The Temple men's basketball team opens defense of its Atlantic 10 Conference championship Wednesday at the Izod Center as the Owls take on Fordham in their league opener. The game, which tips off at 7:00 p.m., will be televised locally on The Comcast Network and broadcast on 1210 AM WPHT.



Temple (9-3) had its six-game win streak snapped last Thursday by Philadelphia Big 5 rival #8/8 Villanova, 78-74. Fifth-year head coach Fran Dunphy's Owls, which own a 36-12 league record over the past three seasons - all culminating in A-10 Championships, will be looking for their third straight win in a conference opener.

Junior guard Ramone Moore continues to lead the Cherry and White with a 15.0 scoring average. Senior forward Lavoy Allen, a Wooden and Naismith award candidate, averages 11.2 points while topping the squad in rebounding (7.0 rpg.). Junior guard Juan Fernandez has a team-high 48 assists while rounding out the Owls' double-figure scorers (10.7 ppg.)

Juniors Scootie Randall (8.7 ppg.) and Michael Eric (6.8 ppg.) complete the Temple starting five while sophomores Rahlir Jefferson (6.8 ppg.) and Khalif Wyatt (5.7 ppg.) provide an offensive spark off the bench.

Temple's defense has been the key to the team's start. The Owls lead the A-10 in scoring defense (59.8 ppg.) and field goal percentage defense (.383).

Fordham, off to a 6-6 start in Tom Pecora's first season as head coach, boasts four double-figure scorers led by senior guard Brenton Butler (17.4 ppg.). Sophomore forward Chris Gaston (15.5 ppg.) leads the conference in rebounding (12.6 rpg.) while junior Alberto Estwick (12.5 ppg.) and freshman Branden Frazier (11.8 ppg.) top the Rams with 28 three-pointers each.

Temple leads the all-time series between the teams, 36-13, and won last year's meeting at Rose Hill Gym, 62-45.

LAST MEETING: #16/17 TEMPLE 62, @FORDHAM 45 (1/23/10): Three-point shooting and strong bench play helped #16/17 Temple break away from upset-minded Fordham to post a 62-45 win at Rose Hill Gym. Juan Fernandez, who topped the Owls with 13 points, hit two three-pointers to open the second half to lead a 16-4 run that gave Temple a 38-23 lead with just under 14 minutes to play. Scootie Randall, who also had two treys, scored a career-high 12 points over a career best 21 minutes. Randall was joined off the bench by Ramone Moore (6 pts) and T.J. DiLeo (career-high 5 points), who helped hold off any late Ram rally. The Owls had started off sluggishly in the first half, making only seven of 28 field goal attempts (28%) and two of 12 from long-range (16.7%). Temple's three top scorers on the season, Ryan Brooks, Fernandez and Lavoy Allen, combined for nine points on three-of-16 from the field in the opening period. The second half saw Temple shoot 16-of-24 (66.7%), including seven-of-nine (77.8%) from long range. Chris Gaston led the Rams with a game-high 16 points

LAST GAME: @#8/8 VILLANOVA 78, #25/RV TEMPLE 74 (12/30/10): Lavoy Allen and Juan Fernandez each reached season scoring highs, combining for 42 points, but it was not enough as #8/8 Villanova held off #25/rv Temple, 78-74, in a hard-fought Big 5 game at The Pavilion. Corey Stokes (24) and Maalik Wayns (21) combined for 45 points for the Wildcats who extended their home court win streak to 43 games. The game, the first with both teams ranked since a 1988 battle between the #1 Owls and the #10 Wildcats at McGonigle Hall, lived up to it hype as there were nine ties and seven lead changes. Temple, which led by as many as eight (32-24), took a slim 40-39 advantage into the locker room. Ramone Moore scored 13 of his 16 points in the half while Fernandez had 12 points and four assists in the period. Villanova quickly took control in the second half courtesy of a 10-0 run to take a 55-45 lead with just under 14 to play. Temple then ran off 13 unanswered points with a Scootie Randall three giving TU a 60-57 lead. That, unfortunately, would be the last Temple basket until a Moore lay-up with 1:10 on the clock. Stokes drained one of his five three-pointers on the ensuing possession to tie the game. Following two Allen free throws, Nova ran off seven straight points. Mouphtaou Yarou (13 pts) started the run with a lay-up. Stokes then connected on a trey with Wayns weaving his way in for two, making it 67-62. Both teams struggled to score the next five minutes, but Villanova's edge at the foul line proved deadly as Wayns and Corey Fisher combined to make four straight over a 30 second stretch to push the margin to seven, 73-66. Wayns, (9-9 FTs), made two free throws to make it 76-68, with 18 seconds on the clock. Moore then found Allen for a lay-up and Antonio Pena fouled him with the Owl forward converting on the three-point play. Allen then converted a three-point play and hit a trey to make it a two-point game, 76-74, with 2.3 seconds to play. Wayns then ended it with two more free throws.

