

THIS WEEK

Temple takes to the road for the second straight week, traveling to Orlando, Fla., to do battle with the UCF Knights. The game is scheduled for Saturday, October 15, at 7:30 p.m. and will air on ESPNU and 97.5 The Fanatic, Temple football's flagship radio station. After falling last Thursday to Memphis in the team's opening conference road matchup, Temple aims to rebound against a UCF squad that failed to play this past weekend due to a postponed game with Tulane, courtesy of Hurricane Matthew. The Owls enter with high hopes, though, following a career performance by senior QB Phillip Walker in the losing effort last Thursday, setting a school record for pass attempts (59) while tying records for both completions (36) and passing yards (445). Senior RB Jahad Thomas continued to impress as well, generating 158 total yards and two touchdowns, notching a school record for consecutive games with two or more scores (4). The matchup with the Knights, who currently sit at 3-2 (1-0 American), marks an important conference clash for both Temple (3-3, 1-1 American) and the East Division, as the Owls still maintain the ability to defend last season's division title by winning out the remainder of the year. Much of the pressure will fall on Temple's defensive front, as they face a powerful rushing offense averaging 232.8 yards per game.

LAST WEEK

Coming up short in a high-scoring inter-conference battle, Temple lost to the Memphis Tigers last Thursday. The Owls dominated the early stages of the game, jumping out to a 13-3 lead going into halftime. From there, the teams' luck would turn, giving up 31 points in the second half while only scoring 14 of their own. Quarterback Phillip Walker set a school record for passing attempts (59) as well tying the mark for passing yards (445) and completions (36), in the losing effort. Defensive lineman Haason Reddick continued his dominant play, notching two sacks during the game, bringing his season total to 4.5. Running back Jahad Thomas also had a big day, accounting for 158 yards from scrimmage and two receiving touchdowns.

LAST TIME

The last time Temple squared off against UCF was last season, the Owls won 30-16 en route to their 6th victory of the year. A strong performance was turned in by RB Jahad Thomas, who posted 199 yards on 31 carries for three touchdowns, single-handedly controlling the scoreboard for Temple throughout the matchup. QB Phillip Walker put together a solid performance as well, finishing 15-of-27 for 149 yards and one touchdown. On the defensive side of the ball, LB Jarred Alwan generated seven total tackles while both DL Praise Martin-Oguike and Nate L. Smith added three apiece. Finally, then-redshirt freshman WR Ventell Bryant caught his first career touchdown.

UP NEXT

The Owls will return to Lincoln Financial Field on Friday, October 21, to host USF in a nationally televised game on ESPN. This will be their fourth consecutive conference matchup, with the game slated to kickoff at 7:00 p.m.

RUNNING INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

Senior running back Jahad Thomas' stellar play has him rising within Temple's all-time record lists. In the past four games, he has set the school record for consecutive games with two or more touchdowns with four. Also, he is third all-time in total touchdowns (28), third in rushing touchdowns (23), and ninth in total rushing yards (1,883). He also recently passed Travis Shelton to become sixth all time in all-purpose yards for the Owls with 3,670 total yards.

FLORIDA TO PHILLY PIPELINE

In recent years, Temple has forged a major connection recruiting players out of Florida. The Owls currently have 11 players on their roster from the Sunshine State, including notable players such as Austin Jones, who holds Temple's all-time record for consecutive field goals made (19), and Freddie Booth-Lloyd, who has started two games at defensive tackle this season. Other notable players form the state of Florida include Ventell Bryant, Brodrick Yancy, Randle Jones, Jyquis Thomas and Sam Franklin. Within the Owls locker room, Florida ranks third in terms of players' home states, only falling behind Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

FLORIDA'S GOT SKILLS

Five of Temple's wide receivers come from the Sunshine State. This list include redshirt sophomores Ventell Bryant, who caught his first career touchdown vs. the Knights last year, and Brodrick Yancy, who has the second-most receptions on the team (19) and started the last three games for the Owls. Other receivers from the group include freshman Freddie Johnson, Willie Smith and Randle Jones, the Owls' leading kickoff returner.

I'M AT A LOSS

Haason Reddick has been a terror to opposing offenses. The redshirt senior had 5.0 TFLs at Memphis tying the conference mark for a single game. He has 12.0 tackles for loss this season and 34.5 for his career. The American Conference marks are 19.0 (Elandon Roberts, Houston, 2015) and 38.0 (Steven Taylor, Houston). Reddick leads all FBS players in taking part in the most TFLs this season.

THE LAST TIME WE MET THE KNIGHTS

The tailback posted 199 yards on 31 carries for three touchdowns, single-handedly controlling the scoreboard for Temple throughout the matchup. QB Phillip Walker put together a solid performance as well, finishing 15-of-27 for 149 yards and one touchdown. On the defensive side of the ball, LB Jarred Alwan generated seven total tackles while both DL Praise Martin-Oguike and DB Nate L. Smith added three apiece. Finally, then-redshirt freshman WR Ventell Bryant caught his first career touchdown.

FROM DOYLESTOWN BY WAY OF FLORIDA

Two of Temple's tight ends - Colin Thompson and Jake O'Donnell - have quite a few things in common. Both are graduate students, and are natives of Doylestown, Pa. Another similarity that the two have is that they both first chose to play college football in Florida (O'Donnell at Miami and Thompson at Florida). Not even playing in the Sunshine State could keep these two great football players from returning to their home state and to one of college football's fastest rising programs. Thompson transferred to Temple in 2014 and is in third season here. O'Donnell joined the Owls this season for his final year of eligibility.

DELEONE AND WIESEHAN RETURN TO THE SUNSHINE STATE

Two Temple Owls' coaches are returning to Florida, where each made a stop during their coaching career. Run game coordinator and offensive line coach George DeLeone served as tight ends coach for the Miami Dolphins from 2008-10. Also, senior offensive assistant and running backs coach Chris Wiesehan spent a season in 2005 with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, serving as an offensive assistant.

OWLS AND KNIGHTS IN THE PRO RANKS

Temple currently has eight alumni playing in the NFL, highlighted by Brandon McManus, kicker for the Super Bowl Champion Denver Broncos, as well as New York Jets' star pass rusher Muhammad Wilkerson. UCF has sixteen players currently on NFL rosters, including Jacksonville Jaguars' starting QB Blake Bortles, New York Jets' WR Brandon Marshall, and Oakland Raiders' RB Latavius Murray.

MR. OCTOBER HAILS FROM PHILLY

Baseball Hall of Famer Reggie Jackson, a Cheltenham native, was the original Mr. October. Temple football has something in common. From 2014-16, the Owls have gone 6-3 in the month of October. They went 4-1 in the month of October last year with their only loss coming against Notre Dame. Three of Temple's five October games this season will be at home and all will be conference games.

STAR TRACK FEATURING CAPTAIN KIRK

After the brilliant success of last season's receiving corps, not many expected this year's youthful unit to reach — much less top — that high level of achievement. Through six games, however, this year's Owls have been stellar, outpacing last season's standouts in both total yards and receiving touchdowns. To the credit of QB Phillip Walker, though, the distribution around the receiving corps has remained notably similar.

AUSTIN POWERS

In 2015, Temple received so many team and individual awards that most overlook the record breaking season kicker Austin Jones had. Last year, Jones broke the record for most field goals made in a season (23), most points by a kicker (113), and best field goal percentage for anyone with over 20 attempts (82.1%). The junior is now tied for second all-time in field goals made (46) and fourth all-time in points scored for Temple (234). He now holds the school record for most consecutive field goals made (19), however he suffered an ACL injury at Memphis and will miss the remainder of the season.

ALL THE WRIGHT STUFF

Entering the season, head coach Matt Rhule made a promise to play WR Isaiah Wright. The true freshman has seen action at WR, RB, punt returner, and also at QB in Wildcat formations. He is the team's third leading rusher with 97 yards on 18 carries. Rhule had nothing but great things to say about him after the Stony Brook game. "[Former Temple RB] Joe Jones, Wright kind of reminds me of Joe. The key thing to me is Isaiah Wright is a true freshman. He's learned everything. He hasn't learned everything great. He has a ways to go in the protections and all of that, but he's a good football guy."

