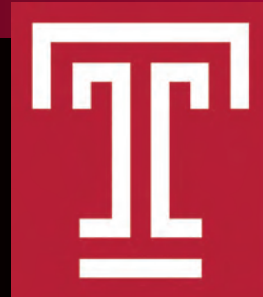

THIS WEEK

#22 Temple travels to Houston to face the Cougars in the inaugural American Athletic Conference championship game. The Owls made it after defeating UConn 27-3 on Senior Day at Lincoln Financial Field while Houston beat Navy 52-31 for the right to host the game. This will be the first time Temple plays for a conference championship.

Temple won the East Division with a 7-1 conference record and did so with a strong, balanced offense. Junior quarterback P.J. Walker has surpassed 2,000 yards for the third consecutive season and junior running back Jahad Thomas earned his first 1,000-yard season on the ground. Senior wide receiver Robby Anderson leads a deep group of receivers and is just the seventh Owl with 50 catches in a season. Redshirt freshman wideout Ventell Bryant has shattered all freshman records in his breakthrough season. Protecting Walker is a strong offensive line that has created the nation's best time of possession improvement since 2014. Houston brings a strong defense to challenge the Owls, led by senior defensive back William Jackson III.

Junior quarterback Greg Ward Jr. leads a potent attack for the Cougars, who went 11-1 this season, losing only at UConn. He finished the regular season with 69.3% completion rate and over 3,000 yards in total offense, with 13 throwing and 16 rushing touchdowns. He'll face one of the nation's top defenses in the Owls. Led by senior linebacker Tyler Matakevich, Temple's defense has been the difference in many of Temple's wins this year. Senior defensive back Tavon Young leads a very strong secondary that has picked off more passes this season than touchdowns allowed (16-11). The defensive line, keyed by seniors Nate D. Smith, Matt Ioannidis, and Hershey Walton, have contributed 32 sacks and are top-10 nationally in tackles for loss.

THE LAST TIME

Houston defeated Temple 31-10 last season at TDECU Stadium. The Cougars raced out to a 10-0 lead early and two Greg Ward Jr. touchdown passes in the third quarter solidified their advantage. P.J. Walker threw for 259 yards and a touchdown for the Owls but was plagued by turnovers, with three interceptions and a fumble while trying to run in a score to tie the game at 17. Jahad Thomas had 199 yards from scrimmage, including a 74-yard gain on a screen pass to get the Owls to first and goal. The Owls defense sacked Ward three times.

A 2ND CHANCE TO MAKE A 1ST IMPRESSION

Temple and Houston met in the first American Athletic Conference game on September 7, 2013. Saturday, they will meet in the first-ever American Athletic Conference Championship Game

UP NEXT

The Owls await their destination and opponent for a bowl game. A win could earn Temple access to a New Year's Six game as the highest ranked Group of Five conference champion.

POLL POSITION

For the first time in team history, the Owls were ranked for four consecutive weeks in the AP and Amway Coaches' Poll. After defeating #21 Memphis, the Owls returned to the polls at 25 and 24, respectively. In addition, Temple spent two weeks in the College Football Playoff Ranking, dropped out for one, and returned for two weeks following the Memphis victory.

HISTORY OF THE RIVALRY

Temple and Houston have only met four times in the past, with the Cougars winning all the match-ups. The teams played twice in the late 80s, when Temple was still an independent and Houston played in the now-defunct Southwest Conference. Those meetings were big wins for the Cougars, including a victory at the Astrodome in 1989, the year quarterback Andre Ward took home the Heisman. Both meetings as conference rivals have gone to Houston but have been much closer than the two previous games. A win would mean Temple has defeated every team in the American, after gaining the program's first victories against UCF and SMU earlier this year.

COACHING CONNECTIONS

While the two teams have become familiar by playing each other the past two seasons, there are members of each coaching staff who are familiar from working together in the past. Houston's defensive coordinator and linebackers coach Todd Orlando coached linebackers at the University of Pennsylvania. Two of those three seasons, his unit lined up against the offensive line and tight ends coached by Ed Foley, the Owls' assistant head coach who still works with tight ends, along with special teams.

HANDLING HOUSTON

While Coach Rhule's teams are 0-2 against the Cougars since both teams helped establish the American Athletic Conference, some players have been successful in the games. Senior linebacker Tyler Matakevich has 17 tackles in the two games, including 11 in 2013 at Lincoln Financial Field. Senior defensive lineman Matt Ioannidis led the game last year with ten tackles, including 2.5 for loss with a sack, and has 12 overall against Houston. Senior defensive back Tavon Young also has 12 tackles in the two games, including a forced fumble and a career-high three passes defended in 2013. On offense, redshirt-senior wide receiver John Christopher and redshirt-junior Romond Deloatch have three catches each in the two games. Junior defensive back Nate Hairston had a reception in 2013 when he played on offense. Junior running back Jahad Thomas set his career highs in Houston last year in receiving with two 70+-yard catches and 150 yards on the day.

CITY CONNECTIONS

The American Athletic Conference is proud of their connections to urban-based institutions of higher learning. Nine of the full-time member schools are in major cities, including Temple and Houston. Both schools have done well in recruiting student athletes from their home cities. The Owls have 12 players from Philadelphia. The Cougars have 13 Houston residents on their roster.

GOING BOWLING

The last time Temple played in a bowl game was 2011. Seven names on that roster appear on this season's. Robby Anderson, John Christopher, Brandon Chudnoff, Eric Lofton, Tyler Mayes, Nate D. Smith, and Hershey Walton were all freshmen who redshirted that season. Praise Martin-Oguke, also a freshman, played seven games that season but did not play against Wyoming in the New Mexico Bowl.

ROCKIN ROBBY

The Temple offense has returned to a traditional approach in 2015 but still has big-play capacity. One of the main targets when P.J. Walker wants to go deep is redshirt senior Robby Anderson. He has two 50+ yard catches this season and the only 100-yard game, gashing East Carolina for 126 yards on eight catches, including the go-ahead score in the fourth quarter. On Senior Day, he became the seventh Owl with 50 receptions in a year and needs just five more for 100 in his career.

FILLING THE NEST

Temple's home game against Notre Dame set a new attendance record for the program at Lincoln Financial Field with 69,280. This is the first season the Owls have multiple sellouts since moving off-campus permanently in 1976. The Penn State game on September 5th was also a sell-out, Temple's first since hosting the Nittany Lions in 1988 at Veterans Stadium. These were the two biggest crowds all season for an American team.

TAKING ON THE TOP 25

While this is just Temple's second ranked-vs.-ranked match-up in program history, Matt Rhule and his staff are no strangers to these contests. Before this season, Coach Rhule has been in 26 of these games, 19 as a player. Defensive line coach Elijah Robinson has participated in 19 such games, including seven as player. Defensive coordinator Phil Snow has coached in 18 ranked games, while linebackers coach Mike Siravo has seen six, five as a coach. First-year Owl coaches Glenn Thomas and Frisman Jackson have been in these games twice, as has offensive line coach Chris Wiesehan.

IT'S A LONG DRIVE

A tradition following a Temple victory is the football team, led by assistant head coach Ed Foley, singing "High Hopes." Philadelphians are familiar with the song popularized by former Phillies broadcaster Harry Kalas who made it his personal anthem. Stealing Kalas' material has become commonplace. His signature home run call, "...it's a long drive" has become a benchmark for the 2015 Owls. They have mounted a long drive in eight of the first 11 contests that have changed the complexion of the game.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

Temple entered the season with high expectations due to the veteran experience across the lineup. However, many freshmen have seen playing time for Coach Rhule. Twenty one freshmen, true and redshirt, have played in at least one game this season. On offense, they've made a significant impact. True freshman Ryquell Armstead has become the change-of-pace back, averaging 3.9 yards per carry. Jager Gardner set a program record with a 94-yard run from scrimmage against SMU and has taken over kickoff returns. The passing game has been lifted by two redshirt freshmen, wide receiver Ventell Bryant and tight end Kip Patton. Bryant has set new school records for freshman receivers with catches and yards, while Patton leads all tight ends in receiving.

IT'S NOT HOW YOU START IT'S HOW YOU FINISH

Temple has outscored opponents 243-81 in the second half this season. They hold a 112-26 3rd quarter margin and a 121-56 advantage in the fourth quarter.

CLOCK CONTROL

The Owls' return to a physical style offense and tenacious defense has helped the team dominate the opposition in time of possession. Ten games have seen Temple win the battle, with the Owls trailing in TOP against just ECU and Notre Dame. For the season, Temple has averaged 33:01 per game, best in the American and 13th in the nation.

BLOCK PARTY

The Owls' special teams coverage has come up with blocked kicks six times in 2015. At UMass, Praise Martin-Oguke blocked an extra point attempt that was returned for a defensive PAT by Will Hayes. At Charlotte, Sharif Finch crashed through to block a punt that Nate L. Smith recovered for a touchdown. Adonis Jennings also blocked a UCF punt, while Finch blocked two in the fourth quarter at East Carolina. Samuel Benjamin blocked a punt at South Florida. Since 2013, Temple has 13 blocked kicks, second best in the FBS in that span.

HOMECOMING FOR COACH THOMAS

There aren't many connections from North Broad to the Lone Star State. One that stands out is quarterbacks coach Glenn Thomas, who is a Texas native. He graduated from Texas Tech, one of Houston's old rivals in the Southwest Conference. His first coaching job after leaving his alma mater was at Midwestern State, a Division II school northwest of Dallas.

TY GOES TO THE RUNNER

Tyler Matakevich entered 2015 with a NCAA leading 355 career tackles and now has 473 for his career. He also is the only FBS player to lead his team in tackles every game of the 2015 season. He became the first Owl to record 100+ tackles in four seasons and only the seventh in NCAA FBS history.

NO FLY ZONE

The veteran Owls secondary continues strong play through 2015. The group held their ground against elite quarterbacks the first three weeks of the season and have become a deciding factor as the calendar turned to October. Temple leads the conference in passing efficiency defense and have allowed 211.4 yards per game and 11 passing touchdowns. The Owls are second in the American in interceptions with 16 and are second with 43 pass break ups.

PASSING THE BUCK

Junior QB P.J. Walker usually is the one flinging the pigskin for the Owls. Against Penn State, he was on the receiving end of a John Christopher wide receiver throwback for 25 yards and delighted the home crowd. After throwing a 2-point conversion to Colin Thompson against UCF, he caught one from Christopher, becoming the first Owl to do that in a game.