D-E-F-E-N-S-E: A question mark for Temple heading into the season due to the loss of lockdown perimeter defender Ryan Brooks, the Owls defense has been stellar so far. TU leads the Atlantic 10 Conference in scoring defense (59.8 ppg) and field goal percentage defense (.383), ranking 25th nationally in the categories. TU had held its opponents under 60 points in each of its first six games, to match the 1962-63 Temple team that set the modern day school record with a similar six-game stretch. Maryland snapped the streak with 61 while Georgetown (65), Northern Illinois (74) and Villanova (78) also eclipsed it. Temple ranked third nationally (56.8 ppg) in scoring defense last season. TU has held opponents under 60 points per game for a season seven times since the installation of the shot clock in 1985 with the lowest average by opponents being 54.8 ppg. in 1999-2000. The Owls also finished 2009-10 fourth nationally in three-point percentage (.285) and seventh in field goal percentage defense (.383).

ALLEN'S TOWN: Senior Lavoy Allen currently ranks **seventh** on Temple's all-time rebound list with 948 boards. He needs **95** rebounds to set the new school record for career rebounds currently held by the Owls' radio color analyst John Baum (1,042, 1966-69). A Wooden and Naismith Award candidate, Allen, who leads the Owls in rebounding (7.0 rpg) and is second in scoring (11.2 ppg), ranks first in career field goal percentage at Temple (492-902, .545). A 2010 First Team all-Atlantic 10 Conference and USBWA All-District selection, Allen became the first Temple player to average a double-double (11.5 ppg./10.7 rpg) since Ollie Johnson accomplished the feat by posting team-highs of 13.6 points and 10.7 rebounds per game as a junior in 1970-71. Named A-10 co-Player of the Week on Monday (12/6), he has two double-doubles on the season and 29 for his career, the most by any active A-10 player. A two-time A-10 all-defensive team selection (2009, 2010), the 6-9 forward became the 46th TU player to reach the 1000 point mark vs. George Washington last season. He is currently 35th on the list with 1,173 points. Next up is #34 - Ed Coe (1,177, 1981-86), #33 - Kevin Lyde (1,188, 1998-02) and #32 - Alex Wesby (1,194, 1999-03).



ALL-AMERICA ALLEN: Allen was tabbed as a preseason First Team All-America candidate by *The Basketball Times*. Allen, who became the first player in nearly 40 years to average a double-double last season (11.5 ppg./10.7 rpg.), is also on the Wooden Award and Naismith Award Watch Lists.

FERNANDEZ FACTS: Junior Juan Fernandez, a preseason second team all-Atlantic 10 Conference selection, led Temple in assists (122), steals (32) and three-pointers (73) while topping the conference in three-point percentage (.453) last season. The Most Outstanding Player of the 2010 A-10 Championship, Fernandez is a big game performer as demonstrated by his career-high 33 points on 11-of-15 shooting, including seven of nine from long-range in the team's 75-65 win over then #3/3 Villanova (12/13/10). The 6-4 Argentine guard, who is playing his natural position - point guard - this season, is the leading returning scorer on the Owls with a 12.6 average. This year, the Cousy Award candidate is third on TU in scoring (9.8 ppg), while leading the team in assists (3.9 apg). He made his 100th career three-pointer against Akron and his three-point percentage (.387, 101-261) is fifth on the TU all-time list.



