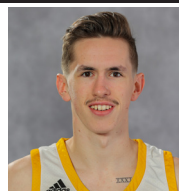

Game Information

- The Braves are 58-58 in known season openers since 1901. Ottawa has a record of 59-57 in home openers.
- Ottawa is 5-3 in home openers and season openers under head coach Aaron Siebenthall.
- Seven varsity returners from 2021-22 are suiting up for the Braves Booster Classic. They are Ian Moore, Tristen Hull, Ty Bland, Ryan Torrey, Gavin Hooper, Elijah Mason, and Tyler Trogstad. Jaxon Pope was a member of the OU junior varsity program last season but has made the move to the varsity roster.
- The Braves have seven newcomers suiting up on Friday and Saturday. They are Dondre Buggage, Ricardo Zambrano, Chamaje Barideaux, Cody Fredrickson, Kamren Woods, Amil Fields, and Curtis Scott. Scott is the lone freshman on the roster. He is from Adelaide, Australia.
- Ottawa was picked by both the conference coaches and media to finish fifth in the KCAC at the annual KCAC Media Day. OU received 98 points from the coaches and 166 points from the media.
- OU is looking for its fifth straight winning season. The Braves won a school record 28 games in 2019-20 along with a KCAC Championship and had a record of 21-11 in 2021-22 to have two 20 win seasons in the last three years.
- The last time OU had four straight winning seasons was under head coach Bill Frear from 1956-57 to 1959-60. 1956-57 (12-12), 1957-58 (19-6), 1958-59 (17-8), 1959-60 (17-8). The longest streak is eight seasons from 1945-46 to 1952-53.
- Ottawa University and Kansas Christian College have met three times with OU leading the series, 3-0. The Braves won the last meeting between the two teams on Nov. 3, 2021 in Wilson Field House, 99-69. Saturday's game against Haskell Indian Nations University is the 63rd meeting between the two teams. Ottawa leads the series 48-14 and is on a four game winning streak against the Indians. OU won the match up last season in Wilson Field House on Oct. 28, 2021, 99-62.
- Kansas Christian College is 1-0 to start the season and enters Friday night's game coming off a 107-98 loss to MidAmerica Christian University in an exhibition game. The Falcons shot 43.7 percent from the floor, 31.6 percent from behind the 3-pt line, and 66.7 percent from the free throw line.
- In the loss to MACU, Kansas Christian was led in scoring by Jamal Clark with 40 points on 15-for-25 shooting from the floor. He also led the team in rebounding with nine. Jahreese Jordan led the team in assists with four and steals with three.
- Haskell Indian Nations University is 0-1 to open the 2022-23 season after falling in its season opener to Baptist Bible College on Thursday night in Lawrence. The Indians shot 42.1 percent from the floor, 31.3 percent from behind the 3-pt line, and 71.4 percent from the free throw line. Ta'te Bear led HINU with 24 points and Bansi King finished with 21 points. Ira Blackbear had a team high five rebounds while Bryan Strom came off the bench to lead the team in assists with eight.

AARON SIEBENTHALL

Siebenthall is in his eighth season as head coach after spending nine years as an assistant in the OU men's basketball program.

In his previous seven seasons Siebenthall has a record of 125-87. Under his leadership, the Braves won the 2019-20 KCAC Championship, qualified for the final NAIA Men's Basketball Division II National Tournament, and earned a trip to the 'Round of 16'. He has coached three NAIA All-Americans, one KCAC Player of the Year, 26 All-KCAC performers and four All-

KCAC Defensive Team selections. The men's basketball team has been named the KCAC Men's Basketball Team of Character twice, he has had one CoSIDA Academic All-District, 10 Daktronic Scholar Athletes and three NAIA Scholar Teams.

