2012 Outlook

Looking to make a third-straight appearance in the Atlantic 10 Tournament, the Owls are in their final year battling in the conference before making the jump to the BIG EAST next fall, the Owls are led by 13-year head coach David MacWilliams, who is returning 11 of his players from a 2011 squad that went 9-10-0 overall and 5-4-0 in league play. In addition, MacWilliams and his staff welcome eight newcomers, who will be heavily relied on to be an offensive presence.

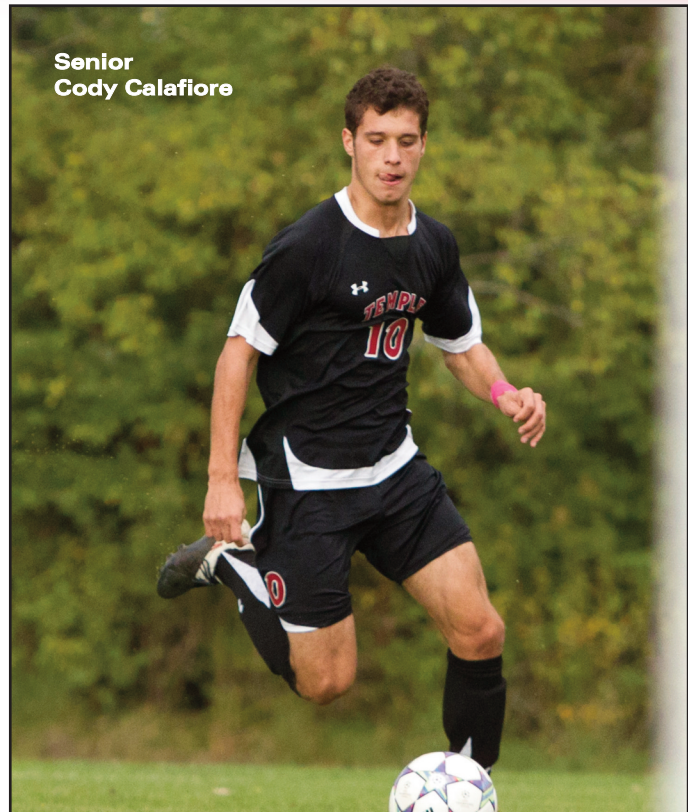
Not only have the Owls brought in several new faces to compete, MacWilliams has also had a significant amount of change to his coaching staff, adding Brian Clarhaut from Connecticut to be his top assistant and Wendell Beres as a volunteer coach, while Evan Prybutok returns for his second season as the graduate assistant.

Despite the departed talent of Tyler Witmer, who finished his career ranked ninth all-time in goals scored at Temple, and Evan Bransdorfer and

Rodrigo Zueletta, the Owls still are returning strong offensive depth, led by senior Cody Calafiore, who led the team in scoring despite missing three games due to injury. Along with him, senior Homero Rodriguez, juniors Ryan Bradbury, Andrew Dodds, Nolan Hemmer, Jake Lister, Vaughn Spurrier and sophomores Willie Chalfant and Mitchell Skrabacz bring a plethora of experience, which should bolster the depth of the unit.

A year after being named to the A-10's All-Rookie team, Spurrier had another productive season, finishing third on the team in scoring, having eight points. Hemmer was a key asset on the front lines as well, having two game-winning goals and a season-total six points, while Dodds and Lister combined for another four goals for the team.

Freshmen Dalton Andrusko, Malcolm McLellan, Jared Martinelli, Josh Tagland and transferring sophomore Chas Wilson are among the faces that are

counted on to bring the Owls a boost in the offensive zone this season and for the next few years to come.

Defensively, the Owls are returning most of the personnel that helped senior goalkeeper Bobby Rosato post five shut outs in net. Senior Billy Kapcock leads the line of defenders for the Owls in his fourth season, as he'll be paired along with juniors Jake Lister, Sam Heller and Sawyer Hemmer. Freshman Nevin Joseph has joined the team in their effort along with 'keepers Cody Eichenlaub and Patrick Lestingi, who will likely be taking this season to learn from the collegiate-level experiences of Rosato and sophomore Dan Scheck.

David MACWILLIAMS

Head Coach
13th Season at Temple • Philadelphia '78

Taking his teams to the Atlantic 10 Tournament in each of the last two seasons and in three of the last four years, David MacWilliams returns to the sidelines for his 13th season as the head coach for the Temple men's soccer team, who is playing its final season in the Atlantic 10 Conference in 2012 before becoming a member of the BIG EAST in 2013.