MORE ON MOORE: Junior Ramone Moore has fit nicely into a starter's role this season after earning A-10 Sixth Man of the Year honors in 2009-10. Moore, who leads the Owls in scoring with a 15.0 average, exploded for a career-high 30 points in Temple's 68-65 win over #9/10 Georgetown (12/9). Named Philadelphia Big 5 co-Player of the Week on Dec. 13, he has scored in double figures in 15 of his 17 career starts, including 10 this season. Last year he averaged 7.6 points and 3.0 rebounds overall, but posted a 9.8 scoring average in A-10 play. His scoring average in his five starts as a sophomore was 16.8 points per game. The Philadelphia product (Southern HS) also leads TU in free throws made (45) and attempted (61) while connecting on 73.8 percent from the charity stripe.



MIKE'S MINUTE: Junior Micheal Eric is in his second year as a starter. The developing 6-11 forward from Lagos, Nigeria has increased both his scoring (6.8 ppg) and rebounding (5.4 rpg) averages from a season ago (5.9 ppg, 3.1 rpg) while currently tied for seventh in blocked shots (1.8 bpg) in the Atlantic 10. He has topped double figures three times this season with a high of 16 points vs. Akron (12/12). He set a career-high with five blocks vs. Seton Hall (11/12) and leads the team with 20. Last season he scored a game and career-high 19 points in the team's 78-56 win over Rhode Island (2/13/10). He ended the regular season with a game-high 18-point effort on seven-of-nine shooting in a win over George Washington.

SCOOTIE SNIPPETS: Junior Scootie Randall is in his first season as a starter. The 6-6 forward, who tallied a career-high 18 points in the Owls' win over Georgia (11/26), is averaging 8.7 points and 4.9 rebounds while ranking second on the squad in offensive rebounds (23) and steals (13). Randall made his first career start in the team's season-opener win over Seton Hall, setting career highs in rebounds (9) and minutes (32). He scored 12 points in TU's wins over Akron and Northern Illinois, 11 versus Toledo and Villanova, and 10 in wins over Maryland and #9/10 Georgetown. He now has six double figure games on the season and seven for his career.

RAHLIR'S RANT: Sophomore Rahlir Jefferson tallied a career-high 18 points on eight of nine shooting in the Owls' win at Ohio (12/22). Jefferson, who leads TU in field goal percentage (34-49, .694), is averaging 6.8 points and 5.4 rebounds. He has team highs in offensive rebounds (25) and steals (14). The team's top reserve posted his first career double-double (10 pts, 10 rebs) in the season-opening win over Seton Hall. Last season he was the lone newcomer to make an impact. He saw action in 34 games and averaged 3.9 points and 2.6 rebounds. He scored a season-high 11 points in the Duquesne win (2/3). His 16.6 minutes per game were the second most by a TU reserve.

WHY WYATT: Sophomore guard Khalif Wyatt tallied a career-high 14 points, hitting four of five three-pointers in the team's win at Ohio (12/22). He has been seeing increased playing time since his breakout performance at the Old Spice Classic. The Norristown High product averaged 8.7 ppg. over the three-game tournament, and scored nine of his points in an 18-4 run that brought Temple back from a 13-point second half deficit against Texas A&M. He had scored 10 points in the team's win over Georgia in the prior game. He saw limited action last season (10 games) as a freshman, but has clearly found a spot in the rotation this season. He is averaging 5.7 points per game and has made 25 of 46 from the field (.543) and seven-of-19 from three (.368). He is tied for fourth on the team in steals (12) and it was his theft in the final minute against Maryland that helped seal the win.