CHERISHED POSSESSIONS

For the season, senior quarterback Phillip Walker has led the Owls to 33 scores on 76 drives (43.4%) with 24 touchdowns on those possessions (31.6%). Overall, Temple has had 82 possessions with 34 scores including 24 TDs.

SUPER FREAK

Redshirt senior Haason Reddick is arguably one of the most athletic players in the country. This year he was ranked #6 on FOX Sports' Bruce Feldman's annual "Freak" list. Standing at 6'1 and 235 lbs., Reddick played as a running back and safety in high school. When he got to Temple, Hc Matt Rhule and DC Phil Snow had the presence of mind to switch him to strong side linebacker and then to defensive end last year, where he excelled. During his redshirt junior year, he led the team in QB hurries (5), and was 9th in the conference in tackles for losses (12.5). Reddick continues where he left off leading the conference with 12.0 TFLs, including 4.5 sacks. He also leads the Owls with 28 total tackles.

YO ADRIAN

When asked for the biggest surprise of the early season, both head coach Matt Rhule and offensive coordinator Glenn Thomas have repeatedly responded with OL Adrian Sullivan. The redshirt junior, who entered camp in August working with the third unit, has worked his way into the starting lineup and has been solid at right guard.

BIG MAC

Anyone who has followed Temple football for the past few seasons knows that replacing Kyle Friend was going to be a difficult task. Redshirt senior Brendan McGowan, who filled in for Friend while he missed four games due to injury a year ago, has been an anchor in the middle of an improving O-line. A heady veteran who already holds a finance degree, McGowan is a trusted voice making the line calls while the guard spots have been breaking in youthful talent.

DOUBLE DS

Dion Dawkins has been protecting QB Phillip Walker's blindside from the left tackle spot for four seasons now. The senior has had eye popping performances to start the season, helping in the pass game and opening huge holes with pancake blocks to open up running lanes for RBs Jahad Thomas and Ryquell Armstead.

YOUNG FOLKS

Temple's defense has seen a recent youthful look throughout the lineup. Literally, the man in the middle of that change is MLB Jared Folks. Folks, a redshirt sophomore was inserted for senior Jarred Alwan for the Charlotte game and has held down the position. He made 3 tackles in his first start and notched his first career interception against SMU.

3-AND-OUT

Temple's defense is among the best at getting opponents off the field. In 71 drives, the defense has forced the offense back to the sidelines without a first down on 26 of those possessions. Only Michigan (45), Alabama (40), Clemson (39), Houston (37), Arizona State and Boston College (33), Tulsa (31), Baylor (30), UCF and Ohio State (29), and Toledo (27) have done it more.

BLOCK PARTY

On the strength of an FBS high five blocked punts in 2015, Temple has been among the best in blocking kicks during the Matt Rhule era. Thanks to Sharif Finch's block in the season opener against Army, Temple has the third most blocked kicks since 2015. For Finch, that was his fifth career blocked punt which leads the nation among active players.

NO DOUBTING THOMAS

The Owls know they have a special player in RB Jahad Thomas. In just two-plus seasons as a starting RB, Thomas has climbed the school record books. He was awarded first team all-conference honors last year as he had 1,262 yards on the ground while scoring 17 touchdowns.

Head coach Matt Rhule had some strong words to say about one of his star players, "I think Jahad is just trying to be great. He's just 100 percent all-in. Sometimes seniors are either thinking about their future - their friends, family, everyone is talking the future, the future, and they forget about the present, they forget about their senior year, and it actually hurts, or they're 1,000 percent bought into the team in their senior year and having fun with their teammates. And Jahad appears to be, based upon his actions, to be 1,000 percent bought into having a great senior year with the way he has practiced, everything that he's doing."

MARTIN LEADS CONFERENCE IN SAAC

Junior DL Jacob Martin was elected coordinator of alumni relations for the American Athletic Conference Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). Martin is a two-year letterwinner for the football team, playing in all but one game on the defensive line rotation and on special teams as a sophomore in 2015. During his time with the Owls he has totaled 22 tackles with 1.5 sacks in two seasons. The mission of SAAC is to improve communication for all student-athletes at each member school as well as enhance communication between the institutions. SAAC takes an active role in understanding and providing feedback regarding NCAA and Conference legislations, and promotes student-athlete well-being, academic achievement, personal development and community service.

OWL SCHOLARS

In an effort to recognize the outstanding academic accomplishments of Temple University's student-athletes, Temple Athletics introduced the Owl Scholars Program in the Fall of 2016. Through team apparel, student-athletes on all of Temple's 19 sports regularly have the opportunity to wear items that represent their athletic lives while on campus or in the classroom; the Owl Scholars Program aims to accomplish the reverse - provide an easily identifiable symbol of academic success for student-athletes to wear on their respective field or court of competition.

The Owl Scholars Patch has been designed to pay homage to the rich history of the Temple Owls, while invoking images of the infamous speech of Temple Uni-

versity's founder Russell Conwell, Acres of Diamonds. The three stars above the regal owl symbolize the three different ways a student-athlete can earn the honor of having the patch included on their uniform/game warm-up:

- completion of a Temple University degree prior to the beginning of the start of the season
- earning a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 prior to the beginning of the start of the season
- earning a 3.0 semester grade point average in the previous semester

42 Football players are wearing the patch this season.



SNOW PATROL

Phil Snow has proven he is one of the most formidable defensive coordinators in the country. Entering his fourth season with the Owls, the team has steadily improved its defense each season under Snow's guidance, especially last season. In 2014, he led the Owls to a #1 rank in almost every single defensive category in the AAC, fourth nationally in scoring defense, and tied for first nationally in fumble recoveries (19). Snow looks to lead the defense to becoming the best in the conference again for the 2016 season.

GOLDEN/RHULE

In the early 2000's, Temple's football program was in a state of despair. Coach Bobby Wallace (1998-2005) had a 19-71 overall record and was coming off three consecutive seasons with two wins or less (0-11 in 2005). The culture and effectiveness of the program started to change once Al Golden took the reins. After a shaky 1-11 start in his first season, Golden led the team to a 26-23 record in the next four seasons. During that time, the team had its first season above .500 since 1990, and went to its first bowl game since 1979. The wealth of success continued with Steve Addazio, as the Owls got a win in the Gildan, New Mexico Bowl during the 2011 season. From there, the reins were handed over to current head coach Matt Rhule in 2013. After finishing 2-10 in his first season, Rhule has improved the team's win total each year by four games, highlighted by the 2015 season when Temple finished 10-4 and won the AAC East Championship. Other accomplishments include the Owls getting off to their first 7-0 start (2015), having the program's first defensive player of the year (Tyler Matakevich, 2015), and their first win over Penn State in 73 years. After continuing to have great recruiting classes, the Owls have high hopes of success for many years to come.

SUPER BOWL CHAMPIONS

Super Bowl 50 saw the Denver Broncos defeat the Carolina Panthers 24-10 in a low scoring battle. A huge key to the success of the Broncos that day was the kicking of Brandon McManus, who went 3/3 on field goals and tacked on one extra point. He also happens to be a proud Temple grad. Like McManus, Temple has a number of alumni who have experienced success on the NFL's biggest stage. Out of the 21 times that an alum from Temple has played in the Super Bowl, 16 of them happen to be on the winning team. Notable names include former Ravens' RB Bernard Pierce (2012), former Patriots/Colts DL Dan Klecko (2003-04,2006) and former Redskins' DB Todd Bowles (1987), who is now a head coach for the New York Jets. Former Owls head coach Bruce Arians was also an offensive coordinator for the Steelers in 2009, helping head coach Mike Tomlin win his first Super Bowl that year.

WILD BOYZ

Third year defensive line coach Elijah Robinson looks to have another loaded group for the 2016 season. The unit is led by DE Haason Reddick who received all-conference honors last year. Praise Martin-Oguike is an experienced playmaker who entered the year with the most sacks out of anyone on the team (11.5), and Jacob Martin and Avery Ellis add some much needed depth to rush the quarterback. Senior Averee Robinson anchor the middle of the defensive line with help from Freddie Booth-Lloyd and Michael Dogbe.

