The Braves' soccer program received votes in the NAIA Coaches Top-25 for the first time since 1971. The 1971 men's soccer team was the most successful in program history, finishing with a 16-2-1 record en route to a third-place finish in the NAIA National Tournament. It was the last time Ottawa qualified for NAIA Nationals.

The 2022 squad has jumped out to their best season start since 2012, boasting a 10-2-3 record and remaining unbeaten in KCAC play through nine games. Three games are left in the regular season before seedings are determined for the KCAC tournament.

Ottawa's potent offense has been a catalyst all season, ranking 25th in the NAIA with 41 goals scored on the season. Bence Molnar has scored 13 goals while Slobodan Novicevic has 12 goals, both ranking in top-5 for goals scored in the KCAC.

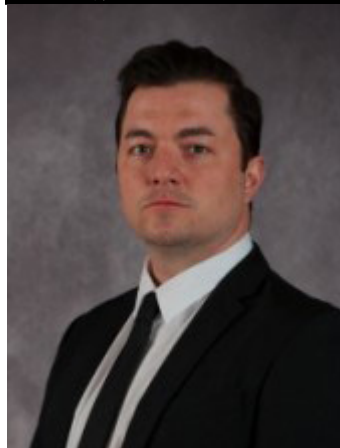
With the depth and quality on offense, fifth year senior Jonathan Rawayo comes in frequently as a super sub. The combination of Zac Wilson and Filippo Della Pasqua at center back has been solid, while outside backs Owain Parker and Martin Basso have shown willingness to join the attack with two assists so far this season. Captain Jack Hatswell does his thing at central midfield, dictating much of the play for the Braves. Gage Powers has been strong as the Braves last line of defense, leading the KCAC with 73 saves and is fifth with a 76% save percentage.

Southwestern has had a difficult start to KCAC play by not winning a conference game so far this season, but the Mound Builders have played teams tough and kept their games close. They had a tough matchup in a 4-0 loss to No. 20 Oklahoma Wesleyan in their last game but had a 2-2 draw against McPherson in the game prior. Southwestern also had a 1-1 tie early in the season against York, the same result as the Braves 1-1 draw against the Panthers on Oct. 5th.

Ottawa owns a 11-4-2 record in the series history against Southwestern, but the Mound Builders have won three straight dating back to 2019. Southwestern took a 3-2 win over Ottawa last year at AdventHealth Field, a game in which Bence Molnar scored two goals.

Up Next: Assuming the Braves get past Southwestern, the last two matches of the season against McPherson and Oklahoma Wesleyan will have major KCAC Tournament seeding implications.

JAMES COTTAGE - HEAD COACH

FIRST SEASON

James Cottage enters his first year as the head coach of the men's soccer program at Ottawa University.

Cottage comes to Ottawa from familiar Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference foe Bethel College, completing his fourth season at the helm for the Threshers in 2021. During his tenure, Cottage coached eight All-KCAC athletes while improvements were made each year including reaching the KCAC playoffs each of the last two seasons. In 2021, the Threshers recorded their highest win total in over a decade while stringing together five straight wins along the way.

Prior to Bethel, Cottage was an assistant at NCAA Division II California State University - Monterey Bay for one season before becoming a volunteer assistant coach for the University of Oklahoma women's soccer team under head coach Matt Potter.

Cottage has spent most of his playing and coaching career in the Sooner State. He took over as the head coach of his alma mater Southwestern Christian University in Bethany, Okla. shortly after the 2014 season, coaching for two seasons. In 2016, SCU finished the season 15-5-5 and went onto win the National Christian College Athletic Association National Tournament, with Cottage being named NCCAA Coach of the Year. Four players were placed on the All-Tournament Team, while Cottage led Chad Dennis to winning Player of the Tournament and NCCAA National Player of the Year.

A native of Thrapston, England, Cottage moved to the United States in 2007 and attended the University of Science and Arts in Chickasha, Oklahoma. After his sophomore year, he transferred to SCU.

Captaining the Eagles in the midfield during the 2009 season, Cottage led SCU to a 16-5 season that saw his team finish as ACCA National Champions and NCCAA Southwest Regional Champions. In 2010, Cottage led the Eagles as captain again during his senior year, scoring eight goals and adding three assists on the way to a 20-3 record.

Cottage graduated from SCU in 2010 with a degree in sport management, and immediately took a position as an assistant soccer coach at SCU. He received a master's degree in Sport Administration in 2018 from East Central University.



CAIN SCOTT - GRADUATE ASSISTANT

SECOND SEASON

Coach Scott is in his second year as a graduate assistant with the Ottawa men's soccer program.