FLYING HIGH IN THE CLASSROOM

The spring of 2015 saw the Owls improve their performance in their studies while preparing for spring football. The team achieved a new high in the team GPA (2.91) for the semester. Senior center Kyle Friend earned the Temple Owl Club Academic Award for the highest GPA for the team during the 2014-15 academic year. Temple Football players have 38 different majors with 30 student-athletes enrolled in the prestigious Fox Business School.

THE WISE OWLS

Temple has five student-athletes who have already completed their undergraduate degrees on the team this season. They are wide receiver John Christopher (kinesiology), defensive lineman Brandon Chudnoff (kinesiology), defensive back Will Hayes (criminal justice), tight end Saledeem Major (accounting), and defensive lineman Hershey Walton (advertising). Twenty-two other student-athletes expect to have their degrees by December.

NIGHT OWLS

For a school founded on evening education and advancement, it seems appropriate that the Owls will play at least eight games in primetime this season. Temple defeated Cincinnati, Charlotte, East Carolina, and SMU on the road, along with UCF and UConn at home, while dropping a primetime network

showdown with Notre Dame and at South Florida. A bowl appearance at night would set a new school record with nine night games.

CLASS ACTS

The Senior CLASS Award celebrates student-athletes who stay in school to complete their degrees and excel in the classroom and community. The Owls nominated seven players for the 2015 award and two were among the 30 candidates announced: Kyle Friend and Tyler Matakevich. The two are the lone representatives of the American and the only teammates to make the list. Matakevich has since been named one of the ten finalists for the award.

THE JAHAD SQUAD

Owls Coach Matt Rhule vowed a return to Temple's power running style of previous seasons. The junior running back from Elizabeth, NJ has answered the challenge. Against UCF, he set career highs with 31 carries, 199 yards, and three scores. His 1,188 yards this season ranks second in the American Athletic Conference and has already doubled his 2014 output. He's also second with over 133 all-purpose yards per game. He could join Paul Palmer as the only Owls to record 2,000 all-purpose yards in a season.

FIGHTING THE POWER

Temple won its second consecutive season opener against a Power Five member school. Here are the other Group of Five schools with wins in consecutive seasons over Power Five schools

SENSATIONAL SCORING STREAKS

The Owls have put up points in 42 of 48 quarters this season and have allowed points in only 28 of those. In every win there has been at least one quarter where Temple held their opponent scoreless, including three each against Penn State, Charlotte, East Carolina, and UConn.

THE "CHAMP" IS HERE

Eight different Owls have over 100 career tackles. The only sophomore of the group is defensive back Sean "Champ" Chandler. He made his 100th total tackle at East Carolina in the Owls' victory. He ranks among the American's best in passes defended and has three interceptions with touchdown returns against Tulane and at SMU. He is also the youngest member of the Owls' single digit club.

CENTURY CLUB

Eight Owls on the current roster have accumulated over 100 career tackles:

Tyler Matakevich (473), Nate D. Smith (245), Sean Chandler (126), Tavon Young (126), Hershey Walton (114), Matt Ioannidis (111), Stephaun Marshall (108), and Jarred Alwan (108).

TEMPLE'S TUFF GUYS

Wearing a single-digit jersey is considered to be one of the highest honors an Owl can earn. These are awarded to the student-athletes deemed by their teammates to be the toughest members of the team. Seven of these carried over from last season but two spots were open following graduation. Jersey #4 has been awarded to redshirt sophomore linebacker Nick Sharga, while #5 went to junior running back Jahad Thomas, just the second offensive player on this list. RATINGS AND RANKINGS

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF RANKINGS

In the first College Football Playoff (CFP) rankings of the 2015 season, the Temple Owls came in at number 22, as announced on ESPN's live CFP rankings show on November 3. Temple made its first ever appearance in the CFP rankings and remained there for four of the next five weeks.

Beginning in 2014, the top four teams in the CFP rankings compete in a bracket style format for a chance to play for the national championship. This year's semifinals (the Capital One Orange Bowl and the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic) are on New Year's Eve, with the winners meeting in the College Football Playoff Championship. The 2016 CFP National Championship is slated for Jan. 11 at University of Phoenix Stadium in Glendale, Arizona.

In addition to determining the semifinal bowls, the selection committee is responsible for seeding teams in the New Year's Six bowls. After the top four teams are assigned to the semifinal sites, the committee fills the remaining bowl slots according to the CFP rankings and bowl agreements between conferences.

WE GIVE A HOOT ABOUT TV RATINGS

The Temple-Notre Dame match-up was the most-watched game in Week 9, nationally across all networks. The 17.6 rating in Philadelphia set a market record, as the game was watched in over 500,000 households in the area. Nationally, over 4 million fans saw the game on ABC, garnering a 3.9 overnight rating. The 3.9 rating was a 26% increase over Saturday Night Football in week 9 of 2014, which featured Ohio State at Penn State.

POSITION BY POSITION

QUARTERBACKS

This season Temple's quarterbacks will be led by Glenn Thomas, the quarterback coach who was hired after a seven year term with the Atlanta Falcons.

With 20 career starts entering the season, junior **P.J. Walker** is the established starter for the Owls. Walker earned the starting QB position midway through his freshman season and has not looked back. That season he threw for 200+ yards and at least one touchdown in all seven starts and challenged the all-time Temple passing marks with 2,084 yards and 20 TDs. Walker brought the Owls to a 6-6 record in 2014 but his personal stats suffered. He continues his assault on the Temple record books reigning in the top three in every major passing category.

Following the loss of Connor Reilly to graduation, there were question marks on who would emerge as Walker's backup. **Frank Nutile** was part of the 2014 recruiting class and redshirted last season after suffering a torn ACL during the first week of camp. He earned the spot behind Walker and was 3-3-40-1TD in his only extended action vs. Tulane.

Redshirt junior transfer **John Loughery** adds some collegiate experience to the mix after playing for Elon from 2013-14. The Wayne, Pa. native and William Penn Charter product played in 10 games and completed 77 of 58 passes for 284 yards for the Phoenix. He is the cousin of Falcons all-pro QB Matt Ryan who was tutored by Thomas in Atlanta.

Tim DiGiorgio was the only other quarterback with any game experience for the Owls entering the season. The redshirt sophomore saw mop-up duty in two early 2014 wins at Vanderbilt and vs. Delaware State.

Logan Marchi was part of the 2015 recruiting class and enrolled at Temple this past January. He is expected to redshirt.

WIDE RECEIVERS

Frisman Jackson, a six-year NFL wide receiver and seven-year college coach, is currently his first season as Temple's wide receivers coach.

Jackson inherited a talented group that was very raw. Gone is the leading receiver from a year ago. Jalen Fitzpatrick, who also was the team's leading receiver in 2012, graduated.

However, the receiver corps got an added jolt this summer when the Owls added redshirt-senior **Robby Anderson** and sophomore transfer **Adonis Jennings**. Anderson was Temple's leading receiver in 2013 but was ineligible in 2014. After rejoining the team in September 2013, Anderson eventually moved into the starting lineup and hauled in 34 passes for 657 yards and 9 TDs in that season's final five games. Jennings, who had 6 catches for 55 yards as a true freshman at Pitt last year, adds both size and speed.

John Christopher returns as the experienced veteran of the group. The redshirt senior and three-time letterwinner entered the season having played in 35 games as an Owl (tied for the most on the team). His 20 starts entering the season were more than all the other wide receivers combined.

Romond Deloatch, a redshirt-junior, is a big receiver who has thrived on the fade pattern in the end zone resulting in three touchdowns in 2014.

After redshirting, **Ventell Bryant** was one of the most improved players in the spring and earned a starting receiver role in the spring game. He continues to develop into one of Walker's top targets.

Brandon Shippen started nine games a year ago after making the conversion from defensive back. He scored a 35-yard touchdown on his first catch in the 2014 season opener.

Samuel Benjamin, a redshirt-junior, has shuttled between receiver and defensive back since injuring his shoulder making a catch in the 2013 season opener. Last season he fought his way on to the field and blocked two punts that were both recovered for TDs.

Two players who saw increased action as the 2014 season progressed were **Keith Kirkwood** and **Brodrick Yancy**. Kirkwood was a transfer from Hawaii who was granted a hardship waiver allowing him to play by the fifth game of 2014. He suffered an injury early on and will most likely redshirt this year. Yancy was part of the 2014 recruiting class. He made 6 catches for 35 yards, all in the final four games of 2014.

Sophomores **Tom Bradway** and **Marshall Ellick** and redshirt freshman **Matt Eaton** all add depth and contribute on special teams.

One of the most gifted athletes on the team (fastest 40 time and highest vertical jump), **Derrek Thomas** has been in and out of the lineup as he develops as a receiver.

Redshirt junior **Rob Heyen** continues to develop. He saw his first collegiate action in a 59-0 victory over Delaware State.

The 2015 class brought **Cortrelle Simpson** (Lackey/Indian Head, Md.). Sophomore **Willie Smith III** (Eagles View Academy/Jacksonville, Fla.) transferred from Seton Hill. **Corey Gaarn** (Cloister, N.J./Bergen Catholic) is a freshman walk-on.

TIGHT ENDS & FULLBACKS

Assistant head coach Ed Foley will tutor the tight ends and fullbacks for the third straight year. This season, he will also add special teams coordinator to his duties.

For the first time, however, Foley will enter a season returning some experience. In 2013, Foley was converting former quarterback Chris Coyer into a tight end. After the senior departed, Foley was left with few experienced players.

Colin Thompson, who transferred from Florida in 2014 after two seasons sidelined with a foot injury, played in nine games a year ago. He was slowly eased into the lineup after proper rehabilitation of his foot and learning the playbook. He has started the nine of the first eleven games.

Kip Patton was a 2014 recruit who spent the season redshirting and working with the defensive line. This season he has been the unit's most pleasant surprise leading the group with 9 catches for 149 yards.

Redshirt-senior **Saledeem Major** appears in multiple tight end sets. Redshirt-sophomore **Cole Boozer** sees limited action as he continues to develop and get stronger. Last season, quarterback **Thomas Rumer** made the switch to tight end. He continues to develop. Walk on **Chris Myarick** was impressive on the scout team and has earned playing time on special teams.

The 2015 recruiting class introduces **Patrick Anderson** (Aliquippa/Aliquippa, Pa.), **Roy Pugh** (Shabazz/South Orange, N.J.) and **Jake Robinson** (Haddonfield Memorial/Haddonfield, N.J.). Two newcomers are walkons **Alex Carling** (North Pocono High/Moscow, Pa.) and **Domenic Nigrelli** (Valley Forge/Wayne, Pa.).

