who blocked eight Arizona State shots in 2000. The mother-daughter duo are two of five Beavs with 8+ blocks in a game.

NO CHARITY

As in year's past, Oregon State's clean defense means opposing teams rarely make it to the charity stripe. The Beavers rank seventh nationally - and fourth among 2025 NCAA Tournament teams - in free throws allowed per game at 11.6.

OWNING THE BOARDS

Oregon State has been one of the top rebounding teams in the country over the last ten seasons. The Beavs have a rebounding margin of +8.1 during that time, which ranks ninth nationally. In five of those seasons, OSU ranked top-10 in the country in ninth margin while finishing in the top-25 twice more (t-35 this season at +6.4)



NOTES

MILESTONE WIN SZN

Milestone win after milestone win came for Scott Rueck and the Oregon State program. The head coach won his 300th game with the Beavs (12/1/24 vs. Grambling) and the 600th of his career (2/22/25 vs. San Diego). As a program, the Beavers won their 800th game in recorded history at San Diego on 2/8/25.

IRON SHARPENS IRON

Nobody can argue with Oregon State's strength of schedule in the non-conference. The Beavers ranked 27th in the NCAA NET Non-Con SOS ranking, battling UConn (NET #2) and Minnesota (NET #29) at neutral sites and Illinois (NET #32) on the road within its first six games of the year.

HOME SWEET HOME

Beaver Nation has long been among the best women's basketball fan bases in the nation, and last year they set several new records in support of the 2023-24 Beavs as the team went 18-2 at home including the postseason (7,227), single-season (103, 110) and student (2,329 vs. UCLA) attendance records. This year, Beaver Nation ranks second in the WCC in average attendance at 4,263, more than 3,000 fans better than the third place school and under 1,000 back of Gonzaga.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Due to the WCC's 20-game league schedule and the desire to put together a challenging non-conference slate, the Beavs were road warriors. The Beavers were one of nine teams in the nation with multiple stretches of 18+ days between home games with 21 days between their first and second home games (11/12-12/3) and 18 days (12/15-1/2) between the final home non-conference contest and first league home game.

PRO BEAVS

Development in the Oregon State program helped several former players earn spots on pro teams all over the world. Numbers fluctuate as seasons start and end, but OSU has 11 alumni playing professionally. Notable performances include Kat Tudor earning a spot on the WBBL Team of the Year and Mikayla Pivec earning NBL1 East First-Team honors. Tudor and Tea Adams also recently led the Caledonia Gladiators to their first Super League Basketball Final with a 68-62 win over the Sheffield Hatters. Marie Gulich (Germany) and Ali Gibson (Puerto Rico) each represented their countries at the Olympics. Gibson was OSU's first two-time Olympian in women's basketball.

Voice of the Beavers Ron Callan has called 541 Oregon State women's basketball games since joining the program in the 2007-08 season, holding a record of 333-208 during that span. Ron called his 500th game of OSU women's basketball against Utah last season, a 91-66 victory.

BEAVER STAFF NOTES

» Assistant Coach **Deven Hunter** enters her fourth season on the Oregon State staff. Hunter worked at San Diego prior to joining the Beavers, and was part of OSU's 2016 Final Four squad as a player. She played a major role in developing All-American post Raegan Beers as well as helping Sela Heide and Kelsey Rees make major improvements in their first years in Corvallis.

» Fellow assistant and 2016 Final Four team member **Sydney Wiese** returned to her second home after a lengthy professional career that included stints with the LA Sparks, Washington Mystics and several international teams. Wiese had the winning scout for the WCC Championship game.

» Director of Player Personnel and Interim Assistant Coach **Eric Ely** is back on the bench for his 13th season with Rueck and the Beavs. A post coach by trade, Ely played a major role in developing players like Pac-12 DPOYs Ruth Hamblin and Marie Gulich during his earlier coaching stint in Corvallis. Ely - whose wife is from Brazil and speaks Portuguese - was the primary recruiter for Catarina Ferreira.

» Associate AD for Sport Performance **Jeff Macy** oversees all of Oregon State's strength and conditioning programs and is the strength coach for the Beaver women. He spent ten years in the NBA, five with the Chicago Bulls (2001-2006) and five with the Milwaukee Bucks (2008-2013). Macy is in his second stint with Oregon State.

» Director of Operations **Olivia Murphy** is in her fifth year with the team. An Oregon State alumnus, Murphy was previously the DOBO for Cal men's basketball.

» Athletic Trainer **Jason Lieuw** is the longest serving member of the Oregon State staff, currently in his 16th year and recently worked his 500th game with the program (at Pacific, 1/25/25).

» Graduate Assistant/Video Coordinator **Jared Vedus** joined the staff last season after spending three years as a practice player for the Beavers.

HEAD COACH SCOTT RUECK (15TH SEASON)



It was a homecoming of sorts for OSU alumnus Scott Rueck, who was named the fifth head coach in the history of the Oregon State women's basketball program on June 30, 2010.

Rueck has been the architect of an accelerated turnaround of the women's basketball program at Oregon State, bringing the team onto the national stage.

Rueck has led the Beavers to eight NCAA Tournaments, including the 2024 event where he took a team picked 10th in the Pac-12 preseason poll to the Elite 8. OSU was also poised to earn a top-4 seed prior to the cancellation of the 2019-20 Tournament due to COVID-19. Oregon State won three-straight Pac-12 titles from 2015-17, and has made five Sweet-16's, three Elite Eight's and a Final Four.

The two-time OSU graduate entered the Oregon State Hall of Fame for the first time with his 2016 Final Four Team on November 10, 2023. Rueck led the Beavers to a sweep of the Pac-12 regular season and conference titles in addition to the Final Four

The now-15th-year coach has led the Beavers to 49 wins over AP Top 25 programs during his time at Oregon State, including 16 over top-10 teams. Squaring off against some of the best players in the nation, the Beavers have often at least held their own. OSU went 4-4 against Oregon during Sabrina Ionescu's time in Eugene and recorded an 7-1 mark against Washington while Pac-12 all-time leading scorer Kelsey Plum played for the Huskies.

Oregon State also developed its own superstars under Rueck. Five players earned All-America honors in six years between 2015-2020. Jamie Weisner and Ruth Hamblin won back-to-back Pac-12 Player of the Year honors in 2015-16 and Hamblin, Gabby Hansen and Marie Gulich won Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in four straight seasons between 2015-18. Sydney Weise was another of the All-Americans and also won the Senior Class Award in 2017 after earning All-Pac-12 recognition for four straight seasons.
