

### STARTING FIVE

» Kennedie Shuler delivered again for Oregon State, recording 19 points, 7 assists, 5 rebounds and 2 steals Saturday en route to a win and WCC Player of the Week honors  
» The weekly award was Shuler's second straight and the fourth of the season for the Beavers, who are one of two teams with three different players (Shuler, Jenna Villa & Tiara Bolden) to win WCC Player of the Week (Santa Clara)  
» The Beavs now face their toughest test of the conference season, a road battle with a Gonzaga team that took the Beavers to overtime in Gill Coliseum  
» OSU enters with momentum in the right places, getting its best post play of the year from Lizzy Williamson (18p, 9r, 4b) to beat San Francisco 75-53 at home  
» Williamson and Shuler were two of four scorers in double figures for Oregon State, joined by Jenna Villa (15 points) and Ally Schimel (11 points)



Lizzy Williamson posted ± of +16 (GU) and +20 (USD) for OSU before breaking out with 18 points vs. USF

### NUMBERS TO KNOW

Oregon State simply does not foul. The Beavers rank **second in the nation in fewest personal fouls per game** with 11.6. No Beavs fouled out until their 21st game.

Since Scott Rueck started coaching the Beavs in 2010-11 **they rank fifth in the nation in FG% defense**, holding opponents to 35.6% shooting from the field.



## TEAM NOTES

## OREGON STATE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL 101

These are the five most important things to know about the way OSU plays basketball:

- Elite position defense is normally the team's calling card. Under Scott Rueck the Beavs rank fifth in the nation in FG% defense, holding foes to 35.7% shooting since 2010-11
- That FG% defense is no accident. Typically, OSU looks to force opponents into their lowest-percentage looks rather than risk their position for steals or turnovers.
- Holding opponents to one shot is crucial for defensive success: OSU ranks 10th nationally in rebound margin over the last 10 seasons (+8.1)
- Offensively, Oregon State teams traditionally opt to surround posts with excellent shooters, forcing defenses to pick their poison between guarding the arc and the rim
- Scott Rueck has coached 14 all-league posts at OSU and his teams have shot an average of 34.6 percent from downtown (14th nationally since his arrival in Corvallis)

## HEADED BACK TO THE PAC-12

The Beavs are grateful to be affiliate members of the WCC for the 2024-25 and 2025-26 seasons. Next year, Oregon State and fellow league member, Washington State will resume Pac-12 play with the new members on the conference: Boise State, Colorado State, Fresno State, Gonzaga, San Diego State, Texas State and Utah State. New members will officially join on July 1, 2026.

## EXORCISING DEMONS IN FROM 2024-25

The early WCC slate set Oregon State up to pick up a few payback victories and the chance to win in buildings where they lost tight games in 2024-25. The Beavers opened league play with wins at USF (lost 52-50 in 24-25) and Saint Mary's (lost 69-66 after 17-point comeback by SMC) before blowing out Pacific, which swept the Beavs by a combined four points last year with both games in Stockton, and Washington State (swept OSU in 2024-25).

## (MISSED) SHOTS! SHOTS! SHOTS SHOTS SHOTS SHOTS! EVERYBODY!

Oregon State's defensive scheme is simple: Make other teams take shots they don't like taking. In a survey of anonymous coaches done by The Athletic, one said of Rueck's defense: "Whatever you're really good at, they're gonna take away. If you're good at ABC, you better come with DEF because they're not gonna give you ABC." The Beavers lead the WCC in FG% Defense (37.1%) and are only allowing teams to make 39.2% of their shots inside the arc. Don't count on getting to the line either, as the Beavs are fifth nationally in opponent free throw attempts per game at 10.0.

## WHAT CAN'T SHE DO?

The following is a complete list of Division 1 Women's Basketball players averaging 10 points, 5 rebounds, 5 assists, 1 steal and 1 block per game in 2025-26:

Unsurprisingly, Shuler is tied for the national lead in games with 10-5-5-1-1 (6 - Kennedie Blair, Michigan State). She's sixth in the nation with nine games of 10-5-5, including Saturday's game against San Francisco.

## HOW CAN SHE ASSIST YOU

Kennedie Shuler is among the nation's most consistent distributors. The Gresham, Oregon product is one of just eight players nationally to hand out five-or-more assists in 17 or more games this season. Shuler is tied for 19th nationally and ranks second in the WCC with 5.7 assists per game. She was one dime shy of the school record with 14 against Long Beach State and is one of just eight players nationally with at least 14 assists in a game this season.

## VIVA VILLA!

Jenna Villa is enjoying a career year after transferring from Washington State to OSU. The junior is one of the most improved players in the country with increases in scoring (+10.3), rebounding (+2.2), assists (+0.4) and steals per game (+0.4). It's not just volume either. Villa is shooting 9.9% better from the field, 4.1% better from three and her PER improved from 13.3 to 29.8. Her 32-point career-high against Pacific is tied for the highest-scoring single game by a WCC player so far in 2025-26 (Jess Lawson, LMU).