Eric Neefe is the only returning fullback. He spent the past two seasons on the scout team. He will be joined this year by senior **Michael Felton**, redshirt-sophomore **Nick Sharga**, sophomore **Rob Ritrovato** and walk-on freshman **Daiqwon Buckley**. Sharga sees the most action, is one of the toughest players on the team, and also plays defense. Felton is a three-year letterwinner who played outside linebacker and has been a core special teams performer. Ritrovato was also a linebacker and played on special teams last season. Buckley (Dunmore, Pa. / Dunmore) is a bruising runner who enrolled at Temple after spending last season at Salisbury.

RUNNING BACKS

This season the running backs will be guided by offensive coordinator Marcus Satterfield. Satterfield spent the past two seasons working with the quarterbacks while coordinating the offense.

Gone from the stable of running backs is Kenneth Harper, the workhorse back over the past two seasons. Last year's leading ground gainer, **Jahad Thomas**, however, returns. Thomas, who made the transition from defensive back to running back, was explosive averaging 7.9 yards per touch from scrimmage. He gained 384 yards on 80 carries and added 364 yards on 14 receptions. This season he has been the Owls best weapon leading the conference for most of the season after opening with back-to-back 100+-yard rushing days. He has scored at least one rushing TD in every game thus far.

A strong 2015 Temple recruiting class was highlighted by two running backs who have provided immediate impact. **Jager Gardner** (Owen/Black Mountain, N.C.) holds the Western North Carolina record with 6,955 career rushing yards. He found a spot in the Temple record book as well with a 94-yard TD run at SMU - the longest run from scrimmage in school history. **Ryquell Armstead** (Millville/Millville, N.J.) reminds Temple coaches of former Owl Bernard Pierce. He rushed for 1,488 yards and 18 TDs as a senior. From the first day of camp, Armstead impressed and has seen the bulk of the carries behind Thomas.

David Hood was 8-62 rushing in a lopsided win over Delaware State in his only action as a freshman. He has seen more action in November.

OFFENSIVE LINE

With Chris Wiesehan beginning his second season as offensive line coach, the Owls will have consistency in the O-line for the first time since 2012.

That's good news for senior **Kyle Friend** who had three different position coaches in his first three seasons. Wiesehan's methods paid dividends for Friend who earned all-conference honors a year ago. One of the strongest (benches 225-lbs. 46 times) and quickest (4.95 / 40) linemen in the NCAA, the center led all current Owls in consecutive games played (43) and consecutive starts (41) until he got injured against Notre Dame. He was replaced by **Brendan McGowan** who started the first eight games of 2014 at right guard before moving to the left side.

Junior **Dion Dawkins** mans the left tackle position protecting the QB's blindside. He suffered an ankle injury last season in game 5 after leading the Owls to a 4-1 start. While he missed just one game, he played on the injured ankle for most of the season.

Four players have shared the other three starting spots.

Shahbaz Ahmed (eight starts at LG) switched from the defensive line in the spring of 2014 and added 30 pounds. After limited action in his first three years, **Eric Lofton** (three starts at RT, four at RG, one at LG) started every game of 2014 at right tackle. He is the Owls' most versatile offensive lineman.

Last season as a redshirt-freshman, **Brian Carter** (five starts at RG) bounced between defensive and offensive line. In fact, he started at defensive tackle at UCF and started at right guard two weeks later vs. East Carolina. One of the strongest players on the team, he earned a start at right guard against Penn State. He is joined on the right side by redshirt-sophomore **Leon Johnson** (six starts at RT), who stepped up during training camp to earn the starting nod.

The Owls are hoping to have similar results with redshirt junior **Julio Derosier** and junior **Kiser Terry**. After spending the 2014 season on the defensive line, both were switched to offensive line this spring.

Developing talent and depth on the offensive line has been a mission of Matt Rhule's since taking the head coaching position two years ago. His 2013 recruiting class which includes **Semaj Reed** and **Adrian Sullivan** continue to develop and each saw spot action last year. The 2014 class of **James McHale**, **Jaelin Robinson** and **Aaron Ruff** all redshirted a year ago. Each has benefited from an additional year in the weight room and are ready to challenge for playing time. The 2015 class of **Jovahn Fair** and **Benson Israel** have the talent to play right away but will most likely redshirt.

The Philadelphia area produced two walk-ons in 2014 for Temple -

Nick Apostolu (Springfield/Springfield, Pa.), and **Gordon Thomas** (Imhotep) - and both have continued to grow and develop. **Joseph Woerner** (Wycoff, N.J./Bergen Catholic) is a freshman walk-on.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Elijah Robinson, one of the brightest young coaches in the country, returns for his second season to lead the Owls' defensive line.

The unit is deep especially on the inside. Seniors **Matt Ioannidis** and **Hershey Walton** lead the way and are once again among the best in the conference. Ioannidis led the team last season with 11.0 tackles for loss and had a career-high and D-line leading 47 tackles. Walton has started 20 games in the past four seasons and has never missed a game.

Averee Robinson shares the spotlight with Walton. He has switched his number to 43 this season to honor his deceased brother Adrian who was a star at Temple from 2009-11 and played in the NFL for three seasons.

Adding to the mix this season are **Freddie Booth-Lloyd** and **Michael Dogbe**, who joined Temple in 2014 and redshirted.

Moving back to defensive end is redshirt-senior **Nate D. Smith** who has manned the middle for most of the past three seasons. Smith has averaged over 70 tackles but has had a knack for the big play with six forced fumbles, three recoveries, one interceptions and 6.5 sacks. He has notched 5.5 sacks in the first nine games of 2015.

Praise Martin-Oguike returned to the team after a two year absence and became a dominant force. He accumulated all 7.5 of his sacks in the final nine games and earned numerous player of the week honors after a 1.5 sack, 3.5 TFL, 3 forced fumble performance when Temple knocked off #21/19 East Carolina.

Redshirt-junior **Haason Reddick** seized the moment while Martin-Oguike battled a preseason injury and has made the most earning the start in the season's first eight games. A walk-on defensive back in 2012, Reddick has added considerable weight to his frame without losing his quickness.

Another player making his share of big plays was **Sharif Finch**. In the 2014 season's first three games, he had one sack, 3.5 TFLs, one forced fumble that he recovered for a touchdown and an interception that he returned 65-yards for another score. This year he added an INT and three blocked punts.

Brandon Chudnoff, **Avery Ellis**, and **Jacob Martin** continue to see action throughout most of the season in the rotation at end.

Julian Taylor saw limited repetitions in 2014. He was injured in the opener against Penn State and had surgery.

Redshirt sophomore **Jordan Jones** sat out last year after transferring from East Stroudsburg. He was converted from offensive line to defensive line this spring.

The 2015 recruiting class adds **Josiah Bronson** (Kentwood/Covington, Wash.), **DeAndre Kelly** (DeMatha/Hyattsville, Md.), and **Dana Levine** (Hallandale/Hallandale, Fla.). **Jeremy Reichner** (West Philadelphia Catholic/Philadelphia, Pa) is a walk-on freshman.

LINEBACKERS

Mike Siravo is now in his third straight year and his second term with Temple. Besides leading the linebackers, Siravo has been responsible for recruiting for the past two seasons for which Temple has received high marks.

For the first time in recent history, Temple entered the season with a legitimate All-America defensive candidate. WLB **Tyler Matakovich** has led the Owls in tackles in each of his three seasons, eclipsing the 100-tackle plateau each year. As such, he joins Steve Conjar and Joe Klecko as the only Temple players to reach that mark three times. In fact, Matakovich's 355 career tackles entering the season was the most of any current NCAA player and was

the only one with more than 300 to his credit. He continues to be a tackling machine as the only FBS player to lead his team in stops in every game of 2015.

The linebacking corp returned three other players who have started at some point from 2013-2014.

The most versatile player in the group is **Stephaun Marshall**. After making the conversion from safety, Marshall became the primary backup at all three linebacker positions and made five starts (3 at SLB and 2 at WLB).

Jarred Alwan is a tough, intelligent player who has started every game at MLB in 2015.

One of the leaders on the team is **Avery Williams**. After moving from running back to defensive back, he finally found a home at linebacker and emerged as the starting SLB last year.

Boye Aromire earned the opening day start at SS in 2014 but has moved to LB this season. He has seen action in every game so far this season, mostly on special teams.

Nick Sharga, a transfer from West Virginia Wesleyan, redshirted last year and has seen action at linebacker. He is also the starting fullback. **Jared Folks** and **Zack Mesday** both redshirted and will benefit from a year of development.

The 2015 recruiting class was strong on linebackers as the Owls added **Chapelle Russell** (Lakewood/Lakewood, N.J.), **Dalshaun Grimes** (Harmony/St. Cloud, Fla.), and **William Updegrove** (Berwick Area/Berwick, Pa.)

Joining the squad as walk-ons in 2015 are: **Mike DiFrancesco** (Neumann-Goretti/Philadelphia, Pa.), and **Todd Jones** (St. Joe's Prep/Philadelphia). Jones has risen up the depth chart and has earned play on special teams.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

This unit, which made the biggest strides in 2014, is headed by defensive coordinator Phil Snow and defensive back coach Fran Brown. Snow concentrates on the safeties and Brown on the corners.

Three-year letterwinner **Tavon Young** is the most experienced and also has proven to be the biggest playmaker. From 2012-2014, he has accounted for seven of Temple's 16 interceptions. In 2014, he had four picks, returned one for a 93-yard TD, and added a fumble return for a 63-yard score.

Sean Chandler made people take notice from the time he walked on campus. As a true freshman, he earned the starting corner spot and was voted by his teammates to wear a single-digit jersey (give to the toughest members of the team). He didn't allow a single touchdown until the 11th game of the season and was a major reason why the team shaved 100-yards off its average of passing yards allowed per game from the previous year.

Redshirt-junior **Nate Hairston**, who has played at wide receiver, has made the switch to defensive back. Redshirt sophomores **Artrel Foster** and **Cequan Jefferson** add depth.

Anthony Davis and **Khiry Lucas** had a chance to see action at corner last season. Both suffered injuries and were limited in the spring. Joining them at cornerback is 2015 recruit **Kareem Ali**, a four-star selection out of Timber Creek High (Sicklerville, N.J.), and walk-ons **Jarrid Satterfield** (Willingboro, N.J.) and **Eriq Fadahunsi** (Indian Head, Md./Lackey).

At safety two starters returned, each of whom started more than

half the games last season. **Alex Wells**, a JUCO transfer, started the season at free safety but missed three games due to injury. He has started every game this season. **Will Hayes** (7 starts; 45 tackles) has once again been a strong player in the secondary. He started the first four games before missing three to injury.

