Outlook

After taking third place for the first time ever at the ECAC Conference Championships a year ago, the Temple Women's Gymnastics team is raising the bar even higher for this season. Returning 11 letterwinners from last season's squad, reigning ECAC Coach of the Year Aaron Murphy has lofty expectations for his squad to make a run at the conference crown.

"Between the coaching staff and myself, our

expectations are definitely to equal what we accomplished last year," commented Murphy. "To take first or second for the first time would be incredible, especially being that we are hosting the ECAC conference championship."

The Owls look to build off of last season's success at the ECAC's, and advance even further in postseason competition.

"Above and beyond the ECAC's, it is a must that we qualify for USAG Nationals as a team," said Murphy. "I think this team, believe it or not, is stronger than last year's squad."

Captains of the 2009-10 squad are juniors Kathryn Ho and Marissa Oxenford. A responsibility normally reserved for sen-

iors, Coach Murphy is confident the duo has what it takes to help the team accomplish its goals.

"In the past the captains have been seniors, but they are doing equally as good a job," commented Murphy. "I am looking for them to show leadership qualities, and to make sure they are always in the gym leading by example. Never leading with a bad attitude and setting the tone for the team are two qualities they constantly show."

Nina Oteri and Danielle Viens comprise the senior class. Each have contributed significantly in their four years with the Cherry and White, and are expected to provide consistency through the year.

"I definitely expect Danielle to be a contributor on the uneven bars, and Nina to compete on the floor and beam," said Murphy. "I anticipate both of them to be consistent through their last year, and bring out big scores for our squad."

In the junior class, first team USAG All-American Katie Canning returns after completing one of the most successful seasons in Temple women's gymnastics history. Canning captured the title in the all-around and the vault at the USAG Championships, and tied for second on the floor.

"Katie was obviously a star last year, and if she could match that or somehow do even better, I'll accept it. I will be thrilled if she could do the same performance as last year," said Murphy.

Along with Canning, the Owls expect junior Chelsea

Troutman to rebound from two injury riddled seasons. An all-arounder, Troutman has made strides in her training and will be a solid competitor for the Owls. Also expected to compete from the junior class is Chelsea Lapent.

Returning from the sophomore class are Kaity Watson, Corrine Williams, Alexa Ahrem and Alexandra Uscatu. Watson had a stellar freshman debut, coming on strong towards the end of the season earning first team

USAG All-America honors in the vault, and second team in the all-around.

"Kaity competed under pressure and did well," commented Murphy. "She is a huge vaulter for us, and has the capabilities to anchor our vault team this year. Corrine brings an amazing amount of gracefulness to the floor and beam, and is really an eyecatcher for the crowd."

Williams grabbed second team USAG All-America honors in the floor, and looks to improve her 10th-place individual finish this year. Ahrem and Uscatu will also look to be contributors to the squad.

As far as the newcomers, Murphy and his staff are very excited about the talented group they have recruited this season. Jean Alban,

Brittany Clark, Ebone Grant, Avery Iudice, Natalie Kahler, Kirstie Viens and Margaret Walch complete a very capable group that is expected to make an immediate impact.

Despite injuries to Grant and Kahler, the Owls still expect the other freshmen to be able to contribute. "I am expecting a lot from Brittany, as she is an all-around competitor," said Murphy. "Jean was brought up in the same gym as Katie Canning, so she has a very competitive mindset. Avery and Margaret are both very stylish gymnasts, and will definitely contribute on several exercises."

The Temple women's gymnastics team opens the season with a trip south to Maryland, and competes that same weekend in the George Washington Invitational. Road meets with Ursinus, Rutgers, West Chester and Penn are several of the exciting match-ups this year.

"To start the season, we are going to compete on a Friday night and then on a Sunday, so right from the beginning I want to go out and make a statement that we are here to compete. We want to challenge Towson every time we go up against them to give them a run for their money," commented Murphy.

The Owls have their sights set on the ECAC title, and do battle with reigning conference champion Towson a total of five times before hosting the ECAC Conference Championships in McGonigle Hall on March 27th.









Aaron Murphy

Head Coach - 4th Season

Aaron Murphy is entering his fourth season as head coach of the Temple women's gymnastics team.

In 2009, Murphy was recognized as ECAC Division I Coach of the Year, leading his team to a school-best third place finish at the

ECAC Conference Championships. During that run, he also led the team to breaking the all-time team record, a mark that stood for six years. The Owls posted a team score of 192.625 against Cornell on March 15, 2009.

Prior to being named head coach, Murphy was the assistant coach for four years at Temple. The 2001 Temple graduate was named the USA Collegiate Assistant Gymnastics Coach of the Year in 2004.

In his four years as an assistant at Temple, Murphy was responsible for spotting all four events while constructing the strength and conditioning program. Under his guidance, the program celebrated eight USAG All-American honorees and several new school records.

Prior to his experience with the women's gymnastics program, Murphy spent the 2001-02 season as an assistant with the Temple men's program under head coach Fred Turoff. While responsible for spotting all skill events for safety purposes, he was integral in assisting the men's team to an ECAC Conference Championship and national recognition.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Murphy was the Public Gymnastics Clinic Director at Temple from 2001-03. In coaching all ages and skill levels, he utilized his several years of experience in supervising, coordinating and working hands-on with inner-city children participating in gymnastics.

A four-year letterwinner at Temple, Murphy served as a team captain his senior season (2000-01). His career as a performer, and 2001 U.S. Championship participant, is headlined with several honors including the 2001 Bill Braverman Award Recipient for Excellence and the 2001 Most Consistent Gymnast Award.