It usually takes a coach four years to make a program his own at the collegiate level. MacWilliams did just that, posting the most wins (13) in a Temple University men's soccer campaign in his fourth season at the helm. He followed that with a second straight double-digit win season in 2004, the first consecutive 10-plus win seasons since 1986-87.

Now in his 13th year as the Owls' head coach, MacWilliams has made Temple a force to be reckoned with in the region and beyond. After a three-year rebuilding effort, the Owl mentor led the 2003 Temple squad to its most wins since 1990. He guided his charges to a 13-6-3 record and a runner-up finish at the Atlantic 10 Tournament. Along the way, Temple set a school record with 11 shutouts and posted two wins over nationally-ranked Duquesne and a win at NCAA participant North Carolina State.

Continuing to use his formula for success, MacWilliams successfully guided the Cherry and White to back-to-back runner-up finishes (2003, 2004) in the conference tournament, posting double-digit wins for the second straight year.

The 2009 season saw the Owls reach yet another winning record of 9-7-2. The season was highlighted by a share of the Soccer Six crown and an upset of #15 Charlotte at Ambler Sports Complex, the highest ranked team the Owls have defeated under MacWilliams.

In 2008, MacWilliams guided the Owls back to the Atlantic 10 Tournament for the first time since their efforts in 2004. Cruising to their best ever finish in the regular season (2nd), TU's season was highlighted with an upset win over nationally ranked conference foe Dayton.

Coach MacWilliams has brought in his fair share of talent since taking over the helm in

2000. In 2008, J.T. Noone was honored as the Owls first All-America selection in 22 years. Over his nine year career thus far, MacWilliams has groomed 17 all-conference players, and a two time Defensive Player of the Year in Patrick Hanigan (2003, 2004).

Along with mentoring four Soccer Seven Players of the Year in his tenure, MacWilliams himself was honored as Soccer Seven Coach of the Year in 2003, 2004, and 2009. Off the field, MacWilliams coached two second team Academic All-America honorees in Steven Wacker (2004) and J.T. Noone (2008, 2009).

MacWilliams, who owns a 80-107-20 mark at Temple, has over 20 years of coaching and playing experience, including four years as the head coach of the Philadelphia Kixx of the Major Indoor Soccer League. He also was the head coach of the MISL's Baltimore Spirit from 1993-95, and was an all-Star coach during his tenure with both clubs. He was inducted into the Baltimore Blast Hall of Fame on January 21, 2006.

Still active in youth soccer, MacWilliams was named the 2002 Eastern Pennsylvania Coach of the Year. He guided the Olympic Development Program's under-17 team to the Region I Championships and the national finals that year. He guided his Under-17 squad to the Region I Championships, qualifying for the national tournament in 2005.

A standout player at Philadelphia University where he captained the 1978 Final Four team, MacWilliams was a three-time Regional All-American (1976-78). As a senior in 1978, he led the nation in scoring with 22 goals and a school-record 16 assists for 60 points, earning national All-America honors. He currently ranks third on the Philadelphia University all-time scoring list with 47 goals and a school-record 43 assists for 137 points. He was inducted into the Philadelphia University Hall of Fame in 1985.

Following his time at Philadelphia University, MacWilliams went on to a stellar professional playing career. He was captain of the

Baltimore Blast, where he was selected as the team's Best Offensive Player. The team's leading scorer and an all-star selection during his career, he later earned a position on the league's All-Decade team.

MacWilliams also played professional soccer for the NPSL's Chicago Sting, the Major Indoor Soccer League's Philadelphia Fever, the North American Soccer League's Philadelphia Fury and Tampa Bay Rowdies. He also played on the United States National Team from 1977-80, participating in the 1979 Pan American Games.

In addition to coaching, MacWilliams also directs the David MacWilliams Pro Soccer Academy. He resides in Lansdale, Pa. with his wife Beth and their three children, David, Megan and Matthew.

First Season at Temple • Saint Peter's College '06

Brian Clarhaut is in his first season as the head coach David MacWilliam's assistant coach. Prior to arriving to Temple, Clarhaut served as the Director of Soccer Quality Control at the University of Connecticut in 2011, where he helped lead the Huskies to the BIG EAST Championship Game and to the NCAA Quarterfinals with a 19-3-3 record.