Hayes' injuries opened the door for **Nate L. Smith** who showed considerable improvement during camp. He has started five games and is among the leaders in tackles.

Jyquils Thomas, a 2014 recruit, redshirted last season but earned the most improved defensive player award in the spring.

Added to the mix are 2015 recruit **Jeremiah Atoki** (Vineland South/Vineland, N.J.), 2014 recruit **Delvon Randall** (Gateway/Monroeville, Pa.) who spent last fall at East Coast Academy. Randall is the only true freshman to see action on defense.

SPECIALISTS

After a disastrous 2013 season, the kicking game made strides in 2014 thanks in part to three true freshmen walk-ons. **Austin Jones** led the team with 69 points. He was perfect on 30 PATs and was 13-22 on field goals. He has been nearly perfect this season. **Alex Starzyk** showcased a powerful punting leg with a 38.4-yard average. Although inconsistent, his best game came in a victory over #21/19 East Carolina when he nailed five of nine punts inside the 20 in a rain-soaked field position battle. Both kickers benefited from long snapper **Corey Lerch** who won an open battle among five long snappers - **Josh Lang** will serve as the backup. Both improved their numbers over last season, with Jones currently holding the best FG percentage in a season for kickers with 20 or more attempts.

Jager Gardner will handle kickoff returns backed by **Ryquell Armstead** and **Robby Anderson**. **Sean Chandler** and **Anderson** are the leading punt returners.

HEAD COACH MATT RHULE

Penn State '97
9th Season at Temple (3rd as Head Coach)



On December 17, 2012, Matt Rhule (pronounced RULE) returned to North Broad Street to take the helm as head coach of the Temple Owls. Following six seasons as one of Al Golden's top assistants, he joined the New York Giants as the assistant offensive line coach in 2012. He is now in his third year as the 26th Owls head coach and 9th on the Temple campus.

Prior to the start of his first season in charge he offered that his squad would produce an exciting brand of football and they would improve as the season progressed. Rhule delivered on those promises as the 2013 Owls produced nearly 400 yards per game of offense (the second best total in school history). Despite an 0-6 start to the season, the troops never surrendered and the team never trailed at the start of the fourth quarter in the second half of the season. The mission in the 2014 off-season was to learn how to finish out games.

They did just that, allowing only 23 fourth quarter points in all of 2014. That adjustment, and the overall improved play of the defense, helped the Owls to a 6-6 record.

On June 25, 2015, Rhule was rewarded with a four-year contract extension that will keep him on the Temple sidelines through the 2021 season. Temple's Director of Athletics Dr. Patrick Kraft announced, "Matt Rhule is one of the best young coaches in college football and we are excited that he will be at the helm of Temple Football through at least 2021. Matt has the program heading in the right direction, especially as we enter a very promising season on the gridiron, and we are confident that he is the right person to take the program to even greater heights."

The State College, PA, native, a former player at Penn State, has 17 years of collegiate coaching experience, including eight seasons at Temple, and six bowl games -- two with the Owls -- on his resume.

Rhule joined the Giants in the spring of 2012. He worked closely with Pat Flaherty, who has been the offensive line coach since 2004. They finished the 2012 campaign at 9-7, second in the NFC East, and averaged 355 yards of offense per game. Four New York players, including guard Chris Snee, were selected to the Pro Bowl.

During his previous tenure at Temple, Rhule's role changed several times. In spring 2011, he was promoted to co-offensive coordinator after serving as the assistant offensive coordinator and tight ends coach as well as the recruiting coordinator under Steve Addazio in 2011. Temple's 2012 recruiting class was ranked #1 in the Mid-American Conference and helped lay the foundation for the program's transition to the Big East Conference.

Under Al Golden, Rhule was promoted to offensive coordinator in the spring of 2008. He also coached the TU quarterbacks. He coached the defensive line in 2006 and served as the quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. For three consecutive years, Temple's recruiting class was ranked #1 in the MAC [2006, 2007, 2008].

In 2011, the Owls went 9-4 and played in the fourth bowl game in school history, the Gildan New Mexico Bowl, where they crushed Wyoming, 37-15 -- Temple's first postseason victory since the 1979 Garden State Bowl. Rhule mentored two-time first-team All-MAC selection TE Evan Rodriguez. For the second time in Rhule's tenure, the Owls set the Temple single-season rushing yardage record and rushing touchdowns records behind the explosive efforts of All-MAC junior running backs Bernard Pierce and Matt Brown.

In 2010, Rhule helped guide the team to an 8-4 regular-season record, and the Owls recorded back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1978-79, including their first win over a BCS team. The Owls recorded the largest margin of victory (42 points against Buffalo) in a MAC game. A school record six offensive players earned All-MAC honors, including repeat first-team honorees OL Colin Madison, OL Darius Morris, and RB Bernard Pierce as well as first-time honoree TE Evan Rodriguez.

In 2009, Rhule's offense helped TU win a single-season record nine consecutive games en route to a 9-4 overall record and first-place tie in the MAC East. Under Rhule's guidance, the Owls set the Temple single-season rushing yardage record. A school record five offensive players were named All-MAC, in-

cluding three on the first team. All-American Bernard Pierce rushed his way into the Temple record book, re-writing all records for a rookie en route to 2009 MAC Freshman of the Year honors.

In 2008, Rhule took the reins as offensive coordinator, helping the Owls to their most wins in nearly two decades. The Owls outscored their opponents for the season for the first time since 1990. Rhule coached All-MAC honorees C Alex Derenthal and school record holder WR Bruce Francis, while QB Adam DiMichele set the school record for passing touchdowns with six in the 55-52 win over Eastern Michigan. Francis set the school records for career receiving TDs (23) and consecutive games with a reception (38).

Rhule arrived in Owl Country after spending four seasons as an assistant coach at Western Carolina, including three as assistant head coach.

From 2002 to 2005, Rhule was an assistant at Western Carolina under head coach Kent Briggs, serving as assistant head coach during his last three seasons. In 2005, he was offensive line coach and run game coordinator after directing the linebackers his first three years. Rhule was special teams coordinator during his tenure in Cullowhee (NC). In 2005, the Catamounts led Division I-AA in kickoff returns, averaging 27.44 yards per return. Sophomore Mike Malone earned first team All-Southern Conference honors with a 31.29 yards per kickoff return average, ranking second nationally. Two offensive linemen and the team's punter captured second team all-league accolades.

In 2004, WCU ranked 12th nationally in total defense and 15th in pass defense, largely due to the production of Rhule's linebacker corps. The team's top five tacklers were linebackers in its eight man front scheme. In 2003, the Catamounts led the SoCon in rush defense for the first time in school history.

Rhule arrived at Western Carolina after serving as assistant defensive line coach at UCLA in 2001. He assisted in coaching five Bruins that earned All PAC-10 honors as the team posted a 7-4 record under head coach Bob Toledo.

From 1999 to 2000, Rhule served as an assistant coach at Mid-American Conference member Buffalo, directing the Bulls defensive line in 2000 and working as assistant defensive line coach in 1999. In 2000, the team's sack total increased from 12 to 27 utilizing a 3-4 alignment. Buffalo also earned its first two Division I-A victories that season.

Rhule began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Penn State in the spring of 1998 before working at Albright College in Reading, PA for the 1998 season. At Albright, he coached the linebackers in a 4-3 scheme and recruited western and central Pennsylvania.

Rhule played four seasons at linebacker with the Nittany Lions under Joe Paterno. A three-time Penn State Scholar-Athlete, he earned Academic All-Big Ten honors in 1997. He received his undergraduate degree in political science before earning his master's degree in educational psychology from Buffalo in 2003.

Born January 31, 1975, he spent his childhood in New York City before moving to State College, PA, as a teenager.

He is married to the former Julie Nibert. The couple has a son, Bryant (10), and daughters, Vivienne (2) and Leona (newborn).

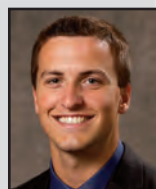

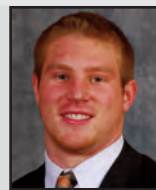

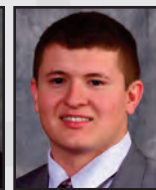

Temple Beats Penn State in Keystone State Battle

PHILADELPHIA - Jahad Thomas rushed for 135 yards and two touchdowns and P.J. Walker completed 15-of-20 passes for 143 yards and added a rushing touchdown to lead Temple to a 27-10 win over visiting Penn State Saturday afternoon in front of a home record crowd of 69,176 at Lincoln Financial Field.

The win was the first for the Owls (1-0) over the Nittany Lions (0-1) since the 1941 season.

After allowing 10 points on Penn State's first two possessions, the Cherry and White defense took control, holding the Nittany Lions scoreless the rest of the way.

Senior LB Tyler Matakevich, who entered the game with a nation's best 355 tackles, recorded a team-high seven tackles, including a career-best three sacks. In all, the Owls defense sacked Penn State QB Christian Hackenberg 10 times and limited the signal caller to 11-25 passing for 103 yards. Junior DL Sharif Finch intercepted Hackenberg to set up Temple's go-ahead third quarter touchdown.

After the game, Temple head coach Matt Rhule said, "The reason I believe we won is because we focused on ourselves and the players bought into that and only worried about the next play. After the game I said we won, it's not about Penn State it is about us. For our guys to do that and focus on themselves shows great maturity."

Penn State jumped out early, scoring on its first two drives. The Nittany Lions got a 33-yard run from Brandon Polk on their first snap, but the Owls defense clamped down in the red zone, forcing a 34-yard field goal from Joey Julius. Following a second consecutive punt, Penn State took the ball 75 yards in six plays, capped off by a 42 yard touchdown run by Akeel Lynch to make the lead 10-0.

The Owls defense then came to life, and kept the PSU offense in check the remainder of the game. After the two scoring drives, Temple forced four straight PSU three-and-outs as the defense began to dominate the line of scrimmage.

Following a punt to the Temple seven, the Owls offense found some rhythm. Walker and Thomas each took off for first down runs. Walker then found redshirt freshman WR Ventell Bryant for 25 yards on third down and 16. Thomas broke off runs of 12 and 31 yards to give the Owls first-and-goal at the Penn State 2.

Two runs into the line produced just one yard so head coach Matt Rhule dialed up some trickery. With freshman RB Ryquell Armstead in front of Thomas, Walker faked the belly run before tossing a wide pitch to Thomas, who recorded his first rushing TD as an Owl. The 12-play, 93-yard drive was the longest scoring drive for the Owls since the 99-yard march at Lincoln Financial Field last season in the 35-24 win over Tulsa on October 11.