Murphy, born in Barberton, Ohio, currently resides in Philadelphia.

Caitlin Council, a former student assistant coach at Towson University, is entering her third season as assistant women's gymnastics coach at Temple University. Council will assist Murphy in all aspects of

coaching including recruiting, travel and fundraising.

As a former gymnast and coach, she has been involved in all aspects of competing in women's gymnastics, and has several years of coaching experience. In her collegiate career, she was a walk-on gymnast at Towson University earning a bachelor's degree in Physical Education.

Coach Council comes from a long background of coaching gymnastics, starting with recreational classes at Barlow's gymnastics and slowly making her way to coaching the competitive team. In addition to coaching at Barlow's, she also has coached at Woodward Gymnastics Camp for the last six summers.

Last season, she coached the Temple Owls balance beam team to become the number one beam team in the ECAC conference, topping her alma mater Towson University. With three years solidified as a Temple Owl, Council is looking towards winning the ECAC championships and competing against her former school.

Year In Review

Heading into the 2008-09 season, the Temple women's gymnastics team had its sights set on achieving goals that had never before been accomplished. Third-year head Coach Aaron Murphy was the first to verbalize these goals when he stated, "Our first goal is to finish top three in the conference."

Returning 12 key contributors from the previous year's squad, along with the addition of one of the strongest freshman classes in the history of the program, the Cherry and White knew that their goals were within grasp.

The team was tested early on in its first meet of the season when it traveled to the George Washington Invitational to take on some of the top teams in the region. Highlighting the team's fourth place finish was a stellar performance by freshman Corrine Williams on the balance beam where she came away with a second place finish in the first meet of her career. Sophomore Katie Canning also put forth a strong showing when she finished third in the all-around and fourth on vault and floor exercise (38.200). Sophomore Chelsea Troutman took fourth in the all-around (38.000). If the individual performances weren't enough, the Owls were also able to out-perform a William & Mary squad that finished ahead of them at the ECAC Championships the prior season.

Canning was named the ECAC Gymnast of the Week and Troutman was awarded the ECAC Coaches' Choice Award for their strong performances at George Washington.

Up next for the Owls was another road meet, this time at Ursinus. Canning was impressive again as she tied for first in the vault, balance beam, and all-around. Senior Natasha Crawford helped the Cherry and White go one-two in the all-around as she took second with a strong showing. As a team, Temple finished just behind regional power Towson to take second.

In its first home meet of the son, the Owls continued to prove that

they could hang with the competition as they were once more narrowly edged by Towson, 192.275-191.375, and topped both Bridgeport and Rutgers. Canning was the star once again, finishing first on floor exercise (9.85), tied for first on vault (9.725) and third in the allaround (38.500).

Ten days later the Owls hosted the Liberty Classic. This time the Cherry and White would not be denied the top spot as it beat four other squads to earn top honors at the meet. It was the final home meet for seniors Natasha Crawford, Winter Sneed, Christine McNeill, Debra DiPrima, and Nikki Berrian. In the uneven bars. Berrian scored a 9.725. Crawford ended her brilliant career at McGonigle Hall by finishing second in the all-around with a 38.050. Sneed also highlighted the event with a careerhigh 9.850 in the floor exercise.

After a loss at West Virginia in a dual meet, the Temple women's gymnastics made its first ever trip to the state of Alaska for a pair of meets at Alaska-Anchorage. In the first meet, the Owls were narrowly edged 190.75-189.650. Corrine Williams continued her strong freshman campaign with second place finishes on vault and beam and a third place finish on the floor. In the second meet vs. Alaska-Anchorage, the Owls were again defeated by a small margin. Canning took first in the all-around and Williams improved in her performance on the balance beam to take first with a 9.775.

Upon returning to the East Coast, the Owls traveled to SCSU for a tri-meet where the team would take first place behind a few stellar The senior duo of performances. Crawford and Berrian went one-two in the uneven bars. Crawford also took first place in the all-around for the first time on the season. Canning took first in vault with a 9.7.

Following a tough trip to Maryland which saw the Cherry and White finish third, the squad headed to Cornell for one of the most important ECAC meets Undeterred by the of the season. pressure, the Owls came out and established a new program record for points in a match with 192.625. Unfortunately it was not quite enough to overcome Cornell's slightly more impressive score of 193.400. Canning continued her successful season as she set a new career mark in the all-around with her first place finish. Freshman Kaity Watson took first place in vault and finished with 38.275 in all-around.

The week before ECAC Championships, the Owls swept the weekly awards as Canning was named Gymnast of the Week, Watson earned Rookie of the Week, and Berrian was named Specialist of the Week.

With the goal of finishing in the top three in the ECAC still the main focus, the team accomplished exactly what it had set out to do in the beginning of the season and finished third. It was the highest finish in the history of the program. Canning cemented her dominance on the season as she took first on the balance beam. As a team the Owls also claimed the top spot in balance beam. Sneed took second in the floor exercise with vet another strong performance. Watson earned top honors for the Cherry and White in all-around with her third place finish.

In the final meet of the season at the Championships, Canning wrapped up one of the most dominant seasons in TU women's gymnastics history with a first place finish in allaround and vault to go with a second place finish in floor exercise. Watson joined Canning in the vault and claimed third.

In post season honors, head coach Aaron Murphy took home ECAC Coach of the Year for guiding his team to its best finish in program history. Berrian joined in on the honors as she was named the ECAC Specialist of the Year for her consistency on the uneven