TJ'S TURN: Redshirt sophomore TJ DiLeo in one of the first guards off the bench for Temple this season. The steady reserve (1.5 ppg., 1.0 rpg.) is averaging 11.3 minutes. He played in 24 games last season, averaging 6.4 minutes per contest. He posted double-figure minutes six times, scoring a career-high seven points over 20 minutes in the Duquesne win.

BROWN BAGGING: Freshman Aaron Brown set new career highs in points (13) and minutes played (16) in Temple's win over Akron (12/12). He had played his way into the rotation after scoring six points over 11 minutes in the team's 54-51 loss to Texas A&M on Nov. 28. Brown was a key figure in the Owls' second half run that eliminated a 13-point second half deficit. The St. Benedict's Prep product is averaging 3.0 points and 7.0 minutes per game over seven contests.

A-10 OPENER: Temple is 19-9 all-time in Atlantic 10 Conference season openers. The Owls are 8-5 when opening conference play on the road. This is the fourth time in head coach Fran Dunphy's five seasons that the Owls have opened their A-10 slate on the road. Temple is 1-2 in the previous three openers on the road, but won the last, 75-68, at La Salle on Jan. 11, 2009.

SCHEDULE STRENGTH: The Owls play four teams ranked in the Top 25. #1/1 Duke (2/23), #7/7 Villanova (78-74, L, 12/30), #13/13 Georgetown (68-65 W, 12/9) and #16/16 Texas A&M (54-51 L, 11/28)

INJURY UPDATE: Freshman forward **Anthony Lee** is suffering from a herniated disk and had surgery on December 17. He will be out for an extended period of time. Senior forward **Craig Williams** fractured the fifth metatarsal of his left foot during a shootaround prior to Temple's 82-49 win over Toledo on November 14. Williams, who had just been cleared for limited practice due to a fracture of the fifth metatarsal of his left foot in the summer, is expected to be out at least another month.

CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAINS: For the first time in program history Temple will boast four captains for a men's basketball season. Senior Lavoy Allen and juniors Micheal Eric, Juan Fernandez and Ramone Moore were voted by their teammates to serve as co-captains for the 2010-11 season. The Owls have had three co-captains on six different occasions, the last when Dionte Christmas, Semaj Inge and Sergio Olmos captained the 2008-09 squad.

BRIGHT LIGHTS: The Temple men's basketball team will have 17 games televised during the 2010-11 season with 11 games nationally-televised.

A-10 RISING: The Atlantic 10 sits eighth in the latest RPI Report while seven schools rank in the top 115 including Temple (16), Rhode Island (38), Dayton(48), Xavier (53), Richmond (77), Massachusetts (108) and St. Bonaventure (114).



BIG FIVE: Temple has been one of the top teams over the 56-year history of the Philadelphia Big 5. The Owls' 25 Big 5 titles (19 shared, six outright) top the city league while their 119-86 record in city-series games ranks second. The Owls' 10-11 Big 5 schedule at Villanova (Dec. 30, L 78-74), and home games against Penn (Jan. 19), Saint Joseph's (Feb. 20) and La Salle (Mar. 5).



MAC ATTACK: For the fifth straight year Temple has played teams from the Mid-American Conference due to a scheduling agreement when the University's football program joined the league.. TU is 17-5 against the MAC since 2006-07 and has won 12 straight games against MAC foes. The last loss to a MAC opponent came against Miami, 68-52, on Dec. 3, 2008 at the Liacouras Center.

ROAD RECORD: Temple has been one of the top teams in the country in road wins the past two seasons. This year, TU is 2-1 on opponent's floors with wins over Central Michigan (65-53, 12/1) and Ohio (76-65, 12/22), and a loss at #7/7 Villanova (78-74, 12/30). The Owls also have a win over Maryland (64-61, 12/5) at the Verizon Center in Washington as part of the BB&T Classic. It was one of two (Georgia) neutral site wins this season, making the Cherry and White 4-2 away from home. Temple posted a 12-3 road record in 2009-10 and tied for the most road wins in the nation with Butler and Morgan State. Away from home, Temple was 16-5 last season (4-2 neutral sites).