The Owls tied the game on their second drive on the second half. Walker hit redshirt freshman TE Kip Patton for a



20-yard catch and run, followed by a wide receiver throwback from redshirt senior WR John Christopher to Walker for 25 yards. The drive stalled out at the PSU 23, but Austin Jones converted his first attempt of the year from 40 yards out to make it 10-10 with 6:23 remaining in the third quarter.

Finch then intercepted Hackenberg and galloped 26 yards to the Penn State 2. Walker then ran it in from one-yard out to give Temple a 17-10 lead.

Following another Temple defensive stop capped by a Nate D. Smith sack to open the fourth quarter, Walker drove the Owls 49 yards in five plays with Jahad Thomas' 24-yard TD, a lane-changing scamper capping the drive. Following another defensive stand, Jones added a 30-yard

insurance field goal to extend the lead to 27-10.

Walker was stellar behind center Kyle Friend, connecting with eight different receivers on the day. Redshirt senior WR Robby Anderson led the way with five catches while Bryant had two catches for a team-high 41 receiving yards.

It was a total team effort on defense. Besides Matakevich, Tavon Young added six tackles while Nate D. Smith had five tackles and two sacks. Five other Owls, Jarred Alwan, Matt Ioannidis, Haason Reddick, Stephaun Marshall and Jacob Martin, all registered sacks in the contest.

After the game, Thomas discussed the thrill of victory: "It felt great to see the excitement of the fans and players. Temple has been in a drought for the last few years and for us to come out and do this for the fans and for Philadelphia, it felt great."

Owls Take Down Bearcats in American Athletic Conference Showdown

CINCINNATI – Jihad Thomas rushed for a career-high 193 yards and senior LB Tyler Matakevich made two interceptions, including one in the end zone in the final seconds, as the Temple Owls defeated the Cincinnati Bearcats 34-26 at Nippert Stadium in American Athletic Conference play Saturday night. A crowd of 38,122 came out for the conference opener and saw the Owls defense withstand a late Bearcat surge to go to 2-0 and defeat their division rival for the first time on the road since 1985.

Temple took the lead in the first quarter following a Bearcat fumble that gave the Owls the ball on the Cincinnati 45. Initially the Bearcats were ruled to have recovered the ball, but Temple head coach Matt Rhule challenged the call and it was determined that senior safety Will Hayes had recovered. The Owls marched 23 yards in five plays with Austin Jones opening scoring with a 40-yard field goal.

The Bearcats put together two prolonged drives, but settled for two Andrew Gantz field goals to take a 6-3 lead in the second quarter. The Owls responded with a drive before the half. Thomas broke off consecutive runs of 12 and 18 yards to get the ball into the red zone. After a delay of game penalty, junior quarterback P.J. Walker hit Thomas, his high school teammate, for 22 yards down the far sideline for a first-and-goal at the 2. After Thomas plunged for a yard, Walker looked right and hit senior fullback Michael Felton in the end zone for a one-yard strike, his first career catch, silencing the white-clad student section in the end zone.

Thomas was just getting started. He took the second-half kickoff 100 yards to the house, tying a program record, and stretching the lead to 17-6 before fans could return with their halftime concessions. The Bearcats responded with an 88-yard bomb from Kiel to Mekale McKay to cut the lead. Senior cornerback Tavon Young broke up the two-point conversion try to keep the edge at 17-12. Temple responded with another Thomas run, this time 56 yards to stretch the lead to 24-12.

The defense forced another turnover as sophomore cornerback Sean Chandler batted a ball into the arms of Matakevich, who made a sprawling interception at the Bearcats' 27. The Owls turned that into Walker's second TD throw as he found Robby Anderson in the back corner of the end zone from 13 yards out to make it 31-12. An Alex Wells interception on the following Bearcat possession set up a nine-play, 25-yard drive that ate up 5:09 and led to Jones' second field goal of the evening, as he converted from 35 yards.

The Bearcats responded with a drive that ended with a Tion Green direct snap from six-yards out to cut the lead to 31-19. Another late drive was thwarted by a second Wells interception and 57-yard return. Kiel led another touchdown drive with a two-yard pass to Shaq Washington that made it 34-26. However, Matakevich recovered the onside kick attempt at the Bearcats' 45. The game took

another twist as Thomas fumbled and the Bearcats recovered. Kiel strung together passes and got his team five yards from a comeback. However, another Chandler tip in the end zone saw the ball fall into the outstretched arms of Matakevich with 13 seconds on the clock. The Owls defense finished the game with five takeaways, including four INTs.

Owls Stay Unbeaten With Thrilling, Last Minute Win at UMass

FOXBORO - Junior quarterback P.J. Walker set a career-high with 391 yards passing and led a last-minute drive that set up sophomore kicker Austin Jones' 32-yard game-winning field goal to lift Temple to a 25-23 win over Massachusetts Saturday afternoon at Gillette Stadium. The Owls move to 3-0 on the season for the first time since 2010.

Walker, whose 391 passing yards is third most in Temple history, finished the game completing 28 of 48 passes with one touchdown and two interceptions. On the final drive, he hit four key completions, including a 12-yard pass to senior wide receiver John Christopher with 12 seconds left at the UMass 15 yard line to set up Jones' game-winning kick.



Frohnappfel then led his team on an eight-play, 59 yard drive, hitting Wilson on a 16-yard go-ahead touchdown with 1:20 on the clock to make it 23-20. Martin-Oguike then made the play of the day, blocking the extra point with Marshall and Hayes taking it all the way back for a two-point play to make it 23-22.

Walker then led the Owls on a 10-play drive over the final minute and change to set up Jones' winning kick from the left hash. The Temple QB completed six of nine passes on the winning drive with Jones making his seventh field goal on the season in seven attempts.

Thomas, who leads the conference in all-purpose yards, had 164 on the day (66 rushing, 67 receiving, 31 return).

Christopher led Temple with seven catches for 72 yards while the offense compiled 458 total yards to UMass' 438.

After the Minutemen took a

23-20 with 1:20 to go, redshirt-junior Praise Martin-Oguike blocked the point-after attempt and junior LB Stephoun Marshall recovered before flipping to senior DB Will Hayes took the lateral and returned the ball for a defensive PAT to close the gap to 23-22.

The Owls defense, for the second week in a row, made a play when the team needed it. They created two turnovers in the game, including a late interception by Marshall. The defense also held the Minutemen to 45 yards rushing on the afternoon and kept pressure on senior quarterback Blake Frohnappfel. Senior linebacker Tyler Matakovich registered nine tackles to lead the way while Nate D Smith recorded an 11-yard sack to stifle a Minutemen drive in the second half. The team won the time of possession battle in every quarter and finished the game with 35:09 of ball control.

Temple jumped out to a 14-0 lead with sophomore WR Adonis Jennings pulling in his first TD reception as an Owl on a 23-yard strike from Walker in the final minutes of the first quarter. Then, following a fumble recovery by senior DL Matt Ioannidis on the ensuing UMass possession, junior RB Jahad Thomas ran 14 yards untouched for the Owls' second score.

The Minutemen responded with a long TD throw from Frohnappfel to Rodney Mills for 46 yards to cut the lead to 14-7. UMass' Blake Lucas connected from 34 yards out to make it 10-7. Jones matched that for the Owls from 33 yards away to make it 17-10. Frohnappfel then led the hosts down the field, finding Mills for a five yard score to tie the game right before halftime.

The Owls took the second-half kickoff and marched 55 yards on 13-play, six-plus minute drive to set up Jones for his second field goal of the game, this one from 37-yards out. That would account for all of the scoring until the game's final minutes as the second half would be a defensive battle.

With just under three minutes to play, Marshall picked off Frohnappfel at midfield. It looked then as if the Owls would be able to run out the clock, but Thomas then gave the Minutemen the ball back via a fumble just two plays later.

Temple Storms Through Charlotte to Stay Unbeaten

CHARLOTTE – The Temple Owls defeated the Charlotte 49ers, 37-3, at a rain-soaked Jerry Richardson Stadium Friday night. A crowd of 13,105 braved the elements and watched the Owls improve to 4-0 (1-0 The American), marking the program's best start since 1974. Junior RB Jahad Thomas rushed for 109 yards and two touchdowns and junior QB P.J. Walker threw two scores to redshirt senior WR Robby Anderson.

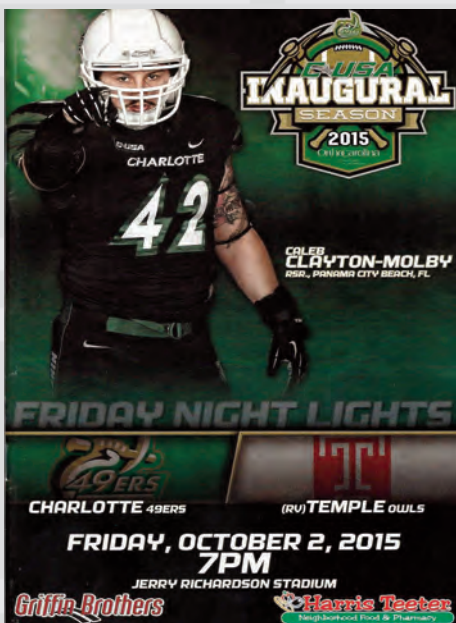
The defense was impressive all night and held the hosts scoreless in the second half. Junior DL Sharif Finch blocked a punt and Nate L. Smith returned it 16 yards for a score.

The rain led to some sloppy conditions in the first half. Walker was plagued by receiver drops, but passed Adam DiMichele for fourth place all-time in passing yards with his first completion to Brodrick Yancy. Temple's first long drive led to a 36-yard field goal attempt by Austin Jones. The Owls reliable kicker then missed his first attempt of the season. However, the Owls defense forced a long field goal by 49ers kicker Blake Brewer, but he missed from 55. Temple took the ball and broke the stalemate in the second quarter as Jones connected from 39 yards away. Charlotte drove into the red zone but Brewer's 26-yard attempt missed.

After an exchange of punts, the Owls got down to business. Walker led the Owls on a signature long march, 76 yards in 13 plays, converting three times on third down. Thomas punched in his fourth rushing touchdown of the season to cap the 6:19 drive. Charlotte got on the scoreboard with a 36-yard field goal. With a five-yard tackle for loss to stall the drive, Temple LB Tyler Matakevich passed Taylor Suman and Al Singleton for third all-time in career tackles. He finished the game with eight tackles, and now has 392 for his Temple career which is the most among active players.