GRADUATES

In a recent poll that surveyed how many graduates each division one school had on its roster, Temple finished tied for third with five other schools having 11 graduates on the team. The list of graduates include TE Romond Deloatch, TE Jake O'Donnell, DB Nate Hairston, OL Adrian Sullivan, LB Avery Williams, DL Avery Ellis, DB Khiry Lucas, LB Stephaun Marshall, OL Brendan McGowan, DL Praise Martin-Oguike and TE Colin Thompson. The university is very proud of these individuals for achieving academic success.

NO FAULT IN OUR STARZYK

The special team's unit looks to have a big year as they return punter Alex Starzyk. He joined the Owls as a freshman walk-on in 2014 and has held the #1 punter role ever since. During the 2015 season, the junior was fourth in the conference for punting average and 5th in the conference for punts inside the 20. The season helped him rank 6th all-time for Temple in terms of punt average (40.3).

NFL IRONMAN

A recent survey was taken among all of the FBS College Football SIDs, about current employees in FBS college football right now with 20+ years of NFL non-playing experience. Tied for first with UCLA head coach Jim Mora was Temple's head athletic trainer Al Bellamy, with 25 years of NFL experience. Bellamy, who is going into his fourth season here at Temple, started off in 1988 as an athletic training assistant with the Washington Redskins and was part of the staff that won Super Bowl XXVI. After his time in Washington, he moved to get a head athletic training position with the Detroit Lions, where he stayed with the team for 12 years.

BOYS TO MEN

After the practice on Friday, August 19th, head coach Matt Rhule made a comment after practice about how pleased he was with grades, on the field success, and the players growing as men. "My number one job is to tell our kids the reason why we're at Temple is to make something great, but the first thing is building great people, great men, and that's who they are in the classroom, that's who they are as football players, and that's who they are as people. Whether that's community service or the way they interact with people. And if you have guys who are interested in school and care about football, then you'll have a great team. Some people don't look at it that way, they believe that it's just their job to win. But at Temple, we believe it's our job to take care of the kids first."

WE'RE MOVIN' ON UP

The Owls saw seven players go to the pros after a very successful 2015 season. Three of those players (CB Tavon Young, DL Matt loannidis, and LB Tyler Matakevich) were drafted in rounds 4-7 and are on the action roster for their respective teams. Other free agent pickups in the NFL from the 2015 squad include OLs Kyle Friend and Shahbaz Ahmed, and WRs Robby Anderson and Brandon Shippen. Anderson made the Jets opening day roster.

TOTE THE RYO

To keep star RB Jahad Thomas fresh this season, head coach Matt Rhule plans to have more of a steady rotation which will include help from RB Ryquell Armstead. He and Jager Gardner were the only freshmen to see action for the Owls' offense last year. In Armstead's first start against Tulane in 2015, he scored two touchdowns. He got the 2016 opening day start and was 16-77-1TD rushing. Through five games this season, Armstead has 313 rushing yards with six touchdowns.

GET A GRIP

Temple had a string of 434 straight offensive plays without losing a fumble that was snapped vs. SMU. From a first quarter Robby Anderson fumble in the AAC Championship game at Houston in 2015, through a Jager Gardner fumble in the fourth quarter vs. SMU in week 5, Temple protected the ball well.

STELLA

Making her debut as the mascot for the Temple Owls' football team in 2013 and continuing this season is Stella, a three-pound, seven-year old, great horned owl from the Elmwood Park Zoo. After her first season as Temple's mascot, Stella was named one of the top five feathered mascots by the NCAA. Weekdays, she works as an educational animal, teaching the virtues of wildlife conservation. Having been raised as a pet illegally in Utah, she is accustomed to humans and, in fact, views herself as one. She shares an enclosure with her boyfriend, Sherlock, who gets jealous when Stella basks in the limelight, but there's always a price to pay for being a celebrity.

OUARTERBACKS

The unit is headed once again by Glenn Thomas, who came to the Owls after a successful seven-year run with the Atlanta Falcons. This season, he adds the responsibility of offensive coordinator after the departure of Marcus Satterfield to become head coach at Tennessee

Thomas is credited with the continued development of senior QB Phillip Walker. The unquestioned team leader burst on the scene with 20 touchdowns and over 2,000 passing yards in just seven starts as a true freshman in 2013 before leveling off in 2014. Under Thomas' guidance, he continued to mature into



a certified field general. He has already set the Temple career marks for attempts (1,250), completions (706), touchdowns (61), yards (8,787) and wins by a starting quarterback (21).

Last season's #2 quarterback was redshirt-sophomore Frank Nutile. After spending his freshman year recovering from a torn ACL, he appeared in four games in limited mop-up duty. He was 3-for-3 for 40 yards and a touchdown in the homecoming win against Tulane.

Logan Marchi spent his freshman year redshirting and is now poised to compete for the backup role. He saw his first action against Stony Brook

The 2016 recruiting class sees the addition of Anthony Russo (Philadelphia/Archbishop Wood).

RUNNING BACKS

Leading the running backs this season will be Chris Wiesehan, who coached Temple's offensive line for the previous two seasons

Jahad Thomas, a first-team all-conference player a year ago, returns for his senior season. This year he has scored a pair of TDs in every game he played. In 2015, he scored at least one rushing touchdown in the first ten games and finished the year with 19 scores and 1,262 rushing yards. Along the way, he topped the century mark five times, including a ca-



reer-high 199 yards and three touchdowns on 31 carries against UCF. The former defensive back is the established starter but should get help carrying the load from a talented group of young runners.

Last season, two true freshmen had limited opportunities to run the ball but showed they had what it takes to succeed. Ryquell Armstead emerged from the start of camp to earn a role spotting Thomas. He averaged five carries for 20 yards in the first five games, but was hampered by an injury for most of the remainder of the season. He finished with 166 yards and two scores on 43 carries. Jager Gardner was given the responsibility of kickoff returner by game seven and eventually earned snaps on offense. Nearly all of his 32 carries for the season were collected in the season's final four games. He set the school record with a 94-yard run from scrimmage at SMU, scoring his lone touchdown of the year on his way to his first career 100-yard game.

After redshirting in 2014, David Hood became a trusted part of the offense last year. By midseason, he was inserted into the third down packages and was the leading ball carrier (14-61-1TD) when Temple defeated #21 Mem-

The 2016 recruiting class sees the addition of Tyliek Raynor (Philadelphia, Pa. / Imhotep). Jonny Forrest [New Rochelle (N.Y.) High] has been added as a walk-on.

The fullback position is manned by two converted linebackers who each walked on to the squad in 2014. Redshirt junior Nick Sharga was the only Temple player to see action on both sides of the ball in 2015. He earned the respect of his peers, being given a single-digit jersey (#4) for his toughness. Redshirt freshman Rob Ritrovato was converted to fullback after contributing on special teams as a true freshman in 2014. He suffered an injury in the season opener and was forced to redshirt.

WIDE RECEIVERS

Frisman Jackson will coach the wide receivers for the second straight year. He is the first to hold that position for two consecutive seasons since 2007-09 (Kevin Gil-

Gone from a year ago are three of the top four receivers: Robby Anderson (70-939-7TDs), John Christopher (20-208), and Brandon Shippen (20-288-1). All three were seniors.

Redshirt sophomore Ventell Bryant (39-579-3TDs), an emerging star, returns. Last season, Bryant shattered the freshman record in receptions (22 - Sean Szarka, 2012) and receiving yards (378 - Carlos Johnson, 1998). He has caught at least one pass in every game he has played.

Adonis Jennings transferred to Temple in 2015 after his freshman campaign at Pitt. The Sicklerville, N.J., native and Timber Creek product enjoyed his return home and contributed with 14 catches for 146 yards and two

Two receivers who redshirted last season are making big contributions in 2016. Redshirt sophomore Brodrick Yancy is proving to be a tough slot receiver. In 2015, he valiantly fought to return from an injury in game two, but was forced to the sidelines for the remainder of the season. Redshirt junior Keith Kirk-

wood, who transferred from Hawaii in 2014, has shown flashes of brilliance and is becoming more consistent.

Redshirt sophomore Marshall Ellick continues to improve. He played in five games a year ago, mostly on



special teams and earned the 2016 most improved offensive player in the spring.

The Owls expect redshirt freshman Cortrelle Simpson to make an impact as a receiver and as a return specialist. Simpson impressed the coaches last season while on the scout team - he was the only player to be named scout team player of the week multiple times.