RANKING REPORT: Temple fell out of college basketball's Top 25 this week following a 78-74 loss at then #8/8 Villanova (12/30). Temple is receiving votes in both polls and is #28 in the latest Associated Press poll and 30th in the ESPN/USA Today poll (as of 1/2). The Owls had a streak of 16 consecutive weeks ranked among the nation's Top 25 end with the release of the November 29 polls.

BALANCED ATTACK: Junior guard Ramone Moore leads the Temple offense with a 15.0 scoring average, but the Owls have had six players serve as the high scorer during a single game this season. Senior forward Lavoy Allen, a Naismith and Wooden Award candidate, has led the Cherry and White in scoring a team-high four times. Moore has topped the squad three times. Juniors Juan Fernandez and Michael Eric have topped the Owls in scoring twice while junior Scootie Randall and sophomore Rahlir Jefferson have done it once. Only three players, Moore, Allen and Fernandez, have scored 20 points in a game with Moore and Allen accomplishing the feat twice. Moore's 30 points in Temple's 68-65 win over Georgetown on December 9 is the high output for a TU player this season.

30 For 30: Temple has knocked off a Top 10 opponent in December in three consecutive seasons with a different player scoring 30 points to lead the way. On Dec. 13, 2008, Dionte Christmas scored 35 points to lead the Owls to an 88-72 win over then #8/8 Tennessee. On Dec. 13, 2009, Juan Fernandez delivered a career-high 33 points in a 75-65 win over then #3/3 Villanova. This season, on Dec. 9, Ramone Moore exploded for a career-high 30 points in a 68-65 win over then #9/10 Georgetown.

FOR THREE: Temple has made at least one three-pointer in 480 consecutive games. The last time the Owls did not make a three-pointer in a game was February 1, 1996. Temple missed all 16 three-point attempts that day in dropping a 59-35 decision to #1 UMass at McGonigle Hall.

THREE-PEAT: Temple became just the second team to win three straight A-10 Championships. UMass owns the conference record with five straight titles (1992, 1993, 1994, 1995, 1996).

20-20 20 VISION: Temple posted its third straight 20-win season in 2009-10, marking the first time the Owls won 20 games in three consecutive seasons since running off six straight 20-win campaigns (1995-96 through 2000-01). Overall, Temple has won 20-or-more games in 31 seasons.

GOOD HANDS TEAM: In 2009-10, Temple led the A-10 and ranked ninth nationally in fewest turnovers per game (10.5 tpg). Since the 1992-93 season, when the statistic started to be tracked by the NCAA, Temple has led the nation 11 times, the last coming in 2005-06. The Owls rank second in the A-10 and 39th nationally with 12.0 turnovers per game this season.

OVERTIME: Temple played and won its first overtime game since Feb. 13, 2008 when it defeated Rhode Island, 68-64, at the Ryan Center on Jan. 10, 2010. Its previous OT game, also a win over URI (92-89 at home) was the last of four overtime games, all wins, during the 2007-08 season. Temple defeated Saint Joseph's, 75-67, in overtime on Feb. 20 and has now won six straight OT games and 12 of its last 14. The Owls are 48-43 all-time in overtime games.

PHILADELPHIA'S TEAM: Temple has more players from the Philadelphia area (8), than any of the other five Division I programs. Three of the Owls starters - Lavoy Allen (Pennsbury HS/Morrisville, PA); Ramone Moore (Southern HS/Philadelphia) and Scootie Randall (Communications Tech/Philadelphia) - are from the Philadelphia area with Moore (2007) and Randall (2008) earning Most Valuable Player honors in the highly-competitive Philadelphia Public League. Three of the four reserves in the team's nine-man rotation - T.J. DiLeo (Cinnaminson (NJ) HS), Rahlir Jefferson (Chester (PA) HS) and Khalif Wyatt (Norristown (PA) HS) - are also from the metro area. Rounding out the eight-man local connection are walk-ons Dutch Gaitley (Archbishop Carroll HS/Haverford, PA) and Jake Godino (Delaware County Christian School/Chester, PA).