As the rain intensified following halftime, so did the Owls. After forcing a three-and-out, the offense took a short field and Thomas scored his second touchdown of the game from one-yard out. The defense forced a second three-and-out and another short punt gave the Owls good field position. This time Walker moved the team 39 yards and found Anderson from 11 yards out to make it a 24-3 lead. The defense stood tall again and Finch then made his huge play, blocking Arthur Hart's punt. Smith corralled and ran it in for a touchdown, the first blocked punt return to paydirt since Samuel Benjamin's at UCF last season. However, Jones' extra point was blocked, marking the first miss of his career.

Walker led a final scoring drive in the fourth quarter. Following a season-long 74-yard interception return by Nate L. Smith, Walker connected with Anderson again, this time 13 yards for the score. The catch gave Anderson his fourth career multiple touchdown game and his first since the 2013 finale at Memphis. Walker finished the game 11 for 23 with two touchdowns and no interceptions and no sacks. He also rushed four times for 18 yards. Redshirt freshman Frank Nutile finished the game behind center as



Owls coach Matt Rhule got many players on the field. That included North Carolina native freshman Jager Gardner. The win gave the Owls their first three-game road trip sweep in program history.

Temple Records Best Homecoming Victory on Record with 49-10 Win vs. Tulane

PHILADELPHIA - Junior quarterback P.J. Walker threw for 183 yards and two touchdowns while freshman running back Ryquell Armstead rushed for two more, as Temple defeated Tulane, 49-10, on Homecoming at Lincoln Financial Field. The Owls move to 5-0 for the first time since 1974, also improving to 2-0 in The American.

Junior running back Jahad Thomas rushed for a touchdown and caught another, while the defense pitched their second consecutive shutout in the second half. After falling behind, 10-7, Temple allowed Tulane just 30 yards of offense the rest of the way, as the Owls won their seventh-consecutive homecoming game with 35,179 on hand. The 39-point margin of victory was the largest Homecoming win for Temple in over 25 years (record only kept back to 1989).

Coach Rhule was very pleased with the performance but was more excited to get so many players into the game. "I'm very pleased to get a win at homecoming and improve to 5-0. I'm proud of our team and I thought they showed resiliency and made plays when they had to in all three areas; offense, defense and special teams. That was a great win for us in that every kid that could get into the game that was not injured or redshirted. That's really important to our team to get all those kids [a chance to play in front of our home crowd]."

The Green Wave scored first, converting a fumble on the opening possession into a 27-yard field goal by Andrew DiRocco. After trading punts, Walker led the Owls down the field, capping an 80-yard, six-play drive with a touchdown pass to Robby Anderson. Anderson had earlier extended the Temple drive with a spectacular sideline catch in double coverage on 3rd-and-12.

Tulane answered after the Owls had a punt hit a player downfield and retook the lead, 10-7, on a seven-yard pass by Tanner Lee to Teddy Veal.

A miscue on the subsequent kickoff started Temple on their 10 yard line. After a sack and a fumble made it second and 29, Jahad Thomas picked up 28 yards up the middle, and added a three-yard run to give the Owls the first down in Tulane territory. Walker followed with a 43-yard strike to redshirt freshman tight end Kip Patton, setting up a 10-yard touchdown run from Thomas that made it 14-10. The score kept Thomas' touchdown streak alive, as the junior has recorded a rushing touchdown in every game this season.

On the next possession, the Green Wave botched a punt attempt to put the Owls on the Tulane 12. After a loss by Thomas, Walker picked out his high school teammate for a 16-yard catch-and-run to push the Temple lead to 21-10. The pass tied Walker with Adam DiMichele for 2nd all-time in Owls' history.

Up 21-10 at the half, the Owls' defense took over. They



forced four three-and-outs and limited Tulane to two first downs in the final two quarters. The Temple defensive unit also forced two turnovers, including a 22-yard interception return by sophomore defensive back Sean Chandler in the third quarter. The score marked the third consecutive game a defensive back has put up points for Temple, which included Will Hayes' defensive PAT at UMass and Nate L. Smith's blocked punt return at Charlotte.

While the defense subdued the Green Wave, the offense continued to rack up points. Armstead scored his first career touchdown on a 16-yard run to cap a six-play, 70-yard drive. After Chandler's touchdown, junior linebacker Avery Williams' first interception of the year set the Owls up on the Tulane 15. Arm-

stead then tallied his second of the game from 16 yards out to make it 42-10.

Walker came out for redshirt freshman Frank Nutile after the 3rd quarter ended, finishing the game 11-for-15 with 183 yards, two touchdowns, and no interceptions. Nutile capped the scoring with his first-career passing touchdown, hitting David Hood from 10-yards out. Sophomore kicker Austin Jones converted all seven extra-point attempts during the game.

Temple Ties Best Start Ever at 6-0 With 30-16 Win Over UCF

PHILADELPHIA - Junior running back Jahad Thomas set career highs with 31 carries, 199 yards, and three touchdowns to lead Temple to a 30-16 win over visiting UCF in front of 31,372 at Lincoln Financial Field on Saturday night.

The Owls tied the best start in school history at 6-0 with the win, matching the 1935, 1945, and 1974 teams. With the victory, Temple became bowl-eligible for the fifth time in the last seven years, while moving to 3-0 in the American Athletic Conference.

After the game, Coach Rhule praised the effort of the players. "I'm really happy to be 6-0. For the guys who went 2-10 and didn't go to a bowl game, for the guys who stuck with us and didn't quit, for the guys who worked and worked, for the guys who lost this game two years ago to know that they're 6-0 and bowl eligible, I'm really proud of them. It talks about the character for the guys on the team."



more scampered for a 65-yard return to UCF's 21-yard line, electrifying a chilly crowd at "The Linc." Two plays later, Thomas put the Owls back in front with a 22-yard touchdown run. Walker then found junior tight end Colin Thompson for the two-point conversion and a 22-16 Owls' advantage.

Chandler provided another strong return after Temple forced UCF's fifth three-and-out of the night and the Owls began on the Knights' 48. Thomas did the leg work, collecting all of the yardage on the drive, capped by his third score of the game, a 21-yard touchdown. Again the Owls went for two, this time it was senior wide receiver John Christopher on the wide-out throwback to Walker, making the lead, 30-16.

Matakevich then sealed the Temple victory, intercepting a pass on the subsequent Knights' possession. Temple's win tonight is the first for the Owls over the Knights in the brief rivalry.

Senior linebacker Tyler Matakevich made history with his 400th-career tackle, becoming just the third Owl to reach the milestone. He finished the game with eight tackles, three solo, also adding a late interception.

Temple started the game with a strong drive, capped by Thomas' first score of the night from 12 yards out. The touchdown was the first for the Owls in an opening drive since October 11, 2014 against Tulsa. Matakevich then made history on the first offensive series for UCF, recording his 400th-career tackle on the first snap. He added tackle number 401 later in the series, as UCF was forced to punt.

After a three-and-out for Temple, Matthew Wright got UCF on the board with a 48-yard field goal. Temple quarterback P.J. Walker answered for the Owls, marching the offense 86 yards in 10 plays, capped by a touchdown throw to red-shirt freshman wide receiver Ventell Bryant. Bryant's first career score marked the 41st touchdown of Walker's career, as he passed Adam DiMichele for second all-time in program history.

Miscues hurt the Owls in the middle quarters. After Adonis Jennings blocked a Knights punt, the Owls set up on the Knights' 29. However, a Walker pass was intercepted and returned 81 yards by UCF's Shaquill Griffin, cutting the lead to 14-10. A muffed punt by Temple then gave the Knights possession, with Wright adding a second field goal to make it 14-13 at the half.

UCF took the lead on the opening drive of the second half thanks to Wright's third field goal of the evening. The Knights then forced a pair of turnovers and a punt on Temple's next three possessions and looked poised to keep their lead.

Temple was able to force UCF to punt after the Knights started on the Owls' 39-yard line, setting up a spectacular return from defensive back, Sean Chandler. The sopho-

Temple Stays Unbeaten for School Record 7-0 Start

GREENVILLE, N.C. - Redshirt senior WR Robby Anderson and junior RB Jahad Thomas scored late fourth quarter touchdowns to lift #22/24 Temple to a 24-14 come-from-behind win at East Carolina Thursday night at Dowdy-Ficklen Stadium. The win moves Temple to 7-0, the best start in program history, and 4-0 in American Athletic Conference play.

Junior QB P.J. Walker was stellar down the stretch, connecting on 19-of-35 for 250 yards and one touchdown on the day. It was his 51-yard pass play to Anderson that set-up the Owls' go-ahead touchdown. Anderson had a season-best eight catches for 126 yards with his one touchdown, a 23-yard reception, with 3:31 to play to give the Cherry and White a 17-14 lead.

Junior DL Sharif Finch blocked two punts on the day, the second coming on East Carolina's ensuing possession to help seal the win. Redshirt freshman WR Ventell Bryant fell on the live ball at the ECU 15, which set up Thomas' second touchdown of the game, a 14-yard run, making it 24-14.

All-America candidate Tyler Matakevich, the team's defensive leader, tied his season-high with 13 tackles while also making his team-leading fourth interception. The senior linebacker helped hold the Pirates scoreless throughout the second half and now has 420 tackles for his career.

The Owls now have a two-game lead over East Carolina (4-4, 2-2 American) in the conference's East Division. Temple also snapped ECU's streak of 26-straight games that the Pirates had won when leading at halftime.

After a sluggish opening quarter with the only points coming on a 28-yard Austin Jones field goal, both offenses opened things up in the second quarter.

The Pirates took their first lead on their first drive of the second quarter. Marching 80 yards on 14 plays in its second longest scoring drive of the season, ECU converted a huge fourth and eight play with Blake Kemp (31-48, 272 yds, 1 TD) connecting with Trevon Brown to the Temple 19. Two plays later, Kemp found Isaiah Jones cutting over the middle for a 14-yard completion to the one yard-line. Chris Hairston then plowed it in for a touchdown to give the Pirates a 7-3 advantage.

The Owls answered with a 12-play, 75-yard drive on their next possession. Two big pass plays, Walker to sophomore WR Adonis Jennings (20 yds) and Bryant (22 yds) moved the ball into ECU territory. Then a fourth-and-two first down run by Thomas kept the drive alive. Thomas completed the drive with a two-yard TD run to give Temple the lead back at 10-7.