Redshirt sophomores Willie Smith and John Ruza, along with redshirt freshman Travon Williams, are former walk-ons who add depth.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of Freddie Johnson [North Fort Myers (Fla.) High], Randle Jones [North Miami Beach (Fla.) High], Branden Mack (Wyncote, Pa. / Cheltenham), and Isaiah Wright (West Hartford, Conn. / Kingswood-Oxford). Justin Bishop (Somers Point, NJ / Mainland) was added as a walk-on.

OFFENSIVE LINE

The offensive line is under new leadership both on and off the field. George DeLeone, a 46-year coaching veteran, returns for his second tour of duty coaching Temple's offensive line. He was the teams' offensive coordinator in 2006-07 and tutored the offensive line in 2007. On the field, the unit will be without the leadership of center Kyle Friend, who graduated, Friend, a three-time captain, was the cornerstone of the offensive line for the past three



Inheriting the baton is senior left tackle Dion Dawkins. Dawkins had started 28 games entering the season and earned fourth team All-America honors from Phil Steele following the 2015 campaign.

Temple has three other linemen with starting experience from a year ago. Redshirt senior Brendan Mc-Gowan has started 19 games over the past four seasons. He started four games at center for Friend in 2015 and was the starting guard for most of the 2014 season. Brian Carter clocked ten games at right guard last season and continues to improve. The redshirt junior is in just his second full season on the O-line after converting from a defensive tackle in 2013. Redshirt junior Leon Johnson started seven games at tackle last year and played in 12 games. Freshman Matt Hennessy has made a contribution to the unit and made his first start vs. Charlotte. The big surprise has been the development of RG Adrian Sullivan. Sullivan began the summer with the third unit but emerged as the starting right guard.

In the past few seasons under head coach Matt Rhule, Temple has looked to develop offensive linemen in one of two ways - convert from defense to offense or recruit-redshirt-develop. Redshirt-junior Cole Boozer has made the transition from tight end to defensive line to offensive line. Redshirt junior **Semaj Reed** and redshirt sophomores **James McHale**, **Jaelin Robinson** and **Aaron Ruff**, and redshirt freshmen **Jovahn Fair** and **Benson Israel** have all been recruited to play offensive line for Temple. With the graduation of Friend, Shahbaz Ahmed and Eric Lofton, the opportunity is there for them to get on the field.

Two walk-ons continue to develop. **Nick Apostolu** and **Gordon Thomas** were added in 2014 Thomas saw action in three games last season.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Darian Bryant** (Philadelphia, Pa. / Chestnut Hill Academy) . **Dan Drewes** [Dunmore (Pa.) High], **Brendan Clark** (Father Judge / Philadelphia, Pa.), and **Vincent Picozzi** (Collegeville, Pa. / Lansdale Catholic) have been added as a walk-ons.

TIGHT ENDS & FULLBACKS

Ed Foley begins his fourth season as Temple's tight ends coach and his second as the special teams coordinator.

Redshirt senior **Colin Thompson** is finally fully recovered from foot injuries that hampered him at Florida and brought the Doylestown, Pa., native back home. Entering his third and final season for Temple, Thompson has been a major force in the improved run game and has made contributions in the passing attack.



Redshirt senior **Romond Deloatch** continues to improve as a receiver, evident by his performance down the stretch in 2015. While he ended the year with 20 receptions for 155 yards and three scores, 13 of those catches came in the final four games.

Chris Myarick is a redshirt sophomore and former walk-on. He has seen limited action, mostly on special teams

Like Thompson, **Jake O'Donnell** is a graduate student from Doylestown who has transferred from a Florida school. O'Donnell has spent the past four years at Miami and joined the Owls in 2016 for his final year of eligibility.

The 2015 recruiting class brought in **Patrick Anderson** and **Jake Robinson** who spent the season redshirting. Joining the squad as walk-ons last year was **Domenic Nigrelli**.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Steve Petrick** (North Huntingdon, Pa. / Norwin), **Taiyir Wilson** (Schwenksville, Pa. / Perkiomen Valley / Fork Union), and **Kenny Yeboah** (Allentown, Pa. / Parkland Senior).

DEFENSIVE LINE

Once again, Elijah Robinson leads the "Wild Boyz," the nickname for Temple's defensive line. Despite the losses of Matt loannidis, Hershey Walton and Nate D. Smith, the defensive line remains deep and talented.

The end position has three players who each spent at least one season as a starter. Redshirt senior **Haason Reddick** started opposite Smith last season and was the unit's most productive player. He registered career highs in tackles (45). TFLS (12.5) and sacks (5.0)



en route to all-conference honors. **Praise Martin-Ogu**ike, also a redshirt senior, emerged as a playmaker in 2014. In the past two years he has 67 tackles, 19.0 TFLs, and a team-leading 11.5 sacks and eight forced fumbles. Senior **Sharif Finch** has been hampered by knee injuries, but has played through them to contribute 78 tackles, 4.5 TFLs, 5.0 sacks, and 2 interceptions over the past three seasons. After four games in 2016, Finch was forced to shut it down due to the knee.

Joining them on the outside are redshirt senior **Avery Ellis** and junior **Jacob Martin**. Both have played in over 25 games over the past three seasons and have

provided quality snaps on defense while being core special teams players.

The anchor on the inside is expected to be senior **Averee Robinson**. Robinson shared a starting spot with Walton last season and finished with career-highs in tackles and TFLs.



Redshirt sophomores Freddie Booth-Lloyd and Michael Dogbe provide some experience. Booth-Lloyd combines size and quickness making him difficult to block. Dogbe had three tackles in the bowl game against Toledo and flashed brilliance at times throughout the season. Taylor was impressive early but lingering knee injury sidelined him for the remainder of the season.

The Owls redshirted three defensive linemen last season. Two recruits - **DeAndre Kelly**, and **Dana Levine** - and walk-on **Jeromy Reichner**. All spent the year getting bigger and stronger under the eye of the strength and conditioning coaches.

Added to the mix is redshirt sophomore transfer **Hez Trahan**. A Philadelphia native, Trahan redshirted at Pitt in 2014 after a stellar career at Roman Catholic. He sat out in 2015 before enrolling at Temple.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Dan Archibong** [Springfield (Pa.) High], **Karamo Dioubate** (Philadelphia / Prep Charter), **Quincy Roche** (Randallstown, Md. / New Town), **Chris Tucker** (Jackson, Tenn. / Trinity Christian Academy), and **Greg Webb** [Sicklerville, N.J. / Timber Creek / Hutchinson (Kan.) CC].

LINEBACKERS

At the linebacker position, Mike Siravo will be respon-

sible for finding a replacement for Temple's all-time leading tackler Tyler Matakevich. The starters all have experience, but the depth is still unprov-

Redshirt seniors **Stephaun Marshall** (14 starts) and **Avery Williams** (12 starts) shared the WLB duties for the past two seasons. Marshall is coming off a career-high in tackles, interceptions and forced fumbles. Williams had his best season as a tackler and added his first career

Jared Folks has started the last three games at MLB for the Owls. So far this season, Folks has 16 tackles and an interception. Also seeing time at middle linebacker is senior Jarred Alwan. He adds much needed experience to the unit providing 22 starts and 135 tackles throughout the course of his four year career.

The linebacking unit has been injected with added speed from a few young playmakers. Redshirt freshman Chapelle Russell and true freshmen Shaun Bradley and William Kwenkeu have been seeing increased plays on defense and have become the core members of the special teams.

Over the past two seasons, the Owls have recruited a few players who have redshirted while learning their craft and building their strength. **Jeremiah Atoki** and **Daishaun Grimes** (2015 class) are primed to make significant contributions in 2016.

Todd Jones and Chris Smith are talented walk-ons who have earned playing time on special teams. Zach Mesday walked on in 2014 and has spent the better part of the past two seasons rehabbing an injury. Kevin DeCaesar and Mike DiFrancesco joined the team as walk-ons in 2015 and continue to develop.

Besides Bradley and Kwenkeu, the 2016 recruiting class sees the addition of Isaiah Graham-Mobley (King of Prussia, Pa. / Upper Merion). Julian Mahan (Sicklerville, N.J. / Timber Creek) was added as a walk-on.