NEW KID IN TOWN: Will Cummings, a 6-1, 170-pound guard out of the Providence School in Jacksonville, Fla., has signed a National Letter of Intent to play men's basketball at Temple University. A true point guard, Cummings averaged 10 points, six assists, three rebounds and three steals in helping lead Providence to the Class AA Florida State Championship as a junior in 2009-10. Ranked as the 34th best point guard by ESPN.com, he is a strong defensive player as evidenced by his school record eight steals in a game last season.

PROFESSOR DUNPHY: For the fourth straight year Temple coach Fran Dunphy is team-teaching an honors course in the University's prestigious Fox School of Business with Dr. Lynne Anderson. The course is titled Management, Theory and Practice: From the Locker Room to the Board Room. "I have had the opportunity to do it at Penn and now doing it at Temple has been a lot of fun for me. I get in the classroom and I get a chance to interact with the students. I get to see them in a different way. They get to see me in a different way. I get a chance to understand what our players are going through in terms of the classroom activities. Again, I think that it's me wanting to learn as much as I can about Temple and its student body as well. It's a home run for me. I am hoping it's a great experience for the students."

A DYNAMIC DUO: Temple has two Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame coaches. The first inductee was Harry Litwack, who coached the Owls from 1952 to 1973 and registered 373 wins. Litwack was inducted on April 26, 1976. John Chaney, who retired March 12, 2006 after 24 seasons and 516 wins at Temple, was inducted on October 5, 2001. Temple is only one of nine universities who have two coaches in the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame. The center jump circle at the Liacouras Center is jointly named in honor of these two coaching legends.

SUMMER SCHOOL: Four Temple Owls played summer ball on various national teams. Sophomore guard TJ DiLeo was second on the German U20 team with 10.7 points per game while pulling in 2.9 rebounds per game at the FIBA U20 European Championship Division A held from July 8-18 in Croatia. Freshman guard Aaron Brown played with the US Virgin Islands team in the Centrobasket Championship held in the Dominican Republic from July 5-11. Brown placed second on his team in scoring with 12.5 points per game. He also drained eight of 17 from three-point range (47.1%) to rank third in the tournament. Prior to the Centrobasket Championship, he competed at the 2010 FIBA Americas U18 Championship. Junior Juan Fernandez worked out with the Argentinean Senior National Team as they prepared to take part in the FIBA World Championships. He did not compete with the team at the competition. Senior Lavoy Allen was a member of the USA Select team that played against the US National team that won the FIBA World Championships.

#400: Fran Dunphy posted his 400th career win in Temple's 68-65 victory over #9/10 Georgetown. The only person to serve as head men's basketball coach at two Philadelphia Big 5 schools, he became just the second Big 5 coach to win 400 games since the inception of city series play. The other is his predecessor, Hall of Fame coach John Chaney who compiled 516 wins in his 24-year tenure at the University.

TEMPLE IS BEAMING: Celebrating Temple's construction of a \$13.5 million basketball practice facility for the Owls' men's and women's programs as part of the \$48 million renovation to Pearson and McGonigle Halls, a 15-foot steel beam was on display in the Fox-Gittis Room throughout both doubleheader games on Nov. 12. Fans were welcomed to the Fox-Gittis Room to sign the beam, which will be used as part of the practice facility's construction.

THE NBA CONNECTION: Thirteen Temple players have been selected in the NBA draft since 1982. Seven of those 13—Terence Stansbury (1984), Tim Perry (1988), Duane Causwell (1990), Mark Macon (1991), Eddie Jones (1994), Aaron McKie (1994) and Mardy Collins (2006)—were taken in the first round.

HEAD COACH FRAN DUNPHY



Fran Dunphy, one of the all-time winningest coaches in Philadelphia Big 5 history, has left his imprint on the Temple men's basketball team in his four years at the helm. After taking over the reins from Hall of Fame coach John Chaney on April 10, 2006, Dunphy brought the Owls back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2001 in just his second season when he guided his charges to the 2008 Atlantic 10 Championship. The following year, he again led Temple to the A-10 title, becoming the first conference team to win consecutive championships since 2001. In 2009-10, he became just the second A-10 coach to guide a team to three straight league championships while leading Temple to a #12 ranking in the final Associated Press poll.