East Carolina was not done. On the ensuing possession, the Pirates quickly moved 75 yards on 13 plays to retake the lead, 14-10, right before halftime. Another fourth down completion aided the Pirates, this time Kemp hit Bryce Williams for a 21-yard gain to the Temple 16. Follow-



ing an incomplete pass, Kemp connected with Jones for nine yards and then Quay Johnson across the middle for a seven-yard touchdown with 18 seconds left.

The third quarter, normally the most productive for the Owls, was scoreless for both high-powered offenses. Temple was able to amass just 28 yards offensively. The Owls were set up with good field position after Matakevich picked off Kemp and returned it 26 yards to the ECU 27, but penalties, which plagued the Owls all evening, halted that threat.

Temple's defense turned up the heat in the fourth quarter. On the Pirates' first possession of the frame, Owls' redshirt junior LB Stephann Marshall forced a fumble that was recovered by sophomore DL Jacob Martin at the Temple 45. That set up a Jones field goal attempt from 37 yards out. However, the normally reliable kicker missed the 37-yard FG attempt, his second of the game, after earlier falling short on a 52-yard kick in second quarter.

Finch then partially blocked a punt on the Pirates next drive, but the ball took a favorable bounce for the home team, putting it at the ECU 25 with just under six minutes on the clock.

Trailing by three, Walker engineered a crucial seven-play, 71-yard drive which included the 51-yard strike to Anderson, coming on a second and 24 play. Then he hit his favorite target for the go-ahead touchdown, a 23-yarder over the middle.

It took only 73 seconds for the Owls to score again. After the defense again forced a three-and-out, Finch blocked another punt with Bryant coming up with the ball at the 15. Two plays later, both Thomas rushes, the stellar running back found the end zone to seal the victory.

Temple Loses Late to Notre Dame in Battle of Ranked Teams

PHILADELPHIA - In a game that was billed by many as Rocky vs. Rudy, #21/22 Temple Football performed much like the fictional Philly boxer, going the distance against #9/9 Notre Dame. As in the movie, it was not enough, as the Irish used a late fourth quarter touchdown to overcome the Owls, 24-20, in front of a record home crowd of 69,280 Saturday Night at Lincoln Financial Field.

The game started off uncharacteristically for Temple, as the Irish took the opening kickoff 74 yards on 12 plays with redshirt freshman QB DeShone Kizer rushing in from four yards out to give Notre Dame an early 7-0 lead. It was the first score that Temple's vaunted defense has allowed on an opening drive this season.

Temple answered on its second possession of the game. After holding the Irish to a three-and-out, Temple used good field position, starting at its own 42, to drive the ball to the ND 24. Consecutive first down completions by Walker, first to Bryant for 14 yards, and then to Robby Anderson for 22, helped to set up a season-long 41-yard field goal by sophomore Austin Jones, making the score, 7-3.

The Irish looked on the verge of scoring early in the second quarter as Kizer moved the ball into the red zone. Red-shirt junior DL Hassan Reddick then put pressure on the Notre Dame quarterback, forcing an errant pass that was picked off by redshirt junior DL Praise Martin-Oguike at the Temple six.

Walker and the Temple offense then capitalized, marching down the field on an eight-play, 94 yard drive. Thomas showed the college football world his breakout speed, rushing 39 yards to midfield. Walker then connected with Bryant for another big play, 26 yards, to the Notre Dame 24. A pass interference call on a third-and-10 play gave the Owls a first down at the Irish nine. Three plays later, Walker found Brandon Shippen over the middle, and the senior wide receiver hauled it in for the score to give the Cherry and White a 10-7 advantage.

Notre Dame then showed why it owns its lofty ranking. Following two short completions, Kizer faked a hand-off up the middle and took the ball around right end and down the sidelines untouched for a 79-yard touchdown run to put the Irish back on top 14-10. After stopping Temple on its next possession, Kizer again took the Irish on a long drive. With a third and 10 at the TU 11, Matakevich made a big interception after senior DB Tavon Young broke up a pass to end the drive and allow the Owls to go into the locker room trailing by just four points.

Notre Dame picked up right where it left off in the second half. Following a Temple three-and-out to start the quarter, the Irish marched 80 yards on 15 plays moving the ball to first and goal at the Owls three. Temple's defense then put the clamps on the drive, as Notre Dame eventually settled on a 23-yard field goal by Justin Yoon to make it 17-10.



Temple finally got its offense back on track with its third drive of the quarter. Led by 27 rushing yards by Thomas and a huge Walker to Anderson 31-yard pass play, the Owls had the ball first-and-goal at the ND seven. A personal foul for targeting on a third down play gave Temple the ball at the four. The Owls finally were able to tie the game following a fourth-and-one play when Walker pitched to Thomas who busted into the end zone for his 13th rushing touchdown of the season (15th overall).

With momentum clearly in the Owls' favor, the defense forced a Notre Dame punt on the ensuing possession, giving Temple the ball at its own 39 with 8:33 remaining. Walker rushed 21 yards on the first play to move the ball into Notre Dame territory. Thomas and freshman RB

Ryquell Armstead combined to rush for another first down and then Walker hit Bryant for an 11-yard gain to the Irish 19. The drive stalled there, with Jones coming on to nail a 36-yard field goal and give Temple a 20-17 lead with 4:45 to play.

Kizer then proved why he has become one of the top signal callers in the nation. He took just six plays to move his team 75 yards with the big play a 45-yard pass to Alize Jones that gave ND a first down at the Temple 17. Two plays later, he found Will Fuller in the back of the end zone for a 17-yard touchdown to give Notre Dame the lead, 24-20.

With 2:02 remaining, the Owls still had time. Walker scrambled 15 yards on the first play to the Temple 39. Three plays later, on a third-and-17, he tossed just his fourth interception of the season, but this one ended the Owls chance of upsetting the ninth-ranked Irish.

Temple Wins Texas Shootout Over SMU to Stay Unbeaten in Conference Play

DALLAS – Junior QB P.J. Walker threw for four touchdowns and ran for another to lead #22 (CFP)/23 (AP)/23 (Amway USA Today) Temple to a 60-40 win at SMU Friday night at Gerald J. Ford Stadium. The Owls improve to 5-0 in the American Athletic Conference and 8-1 overall with the win. SMU falls to 1-8, 0-5 in league play.

Walker completed 18-of-25 passes for 268 yards and four touchdowns. It was Walker's fourth four-touchdown passing game, the most by any Owl signal caller. Walker also rushed seven times for 49 yards, including a 36-yard TD to ice the win.

True freshman RB Jager Gardner set a school record with a 94-yard touchdown run in his first collegiate start, while junior RB Jahad Thomas tied Bernard Pierce for second on the season touchdown list, scoring his 16th of the year. Thomas kept his scoring streak alive, recording a rushing TD in all nine games for the Owls this season.

The Owls, who led for all but seven minutes in the contest, played without injured senior center Kyle Friend, who had his streak of 41 straight starts snapped.

It marks only the third time Temple has scored 60 or more points since the program turned Division I-A in 1971 (63 at Army, 11/17/11; 63 at Holy Cross, 9/29/73). It is also just the third time the Owls and an opponent combined to score 100 or more points during this era [107; Temple 55, Eastern Michigan 52; (11/22/08); 105; Pitt 53, Temple 52; (10/5/96)].

The game started off with a bang for the Owls as Gardner made an immediate impact, rushing up the middle on the game's second play. The Black Mountain, N.C. native accelerated through a gaping hole created by offensive linemen Brian Carter and Eric Lofton for a 94 yard touchdown. It was the longest run from scrimmage in school history, and it gave Temple an early 7-0 lead.

The Owls quickly made it 14-0 before SMU ran off 17 unanswered points over a 10-minute stretch in the second quarter.

Temple responded, as Walker then engineered a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped with a 16-yard pass to WR Romond Deloatch for his first touchdown of the season. The score gave the Owls a 21-17 lead at halftime.

The second half was an old-fashioned shootout with Temple scoring on its first four possessions to take what looked to be a safe 45-31 lead. Adonis Jennings, one of 10 different receivers to catch a pass from Walker, scored on a four-yard reception to open the half. That capped a nine-play, 75-yard drive that was kept alive by a fake punt and first down carry by PK Tyler Mayes.

After Jones answered with his second score of the game, this time rushing in from nine-yards out to make it 28-24, Walker directed another 75-yard scoring drive. This one encompassed seven plays with a 45-yard pass to Anderson setting up a two-yard Thomas rushing touchdown.

Junior LB Jarred Alwan forced his team-best third fumble on the Mustangs next possession with senior DL Matt Ioannidis recovering on the SMU 13. The Mustangs defense held the Owls out of the end zone, but sophomore PK Austin Jones connected on his 13th field goal of the season, this one from 31 yards out, to make it 38-24.

Davis answered right back for SMU as he marched his team 77 yards to paydirt to open what would be a wacky fourth quarter. The Mustang quarterback connected with Jeremiah Gaines on a 30-yard touchdown to make it 38-31.

It took Walker just one play to match Davis. The Owl quarterback hit redshirt freshman WR Ventell Bryant in stride down the right side for a 75-yard touchdown to again push the lead back to 14 points at 45-31.



After Temple forced a SMU punt on the next possession it looked the nationally-ranked Owls would coast to victory. Mustang punter Josh Williams, however, pinned Temple inside its one yard-line to start the drive. Unable to make a first down, the Owls set up to punt in their own end zone and with the penalty occurring in the end zone, a safety was called.

Mayes then kicked off from the Temple 20, and it was returned 80 yards for a touchdown by West. So suddenly, instead of being up by 14 points, the Owls were clinging to a 45-40 lead with just over eight minutes on the clock and momentum on the side of the home team.

Following a first down to the SMU 26, the Owls defense clamped down, forcing a fourth-and-four play. Senior All-America candidate LB Tyler Matakevich, who made a game-high nine tackles, came up with the big play, batting down Davis' pass for a turnover on downs.

With 2:41 to play, Temple was unable to muster a first down on the first two plays. Facing a third-and-14, Walker dropped back to pass, but scrambled to not only pick up the critical first down, but to ice the win with a 36-yard touchdown.

Down 53-40, Davis went to the air and was picked off by sophomore DB Sean Chandler, who took it 41 yards to account for the final score. He became the eighth different Owl to score a touchdown on the night.

With Chance to Capture East Division Crown, Temple Suffers First Conference Loss at USF

TAMPA, Fla. — USF used an explosive first half offense, handing visiting #22 Temple its first American Athletic Conference loss of the season, 44-23, Saturday night at Raymond James Stadium. The Owls fall to 8-2 overall and 5-1 in conference play while the Bulls, who won for the fourth time in their last five games, improve to 6-4 and 4-2 in the conference.