Clarhaut spent the 2009 and 2010 campaigns alongside associate head coach Tim O'Donohue at Stevens Institute of Technology.

During his two seasons at Stevens, Clarhaut helped to lead four players to NSCAA First Team All-America honors. A former Division I player at St. Peter's College from 2004-06, he was a member of the All-Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference

(MAAC) Academic team.

Clarhaut was a member of the 23-0-1 Shawnee High School squad that won the 2003 New Jersey state title and finished as the second-ranked team in the nation according to the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA).

As a member of Bishop Eustace Prep from 2000-2002, he set the single season assists record in 2002 with 27, was an all-conference performer (2002) and an All-New Jersey Top-11 Player (2002).

Clarhaut, a nationally licensed coach through the USSF, serves as the Director of Soccer Quality Control and assists with all aspects of the program.

Assistant Coach
First Season at Temple • Elizabethtown '11

Wendell Beres, who spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons as a player for the Owls, enters his first season as an assistant coach on 13-year head coach David MacWilliams' staff. Beres joins the Temple sideline after spending the past four seasons as head coach at Pennsylvania powerhouse, Council Rock North High School. While at North, Beres amassed an overall record of 59-17-8, including three Conference Championships, and a PA State Semi-Final appearance. Council Rock North spent numerous weeks on the ESPN National Rankings, reaching as high as No. 3 in 2009.

Prior to his stint at Council Rock, Beres spent one season as the top assistant at nearby Delaware Valley College in 2007. From 2004-2006, he was an assistant coach at Central Bucks West HS.

As a player, Beres is a product of North Catholic H.S., in Philadelphia. Beres was team captain in 1999, where he was an All-League selection and Catholic League Champion. Following his time at North Catholic, Beres played on the first two of Dave MacWilliams' TU squads before transferring to Holy Family University for financial reasons. He spent two seasons on the pitch at Holy Family. He graduated with a degree in Marketing in May of 2005.

In addition to coaching at Temple, Beres is a coach at Montgomery United Soccer Club and is an ODP staff coach for Eastern Pennsylvania.

Beres holds a National 'B' License from the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) and assists with all aspects of the program.

He currently resides in Lansdale, PA with his wife Kate and their three daughters, Riley, Avery and Bailey.

Graduate Assistant
Second Season at Temple • Massachusetts '08

Evan Prybutok is in his second season as the graduate assistant coach for Temple University.

Before arriving at Temple, Prybutok served as the head men's soccer coach at Otero Junior College (an NJCAA Division I program) in La Junta, Col., where he was credited for starting a brand new soccer program from the ground up in 2010-2011.

During the inaugural 2010 season, Prybutok guided Otero to NJCAA Region IX regular season and postseason tournament titles, while also winning the NJCAA West District Championship and advancing to the NJCAA Division 1 National Championships as one of the final eight teams in the country in Tyler, Texas.

Otero finished the season ranked seventh in the nation with a 16-3-2 record and became the first-ever inaugural NJCAA soccer program to advance to the National Championships. Otero had one player named to the All-American Team, and 11 All-Region IX selections. Prybutok was named 2010 NJCAA West District Coach of the Year.

Before his time at Otero, he was a volunteer assistant coach at Rutgers University in 2009 and was a coach for the Maine Olympic Development Coaching staff in 2009 as well.

Prybutok played his collegiate soccer at the University of Massachusetts and graduated in 2008 with a bachelors of science in management. Hometown is Mt. Laurel, N.J., which is where he currently resides.

Calafiore's PK Gets Temple By Lafayette, 1-0, In 2011 Opener



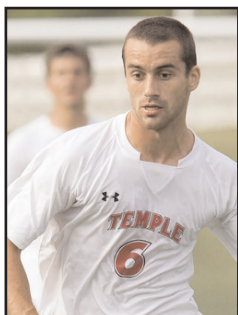

MEN'S SOCCER 2012-13

On March 2, 1975, the idea of what is now the Atlantic 10 Conference was conceived. What started as an eight-school, men's basketball-only affiliation has grown into a 16-university, 21-sport league that is universally hailed as one of the best conferences in the country.