CORNERBACKS

Fran Brown will once again tutors the defensive backs. Like the other levels of the defense, Brown is tasked with replacing a player (Tavon Young) now in the NFL. He is also without all-conference talent Sean Chandler who has been moved to safety.





Redshirt senior **Nate Hairston** and redshirt junior **Artrel Foster** gave the Owls valuable snaps in the secondary last season, whether spotting Young (who nursed an injury) or adding nickel coverage. Hairston was in just his first full season on defense after being converted from wide receiver. Both are among Temple's best special teams performers.

The Owls were expecting big things from **Kareem Ali**. A four-star recruit, Ali redshirted in 2015 and suffered a arm injury in game 2.


Junior Cequan Jefferson is a talented athlete who has contributed on special teams while improving in the secondary.

Redshirt sophomore **Derrek Thomas** is making the conversion from wide receiver. The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Kimere Brown** [Penns Grove (N.J.) High], **Linwood Crump** (South Amboy, N.J. / Piscataway / Sayerville), and **Kareem Gaulden** (Jersey City, N.J. / Lincoln).

SAFETIES

Leading the safeties is defensive coordinator Phil Snow, a 40-year coaching veteran. The position group lost three players to graduation - Alex Wells, Will Hayes and Boye Aromire.

Junior **Sean Chandler** started virtually every game of his college career. Last season, he led all Owl defensive backs with 65 tackles, 5.5 TFLs, 1.0 sacks, a team-high four inter-



One returner with starting experience is redshirt senior **Nate L. Smith**. Smith saw action in each of the past two seasons, but was pressed into a starting role in 2015 and did not disappoint. In seven starts, he contributed 54 tackles (fourth on the team) and his first career interception.

Delvon Randall was the only true freshman to earn playing time on defense. He played in all 14 games on defense and special teams a year ago.

Redshirt sophomore **Jyquis Thomas** was among the Owls top special teams players last season and will be given an opportunity to play in the secondary in 2016.

Redshirt senior **Khiry Lucas** was hurt during the 2014 season and spent 2015 rehabilitating. He earned his degree but has a year of eligibility remaining.

The 2016 recruiting class sees the additions of **Keyvone Bruton** (Norfolk, Va. / Lake Taylor), **Sam Franklin** (Crystal River, Fla. / Citrus / East Coast Prep), **Amir Tyler** [Lakewood (N.J.) High], and **Benny Walls** (Cinnaminson, N.J. / St. Joe's Prep).

SPECIAL TEAMS

For the first time since the departure of Broncos Super Bowl 50 winner Brandon McManus, Temple has a kicker worthy of consideration for the Lou Groza Award. Junior Austin Jones set the school record last season in field goals made (23) and points by a kicker (113). In fact, he had the same number of field goals and FG percentage as Memphis' Jake Elliott, who was the unanimous all-conference selection. He set the school mark with 19 consecutive FG's made before missing on a 43 yard attempt at Memphis. Later that game he suffered an ACL injury that will sideline him for the remainder of the year.

The kicking game benefits from a steady combination of long snapper **Corey Lerch** and holder **Tom Bradway**. Lerch has held down that spot since joining the team as a walk-on in 2014. Bradway redshirted in 2014.

A third specialist who earned a spot as a walk-on in 2014 is punter **Alex Starzyk**. The strong-legged junior improved his punting average by four yards from 2014 with a 42.4-yard average in 2015. Redshirt junior LS **Josh Lang** and a few new walk-ons continue to push the incumbents. **Dan McDonald** (Warrington, Pa. / Archbishop Wood) and **Aaron Boumerhi** (Philipsburg, Pa. / Philipsburg-Osceola) were added as walk-ons this spring.

They did just that, allowing only points in all of 2014. That adjustment, overall improved play of the defense, helped the Owls to a 6-6 record.

On June 25, 2015, Rhule was rewarded with a four-year contract extension that will keep him on the Temple sidelines through the 2021 season. Temple's Director of Athletics Dr. Patrick Kraft announced, "Matt Rhule is one of the best young coaches in college football and we are excited that he will be at the helm of Temple Football through at least 2021. Matt has the program heading in the right direction, especially as we enter a very promising season on the gridiron, and we are confident that he is the right person to take the program to even greater heights."

And take the program to greater heights he did. In 2015, Rhule has led his team to a 10-win regular season and an American Athletic Conference East division trophy. For the first time in 73 years, the Owls beat Penn State, started the season a program-best 7-0, and were ranked in the Top 25 for the first time in 36 seasons. Ten of his players earned all-conference honors and senior linebacker Tyler Matakevich won the Bednarik and Nagurski Awards while also being named a finalist for the Lott IMPACT and Senior CLASS Awards

That success prompted another commitment from Temple University following the season. Said then-University President Dr. Neil Theobald, "Matt's commitment to our student-athletes on and off the field, as well as the program's substantial improvement each season, has more than justified my confidence in him. He works tirelessly for the betterment of our players, our football program, and our university."

Added Kraft, "Matt is one of the top coaches in college football and has been responsible for making Temple a national program. He is an even better person off the field; a true leader who instills character and values in the men under his charge.

The State College, PA, native and a former player at Penn State has 18 years of collegiate coaching experience, including nine seasons at Temple, and seven bowl game appearances -- three with the Owls -- on his resume.

Rhule joined the Giants in the spring of 2012. He worked closely with Pat Flaherty, who has been the offensive line coach since 2004. They finished the 2012 campaign at 9-7, second in the NFC East, and averaged 355 yards of offense per game. Four New York players, including guard Chris Snee, were selected to the Pro Bowl.

During his previous tenure at Temple, Rhule's role changed several times. In spring 2012, he was promoted to co-offensive coordinator after serving as the assistant offensive coordinator and tight ends coach as well as the recruiting coordinator under Steve Addazio in 2011. Temple's 2012 recruiting class was ranked #1 in the Mid-American Conference and helped lay the foundation for the program's transition to the Big East

Under Al Golden, Rhule was promoted to offensive coordinator in the spring of 2008. He also coached the TU quarterbacks. He coached the defensive line in 2006 and served as the quarterbacks coach and recruiting coordinator during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. For three consecutive years, Temple's recruiting class was ranked #1 in the MAC [2006, 2007, 2008].

In 2011, the Owls went 9-4 and played in the fourth bowl game in school history, the

Gildan New Mexico Bowl, where they crushed Wyoming, 37-15 - Temple's first postseason victory since the 1979 Garden State Bowl. Rhule mentored two-time first-team All-MAC selection TE Evan Rodriguez. For the second time in Rhule's tenure, the Owls set the Temple single-season rushing vardage record and rushing touchdowns records behind the explosive efforts of All-MAC junior running backs Bernard Pierce and Matt

In 2010, Rhule helped guide the team to an 8-4 regular-season record, and the Owls recorded back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1978-79, including their first win over a BCS team. The Owls recorded the largest margin of victory (42 points against Buffalo) in a MAC game. A school record six offensive players earned All-MAC honors, including repeat first-team honorees OL Colin Madison, OL Darius Morris, and RB Bernard Pierce as well as first-time honoree TE Evan Rodriguez.

In 2009, Rhule's offense helped TU win a single-season record nine consecutive games en route to a 9-4 overall record and first-place tie in the MAC East. Under Rhule's guidance, the Owls set the Temple single-season rushing yardage record. A school record

Rhule arrived at Western Carolina after serving as assistant defensive line coach at UCLA in 2001. He assisted in coaching five Bruins that earned All PAC-10 honors as the team posted a 7-4 record under head coach Bob Toledo.

From 1999 to 2000, Rhule served as an assistant coach at Mid-American Conference member Buffalo, directing the Bulls defensive line in 2000 and working as assistant defensive line coach in 1999. In 2000, the team's sack total increased from 12 to 27 utilizing a 3-4 alignment. Buffalo also earned its first two Division I-A victories that season.

Rhule began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Penn State in the spring of 1998 before working at Albright College in Reading, Pa., for the 1998 season. At Albright, he coached the linebackers in a 4-3 scheme and

TEMPLE AT A GLANCE...

Temple is in the 4th largest media market in the country, with over 2.9 million TV homes according to Nielsen ratings. The designated market area (DMA) is 7.6 million.

Temple is located in a region of 6.53 million people, and is only 95 miles from NYC and 120 miles from Washington DC. In fact, more than 40% of the US population is within a days drive from Philadelphia.