It was the sophomore tandem of QB Quinton Flowers and RB Marlon Mack that proved to be too much for the Temple defense. The Bulls used big plays on three of their four first half touchdowns with the other being set up by an interception returned to the Owls five yard-line.

Trailing 31-10 at the half, Temple scored 10 quick points to cut the deficit to 31-20. USF tacked on two field goals and a late touchdown to hold off the visitors and move within one game of the Owls in the East Division race.

Junior RB Jahad Thomas became the 10th Temple player to rush for 1,000 yards in a season during the game. He had his 15th rushing touchdown of the season, which ties him for third best on the Temple single-season list. Thomas also continues his streak of scoring at least one rushing TD in every game this year.

Junior P.J. Walker became the second Temple quarterback (Henry Burris, '93-'96) to pass for over 2,000 yards in three straight seasons.

Temple looked sharp to start the game as the Owls moved the ball to the USF 22 on a 17-play drive. The drive was aided by a fake punt on a fourth-and-one at the Temple 40 with the snap going to junior LB Jarred Alwan, who rushed four yards for the first down. When the drive stalled at the 22, normally reliable sophomore PK Austin Jones hit the upright on his 39-yard attempt.

The Owls capitalized on their next possession, taking a 7-0 lead on a one-yard TD run by Thomas. Walker hit red-shirt senior WR Robby Anderson on a 22-yard pass play before Thomas broke off a 35-yard rush that lifted him over the 1,000-yard mark for the season. A pass interference call put the ball at the USF 5 and three plays later Thomas found the end zone.

It took USF just one play to answer as Flowers connected with Rodney Adams on a 68-yard touchdown pass.

That play swung the momentum to the Bulls as Deatri Nichols picked off Walker on the next play, the first of the second quarter, and returned it to the TU 5. Again it took one play for USF to score, this time with Flowers rushing it in from five yards out to make it 14-10.

Freshman Jager Gardner returned the ensuing kickoff 54 yards to the Bulls 40. The Owls picked up three straight rushing first downs before the Bulls held tight at their own 16. Jones connected on his 33-yard attempt this time to cut the deficit to 14-10.

It was then all USF the rest of the half. First Mack broke off a 57-yard TD run and followed that with a 20-yard TD



reception from Flowers to make it 28-10. Flowers set that score up with a 42-yard run of his own. Emil Nadelman capped the scoring with a career-best 47-yard field goal just before intermission.

The Owls came out of the locker room like gangbusters. Redshirt junior DL Praise Martin-Oguike forced and recovered a fumble on the first play to give Temple the ball at the USF 26. Following a Thomas first down run, Walker hit Tampa native Ventell Bryant (5 catches, 86 yards) for a 14-yard TD reception.

Temple's defense quickly forced a punt and the Owls offense was back in business. Walker scrambled for a 38-yard first down run to the USF 22. Thomas then rushed seven yards to the 15, but Eric Lee sacked Walker on the next play and the Cherry and White settled on a 35-yard Jones field goal to cut the deficit to 31-20.

USF then went on a 14-play, 69-yard drive with Flowers and Mack accounting for 65 of the yards. Temple's defense dug in at the end, forcing a Nadelman 24-yard field goal to keep the deficit to two scores, 34-10.

Starting at its own 40 following a 25-yard Gardner return, Walker hit Anderson on a 30-yard connection to the USF 30. The drive stalled with Jones missing wide right on a 45-yard attempt just before the end of the third quarter.

Samuel Benjamin blocked Matti Ciabatti's punt, the sixth blocked kick of the season by the Temple special teams, at the start of the fourth quarter. The Owls, however, were unable to capitalize, going three-and-out on that possession.

The teams then traded field goals before Mack iced the game with a 48-yard TD run to make it 44-23.

Record Setting Performances as Temple Upsets #21 Memphis; Maintain Control of East Division Race

PHILADELPHIA - Junior QB P.J. Walker set the Temple career passing touchdown record and senior LB Tyler Matakevich became just the seventh FBS player to record 100 tackles in four seasons, leading Temple to an impressive 31-12 win over #21 Memphis in front of 31,708 fans at Lincoln Financial Field on Saturday.

The win moves the Owls to 9-2 overall (6-1 American) and keeps the Cherry and White one game ahead of USF (7-4, 5-2) for the East Division title. Memphis lost its third straight game to fall to 8-3, 4-3.

"That was a great win and a great day," said head coach Matt Rhule. "The challenge this week was to our seniors to take the team to another level. By that, I mean winning big games down the stretch, not being distracted, responding to adversity, and we felt like we were prepared for it. Everything that we have been through has led us to this moment to play really well."

Walker, who completed 14 of 26 passes for 261 yards and two touchdowns, played nearly flawless in directing the Owls to 461 yards of total offense in a must-win game. The junior also rushed for 49 yards on seven carries.

Matakevich, who earlier in the week was named a finalist for the Bronko Nagurski award, led an Owl defense, which held the high-scoring Tiger offense to just 12 points, with 11 tackles. The senior from Stratford, Conn. is the only FBS player to have led his team in tackles in every game this season.

Temple's defense never played better, holding Memphis out of the end zone for the first time all season and snapping junior QB Paxton Lynch's streak of 15 straight games with a TD pass. The Owls also held the Tigers to 232 yards of total offense, their lowest number of the season (previous low of 425), which was over 300 less than their average (541) entering play. The Tigers' 12 points were also 31.7 below their nation's sixth best scoring average (43.7 ppg.).

Matakevich and Walker were hardly the only stars of the game. They were just the only one recording milestones in this monumental win for Temple. A win that tied the 1973, 2009, and 2011 squads for second most wins in program history, and one shy of the school record set in 1979 when that Owl team posted a 10-2 record.

Redshirt junior Romond Deloatch was one of those other heroes. It was his acrobatic 13-yard touchdown reception that gave Temple the lead, 7-6, with 8:14 remaining in the half. It was a lead the Owls would never relinquish.

Redshirt freshman David Hood, who entered the game with just 76 yards rushing, had a career and team high 61 yards on 14 carries, including a 14-yard TD run on the Owls' next possession to make it 14-6. That score was set up by a Walker to senior WR Brandon Shippen 49-yard reception to the Memphis 15.



Memphis cut the deficit to 14-9 right before the half on a 44-yard field goal by Jake Elliott. The Tigers had a chance to get even closer early in the third quarter as sophomore Alex Starzyk fumbled the ball while punting with his attempt hitting the back of a teammate and being recovered by Memphis on the Temple 21.

The Owl defense held strong, forcing another Elliott field goal attempt. The Memphis kicker, however, hit the right upright.

Memphis then forced a turnover on downs on the Owls next possession to give the Tigers the ball at the Temple 44. Lynch directed the Tiger offense to the Temple 18, but sophomore DB Sean Chandler (9 tackles) sacked the Memphis signal-caller on a third down play to force an

Elliott field goal attempt. This time the Tiger kicker was true from 39 yards to make it 14-12.

Temple then took control in the fourth quarter. Redshirt freshman TE Kip Patton took a handoff from Walker and ran around the right corner for a 13-yard touchdown on the first play of the frame to give the Owls a two-score lead, 21-12.

After the defense held Memphis to a three-and-out, Walker directed the Owls on a 13-play, 62-yard drive with sophomore PK Austin Jones drilling a 35-yard field goal to make it 24-12.

The defense again came up big on the Tigers next possession, forcing a turnover on downs with a stop of Paxton on a fourth-and-one from the Memphis 37. Five plays later Walker made them pay, hitting Saledeem Major for a 19-yard touchdown. It was the first career touchdown for the redshirt senior tight end and the record 50th passing TD for the junior QB from Elizabeth, N.J.

Defense Stifles UConn; Wins East Division Championship on Senior Night

PHILADELPHIA - Senior Night is always special, but Saturday night was spectacular for the 22 seniors playing their final home game for Temple Football. These Owls helped their team post a dominating 27-3 win over visiting UConn at Lincoln Financial Field.

The win clinched the American Athletic Conference East Division title and secured the Owls (10-2, 7-1) a spot in the inaugural Conference Championship game at West Division winner Houston (10-2, 7-1). It was also the 10th win of the season, tying the overall school-record set by the 1979 Cherry and White squad.

The Owls' defense held an opponent without a touchdown for the second-straight game. Led by senior All-America candidate Tyler Matakevich's 11 tackles, the Cherry and White limited the Huskies offense to a mere 138 yards and nine first downs. The Owls also had 11 tackles for loss with the front seven allowing just nine rushing yards.

Temple did not allow a first down on eight of UConn's 11 drives. The Huskies did not get on the scoreboard until their final drive when they settled on a 45-yard field goal by Bobby Puyol rather than being dealt a shutout.

The Owls defense also forced two turnovers. Junior LB Jarred Alwan forced a second quarter fumble that was recovered by redshirt junior LB Stephau Marshall while sophomore DB Sean Chandler made his fourth interception of the season in the fourth quarter.

Offensively, junior Jahad Thomas scored the first and last touchdown for Temple, his 16th and 17th rushing TDs of the season. Junior QB P.J. Walker completed 19 of 29 passes for 160 yards, including a six-yard TD pass to red-shirt junior WR Romond Deloatch.

Thomas's first score came on Temple's second drive. The junior running back made bursts of eight and 16 yards to start the Owl drive, which began at the UConn 49 due to a shanked Huskie punt. Deloatch then made a 16-yard reception to the UConn 9 before Thomas broke free for a nine-yard touchdown.

Walker then led Temple on an 11-play, 56-yard drive midway through the second quarter to setup a 20-yard field goal by sophomore Austin Jones to make it 10-0. Senior WR Brandon Shippen made three of his season-high four receptions in the drive.

Jones would add another field goal, this one from 37 yards out, on Temple's first possession of the second half to make it 13-0. It was his 18th field goal (on 23 attempts) of the season, ranking third on Temple's single-season list behind Don Bitterlich (21 of 31, 1975) and Bob Wright (19 of 25, 1990).

After holding UConn to a second straight three-and-out to start the half, Walker directed the Owls on a 63-yard drive, hitting Deloatch for his third TD reception of the season

on just 12 catches.

Thomas then broke the game wide open with a 60-yard TD run early in the fourth quarter to make it 27-0. The TD run moved him into sole possession of the number two spot on the single-season list for rushing touchdowns behind Bernard Pierce (27, 2011). Thomas also moved into seventh place on the single-season rushing yardage list and now has 1,188 yards on the season.
