

### 2010 Outlook

Keeping the momentum going has been key for the Temple women's gymnastics program. Already a force to be reckoned with in the conference, the Owls proved yet again last year they are one of the top teams in the ECAC. This season, fifth-year head coach Aaron Murphy has his squad set on bringing home their first ever conference title, along with advancing further in the USAG Nationals.

"Between the team and the coaching staff, we have our minds set on something higher than third place," said Murphy. "Second place would be pretty sweet for us, but first place would be that much sweeter."

Graduating a consistent competitor in Nina Oteri leaves the Owls without one of their top floor and balance beam scorers, but Murphy believes the depth of his team is their best asset.

"This year, we have a very deep team," assessed Murphy. "We brought in seven freshman for this year, and they are all very good on their individual events and very motivated."

The Owls will be heavy on senior leadership, with four athletes returning for their final year of eligibility. The group is significantly special to Murphy, being that it represents his first full recruiting class. Katie Canning will miss the season due to injury, but will return for a fifth year of competition.

Kathryn Ho, Chelsea Lapent, cocaptain Marissa Oxenford and cocaptain Chelsea Troutman comprise a talented and experienced class, one that Murphy can count on to deliver when it matters most.

"Chelsea Lapent has been consistent for us on vault, and we are hoping she can contribute on

floor as well," said Murphy. "Marissa came off of a great year last season and has great leadership and background of competing. Chelsea Troutman has gone through her share of injuries, but has great potential to be one of top gymnasts. Kathryn has always been huge for us on bars, and we are hoping she can continue to do that this season.'

Although small in numbers, the junior class' contributions will be felt immensely. Alexandra Uscatu, Kaity Watson and Corrine Williams are three of the most efficient gymnasts on the squad.

"Alexandra is a powerhouse on vault, and looks great on floor and beam as well," commented Murphy. "Watson has obviously been a powerhouse and has the ability to compete all-around. She is our top vaulter and should anchor that

Williams took home the title on floor at the ECAC Championships last season, also earning USAG All-American first team honors on two apparatus.

"Corrine is looking great," said Murphy. "She is on top of her game and is looking to come back and defend her title."

In their collegiate debuts, the sophomore class proved they had what it takes to compete at the highest level. With Ebone Grant, Avery ludice and Natalie Kahler missing the season due to injury,


Brittany Clark and Margaret Walch stepped up and provided Temple the depth they needed to continue to be successful. Alban grew into one of the Owls' top all-arounders, earning 2010 ECAC Women's Gymnastics Rookie of the Year honors.

The freshman class is regarded by Murphy and his staff as one of their most talented in recent years. Seven fresh faces join the class of 2014, including Sylvie Borschel, Arielle Burris, Brittany DeMeno, Brianna Ferdinandi, Nicole Salnikov, Lindsey Yeager and Heather Zaniewski.

"It's really an all-around package," said Murphy of the incoming class. "They all have their great accomplishments from high school, but I can see our three powerhouses being Sylvie, Brittanie and Heather."

The Owls will compete against some of the best teams in the region, and once again have two chances to take down conference rival Towson. Temple also competes against national powerhouse California at Penn, as well as regional foe Maryland. A trip to NCAA Regional's competitor Missouri is the top highlight of the team's travels. This year, the ECAC Championships will be held at Brown University and the USAG Nationals at Air Force.







# Aaron Murphy

Head Coach
Fifth Season at Temple • Temple '01

Aaron Murphy is entering his fifth season as head coach of the Temple women's gymnastics team.

The 2010 season was yet another successful endeavor for Murphy and his team. The Owls repeated as third place finishers at the ECAC Championships, a meet which they hosted in McGonigle Hall. Moving forward to the USAG Championships, the Owls qualified for the team competition and saw a record eight athletes earn USAG All-America honors.

In 2009, Murphy was recognized as ECAC Division I Coach of the Year, leading his team to a school-best third place finish at the ECAC Conference Championships. During that run, he also led the team to breaking the all-time team record, a mark that stood for six years. The Owls posted a team score of 192.625 against Cornell on March 15, 2009.

Prior to being named head coach, Murphy was the assistant coach for four years at Temple. The 2001 Temple graduate was named

the USA Collegiate Assistant Gymnastics Coach of the Year in 2004.

In his four years as an assistant at Temple, Murphy was responsible for spotting all four events while constructing the strength and conditioning program. Under his guidance, the program celebrated 16 USAG All-American honorees and several new school records.

Prior to his experience with the women's gymnastics program, Murphy spent the 2001-02 season as an assistant with the Temple men's program under head coach Fred Turoff. While responsible for spotting all skill events for safety

purposes, he was integral in assisting the men's team to an ECAC Conference Championship and national recognition.

In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Murphy was the Public Gymnastics Clinic Director at

Temple from 2001-03. In coaching all ages and skill levels, he utilized his several years of experience in supervising, coordinating and working hands-on with inner-city children participating in gymnastics.

A four-year letterwinner at Temple, Murphy served as a team captain his senior season (2000-01). His career as a performer, and 2001 U.S. Championship participant, is headlined with several honors



including the 2001 Bill Braverman Award Recipient for Excellence and the 2001 Most Consistent Gymnast Award.