**NOTES****CERTIFIED BUCKET**

Jenna Villa is likely at the top of opposing scouting reports for the first time in her college career, but it hasn't slowed her down yet. The junior ranks second in the league with 19.2 points/game in WCC games and leads the conference with two 30-point games. She is the 11th Beaver all-time with multiple 30-pieces, the first since Talia von Oelhoffen (2022-24), and the second Beav to score 30+ twice under Scott Rueck.

**SHOOTIN' SCHIMEL**

Ally Schimel joined Oregon State as a walk-on after dominating 3A Oregon high schools at Corbett on the way to two state runner-ups and a title as a senior. The freshman quickly proved herself as a Beav, leading the team in season plus-minus, and earned a scholarship. Schimel is a threat from downtown, making 46% of her triples which ranks 11th nationally.

**ONE WOMAN WRECKING CREW**

Kennedie Shuler's game against Gonzaga on 1/22 wasn't just a good single-game performance, it was one of the nation's best all-around games. Shuler was an assist (which rimmed out in overtime) away from a triple-double with steals and even without that her 17-point, 10-steal, 9-assist, 5-rebound, 3-block day made history in several ways.

- Tied the Oregon State school record, set in 1983 by Juli Coleman vs. BYU
- One of four 10-steal, 3-block performances in the nation since 1999-00 (as far back as searchable stats go for women's basketball)
- One of four points-steals double-doubles in the WCC since 1999-00
- One of 12 points-steals double-doubles in the nation this season and one of two with 9-or-more assists (Hannah Hidalgo vs. Bellermine)
- One of three Oregon State players to have 7+ steals in a game in 16 seasons under Coach Rueck (Ana Marchbanks, 8 in 2012 & Janessa Thropay, 8 in 2018) and the only one to do so twice (vs. Seattle, 1/10/26)

**YOU'RE CALLING THE REJECTION HOTLINE**

Oregon State's #1 rule on defense is No Layups and a talented quartet of rim protectors are enforcing that rule. The Beavers are one of two teams nationally with four players who have at least 19 blocks this season (Kennedie Shuler, Néné Sow, Lizzy Williamson and Lara Alonso-Basurto) and they rank 36th nationally with 4.7 blocks per game.

**EVERYBODY CRASHES THE GLASS**

Oregon State's +6.9 rebounding margin (37th nationally) is a team effort. The Beavers are 1 of 5 teams nationally who have five players (Tiara Bolden, Nene Sow, Jenna Villa, Kennedie Shuler and Lizzy Williamson) averaging at least 4.7 rebounds/game.

**CLEAN DEFENSE**

One of the tenants of a Scott Rueck-coached team is defending without fouling. Over the last 10 seasons, the Beavers are the second-most whistle-averse team in the nation. Only UConn does a better job at defending without fouling.

## NO CHARITY

As in year's past, Oregon State's clean defense meant opposing teams rarely make it to the charity stripe. The Beavers allow the fewest opponent free throw attempts per game in the WCC and 3rd-fewest in the nation this season at 10.0. OSU's opponents are shooting four fewer free throws per game than their next-closest conference foe (SMC, 14.2). For context, the gap between OSU and #2 is larger than the gap between #2 and last (3.7 FTA/game between Saint Mary's and Portland,).

## OWNING THE BOARDS

Oregon State has been one of the top rebounding teams in the country over the last ten seasons. The Beavs have a rebounding margin of +8.1 during that time, which ranks ninth nationally. In five of those seasons, OSU ranked top-10 in the country in rebounding margin while finishing in the top-25 twice more (#23 last season at +7.1)

## GET HER TO THE LINE

Jenna Villa emerged as Scott Rueck's go-to free-throw shooter in crunch time at the Maui Classic. Rueck drew up several plays to get Villa the ball in obvious fouling situations and she converted 7-of-8 free throws to seal the wins. On the year, Villa is making 88.1 percent of her freebies, 2nd in the league and 27th in the nation.

## NEW ELEMENTS IN THE LAB

Lara Alonso-Basurto made history just two games into her collegiate career by becoming the first Oregon State player to record back-to-back double-doubles in her first two college games. In the same weekend, LAB led the Beavs against Corban with 14 points and 11 rebounds and posted 12 rebounds and 11 points against Air Force.

## A MILE IN HER SHOES

It's going to take the whole squad to fill Catarina Ferreira's shoes after a season-ending injury. Her direct minutes have been absorbed by Villa, Lindemans and Alonso at the 4, but only a team effort can account for her impact. The senior had 8 double-doubles to lead returning conference players, shot 79.2 percent from the free throw line and recorded 64 offensive rebounds (4th in the WCC)

## BOLD(EN) ON THE BOARDS

In addition to elite speed and work ethic, Tiara Bolden makes an extra impact on the boards with 5.1 per game to open the season. Bolden pulled down 5+ rebounds 13 times last season and has already done so 14 times this season.