Scott was a four-year letterman on the Braves soccer program and served as a captain for two seasons. As a forward, he scored 13 goals, including a team-high six as a senior, and 12 assists. He had six game-winning goals, four of which happened in his final season. Over his four years, Scott took 81 shots, putting 43 (53.1 percent) of them on frame. He was a 2019 KCAC Scholar Athlete and an NAIA Daktronics Scholar-Athlete.

Scott played two years semi-professionally, from 2017-2019, for Kaw Valley FC, the USL League Two club who play in the Heartland Division of the Central Conference.

He also worked as a volunteer coach for Sporting Kaw Valley. Scott coached youth teams and assisted with the high school team, providing training, encouragement, and helping prepare the players for their weekly games.

Scott graduated from OU in May of 2021 with a degree in secondary education and is pursuing a Master of Arts in Education degree with a concentration in educational leadership at Ottawa University.



JOVANA IVANOVIC

GRADUATE ASSISTANT - GK COACH

SECOND SEASON

Coach Ivanovic is in her second year as a graduate assistant coach with the men's and women's soccer programs. she specializes as a goalkeeper coach for the two programs.

She was a four-year letterman at Lindsey Wilson College where she was a part of four Mid-South Conference Tournament championship teams and three regular season championships. As a goalkeeper, she appeared in 46 games, earning 40 starts. Over her career, she made 180 saves, recording a .837 save percentage. She also earned 16 shutouts. Her junior season, she recorded 58 saves, seventh all-time for a single season at Lindsey Wilson College.

She is a two-time All-Conference Second Team selection, a two-time Daktronics NAIA Women's Scholar-Athlete honoree, a 2019 NAIA Champion of Character and made Academic All-Conference three times.

From 2014-16 she served as goalkeeper on the Serbian National Team in UEFA Women's Championship League.

While at Lindsey Wilson College, Ivanovic served as secretary for the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee to help improve athletic participation in local community service and college athletics. She also helped volunteered with Adair County Youth Soccer's Little Kickers program in Columbia, Ky, teaching children and youth fundamentals, safety and regulations and creating curriculum based on each child's age, skill and abilities.

In addition, she volunteered with Youth Soccer Outreach to help teach soccer fundamentals in areas where no AYSO program was available. She created lessons to reinforce the five core values (Integrity, Respect, Responsibility, Sportsmanship and Servant Leadership) as part of the NAIA National Volunteer Program.

Ivanovic graduated with a double major in general psychology and general communication in May of 2020 from Lindsey Wilson College. She was a member of the Lambda Pi Eta honor society of the National Communication Association and earned Outstanding Graduate in Psychology for Achievement and Purpose.



LUKE COTTAGE - GRADUATE ASSISTANT

FIRST SEASON

Luke Cottage, a native of Thrapston England, begins his first year as Assistant Coach at Ottawa. Cottage graduated from Southwestern Christian University with a Sports Management degree, where he played soccer for four years and became a graduate assistant.

After Graduating, Cottage progressed in his coaching career by working in Canada with Leicester City FC, and then in the United States, Australia with ASA Academy and China with Stoke City FC.

He then moved back to the US to continue coaching at Bethel College and the first year brought great success. The Threshers had one of the most successful seasons to date with the most conference wins and reaching the conference playoffs for the first time in 12 years.

Cottage has worked in club and high school soccer in Oklahoma and across the globe, he is currently working with a local club in Olathe, Toca FC where he has two junior academy teams, and two academy teams.

When asked what coach Luke likes the most about working with Soccer, he responded "there is a great sense of community across the whole organization with everyone working together to achieve the same goal, student success. Of course, I love working with the team and seeing the amazing cultural diversity but to see the success off the field as well as on the field is just as rewarding".

LAST TIME OUT FOR OTTAWA D, 1-1 vs. Friends 10/15/22

OTTAWA, Kan. – Zac Wilson’s equalizer in the 86th minute helped the Ottawa University men’s soccer team draw level late in regulation, finishing in a 1-1 tie against the Friend Falcons on Saturday afternoon at AdventHealth Field.

Down 1-0 and with just a few minutes left, Wilson’s goal to tie the game in the 86th minute was one of pure hustle and determination. It all started with Francisco Arrua earning the Braves a free kick in the midfield. Jack Hatswell took the free kick, sending the ball about 40 yards into the box. Wilson’s initial header went straight up into the air, but he was able to track the ball and get up for a second header that found the back of the net.

The Braves played majority of the second half down one goal, following a penalty kick awarded to Friends in the 46th minute. Juan Zamora stepped up to the penalty spot and converted to put the Falcons up 1-0.

Both teams had several chances in the first half but were missing that missing touch of quality in the final third. The Braves had a hard time hitting frame in the first half, with only shot on goal that forced a save from Falcons’ keeper Felipe Garcia. A solid performance from OU goal-keeper Gage Powers allowed the Braves to hang around and eventually tie the game, with Powers making 10 saves in the contest.