Temple is the 26th largest public University in the country with over 38,000 students founded in 1884 and has 404 academic programs including 5 professional schools of law, medicine, dentistry, pharmacy and podiatry.

Temple is a Research I institution, a Carnegie Classification in 2015 as the highest level and ranked by US News and World Report at 115 (6th) with an overall graduation rate of 70%, and has a full time retention rate for undergraduate students at 89%.

Temple is one of 11 institutions in the country with multiyear APR scores of 970 or greater for all teams including a 2015 multi-years APR score of 971. Temple has over 300,000 alumni around the world including over 170,000 alumni that live in the Philadelphia DMA.

Temple's athletic department has 19 sports and 500 student athletes.

Temple has been bowl eligible 5 out of the last 7 years and finished 10-4 last year, winning the AAC East Division and being ranked in the Top 25 for several weeks.

Temple posted the largest attendance gain during the 2015 season, playing in front of an average home crowd of 44,159, an increase of 20,789 per game. This excitement led ESPN to bring their popular pregame show, College Game Day, to Philadelphia.

The Temple game played against Notre Dame had a 3.9 national rating and an 18.1 local rating. It was ABC's highest ranking game ever in the Philadelphia area which is impactful given Philadelphia is the 4th largest media market in the country.

Out of the 10 football games televised on ABC/ESPN

locally, Temple had over 14.8 million viewers in the Philadelphia market. (There is not data available for the remaining two games televised on CBSSN).

Temple's athletic facilities are among the finest in the country. The football team plays its games in the NFL stadium operated by the Philadelphia Eagles and there are ongoing discussions to build an on campus football stadium as well. The basketball area is a state-of-theart facility with a capacity crowd of 10,000. Over the last four years Temple has spent over \$50 million for athletics multi-purpose facilities with all the athletic facilities being state-of-the-art.

The University itself has over \$400 million planned for capital projects over the next five years including a \$170 million state-of-the-art library.

The men's basketball team is led by the AAC Coach of the Year, Fran Dunphy, and is the reigning AAC regular season basketball champions. The basketball program is the 5th winningest program in the history of college basketball.

On Saturday, December 3, 2016, the American Athletic Conference will hold its second Conference Championship Game. Kickoff will be at 12:00 noon and will be televised nationally by ABC or ESPN. The game will pit the divisional champions from the East and West divisions.

The divisional champions will be the teams from each division with the highest winning percentage in all conference games – both divisional and non-divisional. In the event of a two-team tie within a division, the head-to-head result between the tied teams will determine the divisional champion. The site of the American Athletic Conference Football Championship will be the home venue of the divisional champion with the best record in conference games.

### ARMY RUNS OVER TEMPLE FOR UPSET VICTORY

PHILADELPHIA - Army utilized its famed triple option running attack to march up and down the field to upset the Temple Owls, 28-13, in the season opener for both teams Friday night in front of 34,005 fans at Lincoln Financial Field. The Black Knights accumulated 329 rushing yards on 67 carries with fullback Andy Davidson leading the way with 121 yards and two TDs.

Temple struggled throughout the game to find any offensive rhythm, with the defense unable to slow down the Army ground game. The Army offense controlled the line-of-scrimmage and dominated the time-of-possession in both halves.

Head coach Matt Rhule re-

iterated the Owls mistakes following the loss, targeting turnovers, quarterback protection and red zone efficiency.


"We looked good early on at times, but when times got hard we couldn't react," Rhule said. "That is not the team that we want to have. I thought defensively, we couldn't stop Army. Offensively, we couldn't capitalize. We got the ball in the red zone three times and could not produce. We had three turnovers, Army had none. We could not protect the quarterback. That's on me. We have three losses in a row and we have to do something, quickly, to get ourselves back on track."

Senior QB Phillip Walker and the offense found no movement through the air or on the ground in the second half, scoring just a field goal. However, the four-year starter was able to break the school record for career passing yards in the contest.

On the day, Walker compiled a solid 168 yards on 12 completions through the air, throwing three costly interceptions with no scores. The senior snapped former QB Henry Burris' record of 7,495 passing yards on Temple's opening drive of the second half, finding Keith Kirkwood on a short checkdown pass in the right sideline for 14 yards. He now has 7,541 passing yards for his Owl career.

Meanwhile, RB Ryquell Armstead shouldered the load for the running back corps, racking up career-high 79 yards on 16 carries with one touchdown. The sophomore's strong performance gives the backfield some much-needed depth, as the Owls' usual starter Jahad Thomas sat out with a hand injury.

The scoring came slowly throughout, with Armstead's only touchdown starting things off early in the second quarter. Army quickly matched the following series behind the efforts of QB Ahmad Bradshaw, who snuck his way into the endzone utilizing the Black Knights' rarely



seen triple option offense.

Despite the Temple offense consistently working its way up and down the field, the Owls struggled finishing drives, owing its slim 10-7 halftime lead to excellent field position granted by a senior DL Sharif Finch blocked punt, the fifth of his career.

The second half seemed to continue a similar story as the Owl defense surrendered an opening 77-yard drive and their lead to the Black Knights, capped by Davidson's surge passed the goal line.

Even with junior PK Austin Jones' field goal closing the gap, Army continued to manhandle the Owl defensive front, methodically con-

verting positive gains for its third touchdown of the game. The Black Knight defense followed suit on the ensuing drive, shutting down Walker for a quick three-and-out.

The Owls had a chance in the final minutes as Army, leading 21-13, missed a field goal with 3:41. Temple took possession on its own 30-yard line, but Walker was picked off two plays later by Kenneth Brinson. The Black Knights then iced the game on a 17-yard TD run by Davidson with 2:28 on the clock. Walker tossed his final interception of the night on the final drive.

Defensively, impressive individual performances by senior linebackers Avery Williams (career-high 12 tackles) and Jarred Alwan (9 tackles), not to mention senior cornerback Sean Chandler (10 tackles), failed to slow the Army triple-option onslaught. For the Black Knights, Davidson and Bradshaw led the way, combining for 185 yards on 38 carries with three touchdowns.

# TEMPLE GETS BACK TO WINNING WAYS WITH 38-0 SHUTOUT OVER STONY BROOK

PHILADELPHIA – Under a blazing mid-September heat with 22,296 fans packing the stands, the Temple Owls secured their initial win of the season over visiting FCS-member Stony Brook, 38-0, Saturday afternoon at Lincoln Financial Field.

Despite the high scoreline, the Temple defense proved the most impressive component for the Owls, holding the Seawolves to just 133 yards with no scores. Throughout the first half, Stony Brook only saw the Temple side of the 50-yard line on one possession. That came after a tipped-pass interception at midfield.

The early dominance by the defense helped


the group reassert its identity, a self-proclaimed aggression and hyperactivity. The consistent pressure and blitz-prone front seven made Stony Brook visibly uncomfortable, forcing four turnovers, three sacks and nine tackles-for-loss. On the day, the Seawolves finished a dismal 0-for-13 on third down conversions.

Head coach Matt Rhule discussed his pride regarding how Temple competed during the shutout, noting the energy" and "juice" the Owls had against the Seawolves despite a full week of grueling practice and, not to forget, last Friday's loss to Army still fresh in many players' minds.

"I'm really proud of our team over the last eight days, some real key leadership," Rhule said. "It was a really, really hard work. We were not a fresh team out there today. We worked this week. I thought you saw, hopefully, a team that played with a lot of energy, a lot of juice, and did enough to win the football game, and to get a shutout on defense is always special."

Meanwhile, the defensive energy bled its way into the offensive huddle, as senior QB Phillip Walker guided his squad on multiple scoring drives throughout both halves. Walker, who snapped the school record for career passing yards last week against Army, completed a nearly flawless game, throwing 11-of-23 for three scores with the lone interception.

Under Walker's direction, the offense either reached or began in the redzone five consecutive times after a stalled first possession, scoring touchdowns on four of those occasions. The third quarter proved similar as each of the first two drives saw the scoreboard change in Temple's favor, including a 26-yard strike to junior WR Keith Kirkwood, all before the senior sat out the final period.