## YOU REAP WHAT YOU SOW

Néné Sow's per-game numbers may not jump off the page, but her single-game performances showcase her ability to make a major impact thanks to the senior's effort and size. The 6th-year senior is one of seven WCC players with multiple 12+ rebound games after pulling down 12 boards in one half (plus overtime) against Arizona State.

## AGE IS JUST A NUMBER

Due to a mix of injuries, redshirts, covid years and Pavia waivers, three Beavers will be in at least their sixth season of college basketball this year: Catarina Ferreira (6th), Néné Sow (6th) and Lizzy Williamson (7th).



Tiara Bolden (Eugene, Ore. | Churchill HS) is one of three Beaver State products on this year's OSU team. She's joined by two Portland-area guards in Kennedy Shuler (Gresham, Ore. | Sam Barlow HS) and Ally Schimel (Corbett, Ore. | Corbett HS). All three have started every game this season.

## NOTES

### AUSSIE! AUSSIE! AUSSIE!

After successfully developing Aussies like Kelsey Rees and Jasmine Simmons into key contributors, the Beavs added three players from Down Under to this year's roster. Super senior Lizzy Williamson transferred in from NC State while Keira Lindemans and Katie Field joined Oregon State as freshmen. Lindemans and Field made an impression on OSU staff while beating strong American AAU competition in the Phoenix Nike Tournament of Champions together with ATC Academy.

### ¡VAMOS ESPAÑA!

Lara Alonso, Cloe Vecina and Lucia Navarro make up the Spanish trio on Oregon State's roster. The latter duo were the first Spanish players at OSU under Scott Rueck. Navarro and Alonso played together during tryouts for the U20 Spanish EuroBasket team this summer.

### VOICE OF THE BEAVS

Voice of the Beavers Ron Callan has called 573 Oregon State women's basketball games since joining the program in the 2007-08 season, holding a record of 355-218 during that span. Ron called his 500th game of OSU women's basketball against Utah in 2024, a 91-66 victory. Callan will have his work cut out for him on senior day. As part of a decade-long tradition, he sings the national anthem for all international student-athletes on their senior day. This year, he has three to sing: Colombia (Susana Yepes), Australia (Lizzy Williamson), and Belgium (Néné Sow).

### THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT

Oregon State's future is looking up on the court. The Beavers announced four signees on National Signing Day 2025, all four coming from the United States. Three were all-state selections in Oregon, Washington and New York. The Oregon 5A Player of the Year and the state's top prospect per Prep Girls Hoops and ESPN (#83 nationally) Taylor Young and New York Class B Player of the Year Maggie Warpus highlight the class' honors.

### PRO BEAVS

Development in the Oregon State program helped several former players earn spots on pro teams all over the world. Numbers fluctuate as seasons start and end, but OSU has 10 alumni playing professionally. Notable performances include Kat Tudor earning a spot on the WBBL Team of the Year and Mikayla Pivec earning NBL1 East First-Team honors. Tudor and Tea Adams also led the Caledonia Gladiators to their first Super League Basketball Final with a 68-62 win over the Sheffield Hatters. Marie Gulich (Germany) and Ali Gibson (Puerto Rico) each represented their countries at the most-recent Olympics.

## // HEAD COACH SCOTT RUECK (16TH SEASON)



It was a homecoming of sorts for OSU alumnus Scott Rueck, who was named the fifth head coach in the history of the Oregon State women's basketball program on June 30, 2010.

Rueck has been the architect of an accelerated turnaround of the women's basketball program at Oregon State, bringing the team onto the national stage.

Rueck has led the Beavers to nine NCAA Tournaments, including the 2024 event where he took a team picked 10th in the Pac-12 preseason poll to the Elite 8. OSU was also poised to earn a top-4 seed prior to the cancellation of the 2019-20 Tournament due to COVID-19. Oregon State won three-straight Pac-12 titles from 2015-17, and has made five Sweet-16's, three Elite Eight's and a Final Four.

The two-time OSU graduate entered the Oregon State Hall of Fame for the first time with his 2016 Final Four Team on November 10, 2023. Rueck led the Beavers to a sweep of the Pac-12 regular season and conference titles in addition to the Final Four.

The now-15th-year coach has led the Beavers to 49 wins over AP Top 25 programs during his time at Oregon State, including 16 over top-10 teams. Squaring off against some of the best players in the nation, the Beavers have often at least held their own. OSU went 4-4 against Oregon during Sabrina Ionescu's time in Eugene and recorded an 7-1 mark against Washington while Pac-12 all-time leading scorer Kelsey Plum played for the Huskies.

Oregon State also developed its own superstars under Rueck. Five players earned All-America honors in six years between 2015-2020. Jamie Weisner and Ruth Hamblin won back-to-back Pac-12 Player of the Year honors in 2015-16 and Hamblin, Gabby Hansen and Marie Gulich won Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year in four straight seasons between 2015-18. Sydney Weise was another of the All-Americans and also won the Senior Class Award in 2017 after earning All-Pac-12 recognition for four straight seasons.