The 2021-22 Braves finished the season with an overall record of 21-11 and a fourth place finish in the KCAC with a mark of 16-8. Under Siebenthall's leadership, three Braves were named to the All-KCAC Teams. Andre Jackson was a Second Team selection, Joe Johnson III earned Third Team honors, and Tristen Hull was named Honorable Mention All-KCAC. OU was ranked 21st in the NAIA in total points (2,669), 11th in points per game (83.4), 22nd in field goals made per game (30.3), 31st in field goal percentage (.480), 45th in 3-pt field goals made per game (8.6), 31st in free throws made per game (14), 30th in defensive rebounds per game (28.7), 19th in steals per game (8.8), and 45th in blocks per game (3.4).

In an uncertain 2020-21 season, Siebenthall led the Braves to an overall record of 17-9, record of 11-8 to finish third in the KCAC, and to the KCAC Tournament Semifinals. Jaquan Daniels was named Third Team NAIA All-American. Daniels earned First Team All-KCAC honors and was named to the All-KCAC Defensive Team. Perry Carroll earned KCAC Newcomer of the Year and was a Second Team All-KCAC selection. Ian Moore and Andre Jackson were selected Honorable Mention All-KCAC. Under Siebenthall's leadership, the Braves finished the season ranked sixth in the NAIA in 3-pt field goals made per game (11.1), seventh in total steals (239), eighth in scoring offense per game (90.1), ninth in total 3-pt field goals made (291), 14th in total assists (453), 15th in steals per game (9.1), 16th in assists per game (17.4), 17th in total scoring offense (2,342), 26th in defensive rebounds per game (29.9), 29th in total offensive rebounds (1,016), 44th in assist/turnover ratio (1.15), 45th in field goal percentage (.476), 49th in scoring margin (7.1), 49th in total rebounds per game (39.1), and 50th in 3-pt field goal percentage (.366). The 2020-21 Braves set a new OU single season scoring average (90.1) and set a new single game steals (19) mark. The Braves were in the top 10 in the OU record book in 10 single season categories and five single game categories.

Siebenthall led the 2019-20 Braves to the program's 23 conference championship, a school record 28 overall wins and 19 KCAC victories, a trip NAIA Men's Basketball Division II National Tournament, and a 'Round of 16' appearance. Ottawa had three players earn All-KCAC honors with Darryl Bowie being named KCAC Player of the Year. Jaquan Daniels earned Second Team All-KCAC honors and was named to the KCAC Defensive Team and Ryan Haskins was named Honorable Mention All-KCAC. Because of OU's efforts on the court, Siebenthall was named KCAC Coach of the Year and KBCA Men's Basketball Four Year Coach of the Year. The Braves finished the season ranked fourth in NAIA Division II in total scoring (2908), fifth in total assists (568), sixth in total 3-pt field goals made (351), seventh in scoring offense per game (88.1), ninth in assists per game (17.2), 13th in defensive rebounds per game (29.9), 13th in 3-pt field goals made per game (10.6), 13th in total steals (270), 14th in defensive field goal percentage (.414), 16th in field goal percentage (.486), 17th in free throw percentage (.750), 17th in scoring margin (10.03), 18th in defensive 3-pt field goal percentage (.326), 19th in assist/turnover ratio (1.3), 23rd in steals per game (8.1), 23rd in total offensive rebounds (1267), 25th in 3-pt field goal percentage (.380), 47th in turnover margin (0.8), 47th in total blocks (90), and 48th in total rebounds per game (38.3).

Under Siebenthall's leadership, the Braves finished with an overall record of 19-13 and a fifth place finish in the KCAC with a record of 15-9. Ottawa had three players earn All-KCAC honors. Isaiah Palmer was named First Team and Tasmania Indiana Jones and Ryan Haskins earned Honorable Mention honors. The Braves were ranked 16th in NAIA Division II in total offensive rebounds (1,262), 18th in total points scored (2,710), 18th in total blocks (109), 24th in blocks per game (3.4), 26th in total assists (500), 31st in scoring offense per game (84.6), 32nd in total rebounds per game (39.4), 37th in defensive rebounds per game (28.5), 40th in free throw percentage (.733), 41st in assists per game

(15.6), 48th in field goal percentage (.464), 49th in total rebound margin (1.9), and 50th in offensive rebounds per game (10.9).