On the receiving end of the senior's passes were a number of wideouts: none, however, posted a game near Kirkwood, who pulled in a career-high two touchdowns on four receptions for 54 yards. Kirkwood's standout display was supplemented by a first for sophomore WR Broderick Yancy, who grabbed his initial career score on 15-yard pass in the back of the end zone late in the second quarter.

The Owl offensive engine hit on all cylinders from the get-go, pounding the Stony Brook front all while utilizing a slew of ball carriers for 177 yards on 39 carries for two touchdowns. Sophomore RB Ryquell Armstead saw the most action, generating con-

sistent positive yardage with 48 yards on 14 carries.

A pair of freshmen each made an impact rushing for the Owls, as WR Isaiah Wright made his debut with seven notable touches (42 yards) at tailback while WR Cortrelle Simpson notched two end-around sweeps for 40 yards.

The special teams saw a milestone crossed during the victory, as junior PK Austin Jones' sole field goal midway through the second half jumped him into sixth alltime on Temple's career scoring list, surpassing Cap Poklemba's 190 points from the 1999-02 seasons. Further, P Alex Starzyk showcased his coffin corner skills on two of his four punts against Stony Brook, watching the ball downed at the one-yard line on both kicks.

As for Temple head coach Matt Rhule, the shutout of the Seawolves marks the second of his Owl career, the last of which came against fellow FCS-member Delaware State by a 59-0 mark in 2014.

#### **PENN STATE OUTLASTS TEMPLE FOR 34-27 WIN**

STATE COLLEGE – Despite a resilient defensive effort and a late offensive surge, Temple fell short in its first road challenge, suffering a close 34-27 loss at the hands of rival Penn State in front of a crowd of 100,420 at Beaver Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

The Owls, who battled from behind throughout the entire matchup, closed the score to within a single possession on their final drive, but an inopportune turnover snuffed out the possibility for the comeback.

Throughout the first few drives, quick strikes from both quarterbacks signaled a shootout between the Pennsylvania rivals was underway, but a combination of defensive pressure and

constant penalties soon slowed down both offenses.

Senior QB Phillip Walker and his unit struggled in the first half, but managed to put together multiple scoring possessions in the second, compiling 286 passing yards on 25-of-34 with a rushing touchdown and interception.

The early Owls' spark came behind the efforts of redshirt senior WR Romond Deloatch, who grabbed a career-long 67-yard reception on the initial play of the second drive. With the defense reeling, Temple set up RB Jahad Thomas with his first carry and touchdown of the season on an eight-yard sweep a play later.

The rushing score moved Thomas up to fifth all-time on Temple's career touchdown list, a boost for the senior after sitting out the first two games of the year with a hand injury. He finished the day with 14 carries for 52 yards with two touchdowns along with six receptions for 48 yards.


The Penn State offense similarly gave Temple early issues, finding the endzone on two of its first three possessions and jumping out to a quick seven-point lead. Nittany Lion QB Trace McSorley opened the scoring on Penn State's second drive, finding a wide-open WR Chris Godwin on a deep 52-yard bomb down midfield.

Even with a timely turnover deep in Owl territory to start the second quarter, the defense continued to struggle containing McSorley, watching the sophomore expand the Nittany Lion edge to 21-7 with his first rushing touchdown of the year. Redshirt senior Praise Martin-Oguike forced the Penn State fumble inside the Temple red zone.

Two consecutive unproductive Temple drives plagued the defensive stamina late during the first half, as Penn State's offense continued to dominate overall snaps (43-25) and time-of-possession (17:32-12:26). The Owls were held to a trio of three-and-outs versus Penn State's zero in the initial two quarters, constantly forcing the defense to take the field with little to no rest.

With just 38 seconds remaining and the ball spotted on the Owl 20-yard line, though, Walker and the offense suddenly sprang to life. An up-tempo six-play, 52-yard possession allowed junior PK Austin Jones to close the half-time deficit, drilling a 45-yard field goal with relative ease.

Sophomore DB Delvon Randall snared an interception off McSorley inside the Nittany Lion red zone late in the



third quarter, electrifying a period that had only seen a Penn State field goal thus far. The turnover spurred the Owls' offense, which capped the short scoring drive with Walker leaping into the endzone on a fourth-and-goal conversion.

The shift in momentum jumpstarted the exhausted defense, bending under another McSorley air raid, but again allowing only a field goal, giving Penn State a 27-17 advantage early in the fourth quarter. The stalled drive, one of many throughout the game, came due to the efforts of redshirt senior Haason Reddick, who concluded the match with seven total tackles and a career-high three tackles-for-loss.

A stalled drive on the ensuing Temple possession was quickly rectified on special teams, as punter Alex Staryzk's line drive ricocheted off a Nittany Lion blocker, bounced down to the Penn State one-yard line and was promptly recovered by the Owls.

Thomas, once again, came through on a sweep play in the red zone, striding in for a touchdown on a third-and-goal to cut the lead down to a field goal margin midway through the final period.

Penn State star RB Saquon Barkley, who had been relatively contained up until this point, responded in kind just three plays later, outpacing defenders on a 55-yard burst up the middle to restore the 10-point Nittany Lion edge. The Owls pushed back to within a possession courtesy of a second Jones field goal, this time from 34 yards out, sailed through the uprights with just 2:10 remaining.

After a failed onside kick and Penn State three-and-out, Temple managed to take over deep in their own territory. On the second play of the possession, though, Walker took a shot while in his throwing motion, resulting in a game-ending Nittany Lion interception.

## TEMPLE WINS SEVENTH STRAIGHT HOMECOMING GAME WITH 48-20 VICTORY OVER CHARLOTTE

PHILADELPHIA — Temple recovered quickly from a slow start in its Homecoming matchup against Charlotte, posting its second victory of the season with a dominant 48-20 decision over the 49ers in front of 27,786 fans Saturday afternoon at Lincoln Financial Field.

A trio of Owl big plays highlighted the first half, as senior offensive stars OB Phillip Walker and RB Jahad Thomas created points both through the air and on the ground, building a comfortable 31-7 halftime lead.

Temple head coach Matt Rhule discussed how his offense was able to rattle the 49er defense with an up-tempo speed

and few big plays downfield, finally finding a rhythm early in the second quarter with Walker under center.

"We kind of came out no huddle early and tried to open them up a little bit, just tire them out," Rhule said. "I think we just kind of settled down on offense, got into a rhythm and I think what you're seeing is when we are able to get our quarterback into a rhythm, he's playing pretty well."

After opening the game with a long drive capped by junior Austin Jones' 36-yard field goal, Temple sputtered until the initial play of the second quarter. On a brilliantly faked play-action pass, Walker threw a rope to junior WR Adonis Jennings down the left sideline for a 51-yard score, reclaiming the lead for good.

From that point on the offensive floodgates remained permanently open for the Owls, as the Charlotte defense watched Walker and company become increasingly more effective.

Next up, a fumble recovery by senior DE Praise Martin-Oguike — returned 20 yards by the hulking defensive lineman — was promptly converted into touchdown on a Thomas 13-yard dance into the endzone.

Walker stepped up on the Owls' ensuing drive, dropping a 40-yard dime to WR Brodrick Yancy, who then proceeded to break a tackle and stride in for the second score of his young career. The sophomore wideout topped his previous career mark for receiving yards, snaring four receptions for a team-best 70 yards.

Another sophomore, this time RB Ryquell Armstead, grabbed the spotlight in Temple's final possession of the half, punching in a touchdown of his own a one-yard dive at the goal line.

As for the defense, a lone scoring drive in the first quarter sullied their near-perfect first half performance. Senior signal-digit linebackers Avery Williams and Stephaun Marshall led the way with five tackles each while Martin-Oguike earned the lone turnover.

The third quarter sang the same tune as the 28-point second for Temple offensively, as two consecutive



methodical drives finished with rushing scores to start the period. Both Thomas and Armstead each secured their second endzone appearance, making sharp cuts for one-yard touchdowns.

Leading 45-14 late in the quarter, redshirt freshman reserve QB Logan Marchi replaced Walker as the signal caller for the Owls. The young quarterback proceeded to manufacture a drive deep into 49er territory, setting up Jones' second field goal of the game, this time a 31-yarder.

On the day, Walker finished an impressive 15-of-26 for 268 passing yards and two touchdowns, adding two rushes for 18 yards on the ground. Thomas sup-

plemented the offensive effort in multiple ways, earning a team-best 15 carries for 70 yards and two scores along with three receptions for 49 yards through the air.