The 17th head coach in Temple's 108-year history of men's basketball, Dunphy, now in his fifth season with the Cherry and White, is the first person to serve as the head men's basketball coach at two Philadelphia Big 5 institutions. After 17 years, nine NCAA Tournament bids and 310 wins as head coach at Penn, Dunphy moved North to Temple to replace the legendary Chaney.

Twice named Eastern College Coach of the Year in his four seasons at Temple, Dunphy led his second Owl squad on a late-season run to the Atlantic 10 Championship. He guided the Cherry and White to a 21-13 overall mark in 2007-08, including a second place A-10 regular season finish with an 11-5 conference record. He followed that by directing his charges in 2008-09 to a 22-12 record, 11-5 in league play, and another conference championship.

This 2009-10 season is one that will go down as one of the best in Temple lore. Picked tied for fifth in the A-10 preseason poll, Dunphy motivated his charges to their first A-10 regular season title (9th overall) since 2002 with a 14-2 record. The 2010 A-10 and NABC District Coach of the Year brought the Owls back into the national spotlight with the program's first national ranking since 2001, with the team staying in the polls for 13 consecutive weeks. His Owls would go on to become just the second A-10 team to win three consecutive conference championships while also posting just the fifth perfect Philadelphia Big 5 season in the program's history.

The number one accomplishment achieved by the 2009-10 Temple team was its 29 victories (against six defeats), which ranks third in the school's 114-year history.

One of the most respected coaches in the nation, Dunphy, who owns a 394-212 overall record, has personified success over his coaching career. His impressive resume includes 12 NCAA bids, 13 conference titles, 12 20-win seasons, five Philadelphia Big 5 City Series titles, seven Conference Players of the Year, three Conference Rookies of the Year, five perfect Conference seasons and 48 All-Conference honorees.

Prior to joining Penn's coaching staff, Dunphy served as an assistant under Speedy Morris at his alma mater, La Salle University (1985-86 through 1987-88). The Philadelphia native's coaching career began at the United States Military Academy (1971-72), where he served as an assistant under head coach Dan Dougherty. In 1975, he became head coach of his high school alma mater, Malvern Prep. He remained there until becoming Lefty Ervin's assistant at La Salle University (1979-80). The following year, Dunphy joined current Maryland head coach Gary Williams' staff at American University. He served as an assistant two seasons under Williams, and the final three years under Ed Tapscott, the former head coach of the NBA's Washington Wizards (2008-09). He returned to La Salle in 1985, serving one more season under Ervin and assisting Morris for two seasons. He left La Salle to become Tom Schneider's assistant at Penn in 1988.

In 1989, Dunphy was named the 16th head coach at Penn. He would compile a 310-163 overall record in his 17-year career. His Quaker teams won an unprecedented 48 straight Ivy League games and four league titles from 1992 through 1996. His 1993-94 team posted a 25-3 record and earned a Number 25 ranking in the CNN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, the program's first such ranking since the 1978-79 campaign. That year also included a 90-80 first round upset of sixth-seed Nebraska in the NCAA Tournament.

In his last eight seasons at Penn, Dunphy guided the Quakers to six Ivy League titles and a 93-19 league record. From 1999-2001, he led Penn to 25 straight league wins, including a perfect 14-0 mark in 1999-2000. In 2001-02, Dunphy's Quakers posted a 25-7 record and won the school's first outright city-series title with a perfect 4-0 mark since 1973-74.

A full-time educator on and off the court, Dunphy is in his fourth year teaching in Temple's prestigious Fox School of Business. He is team-teaching an honors course with Dr. Lynne Anderson, entitled, Management, Theory & Practice: From the Locker Room to the Board Room. He previously had served as a lecturer in the Wharton Executive Education program and in the management department of the Wharton School.