The 2017-18 Braves finished the season with an overall record 12-16 and a KCAC record of 11-11. OU had four Braves earn All-KCAC honors, Isaiah Palmer (2nd), Titus Rice (3rd), Hollis Mitchell (HM), and Tasmania Indaiana Jones (HM). Ottawa finished the season ranked seventh in the NAIA in offensive rebounds per game (13.7), 12th in total rebounds per game (41.7), 37th in total rebound margin (4.2), 34th in free throw percentage (.729), 35th in defensive field goal percentage (.436), 36th in defensive rebounds per game (27.9), and 40th in total offensive rebounds (1,168).

Under Siebenthal's leadership the 2016-17 Braves finished with an overall record of 14-17 and a record of 11-11 in the KCAC. The Braves had three players earn All-KCAC honors with Logan Bullinger, Titus Rice, and Hollis Mitchell being named to the teams. OU moved on to the second round of the KCAC Tournament, defeating the University of Saint Mary. It was OU's first win in Leavenworth since Feb. 23, 2010. The Braves also excelled off the court. OU was named the KCAC Team of Character for its work in the community for the second time in three years. Three Braves were also named Daktronic Scholar Athletes and Logan Bullinger became the first OU men's basketball player to be named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District 3 First Team. The Braves finished the year ranked 16th in NAIA Division II in defensive rebounds per game (29.3), 19th in defensive field goal percentage (.425), 30th in total steals (229), 34th in blocks per game (3.3), 35th in steals per game (7.3), 36th in total blocks (104), 41st in assists per game (15), 42nd in total assists (468), 44th in free throw percentage (.719), and 49th in total offensive rebounds (1,164).

In Siebenthal's first season at the helm 2015-16 Braves finished with an overall record of 14-16 and a fourth place finish in the KCAC with a record of 10-10. Under his leadership OU had three players named to the All-KCAC teams with Preston Oakes being named Second Team, Mar-shon Norfleet earning Third Team honors, and Alex Hasty being named to the KCAC All-Defensive Team. The Braves excelled in the classroom and had the most student-athletes named Daktronic Scholar Athletes in NAIA Division II. As a team the Braves finished ranked 16th in NAIA Division II in defensive rebounds per game (29.1), 30th in free throw percentage (.728), 33rd in defensive field goal percentage (.425), 36th in total rebounds per game (39.8), 40th in defensive 3-pt field goal percentage (.336), and 47th in scoring offense per game (80.3).

In his role as associate head coach on former head coach Andy Carrier's staff, Siebenthal developed a reputation as an exceptional recruiter, having served as the Recruiting Coordinator for the men's team all nine years of his tenure. During that time, he developed relationships with an extensive network of coaches at the high school, junior college and college levels across the country, which has extended the quality and quantity of the recruiting pool from which OU has drawn. He also managed many of the operational aspects of the men's program and is known as a topflight organizer in addition to his coaching acumen.

The Carrier-Siebenthal era produced two NAIA Division II National Tournaments, one KCAC Championship, and one KCAC Tournament Championship. The duo also led the Braves to a school single season record of 24 wins in 2007-08 and back-to-back 'Sweet 16' appearances in the NAIA National Tournament. In addition, Siebenthal has been instrumental in coaching 18 Daktronic Scholar Athletes, including the most in the country for an NAIA school in 2008; four NAIA All-Americans; seven First Team All-KCAC Players; one Second Team All-KCAC Player; one Third Team All-KCAC Player, three All-Freshmen Team Players; three Defensive Team Players; and one KCAC Player of the Year.

Siebenthal began his career at the University of Kansas as a women's basketball practice player. He simultaneously served as the Head Basketball Coach for the Kansas Kings AAU youth league. In 2000, he transitioned to Lawrence High School as the Assistant Boys' Basketball Coach and Head JV Coach, where he further developed his coaching style and philosophy before coming to Ottawa in 2006. With a Master of Arts in Education, Siebenthal also teaches in the University's School of Education as an Assistant Professor and is highly prized by his students and his dean as a teacher.

Siebenthal and his wife Shayla have two daughters, Berkley and Elle.