The two touchdowns for the senior running back marked the 23rd and 24th of his storied career with the Owls, jumping him to third all-time in program history.

An imposing defensive effort throughout the game was capped on Charlotte's final possession, as the Owls' second-string unit held its ground inside the Temple 10-yard line and forced a turnover-on-downs. Ultimately, the 49ers proficiency on offense — 429 total yards — was never converted into consistent scoring, as the Temple bend-don't-break mantle held firm.

As for Rhule, the fourth-year head coach remains undefeated in Homecoming matchups with the Owls, improving Temple's streak to eight straight.

#### **OWLS OPEN CONFERENCE PLAY WITH STRONG WIN OVER SMU**

PHILADELPHIA — Aiming to make a splash in the American Conference debut, the Temple offensive and defensive fronts gave no ground as they guided the Owls into the win column, knocking off visiting SMU in a 45-20 thrashing on Saturday afternoon at Lincoln Financial Field. A combination of consistent quarterback pressure and a punishing ground attack proved the difference for the Owls in the victory, surging past the Mustangs in decisive fashion.

With the game teetering on the brink of a Temple blowout midway through the second quarter, senior DE Haason Reddick saw his opportunity to put away the victory on an SMU third-and-6.

Blowing by the right tackle, Reddick smashed into Mustang QB Ben Hicks full force, triggering a fumble that was promptly palmed by fellow senior Romond Deloatch and corralled into the endzone.

The touchdown extended the Owl lead to a commanding 28 points, a margin that was narrowly slimmed throughout the remainder of the matchup. The advantage forced SMU into panic mode early, an edge for the high-energy Temple defensive front.

The critical victory marks the first in the Owls' defense of last season's Eastern Division Title, as they improve to 3-2 (1-0 American) on the year. The Mustangs, meanwhile, fall to 2-3 (0-1 American) and turn their attention to a Tulsa road trip next weekend.


A rocky start for Temple — highlighted by senior QB Phillip Walker throwing a pick-six — was quickly remedied by, surprisingly enough, punter Alex Starzyk. After Temple's second drive stalled three snaps in, the junior drove a kick into the back of an SMU blocker, allowing Reddick to recover the live ball.

Seven plays later, senior RB Jahad Thomas burst through a truck-sized hole for an untouched 12-yard touchdown run, knotting the score at 7-7. From that point on, the Owls' offense never looked back, surgically picking apart the Mustang defense.

The ensuing Temple possession lasted just a single play, as Walker redeemed his opening gaffe with a 42-yard connection to now-healthy sophomore WR Ventell Bryant for the duo's first score of the season. The touchdown gave the Owls a 14-7 lead, an advantage they did not relinquish.

Walker's early struggles were short-lived, as the senior wrapped up the win with 124 yards passing on 7-of-18 and his lone touchdown to Bryant. The receiving corps saw a plethora of distribution from the signal caller as well, with three wideouts topping 30 yards, the best of which came from junior Keith Kirkwood (41 yards on three receptions).

A second sophomore, this time RB Ryquell Armstead, crossed the goal line next for the Owls following a few back-and-forth punts, punching it in after a 34-yard Walk-er-to-Deloatch toss set Temple up at the one-yard line. To cap the offense's first half, Thomas made his second endzone appearance of the day minutes into the sec-



ond quarter, breaking off a 15-yard rush for the score.

For the game, the senior tailback finished with 16 carries for 80 yards and two touchdowns, jumping him into sole possession of third place on Temple's all-time career scoring list (26 touchdowns).

The real story of the half, though, proved the stout defensive performance, giving up just 100 yards and a lone, late touchdown to a statistically high-powered Mustang offense. Along with the forced fumble, the stingy unit also grabbed two interceptions - by senior DB Nate L. Smith and sophomore LB Jared Folks, respectively - as sophomore DB Delvon Randall led the team in tackles (5).

As exciting and point-happy as the first half was for both teams, the final two quarters proved conflictingly quiet. The third saw only an Austin Jones' field goal for Temple, pushing the lead to a comfortable 38-14, before the Mustangs added only their second offensive score of the game on a 14-yard pass to open the final period.

With SMU finally showing some life, the Owls decided to answer with vigor on their ensuing drive. Once again, the ground game came through as Armstead shrugged off defenders in a 37-yard sprint into the endzone.

The sophomore impressed throughout the game, particularly during the final two quarters, finishing with a career-best 159 yards on 15 rushes for two scores of his own.

A defensive stand inside the ten-yard line helped close out the victory, as SMU failed to convert four straight snaps deep in the red zone. Randall concluded the game with a career-best double-digit tackle mark (10) while both Smith and redshirt freshman LB Chapelle Russell added seven tackles each.

# TEMPLE SINGS MEMPHIS BLUES AFTER TIGERS COME BACK FOR 34-27 WIN

MEMPHIS – Under the hostile lights of the Liberty Bowl and fighting a crowd 34,743 strong, Temple struggled to overcome the obstacles of a tough road venue as fellow American Conference foe Memphis outpaced the Owls in a 34-27 shootout.

After winning two straight, the Owls' defense of last season's Eastern Division title took a hit as the team drops to 1-1 in conference play and 3-3 overall. Memphis, meanwhile, bounces back after a close loss last week to No. 14 Ole Miss, surging to a 1-0 American record and a 4-1 mark for the year.

In a true "tale of two halves" game, Temple jumped out to a

commanding 13-3 lead in the first half only to surrender that edge over the course of the final two quarters. The Owls started the game with serious energy and poise on both sides of the ball, but a few big plays by the Tigers buried Temple down the stretch.

The third quarter flipped the game for the Owls, as the team watched their 13-3 advantage evaporate into a 20-13 deficit, with both of Memphis' touchdowns coming over a 51-second span in the final two minutes of the period.

The first was the result of Tigers' RB Doroland Dorceus, who broke off a 71-yard dash up the middle, while the second came on a tipped pass turned picksix by Memphis LB Genard Avery two plays later.

The final quarter, even with some positive results, failed to change the game's eventual outcome, as senior QB Phillip Walker threw his second interception of the night, ending the Owls' hopes of a comeback.

After Memphis RB Darrell Henderson capped a seven-play drive with a 28-yard scoring rush to kickoff the period, Walker found fellow senior RB Jahad Thomas on a 61-yard touchdown pass to narrow the lead to just one possession. Memphis immediately responded on the ensuing kickoff, taking it 95 yards to the house as the Tigers tried keep the Owls at arms length.

Temple set itself up again to close the gap a drive later as Walker connected with Thomas for the duo's second score, this time on a nine-yard screen, cutting the deficit again to just seven. A running into the punter penalty cut the Owls' last chance drive down to just 50 seconds, and the late interception sealed the loss.

On the day, though, Walker finished with career highs across the board, posting a school record in passing attempts (59) while tying in completions (36) and passing yards (445). He joins Henry Burris (445 yards vs. Pitt, 1996) as the only Owl signal-callers to pass for more than 400 yards in a game. Thomas impressed as well,



grabbing six receptions for 121 yards and two touchdowns along with 37 yards on the ground. It marked his fourth straight game with two touchdowns.

And while the second half looked like a shootout, the first half played out much more like a defensive struggle.

A pair of field goals from 31 and 23 yards out, respectively, from junior K Austin Jones gave Temple an early lead. Late in the first half following a gusty fourth-and-three conversion on Walker toss to senior TE Colin Thompson, sophomore RB Ryquell Armstead punched in the game's opening touchdown from two yards out.

The true story of the first half for the Owls, though, came on the defensive side of the ball.

AMERICAN

Led by a suffocating defensive line, the Owls contained the high-octane Memphis offense to just a late field goal and 111 total yards. Tigers' QB Riley Ferguson was visibly uncomfortable throughout both quarters, overthrowing wideouts and struggling to find space in a tight pocket.

Ferguson and his offense were able to regroup during halftime, generating over double their initial production. However, two non-offensive touchdowns for the Tigers saved their lead late as both the kickoff return and the pick-six shifted momentum towards Memphis.

Redshirt senior DL Haasan Reddick led the Owls' defense with 11 tackles, including four for a loss, and two sacks.