Dunphy is one of the leaders in the local Coaches vs. Cancer campaign and was named to the National Council of Coaches vs. Cancer. He was also honored as the 2002 National Coaches vs. Cancer Coach of the Year for his service and tireless dedication to those in need. On September 23, 2008, he joined four other coaches to speak to legislators on Capitol Hill on the need for more funding for cancer research.

The Owl mentor also devotes time to Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Greater Philadelphia's Board of Trustees, and his Penn and Temple teams have participated in the Big

Brothers/Big Sisters program each year. He is also a member of the Philadelphia CYO Hall of Fame.

A 1970 La Salle graduate with a degree in marketing, Dunphy was an outstanding player under Explorers' head coach Tom Gola. As a junior, he helped the Explorers to a 23-1 record. He served as a co-captain his senior year when he averaged 18.6 ppg and led the team in assists, while also being named the MVP of the annual Quaker City Basketball Tournament. In 1979, he earned a Master's degree in counseling and human relations from Villanova University.

Dunphy and his wife, Ree, reside in Villanova, Pa., with their son, J.P.

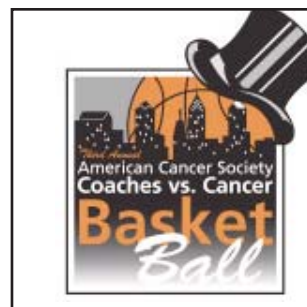

Fifth-year Temple University men's basketball coach Fran Dunphy has been involved in many community service activities in his over 30 years in collegiate coaching. Dunphy has been a major contributor of his time and energy to the American Cancer Society through Coaches vs. Cancer. He has spearheaded the local efforts of the six Division I coaches that have led to raising over \$1 million to benefit the American Cancer Society. Named the Coaches vs. Cancer National Coach of the Year for his efforts, Dunphy has helped to steer events in the area such as the Coaches vs. Cancer Golf Outing; the Coaches vs. Cancer Basketball;

coordinated open practices with the six area teams and holding a March Madness Breakfast to raise awareness for the cause. He was honored in 2008 as a local hero by Bank of America for his role with Coaches vs. Cancer.

Dunphy's Owls were one of three teams to Walk for the Cure at the start of the 2007-08 season with over 1000 students taking part in the Walk held on October 19 in conjunction with Cherry and White Night. The team took part in the Walk for the Cure again on October 24, 2009.

Another cause that Dunphy champions is Big Brothers/Big Sisters. The Owl coach devotes his time to Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Greater Philadelphia by serving on the organization's Board of Trustees. His Penn teams participated in Big Brothers/Big Sisters programs each year during his tenure at the school. His Temple teams have been actively participating in the program the past two seasons.

Dunphy is also a member of the Philadelphia CYO Hall of Fame.

A career game from junior guard Ramone Moore capped off an historic night as Temple knocked off #9/10 Georgetown, 68-65, to secure head coach Fran Dunphy's 400th career win. The Owls never trailed in the nationally-televised contest and were led by a game and career high 30 points from Moore. Moore was the answer for the Owls all night, as he went 12-18 from the floor including two-for-two from three. The Philadelphia native guided Temple to its 11th-straight home win and handed the previously-unbeaten Hoyas (8-1) their first loss. The Temple defense was relentless, constantly pressuring the Hoyas and forcing 17 turnovers. The Owls held Georgetown's top scorer, Austin Freeman, who averaged 20.1 points per game, to just 14 points. Junior guard Jason Clark led the visitors with 15 points. Georgetown battled for the first tie of the night since the opening tip, capitalizing on a Temple turnover and miss to knot the game at 56-56. Moore's biggest shot of the night came on the next possession, as he drained a three to start a 5-0 run to give Temple the lead at 61-56 with 4:15 to play. With just under one-minute remaining, Julian Vaughn made a tough interior shot to make it 66-65. After a missed three by Juan Fernandez, Hollis Thompson drove the paint, but missed an off-balanced lay-up. Rahlir Jefferson drained two free throws with three-seconds left to ice the game.