Murphy, born in Barberton, Ohio, currently resides in Philadelphia.







# Caitlin Council

Assistant Coach Towson '07

Fourth Season at Temple • Towson '07

Caitlin Council, a former student assistant coach at Towson University, is entering her fourth season as assistant women's gymnastics coach at Temple University. Council will assist Murphy in all aspects of coaching including recruiting, travel and fundraising. As a former gymnast and coach, she has been involved in all aspects of competing in women's gymnastics, and has several years of coaching experience. In her collegiate career, was a walk-on gymnast at Towson University where she earned her bachelor's degree in Physical Education.

Council comes from a long background of coaching gymnastics, starting with recreational classes at Barlow's gymnastics

and slowly making her way to coaching the competitive team. In addition to coaching at Barlow's, she also has coached at Woodward Gymnastics Camp for the last six summers. In 2008, she coached the Owls' balance beam team to become the number one beam team in the ECAC, topping her alma mater Towson University. With three years solidified as an Owl, Council looks towards winning the **ECAC** championships and competing against her former school.

# Year In Review

Owls The returned 10 letterwinners from the 2008 history making team, which took third place at the ECAC Championships for the first time ever. Headlined by the return of seniors Nina Oteri and Danielle Viens, and three USAG All-America honorees in Katie Canning, Kaity Watson, and Corrine Williams, the Owls raised the bar even higher this season. Seven new additions bolstered Coach Murphy's 2010 squad and gave Temple depth in every event. Freshmen Jean Alban, Brittany Clark, Ebone Grant, Avery Iudice, Natalie Kahler, Kirstie Viens, and Margaret Walch formed a group that made an immediate impact.

The Cherry and White opened its

2010 season with a third place finish at the University of Maryland Invitational. Highlighting action for the Owls was Corrine Williams, who took third place on floor and fifth on the vault. Up next for Temple was the George Washington Invitational where the Owls, led by Oteri and Watson, placed second only to North Carolina. North Carolina scored a team total of 192.450, followed by Temple's 189.150. Following her tremendous showing in the all-around, Watson was named **ECAC** Division I Gymnast of the Week.

The Owls then placed third at the Ursinus Quad-Meet and were led by a first place finish on floor from Williams, who also placed second on beam. Jean Alban

was named ECAC Women's Gymnastics Rookie of the Week for her solid performance. Debuting in the all-around, the Springfield, Mass. native placed fifth in the all-around standings. Alban also earned sixth on balance beam and placed eighth on uneven bars.

A week later, Watson posted the best vault of the night and the leading all-around score as the Owls were narrowly edged by Rutgers. After a weekend off, Temple geared up for the Liberty Classic at McGonigle Hall where the team turned in a convincing victory over Ursinus, University of Pennylvania, and West Chester. For her performance in the Liberty Classic, junior Alexandra Uscatu was named ECAC Women's Gymnastics Specialist of the Week. Uscatu made her home

debut scoring a 9.500 on vault, leading the Owls' vault team to a season high total of 47.825 and the overall win.

Canning placed third on floor and second on beam and vault to lead the Owls to a fourth place finish at the Towson Invitational. Junior Chelsea Lapent was named the Coaches' Choice of the week for her efforts at the meet. Lapent mainly competed floor and vault for the Owls during the last three seasons, however due to numerous injuries, the team did not have enough women for the bar lineup at the Towson Invitational. Lapent put a basic bar routine together to compete for the Owls and her effort was greatly appreciated by the team.

the Owls to a team total of 190.650 against William & Mary.

The Owls returned home to McGonigle hall to host the 2010 ECAC Championships on March 27. The Cherry and White put forth a strong effort finishing third. Williams took top honors on floor leading all competitors with a score of 9.850. Canning and senior Oteri finished tied for second on balance beam, boasting scores of 9.750. Canning also led Temple on vault, placing seventh with a score of 9.775.

The Owls were ranked seventh in the final USAG Collegiate rankings and made their way to Texas where they competed against host and topranked Texas Women's University,



Temple followed the meet by posting the top score in all four events to beat out West Chester and Springfield College in a tri-meet hosted by West Chester University. The Owls took the top three honors on uneven bars, with Chelsea Troutman leading the way scoring 9.70.

The Owls next took third place at the University of Bridgeport Quad-Meet. The star of the meet was freshman Jean Alban, who led the Owls all-around scoring a team-best 37.850.

Scoring a season-high 191.025, Temple placed third at the Penn Quad-Meet. The Owls were led all-around again by Alban, who scored 37.725 all-around. A week later in their final meet before the ECAC Championships, Oteri captured a first place finish on balance beam and floor to help lead

Bridgeport, Cornell, Rutgers, William & Mary, Air Force, and Seattle Pacific at the USAG Women's Collegiate National Championship. Temple placed third in the team semifinals session.

In the individual competition, Oteri took third place on floor, and Canning earned fourth on vault in the USAG Event Finals. A total of four individuals earned USAG All-America recognition on all four apparatus, with Williams being named second team all-around.





A comprehensive transit system (left) and state-of-the-art subway (below) provide students access to the entire Philadelphia area.