That growth and prominence is a direct result of the ideals and commitments of the member institutions of the Atlantic 10 – Butler University, the University of Dayton, Duquesne University, Fordham University, The George Washington University, La Salle University, University of Massachusetts, University of North Carolina at Charlotte, University of Rhode Island, University of Richmond, St. Bonaventure University, Saint Joseph's University, Saint Louis University, Temple University, Virginia Commonwealth University, and Xavier University.

In 2011-12, the Atlantic 10 was proactive in navigating the sweeping conference realignment issues, adding Butler University and Virginia Commonwealth University, both of which began full membership on July 1, 2012. The league was declared the "winner" of conference realignment by several media outlets, arguably strengthening the league to its best-ever lineup with a record 16 members institutions. The additions were part of a five-year Strategic Initiative Plan that was adopted during the 2010-11 academic year.

The 16 member institutions of the A-10 are united and strengthened by their diversity. Each is extraordinary in its educational mission, whether of a Catholic faith, a private university or a land grant institution. The varied pursuits of each member prove that there are many threads that weave the fabric for a great conference.

The Atlantic 10 Conference, with a total population of over 82 million people within its geographic footprint of nine states and the District of Columbia, will crown champions in 21 sports this year: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, field hockey, men's golf, women's lacrosse, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's rowing, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming & diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The presidents and chancellors of Atlantic 10 institutions, in conjunction with Atlantic 10 Commissioner Bernadette V. McGlade, have made a strong commitment to making the academic and athletics equation a successful one. Over the years, the league membership has strived to better recognize the academic accomplishments of its stu-

dent-athletes. The Commissioner's Honor Roll, which cites every Atlantic 10 student-athlete with a 3.5 grade point average or better, recognized a record 1,359 student-athletes in the Fall 2011.

The league sponsors Academic All-Conference teams in each of its sports and honors two student-athletes as the A-10 Student-Athletes of the Year. Moreover, the Atlantic 10 provides four postgraduate scholarship grants to qualified student-athletes. In 2011-12, nearly 200 student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference recognition, while Dayton's Yvonne Marten, Jennifer Nalepa from Saint Louis, Marissa Norman of Rhode Island and Charlotte's Macey Ruble received postgraduate scholarship grants.

The Atlantic 10 has 56 of the more than 950 Division I sports teams being honored with public recognition awards

for their latest multi-year Academic Progress Rate scores. The Atlantic 10 Conference ranks fourth in number of teams publically recognized by the NCAA and fifth in overall APR

average among all 32 Division I Conferences with a 981 average. The league boasted 40 squads with perfect scores and 104 teams with a score of 990 or better. In total, 188 A-10 teams were at or above the national average, representing 70 percent of all A-10 teams. Of the 21 championship sponsored sports in the Atlantic 10, 19 had a sport average higher than the national average. There are six sports (field hockey, women's cross country, lacrosse, women's swimming & diving, women's indoor track & field and women's outdoor track & field) in which every A-10 team in that sport is above the national average.

The Atlantic 10 boasted a third-place ranking in the single-year Graduation Success Rate (GSR) among all Division I leagues. Measured in a six-year window, 89 percent of freshman enrolling in an A-10 institution in 2004 graduated. Twelve of the league's 14 institutions are above the national four-year GSR average of 80 percent and five of those programs, Dayton, George Washington, Richmond, Saint Joseph's and Xavier are all over 90 percent. The Atlantic 10 also rates in the Top 10 in men's basketball, women's basketball and baseball in the single-year GSR. The league is ninth nationally in men's basketball, graduating at a 74 percent rate, nearly seven percent above the national average. In women's basketball the league ranks sixth with an incredible 96 percent graduation rate for its 2004 freshman class, 10

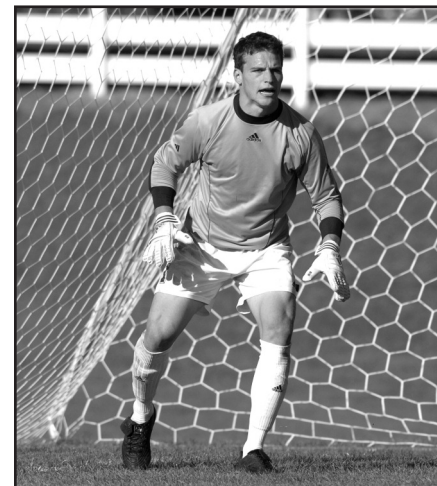
